– BOILERS BOUND FOR AUBURN'S FOUR-TEAM TOURNAMENT IN ALABAMA –

For the third of its six consecutive weekends on the road to begin the season, Purdue baseball travels to the state of Alabama for another four-team tournament, playing in Auburn's round-robin event.

The Boilermakers (5-1) are scheduled to take on Auburn (6-4) Friday at 6 p.m. ET, Southern Miss (6-3) Saturday at 1 p.m. ET and Charleston Southern (4-4) Sunday at noon ET. Purdue will be making its first visit to Auburn's Plainsman Park since the opening weekend of the 2007 spring break trip. Southern Miss and Charleston Southern represent two of the four first-time opponents on the Boilers' 2012 regular-season schedule.

Purdue is off to a 5-1 start for the first time since 2000. This weekend presents another early-season test and barometer for the Boilers. While the combined records of the four teams is not quite on par with the 13-1 mark the four teams carried into East Carolina's Keith LeClair Classic last weekend, Auburn and Southern Miss have both been regulars in the NCAA Regionals. Highlighted by a Cinderella run to the College World Series in 2009, Southern Miss has been to nine consecutive NCAA Tournaments. Auburn hosted a Regional in 2010 that featured USM. The Tigers also played in the postseason 11 times in 13 years from 1993-2005.

Culminating with next weekend's series and spring break trip opener at Murray State, the Boilers will have played their first 10 games against 10 different teams. The weekend-opening win at USM's Conference USA rival East Carolina currently ranks at the top of the Purdue résumé. Friday, the Boilers will be in search of their first victory against a Southeastern Conference opponent since winning at Georgia in the middle game of a 2007 season-opening series.

While batting their customary first and second in the lineup at the Keith LeClair Classic, Tyler Spillner (7-for-12) and Eric Charles (8-for-12) were a combined 15-for-24 with three walks, five RBIs and 10 runs scored. Both players reached base safely in all three games and had multiple hits in Purdue's two wins.

The Boilermakers are expected to face more size on the mound this weekend. Auburn's Derek Varnadore, a 6-foot-4 senior right-hander, won the team pitching triple crown (6 wins, 3.68 ERA, 74 strikeouts) last season, the program's first to accomplish the feat since 1999. He has fanned 14 while issuing only two walks in 13 innings over his first two starts this year.

Southern Miss's probable starter, 6-foot-4 lefty Jake Drehoff, has won each of his first two collegiate starts after surrendering only two earned runs. So far opposing batters have made contact but not found holes. The redshirt-freshman has given up seven hits while striking out only four over his 12 innings.

Charleston Southern probable starter Patrick Dolan was the winning pitcher in the Bucs' first victory of the season, striking out seven over 5 2/3 innings of two-run ball against Georgetown.

Auburn has posted four of its six wins in midweek action. The Tigers lost two-of-three to Missouri and at Arizona in their first two weekend series of the year. Varnadore struck out 11 in the opening-day win against Mizzou. Creede Simpson (.474, 6 doubles, 11 RBIs) and Jay Gonzalez (.375, 10 RBIs, 10 walks, 12 runs) have led the way offensively at the top of the lineup.

Auburn has been aggressive on the base paths, successfully stealing 37 base on 48 attempts.

Simpson and Gonzalez have accounted for 20 of those stolen bases. Through six games, the opposition has only tried to steal twice on Purdue.

Southern Miss has played eight of its first nine games at home, highlighted by a 14-2 midweek win against Alabama Wednesday. The pitching staff has the led the way for the Golden Eagles, who have not surrendered more than four runs in a game this year and no more than two since dropping their season opener, 5-4. The USM pitching staff has compiled a 1.50 ERA thanks in part to surrendering only four extra-base hits (all doubles) in 78 innings. At the plate, the Golden Eagles have yet to hit a home run in their first nine games; and while no player has more than five RBIs, seven players have at least four.

Charleston Southern split a four-game series against Marshall last weekend. Brian Welch has been the primary run producer in the middle of the lineup, accounting for six of CSU's 19 extra-base hits, including a pair of home runs. Centerfielder Bobby Ison is off to a hot start (.441, 15-for-34) while batting first or second. The Bucs don't run much, attempting just six steals in their eight games.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 14th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 380-348 overall record and a 190-178 Big Ten mark through his first 13 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber will make a run at Alexander's all-time wins record (407) this season and is on pace to break the games coached benchmark in 2013.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's single season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first, and reached the Big Ten Tournament for the fourth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons. The four straight tourney appearances represent the longest active streak in the league as well as a program high. The program's 58 Big Ten wins over the last four years are also the most in the league.

Purdue led the Big Ten in numerous statistical categories in 2011, highlighted by runs scored, doubles, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, sacrifice flies, saves and strikeouts. The Boilermakers drew the most walks at the plate and issued the fewest number of free passes on the mound.

Six Boilers were recognized as all-conference performers, matching the second-highest total in program history. Kevin Plawecki and Barrett Serrato were named First Team, Tyler Spillner and Nick Wittgren Second Team and Cameron Perkins and Stephen Talbott Third Team. With Serrato, Spillner and Talbott all honored as outfielders, it marked the first time 1991 that three Purdue outfielders were named all-conference in the same season.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher. He led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 54 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 18 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last seven years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE TO CLOSE OUT SEASON-OPENING TOURNAMENT STRETCH

- The Boilermakers travel to Auburn for the third of their six consecutive weekends on the road to begin the regular season. Another round robin tournament awaits and as of next weekend's series opener at Murray State, Purdue will have played its first 10 games of the season against 10 different teams.
- The Boilermakers were the runner-up at last weekend's Keith LeClair Classic hosted by East Carolina. Purdue defeated the host Pirates but suffered its first loss of the season to tournament champion Maryland, a team that is also 5-1 this season and moved into Collegiate Baseball's Top 30 national rankings this week.
- The Boilermakers had to play three times in span of 24 hours for the second weekend in a row after Friday's action was rained out. Purdue never trailed in its win against ECU Saturday afternoon but committed a season-high five errors Saturday night against Maryland. Sunday's win versus Western Carolina saw the Boilers jump out to an early lead before the Catamounts rallied to tie the game at 7-7 entering the bottom of the sixth. Purdue answered with seven runs in the frame to pull away and win, 14-7.
- The Boilermakers visited Auburn for a three-game series in 2007, but have never played Southern Miss or Charleston. They represent two of the four first-time opponents on Purdue's regular-season schedule.
- At 5-1, the Boilermakers are off to their best start since the 2000 team was 8-1. Purdue and Southern Miss are both ranked among Perfect Game USA's national top 50.

CHARLES CONSISTENCY EARNS SENIOR BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- **Eric Charles** recorded multiple hits and scored a run in all three games of the Keith LeClair Classic earning the senior Big Ten co-Player of the Week honors. He collected his 200th career hit Saturday in the victory against East Carolina and his 100th collegiate RBI Sunday in the win versus Western Carolina. He leads all active Boilers in both statistical categories.
- The second baseman finished the weekend 8-for-12 with two doubles, three RBIs and four runs scored. Charles is off to a hot start this season, leading the team with a .560 batting average (14-for-25). He has hit safely and scored a run in each of the first six games. Dating back to 2011, he has hit safely in nine consecutive games and reached base safely in 25 straight.
- **Barrett Serrato** has also reached base safely in each of the first six games of the new season, hitting safely in five of the first six. He came through with a key RBI single in the three-run sixth inning rally in the ECU victory after the Pirates had intentionally walked **Kevin Plawecki** to setup a lefty-lefty matchup.

BOILERS TURN EIGHT DOUBLE PLAYS IN GREENVILLE

- Purdue turned four double plays in each of its two victories at the Keith LeClair Classic. Of the eight twin killings, six were of the inning-ending variety and none bigger than the 1-2-3 game-ending double play in the East Carolina win. **Nick Wittgren** induced a comebacker off the bat of the ECU cleanup hitter with the bases loaded, one out and Purdue clinging to a 6-4 lead. Wittgren had already walked the previous two hitters to load the bases when the count went full against ECU's Chase McDonald. But moments later the game was over and Wittgren had earned his 13th career save, moving into third place on the Purdue all-time list.
- **Joe Haase** (two), **Joe Eichmann**, **Calvin Gunter**, **Blake Mascarello** and **Connor Podkul** also induced at least one ground ball double play ball. Mascarello started a 1-6-3 double play to eliminate a leadoff single in the eighth inning of the ECU win. Defensively, **David Miller** (six) and **Eric Charles** (five) were active in the twin killings at the second base bag.
- Purdue also turned four double plays in a game in a March 2011 home win against IPFW and three times during the 2009 campaign.

CAN'T WALK YOUR WAY OFF THE ISLAND VERSUS BREEDLOVE & MASCARELLO

- Entering the weekend, Purdue has only issued 16 walks in its 52 2/3 innings pitched this season. **Lance Breedlove** and **Blake Mascarello** are a big reason why. Neither senior has walked a batter so far this season. Breedlove has struck out 16 while not issuing a walk in his 12 innings. Mascarello has retired 22 of the 27 batters he has faced. The left-hander has not issued a free pass of any kind while surrendering only five hits over 7 2/3 innings.

SPILLNER & CHARLES IGNITE THE OFFENSE AT ECU TOURNAY

- While batting their customary first and second in the lineup at the Keith LeClair Classic, **Tyler Spillner** (7-for-12) and **Eric Charles** (8-for-12) were a combined 15-for-24 with three walks, five RBIs and 10 runs scored. Both players reached base safely in all three games and had multiple hits in Purdue's two wins.
- Spillner reached base safely in three of his six opportunities to leadoff an inning, including the first inning of both wins. He's been on safely to open an inning in eight of his 13 opportunities early this season. Sunday in the victory against Western Carolina, the senior posted his third career four-hit effort, scoring a run while recording a hit in each of his first four at-bats.
- **Andrew Dixon**, Spillner and Charles each reached base safely twice and scored a run during the seven-run rally against WCU that decided the game. All three players recorded a hit their first time up to ignite the rally. They each walked in their second plate appearances of the extended frame.

PERKINS 67-GAME STREAK SNAPPED IN LOSS TO MARYLAND

- After getting robbed of a potential base hit up the middle on a nice play by the Maryland pitcher in what proved to be **Cameron Perkins'** final at-bat of the game, the junior's remarkable streak of reaching base safely in 67 consecutive games was snapped. The streak dated back to 2010. Perkins reached base safely at least one in every game he played as a sophomore.
- Perkins reached base safely 133 times during his streak. He collected 98 hits, 12 walks and was hit by a pitch 23 times, good for an on-base percentage of .421.
- In Big Ten play, Perkins has reached base safely in 42 consecutive contests dating back to 2010. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he has managed to find his way on base in 49 straight games against conference opponents. He has compiled an on-base percentage of .425 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 94 times (70 hits, eight walks, 16 hit by pitch).

BOILERMAKERS OPEN 3-0 AT BIG TEN/BIG EAST CHALLENGE

- After being the only Big Ten team to finish the season-opening Big Ten/Big East Challenge 3-0, Purdue jumped out to its first 3-0 start since the 1991 team opened the year 5-0. The Challenge ended deadlocked 15-15 after both the Big Ten and Big East posted 15 wins. South Florida was the only other team to go 3-0.
- The Boilermakers outscored Connecticut, Cincinnati and Notre Dame at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge by a margin of 30-12. Purdue also posted its three wins in a span of just over 24 hours after Friday's opener against Cincinnati was postponed due to rain. The Boilermakers recorded back-to-back three-run rallies late in the game against UConn, led wire-to-wire in the shutout win against Cincinnati and used a nine-run sixth inning to surge past Notre Dame.

BREEDLOVE BESTOWED WITH PITCHER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- **Lance Breedlove's** career-high 11 strikeouts over his seven innings of two-hit ball in Purdue's shutout win of Cincinnati (Feb. 18) earned the senior right-hander National Pitcher of the Week honors from College Sports Madness as well as Big Ten co-Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Breedlove was dominant in his fifth career start as a Boiler. He surrendered only a pair of two-out singles and did not allow a base runner to advance past first. His 11 strikeouts represented the most by a Purdue pitcher since Matt Morgan fanned 14 in a March 2010 win at Ohio.
- Breedlove would have retired the final 16 batters he faced if not for a two-out error in the fifth inning. The senior worked four 1-2-3 frames. He struck out the side in the first inning. Thanks in part to not issuing a walk, Breedlove only needed 89 pitches to complete his seven innings. Purdue's first shutout win since the 2011 Big Ten home opener against Michigan was played in two hours and two minutes.

PERKINS' GRAND SLAM HIGHLIGHTS NINE-RUN RALLY

- Highlighted by a nine-run sixth inning that featured a grand slam from **Cameron Perkins**, Purdue scored in each of the final five innings to overcome a four-run deficit and defeat Notre Dame, 15-8, on the final day (Feb. 19) of the Big Ten/Big East Challenge.
- Each of the nine players in the batting order reached base safely and scored a run before an out was recorded in the sixth inning, leading to the Boilers' biggest inning since also scoring nine times in a March 2010 home win against Chicago State. Perkins connected for the first grand slam by a Boiler since April 2010, giving Purdue a 9-4 lead with a blast to left field. He finished with five RBIs, one shy of his career high. The grand slam was his 17th career home run, tops among active Boilers.

CONSISTENT LINEUP LEADS THE WAY IN ST. PETE

- The Boilermakers scored in 12 of 25 innings in which they batted at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge, finishing the weekend with a .367 team batting average. **Eric Charles** (6-for-13), **David Miller** (6-for-13), **Kevin Plawecki** (5-for-13) and **Stephen Talbott** (4-for-11) hit safely in all three games. **Andrew Dixon** enjoyed a big night at the plate (4-for-4) in the Cincinnati win, finishing the weekend 5-for-8.
- Thanks in part to the opposition committing 14 errors and issuing 16 free passes (11 walks, 5 HBP) over the three games, Purdue had a base runner in 22 of the 25 innings in which the team batted. A trio of 1-2-3 innings in the shutout win against Cincinnati marked the only times the Boilers went in order. Conversely, Purdue only committed two errors and issued eight free passes (4 walks, 4 HBP). The Boilermakers did not make an error or issue a walk in the season-opening win against Connecticut.

BOILERMAKERS AMONG FAVORITES IN BIG TEN

- Tabbed first or second in the preseason predictions by nearly every college baseball publication and website, Purdue entered the 2012 season among the favorites in the Big Ten Conference. Baseball America and College Baseball Insider both predicted the Boilers will win the Big Ten and represent the conference at the NCAA Regionals. Baseball America also predicted Purdue would be a No. 3 seed at Regionals. The league coaches picked the Boilers second to defending conference co-champion Michigan State in the preseason poll.
- Although Purdue has not won a Big Ten title since 1909, the team has certainly come close quite a few times during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** 14-year tenure. Four times since 2001, the Boilers have either finished in second place (2001, 2005, 2008) or been just one game (or fewer) out of first place in the final standings (2001 & 2011). Purdue tied the program's single-season record with 37 wins in 2011, leading the Big Ten in victories and overall win percentage (.649).

STACKED RETURNING LINEUP FEATURES SIX ALL-BIG TEN SELECTIONS

- The Boilermakers' opening day lineup is expected to feature all returning starters that are juniors or seniors. Purdue lost only three players that started games a season ago, with one of those graduated seniors, Payton Bieker, now an assistant coach.
- The opening day lineup is expected to feature six players that have earned All-Big Ten honors during their college careers. **Kevin Plawecki** (First Team catcher), **Barrett Serrato** (First Team outfielder), **Tyler Spillner** (Second Team outfielder), **Cameron Perkins** (Third Team third baseman) and **Stephen Talbott** (Third Team outfielder) were recognized among the best players in the conference at their positions in 2011. Second baseman **Eric Charles**, meanwhile, was a Third Team honoree as a freshman in 2009.
- All five aforementioned players started at least 55 games a season ago. Shortstop **David Miller**, designated hitter/first baseman **Angelo Cianfrocco** and first baseman **Ryan Bridges** are also back this season. Miller was a constant at shortstop and led the Big Ten in walks and on-base percentage in his first season with the program. Bridges and Cianfrocco are expected back at full strength after both missed long stretches of 2011 due to injuries.
- Outfielder **Andrew Dixon** also returns for his senior season. The left-handed hitter started 22 times, making at least one start at all three outfield positions, and played in a team-high 27 games off the bench.
- Plawecki and the outfield trio of Serrato, Spillner and Talbott made history last year. Plawecki was the first Purdue catcher to be named First Team All-Big Ten since 1960. The 1991 season marked the last time that three Purdue outfielders were All-Big Ten honorees in the same year.

FOUR STRAIGHT BIG TEN TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES

- Purdue is the only Big Ten team to reach the league tournament in each of the last four seasons, a program-long streak. The Boilermakers have managed to win at least one Big Ten Tournament game each of the last four years, and in eight of their nine tourney appearances under head coach **Doug Schreiber**. Purdue's 58 conference victories over the last four years are also tops in the league.

WELCOME BACK BLAKE & BRIDGES

- While the Boilermakers will be without key starting pitcher **Brad Schreiber** this season due to offseason elbow surgery, Purdue does welcome back a pair of seniors who missed the final weeks of 2011. **Ryan Bridges** had started 24 of the first 31 games at first base when he suffered a broken leg in the finale of the Michigan series on April 10. He was batting .313 with 11 extra-base hits and 21 RBIs at the time of the injury. He had also impressed with his defense at first base.
- **Blake Mascarello** also returns to the active roster after missing the final month of 2011 due to a violation of team rules. The left-hander was a key member of the Purdue bullpen a year ago, compiling a 1.26 ERA in his six Big Ten appearances. Mascarello was a starting pitcher early in the season but proved most valuable in a relief role.
- Mascarello excelled in relief in the 2012 season-opening win against Connecticut, retiring 12 of the 14 batters he faced over four scoreless innings of relief to earn the victory. Bridges started all three games of the Big Ten/Big East Challenge at first base, finishing the weekend 3-for-12 with a walk and squeeze bunt.
- **MASCARELLO IN RELIEF IN 2011: 2-2, SAVE, 12 APP, 24 2/3 IP, 22 H, 5 BB, 24 K, 1.82 ERA**

WITTGREN STARTS SEASON ON STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- After leading the Big Ten with 12 saves and earning Second Team All-Big Ten honors in 2011, closer **Nick Wittgren** has received his fair share of preseason publicity this year. He was named to the NCBWA's Preseason All-America Third Team and was one of 45 relievers to be selected for the NCBWA's Stopper of the Year preseason watch list. Wittgren was the only player from a Big Ten school on the list for the award that recognizes the nation top Division I relief pitcher.
- Wittgren finished one save shy of the Purdue single-season record last year. He helped the Boilers establish a new program record with 21 saves as a team. But seven different relievers tallied at least one save, with all seven pitchers back this year.
- Twenty-four of Wittgren's 28 relief appearances on the mound saw him finish a game. He struck out 55 in 51 innings while issuing only 10 walks.
- **WITTGREN AS A RELIEVER: 2-2, 28 APP, 12 SAVES, 45 2/3 IP, 39 H, 10 BB, 50 K, 2.36 ERA**

HAASE BEGINS 2012 AS SENIOR STAFF ACE

- Senior **Joe Haase** began the 2011 season in the bullpen but quickly emerged as one of Purdue's top pitchers and finished the year as the team leader in innings pitched. He started a game in each of the eight Big Ten weekend series and shared the team lead with 13 starts total. The right-hander begins the 2012 campaign as the team's Friday starter and ace of the pitching staff.
- Thanks in part to a complete-game shutout in his first career Big Ten start, a win against Minnesota at Target Field, Haase was able to record a consecutive scoreless-innings streak of 14 over four appearances during the first half of the season. He worked at least six innings in six of his nine starts against Big Ten rivals, finishing just one out shy of a complete game in the middle win game in the series sweep of Indiana.
- Haase also took the ball in the midweek games against nationally-ranked foes Louisville and Vanderbilt. He led the way in the win at Louisville, surrendering only two earned runs over 8 2/3 innings. He continued his mastery of Minnesota at the Big Ten Tournament, keeping the gritty Gophers off the scoreboard until the seventh inning in a game the Boilers lost, 1-0.

TALBOTT STILL A PERFECT THIEF

- Purdue was active on the base paths for much of the 2011 season, successfully stealing at least one base in 42 of the 57 games. Twelve Boilermakers swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** led the way at a perfect 17-for-17. After stealing a pair of bases successfully at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge the junior is a perfect 24-for-24 in his career.
- Talbott was a Third Team All-Big Ten outfielder in 2011 thanks in part to ranking second in the conference with 54 runs scored. He did not bat any higher than eighth in the lineup until getting a chance to leadoff in the finale of the Tennessee Tech series (March 20). But for the season he batted no higher than seventh in 46 of the 55 games he started.
- Talbott nearly single-handedly won the opener of the Illinois series (May 13) thanks to a solo home run, double, insurance run and throwing out a runner at the plate. In the third inning, he threw out a runner at the plate to end the top of the frame and homered to open the bottom half.

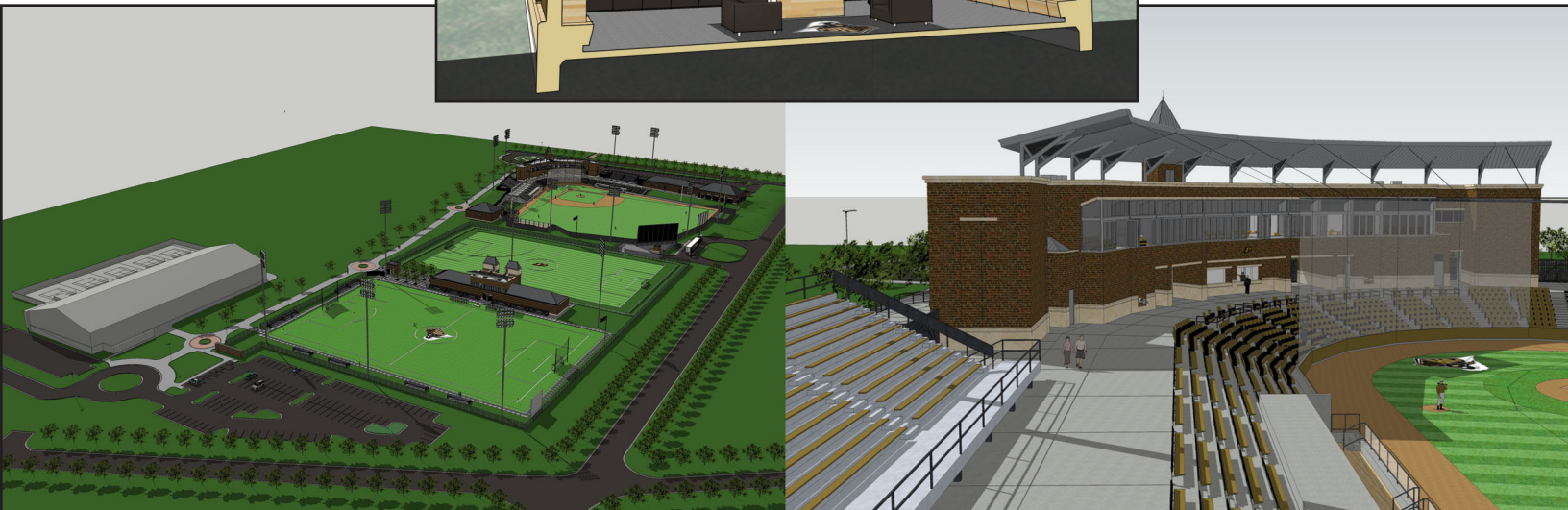
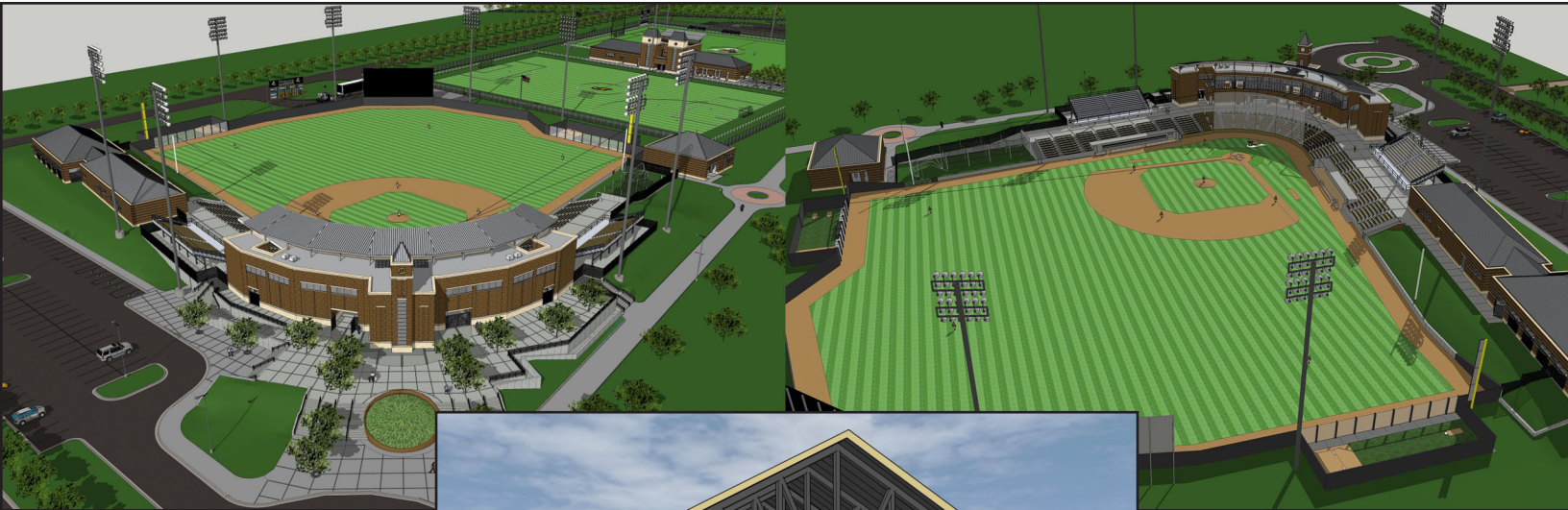

Construction Began in Spring of 2011
Stadium to be located near the intersection of
McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus**

Alexander Field will soon be the new home of the Boilermakers. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. The new stadium will be named Alexander Field in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. The Alexanders were the parents of Dave Alexander, who is giving the lead gift for the project. David Alexander was Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991 and then an athletics administrator through 1994. All three Alexanders graduated from Purdue, and Dave played on Purdue's baseball team. John Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1933, while Anna Margaret Ross Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1935. Both received honorary doctorates from Purdue in 1986.
