#### – AROUND THE HORN –

• After failing to close out a 6-4 win in the 12-inning series finale at Penn State, Purdue suffered its first-ever sweep at the hands of PSU. The Boilermakers lost in walk-off fashion after taking a two-run lead into the bottom of the final inning for the second time this season (also March 5 at ETSU).

• Purdue's 10-game losing streak is its longest since also dropping 10 straight in March 2005. The Boilermakers have been outscored 77-43 during the skid, but only 30-18 over the last five games.

• Early deficits have haunted Purdue over the last 10 games, getting outscored 59-16 over the first five innings. For the season, the opposition has a 117-46 scoring edge over the first five innings.

• Purdue and Indiana have only played five times since the start of 2012, including just one regular-season series (2014 in Bloomington). The Hoosiers are one of four Big Ten teams (along with Illinois, Minnesota and Michigan State) that still have not visited Alexander Field, which opened in 2013.

• A Purdue starter has pitched at least six innings in only two of the team's 25 games. Relievers have worked 133 1/3 of the 219 2/3 innings (61 percent) this year, compiling a 4.73 ERA and 1.58 WHIP.

- Regularly used member of the bullpen over his first three seasons, ranking fourth in program history with 77 career appearances.
- His streak of 11 consecutive scoreless innings vs. Penn State ended in the third inning of the April 1 series opener this year.
- Teamed up with Matt Frawley on a shutout win vs. North Dakota, working five scoreless innings after escaping a 1-out bases-loaded jam in the 2nd.
- Faced only 16 batters through the first five innings in his start at ETSU, which was his first weekend start since March 2014 and just second career.
- Ranked 2nd on the team in 2015 by inducing 6 ground ball double plays in 28 2/3 innings, 2 more than he had in 99 innings as an underclassman.
- Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree ranks second among active Boiler-makers with 152 1/3 career innings pitched.
- In 2014, became just the third pitcher in program history to appear in 30 games in a season (and first since 2008); set a new Purdue freshman record with 25 appearances in 2013.
- Pitched a career-high 6 1/3 innings and recorded a quality start in the 2015 midweek win at Valparaiso, his first start in over year.
- Induced and started a game-ending 1-2-3 double play with the bases loaded and Purdue up a run in 2014 series-opening win at Illinois, becoming first Boiler pitcher to end a game in that fashion since February 2012.
- Starred in relief in Purdue's first-ever sweep at Penn State (2013), working 6 1/3 innings of scoreless relief over his three appearances.

- Retired 10 of the 13 batters he faced while striking out 6 over 3 1/3 innings of one-hit relief vs. Saint Louis; retired 14 of the first 17 batters he faced at in game 3 of the series at ETSU.
- Led the team in innings pitched, strikeouts and strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.84) in 2015, starting 4 Big Ten games and 4 midweek contests.
- Led Purdue to both of its shutout victories in 2015, midweek home wins vs. Valparaiso and Ball State.
- Shined at home in 2015, going 3-1 with a 2.45 ERA, .262 batting average against and 32 strikeouts in 33 innings over 6 starts at Alexander Field.
- Struck out 9 over a season-high 8 shutout innings vs. Ball State, the most strikeouts by a Purdue pitcher since March 2013; fanned eight of the 23 batters he faced over 4 2/3 innings the following week against Illinois State.
- All-Midwest Collegiate Team honoree as a sophomore in 2013 at Indiana Wesleyan, posting a 7-3 record with a 4.21 ERA, throwing 7 complete games and 72 2/3 innings.
- Academic All-Big Ten honoree in 2015 & also a dean's list student at IWU.

# HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 18th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in nine of its 10 appearances under Schreiber.

The 2015 Boilermakers won their final five games and six of their last seven, posting their third longest season-ending win streak in program history. Kyle Wood won the team triple crown in 2015, becoming the first hitter to do so since 2007 and the 11th Boilermaker position player since 1970 to accomplish the feat.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Ball State (1991-92) and spent 1993 as an assistant at Butler.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132) and games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eighth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

# LOTS OF QUALITY LONG RELIEF OUTINGS

• Entering the weekend, Purdue relievers have combined to pitch 133 1/3 of the 219 2/3 innings (61 percent). There have been 15 total relief outings in which a Boilermaker gave up one earned run over or fewer over at least three innings of relief. **Matt Frawley** and **Gavin Downs** both have three such outings and **Edie De LaRiva**, **Brian Ghiselli** and **Tanner Schumacher** have all done it twice. In series finale at Penn State in his first relief appearance of the season, **Tanner Andrews** worked seven shutout innings of two-hit ball to give Purdue a chance to win the 12-inning thriller.

• Meanwhile, there have been two other outings in which a reliever surrendered just two earned runs over four innings of relief. In those 17 outings that could be deemed quality long relief appearances, Purdue pitchers have combined for a 1.51 ERA, 1.02 WHIP and 2.19 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

# KYLE WOOD'S IMPRESSIVE POWER SURGE

• **Kyle Wood** had an extra-base hit in 10 straight games from March 12 to April 1, matching the longest standard hit streak of his career along the way. He also had an RBI in seven straight games from March 12 to 25, racking up 14 total during that stretch.

• Wood also homered nine times in a 14-game stretch in March, including four games in a row from March 19 to 23. He became the first Boilermaker since at least the beginning of the 2005 season to homer in four straight games. The week of March 22 to 27 he hit a three-run homer at Ball State, a grand slam vs. No. 7 Louisville and another three-run homer in the series finale with Nebraska. He hit for the cycle over the course of the Nebraska series and finished the week 8-for-19 with six extra-base hits and 14 RBI.

• Wood has already matched his home run total from the last two seasons combined. He leads the Big Ten in home runs while out homering Penn State (7) as a team and matching Northwestern's team total (9). He ranks 11th nationally in home runs per game and 14th in total home runs entering the weekend.

• Six of Wood's nine home runs have been hit to the opposite field (left) plus one additional long ball to straight away center. He's already matched the most homers by a Purdue hitter in the BBOR bat era (2011-present). Dan Black's 15 homers in 2009 represent the last double-figure total by a Boilermaker. Wood's nine home runs in March were the most by a Purdue player in a single month since Black hit nine in April 2008. Black also hit four homers over the course of four consecutive games on three occasions while hitting a combined 33 long balls between 2008 and 2009.

• Wood has become just the 16th player in program history to reach the 20 career homers benchmark. He's currently tied for 11th in the team record book with 23 career long balls.

# SHIPLEY AMONG TOP DEFENSIVE SHORTSTOPS IN THE BIG TEN

• Sophomore **Harry Shipley** has started 79 consecutive games at shortstop, every game since the start of last season. After leading the Big Ten in defensive assists through the end of the regular season a year ago, he's once again among the top defensive shortstops in the league. He has committed only two errors in 138 defensive chances, his .986 fielding percentage ranking second among Big Ten shortstops. Only Minnesota's Terrin Vavra (one error, .987) and Iowa's Nick Roscetti (two errors, .982) are the only other league shortstops with fielding percentages above .960. Shipley's 87 defensive assists are third most in the conference and he has contributed to 21 of the 24 double plays turned by Purdue, which are second most in the league.

• Shipley has a career .970 fielding percentage, committing only 13 errors in 427 defensive chances — all at shortstop.

# JOHNSON, PICCHIOTTI, STRONG ALSO RIDING STREAKS

• **Kyle Wood's** 10 consecutive games with an extra-base hit was quite the way to put together a hitting streak. But teammates **Kyle Johnson**, **Jack Picchiotti** and **Cody Strong** had notable streaks going as well. Strong has extended his reached base safely streak to 14 straight games, two shy of his career-long run from 2013. Picchiotti's streak of reaching base safely in 14 straight games in which he started ended April 5 at Indiana State. Johnson's 12-game reached safely streak ended in the finale of the Penn State series on April 2.

## EARLY DEFICITS, BIG INNINGS BURNING BOILERMAKERS AS OF LATE

• Purdue did a decent job of avoiding big innings during the first month of the season, giving up four-plus runs in a frame only twice over the first 15 games. But while giving up 77 runs during the 10-game losing streak, the Boilermakers have seen the opposition consistently jump out to early leads. Opponents have also scored four-plus runs in an inning five times over the last 10 games. Of the 77 runs allowed in the last 10 games, 41 have been scored in the first three innings. Ohio and Louisville both scored four runs in the top of the first before Purdue even came to the plate. Purdue has only held the lead in two of the 10 straight losses, March 22 at Ball State and April 2 in the series finale at Penn State.

• Starting pitchers have not been able to go deep for the Boilermakers. Only twice (**Tanner Andrews** on Friday at ETSU and **Matt Frawley** on Saturday vs. Nebraska) has a Purdue starter worked six innings. Conversely, in six of the Boilers' 22 weekend games, their starter failed to make it through the third inning. Purdue is 1-5 in those six games.

## GRAND SLAMS PILING UP

• The Boilermakers hit a pair of grand slams the week of March 22 to 27 and already have three this season, their most since the 2008 team hit four. **Kyle Johnson** connected for his second slam of the season March 22 at Ball State and **Kyle Wood** hit his first collegiate slam in the home opener against Louisville. Johnson is the first Boilermaker to hit two grand slams in the same season since Drew Madia in 2009 and first to do it in the same month since Dan Black in April 2008. Black (2007-09) and Madia (2007-10) both hit three grand slams in their Purdue careers altogether.

• The Boilermakers' hit three grand slams in a month for the first time since April 2008. Going back to the grand slams hit by **Ted Snidanko** and **Jack Picchiotti** in March of last season, Purdue has five in a little over a year. The Boilermakers only hit three grand slams total in the three seasons from 2011 to 2014.

## DE LARIVA STRIKES OUT NINE OF 19 BATTERS FACED

• **Eddie De LaRiva** put together an impressive relief outing in the March 25 Big Ten opener with Nebraska, striking out nine of the 19 batters he faced over 4 2/3 innings of one-run ball. It was the longest outing of his career and more strikeouts than he had in the last two seasons combined after missing 2015 with an arm injury and recording just six Ks in 7 2/3 innings in 2014.

• De LaRiva struck out three batters in sixth, seventh and eighth innings. But a pair of dropped third strikes caused him to face additional hitters in the seventh and eighth. His nine strikeouts alone would have represented the most strikeouts Purdue had as a team this season. After **Mike Lutz** also fanned four batters, the 13 Ks were the Boilermakers' most since striking out 15 in their first win of the 2015 campaign.

## PURDUE WINS THIRD-LONGEST GAME IN PROGRAM HISTORY ON WALK-OFF BUNT

• The Boilermakers rallied to win the middle game of the Ohio series on March 19 in 15 innings. **Alec Olund** delivered the game-winning hit, a two-out bunt single with the runners on the corners. It was the third-longest game in program history and Purdue's first walk-off win since February 2015 vs. Sam Houston State (in Corpus Christi), a game in which Olund scored the game-winning run on a sacrifice fly. Olund also had a two-out RBI bunt single in the March 5 win at ETSU.

• **Alex Lyons** escaped a one-out bases-loaded jam in the 12th inning to keep the game tied. **Matt Frawley** retired 13 of the final 14 batters he faced amid seven innings of one-run relief. **Kyle Wood** hit a game-tying home run in the eighth inning as the Boilers rallied from a 4-1 deficit.

## WOOD ECLIPSES HIT BY PITCH RECORD

• **Kyle Wood** was hit by a pitch for the 41st time in his career in the March 22 loss at Ball State, eclipsing Kevin Plawecki's program record. It was the first Purdue all-time record to change hands since Robert Ramer finished his career in 2013 with the best fewest walks per nine innings ratio in program history. A year earlier during the Boilermakers' Big Ten championship season, Nick Wittgren broke the saves record and Eric Charles eclipsed the runs scored benchmark (along with Plawecki taking over the hit by pitch record).

• Just as Plawecki did not hold the HBP record very long, Wood's stay atop the all-time leaderboard could also be short lived. **Harry Shipley** has already been plunked 20 times before the halfway point of his sophomore season.

## DALESANDRO'S 11-GAME HIT STREAK LONGEST AMONG ACTIVE BOILERS

• Freshman **Nick Dalesandro** had an 11-game hitting streak this season. It began when he delivered a two-run double with the bases loaded in the ninth inning to break a 3-3 tie in the Feb. 21 win at Georgia State and ended in the March 18 series opener against Ohio. The streak already ranks as the longest career hitting streak among active Boilermakers. **Harry Shipley** and **Kyle Wood** both had 10-game hitting streaks last season and **Kyle Johnson** posted a 10-gamer in 2013. Overall, Dalesandro's hit streak was the longest by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh and Brandon Krieg had 12-game streaks in 2014.

• Dalesandro was 15-for-38 (.395) with three doubles and six RBI during the streak. He recorded a hit in his first at-bat in five of the 10 games after delivering the game-winning double. This year Dalesandro became the first Boilermaker since **Kyle Wood** in April 2014 to bat in the lineup in the same game he was the starting pitcher. But it was February 2014 (Wood again) the last time it happened in a weekend game.
