– BOILERS BEGIN HOME-HEAVY STRETCH RUN VERSUS RIVAL INDIANA –

Purdue baseball begins its home-heavy stretch run this weekend with a Big Ten series against rival Indiana, as the long-standing foes square off for the latest chapter in an all-time series that has featured 267 previous meetings.

First pitch at Lambert Field is set for 4 p.m. Friday, 2 p.m. Saturday and 1 p.m. Sunday. With the forecast calling for a high chance of rain Sunday, a doubleheader Saturday is likely.

Having played 267 times since 1888, Indiana (25-15, 6-6 Big Ten) and Purdue (27-13, 7-5 Big Ten) have squared more frequently on the baseball diamond than in any other sport.

The Boilermakers won three of the four meetings last season to improve to 25-23 against IU during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** 13-year tenure. By winning two-of-three in Bloomington last year, Purdue posted the first series victory by the road team since 2005 (when Purdue won three-of-four at IU).

However, last year's series was a wild weekend set that featured a combined 62 runs. Games two and three were both decided in extra innings after the Hoosiers extended the game by plating the game-tying run in the bottom of the ninth. Schreiber called it one of the most exhausting weekends of his coaching career.

The Boilermakers posted their third straight Big Ten series victory by winning two-of-three at Northwestern last weekend. Purdue is one of three teams above the .500 mark in conference play after the first half of the league schedule; the Boilers accomplished the feat while playing three of their first four series on the road.

Purdue took over a share of first place in the Big Ten standings thanks in part to Minnesota posting a series sweep of Indiana in Bloomington last weekend. Entering the series, Indiana had won two-of-three in each of its first three Big Ten series and had not dropped three straight games all season. But the losing skid was extended to four Tuesday with a midweek loss to Miami (Ohio).

The Hoosiers' veteran lineup can feature as many as seven left-handed hitters. Alex Dickerson leads the team in home runs (5) and RBIs (37) after winning Big Ten Player of the Year honors in 2010. Senior Jerrud Sabourin, who has started over 200 consecutive games, broke the IU all-time hits record April 17 at Iowa. Both Dickerson and Sabourin have walked more than they have struck out this year. Freshman Dustin DeMuth leads the way with a .376 average while batting leadoff.

Indiana ranks second in the Big Ten with a 3.66 team ERA and a .258 batting average against. Game one starter Blake Monar has averaged six innings in each of his 10 starts and leads the team with 49 strikeouts. Game two starter Chad Martin checks in at 6-foot-7 and has walked only 14 batters in 53 2/3 innings. Purdue is expected to face a freshman lefty in the series finale for the third weekend in a row. That starter, Joey DeNato, leads the rotation with five wins and a 2.86 ERA. He has accounted for nine of IU's Big Ten-leading 26 pickoffs.

This weekend's series will also feature two of the conference's top closers. The Hoosiers' Ryan Halstead, another freshman from Southern California, has recorded three wins and eight saves in his 15 appearances despite registering only 14 strikeouts in 23 innings.

in the four games against the Hoosiers in 2010. **Eric Charles** is a .370 career hitter against IU, driving in six runs against the in-state rival last year despite collecting only two hits.

The Boilermakers have scored 52 runs over their last five games. They have scored four more times in an inning 13 times over the last 13 games.

Purdue is 5-2 at Lambert Field but has not played at home since finale of the Michigan series on April 10. Beginning this weekend, the Boilers are scheduled to play 11 of their final 14 regular-season games at Lambert Field.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 13th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 343-328 overall record and a 176-168 Big Ten mark through his first 12 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons, while Joe Sexson guided the Boilermakers for 527 games over 18 years.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher and newcomers Kevin Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Brad Schreiber were recognized for standout freshman seasons. Bischoff led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 48 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 16 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last six years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE CLOSES ROAD STRETCH WITH SERIES WIN AT NORTHWESTERN

- Purdue won two-of-three at Northwestern last weekend to close its nine-game road stretch with a 7-2 record. The finale of the road stretch Tuesday at Valparaiso was rained out. The Boilermakers now begin their home-heavy stretch run, during which they are scheduled to play 11 of their final 14 regular-season games at Lambert Field.
- Purdue scored five times in the first inning of both the series opener and series finale at Northwestern. But the Boilers trailed 7-6 after the fourth inning of game one. **Blake Mascarello** worked five shutout innings of relief and **Tyler Spillner** delivered a two-run single in the seventh inning, leading the way during the comeback win.
- Purdue did not score until the ninth inning in game two of the series and got blown out, 14-1. It marked the first time an opponent had posted a double-figure run total since the March 16 loss at Belmont (13-6) on the spring break trip.
- The Boilermakers returned the favor in Sunday's rubber game, keeping Northwestern off the scoreboard until the eighth inning in a runaway win, 10-2. **Calvin Gunter** worked 5 2/3 shutout innings in a spot start. **Eric Charles** scored four times and **Kevin Plawecki** recorded four hits.
- Purdue has scored 52 runs over the last five games and scored four or more times in an inning 13 times in the last 13 games. The Boilermakers have won three straight Big Ten series and enter the weekend in a three-way tie for first despite playing three of the first four series on the road.

LEAGUE-LEADING BOILERS; HIT BY PITCH PILING UP

- Purdue enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in 16 notable statistical categories, including every significant offensive category. The Boilermakers are also among the Top 30 nationally in seven categories.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten in hit by pitch by a wide margin. The Boilers have been hit by a pitch 75 times, averaging nearly two hit batsmen per contest. Purdue batters have been hit by a pitch nearly twice as often as second-place Iowa (39). Meanwhile, the Boiler pitchers have plunked only 30 opposing batters, the second fewest in the league.
- At least one Purdue batter has been hit by a pitch in 36 of the first 40 games, the lone exceptions being the middle game of the Tennessee-Martin (March 12) and Minnesota (April 2) series, opener of the Penn State series (April 15) and finale of the Northwestern series (April 24). The Boilermakers have been hit five times in a game on four occasions, winning three of the four games. The lone loss came in the home opener to Illinois State (March 22).

- **David Miller, Cameron Perkins, Kevin Plawecki, Barrett Serrato** and **Stephen Talbott** each enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in at least one statistical category. Miller is tops in the league with a .486 on-base percentage and 30 walks, drawing 22 since the start of conference play on April 1.
- Talbott leads the Big Ten with 45 runs scored. He's one of five Boilermakers to rank among the Top 10. WITTGREN NAMED TO STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- Currently leading the Big Ten with nine saves, **Nick Wittgren** was one of 46 relievers to be selected for the NCBWA's Stopper of the Year midseason watch list. Wittgren was the only player from a Big Ten school on the updated list. The Stopper of the Year Award recognizes the nation top Division I relief pitcher.
- Fifteen of Wittgren's 19 appearances on the mound have seen him finish a game, another Big Ten-leading total. With 37 strikeouts in 36 innings pitched, he's averaging 9.25 strikeouts per nine innings. He has also compiled a .248 batting average against and issued just seven walks.
- Wittgren has posted four of his nine saves in relief appearances longer than one inning. He closed out Big Ten series-opening wins against Michigan, Penn State and Northwestern. And he recorded a save in six consecutive appearances from April 6-23, closing out four straight Purdue wins in the process. He worked three scoreless innings, striking out a career-high six, to wrap up the series-opening shutout of Michigan. He retired 14 of the 16 batters he faced, giving up a single against Michigan and hitting a batter at Ball State, in his stretch of four saves in a week's time.

MASCARELLO EXCELS IN RELIEF, ESPECIALLY IN BIG TEN PLAY

- **Blake Mascarello** has emerged as one of Purdue's most effective relievers this season, excelling in both long relief and as a setup man. He has worked more than two innings of relief six times this year, highlighted by a season-high five innings of shutout ball in the series-opening victory at Northwestern. For the season, he has allowed only three of 13 inherited base runners to score and induced a team-high five ground ball double plays.
- Mascarello performed exceptionally well in some tight spots in the Penn State series (April 15-17), retiring all five batters he faced with the bases loaded over two appearances. In the series-opening win, he took over on the mound with the bases loaded, no outs and Purdue clinging to a one-run lead. He struck out both batters he faced without either hitter even fouling off a pitch. **Nick Wittgren** finished off the inning and went on to close out the victory.
- Mascarello suffered the loss in game two of the series but helped keep the Boilers in the contest. He entered the game with Penn State leading 3-1 and the bases loaded in the bottom of the sixth. He induced an inning-ending 6-4-3 double play ball with the first pitch he threw. The following inning, the lefty tallied a strikeout and an inning-ending fielder's choice to leave the bases loaded again

PERKINS' HITTING STREAK SNAPPED AT 20

- **Cameron Perkins'** career-best 20-game hitting streak, the longest by a Purdue player since Brandon Haveman hit safely in the final 20 games of the 2009 season, was snapped in the middle game of the Northwestern series. Perkins has still managed to hit safely in 36 of the 39 games in which he has played this season and reached base safely in all 39. Dating back to last year, he has reached base safely in 46 consecutive games.
- Perkins' hitless showing in the middle game of the Northwestern series also snapped his 14-game hit streak against Big Ten competition dating back to last season's conference tournament.
- Perkins jumped out an 18-for-38 (.474) start in Big Ten play. He homered in the Big Ten series at Minnesota and Northwestern and feasted on Michigan pitching (7-for-11, 3 XBH, 5 RBI). The Michigan series highlighted a recent hot stretch in which he recorded multiple hits in five consecutive games (April 8-13), equaling out to a 12-for-21 showing.

PURDUE SCORES FIRST EARLY AND OFTEN

- Purdue has scored first in 31 of its first 40 games this season (including the first 12 in a row) thanks in part to a 99-27 scoring edge in the first two innings of a game. The early offense has been the primary reason that the Boilers have failed to hold the lead at some point only six times in their first 40 games: March 15 at No. 1 Vanderbilt, March 22 vs. Illinois State, games one and three of the Minnesota series (April 1-2) and the middle games of the Penn State (April 17) and Northwestern (April 23) series.
- Because Purdue has scored first so often, the team has also trailed infrequently this year, especially in wins. For the season, the Boilers have held the lead for 208 of the 356 innings (58 percent) they've played. Purdue did not trail in the first seven games of its eight-game win streak (from Feb. 27-March 12), a streak of 61 consecutive innings.
- The Purdue pitching staff did not give up a run in the first inning until game No. 13 on March 12. The Boilermakers have batted first in 32 of the first 40 games.

- Serrato also hit a solo home run in the opener of Big Ten series against Michigan and Penn State. His opposite-field blast at Penn State gave Purdue an early lead that it did not relinquish. The junior recorded a career-high four RBIs in the rubber game win at Penn State and is now batting .362 (17-for-47) with 11 RBIs and 11 runs scored in conference play.

PLawecki ENJOYS BIG WEEK WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION

• **Kevin Plawecki** drove in some big runs to help lead Purdue to a 4-1 week and series win at Penn State (April 13-17). After recording only two RBIs over a stretch of eight games, the sophomore tied his career high with four RBIs in the April 13 win against IPFW and also knocked in four runs in the Penn State series.

• Plawecki drove in the go-ahead run in the eighth inning of the IPFW win, delivering a two-run single to highlight a four-run rally. In the middle game of the Penn State series, Plawecki plated the game-tying run in the seventh inning with a two-out single. He came back in the nightcap of the doubleheader and doubled home a pair to open the scoring in the six-run third inning, finishing the game with four hits.

TALBOTT STILL A PERFECT BASE THIEF

• Purdue has been active on the base paths for much of the season, successfully stealing at least one base in 31 of the first 40 games. Eleven Boilermakers have swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** leads the way at a perfect 16-for-16. The sophomore is also a perfect 21-for-21 in his career.

• Talbott enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 45 runs scored. He did not batter any higher than eighth in the lineup until getting a chance to leadoff in the finale of the Tennessee Tech series (March 20). But for the season he has batted no higher than seventh in 31 of the 39 games he has started.

• Talbott was the only Boiler that hit safely in all eight games of the spring break trip, finishing the road trip through Tennessee with a team-best .406 batting average. He finished a home run shy of the cycle in the March 12 win at Tennessee-Martin.

RECORD SEVEN PURDUE PLAYERS EARN BIG TEN WEEKLY HONORS

• **Cameron Perkins** (Player, April 11) and **Joe Haase** (Pitcher, April 4) were the latest Boilermakers to win their first career Big Ten weekly awards. Perkins was recognized after posting multiple hits in all three games of the Michigan series (April 8-10). Haase was honored for his complete-game shutout of Minnesota April 2 at Target Field. Purdue has had seven different weekly honorees, garnering at least one award following seven of the first eight weekends of the year.

• Since the Big Ten began recognizing Players and Pitchers of the Week in 1990, the seven different Boilermakers honored this year represents a new program high. Previously, Purdue had four honorees in 1997 and 2006. And with **Matt Morgan** winning Pitcher of the Week twice, the eight weekly honors are also a new team benchmark. The Boilermakers won five weekly awards in 2003 and 2006. **Brad Schreiber** has also been named Pitcher of the Week and teammates **Barrett Serrato**, **Angelo Cianfrocco** and **Tyler Spillner** have been honored as the league's top player over a seven-day stretch.

HAASE POSTS SCORELESS-INNINGS STREAK

• Thanks in part to a complete-game shutout in his first career Big Ten start, **Joe Haase** was able to record a consecutive scoreless-innings streak of 14 over four appearances. It was snapped when Michigan scored in the first inning of the April 10 series finale. But the Wolverines managed to score just the one run against the junior. Haase surrendered only two earned runs over a stretch of 26 1/3 innings pitched. He compiled a 0.68 ERA in his six appearances from March 20 through April 17.

• Before Michigan snapped the scoreless-innings streak, top-ranked Vanderbilt (March 15) had been the last team to score against Haase. But the Commodores didn't score while Haase was actually on the mound in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings (an inherited runner scored against the bullpen in the sixth). Thus, it was a streak of 17 consecutive innings since a team had scored while Haase was literally on the mound. His ERA has dropped from 4.79 to 2.86 during his scoreless-innings streak.

• Haase has pitched in 12 games this year, making eight starts. Coincidentally, he's been on the mound in some of Purdue's biggest games of the year. His finest performance came on the big stage of Target Field in the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota, striking out a career-high seven in his first collegiate complete-game shutout. He scattered seven singles and did not give up a hit after the sixth inning.

• The junior pitched in relief in the wins against nationally-ranked Connecticut and Pittsburgh at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge. Haase led Purdue to another win against a nationally-ranked team when he beat Louisville with 8 2/3 innings of solid work in the March 8 midweek opener. He started the game against top-ranked Vanderbilt on the spring break trip, as well as the home opener against Illinois State.

INJURY UPDATES; RAMER PROVIDES TRUE RELIEF

- Purdue lost **Ryan Bridges** for the remainder of the season when he broke the fibula in his right leg on a play at first base in the April 10 series finale against Michigan. Bridges had started 24 of the first 31 games at first base, including 19 in a row. He landed awkwardly on his leg after colliding with the Michigan first baseman near the bag while trying to beat out a sacrifice bunt. The U-M player had jumped in the air to try to catch a wild throw and came down on top of Bridges.
- Pitcher **Brad Schreiber** has also missed two starts during Big Ten play. The sophomore was sidelined by strep throat in the conference-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2). He was also skipped in the rotation during the Northwestern series (April 23-24) after leaving his previous start at Penn State with arm stiffness. He is still be evaluated and is not expected to make a start against Indiana.
- The March 11 series-opening win at Tennessee-Martin also came at a steep price for Purdue. Starting pitcher **Matt Morgan** and **Angelo Cianfrocco** both left the game early with injuries and were sidelined for the rest of the month. Morgan struggled with his control due to a finger injury and Cianfrocco reinjured his right shoulder while hitting a foul ball.
- Morgan returned to the rotation for the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2) and has started the opening game of each of the first four conference weekends. Cianfrocco returned to the lineup for the Michigan series (April 8-10) but has been limited to a designated hitter role.
- Morgan's injury forced him from the game with one out in the third inning of the series opener at UT Martin. **Robert Ramer** picked up the slack out of the bullpen, working five innings of one-run relief to earn the victory. He struck out a career-high five while matching the longest outing of his career. Ramer went on to start the series openers at Tennessee Tech and Bradley, again working five solid innings. He earned the win at Tech but settled for a no decision against Bradley. The sophomore has become Purdue's primary midweek starter.

PLAWECKI AMONG THE BIG TEN'S TOUGHEST TO K

- **Kevin Plawecki** leads the team with a .364 batting average and has emerged as one of the toughest players to strikeout in the Big Ten. He has whiffed only eight times in 151 at-bats (183 plate appearances) to rank second in the Big Ten and 18th nationally in toughest to K entering the week. The sophomore has fanned just once every 18.9 at-bats (and once every 22.9 plate appearances). MORGAN & WITTGREN TEAM UP FOR SERIES-OPENING SHUTOUT OF MICHIGAN

- **Matt Morgan** and **Nick Wittgren** teamed up to strike out 14 batters in a combined shutout effort in the series-opening win against Michigan April 8. The Boilermakers won 8-0, posting their first shutout win against a Big Ten opponent at Lambert Field since 2008 (Northwestern) and their first shutout win over Michigan since 1993.
- Morgan struck out the side in the fourth inning and Wittgren did the same in the seventh. The pitchers teamed up to record at least one strikeout in every inning but the fifth. The season-high 14 strikeouts were the most for Purdue since also fanning 14 in a 2010 series-opening win against Penn State at Lambert Field.

HAASE'S SHUTOUT, PERKINS' HOMERS HIGHLIGHT SERIES AT TARGET FIELD

- **Joe Haase** worked his first career complete-game shutout and **Cameron Perkins** went deep twice to highlight Purdue's Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2), which was played at Target Field.
- Perkins hit both of his home runs to left field, connecting for a solo shot to lead off the seventh inning of game one and hitting a three-run shot in the third inning of game two. It marked the second time this season he has homered in back-to-back games. He finished the series 6-for-12 with five RBIs. **Stephen Talbott** was also a productive 6-for-11 with three RBIs and three runs scored while making some solid defensive plays in left field.
- Haase's complete-game effort in game two of the series lifted Purdue to its first shutout win against Minnesota since 1993 (in Minneapolis).

PLAWECKI NAMED TO JOHNNY BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST

- Sophomore catcher **Kevin Plawecki** has been named to the initial watch list for the Johnny Bench Award, which honors the nation's top Division I catcher. Forty-two catchers appeared on the initial watch list, which will be updated periodically until a list of semifinalists is unveiled May 19.
- Plawecki was a Freshman All-American in 2010 and is among the Big Ten's top prospects for the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He has batted cleanup in every game he has started this season and proved to be Purdue's toughest player to strikeout, going down on strikes only seven times in his first 151 plate appearances.

SEVEN RELIEVERS ALREADY WITH AT LEAST ONE SAVE

- The Purdue bullpen has continued to backup the starting pitchers with solid relief work. Seven pitchers have teamed up for Purdue's conference-leading 15 saves. **Nick Wittgren** has closed out nine wins and pitched in relief a team-high 18 times. **Lance Breedlove**, **Calvin Gunter**, **Blake Mascarello**, **Pat Gannon**, **Sean Collins** and **Mike Sudbury** have also earned a save while recording the final out of a game.
- Wittgren's most impressive outing came in the Feb. 20 win against Pittsburgh. He slammed the door on a potential Pitt rally with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh inning. He entered the game with the Boilers clinging to a one-run lead in the seventh and struck out the No. 4 and 5 hitters in the Pitt lineup to leave the bases loaded. After a 1-2-3 eighth inning, the Panthers posted back-to-back two-out hits against the sophomore right-hander in the ninth. But he again retired the Pitt cleanup hitter to close out the victory.
- Mascarello backed up Breedlove with 3 2/3 scoreless innings of relief in game two of the Lipscomb series.
- Gannon struck out a career-high seven and pitched over four leadoff singles while closing out the March 18 series-opening win at Tennessee Tech.
- Collins struck out four of the seven batters he faced to earn a save in the April 13 win versus IPFW in downtown Fort Wayne.
- Seven different pitchers had at least one save last season as Purdue totaled 14 as a team, none having more than three saves.

SCHREIBER CONSISTENT IN THE WEEKEND ROTATION

- **Brad Schreiber** emerged as Purdue's most consistent starting pitcher during the first half of the season. He pitched at least five innings in each of his first eight starts and went at least six innings in six of the eight. The sophomore took a no-hitter into the sixth inning of his Feb. 27 win at Morehead State and earned Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for six innings of shutout ball in his March 27 win against Bradley. He left the game with the lead in five of his first eight starts. Purdue rallied to win his starts against Tennessee Tech (March 20) and Michigan (April 9)
- By winning each of his first three starts, Schreiber became the first Purdue weekend starter to open the season 3-0 since Jay Buente in 2006. Buente won three of his first four starts as the team's No. 1 arm, the lone no decision coming in a Purdue win at nationally-ranked North Carolina.

SPILLNER SURGES THROUGH MARCH

- **Tyler Spillner** was Purdue's hottest hitter in the month of March, ending the month riding a career-best nine-game hitting streak (which he extended to 10 before it was snapped) and hitting safely in 13 of the final 14 games of the month total. He batted over .400 for the month even though he went 0-for-7 in the Lipscomb series the first weekend of March.
- The junior entered the month batting .276 and saw his average dip to .222 after the Lipscomb weekend. But the Purdue leadoff man batted .472 (25-for-53) over the final 13 games of March. He leads the team with 15 extra-base hits, recording 11 during his 10-game hit streak. He has also posted eight multi-hit efforts during his streak.

EIGHT-RUN NINTH INNING LIFTS PURDUE TO RUBBER GAME WIN AT TENN. TECH

- Purdue baseball scored eight times in the ninth inning to break open a tie game and defeat Tennessee Tech, 12-4, in the March 20 rubber game of the weekend series and finale of the eight-game spring break trip. The team's biggest rally since scoring nine times in a March 26, 2010, home win against Chicago State gave Purdue its fifth consecutive victorious weekend to begin the season.
- **Kevin Plawecki** tied a program single-game record with the first five-hit effort by a Boilermaker since April 2009. He singled five times and was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the ninth inning.
- **Stephen Talbott** knocked in the go-ahead run in the ninth with a squeeze bunt that he beat out for a hit. **Andrew Dixon** scored the go-ahead tally after opening the inning with a base hit. Dixon later delivered a three-run triple in his second at-bat of the frame. **David Miller** also had two hits in the inning.

WALK-OFF LOSS SNAPS WIN STREAK; BOILERS VERSUS TOP-RANKED VANDY

- Purdue's eight-game win streak from Feb. 27-March 12 ended in dramatic fashion in the series finale at Tennessee-Martin. The Boilermakers carried a four-run lead into the bottom of the ninth inning and were two outs away from completing a three-game sweep. But the Skyhawks hit a pair of home runs in the ninth inning, including a walk-off two-run blast. It was Purdue's second walk-off loss of the season.
- March 15, the Boilers were shutout for the first time since April 2009 in a loss at top-ranked Vanderbilt (NCBWA poll). It marked the first time that Purdue played a team ranked No. 1 in the country since getting swept in a 2005 series at Texas.

McHUGH GOES DEEP FOR HIS FIRST COLLEGIATE HIT

- Freshman **Sean McHugh** made his first start for Purdue in the March 16 loss at Belmont and took advantage of the opportunity with a 2-for-3 showing. He was also hit by a pitch and scored twice. But the highlight of the day came in his first at-bat when he went deep to left field for his first collegiate hit. The two-run homer gave Purdue a 3-0 lead in the second inning. McHugh also hit the first home run of the season (and so far only long ball) at Lambert Field, connecting for a solo blast to left field in the March 23 win against Wabash.

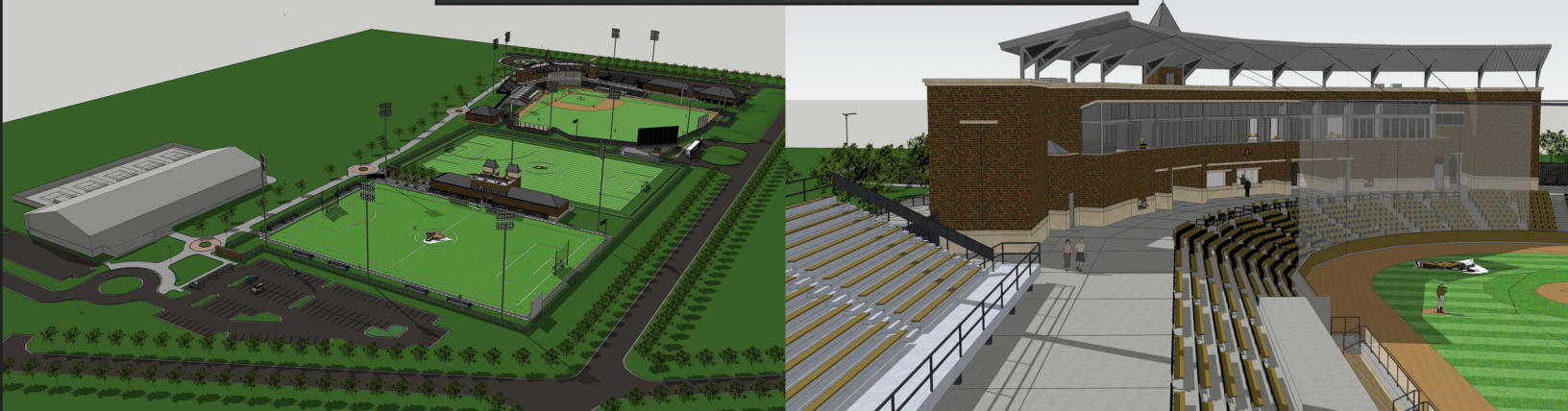
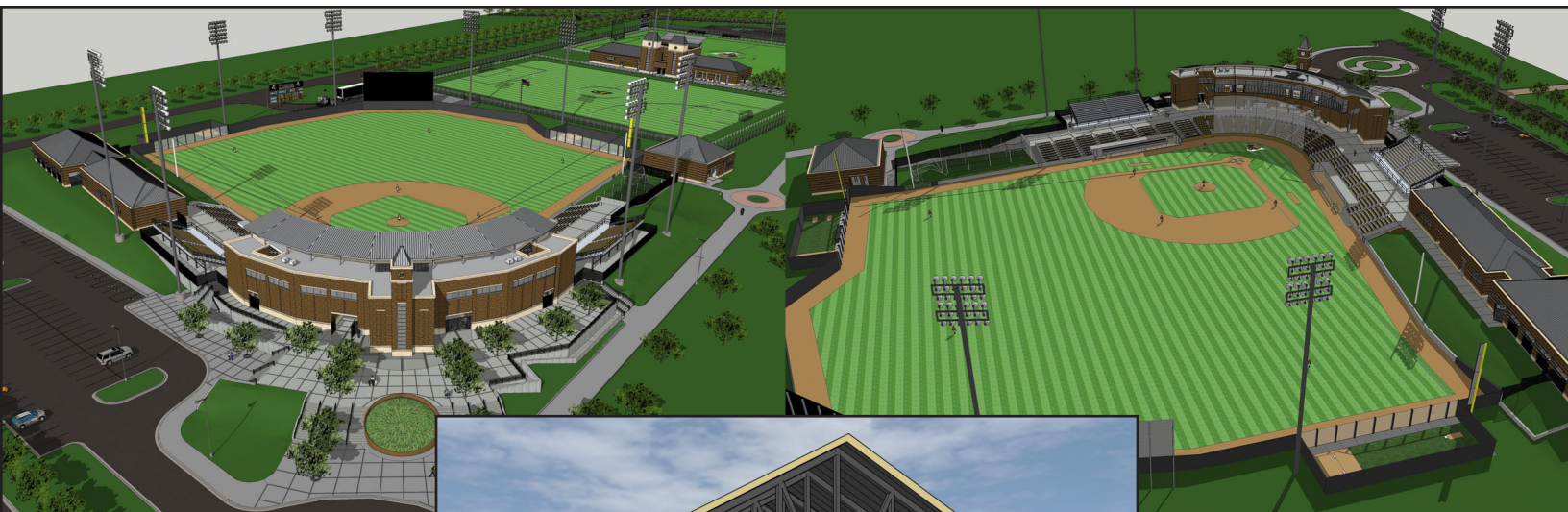

The New Northwest Baseball Facility

Construction to Begin Spring of 2011

Stadium to be located near the intersection of McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus

The 2011 season will be Purdue's last at Lambert Field. The new northwest baseball facility is set to open for the 2012 home opener. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. Purdue will close out the season with an eight-game homestand from May 11-21, highlighted by Big Ten Conference series against Illinois and Iowa. The Boilermakers are expected to open their 2012 home schedule at Lambert and play their first game at their new ballpark in late March or early April.
