# – BOILERS BEGIN CHALLENGING STRETCH WITH HOME SERIES VERSUS ILLINOIS –

No. 18 Purdue baseball begins a challenging four-weekend stretch by hosting Illinois for a three-game series at Lambert Field, welcoming the defending Big Ten regular-season and tournament champs to the old ballpark for a final time.

First pitch is slated for 4 p.m. Friday, 2 p.m. Saturday and 1 p.m. Sunday. Head coach **Doug Schreiber** enters the weekend with 405 career victories. Schreiber could tie or break Dave Alexander's Purdue all-time wins record at the same ballpark where he was a four-year starting second baseman for Alexander from 1983-86.

The Boilermakers (25-5, 7-2 Big Ten) enter the week with a two-game lead in the Big Ten standings despite playing two of their first three conference series on the road. However, the next three weekends could ultimately determine whether or not Purdue can finally break through and claim that elusive regular-season Big Ten title. The Boilermakers take on Illinois (18-13, 3-3 Big Ten), Nebraska (23-12), Michigan State (20-11) and UCLA (22-7) the next four weekends. Those four opponents enter the weekend with a combined 83-43 record.

Illinois and Michigan State shared the Big Ten regular-season title last year. Purdue was a combined 1-6 against the Fighting Illini and Spartans in 2011. Nebraska sports the second-best overall winning percentage in the Big Ten this season as well as an offense that closest resembles the Boilers' attack.

Illinois lost a number of key players from last year's team but remains a battle-tested squad. Dating back to an April 8-10, 2011, series against Iowa, the Fighting Illini have won six of their last eight Big Ten rubber games. In four of those six series wins, including last weekend against Indiana, Illinois came back to take the three-game set after losing the opener.

Purdue enters the weekend winners of five in a row and nine of its last 10. The Boilermakers went 4-1 during their first week at home, March 27-April 1, but batted just .222 as a team that week. In the five games away from Lambert Field since, the team batted .342. Meanwhile, the pitching remained strong, allowing Purdue to outscore the opposition, 39-8, in the five wins.

**Kevin Plawecki** enters the weekend having hit safely in eight straight games and reached base safely in 25 consecutive contests. The latter streak ranks as the longest current run on the team and the third-best streak among active players. The junior has connected for three of his 12 career home runs against the Illini, including homers in games two and three of the series at Lambert Field last year.

**Stephen Talbott's** big game against Illinois a season ago saw him throw out a runner at the plate and hit a solo home run, with the two plays coming only moments apart to end the top of the third and begin the bottom of the frame. **Lance Breedlove** backed up Morgan's quality start with 2 2/3 innings of scoreless relief, retiring eight of the first nine batters he faced.

**Cameron Perkins** has been Purdue's hottest hitter over the last six games. He sat out the April 4 game Anderson University, but has managed to hit safely and record an RBI in five straight, compiling an 11-for-21, nine-RBI showing at the plate during that stretch.

Meanwhile, dating back to the March 13 win at Missouri State, **Connor Podkul's** first collegiate start, **Joe Haase**, Breedlove and Podkul (the projected weekend rotation) have teamed up to compile a combined 2.29 ERA over 78 1/3 innings. Haase and Breedlove have both won each of their first three Big Ten starts.

Illinois' projected starters for games one and two, Kevin Johnson and John Kravetz, are both products of Mount Carmel High School on Chicago's South Side. Purdue has faced Johnson each of the last two seasons. The right-hander pitched a complete-game shutout against the Boilers in Champaign as a freshman and put together another quality start (7 IP, 8 H, 2 ER) at Lambert Field last year. Reliever Matt Milroy shared Big Ten co-Pitcher of the Week honors with Haase this week after striking out 10 of the 21 batters he faced in five innings of scoreless relief in last weekend's rubber game win against Indiana.

# HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 14th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 380-348 overall record and a 190-178 Big Ten mark through his first 13 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber will make a run at Alexander's all-time wins record (407) this season and is on pace to break the games coached benchmark in 2013.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's single season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first, and reached the Big Ten Tournament for the fourth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons. The four straight tourney appearances represent the longest active streak in the league as well as a program high. The program's 58 Big Ten wins over the last four years are also the most in the league.

Purdue led the Big Ten in numerous statistical categories in 2011, highlighted by runs scored, doubles, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, sacrifice flies, saves and strikeouts. The Boilermakers drew the most walks at the plate and issued the fewest number of free passes on the mound.

Six Boilers were recognized as all-conference performers, matching the second-highest total in program history. Kevin Plawecki and Barrett Serrato were named First Team, Tyler Spillner and Nick Wittgren Second Team and Cameron Perkins and Stephen Talbott Third Team. With Serrato, Spillner and Talbott all honored as outfielders, it marked the first time 1991 that three Purdue outfielders were named all-conference in the same season.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher. He led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 54 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 18 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last seven years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

# PURDUE CONTINUES BIG TEN PLAY WITH HOME SERIES AGAINST ILLINOIS

- The Boilermakers enter the weekend having won five straight and nine of their last 10. Purdue's .828 winning percentage (24-5 record) entering the week ranked third nationally.
- The Boilermakers have a two-game lead in the Big Ten standings despite playing two of their first three conference series on the road. However, the next three weekends could ultimately determine whether or not Purdue can finally break through and claim that elusive regular-season Big Ten title. The Boilermakers take on Illinois (18-13), Nebraska (23-12), Michigan State (20-11) and UCLA (22-7) the next four weekends. Those four opponents enter the weekend with a combined 83-43 record.
- Behind a quality start from **Connor Podkul** and a four-run fourth inning, Purdue finished off a series sweep of Northwestern Sunday. The Boilers had lost the finale of their first two conference series after taking the first two games. Purdue posted its fourth undefeated weekend of the season and second true series sweep.
- It was the Boilers' first Big Ten sweep on the road since 2001 when they swept back-to-back road series at Northwestern and Michigan State during a 13-game win streak.
- Illinois was the only visiting team to win a series at Lambert Field last year. Two of Purdue's four home losses at Lambert Field in 2011 were at the hands of the Illini.

# BOILERS' BATS FIFTH IN THE NATION IN TEAM BATTING AVERAGE ENTERING THE WEEK

- Fueled in part by the .437 average Purdue posted in the Murray State sweep (March 9-11), the Boilers entered the week ranked fifth in the nation with a .325 team batting average. Purdue was also 15th in scoring (7.3 runs per game) and 26th in slugging percentage. The Boilermakers continue to lead the Big Ten but saw their team batting average drop from .349 to .326 after batting only .222 as a team during their home-opening five-game homestand (March 27-April 1).
- The pitching and defense have been performing well, too. The Boilermakers were 10th nationally in double plays turned per game and ranked 16th in total twin killings. Purdue has now turned 35 double plays, registering a combined five in the midweek wins against Louisville and IPFW (March 27 and 28). The pitching staff, meanwhile, is averaging only 2.41 walks per game, a total which ranks as the 11th best in the country.

# PITCHING PROPELS PURDUE TO SERIES SWEEP AT NORTHWESTERN

- Starting pitchers **Joe Haase**, **Lance Breedlove** and **Connor Podkul** teamed up for 22 innings of four-run ball, leading the Boilers to a series sweep at Northwestern (April 6-8). It was Purdue's first Big Ten sweep on the road since 2001. The Boilermakers only trailed once all series, going down 1-0 after the first inning of game three. Purdue quickly tied the game in top of the second.
- Haase pitched a two-hit shutout in the series opener, winning his fourth straight start and helping the Boilers remain unbeaten (8-0) when he has started this year.
- Breedlove moved to 3-0 in Big Ten play with seven innings of one-run ball in game two. He has surrendered one run or fewer in each of his first three starts. The lone run he allowed in his wins against Ohio State and Northwestern were scored in his final inning of the day.
- Podkul earned his first collegiate win with six innings of three-run ball. The freshman struck out a season-high six in his longest outing of the year. He became the first Purdue freshman to start a Big Ten game since Kyle Cook in 2008.
- **Cameron Perkins** led the way at the plate, hitting safely and driving in a run in all three games. He finished the series 8-for-14 with five RBIs.

# BOILERS EXPLODE FOR 12-RUN INNING IN MIDWEEK WIN AT BALL STATE

- Purdue scored a season-high 12 times on 11 hits, sending 17 men to the plate, in the sixth inning of the April 11 win at Ball State. It was the Boilers' biggest inning since also scoring 12 times in a March 2008 home win against Western Illinois.
- **Angelo Cianfrocco** and **David Miller** both connected for two-run homers in their second at-bats of the sixth inning. It marked the 15th time this season that the Boilers have scored four or more runs in an inning. Thirteen of those extended rallies have come from the sixth through ninth innings. Meanwhile, Purdue has now posted 12-, nine-, eight- and seven-run rallies in the sixth inning this season.
- Every batter in Purdue's original starting lineup had a hit in the sixth inning. Cianfrocco and **Stephen Talbott** both recorded a pair of hits, Cianfrocco racking up six total bases, and scored twice in the frame.
- The Boilermakers posted their 12th straight victory in true midweek action dating back to March 2011.

# HAASE'S GARNERS PITCHER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR TWO-HIT SHUTOUT

- A two-hit shutout in the April 6 series-opening win at Northwestern earned **Joe Haase** Big Ten co-Pitcher of the Week honors, making him the fifth Boiler honored by the conference office this season. He was also named to the College Baseball Hall of Fame's weekly National All-Star Lineup.
- The senior did not give up hit after the fourth inning, needing only 99 pitches to finish his second career complete-game shutout. He retired 27 of the 30 batters he faced, including eight in a row twice. The right-hander recorded six 1-2-3 innings.
- Haase was honored by the conference office for the second time in his career. Last year, he was recognized after shutting out Minnesota at Target Field during the conference-opening weekend.
- **Lance Breedlove** had been selected as the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week each of the last two weeks. This marks the first time since the Big Ten's weekly awards program began in 1990 that Purdue has had the Pitcher of the Week in three consecutive weeks. **Brad Schreiber** and Haase won back-to-back Pitcher of the Week awards last season.

### BIG TEN LEADING BOILERS

- While the offense has generated the majority of the headlines early this season, the Purdue pitching and defense has also carried its fair share of the load to help Purdue earn its national ranking. Entering the weekend, the pitching staff has issued the fewest walks (72) and surrendered the fewest hits (252), extra-base hits (50) and earned runs (94) in the Big Ten. The Boilermakers 31 double plays turned, including 25 of the ground ball variety induced by the pitchers, are second in the league.
- While leading the league in team batting average, Purdue is second to Nebraska in many other offensive categories. The Huskers have played five more games than the Boilers entering the weekend. Purdue has struck out the fewest number of times in the league (149).
- Individually, **Kevin Plawecki** enters the weekend leading the conference with 15 doubles and a .623 slugging percentage. He was seventh nationally in doubles per game entering the week. **Stephen Talbott** is No. 1 in the league with five triples. **Lance Breedlove**, **Joe Haase** **Blake Mascarello's** share the league lead in wins as three of the nine pitchers with five victories..

### ANTONELLI DELIVERS BIG HIT AS SCHREIBER WINS 400TH & PURDUE REACHES 20 WINS BEFORE APRIL 1

- **Chris Antonelli** delivered the go-ahead single in the seventh inning of a scoreless game and help lead Purdue to a 2-0 win against Penn State March 31. The win was the Boilers' 20th of the season. The team reached the benchmark before April 1 for the first time in program history. Purdue closed the month of March with a 15-3 record.
- Head coach **Doug Schreiber** also his 400th career game March 31. He has now recorded his 100th, 250th, 300th and 400th career wins against Penn State. He received a Gatorade shower from his players during the postgame huddle in left field. The next landmark for the 14th-year head coach is Dave Alexander's all-time wins record (407) at Purdue.
- Antonelli made his first start of the season in the landmark win and after a lengthy at-bat, hit a ground ball through the right side to score **Kevin Plawecki** from third base with two outs in the seventh inning. Plawecki singled to open the frame, breaking up the no-hit bid by Penn State left-hander Joe Kurasch.

### BREEDLOVE THE FIRST BOILER TO WIN PITCHER OF THE WEEK THREE TIMES IN ONE YEAR

- Lance Breedlove's complete-game shutout of Penn State in his season debut at Lambert Field (March 31) earned the senior his third Big Ten Pitcher of the Week award of 2012, making the first Boiler in program history to be honored this times in one season.
- Breedlove retired the first 19 batters of the game in order. Both pitchers carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning, as PSU's Joe Kurasch matched Breedlove for much of the day. But Purdue scored twice with two outs in the seventh and went on to win the game, 2-0.
- Breedlove has won Big Ten Pitcher of the Week in back-to-back wins, working complete-game victories against Ohio State and Penn State. He was the first Boiler to pitch consecutive complete games since Matt Bischoff in April 2009 (also against PSU and OSU).
- Matt Morgan (2007-11) and Bischoff (2007-10) were both three-time Big Ten Pitcher of the Week winners during their careers, but they accumulated those awards over two seasons. Breedlove joins former outfielder Daniel Underwood (2000-03) as the only Purdue players to be recognized by the conference office three times in the same season since the weekly awards program began in 1990. Underwood was a three-time Big Ten Player of the Week in 2003. At the time, Underwood was the first Big Ten baseball player to accomplish the feat.
- Former Ohio State pitcher Alex Wimmers was the last pitcher to be the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week at least three times in the same season. He was honored four times in 2009.
- Breedlove needed only 101 pitches to finish his two-hit shutout of Penn State. It was his fourth start of the season without a walk. He worked seven 1-2-3 innings and retired 27 of the 29 batters he faced, pitching the first complete-game shutout by a Boiler since **Joe Haase** blanked Minnesota on April 2, 2011, at Target Field.

## BIG SCORING EDGE LATE IN GAMES

- Purdue has feasted on relief pitching for much of the season, best demonstrated by a 137-48 scoring edge from the sixth inning through the end of the game. The Boilermakers have scored 55 runs in the sixth inning, their highest total in any inning. In fact, the run totals in the sixth, seventh (34), eighth (27) and ninth (20) innings rank as four of the team's top five most productive innings. Coincidentally, Purdue has only scored 13 runs in the fifth inning.
- The Boilermakers have scored four more runs in an inning 15 times this year. Thirteen of those 15 occurrences have come in the sixth inning or later. Purdue has registered extended sixth-inning rallies featuring run totals of 12 (April 11 at Ball State), nine (Feb. 19 vs. UND), eight (March 10 at Murray), seven (Feb. 26 vs. WCU and March 3 vs. USM) and five (March 15 at WSU).
- On multiple occasions this season, Purdue has been able to score runs against an opposing reliever that entered the day having not surrendered an earned on the year. Wichita's Foster Vielock (3 H, 3 ER), Murray's Will Handlin (7 H, 5 ER), Southern Miss' Cameron Giannini (3 H, 4 ER), and Auburn's Dillon Ortman (H, ER) and Cory Luckie (2 H, 2 ER) all failed to hold down the Purdue offense in close games that the Boilers went on to win.
- In the March 27 walk-off win against Louisville, Purdue scored the game-winning run against the Cardinals' closer, Derek Self. He had surrendered only two earned runs in his first 10 appearances of the season entering the day.

## BOILERS NOW OFFICIALLY RANKED IN ALL FOUR NATIONAL POLLS

- After debuting at No. 24 in the March 19 USA Today/ESPN Top 25 coaches' poll, Purdue is now nationally ranked in all four major national polls at the same time for the first time in program history.
- Among the Collegiate Baseball Top 30 for the sixth week in a row, the Boilers stayed at No. 22 this week. Purdue remained ranked in the Baseball America Top 25 and National Collegiate Baseball Writers of Association Top 30 polls for the fifth week in a row. The Boilermakers remained No. 19 in Baseball America's poll and moved up to No. 18 in the NCBWA & USA Today rankings.
- The program has earned its first in-season national ranking since February 2001 (Baseball America). The Boilermakers were also nationally ranked in the 2002 NCBWA preseason poll.
- The Boilermakers have been ranked among the Top 30 of Perfect Game USA's national Top 50 all season, staying at No. 15 this week.

## ANOTHER LONG ON-BASE STREAK ENDS FOR PERKINS

- In Big Ten play, **Cameron Perkins** had reached base safely in 46 consecutive contests dating back to 2010 until Penn State finally get him off the base paths in the March 31 pitcher's duel. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he had managed to find his way on base in 53 straight games against conference opponents. He compiled an on-base percentage of .419 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 101 times (76 hits, nine walks, 16 hit by pitch).
- After getting robbed of a potential base hit up the middle on a nice play by the Maryland pitcher on Feb. 25 in what proved to be Perkins' final at-bat of the game, the junior's remarkable streak of reaching base safely in 67 consecutive games was snapped. The streak dated back to 2010. Perkins reached base safely at least one in every game he played as a sophomore.

- Perkins reached base safely 133 times during his streak. He collected 98 hits, 12 walks and was hit by a pitch 23 times, good for an on-base percentage of .421.

## TALBOTT PLAYS THE HERO IN HOME-OPENING WALK-OFF WIN

- Stephen Talbott's** walk-off single in the 10th inning punctuated the Boilers' home-opening with an exclamation point. Purdue defeated No. 15 Louisville, 2-1, March 27 in a game that featured two of the nation's top offenses but turned into a pitcher's duel.
- Talbott singled home **Angelo Cianfrocco**, who doubled to open the 10th inning, to join **Sean McHugh** and **Cameron Perkins** as active Boilers with a walk-off hit on their collegiate résumés. McHugh played the hero in Purdue's last extra-inning game, a 12-inning victory against Indiana at Lambert Field on April 29, 2011.
- Starting pitcher **Connor Podkul** did not give up a hit over six innings of one-run ball in his Lambert Field debut. Despite a low pitch count of 59 for Podkul, lefty **Blake Mascarello** took over on the mound to begin the seventh. The Cardinals had three left-handed hitters due up. Mascarello worked four innings of scoreless relief to earn his team-leading fifth win. Head coach **Doug Schreiber** said Podkul is also continuing to build up his pitch count after a heavy work load in the spring and summer of 2011.

## RAMER FANS CAREER-HIGH NINE TO LEAD PURDUE TO MIDWEEK WIN

- Robert Ramer** struck out a career-high nine over eight innings of one-run ball, keeping his team in the game on another slow day for the offense in Purdue's 6-1 win against IPFW March 28.
- Ramer worked four 1-2-3 innings, retiring the final nine batters he faced in order. He recorded five strikeouts his first time through the IPFW lineup and two more in the eighth inning. It was the longest outing of his career.
- Ramer now sports a career record of 10-0. Among the active Boilers with multiple decisions, he remains the program's only undefeated pitcher. Purdue is now 12-1 in games he has started during his career.
- The Boilermakers trailed 1-0 entering the bottom of the seventh but scored three times in the seventh and eighth innings to surge in front. **Cameron Perkins** tied the game with a solo home run to lead off the bottom of the seventh, his team-leading fourth long ball of the season and 20th career.

## TWO-OUT RBI TITANS

- Barrett Serrato** (24 RBIs, 17 with two outs), **Sean McHugh** (14, 10), **David Miller** (14, 10), **Andrew Dixon** (6, 4) and **Stephen Talbott** (14, 7) have supplied the majority of their run production in clutch situations this season. All four players enter the weekend having recorded at least half their RBIs with two outs in an inning. Serrato has led the way, collecting 17 of his 24 RBIs with two outs. On two occasions this year, the opposition (East Carolina and Wichita State) intentionally walked **Kevin Plawecki** with two outs and a runner in scoring position to setup a lefty-lefty matchup with Serrato. He delivered a run-scoring single each time.
- McHugh and Serrato have both connected for three-run homers with two outs in an inning this season. McHugh hit his three-run on the first pitch thrown by new WSU reliever Tobin Mateychick in the sixth inning of game two of the series. Serrato's three-run homer capped the seven-run rally in the comeback win against Southern Miss.



- Senior left-hander **Blake Mascarello** has been Purdue's most consistent pitcher over the first seven weeks of the season, earning the win in five of his 15 relief appearances. He was the winning pitcher against Connecticut, Auburn, Murray State (game one), Missouri State and Louisville. He also closed out the series opener at Ohio State for a save. Mascarello has surrendered a run in five of his 15 appearances and helped the Boilers maintain a lead or kept the game tied in all but one game (game four at Wichita State) in which he has taken the mound with Purdue leading.
- While the lefty has been consistently excellent, his work in the Connecticut and Murray State wins stand out. He retired 12 of the 14 batters he faced over four scoreless innings in the season opener against UConn. In the series opener against Murray State, he retired 13 of the 14 batters he faced. In both instances he closed out the victory.

- Purdue's 10-game win streak was snapped in a doubleheader sweep at the hands of Wichita State March 17 on the final day of the spring break trip. The Boilermakers lost more games on St. Patrick's Day than they had in the first month of the season (one). Purdue had not dropped both games of a doubleheader since May 2010 at Iowa. The 10-game win streak was the program's longest since the 2001 team won 13 in row.
- At 14-1 before the St. Patrick's Day sweep, the Boilers posted the best one-loss start in program history. Previously, the 1959 team had gone 13-1 before suffering its second loss of the year.
- Purdue has posted its 18 wins against 15 team different teams. The Boilermakers played each of their first 10 games of the season against 10 different opponents.
- While the offense grabbed headlines after scoring 40 runs while batting .437 in the series sweep of Murray State (March 9-11), the pitching and defense also performed well in Purdue's first road sweep since taking all three games of a series at Lipscomb the first weekend of March last season. The Boilermakers only surrendered five runs in the series, with Murray State scoring only one run after the first inning. Defensively, Purdue did not commit an error in the series while turning six double plays.

- **Connor Podkul** did not give up a hit until the fifth inning in his first collegiate start and **Blake Mascarello** and **Nick Wittgren** backed him up with 4 2/3 innings of one-run relief, as solid pitching led Purdue to a 4-2 win at Missouri State March 13.
- Wittgren recorded his 16th career save by retiring six of the eight batters he faced over two innings of hitless relief. The junior officially eclipsed the program's all-time saves record. He entered the night in a three-way tie with former closers Scott Dubach (1985-87) and Andy Helmer (1997-00).
- Wittgren recorded his 16 saves in his first 35 relief appearances. He has converted 16 of his 19 save opportunities since becoming the closer early in the 2011 season. Seven of his 16 career saves have come in appearances longer than one inning.
- Wittgren is the first Boiler to establish a new individual program record since Matt Bischoff recorded his 258th career strikeout to break the all-time record in an April 2010 home win against Northwestern.

- **Jack DeAno** worked three innings of hitless relief in his Purdue debut, earning the win in the comeback victory against Southern Miss March 3. He retired nine of the 11 batters he faced, highlighted by a 1-2-3 ninth inning. Southern Miss, which had scored 32 runs in its last two games entering the day, racked up nine runs on 13 hits through the first six innings.
- DeAno sat out the 2011 season as a transfer from Vanderbilt. He had not pitched since high school and was listed as an outfielder on the roster his first year with the program. While he could still see action as a defensive replacement or pinch runner, he is now expected to remain a full-time member of the bullpen.

- Purdue pounded out a school-record 30 hits and scored eight runs in an inning twice, reaching the 20-run plateau for the first time since March 2008 in a 22-1 win at Murray State March 10. The Boilermakers sent 12 men to the plate in the eight-run sixth inning that blew the game open and later scored eight times with two outs in the top of the ninth.
- The previous program record for hits was 26, accomplished twice, most recently in a 2006 win at Indiana (25-8). That game also marked the last time Purdue scored 20-plus runs in a road game.
- The Boilers also turned four double plays in a game (March 10) for the third time this year, highlighted by a 2-5-4 twin killing on a MSU sac bunt attempt with two aboard and no outs in the second inning.

- **Stephen Talbott** recorded multiple hits and scored a run in all three games of the series sweep at Murray State (March 9-11), hitting for the cycle over the course of the weekend, and the No. 9 hitter was recognized as the Big Ten Conference Player of the Week for his efforts. Talbott finished the weekend 10-for-17 with four extra-base hits, five RBIs and five runs scored. The outfielder collected four hits in the wins Saturday and Sunday, his first collegiate four-hit efforts.
- Thanks to a two-run double and a home run, Talbott also matched his career high with four RBIs in the series finale. The two-run double came with two outs in the second inning and tied the game. He went deep to left field in the sixth inning to extend the Boilers' one-run lead entering the frame.
- Talbott also recorded two hits in Purdue eight-run sixth inning in the middle game of the series.
- For the second year in a row, the Boilers had at least one player honored as the Big Ten Player or Pitcher of the Week after each of the first four weekends of the season.
- Talbott finished the spring break trip a team-best 16-for-34 (.471) with six extra-base hits and eight RBIs.

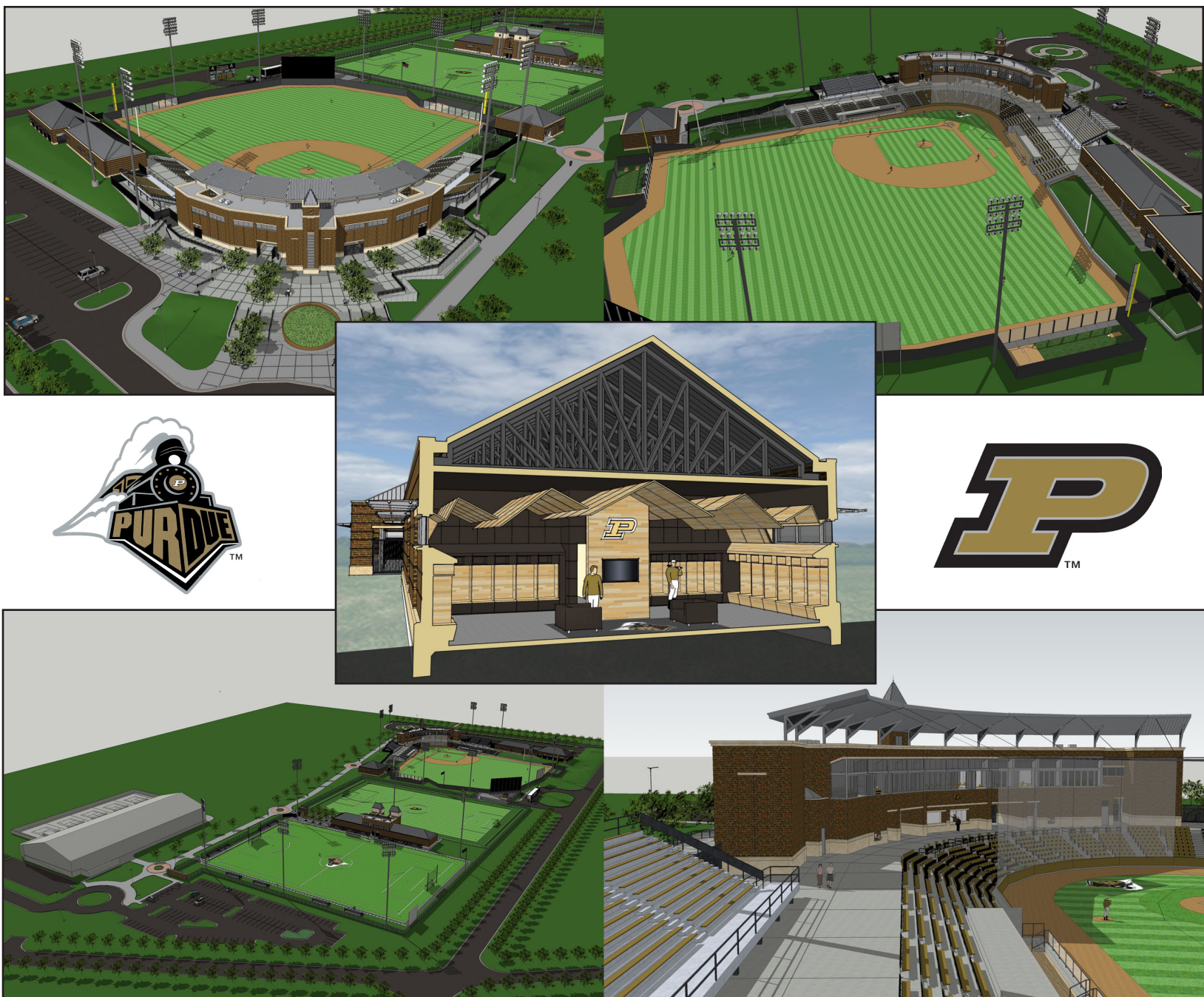

**Coming Soon: Alexander Field  
at the Northwest Athletics Complex  
Construction Began in Spring of 2011  
Stadium to be located near the intersection of  
McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus**

Alexander Field will soon be the new home of the Boilermakers. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. The new stadium will be named Alexander Field in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. The Alexanders were the parents of Dave Alexander, who is giving the lead gift for the project. David Alexander was Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991 and then an athletics administrator through 1994. All three Alexanders graduated from Purdue, and Dave played on Purdue's baseball team. John Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1933, while Anna Margaret Ross Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1935. Both received honorary doctorates from Purdue in 1986.
