- AROUND THE HORN -

• Purdue struggled during the second weekend of the season in its road series at 10th-ranked Cal. The Boilermakers were shut out in the first two games, marking the first time the team had been blanked in consecutive games since March 2008.

• After scoring twice in the first inning Sunday at Cal, the Golden Bears responded with an eight-run rally. It was the biggest inning by a Purdue opponent since Iowa scored eight times in the middle game of last year's April series at Alexander Field.

• After striking out 60 times over the first five games of the season, Purdue did a much better job of putting the ball in play Sunday at Cal, fanning only four times. However, with 23 walks, five HBP and 64 strikeouts over their first six games, the Boilers have not put the ball in play in 92 of their 200 plate appearances (46 percent). With a runner on third base and less than two outs, Purdue has plated that runner in only 4 of 13 chances. Opponents are 12 of 14.

• Purdue scored four unanswered runs over the final three innings at Georgia State to rally for a 5-3 win in the finale of the season-opening weekend. Nick Dalesandro delivered a two-run double in the ninth.

- Battled Georgia Tech as Purdue's season-opening starting pitcher, giving the team a chance to win by staying out of the big inning.
- Joined Nick Dalesandro as the first Purdue pitchers since 2013 to make their first career starts on the mound during a season-opening weekend. However, he became the first non-freshman since 2011 to make his first start on a weekend.
- As a freshman made five of his seven appearances in Big Ten play after not making his collegiate debut until April 11.; worked three innings of one-run ball at nationally ranked Illinois in his first outing as a Boilermaker.
- Retired four of the five batters he faced over an inning and a third of hitless relief to close out the series-opening win against Penn State.
- Played four years of varsity baseball, basketball and football at Tippecanoe Valley High School in north central Indiana.
- Batted over .400 each year as a four-time all-conference performer; area player of the year and second team all-state performer in basketball averaged 20 points as a senior; first team all-state defensive back as a junior and then earned similar honors as a wide receiver his senior year.

- Active career leader in games started and innings pitched; three-time Academic All-Big Ten and 2015 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar honoree.
- Joined the weekend rotation for the first time in March 2014 and has made 18 of his 28 career starts on weekends.
- Started the 2015 season opener at Western Carolina but did not make another weekend start until Maryland series; performed well in midweek starts vs. Louisville, IPFW & Indiana State.
- Led the way in Purdue's 2-1 pitcher's duel win in the middle game at Nebraska last year, inducing 13 ground ball outs over seven innings of one-run ball.
- Put together another strong start vs. NCAA Super Regional qualifier Maryland, taking a 3-1 lead into the ninth inning before the Terps loaded the bases against him & went on to win.
- Worked Purdue's first true complete game since February 2013 in tough-luck loss vs. Ohio State in April 2014, giving up runs in only one inning.
- Earned his first career Big Ten win with seven innings of three-hit ball vs. Michigan (April 2014).
- No. 4 LSU did not score while he was on the mound in first start of 2014.
- True walk-on has been a part of the program since the fall of 2011, but redshirted in 2012 after not making the official 35-man roster.
- Worked 4 1/3 innings of scoreless two-hit relief in his team debut, a 2013 midweek game vs. Indiana State.
- Helped Carroll High School win back-to-back 4A IHSA state titles and was the winning pitcher in 2011 title game; all-conference & all-area honoree went 12-1 to tie the CHS wins record as a senior.

- One bad inning (three-run fourth) marred what was an otherwise strong debut on the mound; had five strikeouts vs. no walks over five innings.
- Has potential to help Purdue as a two-way player as a true freshman; could also see action as an outfielder or at catcher this season.
- Selected in the 33rd round of the 2015 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Detroit Tigers; became Purdue's first NLI signee since the 2009 draft to opt to attend college.
- Ranked No. 3 among impact freshmen in the Big Ten by D1Baseball.com.
- Joined Tanner Andrews as the first Purdue pitchers since 2013 to make their first career starts on the mound during a season-opening weekend.
- East Suburban Catholic Conference Player of the Year and first team all-state honoree as a junior after batting .411 with four home runs and 35 RBI at the plate and going 7-1 on the mound
- Helped lead Joliet Catholic to the 2013 class 3A IHSA state title and the 2014 summer state championship
- His father Mark played baseball at the University of Illinois and his mother Lisa played softball at Illinois-Chicago.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 18th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in nine of its 10 appearances under Schreiber.

The 2015 Boilermakers won their final five games and six of their last seven, posting their third longest season-ending win streak in program history. Kyle Wood won the team triple crown in 2015, becoming the first hitter to do so since 2007 and the 11th Boilermaker position player since 1970 to accomplish the feat.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Ball State (1991-92) and spent 1993 as an assistant at Butler.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132) and games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eighth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

BOILERMAKERS BEGIN THE MONTH OF MARCH IN JOHNSON CITY

• Purdue begins the month of March with a trip towards the Appalachian Mountains for the third year in a row, playing a four-game series at first-time foe East Tennessee State this weekend.

• With a doubleheader on Saturday, this weekend is the first of two four-game series on Purdue's schedule this year. First pitch at Thomas Stadium in Johnson City, Tennessee, is set for 4 p.m. Friday, 1 p.m. Saturday and 1 p.m. Sunday.

• **Doug Schreiber** will coach his 950th career game as the leader of the Boilermakers this weekend. Including his playing career as a four-year starting second baseman for Purdue, he has been involved in 1,174 games in program history.

• Johnson City features an elevation of 1,600 feet in the Ridge-and-Valley Appalachians and foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains. Last year's season-opening series at ETSU's Southern Conference rival Western Carolina was played at an elevation of 2,100 feet, believed to be the highest for any games in Purdue's program history. Two years ago the Boilermakers opened with a series in Knoxville against the University of Tennessee.

• Purdue is looking to kick start its new season after dropping five of its first six games. Getting swept on 10th-ranked Cal's home field is a result that may have befallen many a Midwestern team, but it was the nature of the sweep that was probably most disheartening to the coaching staff. After getting shut out in each of the first two games while striking out a combined 25 times, the Boilermakers were the victim of a true big inning for the first time this season Sunday. The Golden Bears' eight-run rally in the bottom of the first thwarted any potential momentum the team may have gained from **Kyle Johnson's** two-out, two-run double in the top of the frame.

• Purdue's four strikeouts Sunday were easily a season low. And despite having at least one base runner in seven of the nine innings, a trio of double plays limited the positive returns from the additional contact.

• **Nick Dalesandro** hit safely in all three games at Cal and made it through the fifth inning on the mound for the second straight start. Ignited by his game-winning, two-run double in the ninth inning of the Feb. 20 win at Georgia State, the freshman has gone 5-for-11 over the last four games. On the mound he has issued just one walk over 10 1/3 innings. After concentrating strictly on his collegiate mound debut Feb. 19 at Kennesaw State, he served as a true two-way player in his Saturday start at Cal. In doing so, he became the first Boilermaker since Kyle Wood in April 2014 to bat in the lineup on the same day he started on the mound. Wood's start as the pitcher/designated hitter in the finale of Rice series the second weekend of that same season marked the last time a Boilermaker had done it in a weekend game.

• The Purdue coaching staff has opted to have Dalesandro start the nightcap of Saturday's doubleheader on the mound this weekend so his bat can remain in the lineup as much as possible. Playing the outfield in the nightcap of a doubleheader after pitching the first game is a less desirable scenario.

• **Jack Picchioti** (8-for-19), Johnson (8-for-22) and **Cody Strong** (7-for-23) are a combined 23-for-64 (.359 average) with 12 free passes over the first two weekends. Unfortunately, the rest of the team has collectively scuffled early and is a combined 22-for-134 (.164) with 16 free passes. Shortstop **Harry Shipley** was one of the Boilermakers' most consistent players as a freshman a year ago. And while his 1-for-22 start at the plate may look like a sophomore slump on paper, he has remained solid defensively, handling all 29 of his chances cleanly at shortstop.

• East Tennessee State opened Thomas Stadium in time for the 2013 season, a campaign that culminated with a berth in Vanderbilt's NCAA Regional after winning the Atlantic Sun Tournament title. It features an artificial FieldTurf playing surface, which Purdue will see again next weekend at Kansas and later this month when it hosts Ohio at Kokomo Municipal Stadium. The train tracks of the Blue Ridge Railroad bordering the right field wall should add to the unique mountain-view setting this weekend in Johnson City.

• The Buccaneers made the move from the A-Sun to the Southern Conferences during the 2014-15 school year. Purdue (20-34, 6-17 B1G) and ETSU (21-35, 8-16 SoCon) had nearly identical records a year ago. The Bucs are currently in the midst of a stretch in which they're scheduled to play 17 of their 19 games at home. Both teams were originally slated to travel to Emerson, Georgia, this weekend to play at a tournament hosted by the LakePoint Sporting Community. But when the rest of the tournament field did not come together, the decision was made to play a traditional weekend series in Johnson City instead.

• With the exception of a wild 21-12 rubber game loss to Northern Kentucky on Sunday, it's been a bit of a feast or famine start for ETSU lineup. The Bucs have scored 28 of their 43 runs in their three victories and held to two runs or fewer in their other three losses. Catcher Hagen Owenby (13-for-28, 4 HR, 10 RBI) and outfielder Aaron Maher (13-for-23, 7 XBH, 1 strikeout) have led the way offensively. First baseman Kevin Phillips (10-for-30, 4 XBH, 8 RBI) was on Collegiate Baseball's Preseason All-America list.

• On the mound for ETSU, starters Blake Smith and Victor Gonzalez both have had a strong outing this season in which they worked at least six innings of shutout ball. But the rest of the team has compiled a 6.66 ERA. However, the entire staff has managed a strong 2.4 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
