#BOILERNOTES

The Boilermakers kick off the 2018-19 season with an exhibition contest against one of the nation's best in NCAA Division II, welcoming Ashland University to Mackey Arena. Purdue is 44-3 all-time in exhibition games, winning 39 straight entering Sunday. The Boilermakers' last exhibition loss came in 1999 against the United States National Team, while their single-game scoring record of 120 points came against the Moldovan National Team in 1993. Purdue has won its exhibition contests by an average of 39.1 points per game in 12 seasons under head coach Sharon Versyp.

Last year's exhibition win came over the University of Saint Francis (88-39), led by 21 points, 10 rebounds, six assists and three steals from Andreona Keys. Ae'Rianna Harris, Dominique Oden and Karissa McLaughlin all posted double-figures as the Boilermakers cashed in on 57.6 percent from the field.

Purdue returns four starters from the 2017-18 lineup, including its leading scorer (Oden), leading rebounder (Harris) and leading distributor (McLaughlin). The returners accounted for 65 percent of the Boilermakers' points and rebounds last season and 75 percent of their 3-point production.

TEAM NOTES

- Purdue enters its 44th season of women's basketball, holding a 843-466 all-time record
- With a record of 20-14 last season, the Boilermakers logged their 25th 20-win season in program history
- Went 4-1 against the AP Top-25 in 2017-18, marking Purdue's most ranked wins 2006-07, and their best win percentage against ranked opponents (.800) since their 10-0 season in 1998-99
- The Boilermakers head into the 37th Big Ten Conference women's basketball season, having won seven regular season titles, including outright championships in 1991, 1999, 2001 and 2002
- Purdue has won a Big Ten Conference record nine postseason conference tournaments (24 total tournaments played since 1995), and has advanced to the Big Ten Tournament championship on 14 occasions
- The Boilermakers' 42 all-time Big Ten Tournament wins are the most of any conference school, and their .737 (42-15) win percentage is second-best of any team in the conference (Maryland)
- The Boilermakers set a program record, committing 13.4 fouls per game, good for No. 9 in the NCAA in 2017-18
- Purdue led the Big Ten and finished 18th in the NCAA with 175 blocked shots
- The Boilermakers' blocked shots total tied for the fourth-most in a season in program history
- Purdue returns the No. 8 sophomore scoring duo in the NCAA (No. 2 in the Big Ten) in 2017-18 as Dominique Oden and Ae'Rianna Harris combined to score 876 points, most by a pair of Boilermaker sophomores in program history
- In 2017-18 a freshman or sophomore led the Boilermakers in scoring in 25-of-34 contests, including 13 of the last 15 games of the season
- A freshman or sophomore led Purdue in rebounding in 31-of-34 contests last season, including the final 11 games of the year
- The Boilermakers return three of their top-four scorers from last season overall and four of their top-five scorers from conference play
- Purdue enters 2018-19 with an active streak of 27 consecutive wins when leading after three quarters, including a 17-0 mark last season, and last surrendered a fourth-quarter lead on Jan. 15, 2017 to 11th-ranked Ohio State
- The Boilermakers' four returning starters marks their most since the 2011-12 season, when they returned four as well
- With Ae'Rianna Harris and Dominique Oden earning Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media, Purdue is one-of-two schools to have two players on both teams (Iowa)

ROSTER NOTES

- The 2018-19 roster features another youthful flavor for Versyp, built of two seniors, four juniors, four sophomores and four freshmen
- Abby Abel and Nora Kiesler make up the two-member senior class, marking the third straight season the Boilermakers have had two or fewer seniors
- The roster represents four U.S. states (Indiana, Georgia, Kentucky and Nebraska), and three foreign countries (Canada, England and Senegal)

- The Boilermakers balanced out the positional status of the roster this season, featuring eight backcourt players, two guard/forward combos, two forwards and two centers
- The average height on this year's roster sits at 5-foot-11, with the tallest player being Kiesler and the shortest being Abel

- The return of four starters and key role players results in the Boilermakers returning more than half of their 2017-18 production in every statistical category

HEAD COACH SHARON VERSYP

- Entering her 13th season on the Boilermaker sidelines, Versyp now has the longest tenure of any coach in program history
- She is the winningest coach in program history, owning 257 victories at Purdue
- Has nine 20-win campaigns in 12 seasons with the Boilermakers, and has won at least 20 games in 12 of 18 career seasons as a head coach
- Versyp is tied with Lin Dunn for the Boilermakers' career Big Ten Conference wins mark at 120 heading into 2018-19
- Her 129 career Big Ten wins are ranked eighth in conference history, are third-most among active coaches and are seven wins shy of moving up to fifth all-time (136, Jim Foster, Ohio State)
- Her 22 career Big Ten Tournament victories are an event record, breaking the previous mark (shared by Jim Foster and Rene Portland) with Purdue's 2017 quarterfinal win over Indiana
- She's led the Boilermakers to the Big Ten Tournament championship game six times in 12 seasons (four titles)
- Versyp has guided Purdue to a program-record nine NCAA Tournament appearances in 12 seasons
- The Boilermakers are 1-of-25 schools to make at least nine tournaments over Versyp's tenure as head coach, and 1-of-5 schools in the Big Ten Conference

#1 KARISSA MCLAUGHLIN

- Earned 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team honors, becoming 10th player in Purdue history, fifth under Versyp and first Boilermaker since 2013
- Her 75 3-point field goals in 2017-18 are most-ever by a Purdue freshman, third-most in a season in Boilermaker history and second-most by a returning player in the Big Ten

 - Averaged 7.5 points and 7.2 rebounds per game in 2017-18
 - A native of London, England, she's the first british player in Boilermaker history

- Set Martinsville High School records for scoring (2114), assists (437), free throws (472) and games played (98)
 - 2018 Indiana Miss Basketball finalist

OPPONENT NOTES

- Ashland has been one of the best teams in NCAA Division II over the past few seasons, posting a combined 104-3 mark in the last three years, including a flawless 37-0 record in 2017 and a national title
 - Former Ashland head coach Robyn Fralick joined the Division I ranks this summer, taking over the reins at Bowling Green State University
 - The Eagles graduated leading scorer Laina Snyder, who tallied 19.6 points and 8.3 rebounds per game in her final campaign, and Andi Daugherty, who added 14.7 points, 4.9 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game
 - Ashland returns three players who averaged double figures in 2017-18, headlined by junior Jodi Johnson at 18.7 points per game while shooting 60.7 percent from the field and 58.3 percent from 3-point range
 - Twelve of the 15 Ashland players come from their home state of Ohio, while the remaining players hail from Michigan and Minnesota
 - The Eagles played Ohio State in exhibition games in each of the last two seasons, falling to the Buckeyes 110-80 in 2017 and 88-79 in 2016
 - This will be Purdue's second exhibition game against a lower division power in the last four years, playing NAIA Division II Marian in 2015-16 before the Knights went on to win the national title
