At the conclusion of each home game, reporters and photographers are invited to file their stories and send their photos from the Lambert Field press box or the Sports Information Office. The office is located in Mackey Arena, Room 15. Phone lines are available at both locations.

GAME DAY SERVICES

Game programs, notes and information guides will be available to all members of the working media prior to the start of all home games. Final printed results will be provided upon request. After the completion of each game, head coach Doug Schreiber and any requested Purdue baseball players will be available for interviews. All post-game interviews will be done at Lambert Field.

A season after finishing one win from the Big Ten regular season championship, the 2006 Purdue Boilermakers look to take that final step towards a conference title.

A solid nucleus from the 2005 squad returns, primary in the field and at the plate. The Boilermakers return their entire starting infield, as well as the starting catcher and right fielder.

The offensive nucleus is formed around All-America shortstop Mitch Hilligoss, and includes 2004 team home run leader John Hunter and 2005 home run leader Neal Gorka.

On the hill, Purdue features 2005 all-conference selection Brent Coudron and 2004 all-conference honoree Trae Dauby, as well as second-year closer Chris Toneguzzi, from a staff that posted the best ERA in the Big Ten Conference during conference action.

Behind The Dish

The Boilermakers return the services of redshirt junior Spencer Ingaldson (Rapid City, S.D.) as the starting catcher this season. As a first-year starter in 2005, Ingaldson threw out nearly 40-percent of would-be base stealers in Big Ten play while batting .303 in conference games.

Junior Jeff Mojzik (Schererville, Ind.) saw some time behind the plate a year ago and could see more action this season, while redshirt freshman Eric Nielsen (Elkhart, Ind.) will challenge for playing time once he returns to full strength from arm surgery he had a year ago.

Providing depth at catcher for the Boilermakers will be sophomore Jordan Comadena (Normal, Ill.) and redshirt freshman Chris Ivanic (Des Plaines, Ill.).

On The Corners

Senior Eric Wolfe (Toronto, Ontario) returns for his fourth year as the starting first baseman for the Boilermakers. Wolfe is widely considered the top fielding first baseman in the Big Ten. In 2005, he was the only starting first baseman in the conference to post a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage for the season, and has committed just three errors in 1320 career chances.

The hot corner could be a battle for the starting role, as two Boilermakers return after starting numerous games at third base last season.

Senior John Hunter (West Lafayette, Ind.) started half of the season at third, before moving to designated hitter in the final weeks of the season. Hunter earned all-conference honors at third base in 2005, batting over .300 for the season.

Sophomore Dane Wolfe (Toronto, Ontario) started 11 games at third base a year ago, and has the ability to make the tough play appear routine.

Backing up Wolfe at first base will Hunter, freshman Ryne White (Chicago, Ill.) and redshirt sophomore Kyle Lauderdale (Elgin, Ill.). Freshman Andrew Madia (Carmel, Ind.) and junior Dan Stahl (Macungie, Pa.) provide further depth at both corner spots.

Up The Middle

Experts say you can find a quality fielding team when you find one that returns the players up the middle. That is the case this season for the Boilermakers, as they return both starting middle infielders.

Junior Mitch Hilligoss (Windsor, Ill.) returns for his second season as the Purdue shortstop, a year after becoming the second Boilermaker in program history to earn All-America honors. Hilligoss led the Big Ten Conference with a .404 batting average, and

established the Purdue single-season hits record with 92. Hilligoss was a first team all-conference selection, as well as the Big Ten all-tournament shortstop.

Hilligoss' double-play partner is junior Eric Osborn (Fishers, Ind.). Osborn has been the starting second baseman for the Boilermakers since coming to campus for the 2004 season. A solid glove up the middle, Osborn fielded at a .983 clip last season, committing only four errors in 232 chances.

Dane Wolfe provides depth at both second base and shortstop, while freshmen John Cummins (Terre Haute, Ind.) and Kyle Reesing (Austin, Texas) give further depth to the middle infield. Comadena may also see time at second base for the Boilermakers.

The Outfield

Purdue needs to replace two starting outfielders from the 2005 campaign, but can rely on senior Neal Gorka (Westchester, Ill.) to be the outfield's foundation in right field.

Gorka, a former true walk-on, was second on the team last year with a .337 batting average while leading the Boilermakers with seven home runs. A tireless work ethic has made the strong-armed outfielder a fixture in the middle of the Purdue lineup.

Left field and centerfield will be patrolled this season by first-year Boilermakers.

Reesing, a transfer from Rice University, is the favorite for the centerfield position, but will be pushed for action by freshman, and fellow Texan, Alex Jaffee (El Paso, Texas).

The starting left field spot will likely come down to a battle between White, Cummins and Comadena. Each has the ability to provide a solid bat in the lineup, with White adding some pop from the left side. Freshman walk-on Jonathan Lilly (Floyds Knobs, Ind.) will be redshirted this season.

On The Hill

The biggest hit to the Purdue team from one year ago came at pitcher, as two of the four weekend starters were lost to graduation.

Returning to their weekend posts on the mound are senior Brent Coudron (Adrian, Mich.) and junior Dan Sattler (West Lafayette, Ind.).

Coudron was 4-4 last season, 3-2 in Big Ten play with a 3.00 ERA in conference action. His Big Ten ERA ranked fourth in the conference, and earned him a third team All-Big Ten selection.

Sattler was the Sunday starter for the Boilermakers, starting seven games in 2005 during Big Ten play. The local product will likely be a Saturday starter this season, along with Coudron.

The Friday starting spot will be filled by senior Jay Buente (Evansville, Ind.), a hard-throwing right-hander who was 3-2 last year, mainly in a relief role. Buente was a starter during the 2005 summer season, establishing a team record for strikeouts with 100 for the Wisconsin Woodchucks.

Filling the Sunday role for the Boilermakers will be junior transfer Ricky Heines (San Antonio, Texas), who comes to Purdue from Midland College.

The faces coming out of the bullpen should be familiar to Boilermaker fans, as seniors Chris Toneguzzi (Thunder Bay, Ontario) and Trae Dauby (Dale, Ind.) receive the brunt of the relief work in 2006.

Toneguzzi was the closer in 2005, and will return to that role this season. An intimidating figure on the mound at 6'5" and 250 pounds, Toneguzzi overpowered Big

The Schedule

The Purdue non-conference schedule is routinely one of the toughest in the Midwest. This season will be no different.

The Boilermakers open the season in Louisiana, with games vs. Louisiana-Lafayette, Louisiana-Monroe and Kansas State. From there Purdue attacks the top 25 with trips to North Carolina and three games with the top-10 Tar Heels and to Missouri for three games with the top-15 Tigers.

Purdue also plays annual foe Notre Dame, which is also ranked among the top 25 programs in the country in most preseason polls.

In the Big Ten portion of the season, the Boilermakers will travel to Illinois (March 31-April 2), Indiana (April 14-16), Ohio State (April 28-30) and Iowa (May 12-14). At home, Purdue will play host to Michigan State (April 7-9), Michigan (April 21-23) and Penn State (May 6-8), before concluding the regular season vs. Northwestern (May 19-21).
