HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 15th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owned the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber eclipsed Alexander's record for games coached during the second weekend of the 2013 season.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909. In its 16 games during the final year at Lambert, the home of the program since 1965, Purdue won three times in walk-off fashion and locked up the Big Ten title May 12 in front of a large group of program alumni.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

Headlined by Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. A program-record seven players were drafted overall in 2012.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's previous single-season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings under Schreiber in 2001, 2005 and 2008.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 30 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last eight years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

– BOILERMAKERS VISIT EAST LANSING FOR FIRST OF TWO MICHIGAN TRIPS –

For the first of its consecutive road trips to the state of Michigan, Purdue baseball visits East Lansing for a Big Ten weekend series at Michigan State that will feature two games televised live.

First pitch at MSU's McLane Stadium is set for 3 p.m. Friday, 1 p.m. Saturday and noon Sunday. Friday's and Sunday's games are set to be televised live by the BTN.

The Boilermakers are idle from conference play next weekend while hosting Southern Illinois for a three-game series at Alexander Field. Purdue then returns to the state of Michigan the weekend of May 10-12, traveling to Ann Arbor for the first time since 2010 for a series with the Wolverines.

The Boilermakers and Spartans each represented the Big Ten in the 2012 NCAA Tournament, marking the first time the league got two bids to Regionals since 2009.

Michigan State recently won four consecutive games in walk-off fashion, highlighted by a series sweep of nationally-ranked Indiana at McLane Stadium the weekend of April 12-14. But last weekend's MSU-Minnesota series in the Twin Cities was canceled due to snow and field conditions. With those games not being rescheduled, each of the final 12 conference games for Michigan State and Minnesota take on an even greater importance. With only 21 conference games for both teams, each win or loss will have a greater impact on their winning percentages in the race to qualify for the six-team Big Ten Tournament.

Purdue snapped a nine-game losing streak Wednesday when the lineup erupted for a season-high 20 runs. But the pitching staff also had its finest night of the season, with five hurlers combining for the team's first shutout of the season. The Boilers will be looking to snap an eight-game losing streak in Big Ten play this weekend, the program's longest since 2003. Purdue was swept in its last visit to East Lansing (2011). McLane Stadium features a short porch in right field due in part to the location of the adjacent Red Cedar River. In 2011, the Spartans' left-handed hitters connected for five home runs to right field.

Michigan State has lost two key players to season-ending injuries. John Martinez suffered a torn ACL early in March but should get the year back thanks to a medical redshirt. He was a team-best 5-for-12 in last year's Purdue-MSU series at Lambert Field. But the bigger blow to the Spartans came when Jordan Keur suffered a torn Achilles tendon in the series-opening win against Indiana. Keur was leading the team with a .337 batting average and 20 RBI.

Anthony Cheky provides speed at the top of the order (17-of-19 stealing bases) to go along with a high batting average (.333). Jimmy Pickens (14 extra-base hits, 18 RBI), Ryan Krill (9, 21) and Joel Fisher (13, 16) have been the primary run producers. Pickens delivered the walk-off hits in the first two games of the Indiana series and Krill came through in the clutch in the finale.

While 18 different Boilers have taken the mound this season, Michigan State has only used 11 pitchers. Andrew Waszak (3-2, 2.66 ERA) and David Garner (4-2, 3.58 ERA) make up a formidable one-two punch at the top of the weekend rotation. Together, they limited Purdue to just one run over 16 innings in last year's series. Garner threw a complete-game shutout in the series finale at Lambert Field, marking the only time the 2012 Big Ten champions were shut out. As a freshman, he worked 3 2/3 innings of scoreless relief over three appearances against Purdue. Garner's slider can be one of the most devastating pitches in the Big Ten.

The Spartans have managed to compile another impressive RPI (26) this year thanks to road or neutral-site wins against teams having quality seasons like Kentucky, Western Carolina, Tennessee Tech and Austin Peay. A series win at Ohio State and the sweep of Indiana also provided a nice boosts.

The quartet of **Conner Hudnall** (reached safely in 17 straight starts), **Kyle Johnson** (hit safely in

15 of last 16 games), **Sean McHugh** (reached safely in 14 straight games) and **Cody Strong** (reached safely in 15 straight starts) remain the most consistent performers at the plate for Purdue. **Josh Estill** (3 hits, 7 RBI) and **Kyle Wood** (3 hits, 5 RBI) are both coming off big nights in the blowout win against UIC Wednesday. Strong's 13 walks and .542 on-base percentage in Big Ten play are both the best in the conference.

On the mound, **Brett Andzrejewski** (12) and **Mike Lutz** (9) rank one-two in the conference in appearances during Big Ten play.

BOILERS HEAD TO EAST LANSING FOR FIRST OF TWO MICHIGAN ROAD TRIPS

• For the first of consecutive road trips to the state of Michigan, Purdue visits East Lansing this weekend for a Big Ten series at Michigan State. The Spartans had their entire series at Minnesota last weekend canceled due to snow and field conditions. Michigan State recently won four straight games in walk-off fashion, highlighted by a weekend sweep of nationally-ranked Indiana. The Spartans also have a series win at Ohio State (March 29-31) but were swept in a series against Michigan (April 5-7).

• This weekend marks the third of a three-week stretch in which the Boilers will play three teams predicted to make the Big Ten Tournament by the league coaches in the preseason poll. Purdue got thumped by Illinois (April 12-14) in the Boilers first visit to Champaign-Urbana since 2010. Nebraska (April 20-21) also posted a series sweep of Purdue in its first visit to West Lafayette since 1907. Illinois (24-12, 6-6 Big Ten), Nebraska (19-20, 11-4) and Michigan State (22-12, 5-4) are a combined 65-44 overall this year.

• Purdue snapped a nine-game losing streak April 24 with a home win against Illinois-Chicago, but has still lost eight straight games in Big Ten play. The Boilers have been swept four times this season, marking the first time that has happened in a quartet of series at least three-game long since 1999 (**Doug Schreiber's** first year as head coach).

20-RUN ERUPTION HELPS PURDUE SNAP NINE-GAME SKID

• **Josh Estill** and **Kyle Wood** both connected for a home run en route to posting season-high RBI totals and Purdue 15 times in the second inning, blowing out Illinois-Chicago, 20-0, in the rubber game of the season series April 24 Alexander Field.

• The Boilmakers snapped a nine-game losing streak, their longest since opening the 2008 season 0-9, with their first shutout win since blanking Indiana 3-0 in the winner's bracket final of the 2012 Big Ten Tournament. Purdue's two highest run totals this year have come against the Flames (19-18). March 9 in Chicago, the Boilers scored 17 times on a season-high 20 hits to snap a seven-game losing skid.

• Estill connected for the first home run to left field at Purdue's new ballpark. It was Purdue's second long ball of the 15-run second inning. Along with his first collegiate homer, the freshman also delivered a three-run double with the bases loaded in his second at-bat of the frame. His seven RBI matched his season total entering the night and represent the most by a Boiler since Neal Gorka had eight in an April 2006 win against Indiana. Wood hit a three-run homer in the second inning, his third long ball of the season and first at Alexander Field. He had an RBI hit in each of his first three at-bats to finish the night with a career-high five RBI. Purdue has now homered twice in the same inning twice this year.

• **Kyle Bischoff** came to the plate three times in the second inning. He ignited the rally with an infield single, walked and scored his second time up, and struck out to finally end the frame. Purdue had not scored 10-plus runs in an inning since the memorable 10-run ninth inning in the series finale at UCLA last year that helped the Boilers overcome a five-run deficit. Dating back to 2008, Purdue had posted a pair of 12-run frames – March 23, 2008 vs. Western Illinois and April 11, 2012 at Ball State. The final score Wednesday represented the Boilers' first 20-run output since winning game two at Murray State, 22-1, in March of last season.

MINCH NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK FOR SECOND TIME

• **Jordan Minch** struck out a season-high eight over seven innings of one-run ball against Nebraska Saturday evening, earning the lefty Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for the second time this season.

• Minch surrendered just four hits and two walks, striking out six of the first 10 batters he faced. He worked a trio of 1-2-3 innings. The only run he surrendered came on a leadoff homer in the sixth inning. The Highland, Ind., native gave way to the bullpen with Purdue leading game two of the Alexander Field dedication doubleheader, 3-1. Nebraska scored nine times over the final two innings to rally for a 10-4 victory. The Huskers scored 24 times in 11 innings against Purdue relievers in the series sweep.

• It was Minch's fourth quality start in his last six appearances as a starter. He also was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on March 18 after working six innings of shutout ball in a series-clinching win at Evansville. The lefty joins Michigan pitcher Evan Hill (three times) and Northwestern outfielder/first baseman Zach Jones (twice) as multiple-time Freshman of the Week winners this year. The Boilers' four total Freshman of the Week honors, **Josh Estill** and **Kyle Johnson** have also been recognized, are equal to Michigan for the most in the league this year.

HUDNALL & McHUGH RIDING STREAKS

• Even though they've both been battling various leg injuries as of late, **Conner Hudnall** and **Sean McHugh** have proved to be gamblers for the Boilmakers. Hudnall has reached base safely in 17 consecutive games in which he has started, highlighted by recent nine-game hitting streaks in all games and Big Ten play. McHugh has reached base safely in 14 consecutive games and 11 straight Big Ten games, hitting safely in 11 of those 14 games overall.

• **HUDNALL'S REACHED SAFELY STREAK: .323 (21-FOR-65), 5 2B, HR, 8 RBI, 8 R, 6 BB, SAC FLY**

• **McHUGH'S 14-GAME REACHED SAFELY STREAK: .358 (19-FOR-53), 4 XBH, HR, 11 RBI, 11 R, 6 BB, 2 SAC**

JOHNSON & STRONG ALSO STREAKING, CONNECT FOR THREE-RUN HOMERS IN SAME INNING

• **Kyle Johnson** and **Cody Strong** have also been two of the Boilers' most consistent performers over the last month. Strong has hit safely in eight straight games and 15 of the last 16, raising his average .155 points during that stretch. He hit safely in all three games of the Penn State, Illinois and Nebraska series. Strong has reached base safely in 15 straight games, becoming a full-time starter over that span. He leads the league with 13 walks and a .542 on-base percentage in Big Ten play.

• Johnson and Strong both hit their first collegiate home runs during Purdue's seven-run eighth inning in the series opener at Illinois. The Boilmakers posted four- and seven-run innings in the game but still lost 17-12 after the Illini had an eight-run rally. The home runs were both three-run shots to left field. Purdue had not hit two home runs in a game this season, much less two long balls in the same inning. **Angelo Cianfrocco** and current assistant coach **David Miller** were the last pair of Boilers to go deep in the same inning. They did it in Purdue's 12-run sixth inning in April of last season at Ball State.

SEVENTEEN NEW PLAYERS, 27 DIFFERENT LINEUP COMBINATIONS

- Entering the weekend, 17 new players have seen action for the Boilers and head coach **Doug Schreiber** has filled out his one through nine batting order in 31 different ways (in 37 games) this season.
- Among the 31 different batting order combinations that Schreiber has tried this season, he has only duplicated four of them. He used the same lineup in all three games of the Northwestern series and in three straight games on the spring break trip. Purdue also had the same lineup in back-to-back games of the Mississippi State tournament in February and the series sweep at Penn State.
- With **Sean McHugh** missing the April 9 game due a sore hamstring and **Jake Hansen** sitting out the April 14 series finale at Illinois, no Boilers have played in ever game this season. McHugh had been the only Purdue player to start each of the first 29 games. Hansen came off the bench in the first two games of the season and then started 30 consecutive games at shortstop.
- **Gavin Downs** was the latest player to make his Purdue debut, working 4 1/3 innings of shutout relief in the April 3 loss to Indiana State. He retired 10 of the first 11 batters he faced. With 13 freshmen and 17 new players having taken the field for the first time this season, Purdue ranks among the national leaders in both categories.
- **Cody Webster** is among the non-freshman newcomers this season. He made the team as a left-handed pitcher during preseason practice. He is also the punter on the Purdue football team. Travis Dorsch was the last student-athlete to play football (1998-01) and baseball (1999-00) at Purdue. He was a punter/kicker on the football team and pitcher for baseball. Dorsch later played in the NFL. Webster is among the 18 pitchers the Boilers have used this season.

DOWNS IMPRESSIVE AT ALEXANDER FIELD

- **Gavin Downs** earned his first collegiate win with five shutout innings in his first start, leading the way for the pitching staff in the 20-0 victory against Illinois-Chicago April 24. Including the 4 2/3 innings he worked in the April 10 game against Ball State that was called due to rain in the top of the fifth, the redshirt-freshman has now surrendered just one unearned run in 14 innings pitched at Alexander Field this season.

WOOD RETURNS TO THE MOUND, ENJOYS BIG WEEKEND AT THE PLATE

- **Kyle Wood** did everything he could to help the Boilers win at Illinois (April 12-14), hitting safely and driving in a run in all three games of the sweep by the Illini. He also returned to the mound for the first time since suffering a forearm strain in the second inning of his Feb. 24 start against Samford in Starkville, Miss. He had served strictly as the team's designated hitter since the injury.
- Wood worked a 1-2-3 inning against Illinois' 6-7-8 hitters in the bottom of the sixth of game two. That scoreless frame helped Purdue maintain a 4-3 lead at the time. The coaching staff decided that Wood's long-term health was more important than that one game and ended his relief outing after the one inning. He pitched two innings as the starting pitcher in the April 21 loss to Nebraska.
- At the plate in Champaign-Urbana, Wood had two hits and at least one RBI in all three games of the series. He finished the weekend 6-for-10 with four RBI and four runs scored. The redshirt-freshman hit for the cycle over the course of the series after recording a triple and home run Sunday. He has recorded an RBI in five straight games, matching **Jack Picchiotti** for the long streak by a Boiler this season.

40 RUNS ALLOWED IN SWEEP AT ILLINOIS

- With the wind blowing out for the entire series, it was a good weekend for the hitters in the April 12-14 three-game set at Illinois, swept by the Fighting Illini. Purdue lost its first series in Champaign-Urbana since 1999 (also a three-game sweep). There were 62 runs scored in three games, including 40 by the home team. The 40 runs against were the most the Boilers have allowed in a Big Ten series since the conference switched from four to three-game weekends beginning in 2009.
- Purdue surrendered a double-figure run total eight times during its nine-game losing streak in April. Purdue was outscored 105-45 during the skid. In March 2001, the Boilers gave up 10-plus runs six times in a span of seven games. However, Purdue managed to win a 16-12 slugfest at Cincinnati during that stretch while surrendering 85 runs total in the seven games.

STRONG SEES ACTION AT FIVE DIFFERENT POSITIONS

- Freshman **Cody Strong** has now seen action at five different defensive positions, starting games at second base, third base and both corner outfield spots this year. He has also seen action at catcher. He was asked to move to second base in time for the Northwestern series (April 5-7). While reaching base safely in the last 15 games, he has started eight times at second base, four times in right field and once in left field and at third base.
- Strong's 15-game reached safely streak has been made possible by 13 walks in Big Ten play, the most in the league. He walked four times and delivered a game-tying, two-run double in the middle game of the Northwestern series, becoming the first Boiler to walk four times in a game since Dan Black (five) in February 2009 versus Notre Dame. During a season in which strikeouts have been an issue for the entire roster, Strong's four Ks in 52 at-bats (75 plate appearances) has made him the most difficult Boiler to strikeout. He has also not committed an error in 58 defensive chances.
- Including designated hitter, **Jack Picchiotti** has also seen action at five different positions this year. Having already started multiple games at catcher and in both corner outfield spots, he made his first start at third base April 9 at Indiana State.

ANDRZEJEWSKI & LUTZ PITCH IN ALL THREE GAMES OF SELECTED BIG TEN SERIES

- In four of the first five Big Ten series of the season, Purdue has used one relief pitcher in all three games of the weekend. **Brett Andrzejewski** appeared in every game of the home series against Ohio State (4 IP, 5 H, R, 0 BB, K), Northwestern (2 1/3 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 0 K) and Nebraska (2 2/3 IP, 3 H, 3 ER, 2 BB, 3 K). He was also the winning pitcher in the 10-inning victory in game two at Penn State March 30. The senior pitched two innings of scoreless relief, working a 1-2-3 bottom of the 10th against PSU's 2-3-4 hitters after Purdue took the lead in the top of the frame.
- **Mike Lutz** (6 1/3 IP, 6 H, 0 R, 2 BB, K) was called on in all three games of the sweep at Penn State. He earned his first collegiate win with 4 1/3 scoreless frames in Sunday's victory. Lutz had another solid relief appearance in game two of the Northwestern series, working 4 1/3 innings. But he could not get the final out of the ninth inning and the Wildcats ended up scoring four times with outs after he retired the first two batters of the frame.
- The Boilermakers had not used the same pitcher in all three games of a weekend series since Connor Sestak in May 2009 against Indiana. However, Sestak faced only five batters in that series as a situational lefty.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE FIRST WIN AT ALEXANDER FIELD

- Purdue's all-freshman battery of **Jack Picchiotti** and **Jordan Minch** led the way as the Boilermakers won their Big Ten series opener against Northwestern April 5, posting their first victory at Alexander Field in the process.
- Picchiotti was 3-for-5 with a home run and three RBI as one of five Purdue players with multiple hits in the win. His two-run homer into the right field bullpen in the eighth inning was the first longball by a Boiler at Alexander Field. Minch pitched into the eighth inning for the second start in a row. He gave Purdue another quality performance, highlighted by no walks allowed. The lefty scattered ninth hits over 7 1/3 innings. Two of the four runs he allowed scored after he left the game with one out in the top of the eighth.
- The Boilermakers took advantage of four Northwestern errors and scored eight times with two outs thanks in part to eight two-out hits, including five consecutive in the first inning. Purdue sent 11 men to the plate during a six-run third inning rally.

PURDUE PITCHING FAILS TO RECORD A STRIKEOUT FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2008

- The three Purdue pitchers that took the mound (**Robert Ramer**, **Mike Lutz** and **Brett Andrzejewski**) in the April 6 loss to Northwestern did not record a strikeout, marking a team first since a May 2008 loss at Illinois. However, that was a seven-inning game in Champaign in which the Boilers only actually pitched six frames.
- Meanwhile in the same game, Northwestern starting pitcher Luke Farrell used the strikeout to escape a pair of big jams. The Boilermakers had the bases loaded with one out in the first and third innings. Both times, Farrell recorded back-to-back strikeouts to end the threats. Purdue settled for just a single run in both frames and left 12 men on base in a game that was decided in the ninth inning.

JOHNSON NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER & FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- **Kyle Johnson** led the way offensively in Purdue's first ever road sweep at Penn State (March 29-31), hitting safely and driving in a run all three games of the weekend to earn Big Ten co-Player of the Week as well as Freshman of the Week honors for his consistency. He finished the series 6-for-11 with two doubles, four RBI, three walks and two runs scored. He reached base safely in nine of his 14 plate appearances for a .643 on-base percentage. He became the third Boilermaker to win Big Ten Freshman of the Week this year, joining **Josh Estill** (Feb. 18) and **Jordan Minch** (March 18). Only Ohio State has also had multiple players win Freshman of the Week honorees this season.
- Johnson's breakout series was highlighted by Sunday's 3-for-3 showing, in which he reached safely in all four of his plate appearances and scored the go-ahead run in the eighth inning after singling to begin the frame. The San Diego native entered the weekend just 5-for-42 this season, but seemed prime to bust out of season-opening slump based on some recent tough luck at-bats. A .147 batting average on balls in play over the first month of the season suggested the same.
- Johnson is the first freshman around the conference to win Big Ten Player or Pitcher of the Week this year. On four occasions last season, a freshman was named Big Ten Player/Pitcher and Freshman of the Week and it also happened once in 2011 (when FOW was added to the weekly awards program). John Hunter (2003) was the last Purdue freshman to win Big Ten Player of the Week honors. Matt Bischoff was the Pitcher of the Week as a freshman in 2007.

FRESHMAN CLASS & STARTING PITCHING LEAD THE WAY IN SWEEP AT PENN STATE

• Purdue's freshman class led the way in the program's first-ever series sweep at Penn State. Along with **Kyle Johnson's** big series (6-for-11, 4 RBI), freshmen **Jordan Minch**, **Jack Picchiotti** and **Mike Lutz** also played starring roles.

• Minch worked eight innings of one-run ball in his first series-opening start of the season, retiring 16 of 18 batters during one impressive stretch. He was his longest out of the year and among the pitching staff, only **Robert Ramer** has gone deeper in a game this season. Picchiotti had multiple hits in all three games of the series, finishing the weekend 6-for-13 while putting the ball in play in each of his 14 plate appearances.

• Lutz pitched in relief in all three games of the series, finishing the weekend having worked 6 1/3 scoreless innings over his three appearances. He earned his first collegiate win with 4 1/3 scoreless frames in Sunday's victory.

• Ramer was deserving of a win after putting together a quality start in game two the PSU series, working seven innings of two-run ball. But the PSU scored twice in the ninth inning to send the game to extra innings. In Sunday's series finale, **Brad Schreiber** struck out a career-high nine over 4 2/3 innings, the most Ks by a Purdue pitcher in just over a year. The right-hander struck out seven of the 11 batters he faced from the second through fifth innings, highlighted by a 1-2-3 third inning that featured three Ks. He was one out away from qualifying for the win but Purdue committed two errors in the fifth inning to allow three runs to score, tying the score.

• The Boilermakers won game two in 10 innings in what was their first extra-innings game of the season. **Sean McHugh** delivered the big hit in the 10th inning, a two-out RBI single. Purdue has won six straight series against Penn State dating back to 2008, winning 17 of the 22 games during that stretch.

EICHMANN SOLID IN RELIEF AS BUTLER SNAPS BOILERS' 17-GAME MIDWEEK WIN STREAK

• Butler scored seven times in the second inning and rode the big rally to an 8-4 victory over Purdue April 2, snapping the Boilers' 17-game midweek win streak that dated back to March 2011. Purdue lost to Butler for the first time since 1995, snapping a nine-game win streak in the series. It was also the Bulldogs' first win in West Lafayette since 1983.

• As Purdue's third pitcher of the inning, **Joe Eichmann** finally brought the seven-run rally to an end. He went on to enjoy his best performance as a Boiler. The sophomore worked 7 2/3 innings of one-run ball in the longest outing of his college career, throwing over 100 pitches while striking out four and issuing only one walk. He worked four 1-2-3 innings and retired the final 11 batters he faced.

• Eichmann's outing was the longest relief appearance by a Boiler since at least the beginning of the 2008 season. Drew Wurdack (twice in 2010), Blake Mascarello (once in 2010), **Robert Ramer** (twice in 2011) and Sean Collins (once in 2012) each pitched at least five innings in relief for the longest outings out the bullpen since 2008.

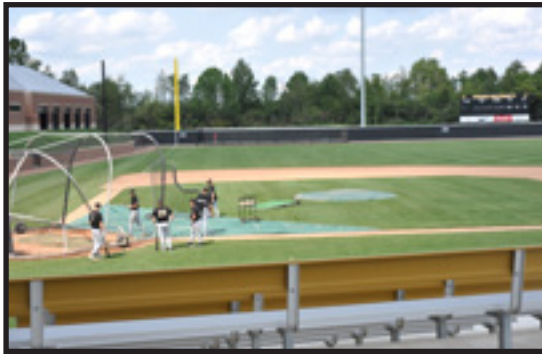

After closing out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion during the 2012 Big Ten Conference championship season, Purdue baseball moved into Alexander Field last August. Alexander Field holds just under 2,000 spectators and has a variety of seating available for Boilermaker baseball fans, including three private suites, box seats behind home plate, bleacher seating behind both dugouts and a grass berm down the left field line.

The inaugural season at the new home of the Boilermakers will feature a 19-game schedule. The first game was set for Tuesday, March 19, against Illinois-Chicago, but it was canceled due to a frigid wind chill and temps in the 30s. Ohio State was the opponent for the first Big Ten series (March 22-24), and a formal dedication game was held Saturday, April 20, before the middle game of a weekend series against Nebraska.

A Big Ten championship ring ceremony and dinner, during which the 2012 team was honored, was held at the new stadium in October after the completion of fall practice and the Gold and Black Series.



Purdue athletics gratefully acknowledge John Purdue Club members and former baseball student-athletes who have donated generously for the new stadium, particularly Dave Alexander, who provided the lead gift in honor of his parents, John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander believed in the value of intercollegiate athletic competition and saw it as a way of enhancing leadership. The two Purdue graduates also believed in service and supporting others. The Alexanders were members of the Purdue President's Council and inaugural members of the John Purdue Club in 1958-59.

Dave Alexander was Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991 – winning 407 games and leading the Boilermakers to the 1987 NCAA Tournament – and an athletics department administrator through 1994. The personable “Alex” lettered for the Boilermakers from 1960 to 1962 and, like his parents, graduated from Purdue. He retired as head coach as the program's all-time wins leader.
