– AROUND THE HORN –

• Purdue is in search of its first Big Ten series victory since March 2013 when it swept Penn State in Central Pennsylvania.

• The Boilers have lost 14 straight Big Ten games since winning their conference opener vs. Rutgers. Purdue has scored just 34 runs during the Big Ten losing streak (2.4 per game) and no more than five runs in any of the single losses.

• Purdue is visiting East Lansing for the third year in a row, losing two of three each of the last two years. In 2013, the Boilers snapped a nine-game Big Ten losing streak with by winning the middle game of the series. Purdue won last year's opener in East Lansing in 11 innings. **Kyle Wood** and **Kyle Johnson** have both homered at MSU during their careers.

• **Harry Shipley** leads the Big Ten in hit by pitch (15) and defensive assists (151). **Kyle Johnson** is tops in the conference in walks (30). **Jack Picchiotti** has thrown out a league-leading 16 base stealers.

- Kept Purdue in the game early at No. 12 Illinois, with 2 of the 3 runs he was charged with scoring after he left the game in the 5th.
- Was deserving of a win vs. No. 24 Iowa after giving up just one earned run over 6-plus innings in quality start, but Hawkeyes rallied for 8 runs vs. the Purdue bullpen.
- Put together his best start as a Boiler in win vs. NIU, striking out career-high six over 7 innings; gave up just five hits & 1 earned run.
- Worked 1-2-3 frames in 1st & 4th innings at ASU, but couldn't come up with shutdown frames after Boilers scored multiple runs in 2nd & 3rd.
- Retired 10 consecutive batters & surrendered only 5 singles in strong outing (5 1/3 IP of 2-run ball) vs. Sam Houston State.
- Started Big Ten series finales vs. Penn State, Michigan State and Michigan in 2014 as a transfer from Parkland CC in Champaign, Ill.
- Worked five shutout innings versus PSU to help lead Purdue to its only shutout win of 2014.
- Worked four innings of scoreless relief in the 16-inning marathon with Southern Illinois.
- Helped Central Catholic win three straight IHSAA Class A state championships & an 81-20 record from 2009-11.
- Two-time small school area player of the year in basketball.

- Had not allowed an extra-base hit in 16 innings pitched this season until Oklahoma went homer-double-homer against him in bottom 3rd.
- Shined vs Bakersfield, retiring 15 of 16 batters during one stretch en route to 7 shutout innings of 3-hit ball.
- Helped lead Purdue to game 3 win at Western Carolina by striking out 4 while going 9-up, 9-down his first time through the lineup.
- Enjoyed a strong summer in Midwest Collegiate League, where he was named an All-Star & pitched 8 innings of 3-hit ball in a playoff win that sent his DuPage County Hounds to league championship series.
- Took the mound in each of the first 6 weekends as a freshman.

- Closed 2014 strong with 7 innings of three-run ball vs. Iowa; did not issue a walk and induced 3 ground-ball double plays.
- Worked Purdue's first true complete game since February 2013 in tough-luck loss vs. OSU in April 2014, giving up runs in only one inning.
- Earned his first career Big Ten win with seven innings of three-hit ball Michigan (April 2014).
- No. 4 LSU did not score while he was on the mound in first start of 2014.
- Earned the win vs. Butler March 1 with 5 2/3 shutout innings, inducing three inning-ending ground ball double plays.
- True walk-on has been a part of the program since the fall of 2011 but redshirted in 2012 after not making the official 35-man roster.
- Worked 4 1/3 innings of scoreless two-hit relief in his team debut, a 2013 midweek game vs. Indiana State.
- Helped Carroll High School win back-to-back 4A IHSAA state titles and was the winning pitcher in 2011 title game; all-conference & all-area honoree went 12-1 to tie the CHS wins record as a senior.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

– BOILERS OPEN SEVEN-GAME ROAD STRETCH WITH ANOTHER TRIP TO MICHIGAN ST. –

Purdue baseball begins a seven-game road stretch by traveling to East Lansing for the third year in a row for a three-game Big Ten series against a rising Michigan State club.

The Spartans' home field is one of two facilities in the Big Ten that does not feature lights and therefore all games in East Lansing are afternoon matinees. Kobs Field does have the unique grass berm in play in right field, propping up the high wall which protects right field's short porch that in turn borders the adjacent Red Cedar River.

The Boilermakers have not won a series at Michigan State since May 2009 and posted a 2-7 record at McLane Stadium while playing there three of the last four years. Coincidentally, after a Purdue-MSU weekend in April 2005 was canceled entirely due to snow, the Boilers only played one series in East Lansing between 1997 and 2006. However, including the forecast for this upcoming weekend, Purdue has been blessed with very good weather in its many trips to East Lansing over the last five years.

The Spartans open a seven-game homestand Friday and are 8-3 at McLane Stadium this season. While completing an impressive month of April in which it compiled a 15-4 record, MSU was projected as an NCAA Regional team this week by D1Baseball.com. Over the last four weekends, the Spartans swept series at Oregon and Rutgers, and rallied to win series against Northwestern and Indiana after dropping the opener.

In 2013, Purdue snapped its nine-game Big Ten losing streak by winning game two of the series in East Lansing. Last season, the Boilers won the opener at MSU in 11 innings, but lost the series after dropping both games of a Saturday doubleheader. **Gavin Downs** (4 IP, 4 H, 1 ER) and **Brett Haan** (4 1/3 IP, 6 H, 2 R) both gave Purdue a chance to win as the starting pitchers in that twinbill, but MSU was victorious in a pair of one-run games. **Kyle Wood** and **Kyle Johnson** have both homered at McLane Stadium during their careers. Wood is 9-for-25 with seven runs scored in East Lansing the last two years.

The Spartans moved their most experienced relief pitcher – all-time saves leader Jeff Kinley – to the weekend rotation for the first time last weekend, and the move paid off in a rubber game win at Indiana. The left-hander struck out seven and did not issue a walk while giving up just one run on three hits over 6 1/3 innings. Fellow senior Mick VanVossen is the reigning Big Ten Pitcher of the Week after his one-hit, complete-game shutout in game one of the Sunday doubleheader in Bloomington last weekend. Purdue has seen plenty of Kinley and VanVossen the last two seasons. It was lefty Cam Vieaux who was the toughest on the Boilermakers a year ago, surrendering just one run on five singles while going the distance in the rubber game. Vieaux has been starting on Fridays over the last few weekends.

Third baseman Mark Weist (.324, 21 XBH, 29 RBI), a senior transfer, and sophomore reliever Joe Mockbee (5 wins, 43 K in 41 1/3 IP) have enjoyed impact seasons to go along with MSU's large group of multi-year starters. Weist leads the team with 14 doubles and has started all 44 games as a transfer from NAIA Spring Arbor University. Mockbee has given up just four extra-base hits (all doubles) while making 20 appearances. He had teamed with Walter Borkovich (3.63 ERA, 30 Ks, .203 B/Avg in 34 2/3 IP) and Kinley to give MSU one of the best relief trios in the league.

Senior first baseman Ryan Krill (.336, 18 XBH, 22 walks) is enjoying his best season offensively and is second in the Big Ten with 40 RBI. Cam Gibson continues to provide a nice mix of power (17 XBH) and speed (16 steals) while leading the team with 46 runs scored.

The Boilermakers are idle next week for final exams on campus before heading to Lincoln, Nebraska, for a Big Ten series at Nebraska. It will be Purdue's second Saturday through Monday series of the year and the road trip features a midweek game at Valparaiso on the way home. The Saturday, May 9, opener at Nebraska marks the beginning of a busy stretch in which the Boilers will play seven times over eight days to close the regular season.

BOILERMAKERS TRAVEL TO EAST LANSING FOR THIRD YEAR IN A ROW

- Purdue will look to snap its 14-game losing streak in Big Ten play as its travels to East Lansing for the third year in a row. Coincidentally, the Boilermakers only played one series at Michigan State from 1997 through 2006 after an entire weekend in East Lansing was snowed out in April 2005. The 14-game Big Ten losing streak is Purdue's longest since dropping 16 in a row in from the end of 1976 (final four) through 1977 (first 12).
- The Big Ten losing streak has continued in part because the Boilers were unable to close out wins against Iowa (game two) and Maryland (game three) at Alexander Field. Purdue carried a 4-2 lead into the eighth inning of the April 4 game against Iowa, but gave up eight in the top of the eighth to lose 10-5. April 26 against Maryland, the Boilers were three outs away from their first win against a nationally ranked opponent since May 2012, taking a 3-1 lead into the ninth. But the Terrapins rallied for three in the top of the ninth to steal the game, 4-3. Purdue also blew a four-run ninth inning lead in a Feb. 28 loss to CSU Bakersfield, losing in 11 innings, 6-4
- Hosting Iowa and playing at Illinois for three years in a row did not go well for the Boilers over the first half of April. After getting swept by both of the Big Ten's current co-leaders, Purdue fell to 1-8 against both Iowa and Illinois dating back to 2013. A sweep at the hands of Michigan kept the Boilers without a series win in Ann Arbor since 1993, their longest active drought at any Big Ten rival.
- Purdue went 5-13 in the month of April, winning midweek games against IPFW (two), Indiana State, Ball State and Illinois State. The Boilers scored 48 runs in their five April wins and 37 runs in their 13 April losses. It has remained a feast or famine stretch for Purdue offensively over the last 31 games (since March 14). In the Boilers' last nine wins, they've scored 92 runs (10.2 per game). But in their last 22 losses they've managed just 53 runs (2.4 per game).

SHIPLEY EXCELLING IN LEADOFF ROLE & RIDING DUAL STREAKS

- After batting ninth in each of the first 26 games of the season, **Harry Shipley** moved to the leadoff spot for the final game of March and has excelled in that role since. The freshman enters the weekend having reached base safely in 14 consecutive games, hitting safely in the last 10. He has matched **Kyle Wood** for the longest hitting streak and **Kyle Johnson** for the longest reached safely streak on the team this season.
- Shipley has reached base safely in 18 of the 19 games in which he has batted leadoff, compiling a .460 on-base percentage over that stretch thanks in part to 17 free passes (10 walks, 7 HBP). He has reached base safely to begin an inning in 15 of his 35 chances over the last 19 games and 11 of 27 chances during his 14-game reached safely streak.
- Shipley was hit by a pitch for the 15th time this season in the April 26th win against Maryland, breaking **Kyle Wood's** Purdue freshman record from 2013. The shortstop leads the Big Ten in HBPs this season.

SIX-RUN FIRST INNING STANDS AS PURDUE'S BIGGEST RALLY SINCE APRIL 2013

- Thanks to five consecutive two-out hits, Purdue scored six times in the first inning of its April 28 win against Illinois State in the finale of a six-game homestand at Alexander Field. It was the Boilers' most productive inning since scoring 15 times in the bottom of the second in an April 24, 2013, home win vs. Illinois-Chicago.
- With all six runs scoring with two outs, Purdue managed to score more two-out runs in one inning than it did in the entire series against its four Big Ten opponents in the month of April: Iowa (four), Illinois (zero), Michigan (three) and Maryland (four). Coincidentally, the Boilers' top two-out hitter this season, **Harry Shipley** (15-for-52, .288, 9 RBI), made the first and final outs of the six-run inning against Illinois State. Shipley has at least five more two-outs than any other Purdue player this season.

PURDUE SECOND IN THE BIG TEN IN DOUBLE PLAYS TURNED

- The Boilermakers enter the weekend second in the Big Ten in double plays turned (47). Penn State has turned 48 in 40 games. Purdue has turned multiple double plays in a game 12 times this year, including five against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and four against Butler (March 28). Shortstop **Harry Shipley** has contributed to 32 of the 47 double plays (68 percent) and second baseman **Cody Strong** has been a part of 28 of the 47 (60 percent). Purdue also led the Big Ten in double plays turned last season (54 in 50 games).
- Individually, Shipley leads the Big Ten in defensive assists (151) while starting every game at shortstop. **Kyle Wood** (436) is tops in putouts. Catcher **Jack Picchiotti** has thrown out a league-leading 16 base stealers.

TIMELY HITTING NON-EXISTENT IN BIG TEN PLAY

- Over the last four weekends, Purdue is 18-for-98 (.184) with runners in scoring position and 15-for-110 (.136) with two outs. During the Big Ten season as a whole, the Boilers have managed just a .202 average with RISP and .139 clip with two outs, recording just 10 of their 42 RBI with two outs.

APRIL PROVED TO BE HOME RUN FRIENDLY

- In 18 games in April, Purdue hitters connected for more home runs (14) than they did in the first 27 games of the season (10). Unfortunately for the Boilers, the additional long balls did not lead to more wins. Eleven of the Purdue's 14 home runs in April were solo shots, continuing on a season-long trend in which 18 of the team's 24 homers (75 percent) have come with the bases empty. **Alec Olund** (three), **Kyle Wood** (three), **Kyle Johnson** (two), **Brandon Krieg** (two) and **Jordan Lewis** (two) all hit multiple home runs in April, headlining the group of seven Boilers that went deep.
- Wood homered in games two and three of the Iowa series, going deep in consecutive games for the second time in his career. He also accomplished the feat in April 2013 in a home win vs. Illinois-Chicago and a road loss at Michigan State. He joined **Jack Picchiotti** as Boilers to homer in consecutive games this season. Wood also hit his first home run at Alexander Field in nearly a year, his last being on April 8, 2014, vs. Louisville.

BRYANT SHINES IN MIDWEEK SHUTOUT OF BALL STATE

- **Shane Bryant** struck out a career-high nine over eight innings of five-hit ball, leading Purdue to its second shutout victory of the season, 6-0, against Ball State April 22. It was the longest outing of the season by a Boilermaker. He followed that up with eight Ks over 4 2/3 in an April 28 start against Illinois State.
- Bryant's nine strikeouts were the most by a Purdue pitcher Brad Schreiber also fanned nine in March 2013 at Penn State. He became the first Purdue pitcher to work at least eight scoreless innings in an outing since Joe Haase pitched a complete-game shutout against Michigan in May 2012. Bryant is the first Boiler to work at least eight innings without issuing a base on balls since **Gavin Downs** did not walk a batter in his complete game vs. Ohio State in April of last season.
- In the 2-0 home-opening win against Valparaiso March 18, it was Bryant that earned the victory with 5 1/3 scoreless innings. He has compiled a 2.33 ERA and struck out 29 over 27 innings pitched at Alexander Field this season.

WOOD STILL ROLLING ALONG

- **Kyle Wood's** season really took off when he enjoyed a monster weekend at Oklahoma (9-for-11, 3 XBH, 7 RBI) the weekend of March 6-8 to garner Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He's batting .314 with 11 extra-base hits and 18 RBI in the 31 games since then. The junior reached base safely in each of the first 10 Big Ten games this year and had a 16-game reached safely streak in league play that dated back to last season. The streak was snapped in game two at Michigan. He has also had a 10-game overall hitting streak but it ended in game one in Ann Arbor.
- Wood is making a bid to become the first Boilermaker since 2007 (Ryne White) to win the team triple crown. Last year, he overtook Sean McHugh for the team lead in batting average during the final weekend to deny McHugh the team triple crown.
- **Jack Picchiotti, Kyle Johnson** and **Brandon Krieg** all saw notable reached base safely streaks end during the Illinois series. Picchiotti had been on base in 14 straight Big Ten games dating back to last season. Johnson (14) and Krieg (11) had their double-figure reached base safely streaks in all games end in game two at Illinois. Johnson enters the Michigan State series riding another 10-game reached base safely streak.

OLUND POSTS FIRST MULTI-HOMER GAME BY A PURDUE FRESHMAN SINCE 2010

- Purdue's first multi-homer game since May 2013 (Sean McHugh) came from an unlikely source. Batting ninth in the lineup in only his fourth start of the season, **Alec Olund** connected for a pair of solo home runs to left field in the April 1 home win vs. IPFW. It was the first multi-homer game by a Purdue freshman since April 2010 (Cameron Perkins), making it the first of the BBCOR bat era (2011-present).
- Olund also made starts against Iowa and Indiana State, but was injured in the fourth inning of the ISU win while trying to make a diving catch on the warning track in right field. He missed the Illinois series with a separated shoulder but was able to return to the lineup for the April 15 win vs. IPFW, going 2-for-3 with a double, walk and three runs scored. He enters the weekend having started eight of the last 10 games.
- There have been only two multi-homer games in the first 53 regular-season games at Alexander Field. However, with 17 homers in the first 18 games this season, home runs are up big time. There were only 16 long balls hit in the 35 games at the first two years of the new ballpark.
- **Kyle Johnson** walked four times in the April 1 win vs. IPFW, becoming the first Boiler to draw four walks in a game since **Cody Strong** in April 2013. Prior to Strong in 2013, a Purdue player had not walked four times since February 2009.

BIG EIGHTH INNINGS FOR AND AGAINST; FIFTH INNING PROVING COSTLY

- Over the first week of April, eighth-inning rallies proved to be the difference in a pair of Purdue's games. April 4, Iowa scored eight times in the top of the eighth to overcome the Boilers' 4-2 lead entering the frame. It marked the second time in a week's time that the opposition put up an eight spot at Alexander Field after Butler also did it in the sixth inning of the nightcap of the March 28 doubleheader.
- April 7 at Indiana State, Purdue scored five times in the eighth inning to extend its lead from 5-4 to 10-4 en route to winning its first game in Terre Haute since 2006, 10-6.
- The fifth inning has been very unkind to Purdue this season, getting outscored 52-15 in baseball's middle frame. The minus-37 run differential is by far the Boilers' worst of any inning. For the season, Purdue has a minus-76 run differential. Nearly half of that negative differential has come from the fifth inning.

PICCHIOTTI'S MARCH POWER SURGE

- **Jack Picchiotti** reached base safely in 11 straight games in March, hitting safely in eight of the first nine. He was 12-for-38 with seven free passes and 11 RBI during that stretch. Seven of the 12 hits went for extra bases, highlighted by home runs against Valparaiso and Rutgers. The long ball against Rutgers was a grand slam, Purdue's second in a four-game stretch. He became the first Boiler to homer in consecutive games since Sean McHugh in March 2014 at Southern Illinois. However, Picchiotti was the first Boilermaker to do so in consecutive games at Alexander Field in the ballpark's brief three-year history.

- **PICCHIOTTI'S 11-GAME REACHED SAFELY STREAK (MARCH 14-28): .316, 7 XBH, 3 HR, 11 RBI, 11 R, 5 BB**

BOILERMAKERS SNAP RUBBER GAME LOSING STREAK, BUT LOSE 2-OF-3 TO RUTGERS

- Not only did Purdue's 23-5 win vs. Northern Illinois March 15 snap a 10-game losing streak in weekend series rubber games, it also allowed the Boilers to win a series after losing the opener for the first time since May 2009 at Michigan State. Purdue's last rubber game win had been in April 2012 at Nebraska.
- However, the rubber game demons rose up again in the March 22 loss to Rutgers. The Scarlet Knights took games two and three to win the series after the Boilers won the opener, 9-5. Purdue has lost nine straight rubber games in Big Ten play dating to May 2012. Going back to the opening weekend of conference play in 2010, the Boilers have won the first game of a weekend but lost the series 10 times in Big Ten play. It has happened 13 times overall since the beginning of the 2010 season. During that stretch, the Boilers only won the middle game of a series three times after losing the opener.

SHIPLEY IMPRESSES DEFENSIVELY DURING 14-GAME ERRORLESS STREAK AT SHORTSTOP

- Shortstop **Harry Shipley** is the only Boilermaker that has started every game at the same position this season. Shipley has done it as a freshman thanks in part to his steady play at the most important defensive position. He has committed 10 errors in 232 defensive chances. His 14-game errorless streak ended March 21 in the middle game of the Rutgers series. It was his first error since game two of the Sam Houston State doubleheader on Feb. 21. During his 14-game streak without an error he handled 74 defensive chances cleanly. He enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 151 defensive assists.
- Shipley has been involved in all four game-ending double plays this season. **Cody Strong** and Shipley teamed up on both game-ending line drive double plays, with the tying run aboard both times. Those closed out victories against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and Valparaiso (March 18). Shipley also made a nice diving stop behind second base to start a game-ending 6-4-3 double play in the March 20 victory vs. Rutgers. Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, Purdue has closed out nine wins on notable game-ending double plays. That total includes games in which the potential tying run was at least in the on-deck circle at the time of the twin killing.

SNIDANKO'S GRAND SLAM, SEVEN RBI HIGHLIGHT BLOWOUT WIN VERSUS NIU

- Purdue scored multiple runs in seven consecutive innings to slug its way to a 23-5 rubber game win vs. Northern Illinois March 15. Despite not entering the game until the sixth inning, **Ted Snidanko** finished the day with a career-high seven RBI and just a single shy of the cycle. He connected for a grand slam in the sixth inning as Purdue posted its second five-run frame of the game. It was the first slam by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh at Michigan in May 2013 and he became the first Purdue player with seven RBI in a game since Josh Estill in April 2013.
- Snidanko nearly hit two grand slams. He tripled off the fence in left center with the bases loaded in his third at-bat. The sophomore entered the day with one extra-base hit and no RBI in 27 games as a Boilermaker.
- Purdue recorded 20 runs and 20 hits for the first time since wins against Illinois-Chicago in March (hits) and April (runs) of 2013. But the 23 runs Sunday were the most since beating Indiana, 25-8, in April 2006 in Bloomington and the 24 hits were Purdue's most since racking up a program-record 30 in a March 2012 victory at Murray State.
