- PURDUE TO SQUARE OFF WITH MSU FOR BIG TEN SHOWDOWN SERIES -

Purdue baseball's final regular-season road trip doubles as the biggest of the year, as the Boilermakers travel to East Lansing, Mich., for a Big Ten showdown series with conference co-leader Michigan State.

Game times at McLane Baseball Stadium are set for 3 p.m. Friday and 1 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

Purdue (30-13, 10-5 Big Ten), Michigan State (27-14, 10-5 Big Ten) and Ohio State (20-19, 9-6 Big Ten) each posted a series sweep at home to pull in front in the Big Ten standings.

The Boilermakers aim to become the first Big Ten team to post a win at McLane Stadium this spring. The Spartans swept both Minnesota and Penn State in East Lansing. Purdue has played well away from home though, compiling a 22-11 record in games played away from Lambert Field. With an eight-game homestand getting underway next week, the Boilers are the only team in the league that will be at home for each of their final two weekends of the regular season.

While the Purdue-Michigan State series highlights the Big Ten weekend schedule, it's unlikely that the conference title will be determined this weekend in East Lansing. Unless one team is able to post another sweep, the series winner will take only a one-game lead in the standings. And with Ohio State only one game back, the final two weekends of the year figure to remain equally important. Purdue does not play Ohio State during the regular season. Michigan State does not play Michigan for a Big Ten series.

Purdue and Michigan State have been the top two offensive teams in the Big Ten for much of the season, entering the weekend ranked one-two in the league in batting average, slugging percentage, runs scored, doubles and sacrifice flies. The first six hitters in both teams' regular lineups are all batting above .300.

Michigan State leadoff man Brandon Eckerle leads the Big Ten with 70 hits and a .389 batting average. First baseman Jeff Holm is MSU's top power hitter (6 homers, 19 extra-base hits) but also leads the team with 19 stolen bases. No. 2 hitter Ryan Jones, who is riding a 30-game hitting streak, Eckerle and Holm have all walked more than they have struck out.

Both teams rely heavily on right-handed starting pitchers. The Spartans' Kurt Wunderlich (7-1) and Tony Bucciferro (6-2) have both pitched more than 70 innings over their 11 starts, teaming up for a 13-3 record. Both upperclassmen rely on their teammates to field their positions. Wunderlich has given up 73 hits in 71 2/3 innings while issuing 20 walks vs. 53 strikeouts. Bucciferro has struck out (44) and walked (11) fewer batters in two more innings (73 2/3) while surrendering nearly the same number of hits (74). Purdue faced both right-handers last season

For the Boilers, **Matt Morgan** and **Joe Haase** will be looking to perform better on the road than they did in their starts at Northwestern in the April 23 doubleheader. The starter for Sunday's series finale won't be determined until the day of the game for the third weekend in a row.

There's also a strong possibility that a two-way player could have an impact on the series both at the plate and on the mound. Needed in the bullpen for the season's stretch run, **Angelo**

Cianfrocco and **Cameron Perkins** have made their collegiate debuts on the mound over the last two weekends. For Michigan State, Tony Wieber has recently seen more playing time in right field. He's 5-0 with four saves in his 17 relief appearances and is batting .354 (17-for-48) with nine doubles.

Purdue has won two-of-three against MSU each of the last two seasons and emerged victorious in six of the last eight meetings dating back to the 2008 series finale at Lambert Field. The Boilermakers' .690 winning percentage (20-9) against Michigan State is the best against Big Ten opponent during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** 13-year tenure. Due in part to cancelations, the two teams only played five times from 2002-05.

The Spartans began the year 7-1 and opened Big Ten play with a 6-1 record. They're 20-13 overall and 4-4 in conference action since those hot starts.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 13th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 343-328 overall record and a 176-168 Big Ten mark through his first 12 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons, while Joe Sexson guided the Boilermakers for 527 games over 18 years.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher and newcomers Kevin Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Brad Schreiber were recognized for standout freshman seasons. Bischoff led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 48 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 16 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last six years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boiler-makers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE SET FOR SHOWDOWN SERIES WITH BIG TEN CO-LEADER MICHIGAN STATE

- Fresh off a sweep of rival Indiana, its first against the Hoosiers since 1997, Purdue heads out on its final road trip of the regular season, traveling to East Lansing for a Big Ten showdown series against Michigan State. The teams enter the weekend tied atop the conference standings after both swept a series last weekend. The Spartans swept Penn State at home and are 6-0 at McLane Stadium in Big Ten play this
- The Boilermakers won game one of the Indiana series in 12 innings. Tyler Spillner delivered the game-tying hit with two outs in the ninth inning and freshman Sean McHugh played the hero in the 12th. McHugh singled to left field on a full-count pitch as a pinch hitter with two outs. It was Purdue's first walkoff win since defeating Minnesota in 10 innings in the 2010 Big Ten opener on a game-winning double from Cameron Perkins
- Joe Haase pitched the Boilers to the game two win, giving up just one earned run over 8 2/3 innings. It marked the third time this season he has pitched at least eight innings in a quality start. Purdue gave him an early lead to work with thanks to a four-run second inning.
- Cameron Perkins homered twice and drove in a career-high six runs in the series finale. It was his second career multi-homer game and the first six-RBI effort by a Boiler since 2009. Calvin Gunter led the way on the mound with 3 1/3 shutout innings of relief, working 6 2/3 innings of one-run ball in the series
- Following this weekend's big series, Purdue closes the regular season with an eight-game homestand. The Boilermakers are the only Big Ten team set to play their final two weekend series at home.
- Purdue has scored 77 runs over the last eight games (posting a 7-1 record) and scored four or more times in an inning 15 times in the last 16 games. The Boilermakers have won four straight Big Ten series.

LEAGUE-LEADING BOILERS; HIT BY PITCH PILING UP

- Purdue enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in 16 notable statistical categories, including every significant offensive category. The Boilermakers are also among the Top 30 nationally in seven categories.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten in hit by pitch by a wide margin. The Boilers have been hit by a pitch 79 times, averaging nearly two hit batsmen per contest. Purdue batters have been hit by a pitch nearly twice as often as second-place Illinois (43). Meanwhile, the Boiler pitchers have plunked only 32 opposing batters, the second fewest in the league.
- · At least one Purdue batter has been hit by a pitch in 39 of the first 43 games, the lone exceptions being the middle game of the Tennessee-Martin (March 12) and Minnesota (April 2) series, opener of the Penn State series (April 15) and finale of the Northwestern series (April 24). McHUGH PLAYS THE HERO IN 12TH-INNING WALK-OFF WIN

- Purdue would not have been able to post its first series sweep of Indiana since 1997 without rallying for a walk-off win in the series opener. **Tyler Spillner** sent the game into extra innings with a two-out run-scoring single, plating **Andrew Dixon** after Dixon had led off the bottom of the ninth with a pinch-hit single.
- But it was freshman **Sean McHugh** that was mobbed by his teammates as the Boilers celebrated a 12th-inning walk-off victory. McHugh was the fourth player to occupy the No. 9 spot in the lineup. He was sent to the plate as a pinch hitter in the 12th. After **Barrett Serrato** and **David Miller** stole third and second base, McHugh singled into left field on a full-count pitch, delivering the game-winning two-out RBI.
- The walk-off win was Purdue's first since defeating Minnesota in 10 innings of the 2010 Big Ten opener. **Cameron Perkins** also played the hero as a freshman that day. But McHugh became the first Purdue player to deliver a walk-off hit as a pinch hitter since John Cummins in April 2006.

WITTGREN NAMED TO STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- Currently leading the Big Ten with nine saves, **Nick Wittgren** was one of 46 relievers to be selected for the NCBWA's Stopper of the Year midseason watch list. Wittgren was the only player from a Big Ten school on the updated list. The Stopper of the Year Award recognizes the nation top Division I relief pitcher.
- Sixteen of Wittgren's 19 relief appearances on the mound have seen him finish a game, a total that ranks third in the Big Ten. With 39 strikeouts in 38 1/3 innings pitched, he's averaging 9.16 strikeouts per nine innings. He has also compiled a .246 batting average against and issued just seven walks.
- Wittgren has posted four of his nine saves in relief appearances longer than one inning. He closed out Big Ten series-opening wins against Michigan, Penn State and Northwestern and was the inning pitcher in the series opener against Indiana.
- Wittgren recorded a save in six consecutive appearances from April 6-23, closing out four straight Purdue wins in the process. He worked three scoreless innings, striking out a career-high six, to wrap up the series-opening shutout of Michigan. He retired 14 of the 16 batters he faced, giving up a single against Michigan and hitting a batter at Ball State, in his stretch of four saves in a week's time.

PURDUE SCORES FIRST EARLY AND OFTEN

- Purdue has scored first in 33 of its first 43 games this season (including the first 12 in a row) thanks in part to a 104-30 scoring edge in the first two innings of a game. The early offense has been the primary reason that the Boilers have failed to hold the lead at some point only six times in their first 40 games: March 15 at No. 1 Vanderbilt, March 22 vs. Illinois State, games one and three of the Minnesota series (April 1-2) and the middle games of the Penn State (April 17) and Northwestern (April 23) series.
- Because Purdue has scored first so often, the team has also trailed infrequently this year, especially in wins. For the season, the Boilers have held the lead for 227 of the 386 innings (59 percent) they've played. Purdue did not trail in the first seven games of its eight-game win streak (from Feb. 27-March 12), a streak of 61 consecutive innings.
- The Purdue pitching staff did not give up a run in the first inning until game No. 13 on March 12. The Boilermakers have batted first in 32 of the first 43 games.

TALBOTT STILL A PERFECT BASE THIEF

- Purdue has been active on the base paths for much of the season, successfully stealing at least one base in 33 of the first 43 games. Eleven Boilermakers have swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** leads the way at a perfect 16-for-16. The sophomore is also a perfect 21-for-21 in his career.
- Talbott enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 47 runs scored. He did not batter any higher than eighth in the lineup until getting a chance to leadoff in the finale of the Tennessee Tech series (March 20). But for the season he has batted no higher than seventh in 33 of the 42 games he has started.
- Talbott was the only Boiler that hit safely in all eight games of the spring break trip, finishing the road trip through Tennessee with a team-best .406 batting average. He finished a home run shy of the cycle in the March 12 win at Tennessee-Martin. He homered in the finale of the Indiana series.

- · Cameron Perkins' career-best 20-game hitting streak, the longest by a Purdue player since Brandon Haveman hit safely in the final 20 games of the 2009 season, was GAMES PLAYER snapped in the middle game of the Northwestern series. Perkins has still managed to hit safely in 39 of the 42 games in which he has played this season and reached base safely in all 42. Dating back to last year, he has reached base safely in 49 consecutive games.
- · Perkins' hitless showing in the middle game of the Northwestern series also snapped his 14-game hit streak 14 against Big Ten competition dating back to last season's 14 conference tournament.
- John Hunter • Perkins jumped out an 18-for-38 (.474) start in Big Ten play. He homered in the Big Ten series at Minnesota and Northwestern and feasted on

Michigan pitching (7-for-11, 3 XBH, 5 RBI). The Michigan series highlighted a recent hot stretch in which he recorded multiple hits in five consecutive games (April 8-13), equaling out to a 12-for-21 showing.

SERRATO DELIVERS GAME-WINNING HIT IN THE NINTH, GOES DEEP AGAIN

- Barrett Serrato lifted Purdue to a comeback win at Ball State (April 12) with a two-out, tworun single in the ninth inning and the Boilers trailing by a run. He singled into left center on the first pitch he saw from the new BSU relief pitcher.
- · Serrato also hit a solo home run in the opener of Big Ten series against Michigan and Penn State. His opposite-field blast at Penn State gave Purdue an early lead that it did not relinquish. The junior recorded a career-high four RBIs in the rubber game win at Penn State (April 17) and is now batting .350 (21-for-60) with six extra-base hits, 13 RBIs and 13 runs scored in conference play.

PLAWECKI ENJOYS BIG WEEK WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION

- Kevin Plawecki drove in some big runs to help lead Purdue to a 4-1 week and series win at Penn State (April 13-17). After recording only two RBIs over a stretch of eight games, the sophomore tied his career high with four RBIs in the April 13 win against IPFW and also knocked in four runs in the Penn State series.
- · Plawecki drove in the go-ahead run in the eighth inning of the IPFW win, delivering a tworun single to highlight a four-run rally. In the middle game of the Penn State series, Plawecki plated the game-tying run in the seventh inning with a two-out single. He came back in the nightcap of the doubleheader and doubled home a pair to open the scoring in the six-run third inning, finishing the game with four hits.

RECORD SEVEN PURDUE PLAYERS EARN BIG TEN WEEKLY HONORS

- · Cameron Perkins (Player, April 11) and Joe Haase (Pitcher, April 4) were the latest Boilermakers to win their first career Big Ten weekly awards. Perkins was recognized after posting multiple hits in all three games of the Michigan series (April 8-10), finishing the weekend 7-for-11. Haase was honored for his complete-game shutout of Minnesota April 2 at Target Field. Purdue has had seven different weekly honorees, garnering at least one award following seven of the first eight weekends of the year.
- Since the Big Ten began recognizing Players and Pitchers of the Week in 1990, the seven different Boilermakers honored this year represents a new program high. Previously, Purdue had four honorees in 1997 and 2006. And with Matt Morgan winning Pitcher of the Week twice, the eight weekly honors are also a new team benchmark. The Boilermakers won five weekly awards in 2003 and 2006. Brad Schreiber has also been named Pitcher of the Week and teammates Barrett Serrato, Angelo Cianfrocco and Tyler Spillner have been honored as the league's top player over a seven-day stretch.

PLAWECKI AMONG THE BIG TEN'S TOUGHEST TO K

- Kevin Plawecki ranks second on the team with a .360 batting average and has emerged as one of the toughest players to strikeout in the Big Ten. He has whiffed only nine times in 164 at-bats (198 plate appearances) to rank third in the Big Ten and 20th nationally in toughest to K entering the week. The sophomore has fanned just once every 18.2 at-bats (and once every 22 plate appearances). For his college career, he has gone down on strikes only 20 times in 368 at-bats (427 plate appearances).
- PLAWECKI IN MARCH: .393 (24-for-61), 4 2B, 9 RBI, 13 R, 4 BB, 8 HBP, .479 OBP

HAASE POSTS SCORELESS-INNINGS STREAK

- Thanks in part to a complete-game shutout in his first career Big Ten start, Joe Haase was able to record a consecutive scoreless-innings streak of 14 over four appearances. It was snapped when Michigan scored in the first inning of the April 10 series finale. But the Wolverines managed to score just the one run against the junior. Haase surrendered only two earned runs over a stretch of 26 1/3 innings pitched. He compiled a 0.68 ERA in his six appearances from March 20 through April 17.
- Before Michigan snapped the scoreless-innings streak, top-ranked Vanderbilt (March 15) had been the last team to score against Haase. But the Commodores didn't score while Haase was actually on the mound in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings (an inherited runner scored against the bullpen in the sixth). Thus, it was a streak of 17 consecutive innings since a team had scored while Haase was literally on the mound. His ERA has dropped from 4.79 to 2.86 during his scoreless-innings streak.
- · Haase has pitched in 13 games this year, making nine starts. Coincidentally, he's been on the mound in some of Purdue's biggest games of the year. His finest performance came on the big stage of Target Field in the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota, striking out a careerhigh seven in his first collegiate complete-game shutout. He scattered seven singles and did not give up a hit after the sixth inning.
- The junior pitched in relief in the wins against nationally-ranked Connecticut and Pittsburgh at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge. Haase led Purdue to another win against a nationally-ranked team when he beat Louisville with 8 2/3 innings of solid work in the March 8 midweek opener. He started the game against top-ranked Vanderbilt on the spring break trip, as well as the home opener against Illinois State and the middle game of the rivalry series with Indiana.

INJURY UPDATES

- Purdue lost Ryan Bridges for the remainder of the season when he broke the fibula in his right leg on a play at first base in the April 10 series finale against Michigan. Bridges had started 24 of the first 31 games at first base, including 19 in a row. He landed awkwardly on his leg after colliding with the Michigan first baseman near the bag while trying to beat out a sacrifice bunt. The U-M player had jumped in the air to try to catch a wild throw and came down on top of Bridges.
- Pitcher Brad Schreiber has also missed three starts during Big Ten play. He has not pitched since leaving in the sixth inning of April 17 start at Penn State with arm stiffness, which turned out to be an elbow injury. If the sophomore right-hander is able to return this season he is expected to be used in a relief role. Schreiber was sidelined by strep throat in the conferenceopening series at Minnesota (April 1-2).
- The March 11 series-opening win at Tennessee-Martin also came at a steep price for Purdue. Starting pitcher Matt Morgan and Angelo Cianfrocco both left the game early with injuries and were sidelined for the rest of the month. Morgan struggled with his control due to a finger injury and Cianfrocco reinjured his right shoulder while hitting a foul ball.
- Morgan returned to the rotation for the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2) and has started the opening game of each of the first four conference weekends. Cianfrocco returned to the lineup for the Michigan series (April 8-10) but has been limited to a designated

MORGAN & WITTGREN TEAM UP FOR SERIES-OPENING SHUTOUT OF MICHIGAN

- Matt Morgan and Nick Wittgren teamed up to strike out 14 batters in a combined shutout effort in the series-opening win against Michigan April 8. The Boilermakers won 8-0, posting their first shutout win against a Big Ten opponent at Lambert Field since 2008 (Northwestern) and their first shutout win over Michigan since 1993.
- Morgan struck out the side in the fourth inning and Wittgren did the same in the seventh. The pitchers teamed up to record at least one strikeout in every inning but the fifth. The seasonhigh 14 strikeouts were the most for Purdue since also fanning 14 in a 2010 series-opening win against Penn State at Lambert Field.

HAASE'S SHUTOUT, PERKINS' HOMERS HIGHLIGHT SERIES AT TARGET FIELD

- · Joe Haase worked his first career complete-game shutout and Cameron Perkins went deep twice to highlight Purdue's Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2), which was
- · Perkins hit both of his home runs to left field, connecting for a solo shot to lead off the seventh inning of game one and hitting a three-run shot in the third inning of game two. It marked the second time this season he has homered in back-to-back games. He finished the series 6-for-12 with five RBIs. Stephen Talbott was also a productive 6-for-11 with three RBIs and three runs scored while making some solid defensive plays in left field.
- Haase's complete-game effort in game two of the series lifted Purdue to its first shutout win against Minnesota since 1993 (in Minneapolis).

PLAWECKI NAMED TO JOHNNY BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST

- Sophomore catcher **Kevin Plawecki** has been named to the initial watch list for the Johnny Bench Award, which honors the nation's top Division I catcher. Forty-two catchers appeared on the initial watch list, which will be updated periodically until a list of semifinalists is unveiled May 19.
- Plawecki was a Freshman All-American in 2010 and is among the Big Ten's top prospects for the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He batted cleanup in each of the first 35 games he started and 38 of the 42 games he has played overall this season.

SEVEN RELIEVERS ALREADY WITH AT LEAST ONE SAVE

- The Purdue bullpen has continued to backup the starting pitchers with solid relief work. Seven pitchers have teamed up for Purdue's conference-leading 16 saves. **Nick Wittgren** has closed out nine wins and pitched in relief a team-high 19 times. **Lance Breedlove**, **Calvin Gunter**, **Blake Mascarello**, **Pat Gannon**, **Sean Collins** and **Mike Sudbury** have also earned a save while recording the final out of a game.
- Wittgren's most impressive outing came in the Feb. 20 win against Pittsburgh. He slammed the door on a potential Pitt rally with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh inning. He entered the game with the Boilers clinging to a one-run lead in the seventh and struck out the No. 4 and 5 hitters in the Pitt lineup to leave the bases loaded. After a 1-2-3 eighth inning, the Panthers posted back-to-back two-out hits against the sophomore right-hander in the ninth. But he again retired the Pitt cleanup hitter to close out the victory.
- Mascarello backed up Breedlove with 3 2/3 scoreless innings of relief in game two of the Lipscomb series.
- Gannon struck out a career-high seven and pitched over four leadoff singles while closing out the March 18 series-opening win at Tennessee Tech.
- Collins struck out four of the seven batters he faced to earn a save in the April 13 win versus IPFW in downtown Fort Wayne.
- Seven different pitchers had at least one save last season as Purdue totaled 14 as a team, none having more than three saves.

SPILLNER SURGES THROUGH MARCH

- Tyler Spillner was Purdue's hottest hitter in the month of March, ending the month riding a career-best nine-game hitting streak (which he extended to 10 before it was snapped) and hitting safely in 13 of the final 14 games of the month total. He batted over .400 for the month even though he went 0-for-7 in the Lipscomb series the first weekend of March.
- The junior entered the month batting .276 and saw his average dip to .222 after the Lipscomb weekend. But the Purdue leadoff man batted .472 (25-for-53) over the final 13 games of March. He leads the team with 15 extra-base hits, recording 11 during his 10-game hit streak. He has also posted eight multi-hit efforts during his streak.

EIGHT-RUN NINTH INNING LIFTS PURDUE TO RUBBER GAME WIN AT TENN. TECH

- Purdue baseball scored eight times in the ninth inning to break open a tie game and defeat Tennessee Tech, 12-4, in the March 20 rubber game of the weekend series and finale of the eight-game spring break trip. The team's biggest rally since scoring nine times in a March 26, 2010, home win against Chicago State gave Purdue its fifth consecutive victorious weekend to begin the season.
- **Kevin Plawecki** tied a program single-game record with the first five-hit effort by a Boilermaker since April 2009. He singled five times and was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the ninth inning.
- Stephen Talbott knocked in the go-ahead run in the ninth with a squeeze bunt that he beat out for a hit. Andrew Dixon scored the go-ahead tally after opening the inning with a base hit. Dixon later delivered a three-run triple in his second at-bat of the frame. David Miller also had two hits in the inning.

McHUGH GOES DEEP FOR HIS FIRST COLLEGIATE HIT

• Freshman **Sean McHugh** made his first start for Purdue in the March 16 loss at Belmont and took advantage of the opportunity with a 2-for-3 showing. He was also hit by a pitch and scored twice. But the highlight of the day came in his first at-bat when he went deep to left field for his first collegiate hit. The two-run homer game Purdue a 3-0 lead in the second inning. McHugh also hit the first home run of the season (and so far only long ball) at Lambert Field, connecting for a solo blast to left field in the March 23 win against Wabash.

WALK-OFF LOSS SNAPS WIN STREAK; BOILERS VERSUS TOP-RANKED VANDY

- Purdue's eight-game win streak from Feb. 27-March 12 ended in dramatic fashion in the series finale at Tennessee-Martin. The Boilermakers carried a four-run lead into the bottom of the ninth inning and were two outs away from completing a three-game sweep. But the Skyhawks hit a pair of home runs in the ninth inning, including a walk-off two-run blast. It was Purdue's second walk-off loss of the season.
- March 15, the Boilers were shutout for the first time since April 2009 in a loss at top-ranked Vanderbilt (NCBWA poll). It marked the first time that Purdue played a team ranked No. 1 in the country since getting swept in a 2005 series at Texas.



Opening in 2012 The New Northwest Baseball Facility Construction to Begin Spring of 2011 Stadium to be located near the intersection of McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus

The 2011 season will be Purdue's last at Lambert Field. The new northwest baseball facility is set to open for the 2012 home opener. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. Purdue will close out the season with an eight-game homestand from May 11-21, highlighted by Big Ten Conference series against Illinois and Iowa. The Boilermakers are expected to open their 2012 home schedule at Lambert and play their first game at their new ballpark in late March or early April.
