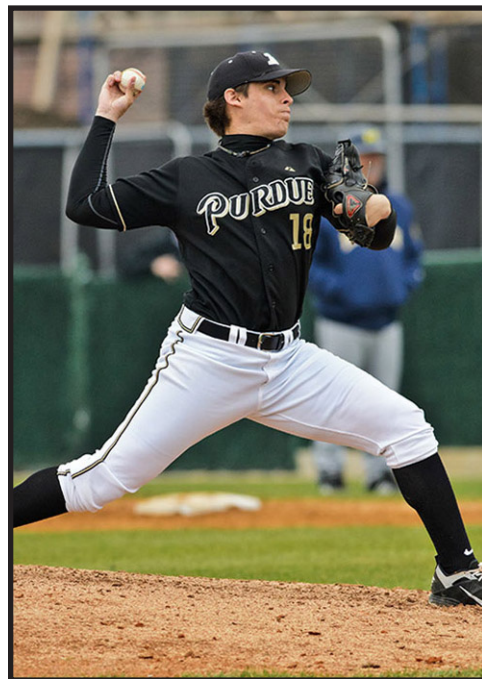
PAYTON BIEKER • #5

- Went 7-for-13 with a double, triple, four RBIs and five walks over a six-game stretch in March of 2011.
- Started all three games of the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota. Also started Big Ten games against Penn State, Northwestern, Indiana and Illinois.
- Delivered a two-out hit in the ninth inning with the tying run in scoring position in the finale of the Michigan State series.
- Posted a four-hit game in a 2010 win at Chicago State.
- Homered against Morehead State and Iowa in 2010.

- Four-year letter-winner has been a member of the program since the fall of 2006.
- Utility man has played in 105 games and started at seven different positions: third base, shortstop, second base, first base, left field, right field and designated hitter.
- Enjoyed a monster game in a 2009 win against Butler, going 5-for-6 with two doubles, a home run, four RBIs and four runs scored.
- Also homered against IPFW in 2009 and Valparaiso in 2010.
- Scored five times to tie a Purdue single-game record and drove in three runs in a win this season at Morehead State.
- Executed a squeeze bunt successfully in the series-opening win at Penn State last month.
- Has not committed an error in his last 50 defensive chances dating back to April 2010.

- Four-year letter-winner has been a member of the program since the fall of 2006.
- Three-year member of the weekend rotation has made 34 of his 51 appearances on the mound as a starter.
- Became the eighth pitcher in Purdue history to record 200 career strikeouts.
- Also ranks among the Purdue all-time leaders in strikeouts per nine innings and strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- Three-time Big Ten Pitcher of the Week was honored after wins against Connecticut and Lipscomb this season.
- Went the distance in a four-hit shutout win against Lipscomb and also helped Purdue blank Michigan in the Big Ten home opener.
- Struck out a career-high 14 in a 2010 win at Ohio.

– PURDUE CLOSES HOMESTAND & REGULAR SEASON VERSUS IOWA –

As Purdue baseball closes its eight-game homestand and the regular season with a Big Ten series against Iowa, the Boilermakers strive to play well and in the process extend their campaign by locking up a conference tournament berth.

First pitch at Lambert Field is set for 4 p.m. Thursday and Friday and 2 p.m. Saturday. Purdue's three seniors – **Payton Bieker**, **David Blount** and **Matt Morgan** – will be recognized prior to Saturday's first pitch for their contributions to Boilermaker baseball.

Saturday's game doubles as the home finale, but it is not expected to be the final game played at Lambert Field. Purdue is scheduled to move into its new stadium at the Northwest Complex next year. However, the 2012 home opener and the first few home dates are expected to be played at Lambert. The new stadium should be unveiled in April 2012.

In a conference race that features six teams within three games of league-leading Michigan State (13-8 Big Ten), the Boilermakers (33-18, 11-10 Big Ten) are among a group of teams that could either win a share of the Big Ten regular-season title or not qualify for the conference tournament. Two victories should assure Purdue of a tournament berth. The Boilermakers could also qualify for the six-team event for the seventh time in the last eight seasons by winning one game and getting some help from Michigan and Michigan State in their series against Penn State (10-11 Big Ten) and Northwestern (9-11 Big Ten), respectively. Purdue owns potential head-to-head tiebreakers against both PSU and NU.

Iowa (20-29, 9-12 Big Ten) has won two-of-three against Penn State and Ohio State the last two weekends to remain alive in the Big Ten Tournament chase. However, one loss would essentially eliminate the Hawkeyes from tourney contention.

Iowa ended the Boilers' season in the Big Ten Tournament last year. In fact, each of Purdue's final five losses came at the hands of the Hawkeyes. Iowa swept the Boilers in Iowa City the final weekend of the regular season and then topped Purdue in the opening round and loser's bracket of the tournament.

Those five straight wins for the Hawkeyes over a span of eight days represented the longest win streak in the series for either team since Iowa also won five in a row from 1989-1992. Purdue had won eight of the last 12 meetings entering the 2010 season.

Thursday's series opener could prove to be the key game of the series. An Iowa win would keep the Hawkeyes alive in the tourney chase and perhaps also put the Boilers in a more extensive must-win scenario.

For Purdue, Morgan is expected to take the mound for the final time at Lambert Field Thursday. As a three-year member of the weekend rotation, Morgan has compiled an 8-2 record in his 12 career starts at home. He became the eighth pitcher in program history to reach the 200-career strikeouts benchmark in his victory against Illinois last weekend. Seventy-nine of his 201 career Ks have over 87 1/3 innings pitched at Lambert.

Purdue is 9-2 in game Morgan has started this season, including 3-0 at home.

Iowa ace Jarred Hippen also presents a formidable challenge. He has won Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors twice over the last three weeks. April 29, the lefty threw a one-hitter against Minnesota at Target Field but still suffered the loss in a 1-0 final. Last weekend, he pitched a three-hit complete-game shutout in the Hawkeyes' win at Ohio State.

Iowa lost two-of-three in each of its first six Big Ten series of the season. The Boilermakers' and Hawkeyes' Big Ten schedules were opposites of each other. Purdue played three of its first four series on the road, but was the only team to close the year with back-to-back series at home. Iowa played

three of its four conference weekends at home, but was the only team to be on the road for the final two series of the season. However, Iowa has actually played better away from home this season. The Hawkeyes are 7-13 (.350) at Duane Banks Field and 13-16 (.448) in games played away from Iowa City this spring.

Iowa (213) and Purdue (212) rank one-two in the Big Ten in walks draw by their batters. But the Hawkeyes have struck out 98 more times in 206 fewer plate appearances. Iowa ranks last in the Big Ten with eight home runs, but has connected for six of the eight in Big Ten play. Granted the bats are not as lively this year, but the Hawkeyes hit six home runs in the five games against Purdue in 2010.

Angelo Cianfrocco, **Brad Schreiber** and Bieker went deep for the Boilers against Iowa last season.

THE FINAL WEEKEND OF THE REGULAR SEASON: PURDUE BASEBALL HOSTS IOWA



HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 13th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 343-328 overall record and a 176-168 Big Ten mark through his first 12 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons, while Joe Sexson guided the Boilermakers for 527 games over 18 years.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher and newcomers Kevin Plawewski, Cameron Perkins and Brad Schreiber were recognized for standout freshman seasons. Bischoff led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 48 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 16 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last six years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE CONCLUDES REGULAR SEASON WITH HOME SERIES VERSUS IOWA

- Purdue is currently 3-2 on its season-long, eight-game homestand. The Boilermakers lost back-to-back home games for the first time this season when Illinois took games two and three of the recent weekend series.
- Purdue bounced back from the series loss to the Illini by winning its midweek finale against Illinois-Chicago Tuesday. The Boilermakers outscored UIC 29-4 en route to winning both ends of the home-and-home midweek series this season. Purdue was 9-1 in midweek action this year.
- The Boilermakers are 11-4 at home this year. The current eight-game homestand represents the team's longest since playing nine consecutive home games from March 22-30, 2008. Purdue has not closed the regular season with back-to-back series at home since 1998.
- A two-out error in the ninth inning burned the Boilers in the rubber game loss to Illinois. A throwing error by **Eric Charles** on a grounder to second base allowed the go-ahead run to score. Purdue trailed the game early, 4-0, but took the lead in the fifth inning on a three-run homer from **Kevin Plawecki**. However, the Boilers did not score for the remainder of the game. Plawecki also connected for a solo shot in game two of the series.
- **Stephen Talbott** and **Matt Morgan** led Purdue to the series-opening victory. Talbott doubled, homered, scored twice and threw a runner out at the plate from left field. Morgan worked six innings of one-run ball, keeping the Illini off the scoreboard until the sixth inning. **Lance Breedlove** back him up with 2 2/3 innings of scoreless relief, retiring eight of the first nine batters he faced.

LEAGUE-LEADING BOILERS; HIT BY PITCH PILING UP

- Purdue enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in 12 notable statistical categories, including many significant offensive category. The Boilermakers are also among the Top 30 nationally in seven categories.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten in hit by pitch by a wide margin. The Boilers have been hit by a pitch 95 times, averaging nearly two hit batsmen per contest. Purdue batters have been hit by a pitch nearly twice as often as second-place Illinois (52). Meanwhile, the Boiler pitchers have plunked only 39 opposing batters, the second fewest in the league.
- At least one Purdue batter has been hit by a pitch in 46 of the first 51 games, the lone exceptions being the middle game of the Tennessee-Martin (March 12) and Minnesota (April 2) series, opener of the Penn State series (April 15), finale of the Northwestern series (April 24) and the opener of Illinois series (May 13). The Boilermakers have been hit five times in a game on four occasions, winning three of the four games. The lone loss came in the home opener to Illinois State (March 22).

BIG TEN LEADERS: MILLER, PERKINS, CHARLES & WITTGREN

- **David Miller**, **Eric Charles**, **Cameron Perkins** and **Nick Wittgren** each enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in at least one statistical category. Recently, Charles over took **Barrett Serrato** for the league lead in sac flies and Perkins passed **Kevin Plawecki** atop in the hit by pitch leaders. **Stephen Talbott** is also second in runs scored.
- Miller is tops in the league with a .497 on-base percentage and 39 walks, drawing 31 since the start of conference play on April 1. He has reached base safely in 20 consecutive games.

- Talbott is second with 54 runs scored. He's one of five Boilermakers to rank among the Top 10. Talbott has scored a run in 34 of the 51 games this season, highlighted by a streak of eight consecutive games with at least one run scored from Feb. 26-March 8. He scored a team-high 14 times during a career-best 10-game hit streak from April 9-23.
- Perkins (17), Plawecki (16), Talbott (14) and Miller (12) rank one through four in hit by pitch. Perkins is among the league's Top 10 in each of the Triple Crown categories.

PURDUE REACHES 30-WIN MARK BY MAY 1

- Thanks in part to a 13-5 record in the month of April, Purdue successfully posted its 30th win of the season by May 1 for the sixth time in program history. The Boilermakers have compiled a 13-3 record since losing two-of-three at preseason favorite Minnesota during the conference-opening series at Target Field. Purdue has also posted consecutive 30-win seasons for the second time during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** 13-year tenure. It's the seventh time total the program has achieved the accomplishment.

- However, poor finishes have marred some of the Boilers' finest seasons. Of the 15 Purdue teams to win 30 games, only one (1982) was able to post a winning record after recording its 30th victory. The 1982 squad went 6-2 after recording its 30th win of the season on May 12 against Ball State.

PERKINS' REACHED SAFELY STREAK RANKS THIRD NATIONALLY

- His 20-game hitting streak may have been snapped April 23 at Northwestern, but **Cameron Perkins'** streak of reaching base safely remains alive and ranks among the best in the nation. Perkins has reached base safely in all 50 games he has played this year. Dating back to 2010, he has reached base safely in 57 consecutive games. That ranks as the third longest active streak in the country.
- Perkins has reached base safely 117 times during his streak, collecting 89 hits, nine walks and getting hit by a pitch 19 times. That's good for an on-base percentage of .429.
- In Big Ten play, Perkins has reached base safely in 39 consecutive contests dating back to last season. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he has managed to find his way on base in 43 straight games against conference opponents. He has compiled an on-base percentage of .434 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 85 times (66 hits, five walks, 14 hit by pitch).

CHARLES' HITTING STREAK POSTED PRIMARILY IN BIG TEN PLAY

- **Eric Charles** enters the weekend riding a 13-game hitting, one game shy of his career-long streak posted as a freshman in 2009. With Purdue having played only two midweek games over the last month of the season, Charles has posted his hit streak primarily in Big Ten play. The second baseman has hit safely in 11 consecutive conference games, recording the sixth longest hitting streak in Big Ten play around the conference this year.
- Charles is the fifth Purdue player to post a hitting streak of at least 10 games this year, joining **Cameron Perkins** (20 and 10), **Kevin Plawecki** (11), **Tyler Spillner** (10) and **Stephen Talbott** (10).

SERRATO EXCELS IN UTILITY ROLE

- **Barrett Serrato** has started all but one game (the finale of the Tennessee Tech series) this season, starting at a team-high four different positions. The junior has seen action in right field (23 starts), third base (9), shortstop (9) and designated hitter (9). Remarkably, the most consecutive games he has started at the same position is the eight straight he started at third base from April 23-May 8. He was back in right field to begin the May 11 homestand opener against Ball State. In Big Ten play, Serrato has made 10 starts in right field, eight starts at third and three as the DH.
- Serrato has also batted at least once in six different spots in the lineup – third through eighth. He's been penciled in the No. 5 hole a team-high 31 times.
- Purdue has posted a 7-2 record in games Serrato has started at shortstop. The Boilermakers are 15-8 in games he has started in right field.

STRANDED RUNNERS BURN BOILERS IN SHOWDOWN SERIES AT MICHIGAN STATE

- The Boilermakers left 32 on runners on base over the course of the three games at Michigan State, including 13 in the series opener. The Spartans were 15-for-36 (.417) with two outs while the Boilers were only 6-for-29 (.207). Michigan State scored all five of its runs in game two of the series with two outs in an inning. The Spartans swept Purdue in the series after the two teams entered the weekend series in East Lansing tied atop the Big Ten standings with 10-5 records. The Boilermakers suffered their first sweep at the hands of MSU since 1993.
- The series ended in thrilling fashion. **Kevin Plawecki** was thrown out at the plate to end the game while trying to score the game-tying run on a two-out single by **Payton Bieker**. Plawecki doubled three times in the series finale to become the first Purdue player with three two-baggers in a game since Nick Overmyer in 2009. Plawecki was ejected after arguing the call and had to sit out the Ball State (May 11) game because it was a postgame ejection.

WITTGREN NAMED TO STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- Currently leading the Big Ten with 11 saves, **Nick Wittgren** was one of 46 relievers to be selected for the NCBWA's Stopper of the Year midseason watch list. Wittgren was the only player from a Big Ten school on the updated list for the award that recognizes the nation top Division I relief pitcher.
- Twenty of Wittgren's 24 relief appearances on the mound have seen him finish a game, a total that ranks second in the Big Ten. He has struck out 46 in 45 2/3 innings while issuing only 10 walks.
- Wittgren has posted five of his 11 saves in relief appearances longer than one inning. He closed out Big Ten series-opening wins against Michigan, Penn State and Northwestern and was the inning pitcher in the series opener against Indiana. He recorded a save in six consecutive appearances from April 6-23, closing out four straight Purdue wins in the process. He worked three scoreless innings, striking out a career-high six, to wrap up the series-opening shutout of Michigan.

McHUGH PLAYS THE HERO IN 12TH-INNING WALK-OFF WIN

• Purdue would not have been able to post its first series sweep of Indiana since 1997 without rallying for a walk-off win in the series opener. **Tyler Spillner** sent the game into extra innings with a two-out run-scoring single, plating **Andrew Dixon** after Dixon had led off the bottom of the ninth with a pinch-hit single.

• But it was freshman **Sean McHugh** that was mobbed by his teammates as the Boilers celebrated a 12th-inning walk-off victory. McHugh was the fourth player to occupy the No. 9 spot in the lineup. He was sent to the plate as a pinch hitter in the 12th. After **Barrett Serrato** and **David Miller** stole third and second base, McHugh singled into left field on a full-count pitch, delivering the game-winning two-out RBI.

• The walk-off win was Purdue's first since defeating Minnesota in 10 innings of the 2010 Big Ten opener. **Cameron Perkins** also played the hero as a freshman that day. But McHugh became the first Purdue player to deliver a walk-off hit as a pinch hitter since John Cummins in April 2006.

TALBOTT STILL A PERFECT BASE THIEF

• Purdue has been active on the base paths for much of the season, successfully stealing at least one base in 37 of the first 51 games. Twelve Boilermakers have swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** leads the way at a perfect 16-for-16. The sophomore is also a perfect 21-for-21 in his career.

• Talbott enters the weekend ranking second in the Big Ten with 54 runs scored. He did not batter any higher than eighth in the lineup until getting a chance to leadoff in the finale of the Tennessee Tech series (March 20). But for the season he has batted no higher than seventh in 41 of the 50 games he has started.

• Talbott was the only Boiler that hit safely in all eight games of the spring break trip, finishing the road trip through Tennessee with a team-best .406 batting average. He finished a home run shy of the cycle in the March 12 win at Tennessee-Martin. He homered in the finale of the Indiana series.

PURDUE SCORES FIRST EARLY AND OFTEN

• Purdue has scored first in 37 of its first 51 games this season (including the first 12 in a row) thanks in part to a 119-41 scoring edge in the first two innings of a game. The early offense has been the primary reason that the Boilers have failed to hold the lead at some point only nine times in their first 51 games: March 15 at No. 1 Vanderbilt, March 22 vs. Illinois State, games one and three of the Minnesota series (April 1-2), the middle games of the Penn State (April 17) and Northwestern (April 23) series, games two and three of the Michigan State (May 7-8) series and the middle game of the Illinois series (May 14).

• Because Purdue has scored first so often, the team has also trailed infrequently this year, especially in wins. For the season, the Boilers have held the lead for 254 of the 463 innings (55 percent) they've played. Purdue did not trail in the first seven games of its eight-game win streak (from Feb. 27-March 12), a streak of 61 consecutive innings.

• The Purdue pitching staff did not give up a run in the first inning until game No. 13 on March 12. The Boilermakers have batted first in 35 of the first 51 games.

PERKINS' HITTING STREAK SNAPPED AT 20

• **Cameron Perkins'** career-best 20-game hitting streak, the longest by a Purdue player since Brandon Haveman hit safely in the final 20 games of the 2009 season, was snapped in the middle game of the Northwestern series. Perkins has still managed to hit safely in 46 of the 50 games in which he has played this season and reached base safely in all 50. Dating back to last year, he has reached base safely in 57 consecutive games.

• Perkins' hitless showing in the middle game of the Northwestern series also snapped his 14-game hit streak against Big Ten competition dating back to last season's conference tournament.

• Perkins jumped out an 18-for-38 (.474) start in Big Ten play. He homered in the Big Ten series at Minnesota and Northwestern and feasted on Michigan pitching (7-for-11, 3 XBH, 5 RBI). The Michigan series highlighted a recent hot stretch in which he recorded multiple hits in five consecutive games (April 8-13), equaling out to a 12-for-21 showing.

PLAWECKI AMONG THE BIG TEN'S TOUGHEST TO K

• **Kevin Plawecki** ranks second on the team with a .354 batting average and has emerged as one of the toughest players to strikeout in the Big Ten. He has whiffed only 10 times in 189 at-bats (228 plate appearances) to rank second in the Big Ten and 19th nationally in toughest to K entering the week. The sophomore has fanned just once every 18.9 at-bats (and once every 22.8 plate appearances). For his college career, he has gone down on strikes only 21 times in 393 at-bats (457 plate appearances).

• **PLAWECKI IN MARCH: .393 (24-for-61), 4 2B, 9 RBI, 13 R, 4 BB, 8 HBP, .479 OBP**

INJURY UPDATES

• Purdue lost **Ryan Bridges** for the remainder of the season when he broke the fibula in his right leg on a play at first base in the April 10 series finale against Michigan. Bridges had started 24 of the first 31 games at first base, including 19 in a row. He landed awkwardly on his leg after colliding with the Michigan first baseman near the bag while trying to beat out a sacrifice bunt. The U-M player had jumped in the air to try to catch a wild throw and came down on top of Bridges.

• Pitcher **Brad Schreiber** has also missed three starts during Big Ten play. He has not pitched since leaving in the sixth inning of April 17 start at Penn State with arm stiffness, which turned out to be an elbow injury. If the sophomore right-hander is able to return this season he is expected to be used in a relief role. Schreiber was sidelined by strep throat in the conference-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2).

• The March 11 series-opening win at Tennessee-Martin also came at a steep price for Purdue. Starting pitcher **Matt Morgan** and **Angelo Cianfrocco** both left the game early with injuries and were sidelined for the rest of the month. Morgan struggled with his control due to a finger injury and Cianfrocco reinjured his right shoulder while hitting a foul ball.

• Morgan returned to the rotation for the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2) and has started the opening game of each of the first four conference weekends. Cianfrocco returned to the lineup for the Michigan series (April 8-10) but has been limited to a designated hitter role.

SERRATO DELIVERS GAME-WINNING HIT IN THE NINTH, GOES DEEP AGAIN

• **Barrett Serrato** lifted Purdue to a comeback win at Ball State (April 12) with a two-out, two-run single in the ninth inning and the Boilers trailing by a run. He singled into left center on the first pitch he saw from the new BSU relief pitcher.

• Serrato also hit a solo home run in the opener of Big Ten series against Michigan and Penn State. His opposite-field blast at Penn State gave Purdue an early lead that it did not relinquish. The junior recorded a career-high four RBIs in the rubber game win at Penn State (April 17).

PLAWECKI ENJOYS BIG WEEK WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION

• **Kevin Plawecki** drove in some big runs to help lead Purdue to a 4-1 week and series win at Penn State (April 13-17). After recording only two RBIs over a stretch of eight games, the sophomore tied his career high with four RBIs in the April 13 win against IPFW and also knocked in four runs in the Penn State series.

• Plawecki drove in the go-ahead run in the eighth inning of the IPFW win, delivering a two-run single to highlight a four-run rally. In the middle game of the Penn State series, Plawecki plated the game-tying run in the seventh inning with a two-out single. He came back in the nightcap of the doubleheader and doubled home a pair to open the scoring in the six-run third inning, finishing the game with four hits.

RECORD SEVEN PURDUE PLAYERS EARN BIG TEN WEEKLY HONORS

• **Cameron Perkins** (Player, April 11) and **Joe Haase** (Pitcher, April 4) were the latest Boilermakers to win their first career Big Ten weekly awards. Perkins was recognized after posting multiple hits in all three games of the Michigan series (April 8-10), finishing the weekend 7-for-11. Haase was honored for his complete-game shutout of Minnesota April 2 at Target Field. Purdue has had seven different weekly honorees, garnering at least one award following seven of the first eight weekends of the year.

• Since the Big Ten began recognizing Players and Pitchers of the Week in 1990, the seven different Boilermakers honored this year represents a new program high. Previously, Purdue had four honorees in 1997 and 2006. And with **Matt Morgan** winning Pitcher of the Week twice, the eight weekly honors are also a new team benchmark. The Boilermakers won five weekly awards in 2003 and 2006. **Brad Schreiber** has also been named Pitcher of the Week and teammates **Barrett Serrato**, **Angelo Cianfrocco** and **Tyler Spillner** have been honored as the league's top player over a seven-day stretch.

HAASE POSTS SCORELESS-INNINGS STREAK

- Thanks in part to a complete-game shutout in his first career Big Ten start, **Joe Haase** was able to record a consecutive scoreless-innings streak of 14 over four appearances. It was snapped when Michigan scored in the first inning of the April 10 series finale. But the Wolverines managed to score just the one run against the junior. Haase surrendered only two earned runs over a stretch of 26 1/3 innings pitched. He compiled a 0.68 ERA in his six appearances from March 20 through April 17.
- Before Michigan snapped the scoreless-innings streak, top-ranked Vanderbilt (March 15) had been the last team to score against Haase. But the Commodores didn't score while Haase was actually on the mound in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings (an inherited runner scored against the bullpen in the sixth). Thus, it was a streak of 17 consecutive innings since a team had scored while Haase was literally on the mound. His ERA has dropped from 4.79 to 2.86 during his scoreless-innings streak.
- Haase has pitched in 14 games this year, making 10 starts. Coincidentally, he's been on the mound in some of Purdue's biggest games of the year. His finest performance came on the big stage of Target Field in the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota, striking out a career-high seven in his first collegiate complete-game shutout. He scattered seven singles and did not give up a hit after the sixth inning.
- The junior pitched in relief in the wins against nationally-ranked Connecticut and Pittsburgh at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge. Haase led Purdue to another win against a nationally-ranked team when he beat Louisville with 8 2/3 innings of solid work in the March 8 midweek opener. He started the game against top-ranked Vanderbilt on the spring break trip, as well as the home opener against Illinois State and the middle game of the rivalry series with Indiana.

MORGAN & WITTGREN TEAM UP FOR SERIES-OPENING SHUTOUT OF MICHIGAN

- **Matt Morgan** and **Nick Wittgren** teamed up to strike out 14 batters in a combined shutout effort in the series-opening win against Michigan April 8. The Boilermakers won 8-0, posting their first shutout win against a Big Ten opponent at Lambert Field since 2008 (Northwestern) and their first shutout win over Michigan since 1993.
- Morgan struck out the side in the fourth inning and Wittgren did the same in the seventh. The pitchers teamed up to record at least one strikeout in every inning but the fifth. The season-high 14 strikeouts were the most for Purdue since also fanning 14 in a 2010 series-opening win against Penn State at Lambert Field.

HAASE'S SHUTOUT, PERKINS' HOMERS HIGHLIGHT SERIES AT TARGET FIELD

- **Joe Haase** worked his first career complete-game shutout and **Cameron Perkins** went deep twice to highlight Purdue's Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2), which was played at Target Field.
- Perkins hit both of his home runs to left field, connecting for a solo shot to lead off the seventh inning of game one and hitting a three-run shot in the third inning of game two. It marked the second time this season he has homered in back-to-back games. He finished the series 6-for-12 with five RBIs. **Stephen Talbott** was also a productive 6-for-11 with three RBIs and three runs scored while making some solid defensive plays in left field.
- Haase's complete-game effort in game two of the series lifted Purdue to its first shutout win against Minnesota since 1993 (in Minneapolis).

PLAWECKI NAMED TO JOHNNY BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST

- Sophomore catcher **Kevin Plawecki** has been named to the initial watch list for the Johnny Bench Award, which honors the nation's top Division I catcher. Forty-two catchers appeared on the initial watch list, which will be updated periodically until a list of semifinalists is unveiled May 19.
- Plawecki was a Freshman All-American in 2010 and is among the Big Ten's top prospects for the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He batted cleanup in each of the first 35 games he started this year.

McHUGH GOES DEEP FOR HIS FIRST COLLEGIATE HIT

- Freshman **Sean McHugh** made his first start for Purdue in the March 16 loss at Belmont and took advantage of the opportunity with a 2-for-3 showing. He was also hit by a pitch and scored twice. But the highlight of the day came in his first at-bat when he went deep to left field for his first collegiate hit. The two-run homer gave Purdue a 3-0 lead in the second inning. McHugh also hit the first home run of the season (and so far only long ball) at Lambert Field, connecting for a solo blast to left field in the March 23 win against Wabash.

SEVEN RELIEVERS ALREADY WITH AT LEAST ONE SAVE

- The Purdue bullpen has continued to backup the starting pitchers with solid relief work. Seven pitchers have teamed up for Purdue's conference-leading 19 saves. **Nick Wittgren** has closed out 11 wins and pitched in relief a team-high 24 times. **Lance Breedlove**, **Calvin Gunter**, **Blake Mascarello**, **Pat Gannon**, **Sean Collins** and **Mike Sudbury** have also earned a save while recording the final out of a game.

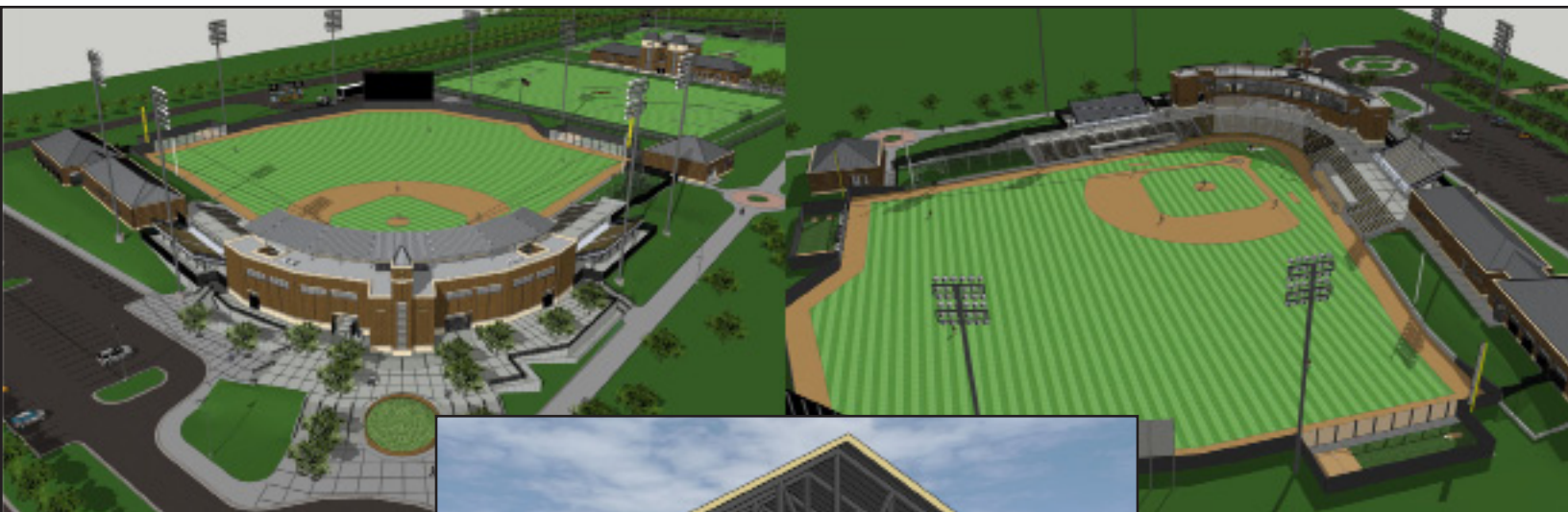

The New Northwest Baseball Facility

Construction to Begin Spring of 2011

Stadium to be located near the intersection of McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus

The 2011 season will be Purdue's last at Lambert Field. The new northwest baseball facility is set to open for the 2012 home opener. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. Purdue will close out the season with an eight-game homestand from May 11-21, highlighted by Big Ten Conference series against Illinois and Iowa. The Boilermakers are expected to open their 2012 home schedule at Lambert and play their first game at their new ballpark in late March or early April.
