– PURDUE TO HOST ILLINOIS FOR FIRST OF BACK-TO-BACK HOME SERIES –

For the first of its back-to-back Big Ten series at home, Purdue baseball welcomes Illinois to campus for a three-game weekend set that will feature two teams tied for third place in the conference standings.

First pitch at Lambert Field is slated for 4 p.m. Friday, 2 p.m. Saturday and 3 p.m. Sunday. The series finale is scheduled to be televised live on the Big Ten Network.

The Boilermakers (31-16, 10-8 Big Ten) opened their season-long, eight-game homestand Wednesday with a win against Ball State. Purdue is set to play its final two weekend series of the season at home for the first time since 1998.

The Fighting Illini (20-24, 10-8 Big Ten) were idle this past week due to final exams on campus but have been playing well as of late, winning eight of their last 11 games. Illinois has won each of its last three series, highlighted by taking two of three at home against Michigan State (April 23-24) and Ohio State (May 6-8). The Illini also posted their first series victory on the road in Big Ten play the weekend of April 29-May 1 when they won two of three at Northwestern.

With Purdue and Illinois sporting the same conference records, the major difference in the teams' overall wins disparity has been midweek action. While the Boilers have won eight of their nine midweek games, the Illini have posted just a 1-6 record. Illinois has not won a road game outside of Big Ten play since March 20 (at Southern Illinois) and is 10-18 in all games played away from Champaign this year.

Purdue strives to bounce back after getting swept by league-leading Michigan State last weekend in East Lansing. The Boilermakers improved to 9-2 at home after Wednesday's win. Purdue has won two of three against the Illini each of the last two seasons and has won six of the last eight meetings dating back to 2008.

The friendly confines of Lambert Field have aided both the Boilers' lineup and pitching staff this season. But the pitching staff has drastically better numbers at home than the offense, which has demonstrated a higher level of consistency home and away. A Purdue starting pitcher has yet to suffer a loss at Lambert this spring. In particular, **Matt Morgan**, **Calvin Gunter** and **Joe Haase**, who are likely to start the three games, have teamed up to compile 45 strikeouts versus 14 walks and a 1.32 ERA in 47 2/3 innings pitched.

Illinois' starting rotation of Kevin Johnson, John Anderson and Corey Kimes has started 36 of the team's 44 games this year. Kimes has earned the win in the rubber game of each of the last two series, working seven innings in quality starts against Northwestern and Ohio State. Johnson and Anderson have regularly pitched deep into games, each working over 70 innings. But both right-handers struggled last weekend against Ohio State.

The Illini's bullpen quartet of Will Strack (3-1, 2.97 ERA), Chris Pack (4-1, 2 saves), Wes Braun (0.56 ERA, 5 saves) and Luke Joyce (2.08 ERA) has backed up the starters efficiently. Strack bailed out Johnson with four innings of scoreless relief in the series-opening win against Ohio State last weekend. Braun has recorded a win and three saves in his six Big Ten appearances. Joyce worked 4 2/3 innings of one-hit relief in the series win against Michigan State but has only pitched in two games since.

Cameron Perkins' consistency in the No. 3 hole of the lineup continues to highlight the Purdue offense. The sophomore has hit safely in each of the last eight games since his 20-game hitting streak was snapped in the nightcap of the April 23 doubleheader at Northwestern. He enters the weekend having reached base safely in 53 consecutive games and 36 consecutive Big Ten games dating back to last season. His 53-game streak is the third longest active run in the nation.

Meanwhile, **Eric Charles** is quietly having another quality season while hitting in front of Perkins in the lineup. The second baseman has hit safely in 15 of the last 16 games and is batting .405 during his current nine-game hit streak. Charles is the only Boiler that has started every game this year, all at second base.

Justin Parr (.486) and Pete Capetta (.415) have led the way offensively in Big Ten play for Illinois. Willie Argo (18), Josh Parr (13), Adam Davis (12) and Capetta (10) have teamed up to account for 53 of the Illini's 76 stolen bases. Casey McMurray will also run (9-for-9), but is more notable for being the most difficult batter to strike out in the Big Ten. The outfielder has fanned only six times in 168 at-bats. However, he is the only regular with more walks than strikeouts.

Purdue and Illinois are tied with Ohio State for third place in the Big Ten standings. Minnesota (11-7) has surged into second place after winning eight of its last nine conference games. Purdue does not play Ohio State and Illinois does not play Minnesota during the regular season. Both the Boilers and Illini close out their regular-season schedules at home next weekend; Purdue hosts Iowa and Illinois hosts Indiana.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 13th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 343-328 overall record and a 176-168 Big Ten mark through his first 12 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons, while Joe Sexson guided the Boilermakers for 527 games over 18 years.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher and newcomers Kevin Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Brad Schreiber were recognized for standout freshman seasons. Bischoff led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 48 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 16 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last six years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE CONTINUES HOMESTAND WITH SERIES AGAINST ILLINOIS

• Purdue bounced back from getting swept at Michigan by winning the opener of its season-long eight-game homestand Wednesday against Ball State. The Boilermakers scored four runs in each of the first three innings to open up an early 12-4 lead. **Cameron Perkins** hit his team-leading eighth home run of the season. Purdue turned three double plays after not turning a twin killing during the entire Michigan State series.

• The Boilermakers improved to 9-2 at home and 8-1 in midweek action this season with Wednesday's win. The current eight-game homestand represents the team's longest since playing nine consecutive home games from March 22-30, 2008. Purdue has not closed the regular season with back-to-back series at home since 1998.

• The Boilermakers left 32 on runners on base over the course of the three games at Michigan State, including 13 in the series opener. Purdue led game one 3-0 but MSU scored four times in both the fifth and sixth inning to take the lead for good. The Spartans were 15-for-36 (.417) with two outs while the Boilers were only 6-for-29 (.207). Michigan State scored all five of its runs in game two of the series with two outs in an inning.

• The series ended in thrilling fashion. **Kevin Plawecki** was thrown out at the plate to end the game while trying to score the game-tying run on a two-out single by **Payton Bieker**. Plawecki doubled three times Sunday to become the first Purdue player with three two-baggers in a game since Nick Overmyer in 2009. Plawecki was ejected after arguing the call and had to sit out the Ball State game because it was a postgame ejection.

• The Boilermakers suffered their first sweep at the hands of MSU since 1993.

LEAGUE-LEADING BOILERS; HIT BY PITCH PILING UP

• Purdue enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in 13 notable statistical categories, including every significant offensive category. The Boilermakers are also among the Top 30 nationally in seven categories.

• Purdue leads the Big Ten in hit by pitch by a wide margin.

The Boilers have been hit by a pitch 89 times, averaging nearly two hit batsmen per contest. Purdue batters have been hit by a pitch nearly twice as often as second-place Illinois (50). Meanwhile, the Boiler pitchers have plunked only 35 opposing batters, the second fewest in the league.

• At least one Purdue batter has been hit by a pitch in 43 of the first 47 games, the lone exceptions being the middle game of the Tennessee-Martin (March 12) and Minnesota (April 2) series, opener of the Penn State series (April 15) and finale of the Northwestern series (April 24). The Boilermakers have been hit five times in a game on four occasions, winning three of the four games. The lone loss came in the home opener to Illinois State (March 22).

BIG TEN OFFENSIVE LEADERS: MILLER, PLaweCKI, Serrato & Talbott

• **David Miller**, **Kevin Plawecki**, **Barrett Serrato** and **Stephen Talbott** each enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in at least one statistical offensive category.

• Miller is tops in the league with a .491 on-base percentage and 35 walks, drawing 27 since the start of conference play on April 1.

• Talbott leads the Big Ten with 49 runs scored. He's one of five Boilermakers to rank among the Top 10. Talbott has scored a run in 32 of the 47 games this season, highlighted by a streak of eight consecutive games with at least one run scored from Feb. 26-March 8. He scored a team-high 14 times during his recent career-best 10-game hit streak (April 9-23).

• Plawecki (16), Perkins (15), Talbott (13), **Eric Charles** (10) and David Miller (10) rank one through six in hit by pitch.

• **Talbott's 10-GAME HIT STREAK: .378 (14-for-37), 2B, 3B, 4 RBI, 14 R, 2 BB, .465 OBP**

PURDUE REACHES 30-WIN MARK BY MAY 1

• Thanks in part to a 13-5 record in the month of April, Purdue successfully posted its 30th win of the season by May 1 for the sixth time in program history. The Boilermakers have compiled a 13-3 record since losing two-of-three at preseason favorite Minnesota during the conference-opening series at Target Field. Purdue has also posted consecutive 30-win seasons for the second time during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** 13-year tenure. It's the seventh time total the program has achieved the accomplishment.

• However, poor finishes have marred some of the Boilers' finest seasons. Of the 15 Purdue teams to win 30 games, only one (1982) was able to post a winning record after recording its 30th victory. The 1982 squad went 6-2 after recording its 30th win of the season on May 12 against Ball State.

PERKINS' REACHED SAFELY STREAK RANKS THIRD NATIONALLY

- His 20-game hitting streak may have been snapped April 23 at Northwestern, but **Cameron Perkins'** streak of reaching base safely remains alive and ranks among the best in the nation. Perkins have reached base safely in all 46 games he has played this year. Dating back to 2010, he has reached base safely in 53 consecutive games. That ranks as the third longest active streak in the country.
- Perkins has reached base safely 110 times during his streak, collecting 74 hits, nine walks and getting hit by a pitch 17 times. That's good for an on-base percentage of .430.
- In Big Ten play, Perkins has reached base safely in 36 consecutive contests dating back to last season. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he has managed to find his way on base in 40 straight games against conference opponents. He has compiled an on-base percentage of .451 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 83 times (66 hits, five walks, 12 hit by pitch).

SERRATO EXCELS IN UTILITY ROLE

- **Barrett Serrato** has started all but one game (the finale of the Tennessee Tech series) this season, starting at a team-high four different positions. The junior has seen action in right field (20 starts), shortstop (9), third base (8) and designated hitter. Remarkably, the most consecutive games he has started at the same position is the eight straight he started at third base from April 23-May 8. He was back in right field to begin the May 11 homestand opener against Ball State. In Big Ten play, Serrato has made eight starts at third, seven in right field and three as the DH.
- Serrato has also batted at least once in seven different spots in the lineup – third through eighth. He's been penciled in the No. 5 hole a team-high 27 times.
- Purdue has posted a 7-2 record in games Serrato has started at shortstop. The Boilermakers are 14-6 in games he has started in right field.

McHUGH PLAYS THE HERO IN 12TH-INNING WALK-OFF WIN

- Purdue would not have been able to post its first series sweep of Indiana since 1997 without rallying for a walk-off win in the series opener. **Tyler Spillner** sent the game into extra innings with a two-out run-scoring single, plating **Andrew Dixon** after Dixon had led off the bottom of the ninth with a pinch-hit single.
- But it was freshman **Sean McHugh** that was mobbed by his teammates as the Boilers celebrated a 12th-inning walk-off victory. McHugh was the fourth player to occupy the No. 9 spot in the lineup. He was sent to the plate as a pinch hitter in the 12th. After **Barrett Serrato** and **David Miller** stole third and second base, McHugh singled into left field on a full-count pitch, delivering the game-winning two-out RBI.
- The walk-off win was Purdue's first since defeating Minnesota in 10 innings of the 2010 Big Ten opener. **Cameron Perkins** also played the hero as a freshman that day. But McHugh became the first Purdue player to deliver a walk-off hit as a pinch hitter since John Cummins in April 2006.

WITTGREN NAMED TO STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- Currently leading the Big Ten with 10 saves, **Nick Wittgren** was one of 46 relievers to be selected for the NCBWA's Stopper of the Year midseason watch list. Wittgren was the only player from a Big Ten school on the updated list. The Stopper of the Year Award recognizes the nation top Division I relief pitcher.
- Eighteen of Wittgren's 22 relief appearances on the mound have seen him finish a game, a total that ranks third in the Big Ten. With 43 strikeouts in 42 1/3 innings pitched, he's averaging 9.15 strikeouts per nine innings. He has also compiled a .258 batting average against and issued just nine walks.
- Wittgren has posted five of his 10 saves in relief appearances longer than one inning. He closed out Big Ten series-opening wins against Michigan, Penn State and Northwestern and was the inning pitcher in the series opener against Indiana.
- Wittgren recorded a save in six consecutive appearances from April 6-23, closing out four straight Purdue wins in the process. He worked three scoreless innings, striking out a career-high six, to wrap up the series-opening shutout of Michigan. He retired 14 of the 16 batters he faced, giving up a single against Michigan and hitting a batter at Ball State, in his stretch of four saves in a week's time.

PURDUE SCORES FIRST EARLY AND OFTEN

• Purdue has scored first in 35 of its first 47 games this season (including the first 12 in a row) thanks in part to a 112-34 scoring edge in the first two innings of a game. The early offense has been the primary reason that the Boilers have failed to hold the lead at some point only eight times in their first 47 games: March 15 at No. 1 Vanderbilt, March 22 vs. Illinois State, games one and three of the Minnesota series (April 1-2), the middle games of the Penn State (April 17) and Northwestern (April 23) series and games two and three of the Michigan State (May 7-8) series.

• Because Purdue has scored first so often, the team has also trailed infrequently this year, especially in wins. For the season, the Boilers have held the lead for 238 of the 427 innings (56 percent) they've played. Purdue did not trail in the first seven games of its eight-game win streak (from Feb. 27-March 12), a streak of 61 consecutive innings.

• The Purdue pitching staff did not give up a run in the first inning until game No. 13 on March 12. The Boilermakers have batted first in 32 of the first 43 games.

TALBOTT STILL A PERFECT BASE THIEF

• Purdue has been active on the base paths for much of the season, successfully stealing at least one base in 35 of the first 47 games. Twelve Boilermakers have swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** leads the way at a perfect 16-for-16. The sophomore is also a perfect 21-for-21 in his career.

• Talbott enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 49 runs scored. He did not batter any higher than eighth in the lineup until getting a chance to leadoff in the finale of the Tennessee Tech series (March 20). But for the season he has batted no higher than seventh in 37 of the 46 games he has started.

• Talbott was the only Boiler that hit safely in all eight games of the spring break trip, finishing the road trip through Tennessee with a team-best .406 batting average. He finished a home run shy of the cycle in the March 12 win at Tennessee-Martin. He homered in the finale of the Indiana series.

PERKINS' HITTING STREAK SNAPPED AT 20

• **Cameron Perkins'** career-best 20-game hitting streak, the longest by a Purdue player since Brandon Haveman hit safely in the final 20 games of the 2009 season, was snapped in the middle game of the Northwestern series. Perkins has still managed to hit safely in 43 of the 46 games in which he has played this season and reached base safely in all 46. Dating back to last year, he has reached base safely in 53 consecutive games.

• Perkins' hitless showing in the middle game of the Northwestern series also snapped his 14-game hit streak against Big Ten competition dating back to last season's conference tournament.

• Perkins jumped out an 18-for-38 (.474) start in Big Ten play. He homered in the Big Ten series at Minnesota and Northwestern and feasted on Michigan pitching (7-for-11, 3 XBH, 5 RBI). The Michigan series highlighted a recent hot stretch in which he recorded multiple hits in five consecutive games (April 8-13), equaling out to a 12-for-21 showing.

• **PERKINS' 20-GAME STREAK: .395 (32-for-81), 10 XBH, 2 HR, 17 RBI, 16 R, .446 OBP, 6 SB**

SERRATO DELIVERS GAME-WINNING HIT IN THE NINTH, GOES DEEP AGAIN

• **Barrett Serrato** lifted Purdue to a comeback win at Ball State (April 12) with a two-out, two-run single in the ninth inning and the Boilers trailing by a run. He singled into left center on the first pitch he saw from the new BSU relief pitcher.

• Serrato also hit a solo home run in the opener of Big Ten series against Michigan and Penn State. His opposite-field blast at Penn State gave Purdue an early lead that it did not relinquish. The junior recorded a career-high four RBIs in the rubber game win at Penn State (April 17).

PLawecki ENJOYS BIG WEEK WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION

• **Kevin Plawecki** drove in some big runs to help lead Purdue to a 4-1 week and series win at Penn State (April 13-17). After recording only two RBIs over a stretch of eight games, the sophomore tied his career high with four RBIs in the April 13 win against IPFW and also knocked in four runs in the Penn State series.

• Plawecki drove in the go-ahead run in the eighth inning of the IPFW win, delivering a two-run single to highlight a four-run rally. In the middle game of the Penn State series, Plawecki plated the game-tying run in the seventh inning with a two-out single. He came back in the nightcap of the doubleheader and doubled home a pair to open the scoring in the six-run third inning, finishing the game with four hits.

INJURY UPDATES

- Purdue lost **Ryan Bridges** for the remainder of the season when he broke the fibula in his right leg on a play at first base in the April 10 series finale against Michigan. Bridges had started 24 of the first 31 games at first base, including 19 in a row. He landed awkwardly on his leg after colliding with the Michigan first baseman near the bag while trying to beat out a sacrifice bunt. The U-M player had jumped in the air to try to catch a wild throw and came down on top of Bridges.
- Pitcher **Brad Schreiber** has also missed three starts during Big Ten play. He has not pitched since leaving in the sixth inning of April 17 start at Penn State with arm stiffness, which turned out to be an elbow injury. If the sophomore right-hander is able to return this season he is expected to be used in a relief role. Schreiber was sidelined by strep throat in the conference-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2).
- The March 11 series-opening win at Tennessee-Martin also came at a steep price for Purdue. Starting pitcher **Matt Morgan** and **Angelo Cianfrocco** both left the game early with injuries and were sidelined for the rest of the month. Morgan struggled with his control due to a finger injury and Cianfrocco reinjured his right shoulder while hitting a foul ball.
- Morgan returned to the rotation for the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2) and has started the opening game of each of the first four conference weekends. Cianfrocco returned to the lineup for the Michigan series (April 8-10) but has been limited to a designated hitter role.

RECORD SEVEN PURDUE PLAYERS EARN BIG TEN WEEKLY HONORS

- **Cameron Perkins** (Player, April 11) and **Joe Haase** (Pitcher, April 4) were the latest Boilermakers to win their first career Big Ten weekly awards. Perkins was recognized after posting multiple hits in all three games of the Michigan series (April 8-10), finishing the weekend 7-for-11. Haase was honored for his complete-game shutout of Minnesota April 2 at Target Field. Purdue has had seven different weekly honorees, garnering at least one award following seven of the first eight weekends of the year.
- Since the Big Ten began recognizing Players and Pitchers of the Week in 1990, the seven different Boilermakers honored this year represents a new program high. Previously, Purdue had four honorees in 1997 and 2006. And with **Matt Morgan** winning Pitcher of the Week twice, the eight weekly honors are also a new team benchmark. The Boilermakers won five weekly awards in 2003 and 2006. **Brad Schreiber** has also been named Pitcher of the Week and teammates **Barrett Serrato**, **Angelo Cianfrocco** and **Tyler Spillner** have been honored as the league's top player over a seven-day stretch.

PLAWECKI AMONG THE BIG TEN'S TOUGHEST TO K

- **Kevin Plawecki** leads the team with a .366 batting average and has emerged as one of the toughest players to strikeout in the Big Ten. He has whiffed only nine times in 175 at-bats (212 plate appearances) to rank third in the Big Ten and 20th nationally in toughest to K entering the week. The sophomore has fanned just once every 19.4 at-bats (and once every 23.6 plate appearances). For his college career, he has gone down on strikes only 20 times in 379 at-bats (441 plate appearances).
- **PLAWECKI IN MARCH: .393 (24-for-61), 4 2B, 9 RBI, 13 R, 4 BB, 8 HBP, .479 OBP**

HAASE POSTS SCORELESS-INNINGS STREAK

- Thanks in part to a complete-game shutout in his first career Big Ten start, **Joe Haase** was able to record a consecutive scoreless-innings streak of 14 over four appearances. It was snapped when Michigan scored in the first inning of the April 10 series finale. But the Wolverines managed to score just the one run against the junior. Haase surrendered only two earned runs over a stretch of 26 1/3 innings pitched. He compiled a 0.68 ERA in his six appearances from March 20 through April 17.
- Before Michigan snapped the scoreless-innings streak, top-ranked Vanderbilt (March 15) had been the last team to score against Haase. But the Commodores didn't score while Haase was actually on the mound in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings (an inherited runner scored against the bullpen in the sixth). Thus, it was a streak of 17 consecutive innings since a team had scored while Haase was literally on the mound. His ERA has dropped from 4.79 to 2.86 during his scoreless-innings streak.
- Haase has pitched in 14 games this year, making 10 starts. Coincidentally, he's been on the mound in some of Purdue's biggest games of the year. His finest performance came on the big stage of Target Field in the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota, striking out a career-high seven in his first collegiate complete-game shutout. He scattered seven singles and did not give up a hit after the sixth inning.
- The junior pitched in relief in the wins against nationally-ranked Connecticut and Pittsburgh at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge. Haase led Purdue to another win against a nationally-ranked team when he beat Louisville with 8 2/3 innings of solid work in the March 8 midweek opener. He started the game against top-ranked Vanderbilt on the spring break trip, as well as the home opener against Illinois State and the middle game of the rivalry series with Indiana.

MORGAN & WITTGREN TEAM UP FOR SERIES-OPENING SHUTOUT OF MICHIGAN

- **Matt Morgan** and **Nick Wittgren** teamed up to strike out 14 batters in a combined shutout effort in the series-opening win against Michigan April 8. The Boilermakers won 8-0, posting their first shutout win against a Big Ten opponent at Lambert Field since 2008 (Northwestern) and their first shutout win over Michigan since 1993.
- Morgan struck out the side in the fourth inning and Wittgren did the same in the seventh. The pitchers teamed up to record at least one strikeout in every inning but the fifth. The season-high 14 strikeouts were the most for Purdue since also fanning 14 in a 2010 series-opening win against Penn State at Lambert Field.

HAASE'S SHUTOUT, PERKINS' HOMERS HIGHLIGHT SERIES AT TARGET FIELD

- **Joe Haase** worked his first career complete-game shutout and **Cameron Perkins** went deep twice to highlight Purdue's Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2), which was played at Target Field.
- Perkins hit both of his home runs to left field, connecting for a solo shot to lead off the seventh inning of game one and hitting a three-run shot in the third inning of game two. It marked the second time this season he has homered in back-to-back games. He finished the series 6-for-12 with five RBIs. **Stephen Talbott** was also a productive 6-for-11 with three RBIs and three runs scored while making some solid defensive plays in left field.
- Haase's complete-game effort in game two of the series lifted Purdue to its first shutout win against Minnesota since 1993 (in Minneapolis).

PLAWECKI NAMED TO JOHNNY BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST

- Sophomore catcher **Kevin Plawecki** has been named to the initial watch list for the Johnny Bench Award, which honors the nation's top Division I catcher. Forty-two catchers appeared on the initial watch list, which will be updated periodically until a list of semifinalists is unveiled May 19.
- Plawecki was a Freshman All-American in 2010 and is among the Big Ten's top prospects for the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He batted cleanup in each of the first 35 games he started and 38 of the 42 games he has played overall this season.

SEVEN RELIEVERS ALREADY WITH AT LEAST ONE SAVE

- The Purdue bullpen has continued to backup the starting pitchers with solid relief work. Seven pitchers have teamed up for Purdue's conference-leading 17 saves. **Nick Wittgren** has closed out 10 wins and pitched in relief a team-high 22 times. **Lance Breedlove**, **Calvin Gunter**, **Blake Mascarello**, **Pat Gannon**, **Sean Collins** and **Mike Sudbury** have also earned a save while recording the final out of a game.
- Wittgren's most impressive outing came in the Feb. 20 win against Pittsburgh. He slammed the door on a potential Pitt rally with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh inning. He entered the game with the Boilers clinging to a one-run lead in the seventh and struck out the No. 4 and 5 hitters in the Pitt lineup to leave the bases loaded. After a 1-2-3 eighth inning, the Panthers posted back-to-back two-out hits against the sophomore right-hander in the ninth. But he again retired the Pitt cleanup hitter to close out the victory.
- Mascarello backed up Breedlove with 3 2/3 scoreless innings of relief in game two of the Lipscomb series.
- Gannon struck out a career-high seven and pitched over four leadoff singles while closing out the March 18 series-opening win at Tennessee Tech.
- Collins struck out four of the seven batters he faced to earn a save in the April 13 win versus IPFW in downtown Fort Wayne.
- Seven different pitchers had at least one save last season as Purdue totaled 14 as a team, none having more than three saves.

SPILLNER SURGES THROUGH MARCH

- **Tyler Spillner** was Purdue's hottest hitter in the month of March, ending the month riding a career-best nine-game hitting streak (which he extended to 10 before it was snapped) and hitting safely in 13 of the final 14 games of the month total. He batted over .400 for the month even though he went 0-for-7 in the Lipscomb series the first weekend of March.
- The junior entered the month batting .276 and saw his average dip to .222 after the Lipscomb weekend. But the Purdue leadoff man batted .472 (25-for-53) over the final 13 games of March. He leads the team with 15 extra-base hits, recording 11 during his 10-game hit streak. He has also posted eight multi-hit efforts during his streak.

But the highlight of the day came in his first at-bat when he went deep to left field for his first collegiate hit. The two-run homer game Purdue a 3-0 lead in the second inning. McHugh also hit the first home run of the season (and so far only long ball) at Lambert Field, connecting for a solo blast to left field in the March 23 win against Wabash.

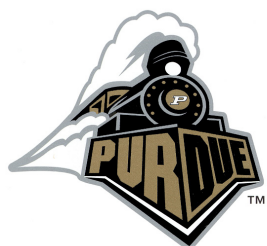
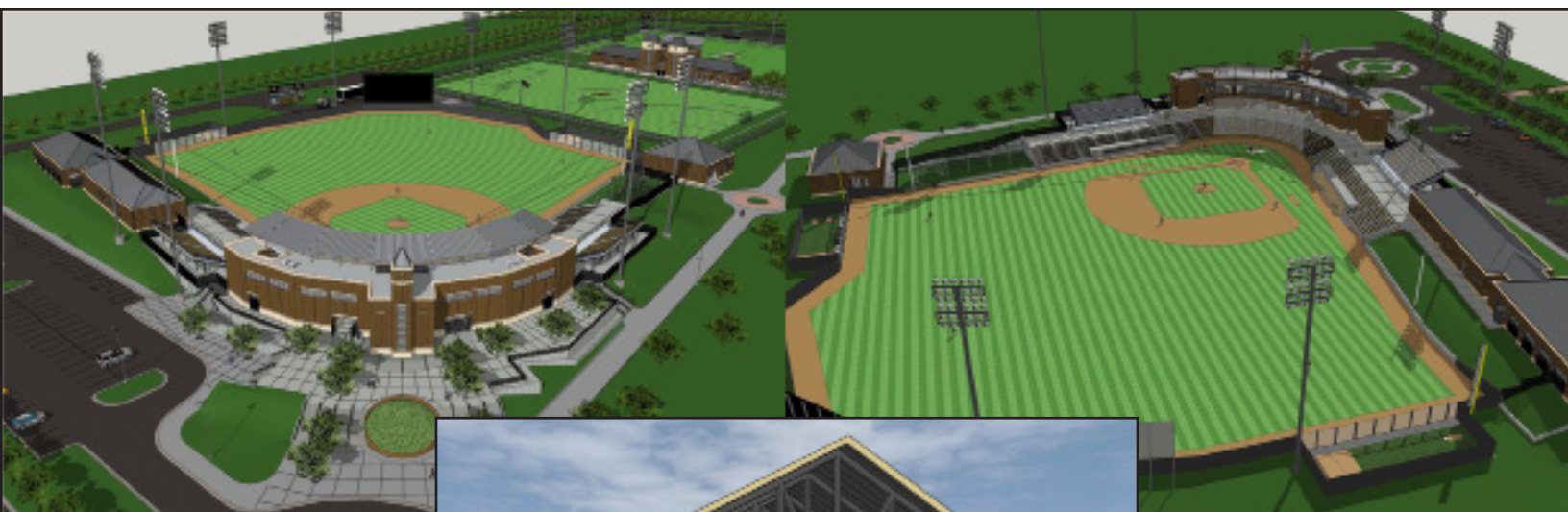

The New Northwest Baseball Facility
Construction to Begin Spring of 2011
Stadium to be located near the intersection of
McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus

The 2011 season will be Purdue's last at Lambert Field. The new northwest baseball facility is set to open for the 2012 home opener. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. Purdue will close out the season with an eight-game homestand from May 11-21, highlighted by Big Ten Conference series against Illinois and Iowa. The Boilermakers are expected to open their 2012 home schedule at Lambert and play their first game at their new ballpark in late March or early April.
