HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

– BOILERS TO TAKE ON THREE FIRST TIME FOES IN FIRST TRIP TO PHOENIX –

Purdue baseball's first-ever trip to Arizona sets up as another four-game weekend, as the Boilermakers take on three first-time opponents at Arizona State's Phoenix Muni Classic being played at the longtime Major League Baseball spring training stadium in the Valley of the Sun.

Having already played doubleheaders against Western Carolina and Sam Houston State over the first two weekends of the young season, Purdue is set to play a doubleheader three weeks in a row for the first time since the end of the 2008 when the Big Ten schedule featured a doubleheader of two seven-inning games every Saturday. The Boilers posted their first doubleheader sweep since April 2012 against Sam Houston State last weekend.

While Purdue may have never played in the state of Arizona before, 17th-year head coach **Doug Schreiber** is quite familiar with the Phoenix area and the ASU program. He was an assistant with the Sun Devils from 1995-1998, helping lead ASU to the championship game of the 1998 College World Series. He was hired as the head coach at Purdue shortly thereafter.

Arizona State is led by new head coach Tracy Smith, who was the skipper of Indiana from 2006-14. The Kentland, Ind., native made the move west after leading the Hoosiers to consecutive Big Ten titles in 2013 and 2014 as well as the 2013 College World Series. Schreiber's Purdue teams were 17-12 against Smith's IU teams. The Boilers won 11 of the 14 meetings, including seven in a row at one point, from the 2008 Big Ten Tournament through 2012. The two old rivals squared off in the Big Ten Tournament five times during that stretch, including the championship game in 2012.

Purdue's last games against current members of the West Coast, Pac-12 and Western Athletic Conferences – the leagues that Gonzaga, Arizona State and CSU Bakersfield call home, respectively – were in 2001 (San Diego), 2012 (UCLA) and 2010 (Chicago State). With next weekend's opponent, Oklahoma, also being a first-time foe, the Boilers are currently in the midst of a stretch in which 10 of the 11 games are against teams they've never played before.

Brandon Krieg's 26-game reached base safely streak, which dates back to April 15 of last season, was tied for the longest in the Big Ten and the 12th longest in the country entering the week. The senior has hit safely in each of the first seven games this year and leads the team with 11 hits and a .379 batting average. Through seven games last season, he was only 3-for-25. But ever since reaching base safely six times and recording the game-winning RBI with a walk-off single in the April 15 victory against Butler last year, he has been the Boilers' most consistent player both offensively and defensively. The move to third base this year has gone smoothly for the Indianapolis native.

Michael Vilardo joined **Kyle Wood** and Krieg as active Boilers with a walk-off RBI last weekend when his sacrifice fly plated the game-winning run in the 12th inning vs. Sam Houston State. **Kyle Johnson** (8 RBI, 3 runs) and Vilardo (6 RBI, 5 runs) have both produced 11 runs for Purdue early this season. Johnson has recorded an RBI in five of the first seven games while batting third in the lineup every time.

The Boilermakers will give the ball to **Mike Kornacker** again in the first game of the weekend. He'll be allowed to pitch a little bit deeper into the game as he's continued to be stretched out. The freshman surrendered one run on two hits while throwing 32 of his 45 pitches for strikes vs. Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in his collegiate debut. Brett Haan will start Friday night against Arizona State after working 5 1/3 innings of two-run ball vs. SHSU. Both runs scored after he left the game in the sixth inning. **Gavin Downs**, **Shane Bryant** and **Matt Frawley** are the top candidates to start the other two games. Frawley would start Saturday if he's not needed to help Purdue secure a win in any of the first three games.

Gonzaga went 2-2 over each of its first two weekends, posting two wins against Utah Valley and UC Davis. Arizona State has compiled its 4-3 record against Oklahoma State (2-1), Oklahoma (midweek win) and TCU (1-2). Bakersfield was swept by Creighton in a season-opening series, won 3-of-4 against Northern Kentucky and lost its midweek opener to Cal Poly Tuesday.

BOILERMAKERS TO TAKE ON THREE FIRST-TIME FOES IN FIRST TRIP TO ARIZONA

• Another four-game weekend is on tap as Purdue travels to Arizona for the first time for the Phoenix Muni Classic hosted by Arizona State. Gonzaga, CSU Bakersfield and the Sun Devils are all first-time opponents. The tournament will be played at a longtime MLB spring training venue that last served as the home of the Oakland A's. Next week's opponent, Oklahoma, is also a first-time foe for the Boilers.

• Gonzaga calls the West Coast Conference home, Arizona State competes in the Pac-12 Conference and CSU Bakersfield is a member of the Western Athletic Conference. Purdue has only played one current opponent of the WCC, losing a 2001 spring break trip game at San Diego. The Boilers lost 2-of-3 at ASU's Pac-12 rival UCLA in 2012, but rallied to win the series finale with a 10-run ninth inning. Purdue swept had four wins against Chicago State in 2010 in its last action against a current member of the WAC.

• Purdue went 2-2 at the Kleberg Bank College Classic last weekend in Corpus Christi, Texas. The Boilers swept a doubleheader against three-time defending Southland Conference champion and 2015 preseason favorite Sam Houston State in thrilling fashion Saturday, winning both games in their final at-bat. **Michael Vilardo** recorded the game-winning RBI in each game on a sacrifice fly. Purdue lost to Missouri, 1-0, in its final game of the weekend. It was the Boilers' first 1-0 loss since the 2011 season finale against Minnesota at the Big Ten Tournament. The Tigers escaped a bases-loaded jam in the sixth inning by turning an unconventional 5-2-3-2 triple play.

• **Brandon Krieg**, **Kyle Wood** and **Matt Gibbs** joined Vilardo on the All-Tournament Team in Corpus Christi. Krieg finished the weekend 6-for-18 and hit safely in every game to extend his career-best reached base safely streak to 26 straight games. Wood was 4-for-14 with two doubles and four walks. He executed a hit-and-run single in the 12th inning of game one against Sam Houston State to set the stage for Purdue's walk-off win. Gibbs earned the victory in both wins vs. SHSU after working a combined three innings of one-hit relief. He induced and started a game-ending 1-6-3 double play to close out the nightcap of the doubleheader and became the first Purdue pitcher since at least the beginning of the 2008 season to earn a victory in consecutive games.

• The Boilermakers also have played the two-time defending champion and 2015 preseason favorite of the Southern Conference, opening with a three-game series at Western Carolina. The Feb 13 opener was the earliest in program history.

VILARDO & OLUND TEAM UP FOR GAME-WINNING RUN IN WALK-OFF WIN

• Purdue scored twice in the bottom of the 12th inning to rally for a 4-3 victory against Sam Houston State in the first game of a neutral-site doubleheader in Corpus Christi Feb. 21. **Alec Olund** scored the game-winning run as pinch runner on **Michael Vilardo's** sacrifice fly to right center field. Vilardo joined **Kyle Wood** and **Brandon Krieg** as active Boilers with game-winning RBI in a walk-off victory.

• In the nightcap of the doubleheader, Purdue overcame deficits of 3-0 and 7-2 to win 9-7 after scoring three times in the top of the ninth inning. Vilardo again delivered the go-ahead run with a sacrifice fly. **Cody Strong** led off the final inning of both games with a base hit against SHSU closer Ryan Brinley, who took the loss in both games after giving up a combined five runs. Brinley entered the day having not allowed a run in his 27 innings of relief for SHSU dating back to 2014.

• **Jack Picchiotti** drove in the game-tying run in both games of the doubleheader. He came through with a pinch-hit, two-out RBI single in the seventh inning of game one. In the nightcap, he also singled home the tying run and later scored the go-ahead tally on Vilardo's sac fly. **Daniel Sander's** pinch hit double plated the game-tying run in the 12th inning of game one.

• Of the 21 innings played in the SHSU doubleheader, Purdue only held the lead in the final inning of both games. The five-run deficit (7-2) the Boilers overcame in game two marked their largest comeback since scoring 10 times in the ninth inning at UCLA in May 2012 to rally back from a 10-5 hole entering the frame. However, Purdue's last win after trailing in the ninth inning was a May 2012 victory against Indiana State, 2-1 in 10 innings, in the final game at Lambert Field. A May 2005 doubleheader sweep of Iowa at Lambert is believed to be the last time Purdue won two games on the same day in its final at-bat.

KRIEG'S REACHED BASE SAFELY STREAK AT 26 STRAIGHT

• **Brandon Krieg** is the only Boilermaker that has hit safely in each of the first seven games this season, extending his reached base safely streak to 26 consecutive games dating back to 2014. Entering the weekend it ranked as the 12th longest active streak in the country. He has hit safely in 20 of the 26 games and overtook **Kyle Wood's** 24-game run last year for the longest reached base streak by an active Boiler. Cameron Perkins reached base safely in 50 consecutive games in 2011.

• Through seven games last season Krieg was 3-for-25 en route to a 3-for-38 start. But he batted .325 from April 15 through the end of the season.

PURDUE PITCHERS STRIKE OUT 15 IN GAME THREE WIN AT WCU

• **Matt Frawley** (5), **Kyle Wood** (7) and **Joe Eichmann** (3) teamed up to strike out 15 Western Carolina batters as Purdue won game three of the series in Cullowhee, 9-5. It ranked as the third-highest strikeout total in program history and the most since the Boilers fanned 16 in a March 2010 victory at Ohio. Frawley struck out four his first time through the lineup. Wood struck out seven of the 15 batters he faced, striking out the side in the sixth and seventh innings. Eichmann struck out WCU's 2-3-4 hitters in order after giving up a leadoff walk and a batter reaching on an error to open the ninth inning. The senior earned his first career save.

• Wood's career-high strikeout total was the most by a Purdue pitcher since Jordan Minch and Connor Podkul both fanned seven as starters last season. However, they pitched at least six innings each time. Wood racked up his seven Ks in only three innings. **Matt Gibbs** and **Tim McElroy** both struck out six in a relief appearance last season, but Wood's seven Ks were the most by a Purdue reliever since Pat Gannon had seven over four innings in a March 2011 win at Tennessee Tech.

• Overall, Purdue pitchers have been more aggressive in the strike zone than what they demonstrated for much of last season. The Boilers have recorded 53 strikeouts vs. 19 walks (a 2.79 K/BB ratio) over the first seven games. A year ago, the pitching staff had only 17 more strikeouts (243) than walks (226), a 1.08 K/BB ratio.

STRONG OUTINGS FROM HAAN, McELROY & BRYANT IN CORPUS CHRISTI

• While **Matt Gibbs** garnered All-Tournament Team honors after earning the win in both games of the Sam Houston State doubleheaders, he was just one of a number of Purdue pitchers that strong outings in South Texas.

• As the starting pitcher in game one vs. SHSU, **Brett Haan** escaped a bases loaded jam in the first inning and went on to retire 10 consecutive batters. Both runs he was charged with scored after he left the mound in the sixth with the game still scoreless. **Tim McElroy** retired nine of the 10 batters he faced in game one vs. SHSU to help get the game into extra innings. The lefty also pitched an inning of scoreless relief Sunday against Missouri.

• **Shane Bryant** allowed a pair of inherited runners to score in game one vs. SHSU, but closed the weekend with four innings of two-hit relief, retiring 11 of the 13 batters he faced. The righthander retired the first seven batters he faced while working 1-2-3 innings in the sixth and seventh, Purdue's first 1-2-3 frames of the game.

PICCHIOTTI & EVAK'S CARRY OVER REACHED SAFELY STREAKS END

• Like **Brandon Krieg**, **Jack Picchiotti** entered 2015 riding a notable 19-game reached base safely streak. Picchiotti had reached base safely in the final 19 games of 2014 season in which he started, but that streak came to an end at 20 in game two of the Western Carolina series. It dated back to April 5, 2014, and the nightcap of a doubleheader vs. Penn State.

• **Jeff Evak's** 10-game reached safely streak that spanned the final seven games of 2014 and the first three this year ended in the Feb. 20 loss to Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

FINDING A WAY TO WIN MORE CLOSE GAMES

- Purdue was 9-16 in games decided by two runs or fewer last season. Ten of the 17 one-run games came in Big Ten play. Additionally, eight of those 25 close games were extra-innings affairs, Purdue going 3-5 in games longer than nine innings. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in the Big Ten during the regular season and the 17 one-run games ranked second in the league behind only Illinois (18).
- A better showing in close games coupled with a less-daunting pre-Big Ten schedule would seem to go hand in hand in helping Purdue have a better season this year. With six starting position players and almost the entire bullpen back from last year, numerous Boilers have experienced the ups and downs of numerous nail biters as well as playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers in 2014.
- Conversely, staying out of big innings early in games would also help Purdue's cause. The Boilers were outscored 53-7 in the first inning during the 2014 campaign, leading to many early deficits the offense was not equipped to overcome after scoring four or more runs in an inning only twice in 50 games.

NINE TRANSFERS LOOKING TO MAKE INSTANT IMPACT

- Eight of Purdue's nine transfers made their team debuts early in the 2015 season. Michael Vilardo has started every game so far and already had a big impact at the top of the lineup. **Justin Gubser** has seen action at catcher and first base and batted cleanup a few times. **Brett Carlson** has made starts at second base and designated hitter and displayed some valuable patience at the plate. He had some big hits in the doubleheader sweep of Sam Houston State.
- Five of the nine transfers began their college careers at other four-year universities. **Shane Bryant** (Indiana Wesleyan), **Brian Ghiselli** (Miami Univ.) and Carlson (Austin Peay) have all been part of the program since the fall of 2013, sitting out last season as redshirts. Vilardo joined the program at the start of the 2015 spring semester as a graduate transfer from Penn, where he was a Second Team All-Ivy League second baseman in 2014. He has settled in as the left fielder for the Boilers after starting the season opener at second base. **Daniel Sander** and **Alex Lyons** helped Vincennes University reach the 2014 NJCAA Division II World Series.
- Among the freshmen, Harry Shipley has started every game at shortstop and held his own defensively and with the bat in the nine hole. **Evan Kennedy** had two hits and a walk while making his first collegiate start (at designated hitter) in the loss to Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. **Alec Olund** scored the game-winning run in the walk-off victory against Sam Houston State and then started for the first time (in right field) in the nightcap, delivering a big two-out, two-run single to help Purdue rally from a 7-2 deficit.

AIMING TO CARRY OVER DEFENSIVE EXCELLENCE INTO 2015

- Purdue led the Big Ten in double plays turned (54) and outfield assists (17) through the end of the 2014 regular season. Those areas of defensive excellence coupled with a .971 fielding percentage helped keep the Boilers in the numerous close games a year ago. Defense is expected to remain a team strength but was not during the season-opening weekend. Purdue committed multiple errors in all three games at WCU and nine for the series. The Boilermakers did not commit multiple errors in three straight games all of last season and had multiple errors in consecutive games only four times. Purdue better defensively in Corpus Christi, committing four errors over the course of the four games. All four miscues came in the game two win against Sam Houston State.
- Freshman **Harry Shipley** has started every game at shortstop primarily because of his defensive prowess. Two-year starting infielder **Brandon Krieg** moved to third base this year after strong defensive seasons at second base (2013) and shortstop (2014). **Kyle Johnson** is in his third season as the starter in center field. Sophomore **Jeff Evak** is fast enough to start in center field but has remained a corner outfielder in right.
- **Cody Strong** and **Jack Picchiotti** had each seen action at six different positions during their underclassman seasons. Strong started the season opener in left field but moved back to second base, where he was a constant in 2014, in the games he has started since. Newcomer **Brett Carlson** has also seen action at second base and been flawless defensively. Picchiotti has already started games at catcher, left field and right field early this season. He was projected to take over the full-time duties at catcher this season as Purdue needed to replace the graduated (and drafted) Sean McHugh, who was the team's overall and defensive MVP in 2014 at catcher.

SUMMER LEAGUE SUCCESS

- **Kyle Johnson** (Peninsula Pilots, Coastal Plain League) and **Kyle Wood** (Lakeshore Chinooks, Northwoods League) helped their summer league teams win league championships in the summer of 2014. They were the starting designated hitters in the two games their teams won in the finals round of the playoffs to clinch the league titles. Johnson was in the starting lineup for all six games Peninsula won in the playoffs and did not play in any of the three losses. Wood's team was named the nation's top summer league team by Perfect Game USA.
- **Jeff Evak** and **Matt Frawley** were named all-stars in the Midwest Collegiate League. **Brian Ghiselli** pitched in the Great Lakes League All-Star Game.

RUBBER GAME STRUGGLES

- Purdue did not win a weekend series in 2014 due in part to an 0-6 record in rubber games. Four times the Boilers won the opener of the series, but ended up losing two-of-three. Purdue has lost nine straight weekend rubber games dating back to May 2012. The Boilermakers have not won a weekend series after losing the opener since May 2009 at Michigan State. In the years since, on 11 occasions Purdue has won the opener of a traditional three-game set but failed to win the series. Nine of those 11 series have been in Big Ten play.

JOHNSON, KRIEG & WOOD AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

- **Kyle Johnson**, **Brandon Krieg** and **Kyle Wood** are all two-year starters that have been constants in the top half of the lineup the last two seasons. The trio was highlighted as the Boilers' contingent among the Big Ten Players to Watch for the 2015 season. Together, Johnson, Krieg and Wood had made a combined 267 starts entering the 2015 season. Johnson (center field) and Krieg (shortstop) were the only two Boilers to make all of their starts at the same position in 2014.
- Wood finished 2014 as the team leader in batting average (.302), on-base percentage (.390) and OPS (.804). He had a 24-game reached base safely streak during the middle of the season and remains the program's main two-way player as a lefthanded relief pitcher.
- Krieg led the 2014 Boilermakers with 12 steals and 28 runs scored. Defensively, he contributed to 32 of the Big Ten-leading 54 double plays Purdue turned. After a 3-for-38 start to the season at the plate, he raised his batting average to .273 by April 20, and .272 entering the final day of the season.
- Johnson seems poised to enjoy a breakout season as the athletic 6-foot-5 outfielder enters his junior campaign having started 88 of the 101 games the last two years. He batted third in the lineup all three games of the 2015 opening weekend and finished WCU series with five hits and four RBI.

BEST IN THE BIG TEN FROM 2008-2012; THIRD BEST IN LEAGUE PLAY FROM 2000-2012

- After a program-best five consecutive Big Ten Tournament berths from 2008-12, Purdue has failed to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament the last two years. With the tournament field remaining at eight teams this year, the Boilers are looking to avoid their first three-year streak of not qualifying since 1988-92 (when it was only a four-team field). Purdue was a Big Ten-best 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in league play (.595) from 2008-12. But the program has managed just a 30-71 overall mark (.297) the last two years.
- From 2000-2012, the Boilermakers were 197-168 (.539) in Big Ten play. Only Minnesota (220-140, .611) and Ohio State (211-152, .581) were better.
