

2008 SEASON REVIEW

The 2008 Season

The Boilermakers opened the season by posting a 2-11 record through the first four weeks of the season. Upon returning to West Lafayette for its home opener, Purdue rolled off a 24-6 record from March 22 to May 3. After defeating Indiana in the series opener on May 3, the Boilermakers slumped to the tune of a 1-6 record over an 11-day span. Purdue got back on track to win three of its last four games in the regular season to earn a No. 2 seed in the conference tournament. The Boilers outlasted Penn State and the rival Hoosiers in the Big Ten Tournament in Ann Arbor before finally falling twice to host Michigan to end the year.

All-Big Ten

The Boilermakers were represented on the all-conference team by six players spread over three squads. Ben Wolgamot and Matt Bischoff were honored on the conference's first team; Brandon Haveman and Josh Lindblom were named to the league's second team; and Ryne White and Matt Jansen were voted to the third team. Prior to 2008, the Boilermakers' have had six or more players named All-Big Ten in four seasons. Six Boilermakers were tabbed to the 1993, 2001 and 2006 all-conference teams, and a program-record eight were selected following the 1997 regular season.

Academic All-Big Ten

The Boilermaker placed nine team members on the Academic All-Big Ten list. Eric Nielsen (2006-08) and Chris Ivanic (2006-08) were feted by the conference office for academics for a third time, while Alex Jaffe (2007-08) and Kyle Reesing (2007-08) became two-time team members.

Big Ten Tournament Appearance

The Boilermakers participated in the Big Ten Tournament for the 12th time since the tournament's inception in 1981 and for the sixth time in 10 seasons under head coach Doug Schreiber.

No. 2 Seed

Purdue's second-place finish in the conference standings in 2008 was the third for Purdue under head coach Doug Schreiber. The Boilermakers finished second in 2001 behind Ohio State and second in 2005 to Illinois. In 2001, the Boilermakers finished 19-7 in Big Ten play (.731) while Ohio State was 20-7 (.741) – and Purdue and Buckeyes did not play each other that season. In 2005, a similar scenario presented itself as Purdue finished 17-11 (.607) while Illinois was 20-12 (.625) – and the two schools did not face each other head-to-head. In 2008, Purdue (21-10) finished in the second spot in the conference standings behind Michigan (26-5) – and once again the Boilermakers found themselves not playing the conference champion during the Big Ten regular season.

Big Ten Tournament Team

Dan Black and Jonathan Moore were both selected to represent Purdue on the All-Big Ten Tournament Team. Black hit .500 (7 for 11) with a Big Ten Tournament record five home runs, five runs scored and 11 RBIs in four games played. Moore went 6 for 13 (.462) with a double, a home run, five RBIs and four runs scored in Ann Arbor.

200-Hit Club

Junior first baseman Ryne White joined an exclusive group of Boilermakers on April 20, when he collected his 200th career hit. Trailing 5-4 in the ninth inning to Ohio State, White hit the first pitch he saw in his at-bat over the right field wall for a three-run homer to give the Boilermakers a 7-5 lead and the eventual win over the Buckeyes. With the blast White become the 16th Boilermaker to reach the 200-hit club in the program's 121-year history. The last Boilermakers to eclipse the 200-hit plateau were Mitch Hilligoss and Eric Wolfe, both accomplishing the feat during the 2006 campaign. White wrapped up his three-year career at Purdue with 229 hits, tied for seventh all-time.

Running to the Record

Junior outfield Brandon Haveman made an immediate impact in the Purdue lineup. The transfer from Lake Michigan College not only provided stellar defense in right field, but the left-handed bat was a spark at the top of the Boilermaker lineup. In 27 Big Ten games, Haveman led Purdue with 35 runs scored. His 35 runs established a new Purdue record for a Big Ten season, eclipsing the former record of 32 established by Ryne White just one season prior. The record for runs by any Big Ten player in a conference season is 39 by Robb Quinlan of Minnesota (1998).

Slamming the Door

Junior relief pitcher Josh Lindblom was as close to perfect on the mound during Big Ten play as one could get. In 13 appearances versus conference foes, Lindblom was perfect in nine save opportunities and recorded one win. In 20.2 innings, the junior right-hander has struck out 22 batters.

Powering Up

Third baseman Dan Black exploded at the plate at the end of the 2008 season. After just three home runs during his freshman season, Black finished second in the Big Ten Conference with 18 home runs last year. Black hit two grand slams and finished with four multi-homer games. He saved his best for last, hitting a Big Ten Tournament record five home runs in four games in Ann Arbor. He connected twice in the tournament opener against Penn State and tied a tournament single-game record by hitting three bombs against Indiana in an elimination game.

2008 SEASON REVIEW

Clean Sweep

In 2005 the Boilermakers swept Minnesota in four games at Lambert Field, becoming the first team to win a conference series against the Gophers since April 2002. Purdue repeated the feat again last season, sweeping Minnesota at Lambert Field – the first time the teams had met in a conference series since the 2005 series. The weekend series was highlighted by a pair of come-from-behind wins during Saturday's doubleheader. In the first game Purdue overcame a 6-3 deficit with four runs in the bottom of the seventh inning to post a 7-6 victory – scoring the four runs in six at-bats without an out. In the nightcap the Boilermakers plated a run in the fifth and six runs in the home half of the sixth inning to battle back from a 5-0 deficit.

Bucking a Trend


Purdue won three games at Ohio State in a four-game Big Ten series for the first time since 1987 (in West Lafayette). The last time Purdue won a series against OSU in Columbus, was 1986 – when present-day head coach Doug Schreiber was a senior second baseman for Purdue. Since the 1987 series win over the Buckeyes, Purdue held an overall record of 13-43 in regular-season meetings with OSU, and a record in regular-season meetings in Columbus of 4-24. Purdue won the first two games of the 2008 series, never trailing in either game. A late comeback effort in Game Three fell short, but a come-from-behind effort in the finale helped Purdue overcame a 5-1 deficit in the eighth inning with three runs and a game-winning three-run home run in the ninth by Ryne White to seal the series win.

For Openers

Purdue opened Big Ten play with a 9-3 record, the first time a Boilermaker baseball team won three straight weekend series to open conference play in program history. Purdue's nine conference wins to open the league slate were the most for a Boilermaker squad through three weeks on Big Ten play, eclipsing the former best of eight wins done three times, last in 2002 (8-4).

Big Ten Players and Pitchers of the Week

April 21 – Matt Jansen earned his first career weekly award after tossing a complete-game shutout to lead Purdue in an 8-0 victory over Ohio State. The performance was the first complete-game outing for the Boilermakers in 2008 and helped the squad to its first series win at Ohio State since 1986. The sophomore pitched all seven innings, scattering six hits without allowing a walk while striking out three Buckeyes to improve his conference record to 2-0. The southpaw also threw 2.2 innings of scoreless relief against Miami (Ohio) in a mid-week matchup, recording two strikeouts in the effort.

April 8 – Ben Wolgamot helped Purdue to a 3-1 series victory at Iowa, batting .563 with a .688 slugging percentage to get the Boilermakers off to a 6-2 Big Ten record. The junior recorded multiple hits in three of the four games, also scoring at least one run in each contest. Wolgamot went 9 for 16 at the plate, scoring seven runs while driving in five more. He smacked a pair of doubles and did not strike out in the series. The Danville, Ill., native's best game came in the series finale when he went 4 for 4 with three runs scored and three RBIs as the Boilermakers won, 16-3. In a non-conference game earlier in the week against 2007 College World Series participant Louisville, Wolgamot was 2 for 2 at the plate with two runs scored and a pair of walks, which brought his weekly stat line to a .611 batting average, a .667 on-base percentage and a .722 slugging percentage. The award was the first of Wolgamot's career.

March 31 – Brandon Haveman earned the first weekly honor from the conference office after leading Purdue to a 4-1 week, including a 3-1 series win over Northwestern. In Big Ten play, the junior went 8 for 16 (.500) at the plate and reached base at a .556 average, drawing a pair of walks to accompany his eight hits. The leadoff batter scored at least one run in three of Purdue's four conference games, accounting for six runs scored in the series. The outfielder also drove in a run in the Boilermakers' 10-2 victory in Game 2 of Saturday's doubleheader.

March 24 – Jonathan Moore led Purdue to a four-game sweep over Western Illinois, posting a .667 batting average (10 for 15) with a slugging percentage of .867. The junior tallied multiple hits in each contest and scored at least one run in every game as the Boilermakers combined for 47 team runs in the four-game set. The outfielder opened the series on Saturday going 2 for 4 with a double and a run scored before going 2 for 3 with a run, a walk and a stolen base in Game 2 of the doubleheader. On Sunday, Moore went 3 for 3 with two runs and a double before finishing the weekend by hitting 3 for 5 with three runs, two RBI and a run in the nightcap to complete the team's first series sweep of the season. The award was the first of Moore's career.

Making a Career of It

Purdue's 2008 draft class of five players selected matches the 1993 Boilermakers for the largest class for a MLB draft in school history. Right-hander Josh Lindblom got the Boilermaker selections started when he was tabbed by the Los Angeles Dodgers with their second-round pick, while first baseman Ryne White went two rounds later to the Arizona Diamondbacks in the fourth round. Lindblom became the second-highest player drafted under head coach Doug Schreiber.

Andy Loomis (16th round), Dan Black (35th) and Matt Bischoff (47th) were all taken on the second day of the draft by the Marlins, Giants and Mets, respectively. Black and Bischoff did not sign professional contracts.
