PURDUE IN SEARCH OF STRONGER SHOWING AT SEASON-OPENING CHALLENGE

Purdue baseball opens its new season at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge for the third year in a row, taking the field against three quality programs that will also be making the transition from indoor practice facilities to live action under the fair skies of Florida's Gulf Coast.

The Boilermakers (33-24 in 2010) take on Connecticut (Friday at 7:30 p.m. at Dunedin Stadium), Notre Dame (Saturday at 4 p.m. at Al Lang Park) and Pittsburgh (Sunday at 1 p.m. at Walter Fuller Complex) this weekend in the greater Tampa-St. Petersburg area. CollegeBaseball360.com will offer live video webcasts of the Connecticut and Notre Dame games.

UConn (48-16) is a preseason favorite in the BIG EAST and ranked as high as No. 9 nationally by Baseball America. The Huskies return a veteran team from 2010, a season in which they won a program-record 48 games and hosted an NCAA Regional.

Notre Dame (22-32) is under the guidance of new head coach Mik Aoki and looking to bounce back from a down year in 2010. The Boilermakers will be out snap a five-game losing streak against their in-state rival dating back to 2003.

Pittsburgh (38-16) finished third in the BIG EAST in 2010 but was left out of the NCAA Tournament. The Panthers have been ranked as high as 30th nationally in Collegiate Baseball's preseason poll.

"We're all basically coming out of indoor [practice facilities]," said Purdue head coach Doug Schreiber, who begins his 13th year as the leader of the program. "It's a nice event and hopefully we'll be able to continue it as well. We've got a pretty good challenge, which I was happy to see the draw of teams that we got."

The Boilermakers have struggled at the Challenge the last two seasons, posting a 1-7 record in games in the Tampa-St. Pete area. Purdue won its inaugural game against Cincinnati at the 2009 Challenge, but has lost a number of close games since. The Boilers dropped a pair of extra-inning affairs in 2009 and two one-run games last season.

Among Purdue's returning players, Tyler Spillner and Matt Morgan have enjoyed the highest level of success at the Challenge. Spillner is 11-for-21 with four doubles and seven RBIs the last two seasons. Morgan has struck out 13 in his 12 innings over starts under the Florida sun. Last year, he was deserving of a win after fanning nine over seven innings of shutout ball against Cincinnati. But the Bearcats rallied against the Boiler bullpen, scoring seven times in the bottom of the ninth inning, for a stunning comeback victory.

As Purdue's projected leadoff man and game one starter, Spillner and Morgan will get to make an early impact on the new season.

"I think we're going to have to do all the little things – the base running, getting bunts down and moving guys over," Spillner said. "The biggest thing we've emphasized this year are the five extra wins. If we would have found a way to win a couple one-run games, five extra wins and a couple Big Ten wins would have given us a Big Ten championship. We were that close."

"I want to play my game and not really do anything much different than what I've been doing in the offseason," Morgan said. "The only major difference is it's on dirt and it's against a different uniform. It's a little challenging to face the same [Purdue] guys every weekend. You learn a lot about your own team, which is good. But it's going to be good to see other hitters and have a measuring stick that we can compare against other teams because we have some really good competition."

Not only is Purdue looking to put together a better showing at the Challenge, but also get off to a better start altogether. Like many northern schools, the Boilermakers are scheduled to play their first 19 games away from Lambert Field. The 33-win campaign of 2010 could have been even better if the Boilers had started, say, 6-5 instead of 3-8.

"[Keys this season will be] big hits in clutch situations and working ourselves into better hitting counts," junior first baseman Ryan Bridges said. "A lot of times last year, we chased maybe something down low and grounded into a double play. And on the defensive side, just making plays; we had too many games get away because of routine plays we messed up. Plays we didn't make."

Purdue played well in true road games a season ago, posting a 15-11 record and winning road series at Indiana, Illinois and Ohio. But the Boilers had their struggles in neutral-site contests, going just 3-7. Four of those seven losses came at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 13th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 343-328 overall record and a 176-168 Big Ten mark through his first 12 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons, while Joe Sexson guided the Boilermakers for 527 games over 18 years.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher and newcomers Kevin Plawewski, Cameron Perkins and Brad Schreiber were recognized for standout freshman seasons. Bischoff led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 48 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 16 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last six years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

BOILERS OPEN WITH 19 STRAIGHT AWAY FROM HOME

• Purdue opens its new season at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge for the third year in a row. The program's 123rd season features the Boilermakers playing their first 19 games away from West Lafayette. Purdue plays 16 consecutive road games from the final weekend of February through the end of the spring break trip (March 19).

• This season also marks the 46th and final year for the Boilermakers at Lambert Field, their home since 1965. Construction of the new Northwest Baseball Facility is slated to begin this spring and the new stadium is scheduled to open in 2012.

RECORDING-SETTING SEASON

• The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and strikeouts (435), strikeouts per nine innings (7.76) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.35) on the mound.

• Individually, **Tyler Spillner** led the Big Ten with seven triples, a new Purdue single-season benchmark. Matt Bischoff established new single-season (95) and career strikeout records (291) while closing out his college career as a four-time All-Big Ten honoree.

• As a team, Purdue led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) while ranking second in ERA (4.78) and saves (14). Remarkably, seven different pitchers earned a save in 2010, none having more than three.

PERKINS, PLawecki & SCHREIBER AMONG BIG TEN'S PLAYERS TO WATCH

• Projected to play prominent roles this spring after earning assorted freshman honors in 2010, **Cameron Perkins**, **Kevin Plawecki** and **Brad Schreiber** have been highlighted among the Big Ten Players to Watch this season. In conjunction with the unveiling of the projected Big Ten Tournament field, each league coach highlighted three players expected to be key to his team's success this season.

• Plawecki was honored after the 2010 season for his impressive numbers at the plate and his work with the Purdue pitching staff. He was recognized as a Freshman All-American by *Collegiate Baseball* and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association after batting a team-best .343 with 21 extra-base hits and a Purdue freshman-record 53 RBIs. He was also the unanimous selection as the catcher on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team thanks in part to a .435 batting average with runners in scoring position.

• Perkins started at first and third base, but settled in at the hot corner and finished the year with a .961 fielding percentage. He joined Plawecki on the *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-American team after batting .338 with 27 extra-base hits, 34 RBIs and 10 stolen bases. He established new Purdue freshman records for hits (74), doubles (17), total bases (119) and at-bats (219). Perkins hit safely in 13 consecutive Big Ten games during the heart of conference play and in all four games at the Big Ten Tournament.

• Schreiber slugged .506 in only 79 at-bats last season — nine of his 22 hits going for extra bases — showing glimpses of the power potential that helped him twice win Wisconsin State Player of the Year honors as high school standout. He was recognized as the relief pitcher on the 2010 Big Ten All-Freshman Team after surrendering only three earned runs in 10 1/3 innings pitched over six appearances on conference weekends. The right-hander is expected to get a chance to start on the mound this year and should get more at-bats at designated hitter.

MORGAN HEADLINES RETURNING PITCHERS

• **Matt Morgan** is one of only three seniors on the roster and Purdue's only returning pitcher that started more than four games in 2010. The right-hander looks to close out his career as a three-year member of the Purdue weekend rotation. Morgan's experience should prove important after the Boilermakers lost three seniors — Matt Bischoff, Drew Wurdack and Matt Jansen — who made a combined 32 starts in 2010. Purdue went 21-11 in games started by those pitchers last year.

• Morgan enters his senior season with a 10-7 career record. He has maximized his opportunities to earn victories, as the Boilermakers are only 10-13 in his 23 career starts. He's likely to join the program's all-time strikeouts list this year and currently ranks among the Purdue leaders in strikeouts per nine innings (7.975), strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.782) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.867). He has struck out 153 versus 55 walks in his first three seasons.

• Morgan struck out a career-high 14 batters over 7 2/3 innings of two-run ball in a March 20 win at Ohio at last season. Along with issuing only one walk, the right-hander struck out the side in the second inning and fanned at least two batters in five of the seven full innings he worked. The 14 Ks were only one shy of the school record, set by Chadd Blasko in March 2002 against Miami (Ohio). **Blake Mascarello** closed out the victory, striking out two of the seven batters he faced. The 16 Ks by Purdue pitchers in the win were also just one shy of the program record, set against Miami (Ohio) in 2002 as well.

BURNING BRIDGES

• **Ryan Bridges** put together a team-best 13-game hitting streak in 2010. He hit safely in every game in which he batted from April 6 through May 14. During that stretch he became the starting first baseman and batted .458 (22-for-48) with eight multi-hit efforts and only two strikeouts. Seven of his 22 hits went for extra bases, including a home run in the middle game of the Indiana series.

PLawecki GARNERS PRESEASON RECOGNITION

• One of the leaders of Purdue's talented sophomore class, **Kevin Plawecki** was recognized by a pair of college baseball websites in the preseason. In a poll of the Big Ten Coaches by CollegeBaseballInsider.com, he was selected as the best defensive and throwing catcher in the conference. Perfect Game USA also selected him as the catcher on its preseason All-Big Ten team.

• Plawecki made 47 of his 52 starts behind the plate in 2010 and was charged with only six passed balls. He threw out 16 would-be base stealers and worked with a Purdue pitching staff that led the Big Ten in strikeouts and batting average against while ranking second in ERA.

SPILLNER & CHARLES HIGHLIGHT JUNIOR CLASS

• **Tyler Spillner** (18) and **Eric Charles** (15) teamed up to account for 33 of Purdue's 90 stolen bases in 2010. Entering the new season, the two juniors are projected to be constants at the top of the Purdue lineup. In 2010, Spillner batted leadoff in 49 of the 54 games he started, while Charles was the Boilers' No. 2 hitter in 37 of his 49 starts. Both players walked more than they struck out as sophomores.

• Spillner was one of two Purdue players to see action in every game of 2010. He was one of three Boilers to record 70-plus hits, 21 going for extra bases thanks to 13 doubles and a program-record seven triples. He also led the team with 32 walks and ranked second in hits, doubles, runs and steals. Spillner was a Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection in 2009.

• Charles saw his batting average drop last season after hitting .371, a Purdue freshman record, in 2009 as a *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-American and Third Team All-Big Ten selection at second base. But he was still productive with his plate appearances, collecting 14 more RBIs thanks in part to a Big Ten-leading eight sacrifice flies. He also executed six sacrifice bunts in the two-hole and reduced his strikeout rate from 6.91 in 2009 to 8.62 last year.

CIANFROCCO & SERRATO CLOSED 2010 AS STARTERS

• **Angelo Cianfrocco** and **Barret Serrato** are both left-handed hitters that are projected to be regulars in the lineup this season. Both players closed the 2010 season as starters, Cianfrocco in right field and Serrato at shortstop. After initially seeing action at first base and designated hitter, Cianfrocco moved out to right field where he started 12 of the 16 games in the season's final month. Serrato started seven of the final nine games of the year.

• Cianfrocco reached base safely a team-best 55 percent of the time when leading off an inning. He is the son of Purdue alumnus and former Big Leaguer Archi Cianfrocco.

• Entering 2010, Serrato has registered an on-base percentage (.379) 100 points better than his collegiate batting average (.278) thanks to 24 walks. He was selected by the Florida Marlins in the 48th round of the 2008 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

NEW PROGRAM FRESHMAN RECORDS

• On their way to earning Freshman All-American honors, **Cameron Perkins** and **Kevin Plawecki** both established new program freshman records in 2010.

• Perkins broke or tied benchmarks for hits (74), doubles (17), at-bats (219) and total bases (119). He led the team in hits, doubles, runs scored and total bases. Plawecki led the team and ranked among the Big Ten leaders with 53 RBIs, eclipsing the previous Purdue freshman record (46) that had stood since 1982.

• Perkins and Plawecki both hit eight home runs to rank second on the team. In the process, they became only the third and fourth freshmen in program history to hit at least eight homers in their first seasons at Boilers.

LEADOFF HOMERS & BACK-TO-BACK JACKS

• **Stephen Talbott** and **Tyler Spillner** both connected for home runs as the game-opening leadoff man in a road game and the Boilers also hit back-to-back homers three times in 2010.

• Talbott led off the March 30 loss at Missouri with his first collegiate long ball. Spillner went deep to open the April 20 win at Chicago State. One was a case of foreshadowing, the other not as much. Talbott's game-opening blast was the first of 10 long balls in the game. Meanwhile, there was only one other homer hit in the game on Chicago's South Side.

• Sets of back-to-back home runs were hit by **Cameron Perkins** and Drew Madia, March 17 at Eastern Kentucky; **David Blount** and Jon Moore, April 6 versus Valparaiso; and Madia and **Kevin Plawecki** April 14 at Illinois State. Purdue won all three games.

HOT CONFERENCE RACE IN 2010

• The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000 (35). Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race in which all six league tournament-qualifying teams finished within three games of first place.

• The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under head coach **Doug Schreiber**, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

PERKINS STREAKY VERSUS BIG TEN COMPETITION

• **Cameron Perkins** posted a 13-game hitting streak in Big Ten play from April 16 through May 14. He also hit safely in all four Big Ten Tournament games.

• Perkins batted .382 (21-for-55) with seven extra-base hits, 10 RBIs and a team-high 15 runs scored during his 13-game Big Ten hitting streak. He went 8-for-18 at the Big Ten Tournament and did not strikeout or commit an error at third base.

• Perkins also had a 10-game hitting streak (in all games) from April 13-25. Only **Ryan Bridges** (13), Barret Arthur (11) and Jon Moore (11) had longer overall hitting streaks in 2010.

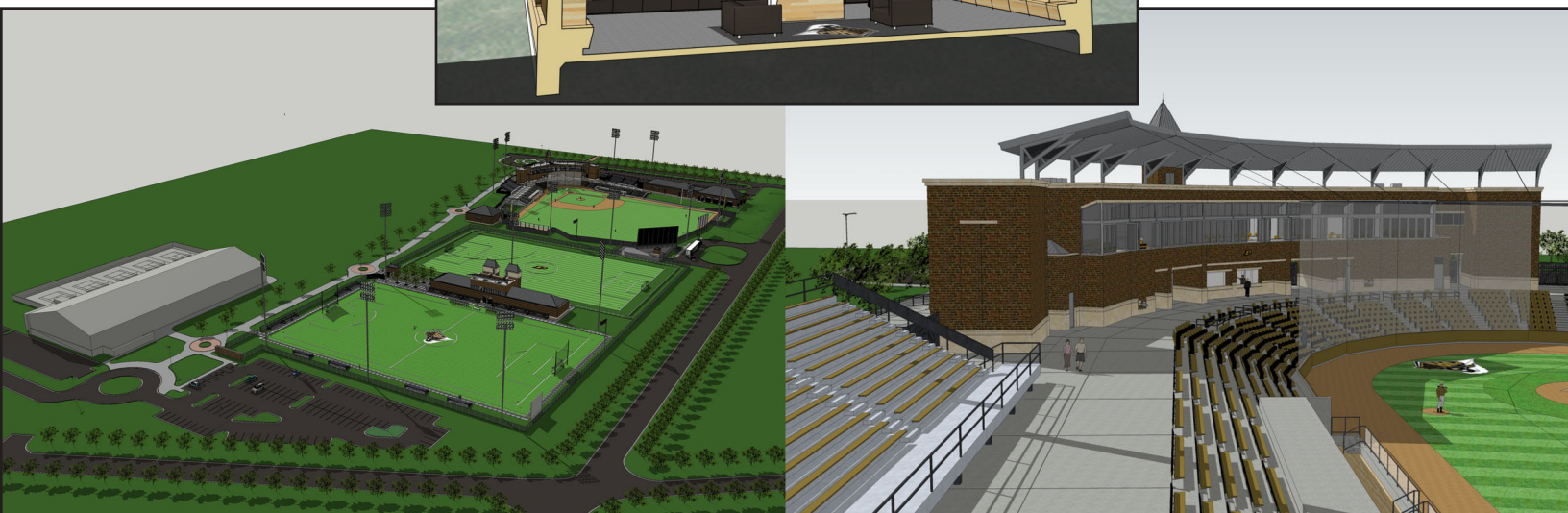
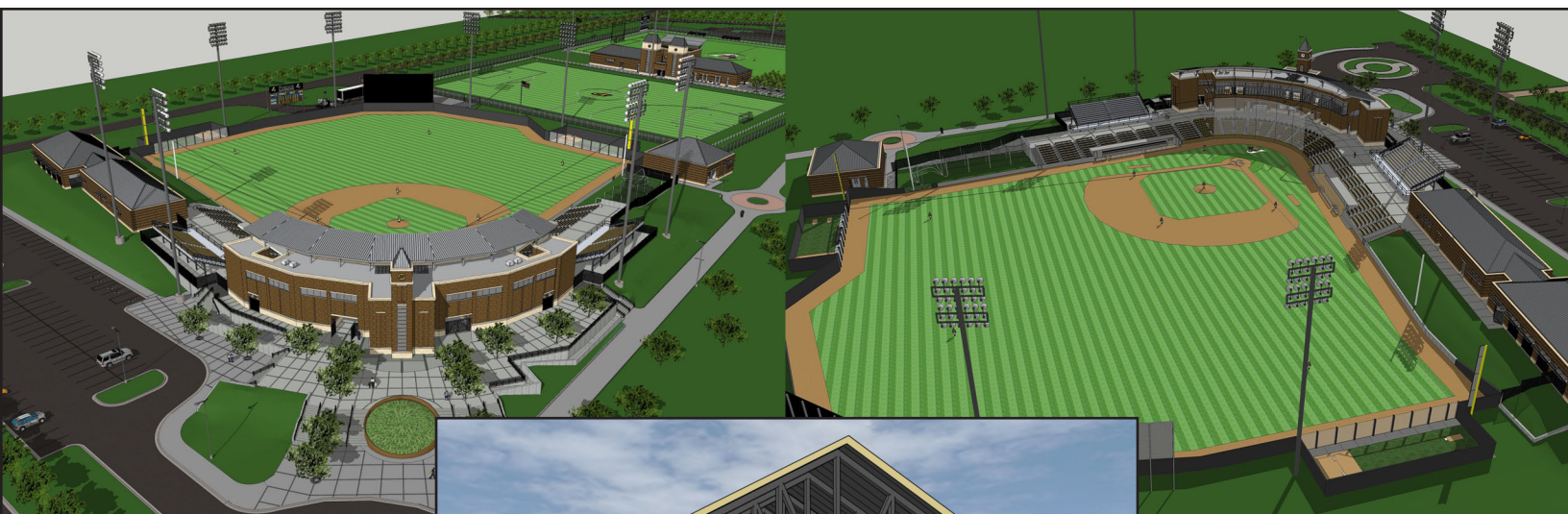

The 2011 season will be Purdue's last at Lambert Field. The new northwest baseball facility is set to open for the 2012 home opener. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. Purdue will close out Lambert Field this year with an eight-game homestand from May 11-21, highlighted by Big Ten Conference series against Illinois and Iowa.
