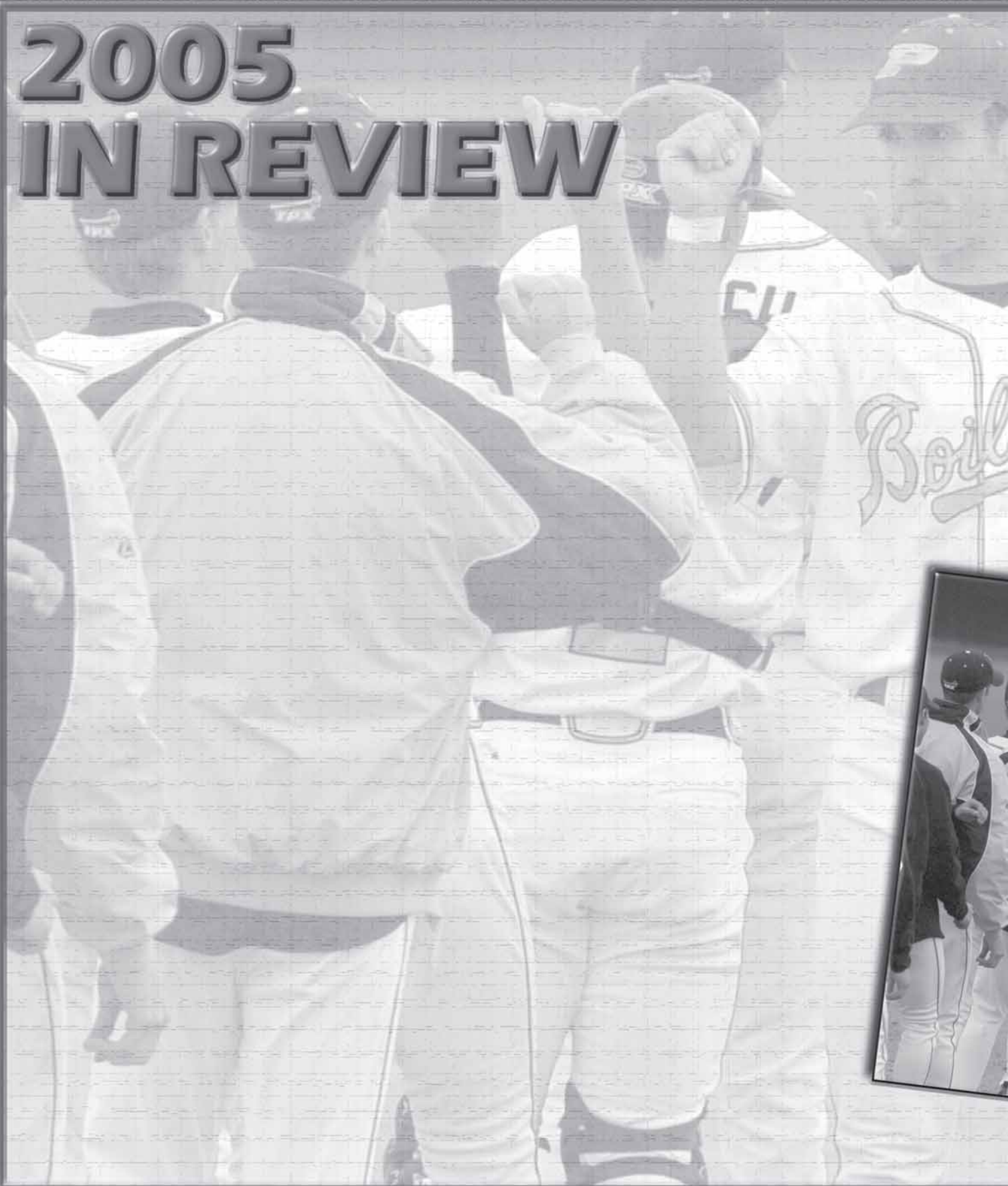

2005 IN REVIEW

MURDEROUS ROW

The slow start to the 2005 season might not have been pretty, but the competition was no doubt spectacular. Through the completion of the Spring Break trip, the Purdue baseball team's non-conference schedule was ranked as the toughest in the nation, according to BoydsWorld.com.

A website that calculates a team's strength of schedule and RPI (Ratings Power Index), much the way the NCAA does, BoydsWorld.com indicated that the Purdue schedule was stronger than that of any of the other 286 NCAA Division I baseball programs.

Purdue opened the season with Florida Atlantic, a 2004 NCAA postseason qualifier, and continued with Mississippi, a 2005 NCAA Super Regional participant. Texas was next on the schedule, a team that won the 2005 NCAA College World Series, and then featured Rice, another Super Regional qualifier. Lamar concluded the opening 11-game stretch, a squad that claimed the 2003 and 2004 Southland Conference title.

Purdue makes it a habit to play the top teams in the nation during its non-conference schedule, year in and year out. From programs like Texas and Rice, to North Carolina and Wake Forest, and on to Mississippi, Florida, and Georgia Tech, the Boilermakers consistently play more NCAA qualifiers than any other program in the Big Ten Conference.

THE LATE-SEASON CHARGE

Through the murderous section of non-conference contests and the first three Big Ten series, Purdue found itself with a disappointing 12-22 overall record and a 5-7 mark in the conference. Then, without warning, the Boilermakers steamed up and took off, charging through the final four weeks of the season like a runaway freight train.

In the final four conference weekends, the Boilermaker Nine posted a conference record of 12-4, claiming series from Minnesota, Iowa and Indiana, and splitting a series with Michigan. Purdue climbed the Big Ten standings, moving from eighth seventh place to second, it's best Big Ten finish since placing second in 2001.

During those final 16 conference games, the Boilermakers out-hit their opponents 154-131. In terms of average, Purdue batted .314 during that 16-game stint, while limiting their opponents to a .273 average. The Boilermaker pitching staff, which produced the lowest ERA in the Big Ten in 2005, posted a 3.51 ERA during the final 16 games of the conference schedule.

DOING WHAT COULDN'T BE DONE

When the weekend of April 29, 30, and May 1 came around, the Boilermakers found themselves struggling in the Big Ten with a 5-7 record. When the weekend was finished, Purdue would have won four conference games, and done so against the least probable opponent.

The Purdue won the Friday contest vs. the Minnesota Golden Gophers by the score of 5-2. A two-run blast by Neal Gorka broke a 2-2 tie and gave the Boilermakers the series opening win. The Saturday doubleheader was one that feature a tough tandem of Boilermaker hurlers, as Mitch Pruemer and Brent Coudron shut down the Gopher offense with a pair of complete games, winning 6-2 and 3-0. The Sunday finale saw the Boilermakers rally from a two-run deficit, scoring four runs in the eighth inning to win 7-3.

The sweep was the first for the Boilermakers since 2001, when the team took four from Northwestern in Evanston in early April. Also, it marked the first time Purdue won a season series vs. Minnesota since 2001.

More impressively, the series win for the Boilermakers snapped a string of 24 consecutive series for the Gophers without a series loss. In every series, dating back to the weekend of April 19-20, 2002, Minnesota had either won or split every Big Ten series. This was the first time a team had swept the Gophers since 2001.

A WILD, WILD, WILD FINISH

Every once in a while, a baseball game makes the fans, the players, and the coaches wonder what had just happened. On May 14 at Lambert Field, that was exactly the way a game vs. the Iowa Hawkeyes ended.

After the first two games of the series were split, the teams were tied at 3-3 in Game Three, heading to the bottom of the seventh, and final, inning. Eric Osborn opened the inning with a single to left, but was erased when a sacrifice bunt attempt resulted in a fielder's choice. Dane Wolfe, now on first base, was removed from the game in favor of a pinch runner, John Phegley. With one out, Iowa relied pitcher Kevin Sunderman unleashed a wild pitch, allowing Phegley to move safely to second base. Another Sunderman errant offering propelled Phegley to third. A walk to Mike Coles gave the Boilermakers runners on the corners with one out and bring Eric Wolfe to the plate. The second offering from Sunderman bounced in front of catcher Ben Geelan, caroming off the catcher and allowing Phegley to scamper home with the winning run.

Purdue won the contest with a run in the bottom of the final inning thanks, in part, to three wild pitches by the Hawkeye bullpen. The Boilermakers would go onto win the Sunday game and set themselves up for a possible run at the Big Ten title.



JUST SHY OF THE TITLE

With the final weekend sending the Boilermakers to Bloomington to face the Indiana Hoosiers, Purdue still had a mathematical shot at the Big Ten regular season championship, a title that would be the first for the team since 1909. However, the Boilermakers would need to take care of a lot of their own business, and receive even more help from the Iowa Hawkeyes, who were in a series with first place Illinois.

The first two days of the series came and went, and the Boilermakers still had the carrot dangling in front of themselves. Three wins against Indiana, and two wins in three games by Iowa, set up the Sunday showdown. If Purdue could beat Indiana, and Iowa could pull off one more win in Champaign, the Boilermakers would get the elusive crown.

Iowa did their part that afternoon, knocking off the Illini for the third time in four games. However, the dream of a trophy would come up short as Purdue fell to Indiana in the season finale. The Boilermakers finished second in the Big Ten for the second time in five years.

At the Big Ten Tournament in Champaign, Purdue lost the tournament opener to Ohio State, but would rebound on their second day by eliminating Michigan and Illinois. A chance to make it to the tournament title game was cut short by Minnesota, which defeated the Boilermakers 9-7.

ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS

Five Boilermakers earned All-Big Ten honors in 2005: two were named to the first team, two to the second team, and one to the third team. Purdue had not placed multiple players on the first team

of the all-conference squad since 2001, when four Boilermakers were honored on the top squad.

Right-handed pitcher Scott Byrnes was a unanimous selection to the first team by the Big Ten coaches, and shortstop Mitch Hilligoss joined him on the top team after winning the conference batting title. Earning second team honors were right-handed pitcher Mitch Pruemer and third baseman John Hunter. The honor was Hunter's second, having earned all-conference accolades in 2004. Southpaw Brent Coudron was named to the third team, giving the Boilermakers three starting pitchers on the All-Big Ten squad.

Hilligoss rolled on into the Big Ten Tournament, picking up all-tournament honors at shortstop. Joining Hilligoss on the postseason team was first baseman Eric Wolfe. The duo were the first all-tournament selections for Purdue since 2000, when Dave Gassner and Nate Sickler were tabbed to the team.

PURDUE'S ALL-AMERICAN

Purdue shortstop Mitch Hilligoss was named to the All-America teams by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) and the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA), with both organizations naming the Windsor, Ill., native to their third team.

With the selection, Hilligoss became the second Boilermaker to earn All-America honors in the 118-year history of the Purdue program. Hilligoss joined Mike Biltmeyer, who was a third-team selection by the ABCA in 1993.

On the season, Hilligoss etched his name high in the Purdue single-season record books. The first-team All-Big Ten honoree established the Purdue record with 92 base hits, shattering the former record of 82 by Archi Cianfrocco.

Hilligoss' batting average of .404 was good for the batting title in the Big Ten in 2005, and ranks second on the Purdue records list among players with a minimum of 175 at-bats in a season. Of the 38 batters named to the three NCBWA All-America teams, only six accumulated a season batting average above the .400 mark.

ACADEMIC ALL-BIG TEN SELECTIONS

11 Boilermakers were named to the Academic All-Big Ten team following the 2005 season: Jay Buente, Matt Bush, Scott Byrnes, Brent Coudron, Andy Dahl, Neal Gorka, Andrew Groves, John Hunter, Eric Osborn, Dan Sattler, and Eric Wolfe.

The selection for Bush, Byrnes and Gorka were the third of their careers, while Buente, Coudron and Wolfe have earned two academic honors.

BYRNES BECOMES A BLUE JAY

The Toronto Blue Jays selected right-handed pitcher Scott Byrnes in the 39th round of the 2005 Major League Baseball first-year baseball draft. Byrnes became the 20th Purdue pitcher to be selected since the drafts inception in 1965, and the sixth under head coach Doug Schreiber.

A unanimous first-team All-Big Ten honoree in 2005, Byrnes posted a 6-4 record on the hill with an ERA of 3.96. In 84 innings of work, the Cincinnati native struck out 58.

Byrnes, who is ranked sixth on the Purdue career charts in innings (271.0) and strikeouts (211), made his professional debut on June 21st with the Pulaski Blue Jays of the Appalachian League. For the season, Byrnes was 2-2 in 21 appearances, recording three saves and 36 strikeouts in 32.1 innings of work.
