• Bo Hofstra joins the weekend rotation as the Sunday starter. He enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with a .088 batting average against and is second with a 0.87 ERA, surrendering just three hits over 10 1/3 innings.

– AROUND THE HORN –

• The Boilermakers begin their annual spring break trip with a return to traditional three-game weekend series, taking on Tulane in the program's first visit to New Orleans since the 1950s.
• Purdue has made two trips to the state of Louisiana this century, opening the 2006 campaign at a tournament hosted by Louisiana-Lafayette and visiting Baton Rouge for a series at LSU in March 2014. However, the program's last game in the Big Easy was against Loyola University of Louisiana in April 1952.
• After the season-opening series at Baylor was canceled due to a grounded flight from Chicago Midway to Dallas Love, this weekend will be the Boilermakers' first series of the year on an opponent's home field.
• **Jacson McGowan** (6 homers, 1.000 slugging percentage) and **Nick Dalesandro** (.472 batting average, .556 on-base percentage) lead the league in multiple statistical categories. **Skyler Hunter** is right on their heels in batting average (.447) and on-base percentage (.500) while ranking second in the league in runs scored (14).

BIG TEN PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Feb. 20, 2017
- March 6, 2017

- Joined all-time strikeouts leader Matt Bischoff (2008-10) as the only Purdue pitcher this century to start three straight season openers.
- Has worked a combined 13 2/3 innings of one-run ball in the last two season-opening wins, surrendering just seven hits while registering 18 strikeouts vs. one walk.
- Helped lead Purdue to a 10-5 record on Fridays as a junior.
- Record seven official quality starts in 2017, including three of his last four outings after a tough stretch in April; had four outings in which he did not allow a run.
- Struck out a career-high 10 over 7 2/3 shutout innings at Santa Clara in 2017, the most Ks by a Purdue pitcher since March 2012 at Ohio State.
- First Purdue pitcher to win each of his first three weekend starts since 2011.
- Retired 27 of the 32 batters he faced in complete-game shutout at SEMO.
- Struck out nine over seven innings while retiring 21 of 24 batters faced at Texas State while leading Purdue to its first season-opening win since 2013.
- Purdue's first Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honoree since May 2012 and only the fifth Boilermaker to win the award twice in the same season.
- Pitched in a team-high 21 games in 2016, starting the opener of each of the first five weekends.
- In 2016, became Purdue's first non-freshman since 2011 to make his first start on a weekend, and did it in a season opener.
- Excelled as a reliever in 2016, compiling a 1.34 ERA and .168 batting average against over 14 appearances, surrendering only 24 hits while striking out 32 in 40 1/3 innings pitched.
- Pitched a career-high seven innings at ETSU and Penn State, working seven scoreless innings vs. PSU to allow Purdue to rally and force extra innings.
- Made five of his seven appearances in Big Ten play as a freshman in 2015 despite not making his collegiate debut until April 11.
- Team MVP in football, basketball and baseball each of his upperclassman years at Tippecanoe Valley High School; all-state defensive back & wide receiver, area player of the year and second team all-state performer in basketball.

April 24, 2017

- Third Team All-Big Ten in 2017, Purdue's first all-conference pitcher since 2012.
- Limited Minnesota to six singles over seven innings in the victory that clinched Purdue's Big Ten Tournament berth last season.
- Was Purdue's top pitcher after start of Big Ten play, working a team-high 63 innings with a 2.43 ERA and .224 average against from March 25 to May 19.
- Threw a complete game 2-hitter vs. Illinois, retiring 27 of 29 batters faced to win Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Delivered a much-needed quality start in the game two win at Ohio State, retiring 13 of the first 14 batters & working 7 2/3 innings of one-run ball.
- Became Purdue's first left-hander to start on the mound since Jordan Minch made the last of his 25 career starts in May 2014.
- Appeared in 21 games, making 12 starts and recording 67 strikeouts in 70 innings pitched as a freshman at Coffeyville Community College in Kansas.
- Helped the Wisconsin Rapids Rafterys win the 2016 Northwoods League title, recording five wins and 55 strikeouts over 60 innings pitched; also worked 4 1/3 innings of one-run ball, striking out six, in his playoff start.
- His high school did not sponsor baseball so he ran track in the spring while also playing football and basketball.
- Played legion baseball in the summer, helping his team win the class C Nebraska state title in 2014; also part of a Platte championship team in basketball.
- All A honor roll student and homecoming king.
- His mother Deb played volleyball at the University of Nebraska at Kearney.

HEAD COACH MARK WASIKOWSKI

Mark Wasikowski, an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the Universities of Oregon, Arizona, Florida as well as Southeast Missouri State during his career, was hired as the head coach of Purdue baseball in June 2016.

Wasikowski has played and coached in the College World Series. He helped lead teams to 14 NCAA Tournament appearances during a successful 20-year run as an assistant coach. He also won an NCAA championship as the starting third baseman and a captain on Pepperdine's 1992 College World Series team.

Wasikowski (pronounced WOZ-uh-COW-ski) played for and worked under three-time national Coach of the Year Andy Lopez for a combined 18 years. He was part of Lopez's coaching staffs at both Florida (1999-2001) and Arizona (2002-11) before joining George Horton's staff at Oregon in the summer of 2011, spending five seasons with Horton in Eugene. Wasikowski was an assistant coach on Arizona's 2004 College World Series team, the same year that Horton led Cal State Fullerton to the national title.

Wasikowski led the Boilermakers to a 19-win improvement in his first season. It ranked as the greatest turnaround in program history and tops nationally entering the week of the conference tournaments around the country. Purdue returned to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2012 after winning 10 more games in league play. Wasikowski's team joined the 2007 Boilermakers as the only Big Ten teams since 1988 to post a 10-win improvement in conference play.

Purdue posted a pair of seven-game win streaks in 2017 and recorded 10-plus victories in both March and April. The Boilermakers won seven weekend series after having only six such successful weekends from 2013 to 2016. Purdue was 8-3 in one-run games after having a 2-13 record in similar contests the year before. The Boilermakers' 18 true road wins were tied with Minnesota for the most in the Big Ten.

Wasikowski is the 20th head coach in Purdue's 129-year history, but only the Boilermakers' fourth full-time skipper since 1978.

Wasikowski has coached 120 players that have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, a list highlighted by 29 big leaguers. During his 10 seasons at Arizona, Wasikowski coached 59 Major League Baseball draft picks and 22 future big leaguers. As the recruiting coordinator, he assembled the Wildcats' 2012 national championship team, leaving for Oregon before the start of the 2011-12 school year. Oregon was one of only three teams nationally to win 40-plus games every year from 2012 to 2014. During his five seasons in Eugene, the Ducks had 23 players drafted.

Wasikowski was a two-time All-West Coast Conference honoree at Pepperdine after spending his first two collegiate seasons at Hawaii and Rancho Santiago Junior College. He was selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 1993 MLB Draft, but opted to remain at Pepperdine to finish his bachelor's degree in business administration while serving as a student assistant under Lopez during the 1994 season. He also has a master's of business administration from Southeast Missouri.

Wasikowski was inducted into the Pepperdine Athletics Hall of Fame along with all of his teammates from the 1992 national championship team. He led the Waves in doubles as a junior and hits as a senior, guiding Pepperdine back to the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

Wasikowski and his wife, Lori Jo, are the parents of two daughters, Joelle and Kelsey.

As a player, I left Arizona much better than when I arrived. He was very good at the mental part of the game and pushing us to get to places we didn't know we could go. I still talk to Waz about once every three months. He is very loyal, and I would trust his character to run my program."

ON BASE SAFELY 10 TIMES AT STETSON TOURNAMENT

- **Nick Dalesandro** (8-for-11, 2 walks) and **Jacson McGowan** (5-for-9, 4 walks, HBP) both reached base safely 10 times over the course of Purdue's three games last weekend in Florida. They both had on-base percentages of .714.
- **Harry Shipley** was the last Boilermaker to post an on-base percentage of .700 or better during a weekend series in which the batter made at least 10 plate appearances. Shipley (3-for-5, 3 walks, 3 HBP) did it at Indiana in April 2016. **Bryce Bonner** (4-for-5, 3 BB, Sac Fly) finished one plate appearance shy of duplicating the feat last season at Texas State.
- **Kyle Wood** (9-for-11, 2 walks, 2 HR, 7 RBI) was the last Boilermaker to bat over .700 with at least 10 at-bats during a three-game weekend series, as Dalesandro did at Stetson's Tournament. Wood accomplished the feat at Oklahoma in March 2015 and won Big Ten Player of the Week for his big weekend.

BOILERMAKERS WIN ALAMO IRISH CLASSIC

- Purdue's five-run ninth inning Feb. 25 vs. Notre Dame propelled the Boilermakers to thrilling 8-7 victory in the championship game of the Alamo Irish Classic. It was the program's largest last at-bat rally in a victory since scoring 10 times in the ninth inning of a May 2012 win at No. 14 UCLA.
- **Nick Dalesandro** drove in the game-tying run with a two-out infield single and he scored on the go-ahead tally on **Braden Giroux's** subsequent base hit.
- Coincidentally, that 2012 victory was also the Boilermakers' last against a nationally ranked opponent. Purdue had lost 41 straight games vs. ranked teams since. Notre Dame was ranked 30th by Collegiate Baseball entering the Alamo Irish Classic after winning two of three at LSU to begin the season.
- **Bo Hofstra's** streak of 18 consecutive batters retired to begin his college career ended when fellow freshman Ryan Cole connected for a two-run double to center field in the sixth inning. Hofstra was named Big Ten Pitcher of the Week after he retired all 11 batters he faced to close out the Saint Louis win.
- **Mike Kornacker, Trevor Cheaney**, Hofstra teamed up to retire 29 of the 31 batters they faced in the doubleheader sweep of Saint Louis and Incarnate Word. It marked the first time since the opening day of the 2012 season that Purdue defeated two different teams on the same day. Kornacker retired 12 of the 14 batters he faced over 4 1/3 innings of scoreless two-hit relief in his two appearances in San Antonio.

DALESANDRO, LEARNARD ON AWARD WATCH LISTS

- Preseason All-American **Ross Learnard** was included on the preseason watch list for the NCB-WA's Stopper of the Year Award. Catcher **Nick Dalesandro** is on the Johnny Bench Award watch list for the second year in a row.
- A consecutive scoreless innings streak of 35 2/3 from March 11 through May 14 allowed Learnard to finish the 2017 season with a 0.58 ERA, eclipsing Purdue's minimum 30 innings ERA record that had stood since 1965. His .196 batting average and .086 WHIP were equally outstanding after he surrendered just 30 hits and 10 walks in 46 1/3 innings.
- As part of Purdue's potent 3-4-5 portion of the lineup, Dalesandro led the Big Ten in batting average (.472) and on-base percentage (.556) as of March 8. He reached base safely in 25 of his first 45 plate appearances this season, highlighted by a 13-for-21 surge in which he recorded three or more hits in a game four times. Drafted by the Detroit Tigers after his senior year of high school, Dalesandro has played in every game for the Boilermakers since the start of the 2016 season. He has made 48 career starts behind the plate and his versatility has also allowed him to start games in all three outfield positions and on the mound.
- Defensively, Dalesandro has worked with a Purdue pitching staff that has compiled a 2.82 ERA over the first 10 games. He has thrown out six base stealers
