2004 IN REVIEW



BOILERS RALLY PAST UAB IN NINTH

It wasn't your typical ninth inning rally, but it worked for the Boilermakers in their series opener against No. 31 UAB. Facing a 6-3 deficit with one out in the ninth, Purdue hitters got four clutch hits - by pitches that is - to help set the stage for the dramatic comeback. Sophomore Eric Wolfe was the first to get plunked. He moved to second on Junior Matt Bush's pinch-hit single to right. Senior shortstop Mitch Koester was then hit by a pitch to load the bases. The Blazers brought in Matt Fowles from the bullpen but he proceeded to hit junior Mike Coles and Senior Ben Fritz with pitches to make it a 6-5 game. Senior third baseman Simon Klink followed with a line shot to right field off another new Blazer pitcher, scoring Koester and Coles and giving the Boilers a 7-6 lead. Sophomore Trae Dauby worked out of a jam in the ninth to earn his first career save while securing the first career win for Junior Martin Havens, who pitched a scoreless eighth inning.

PURDUE SWEEPS REGIONAL-BOUND JACKSONVILLE STATE

The Boilermakers concluded their spring break trip with a three-game sweep of Jacksonville State, the eventual Ohio Valley Conference tournament champions and regional qualifier. In game one of the series, junior Scott Byrnes and senior Jason Driscoll shut out the Gamecocks, combining to allow only four hits, while striking out 11 hitters and issuing no walks. Freshmen Eric Osborn and Mitch Hilligoss each had three hits for the Boilers in the 6-0 win.

Purdue put together a 21-hit attack in a 13-7 victory in Game 2. Four different Purdue batters had three-hit performances, while Hilligoss connected for five hits.

In game three, the Boilers found themselves trailing for the first time in the series, as the Gamecocks scored two runs in the fourth to take a 4-3 lead. Purdue tied the game with a run in the fifth, and then took the lead for good in the top half of the seventh inning. Hilligoss and sophomore John Hunter had RBI singles in the three-run seventh. Dauby notched the win in relief, and Driscoll earned his first save of the year with 1.1 innings of work.

BULLPEN BLANKS OHIO STATE IN EASTER DAY MARATHON

Late-inning heroics and an outstanding effort from the bullpen enabled the Boilermakers to win the Big Ten series finale against Ohio State in a 16-inning marathon on Easter Sunday. Ohio State took a 4-1 lead into the bottom of the eighth with left-handed reliever Trent Luyster on the mound for the Buckeyes. With one out and two runners aboard, Klink drilled a 2-1 pitch over the right-center field wall for a three-run, game-tying home run. It was Klink's first home run of the year.

Dauby, who entered the game for the Boilermakers in the seventh, dominated the Buckeyes as he pitched 6.1 innings of shutout ball, yielding just two hits while striking out four. Driscoll came on in the 14^{th} inning and blanked Ohio State over the next three frames, holding them to just two hits as well. In the 15^{th} inning with runners on first and third and nobody out, Driscoll got a ground ball and two strikeouts to escape a potential Buckeye rally.

In the bottom of the 16th inning, Coles and Koester led off with back-to-back singles for the Boilers. Junior outfielder Andy Dahl then sacrificed them to second and third, bringing up Fritz with one out. The senior backstop hit a one-hopper off the chest of second baseman Drew Anderson, enabling Coles to score from third with the winning run. The nearly four hour marathon gave the Boilermakers a split of the fourgame series with the Buckeyes.

BOILERMAKERS TAKE THREE FROM SPARTANS

The Boilers used clutch hitting and dominating pitching to defeat the Spartans 3-2 in the first game of the four-game series. Hilligoss stroked an RBI double in the sixth that gave the Boilers a 1-0 lead. Hilligoss struck again in the eighth, as he hit a 1-2 pitch over the centerfield wall for a two-run homer, giving Purdue a 3-0 lead. Byrnes pitched into the ninth inning, striking out 11 Michigan State hitters, and allowed just four hits. Dauby ended a small offensive uprising in the ninth, getting a Spartan pinch-hitter to pop up with the tying run on first base to end the game.

In Game 2, redshirt freshman Dan Sattler kept the Michigan State hitters at bay for five scoreless innings. Driscoll tossed the final two frames to complete a 5-0 combined shutout. Hunter and Wolfe each had two hits, while Koester had two runs batted in to pace the Boilermakers.

The Purdue offense wasted little time in Game 3, as the Boilers scored six runs in the first three innings en route to a 6-3 victory. Fifth-year senior Brian Karpel allowed only a solo home run in the fifth before tiring and giving up two more runs in the seventh. Dauby came in and shut the door on the Spartans for his fourth save of the year.

HUNTER HAMMERS MINNESOTA

Hunter put the Boilermakers on his shoulders for the series finale at Minnesota, as he lit up Gopher pitching for three home runs and nine RBI to help Purdue to a 15-6 victory.

With the bases loaded in the first, Hunter drilled the second pitch he saw deep over the left field wall for a grand slam and a quick 4-0 Boilermaker lead. In the second inning, the sophomore designated hitter drove a shot over the right-centerfield wall for a three-run blast, putting the Boilers up 8-0. After being intentionally walked in the fourth and flying deep to left field in the sixth, Hunter came up with two outs and a runner on third in the eighth. He unleashed a line shot just to the left of the 360-foot sign in left-centerfield for his third home run and eighth and ninth runs batted in of the game.

PURDUE EDGES MICHIGAN THREE TIMES

Purdue took three of four regular-season games in dramatic style and won the series against Michigan, which finished just a game and a half ahead of the Boilermakers in the final conference standings. Purdue's three victories over the Wolverines were all by one-run margins.

The Boilermakers took the first game 7-6, as the Old Gold and Black scored three runs in the bottom of the eighth on four hits and two Wolverine errors. Koester registered the big hits as he slammed a two-run homer in the sixth and lofted a flyball single to short left in the eighth that led to two Michigan errors and three Purdue runs on the play. Driscoll notched the win in relief.

Redshirt freshman Spencer Ingaldson had three hits and scored three runs in the Boilermakers' 4-3 win over Michigan in Game 3. With a 4-0 lead going into the top of the seventh, the Wolverines tried to mount a comeback of their own, but Driscoll came in and put out the fire, posting his fifth save of the season.

In the final game of the series, the Boilers again staged some late-inning heroics. Trailing 5-2 midway through the sixth, Purdue scored two runs in the sixth and another run in the seventh to tie the game at 5-5. With two outs in the eighth, redshirt sophomore Neal Gorka ripped a pinch-hit single through the left side of the infield to score Dahl, who had led off the inning with a double and moved to third on Coles' ground out. Gorka's single gave Dauby his fourth win of the season, and Driscoll pitched the final inning for his sixth save.

PURDUE CLINCHES TITAN SERIES WITH WALK-OFF WINS OVER IU

The Boilermakers swept a doubleheader from rival Indiana in thrilling, walk-off fashion, locking up the final point in the Titan Series and securing a berth in the Big Ten Tournament. Purdue entered the weekend with a one-point advantage in the Titan Series, the head-to-head competition for overall athletic bragging rights between the two schools.

In the first walk-off win, Koester drove a shot just inside the left field foul line with the score knotted at 1-1 in the bottom of the seventh, scoring Wolfe from third with the winning run. Sophomore Chris Toneguzzi struck out six batters and limited

the Hoosiers to four hits over seven innings of work. He retired 12 of the last 13 Hoosier batters he faced to pick up the complete game win.

Game 2 was another pitchers' duel, as the Boilermakers again came to bat in the bottom of the seventh and the score tied at 1-1. After two quick outs and behind in the count 1-2, Dahl ripped a Steve Nielsen pitch into the netting above the left field wall for a game-winning, walk-off home run. Dahl's blast gave senior Brian Karpel a complete-game victory, as he allowed only an unearned run on four hits, while striking out six Indiana hitters.

BOILERS RETURN TO BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

Purdue finished the regular Big Ten season in fifth place, just two games out of second, with a 17-14 record. As the fifth seed in the six-team, double-elimination tournament, the Boilers faced fourth-seeded Michigan State and their all-time strikeout leader, Bryan Gale. Byrnes and Gale pitched brilliantly to a 1-1 tie through seven innings. In the top of the eighth, Dahl stepped to the plate with the bases loaded against first-team All-Big Ten reliever Adam White and launched the first pitch he saw deep over the left field wall for a grand slam. The Boilers plated a much-needed run in the top of the ninth as the Spartans would come back to score four runs in the bottom half. Driscoll entered the game to cut the Michigan State rally short, securing a thrilling 6-5 first-round win for the Boilers.

The Boilermakers then faced number-one seed Minnesota and Big Ten Pitcher of the Year Glen Perkins in the winners' bracket. Though Purdue led 1-0 entering the bottom of the fifth, Perkins proved to be too much and the Gopher offense was able to scratch home three runs in the fifth and added three more insurance runs in the eighth for a 6-1 victory over the Boilermakers.

A shaky start put the Old Gold and Black behind 5-0 after just two innings against second-seeded Ohio State in the elimination game. Purdue battled back to make it 5-4 after six innings of play, but couldn't complete the comeback and eventually fell to the Buckeyes, 6-4.

ALL-BIG TEN HONORS

Five Purdue players were named to the All-Big Ten teams, three on the second

Third baseman Simon Klink, shortstop Mitch Koester, and relief pitcher Trae Dauby represented the Boilermakers on the second team. Klink hit 14 doubles, three triples, and three home runs while driving in 34 runs on the season. Koester hit .304 overall and .360 in league games, leading the Boilermakers with 36 RBI on the year and slamming a career-high seven home runs. Dauby posted a 5-1 overall record, with four saves, while leading the Boilers with a team-low 2.98 ERA. In Big Ten games, the junior reliever was 4-1, with two saves and a 1.81 ERA, while holding opponents to a .208 batting average.

Outfielder Andy Dahl and designated hitter John Hunter were third-team selections. Dahl hit .299 overall and .330 in Big Ten games, while slugging five of his seven home runs against conference opponents. Hunter hit seven home runs in league action and drove in 24 of his 34 runs in Big Ten action.

Junior Scott Byrnes was tabbed Big Ten Pitcher of the Week after a 10-strikeout performance against regional-bound Jacksonville State in which he yielded just three hits and no runs in seven innings. Chris Toneguzzi was named Big Ten Pitcher of the Week when he threw seven innings against Northwestern without allowing an earned run on five hits. The sophomore struck out eight batters in the game, a career high. Klink earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors following Purdue's series with Michigan in which the switch-hitter batted .615 (8-13) with two doubles and one home run. Klink scored five runs and drove in four during the weekend series.

ACADEMIC ALL-BIG TEN SELECTIONS

Eight Boilermakers were named Academic All-Big Ten for the 2004 season: Jay Buente, Matt Bush, Scott Byrnes, Brent Coudron, Jason Driscoll, Neal Gorka, Brian Karpel and Eric Wolfe. It was the second such award for Bush, Byrnes, Coudron, Gorka and Karpel.

KLINK DRAFTED BY SAN FRANCISCO

The San Francisco Giants selected third baseman Simon Klink in the 21st round of the 2004 Major League Baseball draft. Klink is the seventh player to be drafted under head coach Doug Schreiber and the 23rd Boilermaker chosen in the last 15

The two-time All-Big Ten third baseman made his professional debut for the Salem-Keizer Volcanoes of the Northwest League. Klink led his team in home runs (11) and runs batted in (44), while hitting for a .258 average in 67 games.




