– Purdue Hosts Michigan For Season's First Home Weekend Series –

Having played nearly 40 games since last hosting a Big Ten series, Purdue baseball finally gets a chance to stay at home, opening the home portion of its conference schedule this weekend when Michigan visits Lambert Field for a final time.

Friday's series opener is slated for a 4 p.m. first pitch. Saturday's middle game is scheduled to be the first of Purdue's four Big Ten Network games this year and get underway at noon. The series finale Sunday is set for 1 p.m.

The Boilermakers (18-10, 1-2 Big Ten) were on the road for the final two weekends of conference play of 2010 as well as the Big Ten Tournament. Purdue has not hosted a three-game weekend series since taking two-of-three from Michigan State, May 8-10 of last season. The Boilermakers have played 39 games since that Michigan State weekend, 34 of those contests being played away from West Lafayette.

Meanwhile, Michigan (7-19, 1-2 Big Ten) will be making its first appearance at Lambert Field since 2006. The two teams did not play regular-season conference series against each other in both 2008 and 2009. Purdue's last series victory against the Wolverines came in 2004 at Lambert Field. And since 2006, Michigan has 11 won of the 14 meetings.

Picked second in the Big Ten preseason poll after finishing second a year ago, the Wolverines have scuffled over the first seven weeks of the season and enter the weekend with a conference-low seven overall wins. Michigan is ranked last in the league in team batting average (.247) and slugging percentage (.311). A 3-0 showing at a tournament hosted by Eastern Michigan the weekend of March 18-20 marked the only time this year the Wolverines have posted consecutive wins.

Purdue enters the series this season with the Big Ten's top-ranked offense, leading the league in 12 notable categories, highlighted by batting average, slugging percentage and runs scored. The Boilermakers are also expected to have their preferred weekend rotation in tact for the first time since the opening weekend of the spring break trip. **Matt Morgan** is expected to make his season debut at Lambert Field Friday. **Brad Schreiber** and **Joe Haase** have won Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors each of the last two weeks.

Purdue and Michigan both lost two-of-three during the opening weekend of Big Ten play. The Boilermakers lost their series at preseason favorite against Minnesota at Target Field, a stadium they had only seen on television prior to April 1. The Wolverines also lost a Saturday rubber game to drop their series with Indiana at home. A quality start from lefty starter Bobby Brosnahan (6 1/3 innings of two-run ball) and a big two-run homer from shortstop Kevin Krantz in the seventh inning lifted Michigan to its game two win against Indiana. Brosnahan also beat Purdue in game two of last year's series in Ann Arbor.

Both teams are led by a cleanup-hitting catcher. The Wolverines' Coley Crank finished the Indiana series 6-for-9 while reaching base safely in nine of his 12 plate appearances. He has recorded a team-best 10 doubles this season. Patrick Biondi (11-of-13 stealing bases) and Michael O'Neill (13-of-17) could test Purdue catcher **Kevin Plawecki** this weekend. The Boilermakers' backstop has thrown out nine of 19 would-be base stealers this year.

Michigan's projected game one starter, Kyle Clark, has given up more unearned (13) than earned runs (11). With 17 strikeouts and seven walks in 28 1/3 innings, opposing batters put the ball in play often but have only recorded six extra-base hits against the right-hander. Game three starter Tyler Mills leads the team with 29 strikeouts and has not given up a home run either.

Following the weekend series at Lambert Field, Purdue begins a 10-game road stretch Tuesday that includes Big Ten series at Penn State (April 15-17) and Northwestern (April 22-24). The Boilermakers' Saturday afternoon games each of the next three weekends are scheduled to be televised live by the Big Ten Network.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 13th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 343-328 overall record and a 176-168 Big Ten mark through his first 12 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons, while Joe Sexson guided the Boilermakers for 527 games over 18 years.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher and newcomers Kevin Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Brad Schreiber were recognized for standout freshman seasons. Bischoff led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 48 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 16 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last six years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

BOILERMAKERS HOST MICHIGAN FOR FIRST HOME WEEKEND SERIES

- Purdue finally gets a chance to play an entire weekend series at home, welcoming Michigan to Lambert Field for the final time. The Wolverines will be making their first trip to West Lafayette since 2006.
- Having been on the road for the final two Big Ten series of 2010 as well as the Big Ten Tournament, the Boilermakers have played 39 games since they last hosted a home series. And another lengthy road stretch is on the horizon, as Purdue is slated to play 10 consecutive games away from Lambert Field after this weekend's three-game set against the Wolverines.
- Michigan has played well against the Boilermakers the last few seasons, winning 11 of the last 14 games dating back to 2006. The two teams did not play a regular-season conference series in 2008 and 2009, but the Wolverines defeated Purdue twice at the 2008 Big Ten Tournament in Ann Arbor and won a neutral-site meeting at the 2009 BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge.
- The Boilermakers' series-opening victory in Ann Arbor last season snapped Michigan's six-game win streak in the series.

LEAGUE-LEADING BOILERS; HIT BY PITCH PILING UP

- Purdue enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in 14 notable statistical categories, including nearly every significant offensive category. The Boilermakers are also among the Top 20 nationally in six categories.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten in hit by pitch by a wide margin. The Boilers have been hit by a pitch 57 times in their first 28 games, averaging more than two hit batsmen per contest. Purdue batters have been hit by a pitch nearly twice as often as second-place Illinois (30). Meanwhile, the Boiler pitchers have plunked only 19 opposing batters, tied for the fewest in the league.
- At least one Purdue batter has been hit by a pitch in 26 of the first 28 games, the lone exceptions being the middle game of the Tennessee-Martin (March 12) and Minnesota (April 2) series. The Boilermakers have been hit five times in game on four occasions this season, winning three of the four games. The lone loss came in the home opener to Illinois State (March 22).

SCHREIBER TOPS IN STRIKEOUTS, PLawecki TOUGHEST TO K

- **Brad Schreiber** enters the weekend leading the league with 38 strikeouts in 36 innings pitched. He's also tops in the Big Ten with a .207 batting average against, giving up only 28 hits in his first six starts. And by issuing only nine walks, he has compiled a higher strikeout total (38) than walks and hits combined (37).
- Schreiber's batterymate **Kevin Plawecki** leads Purdue with a .364 batting average and has emerged as the toughest player to strikeout in the Big Ten. He has whiffed only five times in 107 at-bats (127 plate appearances) to rank 12th nationally entering the week. The sophomore has fanned just once every 21.4 at-bats (and once every 25.4 plate appearances). For his college career, he has gone down on strikes only 16 times in 311 at-bats (356 plate appearances).

PURDUE SCORES FIRST EARLY AND OFTEN

- Purdue has scored first in 23 of its first 28 games this season (including the first 12 in a row) thanks in part to a 68-16 scoring edge in the first two innings of a game. The early offense has been the primary reason that the Boilers have failed to hold the lead at some point only four times in their first 28 games: March 15 at No. 1 Vanderbilt, March 22 vs. Illinois State and games one and three of the Minnesota series (April 1-2). The other game in which Purdue did not score first was the March 12 win at Tennessee-Martin, but rallied to win.
- Because the Boilermakers have scored first so often, they've also trailed very infrequently early this year. Purdue did not trail in the first seven games of its eight-game win streak (from Feb. 27-March 12), a streak of 61 consecutive innings. For the season, the Boilers have held the lead for 147 of the 249 innings (59 percent) they've played.
- The Purdue pitching staff did not give up a run in the first inning until game No. 13 on March 12. The Boilermakers have batted first in 23 of the first 28 games.

It marked the second time this season he has homered in back-to-back games. He finished the series 6-for-12 with five RBIs. **Stephen Talbott** was also a productive 6-for-11 with three RBIs and three runs scored while making some solid defensive plays in left field.

HAASE RIDING SCORELESS-INNINGS STREAK & A CONSTANT IN BIG GAMES

• Thanks in part to a complete-game shutout in his first career Big Ten start, **Joe Haase** enters the weekend riding a consecutive scoreless-innings streak of 14. He has not given up a run in each of his last four appearances. Top-ranked Vanderbilt (March 15) was the last team to score against Haase, who hit the last batter he faced in his start against Vandy. That base runner ended up scoring after the bullpen had taken over for Haase. But the Commodores didn't score while Haase was on the mound in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings. Thus, it has been a streak of 17 consecutive innings since a team scored while Haase was literally on the mound. His ERA has dropped from 4.79 to 2.86 during his scoreless-innings streak.

• Haase has pitched in nine games this year, making five starts. Coincidentally, he's been on the mound in some of Purdue's biggest games of the year so far. His finest performance came on the big stage of Target Field in the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota, striking out a career-high seven in his first collegiate complete-game shutout. He scattered seven singles and did not give up a hit after the sixth inning.

• The junior pitched in relief in the wins against nationally-ranked Connecticut and Pittsburgh at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge. Haase led Purdue to another win against a nationally-ranked team when he beat Louisville with 8 2/3 innings of solid work in the March 8 midweek opener. He started the game against top-ranked Vanderbilt on the spring break trip, as well as the home opener against Illinois State.

• **Cameron Perkins** enters the weekend riding his second 10-game hit streak of the season. He has hit safely in 25 of the 27 games in which he has played and reached base safely in all 27. The sophomore also hit safely in the first 10 games of the year, posting a career-best 14-game streak in the process after collecting at least one hit in all four games of the 2010 Big Ten Tournament.

The Boilermakers have had at least one player honored following six of the first seven weekends of the year.

• Since the Big Ten began recognizing Players and Pitchers of the Week in 1990, the five different Boilermakers honored this year represents a new program high. Previously, Purdue had four honorees in 1997 and 2006. And with Morgan winning Pitcher of the Week twice, the six weekly honors are also a new team benchmark. The Boilermakers won five weekly awards in 2003 and 2006.

• Thanks to six innings of shutout, three-hit ball in his season debut at Lambert Field March 27, **Brad Schreiber** was recognized as the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week. The sophomore surrendered only three singles in his victory against Bradley, improving to 4-0 on the year. He struck out seven, one shy of his career high, and did not issue a walk.

SPILLNER SURGES THROUGH MARCH

- **Tyler Spillner** was Purdue's hottest hitter in the month of March, ending the month riding a career-best nine-game hitting streak (which he extended to 10 before it was snapped) and hitting safely in 13 of the final 14 games of the month total. He batted over .400 for the month even though he went 0-for-7 in the Lipscomb series the first weekend of March.
- The junior entered the month batting .276 and saw his average dip to .222 after the Lipscomb weekend. But the Purdue leadoff man batted .472 (25-for-53) over the final 13 games of March. He leads the team with 15 extra-base hits, recording 11 during his 10-game hit streak. He has also posted eight multi-hit efforts during his streak.

TALBOTT STILL A PERFECT BASE THIEF

- Purdue has been active on the base paths for much of the season, successfully stealing at least one base in 22 of the first 28 games. Eleven Boilermakers have swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** leads the way at a perfect 12-for-12. The sophomore is also a perfect 17-for-17 in his career.
- Talbott enters the weekend leading the team with 30 runs scored. He did not batter any higher than eighth in the lineup until getting a chance to leadoff in the finale of the Tennessee Tech series (March 20). But for the season he has batted eighth or ninth in 23 of the 27 games he has started.
- Talbott was the only Boiler that hit safely in all eight games of the spring break trip, finishing the road trip through Tennessee with a team-best .406 batting average. He finished a home run shy of the cycle in the March 12 win at Tennessee-Martin.

SCHREIBER CONSISTENT IN HIS FIRST SIX STARTS

The sophomore took a no-hitter into the sixth inning of his Feb. 27 win at Morehead State and earned Big

- Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for six innings of shutout ball in his March 27 win against Bradley. He has left the game with the lead in five of his first six starts, all but the March 20 game at Tennessee Tech, a contest the Boilers rallied to win.
- Schreiber has struck out seven or more batters over six innings in four of his first six starts. He fanned a career-high eight March 20 at Tennessee Tech.
- By winning each of his first three starts, Schreiber became the first Purdue weekend starter to open the season 3-0 since Jay Buente in 2006. Buente won three of his first four starts as the team's No. 1 arm, the lone no decision coming in a Purdue win at nationally-ranked North Carolina.
- Schreiber missed his April 2 start at Minnesota due to strep throat.

EIGHT-RUN NINTH INNING LIFTS PURDUE TO RUBBER GAME WIN AT TENN. TECH

- Purdue baseball scored eight times in the ninth inning to break open a tie game and defeat Tennessee Tech, 12-4, in the March 20 rubber game of the weekend series and finale of the eight-game spring break trip. The team's biggest rally since scoring nine times in a March 26, 2010, home win against Chicago State gave Purdue its fifth consecutive victorious weekend to begin the season.
- **Kevin Plawecki** tied a program single-game record with the first five-hit effort by a Boilermaker since April 2009. He singled five times and was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the ninth inning.
- **Stephen Talbott** knocked in the go-ahead run in the ninth with a squeeze bunt that he beat out for a hit. **Andrew Dixon** scored the go-ahead tally after opening the inning with a base hit. Dixon later delivered a three-run triple in his second at-bat of the frame. **David Miller** also had two hits in the inning.

CIANFROCCO & MORGAN SIDELINED; RAMER PROVIDES TRUE RELIEF

- The March 11 series-opening win at Tennessee-Martin came at a steep price for Purdue. Starting pitcher **Matt Morgan** and **Angelo Cianfrocco** both left the game early with injuries and have not played since. Morgan struggled with his control due to a finger injury and Cianfrocco reinjured his right shoulder while hitting a foul ball.
- Morgan returned to the rotation for the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota, pitching into the fifth inning. Cianfrocco's status is still uncertain but his prognosis is better than originally believed and the sophomore is likely to return sometime in April.
- Morgan's injury forced him from the game with one out in the third inning of the series opener at UT Martin. **Robert Ramer** picked up the slack out of the bullpen, working five innings of one-run relief to earn the victory. He struck out a career-high five while matching the longest outing of his career. Ramer went on to start the series openers at Tennessee Tech and Bradley, again working five solid innings. He earned the win at Tech but settled for a no decision against Bradley.

WALK-OFF LOSS SNAPS WIN STREAK; BOILERS VERSUS TOP-RANKED VANDY

• Purdue's eight-game win streak from Feb. 27-March 12 ended in dramatic fashion in the series finale at Tennessee-Martin. The Boilermakers carried a four-run lead into the bottom of the ninth inning and were two outs away from completing a three-game sweep. But the Skyhawks hit a pair of home runs in the ninth inning, including a walk-off two-run blast. It was Purdue's second walk-off loss of the season.

• March 15, the Boilers were shutout for the first time since April 2009 in a loss at top-ranked Vanderbilt (NCBWA poll). It marked the first time that Purdue played a team ranked No. 1 in the country since getting swept in a 2005 series at Texas.

SPILLNER SELECTED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

• **Tyler Spillner** hit safely and scored a run in all four games the week of March 7-13 while batting .500, earning the junior Big Ten Conference co-Player of the Week honors for his consistency at the plate.

• Spillner busted out of an early-season slump with a big weekend series at Tennessee-Martin, finishing the three-game set a team-best 7-for-13 with three extra-base hits, four RBIs and six runs scored. He led off the series finale at UT Martin with his first home run of the season. For the week, Purdue's leadoff man reached base safely to begin an inning in five of his seven opportunities, none more important than his leadoff double in the top of the ninth inning of game two of the UTM series. He eventually scored the game-tying run.

McHUGH GOES DEEP FOR HIS FIRST COLLEGIATE HIT

• Freshman **Sean McHugh** made his first start for Purdue in the March 16 loss at Belmont and took advantage of the opportunity with a 2-for-3 showing. He was also hit by a pitch and scored twice. But the highlight of the day came in his first at-bat when he went deep to left field for his first collegiate hit. The two-run homer gave Purdue a 3-0 lead in the second inning. McHugh also hit the first home run of the season (and so far only long ball) at Lambert Field, connecting for a solo blast to left field in the March 23 win against Wabash.

SPILLNER & CHARLES GO DEEP IN HOMER-HEAVY SERIES FINALE

• After no home runs were hit in the first two games of the Purdue-UT Martin series (March 11-13), both teams went deep three times in the finale. **Tyler Spillner** and **Eric Charles** both connected for homers, Spillner leading off the game with a long ball for the second time in his career. Charles, meanwhile, posted his first career multi-homer game with a solo shot and two-run blast. He joined **Angelo Cianfrocco** as Boilers with a multi-homer game this season and **Cameron Perkins**, **Kevin Plawecki** and **Stephen Talbott** as active Purdue players to accomplish the feat in their careers.

• Spillner and Charles had also gone deep at Tennessee-Martin's Skyhawk Field as freshmen in 2009. Charles has now hit three of his five career home runs and Spillner two of his five career long balls in Martin, Tenn.

BIG HITS FROM DIXON & SERRATO IN COMEBACK WIN

• Purdue posted its first true comeback win of the season March 12, scoring in each of the final five innings – highlighted by a two-run ninth – to defeat Tennessee-Martin, 8-7. The Boilermakers trailed for much of the game after giving up a first-inning run for the first time this season.

• **Andrew Dixon** and **Barrett Serrato** came through with keys hits late in the game. Dixon singled with two outs in each of his final two at-bats, driving in the game-tying run in the sixth and eighth innings. Later with one out, the bases loaded and Purdue trailing by a run, Serrato singled home the game-tying run. The Boilers went ahead moments later when **Ryan Bridges** drove in the go-ahead run with a sacrifice fly to left field.

• Purdue won its sixth straight game March 8 at No. 20 Louisville, posting its third win against a nationally-ranked opponent from the BIG EAST Conference this year. After winning each of the first two games of the Tennessee-Martin series, Purdue opened the year with an 11-2 mark. That represented the program's best start since the 1993 team was also 11-2. The 1993 Boilermakers began the year 16-2 on their way to posting a 36-win campaign.

PLAWECKI FINALLY HELD HITLESS

- **Kevin Plawecki** managed to record at least one hit in each of the first 11 games of the season in which he played. The longest hit streak of the sophomore's Purdue came to an end with an 0-for-5 showing in the middle game of the Tennessee-Martin series March 12. The 11-game run represents the Boilers' longest single-season hit streak so far this year.

MORE NOTABLES ON LOUISVILLE WIN

- Although the teams played only twice from 1999-10, Purdue managed to post its first win against Louisville since 1998 March 8. In the process of winning 6-4, the Boilermakers snapped a pair of notable U of L streaks.
- Purdue was the first team to score more than four runs against the Cardinals this year. The Louisville pitching staff entered the game with a 1.47 team ERA.
- The Boilermakers snapped Louisville's 11-game win streak against Big Ten Conference teams dating back to 2009. The Cardinals won all three of their games at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge and were 23-2 against Big Ten opponents since 2006.

MORGAN GOES THE DISTANCE, HAASE PITCHES INTO THE NINTH

- **Matt Morgan** kept Lipscomb off the scoreboard entirely with his three-hit, complete-game shutout in Purdue's 1-0 win on March 4. It was the senior's first career complete-game shutout and second complete game overall, earning him Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for the second time this season.
- **Joe Haase** finished one out shy of also pitching a complete game in the March 8 win at Louisville, but was still impressive with 8 2/3 innings of four-run ball. He did not issue a walk. At that point in the season, it was the longest outing of the junior's career by more than four innings.
- Morgan was honored for the third time in his career after striking out 10 in Purdue's first 1-0 win since 2007. While registering his third career game with 10 or more strikeouts, he struck out at least one batter in eight of his nine innings. His five 1-2-3 frames were highlighted by a ninth inning in which he retired the heart of the Lipscomb lineup in order. He needed only 108 pitches to go the distance in a game that was played in one hour and 51 minutes.

ANOTHER NO-HIT BID INTO THE SIXTH

- **Lance Breedlove** carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning of his first start as a Boilermaker, helping Purdue win game one of the March 6 doubleheader at Lipscomb. The right-hander gave up a leadoff single in the sixth but still managed to earn his first win as a member of the program with 5 1/3 innings of three-run ball.
- It marked the second Sunday in a row that a Purdue pitcher carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning. **Brad Schreiber** did likewise Feb. 27 at Morehead State before it was broken up by a two-out hit.

PERKINS' HITTING STREAK SNAPPED AT 14

- **Cameron Perkins'** career-best 14-game hitting streak dating back to the final four games of the 2010 season was snapped in the March 8 win at Louisville. The 14-game run matched **Eric Charles** for the longest streak by an active Boilermaker. Charles hit safely in 14 straight games in 2009 on his way to earning Freshman All-American honors.
- Perkins extended his hitting streak in his final at-bat of the March 4 win at Lipscomb, delivering

the big hit of the 1-0 victory with a two-out, run-scoring single in the eighth inning to plate **Stephen Talbott** from second base. He also delivered a clutch bases-clearing, two-out double that put Purdue ahead in the ninth inning of game two of the Morehead State series. The sophomore came back the next day and connected for a two-run homer to center field in both games of the doubleheader.

FIVE RELIEVERS ALREADY WITH AT LEAST ONE SAVE

- The Purdue bullpen has continued to backup the starting pitchers with solid relief work. Five pitchers have teamed up for Purdue's conference-leading eight saves. **Nick Wittgren** has closed out a quartet of games and pitched in relief a team-high 12 games. **Lance Breedlove**, **Calvin Gunter**, **Blake Mascarello** and **Pat Gannon** have also earned saves while recording the final out of a game.
- Wittgren most impressive outing came in the Feb. 20 win against Pittsburgh. He slammed the door on a potential Pitt rally with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh inning. He entered the game with the Boilers clinging to a one-run lead in the seventh and struck out the No. 4 and 5 hitters in the Pitt lineup to leave the bases loaded. After a 1-2-3 eighth inning, the Panthers posted back-to-back two-out hits against the sophomore right-hander in the ninth. But he again retired the Pitt cleanup hitter to close out the victory.
- Mascarello backed up Breedlove with 3 2/3 scoreless innings of relief in game two of the Lipscomb series.
- Gannon struck out a career-high seven and pitched over four leadoff singles while closing out the March 18 series-opening win at Tennessee Tech.
- Seven different pitchers had at least one save last season as Purdue totaled 14 as a team, none having more than three saves.




The 2011 season will be Purdue's last at Lambert Field. The new northwest baseball facility is set to open for the 2012 home opener. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. Purdue will close out Lambert Field this year with an eight-game homestand from May 11-21, highlighted by Big Ten Conference series against Illinois and Iowa.
