At the conclusion of each home game, reporters and photographers are invited to file their stories and send their photos from the Lambert Field press box or the Sports Information Office. The office is located in Mackey Arena, Room 15. Phone lines are available at both locations.

GAME DAY SERVICES

Game programs, notes and information guides will be available to all members of the working media prior to the start of all home games. Final printed results will be provided upon request. After the completion of each game, head coach Doug Schreiber and any requested Purdue baseball players will be available for interviews. All post-game interviews will be done at Lambert Field.

The Boilermaker Nine enter the 2005 season with high expectations after returning to postseason play in 2004. Purdue finished fifth in the Big Ten Conference, then won its first tournament contest since the 2000 season. Three all-conference selections return for the Boilermakers, as well as three of the four weekend starting pitchers.

On the field, the Boilermakers were 9-7 during the regular season vs. teams that finished ahead of them in the Big Ten standings, including 3-1 against third-place Michigan and fourth-place Michigan State. Purdue also swept a three-game series from 2004 NCAA Regional participant Jacksonville State.

A Boilermaker led the Big Ten Conference in 2004 in doubles, triples and home runs in conference action, and all three of those Boilermakers return to the lineup in 2005. Five Boilermakers batted .300-or-better in 2004, and four are back on the diamond in 2005. Five Purdue hurlers won four-or-more games last season, and four return to the hill this campaign.

All indicators point towards a positive swing for the Purdue Boilermakers on the diamond in 2005. Now it's time to play ball.

CATCHER

Spencer Ingaldson (Rapid City, S.D.) is slated to start behind the plate after an impressive 2004 season in which he served as the backup to senior Ben Fritz. The switch-hitting redshirt sophomore hit .353 overall and .364 in Big Ten games. Ingaldson saw action in 20 contests last year, starting in 14.

"Spencer has worked very hard and is ready to help lead this team from behind the plate," Schreiber said. "Defensively, he has a quick, strong throwing stroke and blocks the ball well. Offensively, he's able to drive the ball into the gaps from both sides of the plate and has a knack for getting on base."

Freshmen Jordan Comadena (Normal, Ill.) and Eric Nielsen (Elkhart, Ind.) have brought some outstanding tools with them to West Lafayette. Comadena is a confident hitter, as he displayed this fall by hitting over .400, and has deceptive running speed. Nielsen has exceptional arm strength and is a solid receiver and blocker.

"Both Comadena and Nielsen are very strong physically," Schreiber said. "They are hard-nosed players who play the game with a lot of passion."

Sophomore Jeff Mojzik (Schererville, Ind.) and freshman Chris Ivanic (Des Plaines, Ill.) will also be battling for some playing time behind the dish.

THE CORNERS

Eric Wolfe (Toronto, Ont.) returns at first base, where he started all 57 games for the Boilers last season. The left-handed-batting junior hit .300 in 2004 and has committed only three errors in his first two collegiate seasons.

"Eric is one of the top defensive first basemen in the country," Schreiber said. "He has also worked very hard in the weight room and should drive the ball for us more this spring with his added strength."

Senior Matt Bush (Indianapolis, Ind.) and junior John Hunter (West Lafayette, Ind.) will back Wolfe up at first. Hunter stroked eight home runs and had 34 RBI last year. He was named third team All-Big Ten designated hitter. Bush could also see some time at the DH spot.

Third base will have a new face this year as two-time All-Big Ten third baseman Simon Klink is now playing in the San Francisco Giants organization. Junior college transfer Mike Marx (Crystal Lake, Ill.) will take over for Klink and brings a good glove and strong bat to the Boilermaker lineup.

"Mike should be a very steady player for us both offensively and defensively," Schreiber said. "He is an intelligent player who brings an outstanding work ethic and maturity level to this team."

Dan Stahl (Emmaus, Penn.), a redshirt sophomore, will provide depth for the Boilers at the hot corner.

SEASON OUTLOOK

UP THE MIDDLE

Second base will be manned by sophomore Eric Osborn (Fishers, Ind.), who will look to improve upon a solid 2004 season. Starting 55 games at second as a freshman, Osborn hit .304 with 18 extra-base hits and had 34 runs batted in.

"Oz has some pop in his bat and turns the double play as well as any player I've coached," Schreiber said. "He is a tremendous competitor."

Freshman Dane Wolfe (Toronto, Ont.) will provide a slick-fielding glove behind Osborn. The younger brother of Eric, Dane could also see some time at third base and shortstop.

Sophomore Mitch Hilligoss (Windsor, Ill.) will replace three-year starter and second-team All-Big Ten Mitch Koester at shortstop. Recruited as an infielder, the left-handed-hitting Hilligoss spent most of 2004 in the outfield, while also leading the Boilermakers in hitting with a .327 average.

"Mitch has worked hard to improve his defensive skills in the infield," Schreiber said. "He has good range, a strong arm, and stays under control. He and Osborn work well together up the middle."

A.J. Prickel (Indianapolis, Ind.) could see some time at both shortstop and third base. The red-shirt freshman has good athleticism and strength and could also provide the Boilers with a strong stick off the bench.

OUTFIELD

A third-team All-Big Ten selection in 2004, senior Andy Dahl (Fair Oaks, Calif.) returns to the Boilermaker outfield in 2005. Dahl hit .299 overall and .330 in Big Ten games last spring and slugged seven home runs.

"Andy has tremendous speed and strength," Schreiber said. "He can drive the ball over the fence, beat out an infield hit, and covers a lot of ground in the outfield. He is a cool customer in pressure situations and a great leader."

Senior Mike Coles (Hammond, Ind.) also returns for his second and final season as a Boilermaker. Coles hit .307 last spring, with 23 extra-base hits and stole 13 bases in 15 attempts.

"Coles can be a dangerous lead-off hitter because he can hit for power and steal bases," Schreiber said. "I look for Mike to have an outstanding year for us."

Redshirt junior Neal Gorka (Westchester, Ill.) and junior college transfer Tyler Heck (Centralia, Ill.) should both see time at either one of the corner spots in the outfield.

"Gorka has a strong throwing arm and provides us with a legitimate power hitter in the middle of the batting order," Schreiber said. "Heck adds speed to the lineup and is capable of driving the ball into the gaps on a regular basis."

Freshmen John Phegley (Terre Haute, Ind.) and Brandon LaFollette (Warsaw, Ind.) will provide the Boilers with some solid depth off the bench to begin the season. Prickel, Comadena and Bush are also possibilities for the Boilermakers to use in the outfield.

THE BULLPEN

Junior Trae Dauby (Dale, Ind.) will anchor what should be another solid Boilermaker bullpen. In his 21 relief appearances in 2004, the second-team All-Big Ten performer had a 5-1 record with four saves, a team-low 2.98 ERA. Dauby held opponents to a microscopic .213 batting average.

Right-hander Jay Buente (Evansville, Ind.) returns to bolster the bullpen in 2005. The hard-throwing junior will likely have some opportunities to start some midweek games as well and may push for a weekend starting role by the end of the season.

In a move to strengthen the relief corps, junior Chris Toneguzzi (Thunder Bay, Ont.) will move from the starting rotation to the bullpen this spring. Toneguzzi won five games as a starter and earned a save in two relief appearances in 2004.

"Moving Toneguzzi to short relief provides us with added experience and power on the hill at the end of the game," Schreiber said. "Dauby is one of the premier relievers in the conference and is very versatile. We have another strong option in Buente, who is coming off of a solid summer and fall."

Sophomore Andy Groves (North Liberty, Ind.) logged some quality time as a freshman, earning a win and a save in a little over 30 innings pitched. Fifth-year senior Martin Havens (Highland, Ind.), redshirt sophomore Skyler Young (LaCrosse, Ind.) and Hunter also return relief experience from 2004.

Freshman right-hander Allan Donato (Harrisburg, Penn.) was impressive in fall workouts and should provide some quality innings for the Boilermaker bullpen. Redshirt freshman Tristan McIntyre (Lafayette, Ind.), and freshmen Sean Anthony (Madison, N.J.) and LaFollette will provide solid depth out of the pen.

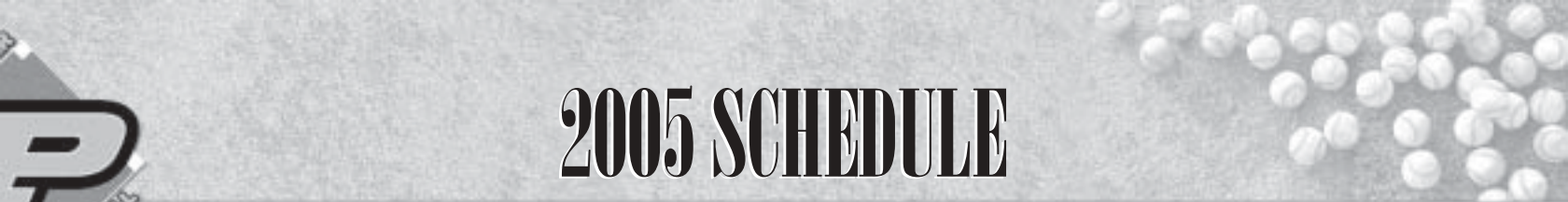
