### - AROUND THE HORN -

- Purdue is visiting Champaign-Urbana for the third year in a row. Next month, the Boilers also play at Michigan State for the third year in a row.
- Under **Doug Schreiber**, Purdue has won series at Illinois in 2001 (3-of-4) & 2010 (2-of-3). The Illini's 3-game sweep in 2013 marked the first time Purdue lost a series in C-U since 1999 (3-game sweep).
- Entering the weekend, **Kyle Wood** is sixth in the Big Ten with a .362 batting average. He is one of 13 active Boilers that are Illinois natives, all hailing from the Chicagoland area.
- Purdue won last year's series opener at Illinois,
   4-3, when Mike Lutz induced & started a game-ending 1-2-3 double play with the bases loaded
- Purdue has lost 21 straight games against ranked teams dating back to June 2012. The Boilers' last win against a ranked foe was at UCLA in May 2012 when they scored 10 runs in the ninth inning to overcome a 10-5 deficit.

- · Joined the weekend rotation for the lowa series in April and moved to Friday after injury to Mike Kornacker.
- Had back-to-back quality outings in midweek play against Valparaiso and Kent State in his first two starts as a Boilermaker.
- Compiled a 1.10 ERA over 16 1/3 innings in March, striking out 19.
- Struck out a season-high 6 over 5-plus innings vs. Kent State.
- · Started the 2015 home opener and led Purdue to a shutout win against Valparaiso with 5 1/3 scoreless innings.
- · Retired 11 of the 13 batters he faced over four scoreless innings of relief in Purdue's 1-0 loss to Missouri in Corpus Christi.
- · Ranked 86th among the Northwoods League's top prospects after a strong summer of 2014 pitching for the Kalamazoo Growlers in which ^ Relief Appearance he was 5-2 with 4 saves and a 3.60 ERA in 65 innings.
- Transfer from Indiana Wesleyan was not part of the official roster in 2014 while redshirting; joined the program in the fall of 2013.
- All-Midwest Collegiate Team honoree in 2013 after posting a 7-3 record with a 4.21 ERA, throwing 7 complete games and 72 2/3 innings.
- His parents are Purdue employees and his father is an alumnus.

## HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extraining affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

#### - BOILERMAKERS VISIT CHAMPAIGN-URBANA FOR THIRD YEAR IN A ROW -

For the second of its back-to-back weekends against nationally ranked Big Ten rivals, Purdue visits Champaign-Urbana for the third year in a row to take on the streaking 12th-ranked Illinois Fighting Illini.

It's a special Saturday through Monday series schedule to accommodate Big Ten Network television coverage Monday evening. First pitch at Illinois Field is set for 4 p.m. Saturday, 1 p.m. Sunday and 7 p.m. Monday (all times ET). Sunday's game will also be televised by the BTN.

Purdue (11-21, 1-5 Big Ten) has not played a Big Ten game on a Monday since defeating Michigan State at Lambert Field in May 2010. Next month, the Boilers will also play a Saturday through Monday series at Nebraska. That schedule change was a byproduct of final exams week on campus from May 4-8.

Unlike Iowa, which was only ranked in one of the five major polls last week, Illinois is a consensus Top 25 club thanks to its Big Ten-best 26-6-1 overall mark. The Fighting Illini (5-1 Big Ten) are 12th in D1Base-ball.com's rankings this week. Purdue has not played consecutive traditional weekend series against nationally ranked teams since March 2006 (at North Carolina and Missouri). The Boilermakers have not played two Top 25 Big Ten teams in the same year since 2000 (Illinois and Minnesota). The Illini are the highest-ranked conference rival Purdue has played since Ohio State was No. 11 in May 1994.

The Boilermakers' artificial turf road stretch continues this weekend as well. Purdue opened its stretch of seven straight road games on turf with a 10-6 win at Indiana State Tuesday. Next weekend's series in Ann Arbor will also be played on turf after Michigan's Ray Fisher Stadium had turf installed in the fall of 2013. The Boilermakers also have a seven-game road stretch on the horizon in May, but both Big Ten opponents (Michigan State and Nebraska) featured on that portion of the schedule have natural grass fields.

Meanwhile, Illinois is set to play at home for the fourth time in the last five weekends. The Illini also host Indiana next weekend. Already enjoying a very successful campaign, Illinois had the good fortune of its series at Northwestern being moved to C-U last weekend due to construction at Rocky Miller Park in Evanston. The Illini are 11-2 at home and have won a season-high seven in a row. They're in prime position to qualify for an NCAA Regional for the third time in the last five years and are being projected as a potential Regional host.

Purdue won last year's series opener in Champaign, 4-3, thanks to a two-out, two-run double from **Brandon Krieg** in the top of the eighth inning and a game-ending 1-2-3 double play with the bases loaded that **Mike Lutz** both induced and started. However, it marked the first of three times in Big Ten play that the Boilers won the opener, but lost the series. The Fighting Illini have won five of the six meetings with Purdue at Illinois Field the last two years.

Coincidentally, the Boilermakers only played three traditional weekend series in Champaign altogether from 2002-10.

**Kyle Wood** has hit safely in all six games at Illinois Field (11-for-20 overall) the last two seasons, homering in the final game of the series both years. **Cody Strong** and **Kyle Johnson** also went deep in C-U as freshmen in 2013. There were a combined 11 home runs in the 2013 series as the wind was blowing out for much of the weekend and Illinois Field lived up to its billing as a hitter-friendly ballpark.

The Fighting Illini have a very well-balanced team this year, but two left-handed pitchers have received the majority of the national attention. Staff ace Kevin Duchene (0.64, 10.1) and closer Tyler Jay (0.79, 10.3) rank one-two in the Big Ten in ERA and strikeouts per nine innings. Duchene has only issued three walks and surrendered just three earned runs in 42 innings pitched. Jay has four wins and eight saves in his league-leading 18 appearances. Krieg recorded his go-ahead double off Jay in the opener last season.

Purdue did not face Duchene a year ago and has only seen the junior in a relief role. During his 2013 Big Ten Freshman of the Year season, he didn't move into the weekend rotation fulltime until the end of April. Last season, he missed about six weeks from mid-March through early May due to injury. The Illini were again cautious with their star lefty this spring, holding him out until the third weekend of the season. But since making his 2015 season debut Feb. 27, Duchene has given Illinois a quality start each time he has taken the mound.

First baseman David Kerian enters the weekend tied for the Big Ten lead with eight home runs. He's one of six Illini with at least three long balls. He has hit seven home runs since March 8. Four regulars in

the Illinois lineup – Pat McInerney (.349, 11 XBH), Reid Roper (12 XBH, 26 RBI), Casey Fletcher (21 RBI, 21 walks) and Kerian – have all walked more than they have struck out. The Illini remain one of the most aggressive base-stealing teams in the league as well, ranking fourth in the Big Ten with 54 stolen base attempts. Purdue will be in search of its first series win in Champaign since 2010 as well as looking to snap a 21-game losing streak against nationally ranked foes.

#### BOILERS TO PLAY CONSECUTIVE SERIES VS. RANKED FOES FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2006

- After getting swept by No. 24 lowa the first weekend of April, Purdue fell to 1-8 against the Hawkeyes at Alexander Field the last three years. Next up the Boilermakers will visit Illinois for the third year in a row. Coincidentally, Purdue only played three regular-season series in Champaign from 2002-10.
- This weekend's series marks the Boilers' first games outside of the state of Indiana since a March 17 midweek loss at No. 11 Louisville. From March 18 through April 5, Purdue played 11 of its 13 games at home but went just 3-10 during that stretch, including losing five of six in Big Ten play at Alexander Field. After playing eight games in the state of Illinois last season, this weekend's series marks the Boilers' only visit to the Land of Lincoln this year. Thirteen players on Purdue's full 35-man roster hail from Illinois and the Chicagoland area.
- With Illinois ranked as high as No. 12 in one of the national polls, Purdue is set to play a Top 25 team in consecutive weekends for the first time since February 2013 (Louisville and Mississippi State). However, both of those were tournaments. The Boilers have not played standard weekend series against back-to-back ranked teams since March 2006 at North Carolina and Missouri. The 2000 campaign marked the last time Purdue played two ranked Big Ten teams (Illinois and Minnesota) in the same season. Illinois will also be the highest-ranked Big Ten team the Boilers have faced since Ohio State was No. 11 in May 1994. With Maryland and Nebraska also in the Top 25 and on the horizon, nationally ranked opponents could become a regular feature to the schedule through mid-May.
- The Boilermakers snapped their seven-game losing streak April 1 with a 9-1 win against IPFW. Tuesday, Purdue won at Indiana State, 10-6, for its first victory in Terre Haute since 2006. The Boilers scored just 12 runs during their seven-game losing skid and it has remained a feast for famine stretch for Purdue offensively over the last 18 games (since March 14). In the Boilers' last six wins they've scored 63 runs (10.5 per game). But in their last 12 losses they've managed just 23 runs (1.9 per game).

#### PURDUE LEADING THE BIG TEN IN DOUBLE PLAYS TURNED

- The Boilermakers enter the weekend leading the Big Ten in double plays turned (36). Purdue has turned multiple double plays in a game eight times this year, including five against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and four against Butler (March 28). Shortstop **Harry Shipley** has contributed to 24 of the 36 double plays and second baseman **Cody Strong** has been a part of 21 of the 36. Purdue also led the Big Ten in double plays turned last season (54 in 50 games).
- Individually, Shipley leads the Big Ten in defensive assists (117) while starting every game at shortstop. Catcher **Jack Picchiotti** has thrown out a league-leading 13 base stealers.

#### BIG EIGHTH INNINGS FOR AND AGAINST: FIFTH INNING PROVING COSTLY

- Over the last week, eighth-inning rallies proved to be the difference in a pair of Purdue's games. April 4, lowa scored eight times in the top of the eighth to overcome the Boilers' 4-2 lead entering the frame. It marked the second time in a week's time that the opposition put up an eight spot at Alexander Field after Butler also did it in the sixth inning of the nightcap of the March 28 doubleheader.
- Tuesday in Terre Haute, Purdue scored five times in the eighth inning to extend its lead from 5-4 to 10-4 en route to winning the game 10-6. It matched the Boilers' biggest rally of the season; they also scored five times in an inning against Northern Illinois (twice) and Oklahoma.
- The fifth inning has been very unkind to Purdue this season, getting outscored 41-14 in baseball's middle frame. The minus-27 run differential is by far the Boilers' worst of any inning this year. For the season, Purdue has a minus-54 run differential. Half of that negative differential has come from the fifth inning.

## WOOD HOMERS IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES AGAINST IOWA; LEWIS HITS HIS FIRST

- **Kyle Wood** homered in games two and three of the lowa series, going deep in consecutive games for the second time in his career. He also accomplished the feat in April 2013 in a home win vs. Illinois-Chicago and a road loss at Michigan State. He joined **Jack Picchiotti** as Boilers to homer in consecutive games this season. Wood also hit his first home run at Alexander Field in nearly a year, his last being on April 8, 2014, vs. Louisville.
- **Jordan Lewis** batted cleanup for the first time as a Boilermaker in the final two games of the Iowa series. The sophomore connected for his first collegiate home run in the middle game of the series, becoming the fifth Purdue player to hit his first long ball as a Boilermaker this year.
- Purdue out homered lowa, 3-0, in the series but still got swept. The three roundtrippers were the Boilers' only extra-base hits of the series. Thirty of lowa's 36 hits over the course of the weekend were singles, but the Hawkeyes were successful with the base-hit approach. For the series, lowa was 19-for-44 with runners in scoring position and 14-for-38 with two outs. Conversely, Purdue was 6-for-23 with runners in scoring position and 4-for-27 with two outs.

#### OLUND POSTS FIRST MULTI-HOMER GAME BY A PURDUE FRESHMAN SINCE 2010

- Purdue's first multi-homer game since May 2013 (Sean McHugh) came from an unlikely source. Batting ninth in the lineup in only his fourth start of the season, Alec Olund connected for a pair of solo home runs to left field in the April 1 DATE home win vs. IPFW. It the first multi-homer game by a Purdue freshman since April 2010 (Cameron Perkins), making it 4/01/15 Alec Olund the first of the BBCOR bat era (2011-present).
- Olund also made starts against Iowa and Indiana State, but was injured in the fourth inning of the ISU win while trying 5/17/12 Cameron Perkins to make a diving catch on the warning track in right field. He is expected to be sidelined for a couple weeks after crashing 4/20/12 Cameron Perkins into the wall and hurting his shoulder and back.
- There have been only two multi-homer games in the first 46 regular-season games at Alexander Field. However, with nine homers in the first 11 games this season, home runs are up. There were only 16 long balls hit in the 35 games at the first two years of the new ballpark.
- Kyle Johnson walked four time in the April 1 win vs. IPFW, becoming the first Boiler to draw four walks in a game since Cody Strong in April 2013. Prior to Strong in 2013, a Purdue player had not walked four times since February 2009.

### HIT BY PITCH TOTALS PILING UP FOR SHIPLEY & WOOD

- Purdue batters were hit by a pitch 10 times in the Big Ten-opening series against Rutgers. Harry Shipley bore the brunt of the beanings and was plunked five times for the weekend. The freshman enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 11 HBPs. He been hit by a pitch 10 times over the last 16 games. The Purdue freshman record for HBPs is 14, set by Kyle Wood in 2013.
- · Meanwhile, Wood has been hit by a pitch five times this season and on 33 occasions for his career. The program's all-time record is 40, established by Kevin Plawecki (2010-12). Wood enters the weekend tied for sixth place in the Purdue record book. As a team, the Boilers have been hit by a pitch 37 times this season, ranking third in the Big Ten.

## PICCHIOTTI'S MARCH POWER SURGE

- Jack Picchiotti recently reached base safely in 11 straight games, hitting safely in eight of the first nine. He was 12-for-38 with seven free passes and 11 RBI during that stretch. Seven of the 12 hits went for extra bases, highlighted by home runs against Valparaiso and Rutgers. The long ball against Rutgers was a grand slam, Purdue's second in a four-game stretch. He became the first Boiler to homer in consecutive games since Sean McHugh in March 2014 at Southern Illinois. However, Picchiotti was the first Boilermaker to do so in consecutive games at Alexander Field in the ballpark's brief three-year history.
- PICCHIOTTI'S 11-GAME REACHED SAFELY STREAK (MARCH 14-28): .316, 7 XBH, 3 HR, 11 RBI, 11 R, 5 BB

#### BOILERMAKERS SNAP RUBBER GAME LOSING STREAK, BUT LOSE 2-OF-3 TO RUTGERS

- Not only did Purdue's 23-5 win vs. Northern Illinois March 15 snap a 10-game losing streak in weekend series rubber games, it also allowed the Boilers to win a series after losing the opener for the first time since May 2009 at Michigan State. Purdue's last rubber game win had been in April 2012 at Nebraska.
- · However, the rubber game demons rose up again in the March 22 loss to Rutgers. The Scarlet Knights took games two and three to win the series after the Boilers won the opener, 9-5. Purdue has lost nine straight rubber games in Big Ten play dating to May 2012. Going back to the opening weekend of conference play in 2010, the Boilers have won the first game of a weekend but lost the series 10 times in Big Ten play. It has happened 13 times overall since the beginning of the 2010 season. During that stretch, the Boilers only won the middle game of a series three times after losing the opener.

#### GIBBS STILL STINGY ON HITS ALLOWED

• Matt Gibbs has faced 46 batters and only allowed eight hits this season. Dating back to the 2014 home opener, he has given up only 28 hits in 44 2/3 innings (5.67 hits per nine). By surrendering only 5.77 hits per nine innings last year, he posted the sixth best single-season clip in Purdue history. His 4.91 hits per nine in Big Ten play was a new program record. He posted a streak of 17 consecutive scoreless innings over seven appearances from April 5-25, 2014. This year, he has allowed eight of 21 inherited runners to score (38 percent). Gavin Downs (0-of-7), Tim McElroy (4-of-13) and Joe Eichmann (8-of-23) have been Purdue's most effective relief pitchers at stranding inherited base runners.

#### SHIPLEY IMPRESSES DEFENSIVELY DURING 14-GAME ERRORLESS STREAK AT SHORTSTOP

- Shortstop **Harry Shipley** and center fielder **Kyle Johnson** are the only Boilers that have started every game at the same position this season. Shipley has done it as a freshman thanks in part to his steady play at the most important defensive position. He has committed seven errors in 170 defensive chances. His 14-game errorless streak ended March 21 in the middle game of the Rutgers series (March 21). It was his first error since game two of the Sam Houston State doubleheader on Feb. 21. During his 14-game streak without an error he handled 74 defensive chances cleanly. He enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 117 defensive assists.
- Shipley has been involved in all four game-ending double plays this season. Cody Strong and Shipley teamed up on both game-ending line drive double plays, with the tying run aboard both times. Those closed out victories against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and Valparaiso (March 18). Shipley also made a nice diving stop behind second base to start a game-ending 6-4-3 double play in the March 20 victory vs. Rutgers. Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, Purdue has closed out nine wins on notable game-ending double plays. That total includes games in which the potential tying run was at least in the ondeck circle at the time of the twin killing.

## SNIDANKO'S GRAND SLAM, SEVEN RBI HIGHLIGHT BLOWOUT WIN VERSUS NIU

• Purdue scored multiple runs in seven consecutive innings to slug its way to a 23-5 rubber game win vs. Northern Illinois March 15. Despite not entering the game until the sixth inning, **Ted Snidanko** finished the day with a career-high seven RBI and just a single shy of the cycle. He connected for a grand slam in the sixth inning as Purdue posted its second five-run frame of the game. It was the first slam by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh at Michigan in May 2013 and he became the first Purdue player with seven RBI in a game since Josh Estill in April 2013.

- Snidanko nearly hit two grand slams. He tripled off the fence in left center with the bases loaded in his third at-bat. The sophomore entered the day with one extra-base hit and no RBI in 27 games as a Boilermaker.
- Purdue recorded 20 runs and 20 hits for the first time since wins against Illinois-Chicago in March (hits) and April (runs) of 2013. But the 23 runs Sunday were the most since beating Indiana, 25-8, in April 2006 in Bloomington and the 24 hits were Purdue's most since racking up a program-record 30 in a March 2012 victory at Murray State.

## WOOD WINS B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR MONSTER SERIES AT OKLAHOMA

- **Kyle Wood** did something productive in 12 of his 14 plate appearances in Purdue's series at Oklahoma (March 6-8), earning the junior first baseman Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He was 9-for-11 with a three-run double, two solo home runs, seven RBI, two walks and four runs scored. He had multiple hits in all three games, highlighted by his first collegiate four-hit effort in the rubber game.
- Wood put up his big numbers predominantly against a tough Oklahoma rotation. The Sooners' starting pitchers combined for 24 strikeouts over 17 1/3 innings in the series. But Wood also delivered an RBI single in his final at-bat of the weekend to win a lefty-lefty matchup vs. OU's closer in the eighth inning.
- Wood's 13-game reached base safely streak ended in the March 17 loss at No. 11 Louisville. He recorded multiple hits in eight of those contests. He was Purdue's first Big Ten Player of the Week honoree since **Kyle Johnson** was named Player and Freshman of the Week on April 1, 2013, following the Boilers' first-ever sweep at Penn State.
- Despite making just three appearances on the mound this season, Wood has struck out 13 over 5 2/3 innings and 13 of the 32 batters he has faced. As a pitcher, he has helped lead Purdue to wins against Western Carolina and Valparaiso, but was only able to retire one of the six batters he faced as lowa hung five runs on him to rally for a 10-5 win April 4 in the middle game of the series.

## 10 EXTRA-INNING GAMES SINCE ST. PATRICK'S DAY 2014; LOTS OF DOUBLEHEADERS

- After blowing a four-run lead in the ninth inning en route to losing to CSU Bakersfield in 11 innings on Feb. 28, 10 of Purdue's last 68 games dating back to St. Patrick's Day 2014 have gone to extra innings. As of Feb. 28, it was 10 of 47 games (21 percent) had gone extras.
- The Boilers' eight extra-innings games last year were the most during **Doug Schreiber's** 17-year tenure as head coach and are believed to be the most in program history overall. Purdue is 4-6 in the 10 extra-innings game, including 1-1 this year.
- The March 28 doubleheader vs. Butler was Purdue's fifth of the season already. The Boilers played three doubleheaders over a span of 13 days from Feb. 14-26 and four in 29 days from Feb. 13-March 14. Purdue had not played a doubleheader in three consecutive weekends since 2008, the final year of the Big Ten schedule featuring a doubleheader of two seven-inning games every Saturday.

#### FRAWLEY STELLAR IN START VERSUS BAKERSFIELD

• Matt Frawley surrendered only three singles and one walk over seven shutout innings, striking out five in the finest outing of the season by a Purdue pitcher Feb. 28 loss to CSU Bakersfield in Phoenix. He worked three 1-2-3 innings and retired 15 of 16 batters from the second through seventh innings. His strikeout and innings pitched totals were career highs as a Boilermaker. It marked the first time a Purdue pitcher worked at least seven shutout innings in an outing since Lance Breedlove led the way in a 3-0 win against Indiana at the 2012 Big Ten Tournament with 7 1/3 shutout innings.
