#### – AROUND THE HORN –

• Purdue is in search of its first Big Ten series victory since March 2013 when it swept Penn State in Central Pennsylvania. The Boilers have not won a series in Ann Arbor since 1993.

• Purdue has lost 8 straight Big Ten games since winning its conference opener vs. Rutgers. The Boilers have scored just 17 runs during the losing streak.

• It was a wild series in Purdue's last visit to Ann Arbor. There were a combined 7 big innings (4+ runs). Michigan scored 5 times in the 7th inning of game 1 to win 9-8. Michigan scored 5 times in the 8th inning of game 2 to break a 5-5 tie. Purdue scored 4 times in the 9th inning of game 3 to win 12-9.

• Kyle Johnson was 5-for-9 with 2 doubles, 5 walks & 7 runs scored in the 2013 series in Ann Arbor.

• Last year's series opener with Michigan went 12 innings. Purdue won game 2 last year behind 7 innings of three-hit ball from Gavin Downs.

- Joined the weekend rotation for the Iowa series in April and moved to Friday after injury to Mike Kornacker.
- Had back-to-back quality outings in midweek play against Valparaiso and Kent State in his first two starts as a Boilermaker.
- Compiled a 1.10 ERA over 16 1/3 innings in March, striking out 19.
- Struck out a season-high 6 over 5-plus innings vs. Kent State.
- Started the 2015 home opener and led Purdue to a shutout win against Valparaiso with 5 1/3 scoreless innings.
- Retired 11 of the 13 batters he faced over four scoreless innings of relief in Purdue's 1-0 loss to Missouri in Corpus Christi.
- Ranked 86th among the Northwoods League's top prospects after a strong summer of 2014 pitching for the Kalamazoo Growlers in which he was 5-2 with 4 saves and a 3.60 ERA in 65 innings.
- Transfer from Indiana Wesleyan was not part of the official roster in 2014 while redshirting; joined the program in the fall of 2013.
- All-Midwest Collegiate Team honoree in 2013 after posting a 7-3 record with a 4.21 ERA, throwing 7 complete games and 72 2/3 innings.
- His parents are Purdue employees and his father is an alumnus.

- Was deserving of a win vs. No. 24 Iowa after giving up just one earned run over 6-plus innings in quality start, but Hawkeyes rallied for 8 runs vs. the Purdue bullpen.
- Put together his best start as a Boiler in win vs. NIU, striking out career-high six over 7 innings; gave up just five hits & 1 earned run.
- Worked 1-2-3 frames in 1st & 4th innings at ASU, but couldn't come up with shutdown frames after Boilers scored multiple runs in 2nd & 3rd.
- Retired 10 consecutive batters & surrendered only 5 singles in strong outing (5 1/3 IP of 2-run ball) vs. Sam Houston State.
- Started Big Ten series finales vs. Penn State, Michigan State and Michigan in 2014 as a transfer from Parkland CC in Champaign, Ill.
- Worked five shutout innings versus PSU to help lead Purdue to its only shutout win of 2014.
- Worked four innings of scoreless relief in the 16-inning marathon with Southern Illinois.
- Helped Central Catholic win three straight IHSAA Class A state championships & an 81-20 record from 2009-11.
- Two-time small school area player of the year in basketball.

- Had not allowed an extra-base hit in 16 innings pitched this season until Oklahoma went homer-double-homer against him in bottom 3rd.
- Shined vs Bakersfield, retiring 15 of 16 batters during one stretch en route to 7 shutout innings of 3-hit ball.
- Helped lead Purdue to game 3 win at Western Carolina by striking out 4 while going 9-up, 9-down his first time through the lineup.

# HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

# - BOILERMAKERS VISIT ANN ARBOR BIG TEN ROAD SERIES -

For the first of its two road trips to the Great Lakes state over the next three weeks, Purdue baseball visits Ann Arbor for its first series on the second-year artificial turf surface at Michigan's Ray Fisher Stadium.

First pitch is slated for 4 p.m. Friday, 2 p.m. Saturday and 1 p.m. Sunday. This weekend represents the Boilermakers' final games of the season on artificial turf. Purdue's remaining road games at Michigan State, Nebraska and Valparaiso over the first 12 days of May will all be played on natural grass fields. The Boilermakers open a six-game homestand Tuesday.

With their open weekend in conference play not until the final weekend of the season, the Wolverines have played three of their first four Big Ten series on the road. Since getting swept at Nebraska the first weekend of league play (March 20-22), they have won two of three vs. Maryland, at Indiana and at Penn State in their last three series. Michigan became the first visiting team to win a traditional weekend series at IU's Kaufman Field, which opened in 2013. In the series against Maryland and Penn State, the Wolverines won two of three after dropping the opener.

The artificial turf was installed at Ray Fisher Stadium in the fall of 2013. Michigan is 6-2 at home this season after losing Wednesday's midweek game to Eastern Michigan. The Wolverines' .296 team batting average is the best in the Big Ten.

Michigan's Jackson Glines (.368) and Purdue's **Kyle Wood** (.366) rank second and third in the Big Ten in batting average, respectively. The Wolverines' Carmen Benedetti leads the conference in RBI (38) thanks in part to 12 doubles and 17 extra-base hits total.

Jacob Cronenworth recently made the move from closer to Friday starter for Michigan, making his first collegiate start on the mound March 28 against Maryland. He struck out nine over five innings that day but still took the loss. Uniquely, he has also batted leadoff in every game this season, even those he started on the mound. Cronenworth has played primarily first base as a position player and leads U-M with four home runs.

Purdue won a pair of games and advanced to the championship round of the 2008 Big Ten Tournament in Ann Arbor, but has not won a traditional weekend series at Ray Fisher Stadium since sweeping a pair of doubleheaders as part of a four-game set in April 1993. That represents Purdue's longest active drought without a series win at any Big Ten rival. However, the Boilers didn't play in Ann Arbor from 1994-2001.

The Purdue-Michigan series at Ray Fisher Stadium in May 2013 was a wild one. There were a combined seven big innings in which four-plus runs were scored. The winning team surged ahead in the eighth inning or later of all three games. The Boilermakers scored four times with outs in the ninth inning to steal the series finale, 12-9. **Jack Picchiotti** delivered a game-tying single with an 0-2 count in the top of the ninth. **Kyle Johnson** finished the weekend 5-for-9 with two doubles, five walks and seven runs scored. **Brandon Krieg** hit a two-run homer in the first game of the series.

Strong outings on the mound from **Gavin Downs** and **Matt Gibbs** highlighted last year's series at Alexander Field. Downs surrendered just two unearned runs over seven innings of three-hit ball to lead the Boilers to a game two win. Gibbs worked six scoreless innings of relief over two appearances. He struck out six over five innings in the opener of the series, which Michigan won in 12 innings. Krieg was 6-for-6 with three walks, three RBI and three runs scored against Michigan a year ago.

**Mike Lutz** appeared in all three games of the Michigan series last season and **Tim McElroy** did the same in 2013 in Ann Arbor.

Head coach **Doug Schreiber** will coach his 450th career Big Ten game as the leader of the Boilermakers Friday.

# BOILERMAKERS MAKE FIRST OF TWO ROAD TRIPS TO STATE OF MICHIGAN

- Purdue will look to snap its eight-game losing streak in Big Ten play as it visits Michigan this weekend for the first of its two trips to the Great Lakes State. The Boilermakers travel north again for a series May 1-3 series at Michigan State, visiting East Lansing for the third year in a row.
- Hosting Iowa and playing at Illinois for three years in a row did not go well for Purdue. After getting swept by both of the Big Ten's current co-leaders, the Boilers fell to 1-8 against both Iowa and Illinois dating back to 2013.
- With Iowa and Illinois both nationally ranked, Purdue played a Top 25 team in consecutive weekends for the first time since February 2013 (Louisville and Mississippi State). However, both of those were tournaments. The Boilers had not played standard weekend series against back-to-back ranked teams since March 2006 at North Carolina and Missouri. The 2000 campaign marked the last time Purdue played two ranked Big Ten teams (Illinois and Minnesota) in the same season. With Maryland and Nebraska also in the Top 25 and on the horizon, nationally ranked opponents could become a regular feature to the schedule through mid-May.
- The Boilers are 3-6 in the month of April, winning midweek games against IPFW (two) and Indiana State. The victory at ISU April 7 was Purdue's first in Terre Haute since 2006. The Boilers have scored 33 runs in their three midweek wins this month and just 14 in their six Big Ten losses in April. It has remained a feast or famine stretch for Purdue offensively over the last 22 games (since March 14). In the Boilers' last seven wins they've scored 77 runs (11 per game). But in their last 15 losses they've managed just 30 runs (2.0 per game). Purdue has only scored seven runs in each of its last two Big Ten series.

## PURDUE SECOND IN THE BIG TEN IN DOUBLE PLAYS TURNED

- The Boilers enter the weekend second in the Big Ten in double plays turned (38). Penn State has turned a league-high 41. Purdue has turned multiple double plays in a game nine times this year, including five against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and four against Butler (March 28). Shortstop **Harry Shipley** has contributed to 26 of the 38 double plays (68 percent) and second baseman **Cody Strong** has been a part of 21 of the 38 (55 percent). Purdue also led the Big Ten in double plays turned last season (54 in 50 games).
- Individually, Shipley leads the Big Ten in defensive assists (129) while starting every game at shortstop. Catcher **Jack Picchiotti** has thrown out a league-leading 14 base stealers.

## WOOD STILL ROLLING ALONG

- **Kyle Wood's** season really took off when he enjoyed a monster weekend at Oklahoma (9-for-11, 3 XBH, 7 RBI) the weekend of March 6-8 to garner Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He's batting .333 with eight extra-base hits and 13 RBI in the 22 games since then. The junior has reached base safely in each of the first nine Big Ten games and has a 15-game reached safely streak in league play dating back to last season. He has also hit safely in the last 10 games overall, the longest streak of his career.
- Wood enters the weekend third in the Big Ten with a .366 batting average.
- Wood is making a bid to become the first Boilermaker since 2007 (Ryne White) to win the team triple crown. Last year, he overtook Sean McHugh for the team lead in batting average during the final weekend to deny McHugh the team triple crown.
- **Jack Picchiotti**, **Kyle Johnson** and **Brandon Krieg** all saw notable reached base safely streaks end during the Illinois series. Picchiotti had been on base in 14 straight Big Ten games dating back to last season. Johnson (14) and Krieg (11) had their double-figure reached base safely streaks in all games end in game two at Illinois.

## APRIL PROVING TO BE HOME RUN FRIENDLY

- In just nine games this month, Purdue hitters have already connected for more home runs (nine) they did in the first 27 games of the season (10). Unfortunately for the Boilers, the additional long balls have not led to more wins. Seven of the Purdue's nine home runs this month have been solo shots, continuing on a season-long trend in which 14 of the team's 19 homers have come with the bases empty. **Kyle Wood** has homered in the last three games at Alexander Field and **Jordan Lewis** has gone deep in consecutive Big Ten series (vs. Iowa and at Illinois). **Brett Carlson** hit a two-run homer April 15 for his first collegiate long ball. He joined Lewis among the group of six Purdue players to hit their first home runs as a Boilermaker this season.
- Wood homered in games two and three of the Iowa series, going deep in consecutive games for the second time in his career. He also accomplished the feat in April 2013 in a home win vs. Illinois-Chicago and a road loss at Michigan State. He joined **Jack Picchiotti** as Boilers to homer in consecutive games this season. Wood also hit his first home run at Alexander Field in nearly a year, his last being on April 8, 2014, vs. Louisville.

## TIMELY HITTING NON-EXISTENT IN BIG TEN PLAY

- Purdue out homered Iowa, 3-0, in the series but still got swept. The three roundtrippers were the Boilers' only extra-base hits of the series. Thirty of Iowa's 36 hits over the course of the weekend were singles, but the Hawkeyes were successful with the base-hit approach. For the series, Iowa was 19-for-44 with runners in scoring position and 14-for-38 with two outs. Conversely, Purdue was 6-for-23 with runners in scoring position and 4-for-27 with two outs.
- Illinois flipped the script a bit in Champaign and swept the series thanks in part to nine extra-base hits. The Illini only had a 26-25 edge in total hits but still outscored the Boilers, 17-7, over the three games. Purdue was just 3-for-28 with runners in scoring position in the series and did not record a two-out RBI.
- Over the last two weekends, the Boilers are 9-for-51 (.176) with runners in scoring position and 7-for-54 (.130) with two outs. During the Big Ten season as a whole, Purdue has managed just a .208 average with RISP and .136 clip with two outs, recording just three of its 25 RBI with two outs.

### BIG EIGHTH INNINGS FOR AND AGAINST; FIFTH INNING PROVING COSTLY

- Over the first week of April, eighth-inning rallies proved to be the difference in a pair of Purdue's games. April 4, Iowa scored eight times in the top of the eighth to overcome the Boilers' 4-2 lead entering the frame. It marked the second time in a week's time that the opposition put up an eight spot at Alexander Field after Butler also did it in the sixth inning of the nightcap of the March 28 doubleheader.
- April 7 in Terre Haute, Purdue scored five times in the eighth inning to extend its lead from 5-4 to 10-4 en route to winning the game 10-6. It matched the Boilers' biggest rally of the season; they also scored five times in an inning against Northern Illinois (twice) and Oklahoma.
- The fifth inning has been very unkind to Purdue this season, getting outscored 46-14 in baseball's middle frame. The minus-32 run differential is by far the Boilers' worst of any inning this year. For the season, Purdue has a minus-55 run differential. More than half of that negative differential has come from the fifth inning.

### OLUND POSTS FIRST MULTI-HOMER GAME BY A PURDUE FRESHMAN SINCE 2010

- Purdue's first multi-homer game since May 2013 (Sean McHugh) came from an unlikely source. Batting ninth in the lineup in only his fourth start of the season, **Alec Olund** connected for a pair of solo home runs to left field in the April 1 home win vs. IPFW. It was the first multi-homer game by a Purdue freshman since April 2010 (Cameron Perkins), making it the first of the BBCOR bat era (2011-present).
- Olund also made starts against Iowa and Indiana State, but was injured in the fourth inning of the ISU win while trying to make a diving catch on the warning track in right field. He missed the Illinois series with a separated shoulder but was able to return to the lineup for the April 15 win vs. IPFW, going 2-for-3 with a double, walk and three runs scored.
- There have been only two multi-homer games in the first 47 regular-season games at Alexander Field. However, with 12 homers in the first 12 games this season, home runs are up. There were only 16 long balls hit in the 35 games at the first two years of the new ballpark.
- Kyle Johnson** walked four time in the April 1 win vs. IPFW, becoming the first Boiler to draw four walks in a game since **Cody Strong** in April 2013. Prior to Strong in 2013, a Purdue player had not walked four times since February 2009.

### HIT BY PITCH TOTALS PILING UP FOR SHIPLEY & WOOD

- Purdue batters were hit by a pitch 10 times in the Big Ten-opening series against Rutgers. **Harry Shipley** bore the brunt of the beanings and was plunked five times for the weekend. The freshman enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 12 HBPs. He been hit by a pitch 11 times over the last 20 games. The Purdue freshman record for HBPs is 14, set by **Kyle Wood** in 2013.
- Meanwhile, Wood has been hit by a pitch five times this season and on 33 occasions for his career. The program's all-time record is 40, established by Kevin Plawecki (2010-12). Wood enters the weekend tied for sixth place in the Purdue record book. As a team, the Boilers have been hit by a pitch 39 times this season, ranking fourth in the Big Ten.

### PICCHIOTTI'S MARCH POWER SURGE

- Jack Picchiotti** reached base safely in 11 straight games in March, hitting safely in eight of the first nine. He was 12-for-38 with seven free passes and 11 RBI during that stretch. Seven of the 12 hits went for extra bases, highlighted by home runs against Valparaiso and Rutgers. The long ball against Rutgers was a grand slam, Purdue's second in a four-game stretch. He became the first Boiler to homer in consecutive games since Sean McHugh in March 2014 at Southern Illinois. However, Picchiotti was the first Boilermaker to do so in consecutive games at Alexander Field in the ballpark's brief three-year history.

# BOILERMAKERS SNAP RUBBER GAME LOSING STREAK, BUT LOSE 2-OF-3 TO RUTGERS

• Not only did Purdue's 23-5 win vs. Northern Illinois March 15 snap a 10-game losing streak in weekend series rubber games, it also allowed the Boilers to win a series after losing the opener for the first time since May 2009 at Michigan State. Purdue's last rubber game win had been in April 2012 at Nebraska.

• However, the rubber game demons rose up again in the March 22 loss to Rutgers. The Scarlet Knights took games two and three to win the series after the Boilers won the opener, 9-5. Purdue has lost nine straight rubber games in Big Ten play dating to May 2012. Going back to the opening weekend of conference play in 2010, the Boilers have won the first game of a weekend but lost the series 10 times in Big Ten play. It has happened 13 times overall since the beginning of the 2010 season. During that stretch, the Boilers only won the middle game of a series three times after losing the opener.

# GIBBS STILL STINGY ON HITS ALLOWED

• **Matt Gibbs** has faced 51 batters and only allowed eight hits this season. Dating back to the 2014 home opener, he has given up only 28 hits in 46 innings (5.49 hits per nine). By surrendering only 5.77 hits per nine innings last year, he posted the sixth best single-season clip in Purdue history. His 4.91 hits per nine in Big Ten play was a new program record. He posted a streak of 17 consecutive scoreless innings over seven appearances from April 5-25, 2014. This year, he has allowed eight of 23 inherited runners to score (35 percent). **Gavin Downs** (0-of-7), **Joe Eichmann** (9-of-25) and **Tim McElroy** (6-of-15) have been Purdue's most effective relief pitchers at stranding inherited base runners.

# SHIPLEY IMPRESSES DEFENSIVELY DURING 14-GAME ERRORLESS STREAK AT SHORTSTOP

• Shortstop **Harry Shipley** and center fielder **Kyle Johnson** are the only Boilers that have started every game at the same position this season. Shipley has done it as a freshman thanks in part to his steady play at the most important defensive position. He has committed eight errors in 193 defensive chances. His 14-game errorless streak ended March 21 in the middle game of the Rutgers series (March 21). It was his first error since game two of the Sam Houston State doubleheader on Feb. 21. During his 14-game streak without an error he handled 74 defensive chances cleanly. He enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 129 defensive assists.

• Shipley has been involved in all four game-ending double plays this season. **Cody Strong** and Shipley teamed up on both game-ending line drive double plays, with the tying run aboard both times. Those closed out victories against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and Valparaiso (March 18). Shipley also made a nice diving stop behind second base to start a game-ending 6-4-3 double play in the March 20 victory vs. Rutgers. Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, Purdue has closed out nine wins on notable game-ending double plays. That total includes games in which the potential tying run was at least in the on-deck circle at the time of the twin killing.

# SNIDANKO'S GRAND SLAM, SEVEN RBI HIGHLIGHT BLOWOUT WIN VERSUS NIU

• Purdue scored multiple runs in seven consecutive innings to slug its way to a 23-5 rubber game win vs. Northern Illinois March 15. Despite not entering the game until the sixth inning, **Ted Snidanko** finished the day with a career-high seven RBI and just a single shy of the cycle. He connected for a grand slam in the sixth inning as Purdue posted its second five-run frame of the game. It was the first slam by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh at Michigan in May 2013 and he became the first Purdue player with seven RBI in a game since Josh Estill in April 2013.

• Snidanko nearly hit two grand slams. He tripled off the fence in left center with the bases loaded in his third at-bat. The sophomore entered the day with one extra-base hit and no RBI in 27 games as a Boilermaker.

• Purdue recorded 20 runs and 20 hits for the first time since wins against Illinois-Chicago in March (hits) and April (runs) of 2013. But the 23 runs Sunday were the most since beating Indiana, 25-8, in April 2006 in Bloomington and the 24 hits were Purdue's most since racking up a program-record 30 in a March 2012 victory at Murray State.

# WOOD WINS B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR MONSTER SERIES AT OKLAHOMA

• **Kyle Wood** did something productive in 12 of his 14 plate appearances in Purdue's series at Oklahoma (March 6-8), earning the junior first baseman Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He was 9-for-11 with a three-run double, two solo home runs, seven RBI, two walks and four runs scored. He had multiple hits in all three games, highlighted by his first collegiate four-hit effort in the rubber game.

• Wood put up his big numbers predominantly against a tough Oklahoma rotation. The Sooners' starting pitchers combined for 24 strikeouts over 17 1/3 innings in the series. But Wood also delivered an RBI single in his final at-bat of the weekend to win a lefty-lefty matchup vs. OU's closer in the eighth inning.

• Wood's 13-game reached base safely streak ended in the March 17 loss at No. 11 Louisville. He recorded multiple hits in eight of those contests. He was Purdue's first Big Ten Player of the Week honoree since **Kyle Johnson** was named Player and Freshman of the Week on April 1, 2013, following the Boilers' first-ever sweep at Penn State.

• Despite making just three appearances on the mound this season, Wood has struck out 13 over 5 2/3 innings and 13 of the 32 batters he has faced. As a pitcher, he has helped lead Purdue to wins against Western Carolina and Valparaiso, but was only able to retire one of the six batters he faced as Iowa hung five runs on him to rally for a 10-5 win April 4 in the middle game of the series.
