- AROUND THE HORN -

- The Boilermakers begin a stretch of nine straight games in the state of Indiana with a weekend series in Kokomo vs. Ohio, a team led by former Purdue pitching coach Rob Smith (1999, 2002-06). The Bobcats won the 2015 Mid-American Conference Tournament and played in an NCAA Regional in Champaign. The Boilermakers will see another former assistant coach in May when they take on Spencer Allen's Northwestern team. Allen was a Purdue assistant from 2008 to 2009.
- · Kokomo Municipal Stadium opened last year and is the home of the Kokomo Jackrabbits of the Prospect League, a summer collegiate league. Tanner Andrews pitched for the Jackrabbits last season. Kokomo Municipal Stadium features an artificial FieldTurf playing surface. After Tuesday's game at Ball State, Purdue will have played its first 11 games this month on FieldTurf.
- · Mike Lutz and Matt Frawley teamed up to lead the Boilers to a shutout win vs. North Dakota, but Purdue lost 2-of-3 at Kansas' Tournament last weekend after losing a one-run game to Saint Louis. It was a frustrating loss because the Boilers only surrendered runs in one inning (three in B-4th).

PURDUE'S WEEKEND ROTATION -

- Went 9-up, 9-down through his first 3 innings against Saint Louis, but was chased in the 4th inning after giving up 3 runs while facing 8 batters.
- · Gave Purdue a quality start in the opener at ETSU but a dropped fly ball in right field was changed to a triple, making all 4 runs earned instead of 2.
- Battled Georgia Tech as Purdue's season-opening starting pitcher, giving the team a chance to win by staying out of the big inning.
- Joined Nick Dalesandro as the first Purdue pitchers since 2013 to make their first career starts on the mound during a season-opening weekend. However, he became the first non-freshman since 2011 to make his first start on a weekend.
- As a freshman made five of his seven appearances in Big Ten play after not making his collegiate debut until April 11; worked three innings of onerun ball at nationally ranked Illinois in his first outing as a Boilermaker.
- Played four years of varsity baseball, basketball and football at Tippecanoe Valley High School in north central Indiana.
- · Batted over .400 each year as a four-time all-conference performer; area player of the year and second team all-state performer in basketball averaged 20 points as a senior; first team all-state defensive back as a junior and then earned similar honors as a wide receiver his senior year.

MIKE LUTZ SENIOR RHP NORTH BARRINGTON, ILL. LAKE ZURICH HS

- · Regularly used member of the bullpen over his first three seasons, ranking fourth in program history with 74 career appearances.
- Teamed up with Matt Frawley on a shutout win vs. North Dakota, working five scoreless innings after escaping a 1-out bases-loaded jam in the 2nd.
- Faced only 16 batters through the first five innings in his start at ETSU, which was his first weekend start since March 2014 and just second career.
- Ranked 2nd on the team in 2015 by inducing 6 ground ball double plays in 28 2/3 innings, 2 more than he had in 99 innings as an underclassman.
- Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree ranks second among active Boilermakers with 135 1/3 career innings pitched.
- In 2014, became just the third pitcher in program history to appear in 30 games in a season (and first since 2008); set a new Purdue freshman record with 25 appearances in 2013.
- Pitched a career-high 6 1/3 innings and recorded a quality start in the 2015 midweek win at Valparaiso, his first start in over year.
- Induced and started a game-ending 1-2-3 double play with the bases loaded and Purdue clinging to a one-run leading in the 2014 series-opening win at Illinois, becoming the first Boiler pitcher to end a game in that fashion since February 2012.
- · Starred in relief in Purdue's first-ever sweep at Penn State (2013), working 6 1/3 innings of scoreless relief over his three appearances.
- · Also pitched in all three games of a 2013 series at Michigan State and 2014 series vs. Rice and Michigan.

TANNER SCHUMACHER JUNIOR RHP BLAINE, MINN. **BLAINE HS**

- Transfer pitched at Wabash Valley College (Mount Carmel, Illinois) in 2015 and North Dakota State in 2014 after redshirting the year prior.
- Retired all 12 batters he faced over four perfect innings of relief to help Purdue rally for victory at Georgia State.
- The only run he allowed in his Purdue debut came on a solo home run in the season opener at Georgia Tech; had the honor of being the first Boilermaker out of the bullpen this year.
- · Surrendered the walk-off home run to ETSU's Aaron Maher in the ninth inning of the 9-8 loss in the nightcap of the March 5 doubleheader
- Pitched in 12 games for Wabash Valley, earning three wins and a save while compiling 27 strikeouts and a 3.16 ERA in 31 1/3 innings.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 18th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in nine of its 10 appearances under Schreiber.

The 2015 Boilermakers won their final five games and six of their last seven, posting their third longest season-ending win streak in program history. Kyle Wood won the team triple crown in 2015, becoming the first hitter to do so since 2007 and the 11th Boilermaker position player since 1970 to accomplish the feat.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Ball State (1991-92) and spent 1993 as an assistant at Butler.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132) and games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eighth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

CLOSER TO HOME FINALLY

• After playing its first 13 games in four different states (Georgia, California, Tennessee and Kansas), the schedule finally turns in Purdue's favor in terms of travel. Beginning with this weekend's series in Kokomo, the Boilermakers will close out the month of March with nine straight games in the state of Indiana. And there's really only one long trip (April 1-3 at Penn State) on tap during the next 22 games. Purdue is scheduled to play 19 of those 22 games in the state of Indiana and 11 of those 19 in-state games at Alexander Field. The home opener is set for Wednesday, March 23. Last season, the Boilermakers were 12-15 (.444) in games played in Indiana and 8-19 (.296) in games played elsewhere.

DALESANDRO'S 11-GAME HIT STREAK ALREADY LONGEST AMONG ACTIVE BOILERS

- Freshman **Nick Dalesandro** enters the weekend riding an 11-game hitting streak, which began when he delivered a two-run double with the bases loaded to break a 3-3 tie in the Feb. 21 win at Georgia State. It already ranks as the longest career hitting streak among active Boilermakers. **Harry Shipley** and **Kyle Wood** both had 10-game hitting streaks last season and **Kyle Johnson** posted a 10-gamer in 2013. Overall, Dalesandro's hit streak is the longest by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh and Brandon Krieg had 12-game streaks in 2014.
- Dalesandro is 15-for-38 (.395) with three doubles and six RBI during the streak. He has recorded a hit in his first at-bat in five of his last 10 games. This year Dalesandro has become the first Boilermaker since **Kyle Wood** in April 2014 to bat in the lineup in the same game he was the starting pitcher. But it February 2014 (Wood again) the last time it happened in a weekend game. After getting chased from the mound in the bottom of the second inning of his start at ETSU, he delivered another bases-loaded two-run double the following frame to ignite the Purdue comeback.
- Fellow freshman **Jacson McGowan** saw his six-game hitting streak and eight-game reached base safely streak end in the March 12 loss at Kansas. He came through with a rare two-run sac fly with the bases loaded in the fourth inning of the 19-6 win at ETSU. The center fielder made a diving catch to take away a double, but **Jack Picchiotti** was able to score from second on the play.

MORE EXCELLENT LONG RELIEF WORK

- Over the last two weekends, **Matt Frawley** (11 2/3 IP, 8 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 8 K) and **Shane Bryant** (8 2/3 IP, 4 H, 3 R, 2 BB, 11 K) have excelled in long relief. The Boilermakers had a chance to win both games of the March 5 doubleheader at ETSU after they combined for 13 innings of five-run ball, surrendering only eight hits and one walk while striking out 11. The effective long relief allowed Purdue to overcome its starting pitchers both failing to make it through the second inning. At Kansas' Tournament, they combined for 7 1/3 innings of scoreless relief. Frawley worked the final four frames of the shutout of North Dakota, teaming up with Mike Lutz for Purdue's first shutout since April 2015 vs. Ball State
- Frawley's 7 2/3 innings pitched and six strikeouts at ETSU were both career highs. It was the longest relief outing by a Purdue pitcher since April 2013. He retired seven of the first eight batters he faced and later 14 of the final 16 that came to the plate against him.
- In Purdue's comeback win at Georgia State on Feb. 21, **Tanner Schumacher** retired all 12 batters he faced over four perfect innings of relief.

JOHNSON & WOOD PRODUCE A NUMBER OF FIRST TIMES SINCE AT ETSU

- There were a combined 11 home runs hit in the four-game series at East Tennessee State, including six by Purdue's **Kyle Johnson** and **Kyle Wood**. Both seniors recorded their first collegiate multi-homer games, joining **Alec Olund** as active Boilermakers to accomplish the feat. Purdue's three home runs in the 19-6 win were the team's most in a game since hitting four in a May 2012 win at lowa that clinched the outright Big Ten title. The 27 runs the Boilermakers scored in the March 5 doubleheader at ETSU were their most in a single day since putting up 35 in a doubleheader sweep at Morehead State in February 2011.
- Johnson had career-highs of four hits and six RBI in his multi-homer game, the 19-6 Purdue win. He hit the first grand slam by a Boilermaker since **Jack Picchiotti** in the 2015 Big Ten opener vs. Rutgers. His 10 total bases were the most by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh had 12 as part of a multi-homer game in May 2013. Johnson hit his grand slam in the seventh inning and a two-run shot the following frame, becoming the first Boilermaker since Cameron Perkins in May 2012 (at lowa) to go deep in consecutive innings.
- Wood homered three times in the Saturday doubleheader, doing deep twice in the nightcap. He became the first Boilermaker since Perkins in February 2011 to homer in both games of a doubleheader. His three home runs in one day were the most by a Boilermaker since Dan Black's three-homer game against Indiana at the 2008 Big Ten Tournament.

SITUATIONAL HITTING FRUSTRATIONS IN LOSSES

- In the Boilermakers' 10 losses this season they've struggled with timely hitting. Five of the 10 losses have been by three runs or fewer. Purdue has actually had more chances for potential rallies than its opponents, seeing its leadoff man reach base safely 31 times (34 percent) to begin an inning. But the Boilers have left 79 runners on base (avearge of 7.9 per game) while hitting just .188 (18-for-96) with runners in scoring position.
- With a runner on third and less than two outs, Purdue has plated that runner in just 6 of 18 (33 percent) opportunities in its 10 losses. Meanwhile, opponents have cashed in 21 of 28 (75 percent) chances with a runner on third and less than two outs. Purdue has struck out 89 times (average of 8.9 per game) in its 10 losses, part of the reason it has not scored more runners from third with less than two outs. But when they have put the ball in play with runners on base, the Boilermakers have grounded into 12 double plays.
