– BOILERS OPEN SPRING BREAK TRIP WITH FIRST TRADITIONAL WEEKEND SERIES –

Purdue baseball's annual spring break trip begins with its first traditional weekend series of the new season, as the No. 29 Boilers visit the Commonwealth of Kentucky for a three-game set at Murray State.

First pitch is set for 3 p.m. ET Friday and Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday. Purdue (8-1) will be making its first visit to Murray, Ky., since 1977. The two teams have not played since 1987 (in Morehead, Ky.). Murray State (8-5) represents the only current Ohio Valley Conference team that the Boilers have not played during head coach Doug Schreiber's 14-year tenure.

While every other MSU athletic program is known as the Racers, the baseball program continues the heritage of Thoroughbreds nickname. In the 1950s, Murray State's teams began switching from Thoroughbreds to the shorter (and more headline friendly) Racers nickname. But former head coach Johnny Reagan, whom MSU's stadium is named after, was the driving force behind baseball keeping the Thoroughbreds nickname alive. Now, it's commonly shortened to 'Breds.

After Friday's series opener, Purdue will have played each of its 10 games this season against 10 different opponents. Dating back to the end of the 2011 season, it will have been 14 consecutive games against a different foe. Previously, the Boilers played their first nine games of the 2001 season against nine different opponents, but otherwise that level of opponent variety over a 10-game stretch is unusual in the program's modern era.

So far this season the single games against a daily new opponent have not adversely affected Purdue. In particular, the Boilers have really feasted on opposing bullpens this year. The wins against Connecticut, Notre Dame, Western Carolina, Auburn and Southern Miss were all made possible by big innings late in the game. Purdue has outscored the opposition 48-20 from the sixth through ninth innings. Coincidentally, the seventh remains the only frame in which the Boilers' pitching staff has yet to give up a run this season.

Despite losing in walk-off fashion Wednesday at Belmont, Murray State is off to a strong start this season. The 'Breds lost two-of-three to Valparaiso during the season-opening weekend but have responded with series wins versus South Dakota State and at Central Arkansas. The series opener at UCA last weekend was not decided until the 17th inning.

After winning each of its first four one-run contests, Murray dropped its first tight game of the season Wednesday in Nashville. The strong relief work from Will Handlin and Luke Shuemaker have been a big reason why the 'Breds have won so many tight games. Both pitchers have appeared in six games this year, working a combined 34 innings. Together they have surrendered only three extra-base hits and one earned run.

Handlin, a right-hander, has earned a pair of victories in relief and saved another. He has not issued a walk in 15 2/3 innings. Shuemaker, a left-hander, has two saves while striking out 19 in 18 1/3 innings. Project game two starter Cameron Finch (2-0, .245 ERA, .268 Avg. Against) has also gotten off to a strong start as a sophomore.

A number of Boilers enjoyed consistent weekends at Auburn's tournament to open the month of March. **Kevin Plawecki** hit safely and drove in a run in all three games. **Stephen Talbott** hit safely and scored a run in all three games. **Cameron Perkins**, who was 7-for-12 at Plainsman Park, and

Plawecki both recorded their 100th career RBIs in the Auburn win.

Plawecki also homered in back-to-back games for the third time in his career. He has accomplished the feat in each of his first three collegiate seasons. However, he has not gone deep in three straight games as a Boiler.

Purdue's spring break trip continues with a March 13 game at Missouri State and a four-game series at Wichita State from March 15-17 that will feature a Saturday doubleheader.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 14th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 380-348 overall record and a 190-178 Big Ten mark through his first 13 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber will make a run at Alexander's all-time wins record (407) this season and is on pace to break the games coached benchmark in 2013.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's single season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first, and reached the Big Ten Tournament for the fourth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons. The four straight tourney appearances represent the longest active streak in the league as well as a program high. The program's 58 Big Ten wins over the last four years are also the most in the league.

Purdue led the Big Ten in numerous statistical categories in 2011, highlighted by runs scored, doubles, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, sacrifice flies, saves and strikeouts. The Boilermakers drew the most walks at the plate and issued the fewest number of free passes on the mound.

Six Boilers were recognized as all-conference performers, matching the second-highest total in program history. Kevin Plawecki and Barrett Serrato were named First Team, Tyler Spillner and Nick Wittgren Second Team and Cameron Perkins and Stephen Talbott Third Team. With Serrato, Spillner and Talbott all honored as outfielders, it marked the first time 1991 that three Purdue outfielders were named all-conference in the same season.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher. He led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 54 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 18 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last seven years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

SPRING BREAK TRIP BEGINS WITH FIRST TRADITIONAL WEEKEND SERIES OF 2012

- Off to an 8-1 start for the first time since 1959, Purdue begins its eight-game, 10-day spring break trip with its first visit to Murray, Ky., since 1977. Murray State is the only current Ohio Valley Conference school that the Boilers have not played during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** 14-year tenure.
- After participating in three tournaments to open the new season, Purdue has posted each of its eight wins against eight different teams. The series opener against Murray will represent a 10th different opponent in the first 10 games of 2012. Dating back to the end of the 2011 season, the Boilers will have played 14 consecutive games against a different opponent.
- Purdue went 4-4 on its 2011 spring break trip through the state of Tennessee, which included weekend series wins against Murray State's OVC rivals Tennessee-Martin and Tennessee Tech. The Boilermakers were 7-3 vs. Ohio Valley teams last year.

BOILERS GARNER FIRST IN-SEASON NATIONAL RANKING SINCE 2001

- With eight wins against eight different opponents and its best-nine game start since 1959, Purdue debuted at No. 29 in this week's Collegiate Baseball Top 30, earning its first in-season national ranking in one of the four major polls since February 2001. The Boilermakers were also nationally ranked in the 2002 NCBWA preseason poll.
- Purdue has been ranked among the Top 30 of Perfect Game USA's national Top 50 all season, moving up to 21st this week after posting a 3-0 weekend record at Auburn's four-team round robin tournament. The Boilermakers also continue to receive votes in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' poll (Top 25) and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association poll (Top 30). The Boilermakers received 44 poll points in the USA Today/ESPN Top 25 to essentially rank 34th in the coaches' weekly voting.
- Purdue's only loss so far this season came at the hands of a Maryland team that is 9-1 and has won eight consecutive games entering the week. The Terrapins joined the Baseball America (No. 25) and NCBWA (No. 30) rankings this week.

WITTGREN TIES ALL-TIME SAVES RECORD, WINS BIG TEN PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Closer **Nick Wittgren** finished off two of Purdue's three wins at Auburn's tournament (March 2-4), tying the program's all-time record with his 15th career save and earning Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for his efforts.
- Wittgren closed out the victories against Auburn and Charleston Southern, retiring eight of the 11 batters he faced over his three innings of scoreless relief. More importantly, the junior got some big outs when the Boilers need them most. He left the potential tying run at second base while finishing off the Auburn win and fanned the CSU leadoff hitter with the bases loaded to close out the eighth inning.
- Wittgren's 15 career saves have moved him into a first place tie atop the program's all-time leaderboard with former Purdue closers Andy Helmer (1997-00) and Scott Dubach (1985-87). Wittgren earned 12 saves in 2011, one shy of the Boilers' single-season record.
- Helmer was also the last Purdue pitcher to win Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors as a reliever, accomplishing the feat in April 2000.

PLAWECKI ON JOHNNY BENCH WATCH LIST AGAIN

- After being among the 13 semifinalists nationally a season ago for the Johnny Bench Award, **Kevin Plawecki** has once again been selected to the initial watch list for the award that recognizes the nation's top all-around catcher. The initial watch list featured 43 catchers. More could be added as the season progresses and a group of semifinalists will be announced May 16.
- Plawecki and Iowa's Dan Sheppard were the only Big Ten backstops named to the initial watch list. Plawecki has batted cleanup in each of the first nine games this season, starting all but one behind the plate. He has hit safely and recorded an RBI in seven of the first nine games.
- Defensively, Plawecki has thrown out four of five would-be base stealers over the first nine games. He homered twice, drove in a run in all three games and threw out three runners trying to steal at last weekend's Auburn Tournament, helping Purdue post a 3-0 record. He recorded his 100th career RBI in the weekend-opening win against Auburn.
- Plawecki homered on consecutive days in the wins against Southern Miss and Charleston Southern. Both home runs were towering fly balls over the 35-foot-high wall in left field. He went deep in back-to-back games for the third time in his career. He also accomplished the feat in 2010 (at Illinois State and vs. Penn State) and 2011 (games two and three of Illinois series). Among active Boilers, **Ryan Bridges**, **Cameron Perkins** (twice) and **Tyler Spillner** have also homered in back-to-back games.

SERRATO'S THREE-RUN HOMER CAPS SEVEN-RUN TWO-OUT RALLY

- Punctuated by a go-ahead three-run homer from **Barrett Serrato**, Purdue scored seven times with two outs in the seventh inning to overcome a six-run deficit and stun Southern Miss, 10-9, March 3 at Auburn's four-team tournament.
- Seven consecutive Purdue hitters reached base safely during the quick-strike rally, which began innocently enough with a seeing-eye single up the middle from **David Miller**. The Boilermakers have scored seven or more runs in an inning three times this year, all three extended rallies giving Purdue the lead in the sixth inning or later.
- **Stephen Talbott**, **Tyler Spillner**, **Cameron Perkins** and **Kevin Plawecki** each delivered a run-scoring hit to set the stage for Serrato. The senior connected for a three-run homer to right center that capped the rally. Purdue hit for the cycle in the inning, Talbott tripling home Miller and Spillner doubling home Talbott.
- Miller was named to CollegeBaseball360.com's Primetime Performers national honor roll after finishing the weekend 5-for-12 and scoring a run in all three games of the Auburn tournament. He also played flawless defense at shortstop. The junior singled and scored the go-ahead run and later a key insurance run in each of the final two innings of the win against Auburn.

DeANO EARNS THE WIN IN HIS COLLEGIATE DEBUT

• **Jack DeAno** worked three innings of hitless relief in his Purdue debut, earning the win in the comeback victory against Southern Miss March 3. He retired nine of the 11 batters he faced, highlighted by a 1-2-3 ninth inning. Southern Miss, which had scored 32 runs in its last two games entering the day, racked up nine runs on 13 hits through the first six innings.
 • DeAno sat out the 2011 season as a transfer from Vanderbilt. He had not pitched since high school and was listed as an outfielder on the roster his first year with the program. While he could still see action as a defensive replacement or pinch runner, he is now expected to remain a full-time member of the bullpen.

PERKINS & PLawecki RECORD 100TH CAREER RBIs IN SAME GAME AS SPILLNER & CHARLES BOTH POST FOUR-HIT EFFORTS

• The first four hitters in the Purdue lineup enjoyed a productive night in the March 2 win at Auburn. **Tyler Spillner** and **Eric Charles** both recorded four-hit efforts at the top of the order, setting the table for **Cameron Perkins** and **Kevin Plawecki**. Perkins and Plawecki both tallied their 100th career RBIs in the victory. Together the four hitters were a combined 11-for-20 with nine RBIs and five runs scored.
 • Perkins' game-tying sacrifice fly in the sixth inning plated **Stephen Talbott** and accounted for his 100th career RBI. Plawecki's 100th RBI came on a two-run single in the eighth inning that drove in Spillner and Charles. To go-ahead run had scored on Charles' base hit earlier in the inning.
 • Talbott successfully executed three sacrifice bunts in the Auburn win. On all three occasions, the player he advanced into scoring position scored. **David Miller** was advanced in the eighth and ninth innings, scoring the go-ahead tally in the eighth. His insurance run in ninth also proved very significant after Purdue held on to win 9-8 despite a three-run ninth inning for Auburn.

BREEDLOVE MAKING BATTERS EARN THEIR WAY ON BASE

• **Lance Breedlove** has issued just one walk in his first three starts while leading the team with 22 strikeouts. That one free pass came in his March 3 start against Southern Miss, a one-out walk in the third inning. The senior worked 14 1/3 innings before that first base on balls.
 • **Blake Mascarello** also issued his first walk of the season at the Auburn tournament. The senior had not issued a walk in his first 7 2/3 innings over three appearances. Coincidentally, he walked the first batter he faced in his relief outing against Auburn. The lefty still got the win though, stranding the bases loaded in the fifth inning and facing only 10 batters in the sixth through eighth innings. He worked 1-2-3 frames in the sixth and eighth.

CHARLES CONSISTENCY EARNS SENIOR BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

• **Eric Charles** recorded multiple hits and scored a run in all three games of the Keith LeClair Classic earning the senior Big Ten co-Player of the Week honors. He collected his 200th career hit Feb. 25 in the victory against East Carolina and his 100th collegiate RBI the next day in the win versus Western Carolina. He leads all active Boilers in both statistical categories.
 • The second baseman finished the weekend 8-for-12 with two doubles, three RBIs and four runs scored. Charles got off to a hot start this season, leading the way a .560 batting average (14-for-25) over the first six games. He hit safely in each of first seven games (including six multi-hit efforts) and scored a run in the first eight. His career-best streak of reaching base safely in 27 consecutive games ended March 4 in the win against Charleston Southern.
 • **Barrett Serrato** also reached base safely in each of the first eight games of the new season, hitting safely in seven of the first eight. He came through with a key RBI single in the three-run sixth inning rally in the ECU victory after the Pirates had intentionally walked **Kevin Plawecki** to setup a lefty-lefty matchup. But his biggest of the young season remains the go-ahead three-run homer to cap the seven-run rally against Southern Miss.

BOILERS TURN EIGHT DOUBLE PLAYS IN GREENVILLE

• Purdue turned four double plays in each of its two victories at the Keith LeClair Classic. Of the eight twin killings, six were of the inning-ending variety and none bigger than the 1-2-3 game-ending double play in the East Carolina win. **Nick Wittgren** induced a comebacker off the bat of the ECU cleanup hitter with the bases loaded, one out and Purdue clinging to a 6-4 lead. Wittgren had already walked the previous two hitters to load the bases when the count went full against ECU's Chase McDonald. But moments later the game was over and Wittgren had earned his 13th career save, moving into third place on the Purdue all-time list.
 • **Joe Haase** (two), **Joe Eichmann**, **Calvin Gunter**, **Blake Mascarello** and **Connor Podkul** also induced at least one ground ball double play ball. Mascarello started a 1-6-3 double play to eliminate a leadoff single in the eighth inning of the ECU win. Defensively, **David Miller** (six) and **Eric Charles** (five) were active in the twin killings at the second base bag.
 • Purdue also turned four double plays in a game in a March 2011 home win against IPFW and three times during the 2009 campaign.

SPILLNER & CHARLES IGNITE THE OFFENSE AT ECU TOURNEY

• While batting their customary first and second in the lineup at the Keith LeClair Classic, **Tyler Spillner** (7-for-12) and **Eric Charles** (8-for-12) were a combined 15-for-24 with three walks, five RBIs and 10 runs scored. Both players reached base safely in all three games and had multiple hits in Purdue's two wins.

• Spillner reached base safely in three of his six opportunities to leadoff an inning, including the first inning of both wins. He's been on safely to open an inning in nine of his 17 opportunities early this season. Sunday in the victory against Western Carolina, the senior posted his third career four-hit effort, scoring a run while recording a hit in each of his first four at-bats.

• **Andrew Dixon**, Spillner and Charles each reached base safely twice and scored a run during the seven-run rally against WCU that decided the game. All three players recorded a hit their first time up to ignite the rally. They each walked in their second plate appearances of the extended frame.

PERKINS' 67-GAME STREAK SNAPPED IN LOSS TO MARYLAND

• After getting robbed of a potential base hit up the middle on a nice play by the Maryland pitcher in what proved to be **Cameron Perkins'** final at-bat of the game, the junior's remarkable streak of reaching base safely in 67 consecutive games was snapped. The streak dated back to 2010. Perkins reached base safely at least one in every game he played as a sophomore.

• Perkins reached base safely 133 times during his streak. He collected 98 hits, 12 walks and was hit by a pitch 23 times, good for an on-base percentage of .421.

• In Big Ten play, Perkins has reached base safely in 42 consecutive contests dating back to 2010. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he has managed to find his way on base in 49 straight games against conference opponents. He has compiled an on-base percentage of .425 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 94 times (70 hits, eight walks, 16 hit by pitch).

BOILERMAKERS OPEN 3-0 AT BIG TEN/BIG EAST CHALLENGE

• After being the only Big Ten team to finish the season-opening Big Ten/Big East Challenge 3-0, Purdue jumped out to its first 3-0 start since the 1991 team opened the year 5-0. The Challenge ended deadlocked 15-15 after both the Big Ten and Big East posted 15 wins. South Florida was the only other team to go 3-0.

• The Boilermakers outscored Connecticut, Cincinnati and Notre Dame at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge by a margin of 30-12. Purdue also posted its three wins in a span of just over 24 hours after Friday's opener against Cincinnati was postponed due to rain. The Boilermakers recorded back-to-back three-run rallies late in the game against UConn, led wire-to-wire in the shutout win against Cincinnati and used a nine-run sixth inning to surge past Notre Dame.

BREEDLOVE BESTOWED WITH PITCHER OF THE WEEK HONORS

• **Lance Breedlove's** career-high 11 strikeouts over his seven innings of two-hit ball in Purdue's shutout win of Cincinnati (Feb. 18) earned the senior right-hander National Pitcher of the Week honors from College Sports Madness as well as Big Ten co-Pitcher of the Week honors.

• Breedlove was dominant in his fifth career start as a Boiler. He surrendered only a pair of two-out singles and did not allow a base runner to advance past first. His 11 strikeouts represented the most by a Purdue pitcher since Matt Morgan fanned 14 in a March 2010 win at Ohio.

• Breedlove would have retired the final 16 batters he faced if not for a two-out error in the fifth inning. The senior worked four 1-2-3 frames. He struck out the side in the first inning. Thanks in part to not issuing a walk, Breedlove only needed 89 pitches to complete his seven innings. Purdue's first shutout win since the 2011 Big Ten home opener against Michigan was played in two hours and two minutes.

PERKINS' GRAND SLAM HIGHLIGHTS NINE-RUN RALLY

• Highlighted by a nine-run sixth inning that featured a grand slam from **Cameron Perkins**, Purdue scored in each of the final five innings to overcome a four-run deficit and defeat Notre Dame, 15-8, on the final day (Feb. 19) of the Big Ten/Big East Challenge.

• Each of the nine players in the batting order reached base safely and scored a run before an out was recorded in the sixth inning, leading to the Boilers' biggest inning since also scoring nine times in a March 2010 home win against Chicago State. Perkins connected for the first grand slam by a Boiler since April 2010, giving Purdue a 9-4 lead with a blast to left field. He finished with five RBIs, one shy of his career high. The grand slam was his 17th career home run, tops among active Boilers.

CONSISTENT LINEUP LEADS THE WAY IN ST. PETE

• The Boilermakers scored in 12 of 25 innings in which they batted at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge, finishing the weekend with a .367 team batting average. **Eric Charles** (6-for-13), **David Miller** (6-for-13), **Kevin Plawecki** (5-for-13) and **Stephen Talbott** (4-for-11) hit safely in all three games. **Andrew Dixon** enjoyed a big night at the plate (4-for-4) in the Cincinnati win, finishing the weekend 5-for-8.

• Thanks in part to the opposition committing 14 errors and issuing 16 free passes (11 walks, 5 HBP) over the three games, Purdue had a base runner in 22 of the 25 innings in which the team batted. A trio of 1-2-3 innings in the shutout win against Cincinnati marked the only times the Boilers went in order. Conversely, Purdue only committed two errors and issued eight free passes (4 walks, 4 HBP). The Boilermakers did not make an error or issue a walk in the season-opening win against Connecticut.

- Tabbed first or second in the preseason predictions by nearly every college baseball publication and website, Purdue entered the 2012 season among the favorites in the Big Ten Conference. Baseball America and College Baseball Insider both predicted the Boilers will win the Big Ten and represent the conference at the NCAA Regionals. Baseball America also predicted Purdue would be a No. 3 seed at Regionals. The league coaches picked the Boilers second to defending conference co-champion Michigan State in the preseason poll.
- Although Purdue has not won a Big Ten title since 1909, the team has certainly come close quite a few times during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** 14-year tenure. Four times since 2001, the Boilers have either finished in second place (2001, 2005, 2008) or been just one game (or fewer) out of first place in the final standings (2001 & 2011). Purdue tied the program's single-season record with 37 wins in 2011, leading the Big Ten in victories and overall win percentage (.649).

- The Boilermakers' opening day lineup is expected to feature all returning starters that are juniors or seniors. Purdue lost only three players that started games a season ago, with one of those graduated seniors, Payton Bieker, now an assistant coach.
- The opening day lineup is expected to feature six players that have earned All-Big Ten honors during their college careers. **Kevin Plawecki** (First Team catcher), **Barrett Serrato** (First Team outfielder), **Tyler Spillner** (Second Team outfielder), **Cameron Perkins** (Third Team third baseman) and **Stephen Talbott** (Third Team outfielder) were recognized among the best players in the conference at their positions in 2011. Second baseman **Eric Charles**, meanwhile, was a Third Team honoree as a freshman in 2009.

• Purdue is the only Big Ten team to reach the league tournament in each of the last four seasons, a program-long streak. The Boilermakers have managed to win at least one Big Ten Tournament game each of the last four years, and in eight of their nine tourney appearances under head coach **Doug Schreiber**. Purdue's 58 conference victories over the last four years are also tops in the league.

- While the Boilermakers will be without key starting pitcher **Brad Schreiber** this season due to offseason elbow surgery, Purdue does welcome back a pair of seniors who missed the final weeks of 2011. **Ryan Bridges** had started 24 of the first 31 games at first base when he suffered a broken leg in the finale of the Michigan series on April 10. He was batting .313 with 11 extra-base hits and 21 RBIs at the time of the injury. He had also impressed with his defense at first base.
- **Blake Mascarello** also returns to the active roster after missing the final month of 2011 due to a violation of team rules. The left-hander was a key member of the Purdue bullpen a year ago, compiling a 1.26 ERA in his six Big Ten appearances. Mascarello was a starting pitcher early in the season but proved most valuable in a relief role.
- Mascarello excelled in relief in the 2012 season-opening win against Connecticut, retiring 12 of the 14 batters he faced over four scoreless innings of relief to earn the victory. Bridges started all three games of the Big Ten/Big East Challenge at first base, finishing the weekend 3-for-12 with a walk and squeeze bunt.
- **MASCARELLO IN RELIEF IN 2011: 2-2, SAVE, 12 APP, 24 2/3 IP, 22 H, 5 BB, 24 K, 1.82 ERA**

- After leading the Big Ten with 12 saves and earning Second Team All-Big Ten honors in 2011, closer **Nick Wittgren** has received his fair share of preseason publicity this year. He was named to the NCBWA's Preseason All-America Third Team and was one of 45 relievers to be selected for the NCBWA's Stopper of the Year preseason watch list. Wittgren was the only player from a Big Ten school on the list for the award that recognizes the nation top Division I relief pitcher.
- Wittgren finished one save shy of the Purdue single-season record last year. He helped the Boilers establish a new program record with 21 saves as a team. But seven different relievers tallied at least one save, with all seven pitchers back this year.
- Twenty-four of Wittgren's 28 relief appearances on the mound saw him finish a game. He struck out 55 in 51 innings while issuing only 10 walks.
- **WITTGREN AS A RELIEVER IN 2012: 2-2, 28 APP, 12 SAVES, 45 2/3 IP, 39 H, 10 BB, 50 K, 2.36 ERA**

- Senior **Joe Haase** began the 2011 season in the bullpen but quickly emerged as one of Purdue's top pitchers and finished the year as the team leader in innings pitched. He started a game in each of the eight Big Ten weekend series and shared the team lead with 13 starts total. The right-hander begins the 2012 campaign as the team's Friday starter and ace of the pitching staff.
- Thanks in part to a complete-game shutout in his first career Big Ten start, a win against Minnesota at Target Field, Haase was able to record a consecutive scoreless-innings streak of 14 over four appearances during the first half of the season. He worked at least six innings in six of his nine starts against Big Ten rivals, finishing just one out shy of a complete game in the middle win game in the series sweep of Indiana.
- Haase also took the ball in the midweek games against nationally-ranked foes Louisville and Vanderbilt. He led the way in the win at Louisville, surrendering only two earned runs over 8 2/3 innings. He continued his mastery of Minnesota at the Big Ten Tournament, keeping the gritty Gophers off the scoreboard until the seventh inning in a game the Boilers lost, 1-0.

- Purdue was active on the base paths for much of the 2011 season, successfully stealing at least one base in 42 of the 57 games. Twelve Boilermakers swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** led the way at a perfect 17-for-17. After successfully stealing four bases in 2012 the junior is a perfect 26-for-26 in his career.
- Talbott was a Third Team All-Big Ten outfielder in 2011 thanks in part to ranking second in the conference with 54 runs scored. He did not bat any higher than eighth in the lineup until getting a chance to leadoff in the finale of the Tennessee Tech series (March 20). But for the season he batted no higher than seventh in 46 of the 55 games he started. He has batted ninth in the first seven games he has started in 2012.

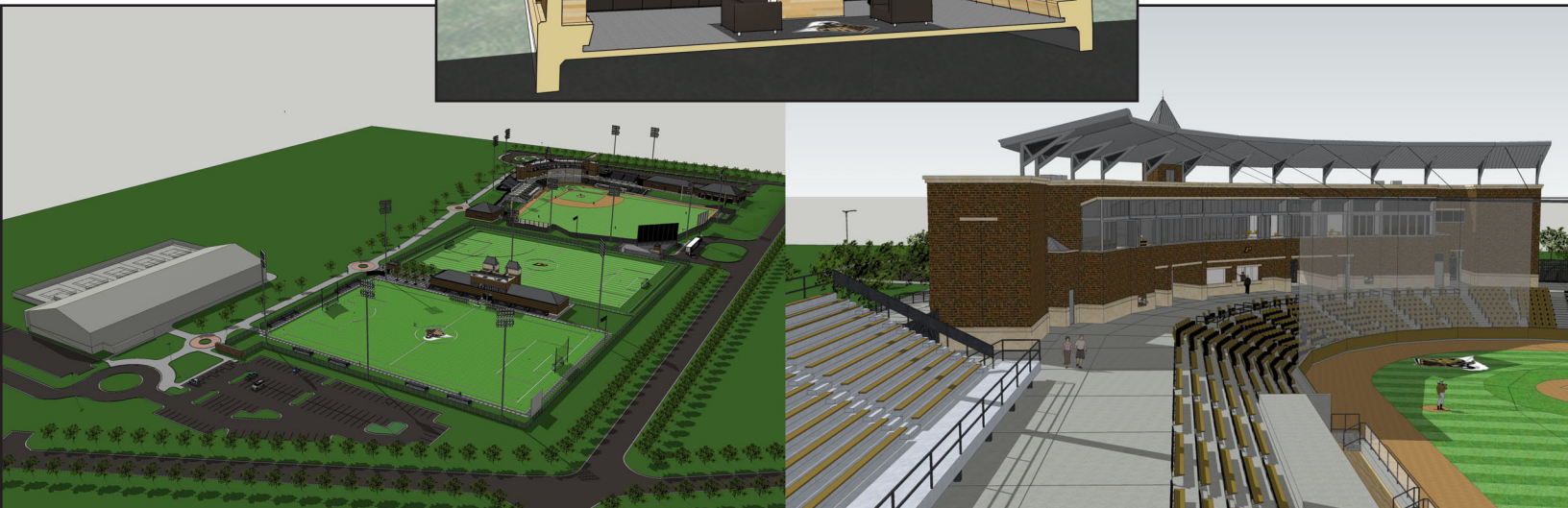
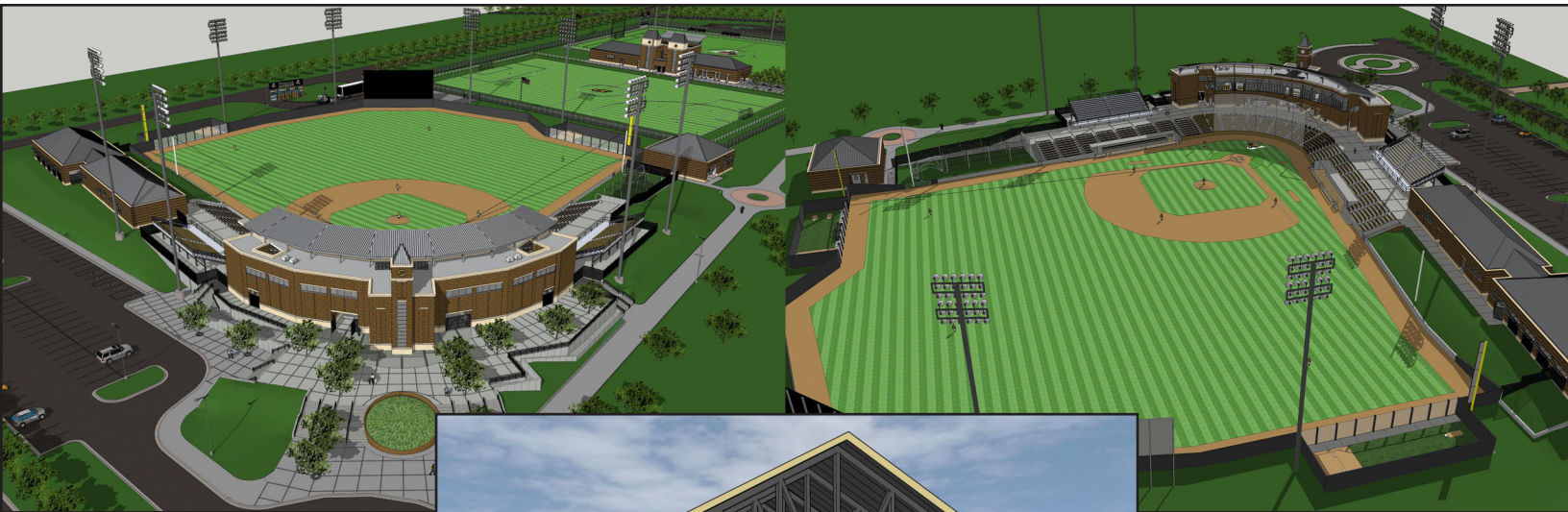

Coming Soon: Alexander Field at the Northwest Athletics Complex Construction Began in Spring of 2011 Stadium to be located near the intersection of McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus

Alexander Field will soon be the new home of the Boilermakers. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. The new stadium will be named Alexander Field in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. The Alexanders were the parents of Dave Alexander, who is giving the lead gift for the project. David Alexander was Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991 and then an athletics administrator through 1994. All three Alexanders graduated from Purdue, and Dave played on Purdue's baseball team. John Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1933, while Anna Margaret Ross Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1935. Both received honorary doctorates from Purdue in 1986.
