- AROUND THE HORN -

- Purdue is in search of its first Big Ten series victory since March 2013 when it swept Penn State in Central Pennsylvania.
- The Boilers snapped their 16-game Big Ten losing streak May 3 at Michigan St., ending the program's longest skid in conference play since 1976-77.
- Purdue won 2-of-3 in 2012 in its only other trip to Lincoln and the state of Nebraska overall. However, **Brandon Krieg** is the only active Boiler that played in the 2012 series, pinch running in game three. Purdue and Nebraska did not play in 2014.
- The Boilers are set for their second Saturday-Monday series of the season. They also played on a Monday at Illinois due to BTN coverage. Prior to this season, the Boilers had not played a Monday Big Ten game since May 2010.
- Harry Shipley leads the Big Ten in hit by pitch (15) and defensive assists (158). Jack Picchiotti has thrown out a league-leading 18 base stealers.

- Helped Carroll High School win back-to-back 4A IHSAA state titles and was the winning pitcher in 2011 title game; all-conference & all-area honoree went 12-1 to tie the CHS wins record as a senior.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extraining affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

- HOME STRETCH BEGINS WITH SERIES AT NEBRASKA -

Purdue baseball begins its busy home stretch with its second Saturday through Monday series of the year, traveling to Nebraska for the season's final Big Ten road weekend.

First pitch at Haymarket Park in Lincoln is set for 1 p.m. ET Saturday and 2 p.m. ET Sunday and Monday. The series was shifted to Saturday-Monday due to finals exams for both universities during the first week of May.

The series not starting until Saturday came in handy besides just the additional time for final exams. The outfield of Hawks Field at Haymarket Park was submerged by standing water Thursday morning after flash flooding hit Lincoln overnight Wednesday. Nebraska's capital city received 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches of rain in a short time. With the infield already in better shape after being tarped during the storm, the Haymarket Park grounds crew was remarkably efficient in removing the standing water in the outfield in just 24 hours. Saturday's game time was actually moved up two hours due to the threat of more rain in the late afternoon.

The Boilermakers are set to close out their regular season with seven games in eight days, stopping at Valparaiso on their way home for Tuesday's midweek finale at Valparaiso. Purdue hosts Penn State for the final Big Ten weekend, but as is customary, it's a Thursday through Saturday series. The Boilers need to sweep Nebraska this weekend to keep any Big Ten Tournament hopes alive.

The Huskers have been strong at home this season, compiling a 20-4 mark at Haymarket Park while recording 20 of their 33 overall wins at home. Ohio State is the only visiting team to win a series in Lincoln this year and it took a pair of 10-innings victories for the Buckeyes to accomplish the feat. Purdue's 2012 Big Ten championship team won two of three at Haymarket Park in the program's first-ever trip to the state of Nebraska. However, **Brandon Krieg** is the only active Boiler that played in the series, pinch running in the rubber game victory.

Nebraska was one of two Big Ten teams (along with Northwestern) that Purdue did not play last season.

Alex Lyons will have an opportunity to start on the mound Friday for the Boilers after putting together his best outing of the season Saturday at Michigan State. The sophomore struck out five over five innings of one-run relief and will now become only the seventh Purdue pitcher to start a game this season. That is the team's fewest since using only six starting pitchers over 59 games in 2012.

Nebraska leads the Big Ten with a .981 fielding percentage, committing only 38 errors in 50 games. The Huskers in turn have surrendered only 20 unearned runs this season. While the Boilers' have not played as well defensively as a year ago when they were among the best in the Big Ten, they've also had a tougher time pitching over errors. Purdue has given up 51 unearned runs while committing 60 errors in 48 games.

The Huskers' weekend rotation pitches to contact for the most part. Chance Sinclair, Kyle Kubat and Derek Burkamper average only 5.9 strikeouts per nine innings as a trio, although relievers Colton Howell (29 K in 25 2/3 IP) and Josh Roeder (25 K in 18 IP) represent a couple power arms in the bullpen. Roeder broke the program's all-time saves record this year. He's a true one-inning closer, recording 14 saves while pitching just 18 innings in 18 appearances in 2015.

Former Boilermaker Brad Schreiber's brother Scott is a freshman first baseman for Nebraska, seeing action in 35 of his team's 50 games. Brad is off to a strong start in his second full season of pro ball, serving as the closer for the Charlotte Stone Crabs, the Tampa Bays Rays affiliate in the High-A Florida State League.

Nebraska is looking for consecutive NCAA Regional appearances for the first time since qualifying in four straight years from 2005-08. However, after finishing third and second in the Big Ten standings the last two years, respectively, the Huskers are still very much fighting to get into the Big Ten Tournament this season. With an 8-10 league mark and a series at Big Ten-leading Illinois up next, Nebraska still has a lot of work to do to finish at .500 in the conference this year. That speaks to how good the Big Ten has been in 2015.

BOILERMAKERS CLOSE OUT SEASON WITH BUSY EIGHT-DAY STRETCH

- Beginning with this weekend's road trip to Nebraska, Purdue closes out the regular season with seven games in eight days. The Boilermakers play Saturday through Monday at Nebraska, take on Valparaiso Tuesday in Northwest Indiana on their way home from Lincoln, and host Penn State next weekend for a Thursday through Saturday series. Purdue also played a Saturday through Monday series at Illinois earlier this season. The Nebraska series was moved due to final exams the first week of May for both schools.
- The Boilermakers snapped their 16-game losing streak in Big Ten play May 3 in the series finale at Michigan State. The Big Ten skid was Purdue's longest since also dropping 16 in a row from the end of 1976 (final four) through 1977 (first 12).
- The losing streak continued in part because the Boilers were unable to close out wins against lowa (game two) and Maryland (game three) at Alexander Field in April. The Boilers carried a 4-2 lead into the eighth inning of the April 4 game against lowa, but gave up eight in the top of the eighth to lose 10-5. April 26 against Maryland, Purdue was three outs away from its first win against a nationally ranked opponent since May 2012, taking a 3-1 lead into the ninth. But the Terrapins rallied for three in the top of the ninth to steal the game, 4-3. Purdue also blew a four-run ninth inning lead in a Feb. 28 loss to CSU Bakersfield, losing in 11 innings, 6-4
- Purdue went 5-13 in the month of April, winning midweek games against IPFW (two), Indiana State, Ball State and Illinois State. The Boilers scored 48 runs in their five April wins and 37 runs in their 13 April losses. It was a feast or famine stretch for Purdue offensively over 32 games from March 14 through May 1. During that portion of the season, in the Boilers' nine wins they scored 92 runs (10.2 per game). But in their 23 losses they managed just 55 runs (2.4 per game). Purdue's 10-7 loss in game two of the Michigan State series marked the first time it had scored more than five runs in a loss since a 13-10 defeat at Oklahoma March 8.

NEW REACHED SAFELY STREAKS FOR JOHNSON & CARLSON

- Kyle Johnson and Brett Carlson both enter the weekend riding notable double-figure reached base safely streaks. After posting a 14-game reached safely streak from March 20 through April 11, Johnson has now been on base at least once in the last 13 games he has played. Thanks to his 30 walks, which ranks third in the Big Ten, the junior has been on base in 27 of the last 28 games in which he has played (all but the April 12 loss at Illinois). Johnson leads the team in batting average (.354) and on-base percentage (.419) in conference play after reaching base safely in 17 of the first 18 league games.
- Brett Carlson saw his 10-game reached base safely streak snapped May 2 when he was retired as a pinch hitter late in the game. But as a starter, the utility man has been on base safely in his last 10 games. Carlson has started games at four different positions this year DH, second base, left field and right field.

LYONS & EICHMANN SHINE IN RELIEF AT MICHIGAN STATE

• Alex Lyons and Joe Eichmann each had excellent long relief outings in the series at Michigan State. Lyons struck out a season-high five over five innings of one-run relief in game two. He matched Shane Bryant for the longest relief outing by a Boilermaker this season. Lyons entered the game with Purdue trailing 9-4 in the fourth inning. By holding MSU to just one run while finishing out the game, he helped set the stage that allowed the Boilers to bring the potential tying run to the plate in the top of the seventh.

• Eichmann earned the victory in the series finale thanks to 4 1/3 innings of scoreless two-hit relief. He

worked 1-2-3 frames in the seventh and ninth innings and did not issue a walk in his longest outing of the season. The senior stranded the potential tying run at third base while finishing off the bottom of the fifth and went on to retire 12 of the 14 batters he faced altogether.

SHIPLEY EXCELLING IN LEADOFF ROLE BUT DUAL STREAKS END AT MSU

- After batting ninth in each of the first 26 games of the season, **Harry Shipley** moved to the leadoff spot for the final game of March and has excelled in that role since. The freshman saw a pair of notable streaks end in the Michigan State series. His 10-game hitting streak was snapped in the opener and his 15-game reached safely streak ended in the middle game. Shipley matched **Kyle Wood** for the longest hitting streak and compiled the longest reached safely streak on the team this season.
- Shipley has reached base safely in 20 of the 22 games in which he has batted leadoff, compiling a .426 on-base percentage over that stretch thanks in part to 19 free passes (12 walks, 7 HBP). He has reached base safely to begin an inning in 16 of his 41 chances (39 percent) over the last 22 games and 12 of 28 chances (43 percent) during his 15-game reached safely streak.
- Shipley was hit by a pitch for the 15th time this season in the April 26th win against Maryland, breaking **Kyle Wood's** Purdue freshman record from 2013. The shortstop leads the Big Ten in HBPs this season.

PURDUE THIRD IN THE BIG TEN IN DOUBLE PLAYS TURNED

- The Boilermakers enter the weekend third in the Big Ten in double plays turned (49). Northwestern (53) and Penn State (51) have both turned more than 50 twin killings. Purdue has turned multiple double plays in a game 13 times this year, including five against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and four against Butler (March 28). Shortstop Harry Shipley has contributed to 34 of the 49 double plays (69 percent) and second baseman Cody Strong has been a part of 30 of the 49 (61 percent). Purdue led the Big Ten in double plays turned last season (54 in 50 games).
- Individually, Shipley leads the Big Ten in defensive assists (158) while starting every game at shortstop. **Kyle Wood** (420) is second in putouts. Catcher **Jack Picchiotti** has thrown out a league-leading 18 base stealers, helping Purdue lead the league with 24 caught stealings as a team.

TIMELY HITTING NON-EXISTENT IN BIG TEN PLAY

• While getting swept in its four straight Big Ten series vs. Iowa, Illinois, Michigan and Maryland, Purdue was just 18-for-98 (.184) with runners in scoring position and 15-for-110 (.136) with two outs. During the Big Ten season as a whole, the Boilers have managed just a .208 average with RISP and .139 clip with two outs, recording just 12 of their 57 RBI (21 percent) with two outs.

SIX-RUN FIRST INNING STANDS AS PURDUE'S BIGGEST RALLY SINCE APRIL 2013

- Thanks to five consecutive two-out hits, Purdue scored six times in the first inning of its April 28 win against Illinois State in the finale of a six-game homestand at Alexander Field. It was the Boilers' most productive inning since scoring 15 times in the bottom of the second in an April 24, 2013, home win vs. Illinois-Chicago.
- With all six runs scoring with two outs, Purdue managed to score more two-out runs in one inning than it did in the entire series against its four Big Ten opponents in the month of April: Iowa (four), Illinois (zero), Michigan (three) and Maryland (four). Coincidentally, the Boilers' top two-out hitter this season, Harry Shipley (16-for-57, .281, 9 RBI), made the first and final outs of the six-run inning against Illinois State. Shipley has at least five more two-outs than any other Purdue player this season.

APRIL PROVED TO BE HOME RUN FRIENDLY

- In 18 games in April, Purdue hitters connected for more home runs (14) than they did in the first 27 games of the season (10). Unfortunately for the Boilers, the additional long balls did not lead to more wins. Eleven of the Purdue's 14 home runs in April were solo shots, continuing on a season-long trend in which 19 of the team's 28 homers (68 percent) have come with the bases empty. Alec Olund (three), Kyle Wood (three), Kyle Johnson (two), Brandon Krieg (two) and Jordan Lewis (two) all hit multiple home runs in April, headlining the group of seven Boilers that went deep.
- · Wood homered in games two and three of the lowa series, going deep in consecutive games for the second time in his career. He also accomplished the feat in April 2013 in a home win vs. Illinois-Chicago and a road loss at Michigan State. He joined Jack Picchiotti as Boilers to homer in consecutive games this season. Wood also hit his first home run at Alexander Field in nearly a year, his last being on April 8, 2014, vs. Louisville.

WOOD STILL ROLLING ALONG & LOOKING TO BECOME FIRST TEAM TRIPLE CROWN WINNER SINCE 2007

- Kyle Wood's season really took off when he enjoyed a monster weekend at Oklahoma (9-for-11, 3 XBH, 7 RBI) the weekend of March 6-8 to garner Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He's batting .306 with 12 extra-base hits and 20 RBI in the 34 games since then. The junior reached base safely in each of the first 10 Big Ten games this year and had a 16-game reached safely streak in league play that dated back to last season. The streak was snapped in game two at Michigan. He has also had a 10-game overall hitting streak but it ended in game one in Ann Arbor.
- · Wood is making a bid to become the first Boilermaker since 2007 (Ryne White) to win the team triple crown. Last year, he overtook Sean McHugh for the team lead in batting average during the final weekend to deny McHugh the team triple crown.
- · Jack Picchiotti, Kyle Johnson and Brandon Krieg all saw notable reached base safely streaks end during the Illinois series. Picchiotti had been on base in 14 straight Big Ten games dating back to last season. Johnson (14) and Krieg (11) had their double-figure reached base safely streaks in all games end in game two at Illinois. Johnson enters the Nebraska series riding another 13-game reached base safely streak.

BRYANT SHINES IN MIDWEEK SHUTOUT OF BALL STATE

- · Shane Bryant struck out a career-high nine over eight innings of five-hit ball, leading Purdue to its second shutout victory of the season, 6-0, against Ball State April 22. It was the longest outing of the season by a Boilermaker. He followed that up with eight Ks over 4 2/3 in an April 28 start against Illinois
- Bryant's nine strikeouts were the most by a Purdue pitcher Brad Schreiber also fanned nine in March 2013 at Penn State. He became the first Purdue pitcher to work at least eight scoreless innings in an outing since Joe Haase pitched a complete-game shutout against Michigan in May 2012. Bryant is the first Boiler to work at least eight innings without issuing a base on balls since Gavin Downs did not walk a batter in his complete game vs. Ohio State in April of last season.
- In the 2-0 home-opening win against Valparaiso March 18, it was Bryant that earned the victory with 5 1/3 scoreless innings. He has compiled a 2.33 ERA and struck out 29 over 27 innings pitched at Alexander Field this season.

OLUND POSTS FIRST MULTI-HOMER GAME BY A PURDUE FRESHMAN SINCE 2010

- Purdue's first multi-homer game since May 2013 (Sean McHugh) came from an unlikely source. Batting ninth in the DATE lineup in only his fourth start of the season, Alec Olund con- 4/01/15 Alec Olund nected for a pair of solo home runs to left field in the April 1 home win vs. IPFW. It was the first multi-homer game by a 5/17/12 Cameron Perkins Purdue freshman since April 2010 (Cameron Perkins), making 4/20/12 Cameron Perkins it the first of the BBCOR bat era (2011-present).
- Olund also made starts against Iowa and Indiana State, but 3/13/11 Eric Charles was injured in the fourth inning of the ISU win while trying to make a diving catch on the warning track in right field. He missed the Illinois series with a separated shoulder but was
- able to return to the lineup for the April 15 win vs. IPFW, going 2-for-3 with a double, walk and three runs scored. He enters the weekend having started eight of the last 10 games.
- There have been only two multi-homer games in the first 53 regular-season games at Alexander Field. However, with 17 homers in the first 18 games this season, home runs are up big time. There were only 16 long balls hit in the 35 games at the first two years of the new ballpark.
- Kyle Johnson walked four times in the April 1 win vs. IPFW, becoming the first Boiler to draw four walks in a game since Cody Strong in April 2013. Prior to Strong in 2013, a Purdue player had not walked four times since February 2009.

FIFTH INNING PROVING COSTLY; BIG EIGHTH INNINGS FOR AND AGAINST

- The fifth inning has been very unkind to Purdue this season, getting outscored 52-18 in baseball's middle frame. The minus-34 run differential is by far the Boilers' worst of any inning. For the season, Purdue has a minus-87 run differential. Almost 40 percent of that negative differential has come from the fifth inning.
- · Over the first week of April, eighth-inning rallies proved to be the difference in a pair of Purdue's games. April 4, Iowa scored eight times in the top of the eighth to overcome the Boilers' 4-2 lead entering the frame. It marked the second time in a week's time that the opposition put up an eight spot at Alexander Field after Butler also did it in the sixth inning of the nightcap of the March 28 doubleheader.
- April 7 at Indiana State, Purdue scored five times in the eighth inning to extend its lead from 5-4 to 10-4 en route to winning its first game in Terre Haute since 2006, 10-6.

PICCHIOTTI'S MARCH POWER SURGE

- · Jack Picchiotti reached base safely in 11 straight games in March, hitting safely in eight of the first nine. He was 12-for-38 with seven free passes and 11 RBI during that stretch. Seven of the 12 hits went for extra bases, highlighted by home runs against Valparaiso and Rutgers. The long ball against Rutgers was a grand slam, Purdue's second in a four-game stretch. He became the first Boiler to homer in consecutive games since Sean McHugh in March 2014 at Southern Illinois. However, Picchiotti was the first Boilermaker to do so in consecutive games at Alexander Field in the ballpark's brief three-year history.

BOILERMAKERS SNAP RUBBER GAME LOSING STREAK, BUT LOSE 2-OF-3 TO RUTGERS

- Not only did Purdue's 23-5 win vs. Northern Illinois March 15 snap a 10-game losing streak in weekend series rubber games, it also allowed the Boilers to win a series after losing the opener for the first time since May 2009 at Michigan State. Purdue's last rubber game win had been in April 2012 at Nebraska.
- However, the rubber game demons rose up again in the March 22 loss to Rutgers. The Scarlet Knights took games two and three to win the series after the Boilers won the opener, 9-5. Purdue has lost nine straight rubber games in Big Ten play dating to May 2012. Going back to the opening weekend of conference play in 2010, the Boilers have won the first game of a weekend but lost the series 10 times in Big Ten play. It has happened 13 times overall since the beginning of the 2010 season. During that stretch, the Boilers only won the middle game of a series three times after losing the opener.
