#BOILERNOTES

The Boilermakers are set to open conference play today, beginning the 37th season of Big Ten play. It's the first time Purdue has opened conference play with a home game since 2011-12, and the first time they've opened the Big Ten schedule against the Buckeyes since 2013-14. The Big Ten returns to an 18-game conference schedule for the 18th time after playing 16 games for the last two seasons, from 2011-to-2014 and from 1995-to-2007.

Purdue wrapped up a 9-4 non-conference schedule last week with wins over Albany and Bradley at Mackey Arena. The Boilermakers dealt the Braves their first loss of the season Friday behind 23 points from sophomore Karissa McLaughlin and a 14-point, 13-rebound double-double from junior Ae'Rianna Harris. McLaughlin and junior Dominique Oden remain two of the top-10 scorers in the Big Ten at 15.5 and 15.2 points per game, respectively, and Harris leads the Big Ten and is one of the nation's top shot blockers at 3.0 per contest.

The Boilermakers are 7-1 at home this season, averaging 70.5 points per game and shooting a solid 43 percent from the field. The solid shooting percentages in the friendly confines of home continue to the 3-point arc and free throw line where they're cashing in 38 percent and 80 percent, respectively.

TEAM NOTES

- Purdue is in its 44th season of women's basketball, holding an 852-470 all-time record
- The Boilermakers rank eighth in the NCAA in average attendance at 6,520 fans per game
- Purdue is the only school in the conference with two top-10 scorers as McLaughlin and Oden rank eighth and ninth, respectively, at 15.5 and 15.2 points per game
- The Boilermakers rank eighth in the NCAA and are first in the Big Ten with 69 blocks on the season, averaging 5.3 per game
- Purdue has made the 18th-most free throws in the NCAA, netting 181 on the season, and are shooting 83.1 percent (69-83) at the stripe over their last four games
- The Boilermakers' season-opening win at Ball State was the fifth-largest road win in program history and the biggest since a 43-point win at Butler in 2006
- Purdue had 16 steals against Ball State, its most since Nov. 28, 2012 vs. Georgia Tech in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge
- The Boilermakers cashed in 12-of-18 3's against Miami, marking the No. 6 single-game performance in the NCAA this season and tied Purdue's No. 7 single-game mark all-time
- Purdue blocked 12 shots at Ohio, tying for the third-most in a game in program history and the most since 2014
- The Boilermakers hosted 10,086 fans for the South Carolina game on Dec. 16, making Purdue 1-of-6 schools in the nation with an attendance figure of 10,000+ this season
- The Boilermakers' four returning starters marks their most since the 2011-12 season, when they returned four as well
- With Ae'Rianna Harris and Dominique Oden earning Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media, Purdue is one-of-two schools to have two players on both teams (Iowa)

LAST TIME OUT

- The Boilermakers finished the non-conference schedule with back-to-back wins, defeating Bradley University last Friday 74-61
- The Boilermakers outscored the Braves 29-10 in the first quarter, including a 19-0 run to finish the period
- Purdue won the battle on the glass 44-36, and held Bradley to just 36.1 percent from the field

HEAD COACH SHARON VERSYP

- In her 13th season on the Boilermaker sidelines, Versyp now has the longest tenure of any coach in program history
- She is the winningest coach in program history, owning 266 victories at Purdue
- Has nine 20-win campaigns in 12 seasons with the Boilermakers, and has won at least 20 games in 12 of 18 career seasons as a head coach
- Versyp is tied with Lin Dunn for the Boilermakers' career Big Ten Conference wins mark at 120 heading into 2018-19
- Her 129 career Big Ten wins are ranked eighth in conference history, are third-most among active coaches and are seven wins shy of moving up to fifth all-time (136, Jim Foster, Ohio State)
- Her 22 career Big Ten Tournament victories are an event record, breaking the previous mark (shared by Jim Foster and Rene Portland) with Purdue's 2017 quarterfinal win over Indiana
- She's led the Boilermakers to the Big Ten Tournament championship game six times in 12 seasons (four titles)
- Versyp has guided Purdue to a program-record nine NCAA Tournament appearances in 12 seasons
- The Boilermakers are 1-of-25 schools to make at least nine tournaments over Versyp's tenure as head coach, and 1-of-5 schools in the Big Ten Conference

#1 KARISSA MCLAUGHLIN

- Leads the Big Ten and ranks sixth in the NCAA at the free throw line, converting 93 percent (40-43) this season and has cashed in 91.8 percent for her Purdue career (78-85)
- Ranked eighth in the NCAA and leads the Big Ten in minutes played (463:37)
- Dished out six assists in the Albany win against zero turnovers and the Boilermakers are 17-2 in her career when she deals at least five assists in a game
- Joined the Boilermaker record books as the fifth player to hit 5-of-5 from 3-point range in a game, draining all five attempts against No. 21 Miami
- Scored a career-high 25 points twice this season first hitting the mark vs. St. John's, hitting 9-of-14 from the field and 3-of-7 from 3-point range, and scoring 25 again vs. South Carolina as she hit 10-of-12 at the free throw line
- Saw a streak of 19-straight games with a 3-point field goal broken vs. Purdue Fort Wayne, six shy of the school record, and has restarted her streak with nine straight since
- Poured in 22 points vs. Western Illinois, hitting on 6-of-12 from the field, 4-of-7 from distance and 6-of-6 at the line
- Has four games with at least four 3-pointers this season (Ball State, Western Illinois, Miami, Ohio), now owning eight career games with at least four
- Earned 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team honors, becoming 10th player in Purdue history, fifth under Versyp and first Boilermaker since 2013
- Her 75 3-point field goals in 2017-18 are most-ever by a Purdue freshman and third-most in a season in Boilermaker history

#2 ABBY ABEL

- Named the co-Grand Marshal of the 2018 Indianapolis 500 Festival Parade for her work with the Special Olympics
- Was the keynote speaker at the 2018 Special Olympics USA Games in Seattle
- Created an annual Special Olympics "Play Unified" event at Purdue, which has been held at Cardinal Court in Mackey Arena the last two years with students from across the athletics department and campus

#3 LYNDSY WHILBY

- Transferred to Purdue after one season at Texas Tech, where she averaged 7.2 points in 30 games and nine starts for the Red Raiders
- A three-time Georgia AAAAAA State Champion at McEachern High School

#5 CASSIDY HARDIN

- Started last Sunday's game vs. Loyola and the season-opener at Ball State, becoming the second freshman in as many years to do so (McLaughlin)
- Hit 96 3-pointers as a senior at Center Grove High School, a school record and the fifth-most in a season in Indiana state history
- Made 260 career 3-pointers, good for eighth-most in state history
- McDonald's All-America nominee

#11 DOMINIQUE ODEN

- Posted her first career double-double with 19 points and 10 rebounds vs. South Carolina
- Has scored in double figures in 12-of-13 games this season and 19 of her last 21 overall
- Became the 33rd 1,000-point scorer at Purdue with 16 at Ohio
- She is the 16th junior in program history to accomplish the feat and the seventh player to do it in under 80 games
- Is the top shooting guard in the Big Ten, ranked eighth overall at 49.7 percent from the field
- Ranked seventh in the Big Ten at 1.8 steals per game, including three games with at least three steals
- Poured in a career-high 27 points against Miami, hitting a career-most six 3's, and leading the team in scoring for the third straight game
- Named to the Big Ten Player of the Week Honor Roll twice this season (12/3, 12/17)
- Matched a career high with four steals at Ball State
- 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)
- Earned 2017-18 Second Team All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media
- Averaged 18.8 points over the final 15 games of the 2017-18 season, topping the 20-point mark nine times
- Led Purdue in scoring at 14.1 points per game, becoming the first sophomore to lead the Boilermakers since 2009-10
- Her nine 20-point games are tied for third-most in Purdue history by a Boilermaker sophomore and the most in Big Ten and postseason play

- Transferred to Purdue from the University of the Pacific, where she appeared in 56 games for the Tigers, including 23 starts
- Averaged 7.5 points and 7.2 rebounds per game in 2017-18
- A native of London, England, she's the first british player in Boilermaker history

#23 KAYANA TRAYLOR

- Dished a career-most eight assists against Loyola Chicago and Bradley, nearly posting a triple-double with eight points and seven rebounds against Bradley
- Ranked 11th in the Big Ten, second among freshmen, with 4.3 assists per game
- Earned her first career start vs. Harvard
- Put up 12 points, four assists and three steals at Ball State, hitting 6-of-6 at the free throw line
- Second Purdue freshman in as many years to score in double figures in their first career game (McLaughlin)
- Set Martinsville High School records for scoring (2114), assists (437), free throws (472) and games played (98)
- 2018 Indiana Miss Basketball finalist
- McDonald's All-America nominee

#25 TAMARA FARQUHAR

- Logged her first career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds at Ohio
- Posted her second double-figure scoring game of the season against Ole Miss, finishing with 10 points, three boards and three blocks
- Tied her career-best with 12 points vs. Western Illinois, hitting 4-of-6 from the floor and 4-of-5 at the free throw line
- Matched a career high with 13 rebounds in the season opener, including four on the offensive end
- Also tied career-high marks at Ball State for steals, three, and assists, two
- Started 17-of-34 games as a freshman, becoming one of five rookie starters for Versyp's career
- Set top-10 Purdue freshman marks for rebounding (163) and blocked shots (28)
- Along with Dawson College teammate Léony Boudreau, they are the first two Canadian players in Purdue women's basketball history

#30 NYAGOA GONY

- Tallied five points, nine rebounds and a pair of blocked shots in her collegiate debut, playing 16 minutes
- Led Lincoln High School to its first state championship appearance in 14 years in 2018
- Two-time honorable mention all-state honoree
- Led the state of Nebraska in rebounding in 2015-16

#32 AE'RIANNA HARRIS

- Leads the Big Ten with 39 blocked shots this season, good for second in the NCAA, and her 3.00 rejections per game is tied for sixth in the country
- One-of-3 players in Purdue history to reject 200 career shots, joining Stacey Lovelace and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton
- With 219 for her career she remains one block shy of tying Lovelace for No. 2 on the Boilermakers' record list, but well shy of Wisdom-Hylton's record of 281
- Her eight blocks at Ohio make her 1-of-4 players in Purdue history to reject at least eight in a game and the first since 2013
- Set Purdue's single-game field goal percentage record vs. Purdue Fort Wayne, going 10-for-10 from the field, becoming the 11th player in Big Ten Conference history to go at least 10-for-10 in a game
- Has five double-doubles this season, including her 14-point, 13-rebound effort most recently against Bradley
- Tied for eighth in program history on the double-double list (14), matching Camille Cooper
- Named to Lisa Leslie Award preseason watch list for the nation's top center
- 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)
- 2018 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the third Boilermaker to earn the honor and third sophomore in conference history to take home the award
- One-of-3 players (only one to return in 2018-19) in the NCAA last season to post 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots

#45 FATOU DIAGNE

- Started her first career game vs. Ole Miss, posting career-high totals of six points, seven rebounds and three assists in 22 minutes
- Posted five points and six rebounds in 13 minutes against Purdue Fort Wayne
- Sat out the 2017-18 season at Purdue due to injuries (foot)
- Played on back-to-back NJCAA National Championship teams at Gulf Coast State College
- Second player in program history from Senegal, following Aya Traore (2004-06)

OPPONENT NOTES

- The Buckeyes come to Mackey Arena at 4-5 after losing a pair at the West Palm Invitational in the week before the holiday break
- They fell to Butler 66-53 and Virginia Tech 81-73, making their first trip to Mackey Arena with a losing record since 1991
- Ohio State's non-conference schedule was shortened by two games, missing a west-coast roadtrip due to the fires in California where they had scheduled Sacramento State and No. 6 Stanford
- The Buckeyes are led by seventh-year head coach Kevin McGuff, who is 127-56 in his Ohio State tenure and 18 wins shy of 400 in his coaching career
- The Ohio State roster has radical turnover from the 2017-18 season, featuring only two players who stepped on the floor for last year's team: Makayla Waterman and Jensen Caretti
- McGuff brought in six graduate transfers and three freshman during the offseason
- One of the Buckeye transfers is a familiar face as Carmen Grande faced the Boilermakers four times over the last three seasons at Ball State and was second in the NCAA last season in assists for the Cardinals
- Transfer Najah Queenland was teammates with Boilermaker transfer Jenelle Grant last season at the University of the Pacific
- Cleveland State transfer Ashanti Abshaw played for one season under Purdue assistant coach Beth Couture (COO-chur) as an associate head coach for the Vikings
