- AROUND THE HORN -

• As the only Big Ten team scheduled to play its first two conference weekends on the road, the Boilermakers travel to Bloomington for the latest chapter in the rivalry series with Indiana. Purdue and Nebraska were the only Big Ten teams to win weekend series vs. IU in 2017.

• The sweep at Penn State last weekend allowed the Boilermakers to open league play 3-0 for the first time since 2000. However, it was their first conference-opening series sweep since 1985.

• Dating back to the 2008 Big Ten Tournament, Purdue has won 11 of the last 14 meetings with IU played away from Bloomington. But Indiana has won six straight home games vs. the Boilermakers after sweeping series in 2014 and 2016. All three games of the 2016 series were one-run affairs.

• Including the 2017 Big Ten Tournament, Purdue is 0-8 all-time at Bart Kaufman Field (opened in 2013). The Boilermakers have not tasted victory in Bloomington since 2010. The current seven-year drought is the longest Purdue has ever gone without posting at least one win in B-Town.

• Purdue's Feb. 25 win vs. No. 30 Notre Dame was its first versus a nationally ranked opponent since May 2012. The Boilermakers have not won a weekend series vs. a ranked team since March 2006 at Missouri.

BIG TEN PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Feb. 20, 2017
- March 6, 2017

- Joined all-time strikeouts leader Matt Bischoff (2008-10) as the only Purdue pitchers this century to start three straight season openers.
- Lost a 1-0 pitchers duel at Tulane to open the spring break trip, keeping the home team off the scoreboard until a two-out single in the eighth inning.
- Went on to lose 3 consecutive starts for the first time since 2016, giving up 3 home runs at Saint Louis after a dropped fly ball extended the second inning; struggled with his command early in the home opener vs. Lipscomb, giving up to 2 first-inning runs.
- Has worked a combined 13 2/3 innings of one-run ball in the last two season-opening wins, surrendering just seven hits while registering 18 strikeouts vs. one walk.
- Helped lead Purdue to a 10-5 record on Fridays as a junior.
- Recorded seven official quality starts in 2017, including three of his last four outings after a tough stretch in April; had four outings in which he did not allow a run.
- Struck out a career-high 10 over 7 2/3 shutout innings at Santa Clara in 2017, the most Ks by a Purdue pitcher since March 2012.
- Retired 27 of the 32 batters he faced in complete-game shutout at SEMO.
- Struck out nine over seven innings while retiring 21 of 24 batters faced at Texas State while leading Purdue to its first season-opening win since 2013.
- In 2017, became Purdue's first Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honoree since May 2012 and only the fifth Boilermaker to win the award twice in the same season.
- Pitched in a team-high 21 games in 2016, starting the opener of each of the first five weekends; Purdue's first non-freshman since 2011 to make his first start on a weekend.
- Excelled as a reliever in 2016, compiling a 1.34 ERA and .168 batting average against over 14 appearances, surrendering only 24 hits while striking out 32 in 40 1/3 innings pitched.
- Made five of his seven appearances in Big Ten play as a freshman in 2015 despite not making his collegiate debut until April 11.
- Team MVP in football, basketball and baseball each of his upperclassman years at Tippecanoe Valley High School; all-state defensive back & wide receiver, area player of the year and second team all-state performer in basketball.

BIG TEN PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- April 24, 2017

- Has struggled with his command at times in 2018 due in part to a cracked finger nail on the index finger of his pitching hand; Purdue has still won 6 of his 7 starts.
- Almost didn't get out of the first inning at PSU, but went on to put together a quality start.
- Third Team All-Big Ten in 2017, Purdue's first all-conference pitcher since 2012.
- Limited Minnesota to 6 singles over 7 innings in the win that clinched Purdue's 2017 Big Ten Tournament berth.
- Was Purdue's top pitcher after start of Big Ten play last year, working a team-high 63 innings with a 2.43 ERA and .224 average against from March 25 to May 19.
- Threw a complete game 2-hitter vs. Illinois in 2017, retiring 27 of 29 batters faced to win Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Delivered a much-needed quality start in the game two win at Ohio State, retiring 13 of the first 14 batters & working 7 2/3 innings of one-run ball.
- Appeared in 21 games, making 12 starts and recording 67 strikeouts in 70 innings pitched as a freshman at Coffeyville Community College in Kansas.
- Helped the Wisconsin Rapids Rafters win the 2016 Northwoods League title, recording five wins and 55 strikeouts over 60 innings pitched; also worked 4 1/3 innings of one-run ball, striking out six, in his playoff start.
- His high school did not sponsor baseball so he ran track in the spring while also playing football and basketball; played legion baseball in the summer, helping his team win the class C Nebraska state title in 2014.
- All A honor roll student and homecoming king.
- His mother Deb played volleyball at the University of Nebraska at Kearney.

- Became Purdue's first freshman to make a start during the conference-opening weekend since Mike Kornacker in March 2015.
- The only hit he allowed in 5 innings at Penn State came on a wind-aided fly ball in the fifth inning that dropped in front of the center fielder.
- Made his first collegiate start at Southeastern Louisiana on the spring break trip and moved into the rotation that weekend for the Saint Louis series; was scheduled to start the series finale vs. Lipscomb but it was canceled.
- Continues to be stretched out after starting the year in the bullpen, but walks and wild pitches have been an issue at times.
- Pitched in relief in the season-opening win vs. Western Michigan.
- Two-time first team all-state as an upperclassman at Crawfordsville High School.
- Recorded 127 strikeouts as a junior and 124 Ks as a senior while helping lead CHS to consecutive conference titles.
- Also a four-year letterwinner in football and basketball.
- First team all-conference in all three sports as a senior as well as in football and baseball as a junior.
- High honor roll student and National Honor Society.

HEAD COACH MARK WASIKOWSKI

Mark Wasikowski, an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the Universities of Oregon, Arizona, Florida as well as Southeast Missouri State during his career, was hired as the head coach of Purdue baseball in June 2016.

Wasikowski has played and coached in the College World Series. He helped lead teams to 14 NCAA Tournament appearances during a successful 20-year run as an assistant coach. He also won an NCAA championship as the starting third baseman and a captain on Pepperdine's 1992 College World Series team.

Wasikowski (pronounced WOZ-uh-COW-ski) played for and worked under three-time national Coach of the Year Andy Lopez for a combined 18 years. He was part of Lopez's coaching staffs at both Florida (1999-2001) and Arizona (2002-11) before joining George Horton's staff at Oregon in the summer of 2011, spending five seasons with Horton in Eugene. Wasikowski was an assistant coach on Arizona's 2004 College World Series team, the same year that Horton led Cal State Fullerton to the national title.

Wasikowski led the Boilermakers to a 19-win improvement in his first season. It ranked as the greatest turnaround in program history and tops nationally entering the week of the conference tournaments around the country. Purdue returned to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2012 after winning 10 more games in league play. Wasikowski's team joined the 2007 Boilermakers as the only Big Ten teams since 1988 to post a 10-win improvement in conference play.

Purdue posted a pair of seven-game win streaks in 2017 and recorded 10-plus victories in both March and April. The Boilermakers won seven weekend series after having only six such successful weekends from 2013 to 2016. Purdue was 8-3 in one-run games after having a 2-13 record in similar contests the year before. The Boilermakers' 18 true road wins were tied with Minnesota for the most in the Big Ten.

Wasikowski is the 20th head coach in Purdue's 129-year history, but only the Boilermakers' fourth full-time skipper since 1978.

Wasikowski has coached 120 players that have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, a list highlighted by 29 big leaguers. During his 10 seasons at Arizona, Wasikowski coached 59 Major League Baseball draft picks and 22 future big leaguers. As the recruiting coordinator, he assembled the Wildcats' 2012 national championship team, leaving for Oregon before the start of the 2011-12 school year. Oregon was one of only three teams nationally to win 40-plus games every year from 2012 to 2014. During his five seasons in Eugene, the Ducks had 23 players drafted.

Wasikowski was a two-time All-West Coast Conference honoree at Pepperdine after spending his first two collegiate seasons at Hawaii and Rancho Santiago Junior College. He was selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 1993 MLB Draft, but opted to remain at Pepperdine to finish his bachelor's degree in business administration while serving as a student assistant under Lopez during the 1994 season. He also has a master's of business administration from Southeast Missouri.

Wasikowski was inducted into the Pepperdine Athletics Hall of Fame along with all of his teammates from the 1992 national championship team. He led the Waves in doubles as a junior and hits as a senior, guiding Pepperdine back to the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

Wasikowski and his wife, Lori Jo, are the parents of two daughters, Joelle and Kelsey.

As a player, I left Arizona much better than when I arrived. He was very good at the mental part of the game and pushing us to get to places we didn't know we could go. I still talk to Waz about once every three months. He is very loyal, and I would trust his character to run my program."

ENDED MARCH ON A HIGH NOTE WITH A SWEEP IN CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA

- The Boilermakers are 3-0 in Big Ten play for the first time since 2000. Purdue completed its first conference-opening sweep since 1985 with its first doubleheader sweep in Big Ten play since April 2012 vs. Illinois.
- The Boilermakers have swept three of their five doubleheaders this season, a feat last accomplished in 2012 as well. The five doubleheaders are just one shy of the total from the last two seasons combined (six).
- The Boilermakers retired 18 consecutive Penn State hitters from the sixth inning of game one through the third inning of game two of the doubleheader. **Dalton Parker** and **Trent Johnson** each worked a pair of 1-2-3 innings during that stretch. Twenty-eight consecutive PSU batters came to the plate without recording a hit from the sixth inning of game one through the fifth inning of game two.
- It took a wind-aided bloop double to break up Johnson's no-hit bid in the fifth inning of the nightcap. Johnson and **Cameron Williams** teamed up to retire the next nine consecutive batters.

McGOWAN FINDS HIS GROOVE AGAIN

- **Jacson McGowan** was mired in a 3-for-28 slump when he delivered a two-out RBI single in the sixth inning of the March 18 series finale at Saint Louis. That came on the heels of a red-hot start in which he batted .472 (17-for-36) with six homers and 17 RBI over the first nine games. Not surprisingly, Purdue went 8-1 in the first nine games and 1-8 from March 4 to 18. But McGowan has found his way out of the slump. Dating back to that two-out single at Saint Louis, he's 9-for-22 with two homers, three walks and 11 RBI. The junior had multiple hits in each of Purdue's first three home games this season.
- McGowan is already the first Boilermaker since Cameron Perkins in 2011 with at least three four-RBI games in a season.
- **Nick Dalesandro** (No. 12 catcher) and McGowan (No. 24 first baseman) were both ranked among the top 25 in D1Baseball.com's updated national position rankings through the first six weeks of the season (released March 28). Dalesandro is the Big Ten's top-ranked catcher and McGowan is the No. 2 first baseman in the conference.

EXCELLENT WEEK FOR PURDUE PITCHING

- The Boilermakers surrendered only six runs (five earned) on 21 hits over 36 innings last week (March 26-31). The pitchers recorded 15 more strikeouts (35) than hits allowed. For the week, opposing hitters were just 6-for-43 (.140) with runners on base and 3-for-26 (.115) with runners in scoring position. Purdue pitchers allowed the first batter of an inning to reach safely in only six of the 36 innings. The defense backed up the staff, committing just two errors in 134 defensive chances – good for a .985 fielding percentage.
- The five runs allowed at Penn State were the fewest surrendered in a three-game weekend series since last year's sweep of Illinois (four) at Alexander Field. A sweep at Northwestern in April 2012 marked the last time Purdue limited the home team to five runs or fewer in a Big Ten road series.
- **Ryan Beard** set the tone last week with six hitless innings in the Valparaiso win. The first hit he surrendered came with two outs in the seventh inning and was recorded by the 24th batter Beard faced.
- **Trent Johnson** followed Beard's lead and did not give up a hit until his final inning. In game three of the series, the freshman retired the first seven Penn State batters in order and did surrender a hit until a wind-aided fly ball dropped in center field in the bottom of the fifth. That ball was hit by the 18th batter Johnson faced.
- Friday, **Tanner Andrews** surrendered a single to the PSU leadoff man, but didn't give up another hit to the next 13 batters he faced. Three of the six hits he allowed came in the seventh inning.
- **Gareth Stroh** also gave up a game-opening single on Saturday. He did not give up another hit to the next 12 batters he faced on his way to a quality start.

HUNTER RECORDS 30 HITS IN 20 GAMES

- **Skyler Hunter** has hit safely in 20 of the first 24 games this season, recording multiple hits 10 times. The switch-hitter joined Kyle Johnson (2016), Kevin Plawecki (2012, 2011), Eric Charles (2012), Cameron Perkins (2012), Barrett Serrato (2012) and Tyler Spillner (2010) as Boilermakers in the last decade to record 30 hits in the team's first 20 games.
- Hunter led Purdue in hits (65) and batting average (.325) as a freshman last season, becoming the first Boilermaker since Plawecki in 2010 to accomplish the feat.

RELIEF PITCHING REALLY GOOD AS OF LATE

- The Boilermaker bullpen was equally effective as the starters the final week of March, working 12 innings of six-hit relief. The relief corps registered 15 strikeouts vs. four walks. Dating back to the eighth inning of the March 18 loss at Saint Louis, Purdue relievers have conceded just one unearned run over 21 innings. They had a streak of 12 consecutive scoreless innings during that stretch.
- The Purdue bullpen retired 23 of the 29 batters it faced over eight innings of four-hit shutout relief in the Lipscomb doubleheader, recording nine strikeouts.
- Over the last 14 games, **Dalton Parker** (6 1/3 IP over 4 App) and **Ross Learnard** (5 2/3 IP over 5 App) have combined for 12 innings of four-hit relief. The two Central Illinois natives were a big reason why the Purdue bullpen had 12 wins and 13 saves in 2017. They teamed up for 80 strikeouts while surrendering just 63 hits in 89 1/3 innings pitched in their first seasons as Boilermakers.
- Freshman **Bo Hofstra** has pitched 5 1/3 innings of two-hit relief over his first two appearances at Alexander Field. Hofstra has made 10 of his 11 appearances this season out of the bullpen. As a reliever, he has worked 19 innings, giving up only 11 hits (.167 B/Avg) while compiling a 2.37 ERA. Take out his rough fifth inning at Saint Louis on March 18 and the right-hander has a 1.69 ERA over 21 1/3 innings, recording 17 strikeouts while surrendering just 12 hits.

SHIPLEY SHINES IN LEADOFF SPOT

- **Harry Shipley** has reached base safely a team-high 18 times over the last eight games. He has been on base safely at least twice in seven of the eight games, including five straight from March 17-28. **Skyler Hunter** is the only other Boilermaker to reach base safely twice in five consecutive games this year. Hunter reached base safely 12 times over Purdue's five games from Feb. 24 through March 4.
- Shipley has now been plunked 68 times in his career, extending the all-time program record he established last year.
- Shipley batted leadoff in 23 of the 56 games last season, batting .301 with a .454 on-base percentage and 21 runs scored in those games as Purdue went 13-10. This season he has reached base safely 58 percent (11 of 19) of the time when leading off any inning. That's the best percentage for any Boilermaker who has led off any inning at least 10 times.
- Shipley has played in 91 consecutive games and 187 of 188 since the start of 2015. Among active players, only **Nick Dalesandro** has played in more consecutive games (134) than Shipley. **Jacson McGowan** has played in 81 straight.

HOT START FOLLOWED BY A TOUGH STRETCH

- Purdue was 8-1 over its first 9 games (through March 3)

LEARNARD LOCKED IN AGAIN

- Since giving up a walk-off home run in the ninth inning of the 4-2 loss vs. Notre Dame on Feb. 24 in San Antonio, **Ross Learnard** has retired 24 of the 31 batters he has faced in his last eight appearances. He has worked 8 1/3 innings of five-hit relief during that stretch. The left-hander earned the save in consecutive games the final week of March, closing out the series-opening win at Penn State by striking out the No. 1 and 2 hitters in the lineup with the tying run at second base.
- Learnard was an NCBWA All-American in 2017 after posting a program-record 0.58 ERA.

HUNTER WITH A HIT IN THE FIRST 13 GAMES

- **Skyler Hunter** hit safely in each of the 13 games this season, recording multiple hits seven times. It was the longest hit streak by a Boilermaker since Eric Charles enjoyed a 15-game run late in the 2011 campaign. Purdue has had 12 hit streaks of at least 13 games since the start of the 2008 season.
- **Jacson McGowan** reached base safely in a career-high 15 consecutive games, the first 13 of 2018 and the final two games of last season.

NEW ORLEANS WEEKEND

- **Tanner Andrews** matched zeros with Tulane's starting pitcher for seven innings but lost a 1-0 pitchers duel in the March 9 series opener in New Orleans. He struck out seven over 7 2/3 innings, working four true 1-2-3 frames. The Green Wave scored on a two-out, two-strike RBI single in the eighth inning. It was Purdue's first 1-0 loss February 2015 vs. Missouri in Corpus Christi, Texas.
- The Boilermakers came back the next day and posted season highs for runs (12) and hits (19) in a 12-8 victory. **Ben Nisle** homered in each of the final two games of the Tulane series. **Evan Warden** (4-for-9, 2 2B, 5 BB, HBP) reached base safely 10 times for the weekend.

ON BASE SAFELY 10 TIMES AT STETSON TOURNAMENT

- **Nick Dalesandro** (8-for-11, 2 walks) and **Jacson McGowan** (5-for-9, 4 walks, HBP) both reached base safely 10 times over the course of Purdue's three games last weekend in Florida. They both had on-base percentages of .714.
- **Harry Shipley** was the last Boilermaker to post an on-base percentage of .700 or better during a weekend series in which the batter made at least 10 plate appearances. It was a feat **Tyler Powers** (4-for-7, 3 BB, 3 RBI, 4 R, sac bunt) duplicated in the sweep at Big Ten State this year. Shipley (3-for-5, 3 walks, 3 HBP) did it at Indiana in April 2016. **Bryce Bonner** (4-for-5, 3 BB, sac fly) finished one plate appearance shy of duplicating the feat last season at Texas State.
- Kyle Wood (9-for-11, 2 walks, 2 HR, 7 RBI) was the last Boilermaker to bat over .700 with at least 10 at-bats during a three-game weekend series, as Dalesandro did at Stetson's Tournament. Wood accomplished the feat at Oklahoma in March 2015 and won Big Ten Player of the Week for his big weekend.
