- AROUND THE HORN -

• This weekend's long trip to Central Pennsylvania marks Purdue's only games outside of the state of Indiana from March 18 through April 20. After Wednesday's rain out, 18 of the team's 21 games were scheduled to be played in its home state during that month-long stretch.
• Penn State visited Alexander Field the last two seasons. Purdue posted its first ever sweep at Penn State in its last visit to Medlar Field in 2013. That was also the second weekend of the Big Ten season after the Boilermakers were swept at home during the first weekend of league play.
• Purdue was outscored 29-6 over the first five innings of its four home games last week, all losses. However, over the final four innings the Boilermakers enjoyed a 17-9 scoring edge. Dating back to the March 12 loss at Kansas, Purdue has been outscored 58-12 in the first five innings while having a 26-16 scoring edge after the fifth. Not surprisingly, Purdue is just 1-8 in those nine games, the lone win being a 15-inning marathon against Ohio on March 19.
• Penn State is 6-1 at home and has won seven of its last nine games overall.

- Regularly used member of the bullpen over his first three seasons, ranking fourth in program history with 76 career appearances.
- Teamed up with Matt Frawley on a shutout win vs. North Dakota, working five scoreless innings after escaping a 1-out bases-loaded jam in the 2nd.
- Faced only 16 batters through the first five innings in his start at ETSU, which was his first weekend start since March 2014 and just second career.
- Ranked 2nd on the team in 2015 by inducing 6 ground ball double plays in 28 2/3 innings, 2 more than he had in 99 innings as an underclassman.
- Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree ranks second among active Boilermakers with 149 career innings pitched.
- In 2014, became just the third pitcher in program history to appear in 30 games in a season (and first since 2008); set a new Purdue freshman record with 25 appearances in 2013.
- Pitched a career-high 6 1/3 innings and recorded a quality start in the 2015 midweek win at Valparaiso, his first start in over year.
- Induced and started a game-ending 1-2-3 double play with the bases loaded and Purdue up a run in 2014 series-opening win at Illinois, becoming first Boiler pitcher to end a game in that fashion since February 2012.
- Starred in relief in Purdue's first-ever sweep at Penn State (2013), working 6 1/3 innings of scoreless relief over his three appearances.

- Retired 10 of the 13 batters he faced while striking out 6 over 3 1/3 innings of one-hit relief vs. Saint Louis; retired 14 of the first 17 batters he faced at in game 3 of the series at ETSU.
- Led the team in innings pitched, strikeouts and strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.84) in 2015, starting 4 Big Ten games and 4 midweek contests.
- Led Purdue to both of its shutout victories in 2015, midweek home wins vs. Valparaiso and Ball State.
- Shined at home in 2015, going 3-1 with a 2.45 ERA, .262 batting average against and 32 strikeouts in 33 innings over 6 starts at Alexander Field.
- Struck out 9 over a season-high 8 shutout innings vs. Ball State, the most strikeouts by a Purdue pitcher since March 2013; fanned eight of the 23 batters he faced over 4 2/3 innings the following week against Illinois State.
- All-Midwest Collegiate Team honoree as a sophomore in 2013 at Indiana Wesleyan, posting a 7-3 record with a 4.21 ERA, throwing 7 complete games and 72 2/3 innings.
- Academic All-Big Ten honoree in 2015 & also a dean's list student at IWU.

BIG TEN PLAY CONTINUES: PURDUE BASEBALL AT PENN STATE



HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 18th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in nine of its 10 appearances under Schreiber.

The 2015 Boilermakers won their final five games and six of their last seven, posting their third longest season-ending win streak in program history. Kyle Wood won the team triple crown in 2015, becoming the first hitter to do so since 2007 and the 11th Boilermaker position player since 1970 to accomplish the feat.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Ball State (1991-92) and spent 1993 as an assistant at Butler.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132) and games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eighth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

KYLE WOOD'S IMPRESSIVE POWER SURGE

• **Kyle Wood** enters the weekend with an extra-base hit in each of the last nine games. He has also homered nine times in the last 14 games, including four games in a row from March 19 to 23. He became the first Boilermaker since at least the beginning of the 2005 season to homer in four straight games. Last week he hit a three-run homer at Ball State, a grand slam vs. No. 7 Louisville and another three-run homer in the series finale with Nebraska. He hit for the cycle over the course of the Nebraska series and finished the week 8-for-19 with six extra-base hits and 14 RBI.

• Wood has already matched his home run total from the last two seasons combined. He leads the Big Ten in home runs and has out homered three other Big Ten teams; Northwestern, Michigan and Penn State all have six home runs in 2016. He ranks seventh nationally in home runs this week.

• Six of Wood's nine home runs have been hit to the opposite field (left) plus one additional long ball to straight away center. He's already matched the most homers by a Purdue hitter in the BBCOR bat era (2011-present). Dan Black's 15 homers in 2009 represent the last double-figure total by a Boilermaker. Wood's nine home runs in March were the most by a Purdue player in a single month since Black hit nine in April 2008. Black also hit four homers over the course of four consecutive games on three occasions while hitting a combined 33 long balls between 2008 and 2009.

• Wood has become just the 16th player in program history to reach the 20 career homers benchmark. He's currently tied for 11th in the team record book with 23 career long balls.

• **WOOD'S 9-GAME XBH STREAK: 14-FOR-36 (.389), 3 2B, 3B, 6 HR, 18 RBI, 9 R, 1.028 SLUGGING PCT**

• **WOOD'S 14-GAME POWER SURGE: 20-FOR-55 (.364), 15 XBH, 9 HR, 23 RBI, 20 R, .982 SLUGGING PCT**

JOHNSON, PICCHIOTTI, STRONG ALSO RIDING STREAKS

• **Kyle Wood's** nine consecutive games with an extra-base hit is quite the way to put together a hitting streak. But teammates **Kyle Johnson**, **Jack Picchiotti** and **Cody Strong** have notable streaks going as well. Johnson and Strong have reached base safely in 10 consecutive games apiece. Picchiotti has reached base safely in 12 consecutive games in which he has started.

• **JOHNSON'S 10-GAME REACHED SAFELY STREAK: 15-FOR-43 (.349), 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, 9 R, 2 BB, .417 OBP**

• **STRONG'S 10-GAME REACHED SAFELY STREAK: 9-FOR-37 (.243), 2 2B, 3 RBI, 4 R, 6 BB, 3 SAC, .349 OBP**

• **PICCHIOTTI'S 12-GAME STREAK AS A STARTER: 12-FOR-46 (.261), 5 2B, 3 RBI, 13 R, 4 BB, 2 SB, .346 OBP**

GRAND SLAMS PILING UP

• The Boilermakers hit a pair of grand slams last week and already have three this season, their most since the 2008 team hit four. **Kyle Johnson** connected for his second slam of the season March 22 at Ball State and **Kyle Wood** hit his first collegiate slam in the home opener against Louisville. Johnson is the first Boilermaker to hit two grand slams in the same season since Drew Madia in 2009 and first to do it in the same month since Dan Black in April 2008. Black (2007-09) and Madia (2007-10) both hit three grand slams in their Purdue careers altogether.

• The Boilermakers' hit three grand slams in a month for the first time since April 2008. Going back to the grand slams hit by **Ted Snidanko** and **Jack Picchiotti** in March of last season, Purdue has five in a little over a year. The Boilermakers only hit three grand slams total in the three season from 2011 to 2014.

SHIPLEY AMONG TOP DEFENSIVE SHORTSTOPS IN THE BIG TEN

• Sophomore **Harry Shipley** has started 75 consecutive games at shortstop, every game since the start of last season. After leading the Big Ten in defensive assists through the end of the regular season a year ago, he's once again among the top defensive shortstops in the league. He has committed only two errors in 122 defensive chances, his .984 fielding percentage ranking as the best among Big Ten shortstops. Only Minnesota's Terrin Vavra (one error, .982) and Iowa's Nick Roscetti (two errors, .979) are the only other league shortstops with fielding percentages above .950. Shipley's 77 defensive assists are tied for second most in the conference and he has contributed to 18 of the 21 double plays turned by Purdue, which are also second most in the league.

FRAWLEY CONSISTENTLY EXCELLENT IN MARCH

• **Matt Frawley** enters the weekend ranked fifth in the Big Ten in ERA (1.59) and 12th in batting average against (.228), putting up his strong numbers despite not starting a game until the opening weekend of Big Ten play. He worked at least four innings of effective relief in each of his first three outings of March, helping Purdue win all three games in which he took the mound. He worked seven innings of one-run ball in the 15-inning win against Ohio, keeping OU off the scoreboard after the fifth inning and remaining on the hill through the top of the 11th as he and **Alex Lyons** teamed up post 10 consecutive scoreless innings.

• Frawley made his first start of the season March 26 in the middle game of the Nebraska series. He surrendered just one earned run over six innings to account for the first official quality start of the season by a Boilermaker. But he took the loss after Nebraska also scored three unearned runs against him on a day in which Purdue committed a season-high four errors.

• Frawley also worked the final four frames of the shutout of North Dakota, teaming up with **Mike Lutz** for Purdue's first shutout since April 2015 vs. Ball State. Frawley's 7 2/3 innings pitched and six strikeouts at ETSU were both career highs. It was the longest relief outing by a Purdue pitcher since April 2013.

DE LARIVA STRIKES OUT NINE OF 19 BATTERS FACED

• **Eddie De LaRiva** put together an impressive relief outing in the March 25 Big Ten opener with Nebraska, striking out nine of the 19 batters he faced over 4 2/3 innings of one-run ball. It was the longest outing of his career and more strikeouts than he had in the last two seasons combined after missing 2015 with an arm injury and recording just six Ks in 7 2/3 innings in 2014.

• De LaRiva struck out three batters in sixth, seventh and eighth innings. But a pair of dropped third strikes caused him to face additional hitters in the seventh and eighth. His nine strikeouts alone would have represented the most strikeouts Purdue had as a team this season. After **Mike Lutz** also fanned four batters, the 13 Ks were the Boilermakers' most since striking out 15 in their first win of the 2015 campaign.

CUTTING DOWN RUNNERS AT THE PLATE

• Purdue has thrown out eight runners at the plate over the last eight games. Five of those runners were cutdown while trying to score on hits that reached the outfield.

EARLY DEFICITS, BIG INNINGS BURNING BOILERMAKERS AS OF LATE

• Purdue did a decent job of avoiding big innings over the first month of the season, giving up four-plus runs in a frame only twice over the first 15 games. But while giving up at least nine runs in each of their last six games, all losses, the Boilermakers have seen the opposition jump out to early leads and score four-plus runs in an inning four times. Of the 56 runs allowed in the last six games, 31 have been scored in the first three innings. Ohio and Louisville both scored four runs in the top of the first before Purdue even came to the plate. Purdue's only lead in the last six games was short lived after Ball State quickly overcame a 7-0 deficit entering the bottom of the second on March 22.

• Starting pitchers have not been able to go deep for the Boilermakers. Only twice (**Tanner Andrews** on Friday at ETSU and **Matt Frawley** on Saturday vs. Nebraska) has a Purdue starter worked six innings. Conversely, in six of the Boilers' 19 weekend games, their starter failed to make it through the third inning. Purdue is 1-5 in those six games.

PURDUE WINS THIRD-LONGEST GAME IN PROGRAM HISTORY ON WALK-OFF BUNT

• The Boilermakers rallied to win the middle game of the Ohio series on March 19 in 15 innings. **Alec Olund** delivered the game-winning hit, a two-out bunt single with the runners on the corners. It was the third-longest game in program history and Purdue's first walk-off win since February 2015 vs. Sam Houston State (in Corpus Christi), a game in which Olund scored the game-winning run on a sacrifice fly. Olund also had a two-out RBI bunt single in the March 5 win at ETSU.

• **Alex Lyons** escaped a one-out bases-loaded jam in the 12th inning to keep the game tied. **Matt Frawley** retired 13 of the final 14 batters he faced amid seven innings of one-run relief. **Kyle Wood** hit a game-tying home run in the eighth inning as the Boilers rallied from a 4-1 deficit.

WOOD ECLIPSES HIT BY PITCH RECORD

• **Kyle Wood** was hit by a pitch for the 41st time in his career in the March 22 loss at Ball State, eclipsing Kevin Plawecki's program record. It was the first Purdue all-time record to change hands since Robert Ramer finished his career in 2013 with the best fewest walks per nine innings ratio in program history. A year earlier during the Boilermakers' Big Ten championship season, Nick Wittgren broke the saves record and Eric Charles eclipsed the runs scored benchmark (along with Plawecki taking over the hit by pitch record).

• Just as Plawecki did not hold the HBP record very long, Wood's stay atop the all-time leaderboard could also be short lived. **Harry Shipley** has already been plunked 20 times before the halfway point of his sophomore season.

DALESANDRO'S 11-GAME HIT STREAK LONGEST AMONG ACTIVE BOILERS

• Freshman **Nick Dalesandro** had an 11-game hitting streak this season. It began when he delivered a two-run double with the bases loaded in the ninth inning to break a 3-3 tie in the Feb. 21 win at Georgia State and ended in the March 18 series opener against Ohio. The streak already ranks as the longest career hitting streak among active Boilermakers. **Harry Shipley** and **Kyle Wood** both had 10-game hitting streaks last season and **Kyle Johnson** posted a 10-gamer in 2013. Overall, Dalesandro's hit streak was the longest by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh and Brandon Krieg had 12-game streaks in 2014.

• Dalesandro was 15-for-38 (.395) with three doubles and six RBI during the streak. He recorded a hit in his first at-bat in five of the 10 games after delivering the game-winning double. This year Dalesandro became the first Boilermaker since **Kyle Wood** in April 2014 to bat in the lineup in the same game he was the starting pitcher. But it February 2014 (Wood again) the last time it happened in a weekend game.

JOHNSON & WOOD PRODUCE A NUMBER OF FIRST TIMES SINCE AT ETSU

• There were a combined 11 home runs hit in the four-game series at East Tennessee State, including six by Purdue's **Kyle Johnson** and **Kyle Wood**. Both seniors recorded their first collegiate multi-homer games, joining **Alec Olund** as active Boilermakers to accomplish the feat. Purdue's three home runs in the 19-6 win were the team's most in a game since hitting four in May 2012. The 27 runs the Boilermakers scored in the March 5 doubleheader at ETSU were their most in a single day since putting up 35 in a doubleheader sweep at Morehead State in February 2011.

• Johnson had career-highs of four hits and six RBI in his multi-homer game, the 19-6 Purdue win. His 10 total bases were the most by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh had 12 as part of a multi-homer game in May 2013. Johnson hit his grand slam in the seventh inning and a two-run shot the following frame, becoming the first Boilermaker since Cameron Perkins in May 2012 (at Iowa) to go deep in consecutive innings.

• Wood homered three times in the Saturday doubleheader, going deep twice in the nightcap. He became the first Boilermaker since Perkins in February 2011 to homer in both games of a doubleheader. His three home runs in one day were the most by a Boilermaker since Dan Black's three-homer game against Indiana at the 2008 Big Ten Tournament.
