– AROUND THE HORN –

• After winning its final five games of 2015, Purdue enters the new season with the longest active win streak in the country. The five-game win streak was the third longest to close a season in program history. The 1908 & 1992 teams won their final six games.
• The Boilermakers are visiting Atlanta for the first time since a two-game midweek series at Georgia Tech in the middle of the 2004 spring break trip. Purdue assistant coach Wally Crancer is a Tech alumnus and was part of the 2006 College World Series team.
• Purdue has not played at three different fields over the same weekend since the 2013 Big East/Big Ten Challenge, a season-opening event in the Clearwater-St. Petersburg area of Florida's Gulf Coast.
• Purdue has a very veteran squad. Only three newcomers, two freshmen & one JUCO transfer, are expected to travel the first weekend. Five seniors could be in the opening day lineup, the most since 2012.

- Made five of his seven appearances in Big Ten play after not making his collegiate debut until April 11.
- Expected to join Nick Dalesandro as the first Purdue pitchers since 2013 to make their first career starts on the mound during a season-opening weekend. However, he'll be the first non-freshman since 2011 to make his first start on a weekend.
- Worked three innings of one-run ball at nationally ranked and eventual Big Ten champion Illinois in his first outing as a Boilermaker.
- Retired four of the five batters he faced over an inning and a third of hitless relief to close out the series-opening win against Penn State.
- Played four years of varsity baseball, basketball and football at Tippecanoe Valley High School in north central Indiana.
- Batted over .400 each year as a four-time all-conference performer, highlighted by first team honors as an upperclassman.
- Area player of the year and second team all-state performer in basketball averaged 20 points and nine rebounds as a senior.
- First team all-state defensive back as a junior and then earned similar honors as a wide receiver his senior year.

- Active career leader in games started and innings pitched; three-time Academic All-Big Ten and 2015 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar honoree.
- Joined the weekend rotation for the first time in March 2014 and has made 16 of his 26 career starts on weekends.
- Started the 2015 season opener at Western Carolina but did not make another weekend start until Maryland; performed well in midweek starts vs. Louisville, IPFW & Indiana State.
- Led the way in Purdue's 2-1 pitcher's duel win in the middle game at Nebraska last year, inducing 13 ground ball outs over seven innings of one-run ball.
- Put together another strong start vs. NCAA Super Regional qualifier Maryland, taking a 3-1 lead into the ninth inning before the Terps loaded the bases against him & went on to win.
- Worked Purdue's first true complete game since February 2013 in tough-luck loss vs. Ohio State in April 2014, giving up runs in only one inning.
- Earned his first career Big Ten win with seven innings of three-hit ball vs. Michigan (April 2014).
- No. 4 LSU did not score while he was on the mound in first start of 2014.
- True walk-on has been a part of the program since the fall of 2011 but redshirted in 2012 after not making the official 35-man roster.
- Worked 4 1/3 innings of scoreless two-hit relief in his team debut, a 2013 midweek game vs. Indiana State.
- Helped Carroll High School win back-to-back 4A IHSA state titles and was the winning pitcher in 2011 title game; all-conference & all-area honoree went 12-1 to tie the CHS wins record as a senior.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 18th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in nine of its 10 appearances under Schreiber.

The 2015 Boilermakers won their final five games and six of their last seven, posting their third longest season-ending win streak in program history. Kyle Wood won the team triple crown in 2015, becoming the first hitter to do so since 2007 and the 11th Boilermaker position player since 1970 to accomplish the feat.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Ball State (1991-92) and spent 1993 as an assistant at Butler.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132) and games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eighth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

BOILERMAKERS FINISHED 2015 STRONG

• Even during the midst of another season that ultimately would not be remembered as a particularly successful one, the 2015 Boilermakers managed to accomplish a number of things it had not in a few years, culminating with a season-ending win streak that closed the curtain on the campaign on a high note. Purdue won its final five games and six of its last seven, posting their third longest season-ending win streak in program history. The 1908 and 1992 teams each won their final six contests. The five-game win streak is the longest active run in the country entering 2016.

JOHNSON & WOOD LEAD EXPERIENCED LINEUP

• **Kyle Johnson** and **Kyle Wood** are expected to close out their collegiate careers this season as four-year starters. They shared the team lead in extra-base hits (19), home runs (6) and RBI (34) last season.

• Johnson and Wood have each made 141 starts over the last three years while being regulars in the heart of the lineup. They'll headline a lineup that returns all but one full-time starter from 2015. Purdue's lineup for the season opener at Georgia Tech is expected to feature five seniors, which would be its most since 2012.

• Johnson was at his best in Big Ten play last season, batting .378 with 11 extra-base hits, 16 RBI and 14 runs scored. He hit five of his six home runs last year in conference play and ranked eighth in the league with his .378 average against Big Ten pitchers. The three-year starting center fielder is Purdue's active career leader in RBI (77) and walks (68). He had an 18-game reached base safely streak over the final month of the 2015 campaign.

WOOD TEAM TRIPLE CROWN WINNER IN 2015

• **Kyle Wood** became Purdue's first such honoree since April 2013. Wood went on to win the team triple crown, sharing the team lead in home runs and RBI with **Kyle Johnson**. Wood was the first hitter to win the team triple crown since Ryne White in 2007 and 11th Boilermaker position player since 1970 to accomplish the feat.

• Wood led the team with 18-multi hit games and a .326/.421/.487 slash line. He was named the Big Ten Player of the Week in March after a monster series at Oklahoma and was a second team all-conference selection by College Sports Madness after the season. Perfect Game USA and CSM had him on their preseason all-conference teams this year, and he was ranked 35th on D1Baseball.com's list of top first baseman in the country. He's Purdue's active career leader in hits (152), doubles (31), home runs (14) and should break the program's all-time hit by pitch record (40) this season.

SHIPLEY A CONSTANT AT SHORTSTOP

• As a freshman, **Harry Shipley** started every game at shortstop in 2015. He was the only Boilermaker to start every game at the same position. With Shipley playing shortstop for an amazing 469 of the 473 innings in which Purdue was in the field. He teamed up with second baseman **Cody Strong** and first baseman **Kyle Wood** to help the Boilers turn 54 double plays, a total that ranked second in the Big Ten through the end of the regular season.

• During **Doug Schreiber's** 17-year tenure as head coach (1999-present), Shipley became the first freshman to start every game and just the second to play in every game. He was hit by a pitch a league-leading 16 times to establish a new Purdue freshman record and also finished the regular season leading the Big Ten in defensive assists (184).

FRAWLEY TO SERVE AS RELIEF ACE

• **Matt Frawley** finished the 2015 campaign as the Boilermakers' closer after making all 12 of his starts as part of the weekend rotation. The junior is projected to be the ace of the bullpen this year and could be used for multiple-inning saves on a regular basis.

• Frawley has the ability to hit 90 mph on the radar gun and could be poised for a breakout year. He pitched much better than his 1-9 record in 2015 indicates, putting together four official quality starts as well as three other outings where he surrendered three runs or fewer. Meanwhile, three of those four quality starts came against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament.

• The right-hander was effective at limiting the opposition's power potential in 2015. Only 15 of the 59 hits (25 percent) he allowed over 55 1/3 innings went for extra bases. And eight of those 15 extra-base hits came in two starts -- at Oklahoma (three) and at Michigan (five). The Sooners were the only team to take him deep a year ago.

THREE OTHER VERSATILE SENIORS

• Seniors **Jack Picchiotti**, **Cody Strong** and **Brett Carlson** are all expected to be in the starting lineup during the season-opening weekend. They have all seen action at least four different positions during their careers. Picchiotti and Strong are both three-year starters and Carlson played in the NCAA Regionals as an underclassman with Austin Peay before transferring to Purdue.

BRYANT EXCELLENT AT HOME IN 2015

• **Shane Bryant** led the way in both of Purdue's shutout in 2015 victories, highlighted by a nine-strikeout performance over eight innings in an April win against Ball State. It was the most K's by a Purdue pitcher since March 2013. He shined at home all season, going 3-1 with a 2.45 ERA, .262 batting average against and 32 strikeouts in 33 innings over his six starts at Alexander Field.

SITUATIONAL HITTING CAME AROUND LATE IN THE SEASON

• While conference wins were tough to come by in 2015, the Boilers remained competitive throughout the season in non-conference (14-17) and midweek play (7-4). Eventually, the team's subpar situational hitting statistics during the 16-game Big Ten losing streak (.175 team batting average with runners in scoring position, .136 with two outs) began to trend in Purdue's favor. During their final seven games of the season, the Boilers batted .362 with runners in scoring position and .277 with two outs.

BIG TEN AS COMPETITIVE AS EVER IN 2015

• The Big Ten Conference was as competitive as ever in 2015 and in terms of the record-number of NCAA Regional bids it received (five), enjoyed its finest season in the modern era of college baseball. And it was Purdue that helped keep bubble teams Michigan State and Nebraska out of the NCAA Tournament by posting road wins in East Lansing and Lincoln during its season-ending hot stretch.

• The Boilers' 6-4 win at MSU on May 3 marked the beginning of the exciting final few weeks of the campaign. Purdue snapped its 16-game Big Ten losing streak that day, a skid that stood as the program's longest since also dropping 16 consecutive Big Ten games from the end of 1976 through 1977. However, looking back at the conference losing streak reveals that 12 of those 16 losses came against NCAA Regional qualifiers. In the month of April, the Boilers played four consecutive weekend series against teams that would earn NCAA bids -- Iowa, Illinois, Michigan and Maryland. Illinois and Maryland would go on to win their Regionals.

• Altogether, Purdue played 11 games against Top 25 teams and 15 games against NCAA Regional qualifiers. Additionally, three of the top six teams (Oklahoma, Illinois, Arizona State) with the most players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft last year were on the Boilers' schedule.

EXERCISING THE RUBBER GAME DEMONS

• By rallying to win two of three at Nebraska the weekend of May 9 to 11 last year, Purdue posted its first Big Ten series victory since sweeping Penn State in Central Pennsylvania in March 2013. In the process, the Boilers won a Big Ten series after dropping the opening game for the first time since May 2009 at Michigan State. The Monday rubber game featured an eight-run inning for Purdue, its biggest since April 2013, a rally that propelled the team to its first Big Ten rubber game win since an April 2012 victory in Lincoln. The Boilermakers joined Ohio State as the only Big Ten teams to win a pair of series at Haymarket Park since Nebraska joined the league in 2012.
