HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 15th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber has been in the third base coach's box for 787 games through 14 years and will break Alexander's record for games coached early in 2013

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909. In its 16 games during the final year at Lambert, the home of the program since 1965, Purdue won three times in walk-off fashion and locked up the Big Ten title May 12 in front of a large group of program alumni.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nines appearances under Schreiber.

Headlined by Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. A program-record seven players were drafted overall in 2012.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's previous single-season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings under Schreiber in 2001, 2005 and 2008.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 30 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last eight years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

- BOILERMAKERS RETURN TO FLORIDA FOR SEASON-OPENING WEEKEND -

Purdue baseball begins its new campaign against three of the top teams in the Big East Conference in 2012, playing four games in three days under the fair skies of Florida during its fifth consecutive season-opening weekend at the Big East/Big Ten Challenge.

The Boilermakers will be the visiting team on the scoreboard in their two schedule games against Connecticut and the designated home team in their contests against South Florida (38-22 in 2012) and No. 4 Louisville.

Friday's season opener versus UConn is slated for 4 p.m. at Florida Auto Exchange Stadium, the Toronto Blue Jays' spring training home field in Dunedin, Fla. Purdue and South Florida will square off under the lights Saturday evening at Bright House Field, the Philadelphia Phillies' spring training home field in Clearwater, Fla. Sunday, the Boilers will play a doubleheader at Al Lang Stadium along the shoreline in downtown St. Petersburg, taking on Louisville at 10 a.m. and UConn at 1 p.m.

Purdue has played at all three stadiums at least once in its previous 14 games at the Big East/ Big Ten Challenge the last four seasons. Unlike seasons past when the Challenge featured numerous teams from both conferences, the Big Ten will be represented by only Indiana and Purdue this season. The teams that finished one-two in the Big Ten standings a year ago take on the Big East opponents that finished first (Louisville), third (South Florida) and fifth (Connecticut) in 2012.

Louisville is also scheduled to play Purdue and Indiana in midweek action later this spring. The Boilermakers visit the Cardinals' Jim Patterson Stadium March 13 during the spring break trip.

The Boilermakers kick started their rise into the national rankings with their 3-0 showing at the 2012 Big East/Big Ten Challenge. However, more true freshmen (12) are scheduled to travel this weekend than returning players (11) that were part of the 28-man roster than went to Florida for the season-opening weekend a year ago.

Connecticut is expected to start a pair of left-handers against Purdue this weekend, neither pitcher appearing in the Purdue-UConn games at the Challenge the last two seasons. Opening day starter Anthony Marzi had just a 3-8 record a year ago despite a compiling a 2.55 ERA and .207 batting average against. Brian Ward also had three wins despite an ERA of three runs higher (5.57). Big East Preseason Player of the Year LJ Mazzilli, the son of MLB veteran and former Big League manager Lee Mazzilli, returned for his senior season at Connecticut even after being selected in the ninth round of the 2012 MLB Draft. He homered against Purdue last season.

South Florida finished just one game behind Big East co-champions Louisville and St. John's a year ago. The Bulls batted only .255 as a team but had a strong pitching staff (3.50 team ERA) and were solid defensively (.971 fielding percentage). Probable starter Joey Lovecchio successfully pitched to contact, earning eight wins while striking out 45 and walking only 17 in 79 innings during his first year with the program as junior college transfer. Offensively, James Ramsay and Alex Mendez are both back after sharing the team-lead with 32 RBI a year ago.

Louisville has announced it will start the same starting pitcher it threw in the 2012 home opener at Lambert Field, a 10-inning pitcher's duel won by the Boilers on Talbott's walk-off single. Indianapolis native Jared Ruxer was a high school teammate of **Brandon Krieg** at Lawrence Central. He finished his freshman season in the U of L weekend rotation, going 8-3 with a 3.38 ERA in his first year with the Cardinals. He too pitched to contact, tallying 32 strikeouts versus 15 walks in 77 1/3 innings.

Offensively for U of L, infielders Ty Young and Nick Ratajczak return after both players batted over .340 with on-base percentages over .460. They combined for 49 of Louisville's 115 hit batters. Young also hit six home runs and stole 15 bases. Ratajczak struck out only nine times in 245 at-bats.

The Boilermakers also scheduled to play four games and take on another Top Five team in the Baseball America preseason poll next weekend in Starkville, Miss. Purdue, No. 5 Mississippi State and Samford will comprise the three-team field at the Diamond Classic at Dudy Noble Field in Starkville, Miss. All three teams gualified for the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

BOILERMAKERS OPEN NEW SEASON AT CHALLENGE FOR FIFTH STRAIGHT YEAR

- Purdue begins its 2013 campaign and the defense of its Purdue AT BIG EAST/BIG TEN CHALLENGE 2012 Big Ten title with a return trip to Pinellas County, Fla. for the Big East/Big Ten Challenge, marking the fifth year in a row the Boilers have opened in the St. Petersburg-Clearwater area. This year's downsized event only features five teams: No. 4 Louisville, Connecticut and South Florida from the Big East and Indiana and Purdue from the Big Ten.
- Purdue has posted a 6-8 record at the Big East/Big Ten Challenge, with five of those six wins coming in the previous two seasons. The Boilermakers were one of only two Big Ten teams to post a winning record at the 2011 event. Last season, only Purdue and South Florida were a perfect 3-0
- The Boilermakers will play games at Florida Auto Exchange Stadium (Friday vs. UConn), Bright House Field (Saturday vs. USF) and Al Lang Stadium (Sunday vs. U of L and UConn). In its last games at those parks, Purdue defeated Connecticut at Florida Auto Exchange in 2011,

lost to South Florida at Bright House in 2009 and defeated Notre Dame at Al Lang in 2012.

• In 2011, Brad Schreiber made his first career weekend start for Purdue in the win against No. 30 Pittsburgh, surrendering only two earned runs while striking out seven over six innings to earn the victory. Among current Boilers, Angelo Cianfrocco (first base), Stephen Talbott (left field) and Jake Hansen (shortstop) also started that game and had at least one hit each.

PURDUE LOOKS TO DEFEND BIG TEN TITLE WITH REVAMPED ROSTER

- · Upperclassmen, specifically seniors, were a driving force behind Purdue's program-record 45-win season and Big Ten title in 2012. The Boilermakers graduated 15 seniors and also lost three juniors that were selected in the MLB First-Year Player from last season's team. Not all of those roster spots will be filled by true freshmen this season but there will be a large number of newcomers on the official 35-man roster nonetheless.
- · Looking at the 28-man travel roster for the season-opening weekend, 12 true freshmen and 14 newcomers are expected to make the trip to Florida with Purdue. Only 11 players will that suited up for the Boilers at the 2012 Big East/Big Ten Challenge will be on the trip this season.

2012 BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a programrecord 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional at U.S. Steel Yard in Northwest Indiana and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion.
- The Boilermakers began the season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April BIG TEN TEAMS TO HOST NCAA REGIONAL 1, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909. In its 16 games at Lambert, the home of the program from 1965-2012, Purdue won three times in walkoff fashion and locked up the Big Ten title May 12 in front of a large group of program alumni.
- · Head coach Doug Schreiber was named the Big Ten
- Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012.
- By clinching the title on May 12 with a win in the 20th conference game of the season, the Boilers became the earliest team to clinch the title since the Big Ten schedule moved from 32 to 24 games in 2009. As the No. 1 seed at the Big Ten Tournament, Purdue won three consecutive games to win the six-team event for the first time. The Boilermakers made their fifth straight tournament appearance, the longest active streak in the league as well as the longest in program history. Dating back to 2008, Purdue is 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represent the best marks in the league.
- · Purdue became the fifth Big Ten school (excluding Nebraska) to host an NCAA Regional and the first since Michigan in 2008. Of the 16 Regional hosts in 2012, the Boilers were the only one that did not have the advantage of playing at its home ballpark. But playing away from campus was nothing new for Purdue. The Boilermakers posted 32 of their wins away from Lambert Field, ranking second in the nation in true road wins. Purdue's .763 winning percentage ranked fourth nationally
- The Boilermakers enjoyed six undefeated weekends and went 9-0 in midweek action, extending their midweek win streak to 17 dating back to March 2011. Purdue won the opening game of each of its eight Big Ten series and was pushed to a rubber game only twice. The Boilers had a losing record in only three of their 16 weekends.

TALBOTT LOOKING TO CLOSE CAREER AS THREE-YEAR STARTING OUTFIELDER

- A constant in left field and in the nine hole the last two years, **Stephen Talbott** enters his senior season as the Boilers' projected leadoff man and center fielder. The New Jersey native has batted over .300 in each of his first three years at Purdue and enters 2013 with a .322 career average. He's also 37-of-42 in career stolen base attempts. Talbott began his career a perfect 30-of-30 stealing bases before finally being thrown out for the first time in April 2012 at Northwestern.
- Talbott was named a Third Team All-Big Ten outfielder in 2011 after batting .301 with 13 doubles, a .392 on-base percentage and 17 stolen bases. He led the Big Ten in runs that season despite batting ninth in 36 of his 55 starts. He batted .347 with a team-high 12 sacrifice bunts in 2012.

CIANFROCCO LOOKS TO FINISH CAREER ON HIGH NOTE

- One of Purdue's most snake bitten players the last few seasons, senior **Angelo Cianfrocco** has seen action as a first baseman, corner outfielder, designated hitter and relief pitcher during his Purdue career. He has started 98 of the 116 games in which he has played, making a career-high 42 starts in 2012. In 2011, Cianfrocco was among the Boilers hottest hitters early in the 2011 season when he suffered a shoulder injury on the opening weekend of the spring break trip that sidelined him for a month and kept in a designated hitter role until May. Last season his .235 batting average was adversely affected by an unusually low .254 batting average on balls in play. He did finish the season having hit safely in each of the final four games in which he batted, including a two-hit showing in the NCAA Regional loss to Kent State.
- · Cianfrocco had offseason foot surgery and is questionable for the season-opening weekend. He is the son of Purdue alumnus and MLB veteran Archi Cianfrocco.

McHUGH MAKES THE MOVE TO THIRD BASE

- Junior Sean McHugh was a part-time start on the 2012 Big Ten Championship, maximizing his opportunities by batting .317 with 10 extra-base hits, 24 RBI and a.549 slugging percentage. He was Purdue's regular catcher in midweek action and made five starts at designated hitter in the final three weeks of the season, including two of the NCAA Regional games. After playing for the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox in the Cape Cod League in the summer of 2012, he is projected to move to third base and bat third in the lineup for Purdue this season.
- McHugh played a starring role in two of the Boilers' most dramatic moments of 2012. In the 10-run ninth inning rally in the comeback win in the finale of the UCLA series, he ignited the rally with a leadoff walk and later knocked in the go-ahead run with the third of Purdue's seven consecutive two-out hits. He did all that despite having not played the entire weekend until the eighth inning of Sunday's game. Nine days later in the final game in the history of Lambert Field, McHugh connected for the game-tying, pinch-hit home run with two outs in the ninth inning. Purdue went on to defeat Indiana State in 10 innings.

RAMER BACK FOR FIFTH YEAR AFTER EARNING DEGREE

- Fifth-year senior Robert Ramer is a big reason why Purdue has won 17 straight midweek games dating back to March 2011, serving as the starting pitcher in 10 of those games. But the Northern California native was also there when the Boilers needed him during the 2012 postseason, taking the ball in the Big Ten Tournament championship game victory against Indiana and also starting the NCAA Regional game against Kentucky. Purdue went 9-1 in Ramer's 10 starts in 2012 and are 17-2 when he has started during his career. His 13-1 career record represents a program record for career winning percentage.
- Ramer issued only two walks in 50 1/3 innings last season, establishing a Purdue single-season records (minimum 30 innings) for fewest walks per nine innings (0.358) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (15.0). He came up just shy of enough innings to qualify for the national leaders in both categories. He earned his bachelor's degree in management last year and is currently pursuing an MBA at Purdue. He'll have a chance to be a four-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree this year.

SCHREIBER & WOOD RETURN FROM INJURY

- Had they been healthy in 2012, it's possible **Brad Schreiber** and **Kyle Wood** could have been part of Purdue's weekend rotation. Both players redshirted after having Tommy John surgery. While they were out, the Purdue pitching staff still managed to post new school records for ERA (3.16), WHIP (1.21) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.18). So while Purdue lost its four All-Big Ten pitchers from last season, getting Schreiber and Wood back from injury gives the rotation a nice boost.
- Schreiber was Purdue's most consistent pitcher for the first half of the 2011 season, helping the Boilers win six of his eight starts. He was leading the Big Ten in strikeouts (50) when he suffered an arm injury in the April series at Penn State. Wood is projected to be the Boilers' top two-way player this season. He's scheduled to play outfield and first base as well as pitch and remain in the lineup on the days he starts on the mound. Wood batted .444 (8-for-18) in Purdue's five-game Gold and Black Series this past fall.

KRIEG & OLIVER FORM NEW DOUBLE PLAY DUO

- Brandon Krieg and Bennett Oliver were part of the travel roster every weekend of 2012 but there playing time was otherwise sparse on Purdue's veteran team. Now sophomores, the duo is projected to be the team's new double play duo at second base and shortstop, respectively. While they're opportunities were limited in 2012, Krieg was on the field for the final inning of the Big Ten Tournament championship game victory against Indiana and started the NCAA Regional win versus Valparaiso. Oliver made starts against quality opponents like Maryland, Michigan State (two) and UCLA.
- In the summer of 2012, Krieg and Oliver teamed with **Kyle Wood** to help Northwest Indiana Oilmen win the Midwest Collegiate League title. **Joe Eichmann** also played for Northwest Indiana but did not pitch in the second half of the season.

HUDNALL & PICCHIOTTI IMPRESSED IN FALL BALL

• Conner Hudnall and Jack Picchiotti are two of the newcomers expected to see significant playing time early this season. Both players impressed in the team's five-game Black and Gold Series this past fall. Hudnall batted .474 (9-for-19) with three RBI and Picchiotti batted .350 (7-for-20) with two RBI. Both players did not strikeout.

ALEXANDER FIELD


After closing out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion during the 2012 Big Ten championship season, Purdue baseball moved into its new Alexander Field stadium facilities in August 2012. The inaugural season at the new home of the Boilermakers will feature a 23-game schedule. The first game at Alexander Field is set for Tuesday, March 19, 2013. Ohio State will be the opponent for the first Big Ten series (March 22-24) and a formal dedication game is being planned for Saturday, April 20, 2013.

A Big Ten championship ring ceremony and dinner, during which the 2012 team was honored and receieved its championship rings, was held at the new stadium in the fall of 2012 after the completion of fall practice and the Gold and Black Series.



The \$21 million stadium, financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators. The new stadium was named Alexander Field in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. The Alexanders were the parents of Dave Alexander, who gave the lead gift for the project. Dave Alexander was Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991 and then an athletics administrator through 1994.
