# HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 16th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the inaugural season at the new ballpark turned out to be a rebuilding year for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909. In its 16 games during the final year at Lambert, Purdue won three times in walk-off fashion and locked up the Big Ten title May 12 in front of a large group of program alumni.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's previous single-season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings under Schreiber in 2001, 2005 and 2008.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 30 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last nine years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

### – BOILERS TO PLAY ON CAMPUS AT MINNESOTA FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2004 –

For its final regular-season road trip, Purdue is set to square off with Minnesota for the first time since 2011 knowing it needs a series win to help keep its Big Ten Tournament hopes alive.

First pitch at Siebert Field in Minneapolis is set for 7:30 p.m. ET Friday, 7 p.m. ET Saturday and 1 p.m. ET Sunday. The Boilermakers will be playing on campus at Minnesota for the first time since the 2004 Big Ten Tournament. The last two Purdue-Minnesota series in the Twin Cities have been played at the Metrodome (2009) and Target Field (2011).

The Boilermakers (12-32, 5-13 Big Ten) need to win at least four of their last six conference games to have a chance to qualify for the eight-team Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 21-25 in Omaha, Neb. Trailing the three teams tied for sixth place in the standings by three games with six to play, the odds may not be in Purdue's favor but it does have the advantage of playing two teams (Minnesota and Iowa) also chasing conference tourney bids.

The most realistic scenarios for the Boilers to earn a berth involve series wins against Minnesota (23-20, 9-9 Big Ten) and Iowa (8-10 Big Ten) first and foremost. Iowa hosts second-place Illinois (13-5 Big Ten) this weekend and Minnesota travels to league-leading Indiana (16-2 Big Ten) next weekend. Purdue would lose head-to-head tiebreakers with Ohio State (8-10 Big Ten) and Michigan State (8-10 Big Ten), and those teams have the advantage of playing Northwestern (OSU) and Penn State (MSU) next weekend.

Even if they were to lose two-of-three this weekend at Minnesota, the Boilers could still theoretically qualify for the Big Ten Tournament if Iowa were to lose at least two-of-three to Illinois and then get swept by Purdue next weekend at Alexander Field.

Minnesota can clinch a Big Ten Tournament berth this weekend with two wins coupled with at least one loss by Penn State vs. Indiana. The Gophers would certainly like to avoid having to win a game next weekend at Indiana to clinch a tourney bid.

The Boilermakers have played 43 different teams since their last game with Minnesota. There are only three players – Minnesota's Bobby Juan and Matt Halloran, Purdue's **Sean McHugh** – on the active rosters who have played in a game between the Gophers and Boilers. None of the three saw action when the teams last met in the 2011 Big Ten Tournament. McHugh made a start at first base at Target Field in April of his freshman season.

The new-look Siebert Field debuted last season on Minnesota's East Bank campus. The Gophers surrendered just one run in 27 innings in a three-game sweep of a struggling Penn State team at Siebert the final weekend of April. But they're just 7-6 overall at home this year, with two of those victories coming against non-Division I opponents.

Solid starting pitching keeps Minnesota competitive every year. Alec Crawford (3.77 ERA, 56 Ks in 76 1/3 IP) and Ben Meyer (2.43 ERA, 56 Ks in 77 2/3 IP) have taken the ball every weekend and gave their team a chance to win in their starts last weekend at No. 4 Florida State. Neal Kunik (1.91 ERA, .207 B/Avg) recently joined the weekend rotation and has not surrendered a run in his first two Big Ten starts (vs. Iowa and Penn State).

The Minnesota offense is among the bottom third of the Big Ten in runs scored, hits and slugging percentage, but does put the ball in play regularly. While Purdue has struck out 295 times in 44 games, Minnesota has just 224 Ks in 43 contests. The Gophers do not bunt (16 sac bunts) or steal bases (33) often. Both teams are strong defensively. The Boilermakers did not commit an error last weekend at Indiana.

# **LOTS OF CLOSE GAMES IN APRIL**

• Twelve of Purdue's 18 games in April were decided by two runs or fewer, including five extra-innings affairs. The Boilermakers posted a 5-7 mark in those close games en route to a 7-11 April record. For the season, Purdue is 8-13 in games decided by two or fewer runs.

• An 11-inning win at Michigan State April 11, the first walk-off victory in Alexander Field history April 15 vs. Butler (in 10 innings) and a 13-inning walk-off win April 25 vs. Ohio State highlighted the recent stretch of tight games. The win at MSU snapped a five-game losing streak in extra-inning games dating back to the final weekend of 2013. The Butler win was the Boilers' first in walk-off fashion since the final game at Lambert Field, May 2012 vs. Indiana State. Three straight Big Ten openers for Purdue (April 11-25) went to extra innings. The 13-inning thriller with Ohio State was the longest game in the short history of Alexander Field but already the sixth extra-innings affair in 32 games at the second-year ballpark.

• The seven extra-innings games, including five over a stretch of 11 games from April 8-25, are the most in one season during head coach Doug Schreiber's 16-year tenure.

# **PURDUE SWEEP IN BIG TEN PLAY FOR FIRST TIME IN 2014**

• The Boilermakers were swept in a three-game set at No. 11 Indiana the first weekend of May in the first regular-season series between the two rivals since 2011. Purdue's seven-game win streak against IU was snapped as the Hoosiers posted their first sweep in the rivalry series since 1999. The Boilermakers were swept in Big Ten play for the first time this season. And they never held the lead on the weekend after getting shut out Friday and Indiana scoring three times in the first inning Friday and five times in the first inning Sunday.

• Dating back to last season, Purdue has now lost 13 consecutive weekend series and 12 straight three-game sets in Big Ten play.

# **GIBBS LEADING BIG TEN IN ERA IN CONFERENCE PLAY AFTER SCORELESS STREAK**

• Matt Gibbs enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in ERA (0.96) and batting average against (.121) in conference play. He has surrendered only two earned runs on seven hits in 18 2/3 innings pitched over eight appearances in conference play.

• Gibbs' streak of 16 consecutive scoreless innings over seven appearances ended April 27 vs. Ohio State. The junior allowed five inherited runners to score during that stretch, but none of the runners he allowed to reach base scored. He excelled in the extra-innings affairs in the series openers with Michigan State (3 IP, 2 H, 2 BB, 2 K) and Michigan (5 IP, 2 H, 2 BB, 6 K). He earned his first collegiate victory in the MSU win and posted career-high totals for innings pitched and strikeouts vs. Michigan, helping extend the game into the 12th inning.

• Led by Gibbs and some strong outings from staff ace **Jordan Minch** (43 1/3 IP, 40 H, 32 K, 4.15 ERA), the Purdue pitching staff has been much better in Big Ten play after a rough start to the season. Minch was still on the mound in the eighth inning in four of his first six Big Ten starts. **Joe Eichmann** has pitched in 12 of the 18 Big Ten games to lead the league in appearances in conference play. He pitched in each of first nine Big Ten games. **Mike Lutz** (11) and **Tim McElroy** (11) are tied for second.

• The Boilermakers have posted a 4.88 ERA in Big Ten play vs. the 6.66 mark it has compiled in non-conference (6.97 pre-Big Ten). More importantly, Purdue has posted 94 strikeouts vs. 75 walks in Big Ten action after racking up 120 Ks vs. 129 walks in nonconference play. The Boilers' overall team ERA has dropped from 9.16 on March 16 to 5.92 entering the Minnesota series. Purdue may rank last in the Big Ten in overall team ERA, but its 4.88 ERA in league play is ninth and much better than Northwestern (5.61) and Penn State (6.06).

# **RUBBER GAME STRUGGLES**

• Four times in a stretch of six weekends from March 21 through April 27 (at SIU, at Illinois, at MSU and vs. OSU), the Boilers won the opener but lost the series. Purdue has not won a weekend series this season due in part to an 0-5 record in rubber games. Purdue has lost eight straight weekend rubber games dating back to May 2012. The Boilermakers have not won a weekend series after losing the opener since May 2009 at Michigan State. In the years since, on 11 occasions Purdue has won the opener of a traditional three-game set but failed to win the series. Nine of those 11 series have been in Big Ten play.

• During the Boilers' first home weekend of the season (April 5-6), Purdue outscored PSU 10-8 in the series but still lost two-of-three. The weekend of April 11-12 at Michigan State, the scoring was even at 12 runs apiece but the Boilers again lost two-of-three. Purdue had not lost a series in which it had outscored the opposition since March 2010 at Southern Illinois (32-21 scoring edge, lost 2-of-3). It had not happened in Big Ten play since April 2007 vs. Ohio State (23-15 scoring edge, lost 3-of-4). Each of the last three seasons, Purdue had managed to win at least one series in which it was outscored for the weekend (2011 at Northwestern, 2012 vs. Penn State and 2013 at Evansville).

• The Boilermakers dropped a pair of one-run games in doubleheader sweeps at the hands of Penn State and Michigan State, falling to 1-7 in twinbills this year and 0-6 in doubleheaders against the same team. Purdue's streak of six consecutive series wins vs. PSU ended this year. The Boilers won the series finale, 4-0, to post their first shutout since April 20, 2013 vs. Illinois-Chicago and first against a Big Ten opponent since beating Indiana 3-0 in the winner's bracket final of the 2012 Big Ten Tournament. **Brett Haan** earned his first win as a Boilermaker with five shutout innings. **Joe Eichmann** retired all 12 batters he faced while appearing in all three games of the Penn State series.

### WOOD'S REACHED-SAFELY STREAK SNAPPED AT 24 STRAIGHT

- **Kyle Wood's** reached base safely streak was snapped at 24 consecutive games in the finale of the series at No. 11 Indiana on May 4. He had been on once in every game he had batted since March 17. The first baseman had also compiled a 24-game reached safely streak in Big Ten play dating back to last season after reaching safely in his first 14 conference games of 2014.
- Wood's 24-game streak was the longest by a Boilermaker since Kevin Plawecki reached base safely in 25 straight games in 2012. **Brandon Krieg's** 13-game reached safely streak is now the longest active run on the team. **Jack Picchiotti** has reached base safely in the last 14 games in which he has started. **Sean McHugh** and Krieg also had 12-game hitting streaks earlier this season.

### BOILERMAKERS HOLD ON FOR QUALITY MIDWEEK WIN AT ILLINOIS STATE

- Consecutive big innings allowed Purdue to open up an 8-0 lead and **Patrick Kenney** shut the door after Illinois State rallied to make it a two-run game, closing out an 8-6 win for the Boilermakers April 29 in Normal, Ill. Purdue became only the second visiting team to win at ISU's Duffy Bass Field this season. The road team has won seven consecutive games in the annual midweek series.
- The game ended on a line drive 5-3 double play to third base. It marked the second time this season Purdue has won a close game on a double play. **Mike Lutz** induced and started a game-ending 1-6-3 twin killing with the bases loaded in the 4-3 series-opening win at Illinois March 28.
- The Boilermakers' 8-0 lead entering the bottom of the eighth inning represented their biggest lead of the season. It came after scoring four in the fifth and three in the sixth. Purdue has only scored four-plus runs in a frame twice this year. The 8-6 final marked the most runs the Boilers had allowed in a win this season. Previously, Purdue had only won one game (April 15 vs. Butler, 5-4) in which an opponent had scored four-plus runs.
- Purdue completed a three-game season series sweep of Butler April 15. With the Boilers having won games against the Bulldogs in Birmingham, Ala., Indianapolis and West Lafayette, it's believed to be the first time in program history Purdue has defeated an opponent in three different locations in the same season.

### EVAK'S INSIDE-THE-PARK HOMER, WOOD'S WALK-OFF SINGLE HIGHLIGHT 13-INNING WIN

- **Jeff Evak** connected for a game-tying, inside-the-park home run and **Kyle Wood** delivered the game-winning hit eight innings later as Purdue defeated Ohio State in 13 innings, 4-3, April 25. Runs were only scored in the three of the 26 half innings played in the extended thriller.
- After being thrown out at the plate to end the 10th inning, **Cody Strong** led off the 13th with a double and scored this time on Wood's base hit through the left side.
- Evak enjoyed a fantastic five-minute stretch in which he connected for the inside-the-park homer in the bottom of the fifth and made a diving catch in right field to take away a leadoff double in the top of the sixth. The freshman connected for a deep fly ball to center field that kept carrying and eventually hit off the wall to the right of the 408-foot marker, caroming back towards left center. It was the freshman's first collegiate home run.
- **Jordan Minch, Matt Gibbs** and **Mike Lutz** teamed up for 11 consecutive scoreless innings after Minch gave up three runs in the top of the second. A wild swing in momentum featured Lutz warming up in the bullpen in the third inning to Minch still being on the mound in the ninth. Minch retired 13 of the final 16 batters he faced, highlighted by striking out the side in the ninth inning. It was the sophomore's longest outing as a Boiler as well as the longest by a Purdue pitcher this season. He threw over 130 pitches.

## BOILERMAKERS AMONG THE BIG TEN LEADERS IN FIELDING & DOUBLE PLAYS TURNED

• Purdue's solid play defensively has been one of the bright spots of the season. Entering the week-end, the Boilermakers lead the Big Ten having turned 44 double plays in 44 games. They're also tied for second in the conference in fielding percentage (.973). Purdue did not commit an error in the Penn State and Indiana series, but made a season-high five in the 12-inning series-opening loss to Michigan. The Boilers have posted 17 games without an error this year. For the season, Purdue has committed 46 errors in 44 games. Nebraska (.976, 42 DPs) has made 46 errors in 49 games and leads the league in fielding percentage while raking second to the Boilers in double plays turned.

• **Sean McHugh** has also impressed individually with his play behind the plate. The senior has thrown out 23 base stealers (who are 22-of-45 with McHugh behind the plate) to rank second in the Big Ten. Base stealers are 30-of-57 against Purdue overall, the 30 steals allowed representing the third fewest against in the Big Ten. Only Michigan State (37, 29-of-66) has thrown out more runners than McHugh and the Boilers. MSU's Joel Fisher leads the league, throwing out 28 base stealers.

## STRONG OUTINGS FROM DOWNS & PODKUL

• **Gavin Downs** and **Connor Podkul** both put together impressive starts at Alexander Field during the recent home-heavy stretch (April 15-27).

• Downs earned his first career Big Ten win April 19 with seven innings of three-hit ball against Michigan, surrendering just two unearned runs. He followed that up with his first collegiate complete game, needing only 93 pitches in a tough-luck 2-0 loss to Ohio State. Those were his best outings since keeping No. 4 LSU off the scoreboard for six innings March 8 in Baton Rouge. Downs pitched Purdue's first true complete game since February 2013 (Robert Ramer vs. UConn). **Jordan Minch** and Ramer had each worked nine-plus innings in a start since then, but both outings came in extra-innings games. Downs did not issue a walk in his complete game, joining **Adam Dressler** (twice) as the only starting pitchers to not walk a batter in an outing this year. Podkul also did it May 2 at No. 11 Indiana.

• Podkul's first home start since May 2012 was also his best outing of the year. He struck out a career-high seven over six scoreless innings April 23 vs. Illinois-Chicago. He came up just one out shy of his longest collegiate outing. Podkul did not pitch from March 17 through April 19 as he continues to work his way back to full strength from Tommy John Surgery in the fall of 2012 and a knee ailment. However, over three consecutive outings (vs. Michigan, UIC & Ohio State) the right-hander worked a combined 10 2/3 shutout innings, surrendering just five hits and three walks while striking out 11.

## KRIEG, MULLEN & WOOD DELIVER BIG HITS; MANIAGO HAS A DAY TO REMEMBER

• **Brandon Krieg**, **Michael Mullen** and **Kyle Wood** have delivered the game-winning hits in the Boilers' last three extra-innings victories. Krieg's walk-off single April 15 vs. Butler gave head coach **Doug Schreiber** his 450th win as the leader of the program. Krieg was 4-for-4 and reached base safely six times in the win. It was his second career four-hit game and he became the first Boiler to reach safely six times in a game since Eric Charles in March 2012 at Murray State. Krieg went on to enjoy a 10-for-16 week at the plate in which he reached base in 15 of his 22 plate appearances. He had a pair of three-hit games against Michigan.

• Mullen didn't enter the extra-innings win at Michigan State until the bottom of the 10th inning, but had a big impact on the final few frames. He turned an inning-ending 5-4-3 double play at second base with runners on first and second in the 10th. Not long after, he came through with a two-out single to drive home the go-ahead run in the top of the 11th. The hit plated **Steve Maniago**, who had connected for his first career home run earlier in the game to give Purdue a 3-2 lead. Maniago contributed to two of three inning-ending double plays turned by the Boilers.

• Wood's walk-off hit in the 13-inning against Ohio State ended the longest game in the short history of Alexander Field. He slapped a pitch over the third baseman's head for the game-winning single after he had initially showed bunt with runners on first and second and no outs. The sophomore first baseman had not been in the starting lineup for the previous five games due to a suspension for a violation of team rules.

## STACKED SCHEDULE

• Purdue has challenged itself with a 2014 schedule that features numerous quality opponents. Indiana, LSU and Louisville all qualified for the 2013 College World Series and were preseason favorites in their conferences this year. Rice, San Diego State and Illinois were also NCAA Regional teams a year ago.

• The Boilers' strength of schedule ranks 15th nationally in the Boyd's World ISR as of May 8. It ranked as high as No. 2 in the country throughout much of March and has been the toughest in the Big Ten. Around the league, only Indiana (26th), Nebraska (88th), Ohio State (99th) and Michigan (100th) also have strength of schedule ratings in the Top 100.

• Purdue's opponents have compiled a combined 537-372-2 (.591) record this year after posting a combined mark of 618-460 (.573) last season. The 18 teams that the Boilers have already played have compiled a 487-335-2 (.592) record this year.
