1/3-inning start. Surrendered one earned run on two hits and struck out three ... **Northwestern** (March 28-30): Picked up

his first win of the season with 7 2/3 shutout innings against the Wildcats. Allowed just four hits and struck out eight in the 3-0

over 5 1/3 innings of work. Struck out four and walked two

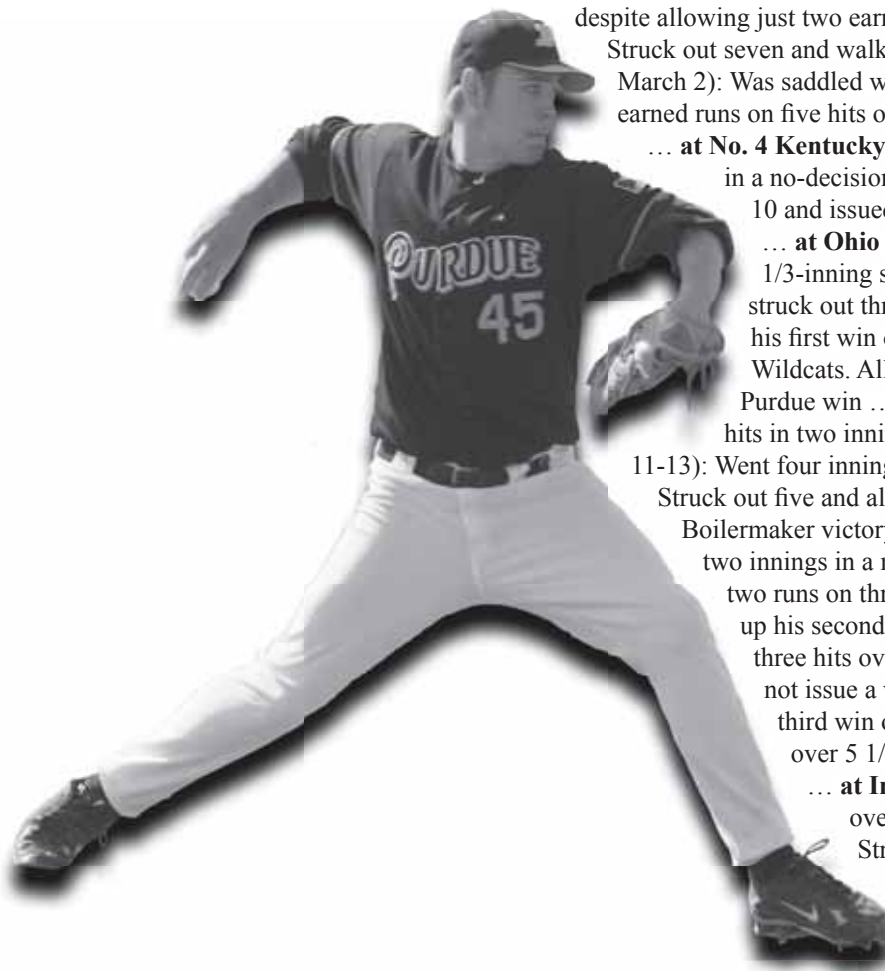
... **at Indiana** (May 3-5): Allowed two runs on six hits over six innings to win his fourth game of the season.

Went 3-2 with a team-best 2.85 ERA in 60 innings of work ... Posted two saves ... Finished with 61 strikeouts against just eight walks ... **at Georgia** (Feb. 23-25): Made his first collegiate appearance and struck out two in a shutout inning of relief ... **at Western Kentucky** (March 2-4): Worked two innings of relief. Allowed three runs on five hits, but struck out five against no walks ... **at No. 13 Auburn** (March 9-11): Worked one inning out of the bullpen. Surrendered one run on one hit ... **at Alabama-Birmingham** (March 13-14): Made his first collegiate start and picked up his first career win in a seven-inning shutout performance. Struck out a career-high 11 batters while scattering five hits ... **at Samford** (March 16-18): Notched his first collegiate save in Purdue's 7-6 win after allowing one run on three hits in two innings of work. Struck out two and walked none ... **at Western Illinois** (March 24-25): Surrendered an unearned run on one hit in two relief innings. Struck out two ... **at Ball State** (March 28): Worked one hitless inning of relief ... **Illinois** (March 30-April 1): Tossed five innings in relief and surrendered just two earned runs on eight hits, while striking out six ... **Indiana** (April 13-15): Tallied his second career save with three scoreless innings of one-hit relief against the Hoosiers ... **at Notre Dame** (April 18): Made his second career start and had to settle for a no-decision despite tossing a one-hitter over nine shutout innings. Had a perfect game through eight innings, struck out seven and did not issue a walk in a game Purdue eventually lost 1-0 in 10 innings ... **Ohio State** (April 27-29): Picked up his second win of the season in a seven-inning shutout start. Scattered four hits with five Ks and no walks in the complete game effort ... **at Penn State** (May 5-6): Despite allowing just two runs on seven hits with six Ks and no walks over 7 1/3 innings, was charged with his first career loss in a 4-1 defeat to the Nittany Lions ... **Iowa** (May 11-13): Picked up his third win of the season with a solid seven-inning start. Allowed four runs on seven hits with 6 Ks and one walk ... **at Northwestern** (May 18-20): Was charged with his second loss of the year after allowing six runs on 12 hits in 5 2/3 innings. Still struck out six and walked none.

Was a four-year letterwinner at New Haven High School ... Finished with a 3-2 record and nine saves as a freshman with 63 strikeouts and a 3.20 ERA ... Tallied a 9-1 record with a 1.20 ERA as a sophomore while breaking the school record with 120 strikeouts and being named first team all-conference ... Had an 11-2 record with a 0.70 ERA in his junior year, breaking his own record for strikeouts in a season with 137 ... Also named first team all-conference, first team all-area, and first team all-state as a junior ... Had a 12-3 record with a 1.21 ERA as a senior with 133 strikeouts and just 9 walks while setting school records for career wins (35) and strikeouts (453), again being named first team all-conference, all-area, and all-state ...
