## #BOILERNOTES

The Boilermakers step into the national spotlight Sunday, hosting the 2017 NCAA Champions in Mackey Arena on ESPN2. South Carolina is Purdue's third ranked opponent of the non-conference schedule, and the Boilermakers put their perfect 5-0 home record on the line.

Purdue is coming off a week-long break for final exams after earning a 65-41 victory over Loyola last Sunday in Mackey Arena. The Boilermakers limited the Ramblers to no more than 11 points in each of the four quarters, holding them to 32 percent from the field, and exploded for a season-high 31 points in the third quarter, opening the period with a 19-0 run to blow the game open. Junior Dominique Oden continued her steady stream of scoring, posting 16 points on 5-of-7 shooting to mark her ninth double-figure effort in 10 games this season, and 16 of her last 18 overall. Sophomore Karissa McLaughlin led all scorers with 19 points, hitting 8-of-16, and freshman Kayana Traylor filled out the stat sheet with nine points, a career-high eight assists and five rebounds.

Sunday marks just the fourth all-time meeting between Purdue and South Carolina, and the first since the second round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

**TEAM NOTES**

- Purdue is in its 44th season of women's basketball, holding a 850-469 all-time record
- The Boilermakers are a flawless 5-0 on the season in Mackey Arena, holding opponents to 54.6 points per game on 35.1 percent shooting
- Purdue has started five different lineups in 10 games on the year
- The Boilermakers are making an impact from behind the 3-point arc, hitting 65 so far this season, good for third-most in the conference
- Purdue is 1-of-3 schools in the conference with three scorers ranked in the top-20 in Big Ten, with Oden, McLaughlin and Harris averaging a combined 42.6 points per game
- After not getting double-figure scoring from the bench in the final seven games of 2017-18 and 21 of the last 22 games of the season, the Boilermaker reserves are averaging 17.8 points per game, including 33-point totals against Ball State and Purdue Fort Wayne
- The Boilermakers' season-opening win at Ball State was the fifth-largest road win in program history and the biggest since a 43-point win at Butler in 2006
- Purdue had 16 steals against Ball State, its most since Nov. 28, 2012 vs. Georgia Tech in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge
- Purdue blocked 12 shots at Ohio, tying for the third-most in a game in program history and the most since 2014
- St. John's was the second of three inaugural opponents on the Purdue schedule this season, and the Boilermakers are 143-55 all-time in first-ever meetings
- Purdue owns an active streak of 33 consecutive wins when leading after three quarters, including an 18-0 mark last season, and last surrendered a fourth-quarter lead on Jan. 15, 2017 to 11th-ranked Ohio State
- The Boilermakers' four returning starters marks their most since the 2011-12 season, when they returned four as well
- With Ae'Rianna Harris and Dominique Oden earning Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media, Purdue is one-of-two schools to have two players on both teams (Iowa)

**LAST TIME OUT**

- The Boilermakers won their fifth game at Mackey Arena last Sunday, defeating visiting Loyola Chicago 65-41
- Purdue scored a season-high 31 points in the third quarter, opening the second half on a 19-0 run
- The Boilermakers committed a season-low 11 turnovers, while converting the Ramblers' 21 miscues into 21 points

**HEAD COACH SHARON VERSYP**

- In her 13th season on the Boilermaker sidelines, Versyp now has the longest tenure of any coach in program history
- She is the winningest coach in program history, owning 264 victories at Purdue
- Has nine 20-win campaigns in 12 seasons with the Boilermakers, and has won at least 20 games in 12 of 18 career seasons as a head coach
- Versyp is tied with Lin Dunn for the Boilermakers' career Big Ten Conference wins mark at 120 heading into 2018-19
- Her 129 career Big Ten wins are ranked eighth in conference history, are third-most among active coaches and are seven wins shy of moving up to fifth all-time (136, Jim Foster, Ohio State)
- Her 22 career Big Ten Tournament victories are an event record, breaking the previous mark (shared by Jim Foster and Rene Portland) with Purdue's 2017 quarterfinal win over Indiana
- She's led the Boilermakers to the Big Ten Tournament championship game six times in 12 seasons (four titles)
- Versyp has guided Purdue to a program-record nine NCAA Tournament appearances in 12 seasons
- The Boilermakers are 1-of-25 schools to make at least nine tournaments over Versyp's tenure as head coach, and 1-of-5 schools in the Big Ten Conference

**#1 KARISSA MCLAUGHLIN**

- Joined the Boilermaker record books as the fifth player to hit 5-of-5 from 3-point range in a game, draining all five attempts against No. 21 Miami
- Owns one of the nation's top free throw percentages, hitting 95.7 percent (22-23) at the free throw line
- Third in the Big Ten in assist/turnover ratio at 2.2/1, dealing 38 assists against 17 turnovers on the year
- Scored a career-high 25 points vs. St. John's, hitting 9-of-14 from the field and 3-of-7 from 3-point range
- Saw a streak of 19-straight games with a 3-point field goal broken vs. Purdue Fort Wayne, six shy of the school record
- Poured in 22 points vs. Western Illinois, hitting on 6-of-12 from the field, 4-of-7 from distance and 6-of-6 at the line
- The Boilermakers are 16-2 when she deals at least five assists in a game
- Has four games with at least four 3-pointers this season (Ball State, Western Illinois, Miami, Ohio), now owning eight career games with at least four
- Earned 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team honors, becoming 10th player in Purdue history, fifth under Versyp and first Boilermaker since 2013
- Her 75 3-point field goals in 2017-18 are most-ever by a Purdue freshman and third-most in a season in Boilermaker history

**#2 ABBY ABEL**

- Named the co-Grand Marshal of the 2018 Indianapolis 500 Festival Parade for her work with the Special Olympics
- Was the keynote speaker at the 2018 Special Olympics USA Games in Seattle
- Created an annual Special Olympics "Play Unified" event at Purdue, which has been held at Cardinal Court in Mackey Arena the last two years with students from across the athletics department and campus

**#3 LYNDSY WHILBY**

- Shooting 46.2 percent from the 3-point line (6-13)
- Transferred to Purdue after one season at Texas Tech, where she averaged 7.2 points in 30 games and nine starts for the Red Raiders
- A three-time Georgia AAAAAA State Champion at McEachern High School

**#5 CASSIDY HARDIN**

- Started last Sunday's game vs. Loyola and the season-opener at Ball State, becoming the second freshman in as many years to do so (McLaughlin)
- Hit 96 3-pointers as a senior at Center Grove High School, a school record and the fifth-most in a season in Indiana state history
- Made 260 career 3-pointers, good for eighth-most in state history
- McDonald's All-America nominee

**#11 DOMINIQUE ODEN**

- Has scored in double figures in 9-of-10 games this season and 16 of her last 18 overall
- Became the 33rd 1,000-point scorer at Purdue with 16 at Ohio
- She is the 16th junior in program history to accomplish the feat and the seventh player to do it in under 80 games
- Is the top shooting guard in the Big Ten, ranked 10th overall at 48.7 percent from the field
- Tied for fourth in the Big Ten at 2.0 steals per game, including three games with at least three steals
- Poured in a career-high 27 points against Miami, hitting a career-most six 3's, and leading the team in scoring for the third straight game
- Named to the Big Ten Player of the Week Honor Roll on Monday (12/3)
- Matched a career high with four steals at Ball State
- 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)
- Earned 2017-18 Second Team All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media
- Averaged 18.8 points over the final 15 games of the 2017-18 season, topping the 20-point mark nine times
- Led Purdue in scoring at 14.1 points per game, becoming the first sophomore to lead the Boilermakers since 2009-10
- Her nine 20-point games are tied for third-most in Purdue history by a Boilermaker sophomore and the most in Big Ten and postseason play

### #22 JENELLE GRANT

- Transferred to Purdue from the University of the Pacific, where she appeared in 56 games for the Tigers, including 23 starts
- Averaged 7.5 points and 7.2 rebounds per game in 2017-18
- A native of London, England, she's the first british player in Boilermaker history

### #23 KAYANA TRAYLOR

- Averaging 7.0 points and 4.1 assists per game off the bench, leading the Purdue reserves in scoring
- Finished with nine points, eight assists and five rebounds vs. Loyola
- Posted nine points and six assists vs. Purdue Fort Wayne
- Earned her first career start vs. Harvard
- Put up 12 points, four assists and three steals at Ball State, hitting 6-of-6 at the free throw line
- Second Purdue freshman in as many years to score in double figures in their first career game (McLaughlin)
- Set Martinsville High School records for scoring (2114), assists (437), free throws (472) and games played (98)
- 2018 Indiana Miss Basketball finalist
- McDonald's All-America nominee

### #25 TAMARA FARQUHAR

- Logged her first career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds at Ohio
- Posted her second double-figure scoring game of the season against Ole Miss, finishing with 10 points, three boards and three blocks
- Tied her career-best with 12 points vs. Western Illinois, hitting 4-of-6 from the floor and 4-of-5 at the free throw line
- Matched a career high with 13 rebounds in the season opener, including four on the offensive end
- Also tied career-high marks at Ball State for steals, three, and assists, two
- Started 17-of-34 games as a freshman, becoming one of five rookie starters for Versyp's career
- Set top-10 Purdue freshman marks for rebounding (163) and blocked shots (28)
- Along with Dawson College teammate Léony Boudreau, they are the first two Canadian players in Purdue women's basketball history

### #30 NYAGOA GONY

- Tallied five points, nine rebounds and a pair of blocked shots in her collegiate debut, playing 16 minutes
- Led Lincoln High School to its first state championship appearance in 14 years in 2018
- Two-time honorable mention all-state honoree
- Led the state of Nebraska in rebounding in 2015-16

### #32 AE'RIANNA HARRIS

- Has four double-doubles this season, including her 14-point, 11-rebound, eight-blocked shot effort most recently at Ohio
- Her eight blocks make her 1-of-4 players in Purdue history to reject at least eight in a game and the first since 2013
- Set Purdue's single-game field goal percentage record vs. Purdue Fort Wayne, going 10-for-10 from the field, becoming the 11th player in Big Ten Conference history to go at least 10-for-10 in a game
- Tied for ninth in program history on the double-double list (13), matching Leslie Johnson
- Leads the Big Ten with 28 blocked shots this season, good for second in the NCAA
- One-of-3 players in Purdue history to reject 200 career shots, joining Stacey Lovelace and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton
- Named to Lisa Leslie Award preseason watch list for the nation's top center
- 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)
- 2018 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the third Boilermaker to earn the honor and third sophomore in conference history to take home the award
- One-of-3 players (only one to return in 2018-19) in the NCAA last season to post 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots

- The second player in Boilermaker history to block at least 100 shots in a season, rejecting 105, three shy of Purdue's single-season record and tied for 13th-most in a season in Big Ten Conference history

### #45 FATOU DIAGNE

- Started her first career game vs. Ole Miss, posting career-high totals of six points, seven rebounds and three assists in 22 minutes
- Posted five points and six rebounds in 13 minutes against Purdue Fort Wayne
- Sat out the 2017-18 season at Purdue due to injuries (foot)
- Played on back-to-back NJCAA National Championship teams at Gulf Coast State College
- Second player in program history from Senegal, following Aya Traore (2004-06)

#### OPPONENT NOTES

- The No. 25 Gamecocks come to Mackey Arena at a deciving 5-4, having dropped three of their four losses against top-10 opponents this season
- They most-recently posted a dominant 80-50 victory over Appalachian State, hitting 54.2 percent from the field and outrebounding the Mountaineers 47-27
- South Carolina won the 2017 NCAA Championship, defeating Mississippi State in the final game 67-55
- The Gamecocks have been to at least the Sweet 16 in each of the last five seasons, including the 2015 Final Four and the Elite Eight in 2018
- Head coach Dawn Staley is in her 11th season with the Gamecocks, winning an average of 25 games per season
- South Carolina ranks third in the country with 7.2 blocked shots per game, and is 15th with 146 made free throws
- Junior Te'a Cooper leads her team with 14.0 points per game, hitting a team-most 12 3-point field goals
- Cooper and Purdue sophomore Lyndsey Whilby were teammates at McEachern High School
