#BOILERNOTES

The Boilermakers suffered their first loss of the season Thursday, falling to St. John's in their opening game of the 2018 Paradise Jam 68-62. The Boilermakers fell behind early and were never able to fully recover despite 25 points from sophomore Karissa McLaughlin and 17 points and 10 rebounds from junior Ae'Rianna Harris.

McLaughlin's 25 points were a career high, hitting 9-of-14 from the field and 3-of-7 from distance, while adding three assists, three rebounds and two steals. Harris posted her third double-double of the year, moving into a tie for 10th on Purdue's career list with Christa LaCroix. Harris added two assists, three blocks and a steal, hitting 7-of-10 from the floor. Sophomore Tamara Farquhar had a great first half for the Boilermakers with six points and three rebounds, and freshman Kayana Traylor had five points and three assists off the bench.

Purdue was outrebounded for the first time this season 30-29, and surrendered 12 second chance points. The Boilermakers' 19 turnovers were converted into 11 St. John's points.

Ole Miss fell in their tournament opener to No. 2 UConn 90-50, shooting only 32.3 percent against the Huskies and forcing only four turnovers. Crystal Allen and Shannon Dozier scored double figures with 11 points apiece.

TEAM NOTES

- Purdue is in its 44th season of women's basketball, holding a 847-467 all-time record
- The Boilermakers' season-opening win at Ball State was the fifth-largest road win in program history and the biggest since a 43-point win at Butler in 2006
- Purdue had 16 steals against Ball State, its most since Nov. 28, 2012 vs. Georgia Tech in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge
- The Red Storm are the second of three inaugural opponents on the Purdue schedule this season, and the Boilermakers are 143-54 all-time in first-ever meetings
- Purdue's defense is limiting opponents to 55.0 points per game this season, holding them to 35.9 percent from the field and 25.3 percent from 3-point range
- The Boilermakers are outrebounding opponents by an average of 10.2 per game (41.0-30.8)
- Purdue is averaging 15.0 offensive rebounds per game, converting them into an average of 15.6 second chance points
- The Purdue reserves have made a huge impact this season, including 33 points against Ball State and Purdue Fort Wayne and 28 against Western Illinois
- Purdue owns an active streak of 30 consecutive wins when leading after three quarters, including a 17-0 mark last season, and last surrendered a fourth-quarter lead on Jan. 15, 2017 to 11th-ranked Ohio State
- The Boilermakers' four returning starters marks their most since the 2011-12 season, when they returned four as well
- With Ae'Rianna Harris and Dominique Oden earning Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media, Purdue is one-of-two schools to have two players on both teams (Iowa)

LAST TIME OUT

- Purdue suffered its first loss of the season, falling 68-62 to St. John's in the Paradise Jam opener
- Despite shooting 49 percent from the field, the Boilermakers turned the ball over 19 times and surrendered 11 offensive rebounds
- The Boilermakers committed a season-low 12 fouls

HEAD COACH SHARON VERSYP

- In her 13th season on the Boilermaker sidelines, Versyp now has the longest tenure of any coach in program history
- She is the winningest coach in program history, owning 261 victories at Purdue
- Has nine 20-win campaigns in 12 seasons with the Boilermakers, and has won at least 20 games in 12 of 18 career seasons as a head coach
- Versyp is tied with Lin Dunn for the Boilermakers' career Big Ten Conference wins mark at 120 heading into 2018-19
- Her 129 career Big Ten wins are ranked eighth in conference history, are third-most among active coaches and are seven wins shy of moving up to fifth all-time (136, Jim Foster, Ohio State)
- Her 22 career Big Ten Tournament victories are an event record, breaking the previous mark (shared by Jim Foster and Rene Portland) with Purdue's 2017 quarterfinal win over Indiana
- She's led the Boilermakers to the Big Ten Tournament championship game six times in 12 seasons (four titles)
- Versyp has guided Purdue to a program-record nine NCAA Tournament appearances in 12 seasons
- The Boilermakers are 1-of-25 schools to make at least nine tournaments over Versyp's tenure as head coach, and 1-of-5 schools in the Big Ten Conference

#1 KARISSA MCLAUGHLIN

- Scored a career-high 25 points vs. St. John's, hitting 9-of-14 from the field and 3-of-7 from 3-point range
- Saw a streak of 19-straight games with a 3-point field goal broken vs. Purdue Fort Wayne, six shy of the school record

- Poured in 22 points vs. Western Illinois, hitting on 6-of-12 from the field, 4-of-7 from distance and 6-of-6 at the free throw line
- The Boilermakers are 15-2 when she deals at least five assists in a game
- Has a pair of games with at least four 3-pointers this season (Ball State, Western Illinois), now owning seven career games with at least four
- One-of-30 players in the nation to remain perfect at the free throw line so far this season
- Earned 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team honors, becoming 10th player in Purdue history, fifth under Versyp and first Boilermaker since 2013
- Her 75 3-point field goals in 2017-18 are most-ever by a Purdue freshman, third-most in a season in Boilermaker history and second-most by a returning player in the Big Ten

#2 ABBY ABEL

- Named the co-Grand Marshal of the 2018 Indianapolis 500 Festival Parade for her work with the Special Olympics
- Was the keynote speaker at the 2018 Special Olympics USA Games in Seattle
- Created an annual Special Olympics "Play Unified" event at Purdue, which has been held at Cardinal Court in Mackey Arena the last two years with students from across the athletics department and campus

#3 LYNDESE WHILBY

- Transferred to Purdue after one season at Texas Tech, where she averaged 7.2 points in 30 games and nine starts for the Red Raiders

- A three-time Georgia AAAAAA State Champion at McEachern High School

#5 CASSIDY HARDIN

- Has hit eight 3-pointers in the last three games, including four triples vs. Purdue Fort Wayne, shooting 39.1 percent from behind the arc
- Started the season-opener at Ball State, becoming the second freshman in as many years to do so (McLaughlin)
- Hit 96 3-pointers as a senior at Center Grove High School, a school record and the fifth-most in a season in Indiana state history
- Made 260 career 3-pointers, good for eighth-most in state history
- McDonald's All-America nominee

#11 DOMINIQUE ODEN

- Saw a streak of six straight games in double figures end Thursday vs. St. John's
- Matched a career high with four steals at Ball State, and is averaging 2.5 steals per game on the year
- 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)
- Earned Second Team All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media
- Averaged 18.8 points over the final 15 games of the 2017-18 season, topping the 20-point mark nine times
- Led Purdue in scoring at 14.1 points per game, becoming the first sophomore to lead the Boilermakers since 2009-10
- Her nine 20-point games are tied for third-most in Purdue history by a Boilermaker sophomore and the most in Big Ten and postseason play

#15 LÉONY BOUDREAU

- Out indefinitely with an injury
- Along with Dawson College teammate Tamara Farquhar, they are the first two Canadian players in Purdue women's basketball history
- Majoring in biomedical engineering with goals to work with and build prosthetics for paraolympic athletes

#22 JENELLE GRANT

- Transferred to Purdue from the University of the Pacific, where she appeared in 56 games for the Tigers, including 23 starts
- Averaged 7.5 points and 7.2 rebounds per game in 2017-18
- A native of London, England, she's the first british player in Boilermaker history

#23 KAYANA TRAYLOR

- Posted nine points and a career-most six assists vs. Purdue Fort Wayne
- Earned her first career start vs. Harvard
- Put up 12 points, four assists and three steals at Ball State, hitting 6-of-6 at the free throw line
- Second Purdue freshman in as many years to score in double figures in their first career game (McLaughlin)
- Set Martinsville High School records for scoring (2114), assists (437), free throws (472) and games played (98)
- 2018 Indiana Miss Basketball finalist
- McDonald's All-America nominee

#25 TAMARA FARQUHAR

- Tied her career-best with 12 points vs. Western Illinois, hitting 4-of-6 from the floor and 4-of-5 at the free throw line
- Matched a career high with 13 rebounds in the season opener, including four on the offensive end
- Also tied career-high marks at Ball State for steals, three, and assists, two
- Started 17-of-34 games as a freshman, becoming one of five rookie starters for Versyp's career
- Set top-10 Purdue freshman marks for rebounding (163) and blocked shots (28)
- Along with Dawson College teammate Léony Boudreau, they are the first two Canadian players in Purdue women's basketball history

#30 NYAGOA GONY

- Has blocked two shots in three of her first five games
- Tallied five points, nine rebounds and a pair of blocked shots in her collegiate debut, playing 16 minutes
- Led Lincoln High School to its first state championship appearance in 14 years in 2018
- Two-time honorable mention all-state honoree
- Led the state of Nebraska in rebounding in 2015-16

#32 AE'RIANNA HARRIS

- Set Purdue's single-game field goal percentage record vs. Purdue Fort Wayne, going 10-for-10 from the field, becoming the 11th player in Big Ten Conference history to go at least 10-for-10 in a game
- Had back-to-back double-doubles with 10 points and 11 rebounds vs. Western Illinois and 19 points and 14 rebounds vs. Harvard
- Tied for 10th in program history on the double-double list, surpassing Stephanie White and Shereka Wright
- With 12 blocks this season she needs three more to catch Camille Cooper (1998-2001) for third on Purdue's career list
- Named to Lisa Leslie Award preseason watch list for the nation's top center
- 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)
- 2018 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the third Boilermaker to earn the honor and third sophomore in conference history to take home the award
- One-of-3 players (only one to return in 2018-19) in the NCAA last season to post 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots

- Played on back-to-back NJCAA National Championship teams at Gulf Coast State College
- Second player in program history from Senegal, following Aya Traore (2004-06)

- Ole Miss entered the tournament after a win over Western Michigan on Sunday 69-66, but fell to IUPUI on Nov. 9 in Oxford 66-58
- Senior graduate transfer Crystal Allen leads the Rebels at 18.0 points per game entering the week and is their only player in double figures
- Freshman Mimi Reid is averaging 5.0 assists per game, and graduate transfer La'Karis Salter, who followed McPhee-McCuin from Jacksonville leads the team in rebounding at 7.5 per game
