- Held Butler scoreless for 5 2/3 innings, giving up just 5 singles.
- Did not issue a walk over 6-plus innings vs. NIU in his longest outing of 2015; put up 4 straight zeroes after giving up a run in first 2 innings
- Did not have a clean inning over 3 1/3 innings vs. Gonzaga but gave up only 1 run.
- Made his collegiate debut vs. Texas A&M-Corpus Christi after not traveling for season-opening weekend partly due to back soreness.
- Catholic League Player of the Year as a senior at St. Laurence after batting .417 and posting a 9-1 record with 88 strikeouts on the mound.
- Batted .429 with an 8-1 record, 82 strikeouts and a 0.97 ERA on the mound as a junior to earn Area Player of the Year honors from the Southtown Star newspaper.
- · Established new school records for games played, hits, RBI, runs scored & strikeouts.
- Brother Mark plays baseball at Lewis University in Chicagoland area.

# HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extraining affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

#### - BOILERMAKERS CLOSE OUT HOME-HEAVY STRETCH AGAINST IOWA -

As No. 24 lowa visits Alexander Field for the third year in a row, Purdue baseball is set to resume its Big Ten Conference schedule while playing at home for the third consecutive weekend.

First pitch is slated for 5:30 p.m. Friday, 2 p.m. Saturday and 1 p.m. Sunday. The Hawkeyes (18-7, 3-0 Big Ten) are believed to be the first Big Ten rival to ever visit West Lafayette for a weekend series three years in a row. The Boilermakers (10-18, 1-2 Big Ten) will travel to Illinois and Michigan State for the third year in a row later this season. The duplicate scheduling is a byproduct of the Big Ten's expansion over the last four years. The addition of Maryland and Rutgers this year led to the league schedule having to be reworked again.

lowa was ranked 24th in this week's Collegiate Baseball Top 30 poll after sweeping Indiana in Iowa City last weekend. The Hawkeyes are ranked for the first time since 1990. Purdue will be looking to snap an 18-game losing streak against ranked teams this weekend. A May 2012 win at UCLA marked the last time the Boilers took down a ranked opponent.

lowa entered the week ranking among the top 10 nationally in ERA (2.81) and fielding percentage (.980). The ERA rose by half a run after giving up a season-high 15 earned runs Wednesday in a midweek loss at Western Illinois.

The Hawkeyes' stellar defense has helped contribute to a .277 batting average on balls in play clip against the lowa pitchers. Typically, a .300 clip is considered a baseline average when looking at batting average on balls in play, which removes strikeouts and home runs from the standard batting average equation. While both teams' pitchers average about 6.5 strikeouts and four walks per nine innings, the Purdue pitching staff has seen opposing hitters produce a .357 batting average on balls in play against if

Led by the individual league leader Eric Toole (16-of-18), lowa leads the Big Ten in stolen bases (42-of-54). Toole also leads the team with a .353 batting average and 21 runs scored. Purdue's **Jack Picchiotti** has thrown out 13 base stealers this season to lead the conference.

Tyler Peyton is starting on the mound on Fridays and remains a constant in the middle of the lineup for the Hawkeyes. He's batting .350 but has just three extra-base hits on the season as the regular first baseman when he's not pitching. Peyton is the reigning Big Ten Pitcher of the Week after throwing a complete game shutout against Indiana last weekend. Second baseman Jake Mangler is having another good season for lowa as well, leading the team with 18 RBI while striking out just seven times in 103 at-bats. Outfielders Joel Booker and Toole as well as Mangler have started every game at the same positon.

Purdue and Iowa closed the regular season against each other for five straight years from 2010-14. Including two meetings at the 2010 Big Ten Tournament, the Hawkeyes were 12-5 against the Boilers during that stretch. Iowa has won five of six at Alexander Field the last two years and last year qualified for the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2010.

At the conclusion of this weekend, Purdue will have played 11 of its 13 games at home from March 18 through April 5. With road weekends at No. 15 Illinois and Michigan on tap, the Boilers are scheduled to play seven of their eight games away from Alexander Field from April 7-19. With Iowa, Illinois, Maryland and Nebraska all currently nationally ranked, Purdue could end up playing four series against Top 25 over the next six weekends.

#### BOILERMAKERS HOST IOWA FOR THE THIRD YEAR IN A ROW

- Purdue wraps its home-heavy stretch by welcoming lowa to Alexander Field for the third year in a row. The Boilermakers are set to play at home for the third weekend in a row, closing out a portion of the season in which 11 of their of 13 games were played at home. The Hawkeyes are ranked 24th in Collegiate Baseball's national poll after sweeping Indiana at home last weekend. Purdue will be in search of its first victory against a nationally ranked opponent since May 2012 at UCLA. The Boilermakers have dropped 18 straight games ranked teams since that win at UCLA.
- · Will No. 15 Illinois up next on the schedule and likely to remain nationally ranked going into next weekend's series, Purdue is likely to play a Top 25 in consecutive weekends since February 2013 (Louisville and Mississippi State). However, both of those were tournaments. The Boilers have not played standard weekend series against back-to-back ranked teams since March 2006 at North Carolina and Missouri. The 2000 campaign marked the last time Purdue played two ranked Big Ten teams (Illinois and Minnesota) in the same season. With Maryland and Nebraska also in the Top 25 and on the horizon, nationally ranked opponents could become a regular thing over the next six weekends.
- The Boilermakers snapped their seven-game losing streak Wednesday with a 9-1 win against IPFW. After scoring just 12 runs during the skid, the bats came alive Wednesday. But it has remained a feast for famine stretch for Purdue offensively over the last 14 games. In the Boilers' last five wins they've scores 53 games. But in their last nine losses they've managed just 16 runs.
- · Jack Picchiotti's grand slam broke a 5-5 tie in the seventh inning and lifted the Boilers to a Big Tenopening win against Rutgers March 20, but Purdue ended up losing the series after scoring only three runs the rest of the weekend. The Boilers remained winless in Big Ten rubber games since April 2012.
- Purdue shut out Valparaiso, 2-0, in the home opener March 18. It was the sixth-earliest home opener in program history and the earliest ever during head coach Doug Schreiber's 17-year tenure. Purdue's pitchers struck out 12 while leading the team to its first shutout win since April 2014 vs. Penn State. The Boilers won the contest on a game-ending line drive double play for the second time this season. Purdue improved to 13-4 in home openers under Schreiber.

- · Purdue's first multi-homer game since May 2013 (Sean McHugh) came from an unlikely source. Batting ninth in the DATE lineup in only his fourth start of the season, Alec Olund con- 4/01/15 Alec Olund nected for a pair of solo home runs to left field in the April 1 5/17/13 Sean McHugh home win vs. IPFW. It the first multi-homer game by a Purdue 5/17/12 Cameron Perkins freshman since April 2010 (Cameron Perkins), making it the first 4/20/12 Cameron Perkins of the BBCOR bat era (2011-present).
- There have been only two multi-homer games in the first 43 3/13/11 Eric Charles regular-season games at Alexander Field. However, with six homers in the first eight games this season, home runs are up. There were only 16 long balls hit in the 35 games at the first two years of the new ballpark.
- · Kyle Johnson walked four time in the April 1 win vs. IPFW, becoming the first Boiler to draw four walks in a game since Cody Strong in April 2013. Prior to Strong in 2013, a Purdue player had not walked four times since February 2009.

#### PICCHIOTTI'S MARCH POWER SURGE

- · Jack Picchiotti reached base safely in 11 straight games, hitting safely in eight of the first nine. He was 12-for-38 with seven free passes and 11 RBI during that stretch. Seven of the 12 hits went for extra bases, highlighted by home runs against Valparaiso and Rutgers. The long ball against Rutgers was a grand slam, Purdue's second in a four-game stretch. He became the first Boiler to homer in consecutive games since Sean McHugh in March 2014 at Southern Illinois. However, Picchiotti was the first Boilermaker to do so in consecutive games at Alexander Field in the ballpark's brief three-year history.
- PICCHIOTTI'S 11-GAME REACHED SAFELY STREAK (MARCH 14-28): .316, 7 XBH, 3 HR, 11 RBI, 11 R, 5 BB

#### HIT BY PITCH TOTALS PILING UP FOR SHIPLEY & WOOD

- · Purdue batters were hit by a pitch 10 times in the Big Ten-opening series against Rutgers. Harry Shipley bore the brunt of the beanings and was plunked five times for the weekend. The freshman has now been hit by a pitch eight times over the last 12 games. The Purdue freshman record for HBPs is 14, set by **Kyle Wood** in 2013. Shipley enters the weekend with 14 walks and nine HBP.
- Meanwhile, Wood has been hit by a pitch five times this season and on 33 occasions for his career. The program's all-time record is 40, established by Kevin Plawecki (2010-12). Wood enters the weekend tied for sixth place in Purdue record book. As a team, the Boilers have been hit by a pitch 32 times this season, ranking third in the Big Ten.

# BOILERMAKERS SNAP RUBBER GAME LOSING STREAK, BUT LOSE 2-OF-3 TO RUTGERS

- Not only did Purdue's 23-5 win vs. Northern Illinois March 15 snap a 10-game losing streak in weekend series rubber games, it also allowed the Boilers to win a series after losing the opener for the first time since May 2009 at Michigan State. Purdue's last rubber game win was in April 2012 at Nebraska.
- · However, the rubber game demons rose up again in the March 22 loss to Rutgers. The Scarlet Knights took games two and three to win the series after the Boilers won the opener, 9-5. Purdue has lost nine straight rubber games in Big Ten play dating to May 2012. Dating back to the opening weekend of conference play in 2010, the Boilers have won the first game of a weekend but lost the series 10 times in Big Ten play. It has happened 13 times overall since the beginning of the 2010 season. During that stretch, the Boilers only won the middle game of a series three times after losing the opener.

#### SHIPLEY IMPRESSING DEFENSIVELY BUT 14-GAME ERRORLESS STREAK ENDS

· Shortstop Harry Shipley and center fielder Kyle Johnson are the only Boilers that have started every game at the same position this season. Shipley has done it as a freshman thanks in part to his steady play at the most important defensive position. He has committed only five errors in 146 defensive chances. His 14-game errorless streak ended March 21 in the middle game of the Rutgers series. It was his first error since game two of the Sam Houston State doubleheader on Feb. 21. During his 14-game streak without an error he handled 74 defensive chances cleanly. He enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 99 defensive assists.

· Shipley has been involved in all four game-ending double plays this season. Cody Strong and Shipley teamed up on both game-ending line drive double plays, with the tying run aboard both times. Those closed out victories against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and Valparaiso (March 18). Shipley also made a nice diving stop behind second base to start a game-ending 6-4-3 double play in the March 20 victory vs. Rutgers. Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, Purdue has closed out nine wins on notable game-ending double plays. That total includes games in which the potential tying run was at least in the on-deck circle at the time of the twin killing.

#### **GIBBS STILL STINGY ON HITS ALLOWED**

• Matt Gibbs has faced 35 batters and only allowed four hits this season. Dating back to the 2014 home opener, he has given up only 24 hits in 42 1/3 innings (5.10 hits per nine). By surrendering only 5.77 hits per nine innings last year, he posted the sixth best single-season clip in Purdue history. His 4.91 hits per nine in Big Ten play was a new program record. He posted a streak of 17 consecutive scoreless innings over seven appearances from April 5-25, 2014. This year, he has allowed only four of 16 inherited runners to score (14 percent).

#### SNIDANKO'S GRAND SLAM, SEVEN RBI HIGHLIGHT BLOWOUT WIN VERSUS NIU

• Purdue scored multiple runs in seven consecutive innings to slug its way to a 23-5 rubber game win vs. Northern Illinois March 15. Despite not entering the game until the sixth inning, Ted Snidanko finished the day with a careerhigh seven RBI and just a single shy of the cycle. He connected for a grand slam in the sixth inning as Purdue posted its second five-run frame of the game. It was the first slam by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh at Michigan in May 2013 and he became the first Purdue player with seven RBI in a game since Josh Estill in April 2013.

· Snidanko nearly hit two grand slams. He tripled off the fence in left center with the bases loaded in his third at-bat. The sophomore entered the day with one extra-base hit and no RBI in 27 games as a Boilermaker.

· Purdue recorded 20 runs and 20 hits for the first time since wins against Illinois-Chicago in March (hits) and April (runs) of 2013. But the 23 runs Sunday were the most since beating Indiana, 25-8, in April 2006 in Bloomington and the 24 hits were Purdue's most since racking up a program-record 30 in a March 2012 victory at Murray State.

#### WOOD WINS B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR MONSTER SERIES AT OKLAHOMA

- Kyle Wood did something productive in 12 of his 14 plate appearances in Purdue's series at Oklahoma (March 6-8), earning the junior first baseman Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He was 9-for-11 with a three-run double, two solo home runs, seven RBI, two walks and four runs scored. He had multiple hits in all three games, highlighted by his first collegiate four-hit effort in the rubber game.
- · Wood put up his big numbers predominantly against a tough Oklahoma rotation. The Sooners' starting pitchers combined for 24 strikeouts over 17 1/3 innings in the series. But Wood also delivered an RBI single in his final at-bat of the weekend to win a lefty-lefty matchup vs. OU's closer in the eighth inning of Sunday's rubber game.
- · Wood's 13-game reached base safely streak ended in the March 17 loss at No. 11 Louisville. He recorded multiple hits in eight of those contests. He was Purdue's first Big Ten Player of the Week honoree since Kyle Johnson was named Player and Freshman of the Week on April 1, 2013, following the Boilers' first-ever sweep at Penn State.
- Despite making just two appearances on the mound this season, Wood has struck out 12 over 5 1/3 innings and 12 of the 26 batters he has faced. As a pitcher, he has helped lead Purdue to wins against Western Carolina and Valparaiso.

#### VILARDO'S 12-GAME REACHED BASE SAFELY STREAK SNAPPED

- Michael Vilardo's 12-game reached base safely streak ended in game one of the March 14 double-header with Northern Illinois. Vilardo has opened the game with a hit seven times while batting leadoff in 22 of the first 14 games. The transfer from the University of Pennsylvania produced multiple hits six times during his reached safely streak while going hitless only twice.
- VILARDO'S 12-GAME REACHED SAFELY STREAK: .360 (18-FOR-50), 5 XBH, 7 RBI, 10 R, 3 BB, 2 HBP

#### 10 EXTRA-INNING GAMES SINCE ST. PATRICK'S DAY 2014; LOTS OF DOUBLEHEADERS

- After blowing a four-run lead in the ninth inning en route to losing to CSU Bakersfield in 11 innings on Feb. 28, 10 of Purdue's last 64 games dating back to St. Patrick's Day 2014 have gone to extra innings. As of Feb. 28, it was 10 of 47 games (21 percent) had gone extras.
- The Boilers' eight extra-innings games last year were the most during **Doug Schreiber's** 17-year tenure as head coach and are believed to be the most in program history overall. Purdue is 4-6 in the 10 extra-innings game, including 1-1 this year.
- The March 28 doubleheader vs. Butler is Purdue's fifth of the season already. The Boilers played three doubleheaders over a span of 13 days from Feb. 14-26 and four in 29 days from Feb. 13-March 14. Purdue had not played a doubleheader in three consecutive weekends since 2008, the final year of the Big Ten schedule featuring a doubleheader of two seven-inning games every Saturday.

#### FRAWLEY STELLAR IN START VERSUS BAKERSFIELD

- Matt Frawley surrendered only three singles and one walk over seven shutout innings, striking out five and putting together the finest outing of the young season by a Purdue pitcher in the Feb. 28 loss to CSU Bakersfield in Phoenix. He worked three 1-2-3 innings and retired 15 of 16 batters from the second through seventh innings. His strikeout and innings pitched totals were career highs as a Boilermaker. It marked the first time a Purdue pitcher worked at least seven shutout innings in an outing since Lance Breedlove led the way in a 3-0 win against Indiana at the 2012 Big Ten Tournament with 7 1/3 shutout innings.
- Bakersfield opened the ninth inning with five consecutive hits to rally for four runs and tie the game. Purdue was fortunate to get the game to extra innings after CSUB had the go-ahead run on third with no outs. **Alex Lyons** got out of the jam thanks in part to an inexplicable suicide squeeze attempt with an 0-2 count on the batter with one out in the inning. However, the game marked the first time the Boilers suffered a loss after taking the lead into the ninth since the finale of last season's series at Minnesota when they gave up a three-run lead.

#### FIVE DOUBLE PLAYS IN GAME ONE WIN, NINE FOR THE DAY VERSUS GONZAGA

- Purdue tied a program record with five double plays in the game one win en route to finishing the Feb. 26 doubleheader vs. Gonzaga with nine twin killings. The five double plays were the most since the Boilers' turned four in a March 2012 win at Murray State. Gonzaga helped give Purdue a pair DPs in the game one win after an illegal slide into second base as the Boilers went for a 3-6-1 twin killing. An inning later, a runner tried to score from second base on a sac fly to right center after **Kyle Johnson** slipped while making the catch. But he quickly flipped the ball to **Jeff Evak**, who hit cutoff man **Cody Strong** and Purdue completed the F8-942 put out at the plate.
- Undoubtedly the most exciting double play of the nine was the game-ending line drive to **Harry Shipley** at shortstop. Gonzaga had the bases loaded with one out and Purdue was clinging to a 5-3 lead, but the Boilers successfully doubled off the runner at second base for the final out.
- The Boilermakers turned 15 double plays in their first nine games season, but only 16 in the 19 games since. Purdue enter the weekend leading the Big Ten in double plays turned. The Boilers turned 54 double plays in 50 games a year ago to lead the Big Ten. Purdue also ranks first in the league this year by throwing out 18 base stealers (29-of-47). **Jack Picchiotti** has thrown out 13-of-30 base stealers to lead the Big Ten in caught stealings and rank among the top 20 nationally in percentage (.433) entering the week.

#### KRIEG'S REACHED BASE SAFELY STREAK SNAPPED AT 26

- Brandon Krieg hit safely in each of the first seven games this season, extending his reached base safely streak to 26 consecutive games dating back to 2014. It ranked as the 13th longest active streak in the country when it was snapped Feb. 26 in game one of the doubleheader with Gonzaga. He had hit safely in 20 of the 26 games and overtook Kyle Wood's 24-game run last year for the longest reached base streak by an active Boiler. Cameron Perkins reached base safely in 50 consecutive games in 2011.
- Even with the streak snapped, Krieg is still off to a much better start at the plate than a year ago. Through 11 games last season he was 3-for-38. But he batted .325 from April 15 through the end of the season in 2014.

### VILARDO, PICCHIOTTI & GIBBS STAR IN WILD DOUBLEHEADER SWEEP OF SHSU

- Purdue scored twice in the bottom of the 12th inning to rally for a 4-3 victory against Sam Houston State in the first game of a neutral-site doubleheader in Corpus Christi Feb. 21. **Alec Olund** scored the game-winning run as pinch runner on **Michael Vilardo's** sacrifice fly to right center field. Vilardo joined **Kyle Wood** and **Brandon Krieg** as active Boilers with a game-winning RBI in a walk-off victory.
- In the nightcap of the doubleheader, Purdue overcame deficits of 3-0 and 7-2 to win 9-7 after scoring three times in the top of the ninth inning. Vilardo again delivered the go-ahead run with a sacrifice fly. **Cody Strong** led off the final inning of both games with a base hit against SHSU closer Ryan Brinley, who suffered both losses after giving up a combined five runs. Brinley entered the day having not allowed a run in his 27 innings of relief for SHSU dating back to 2014.
- Jack Picchiotti drove in the game-tying run in both games of the doubleheader. He came through with a pinch-hit, two-out RBI single in the seventh inning of game one. In the nightcap, he also singled home the tying run and later scored the go-ahead tally on Vilardo's sac fly. **Daniel Sander's** pinch hit double plated the game-tying run in the 12th inning of game one. It was Sander's first hit as a Boilermaker.
- Of the 21 innings played in the SHSU doubleheader, Purdue only held the lead in the final inning of both games The Boilers had not swept a doubleheader since April 2012 vs. Illinois. **Matt Gibbs** earned the victory in both games of the twinbill after retiring seven of the nine batters he faced over three scoreless innings of relief. He induced and started a game-ending double play in the nightcap and became the first Purdue pitcher since Chris Toneguzzi in April 2006 to earn the victory in consecutive games. Krieg, Vilardo and Wood joined Gibbs on the All-Tournament Team.
