– BOILERS HOST PENN STATE FOR FIRST HOME WEEKEND SERIES OF 2012 –

No. 19 Purdue baseball closes out its weeklong five-game homestand with its first series of the year at Lambert Field, welcoming Penn State to campus for the second Big Ten weekend of the season.

Purdue head coach Doug Schreiber enters the weekend with 398 career wins. A series win would give the 14th-year leader of the program his third notable milestone win against the Nittany Lions (7-16, 1-2 Big Ten). Schreiber also recorded career wins No. 100 and 300 in games against Penn State. Meanwhile, the Purdue alumnus continues to close in Dave Alexander's all-time record (407) for wins as the head coach of the Boilermakers.

After posting midweek wins against No. 15 Louisville and IPFW earlier this week, Purdue (18-4, 2-1) improved to 13-3 in March. Along with Schreiber reaching the 400-win benchmark, the Boilers also have an opportunity this weekend to post their 20th win by April 1. Granted, the Feb. 18 season start date was among the earliest in program history, but no Purdue team has ever won 20 games by April 1. The 1991 team had an opportunity to accomplish the feat but lost the nightcap of a March 31 doubleheader at Michigan State after posting win No. 19 earlier in the day.

The Boilermakers entered the week leading the nation with a .349 team batting average. However, they batted only .190 (12-for-63) as a team while winning their midweek home games against Louisville and IPFW. Too many fly balls were a bit of an issue, as Purdue was retired on fly balls on 28 of the 52 outs it made in those games.

Cameron Perkins connected for his 20th career home run Wednesday, leading off the seventh inning against IPFW with a game-tying blast to left field. He joined Sean McHugh as active Boilers to hit the first long ball of the season at Lambert Field. The junior became the 15th player in program history with 20 career home runs. Meanwhile, after hitting safely and scoring a run in all three games of the Ohio State series last weekend in Columbus, Perkins has now reached base safely in 45 consecutive Big Ten games dating back to 2010.

Kevin Plawecki and Barrett Serrato have teamed up with Perkins to give Purdue one of the most formidable 3-4-5 lineup combinations in the country. Plawecki has reached base safely in 17 consecutive games. At Ohio State, he had two hits, recorded an RBI and scored a run in all three games. Serrato continues to be very dangerous in a run-producing role. Fifteen of his 19 RBIs this season have come with two outs. The senior has recorded 17 of his 32 hits with a runner in scoring position.

Along with Schreiber's pursuit of 400 wins, century-mark career milestones for Blake Mascarello (99 career strikeouts), Tyler Spillner (98 career RBIs) and Stephen Talbott (98 career hits) could be achieved this weekend as well.

The Boilermakers have enjoyed a high level of success against Penn State during Schreiber's tenure. Purdue's 31 victories and .608 winning percentage vs. PSU represent the team's top marks against any Big Ten rival since 1999. After winning three of the four games last year and sweeping the Lions at Lambert in 2010, the Boilers have won 12 of the last 15 meetings. During PSU's Big Ten era (1994-present), Purdue has only lost one home series (2003) with Penn State.

The Nittany Lions struggled early this season, suffering through a 1-9 stretch while playing their first 17 games on the road. Penn State went 4-2 during its recent six-game homestand but lost two-of-three to Indiana last weekend. Games two and three were tight one-run affairs after the Hoosiers rolled to a 14-2 series-opening win.

Purdue faced PSU's game one probable starter John Walter twice last season. The right-hander was effectively wild in game two of the regular-season series in University Park, limiting the Boilers to two runs on one hit while walking eight. Purdue was able to score four runs against him five innings in an opening-day win at the Big Ten Tournament.

Purdue has won six straight home games dating back to a May 17, 2011, midweek win against Illinois-Chicago.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 14th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 380-348 overall record and a 190-178 Big Ten mark through his first 13 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber will make a run at Alexander's all-time wins record (407) this season and is on pace to break the games coached benchmark in 2013.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's single season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first, and reached the Big Ten Tournament for the fourth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons. The four straight tourney appearances represent the longest active streak in the league as well as a program high. The program's 58 Big Ten wins over the last four years are also the most in the league.

Purdue led the Big Ten in numerous statistical categories in 2011, highlighted by runs scored, doubles, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, sacrifice flies, saves and strikeouts. The Boilermakers drew the most walks at the plate and issued the fewest number of free passes on the mound.

Six Boilers were recognized as all-conference performers, matching the second-highest total in program history. Kevin Plawecki and Barrett Serrato were named First Team, Tyler Spillner and Nick Wittgren Second Team and Cameron Perkins and Stephen Talbott Third Team. With Serrato, Spillner and Talbott all honored as outfielders, it marked the first time 1991 that three Purdue outfielders were named all-conference in the same season.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher. He led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 54 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 18 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last seven years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE HOSTS PENN STATE FOR FIRST HOME WEEKEND

- After winning two-of-three at Ohio State during the opening weekend of Big Ten play, Purdue concludes its five-game weeklong homestand with a home series against Penn State. The Boilermakers have won 12 of their last 15 games against PSU dating back to 2008, including a three-game series sweep at Lambert Field in 2010.
- Purdue head coach **Doug Schreiber** enters the weekend with 398 career wins. The Purdue alumnus also continues to close in on Dave Alexander's all-time record (407) for wins as the head coach of the Boilermakers.
- After posting midweek wins against No. 15 Louisville and IPFW earlier this week, Purdue improved to 13-3 in March. The Boilers have an opportunity this weekend to post their 20th win by April 1. Granted, the Feb. 18 season start date was among the earliest in program history, but no Purdue team has ever won 20 games by April 1.
- Purdue was denied its first-ever series sweep in Columbus when it lost Sunday's series finale at Ohio State, 5-4. The Boilermakers captured the series with a doubleheader sweep Saturday. The final inning and a half Sunday featured six runs after the teams combined for only three runs in the first seven innings.

BOILERS' BATS LEAD THE NATION IN TEAM BATTING AVERAGE ENTERING THE WEEK

- Fueled in part by the .437 average Purdue posted in the Murray State sweep (March 9-11), the Boilers entered the week lead the nation with a .349 team batting average. Purdue was also seventh in scoring (8.1 runs per game) and ninth in slugging percentage. But the defense has been performing well, too. The Boilermakers were fourth in double plays turned per game and ranked ninth in total twin killings. Purdue has now turned 30 double play after registering five in the two midweek wins this week.

TALBOTT PLAYS THE HERO IN HOME-OPENING WALK-OFF WIN

- **Stephen Talbott's** walk-off single in the 10th inning punctuated the Boilers' home-opening with an exclamation point. Purdue defeated No. 15 Louisville, 2-1, March 27 in a game that featured two of the nation's top offenses but turned into a pitcher's duel.
- Talbott singled home **Angelo Cianfrocco**, who doubled to open the 10th inning, to join **Sean McHugh** and **Cameron Perkins** as active Boilers with a walk-off hit on their collegiate résumés. McHugh played the hero in Purdue's last extra-inning game, a 12-inning victory against Indiana at Lambert Field on April 29, 2011.
- Starting pitcher **Connor Podkul** did not give up a hit over six innings of one-run ball in his Lambert Field debut. Despite a low pitch count of 59 for Podkul, lefty **Blake Mascarello** took over on the mound to begin the seventh. The Cardinals had three left-handed hitters due up. Mascarello worked four innings of scoreless relief to earn his team-leading fifth win. Head coach **Doug Schreiber** said Podkul is also continuing to build up his pitch count after a heavy work load in the spring and summer of 2011.
- Podkul has surrendered only three hits over 12 1/3 innings in his first four appearances for the Boilers.

BIG TEN LEADING BOILERS

- While the offense has generated the majority of the headlines early this season, the Purdue pitching and defense has also carried its fair share of the load to help Purdue earn its national ranking. Entering the weekend, the pitching staff has issued the fewest walks (60) and surrendered the second fewest runs (94) in the Big Ten. The Boilermakers 30 double plays turned, including 25 of the ground ball variety induced by the pitchers, are tops in the league.
- While leading the league in team batting average, Purdue is second to Nebraska in many other offensive categories. The Huskers have played five more games than the Boilers entering the weekend. Purdue does lead the league with 24 sacrifice bunts and struck out the fewest number of times in the league (115).
- Individually, **Kevin Plawecki** enters the weekend leading the conference with 13 doubles and a .687 slugging percentage. **Lance Breedlove** is tops in the Big Ten with 39 strikeouts and **Blake Mascarello's** five wins are the most in the league.

BREEDLOVE PITCHER OF THE WEEK AGAIN

- **Lance Breedlove** struck out 10 in his complete-game win at Ohio State March 24, earning Big Ten co-Pitcher of the Week honors for the second time this season for his first complete game as a Boilermaker.
- Breedlove went the distance in game two of the doubleheader sweep at OSU, posting his second double-figure strikeout performance of the year. The senior fanned 11 over seven innings of shutout ball against Cincinnati in his first start of the year, also earning Pitcher of the Week honors for that performance.
- Since the Big Ten began its weekly awards program in 1990, Breedlove is the seventh Purdue hurler to win Pitcher of the Week honors multiple times during his career. However, he joins Matt Morgan (2011) and Matt Bischoff (2010) as the only three to win the award twice in the same season.
- The only run Breedlove allowed scored with two outs in the ninth inning. He did not issue a walk until the eighth. The right-hander induced three ground ball double plays Saturday, all three coming after the first batter of an inning reached base safely. He pitched the first complete game by a Purdue pitcher since **Joe Haase** went the distance in a shutout of Minnesota at Target Field in April of last season.

RAMER FANS CAREER-HIGH TO LEAD PURDUE TO MIDWEEK WIN

- **Robert Ramer** struck out a career-high nine over eight innings of one-run ball, keeping his team in the game on another slow day for the offense in Purdue's 6-1 win against IPFW March 28.
- Ramer worked four 1-2-3 innings, retiring the final nine batters he faced in order. He recorded five strikeouts his first time through the IPFW lineup and two more in the eighth inning. It was the longest outing of his career.
- Ramer improved his career record to 8-0 with the win. Among the active Boilers with multiple decisions, he remains the program's only undefeated pitcher. Purdue is now 10-1 in games he has started during his career.
- The Boilermakers trailed 1-0 entering the bottom of the seventh but scored three times in the seventh and eighth innings to surge in front. **Cameron Perkins** tied the game with a solo home run to lead off the bottom of the seventh, his team-leading fourth long ball of the season and 20th career.

BIG SCORING EDGE LATE IN GAMES

- Purdue has feasted on relief pitching for much of the season, best demonstrated by a 98-37 scoring edge from the sixth inning through the end of the game. The Boilermakers have scored 42 runs in the sixth inning, their highest total in any inning. In fact, the run totals in the sixth, seventh (29), ninth (19) and eighth (17) innings rank as the team's top four. Coincidentally, Purdue has only scored seven runs in the fifth inning.
- The Boilermakers have scored four more runs in an inning 11 times this year. Ten of those 11 occurrences have come in the sixth inning or later. Purdue has registered extended sixth-inning rallies featuring run totals of nine (Feb. 19 vs. UND), eight (March 10 at Murray), seven (Feb. 26 vs. WCU and March 3 vs. USM) five (March 15 at WSU) and four (twice).
- On multiple occasions this season, Purdue has been able to score runs against an opposing reliever that entered the day having not surrendered an earned on the year. Wichita's Foster Vielock (3 H, 3 ER), Murray's Will Handlin (7 H, 5 ER), Southern Miss' Cameron Giannini (3 H, 4 ER), and Auburn's Dillon Ortman (H, ER) and Cory Luckie (2 H, 2 ER) all failed to hold down the Purdue offense in close games that the Boilers went on to win.
- In the March 27 walk-off win against Louisville, Purdue scored the game-winning run against the Cardinals' closer, Derek Self. He had surrendered only two earned runs in his first 10 appearances of the season entering the day.

PERKINS ALWAYS ON BASE VERSUS BIG TEN COMPETITION

- In Big Ten play, **Cameron Perkins** has reached base safely in 45 consecutive contests dating back to 2010. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he has managed to find his way on base in 52 straight games against conference opponents. He has compiled an on-base percentage of .424 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 100 times (75 hits, nine walks, 16 hit by pitch).
- After getting robbed of a potential base hit up the middle on a nice play by the Maryland pitcher on Feb. 25 in what proved to be Perkins' final at-bat of the game, the junior's remarkable streak of reaching base safely in 67 consecutive games was snapped. The streak dated back to 2010. Perkins reached base safely at least one in every game he played as a sophomore.
- Perkins reached base safely 133 times during his streak. He collected 98 hits, 12 walks and was hit by a pitch 23 times, good for an on-base percentage of .421.

BOILERS NOW OFFICIALLY RANKED IN ALL FOUR NATIONAL POLLS

- After debuting at No. 24 in the March 19 USA Today/ESPN Top 25 coaches' poll, Purdue is now nationally ranked in all four major national polls at the same time for the first time in program history.
- Among the Collegiate Baseball Top 30 for the fourth week in a row, the Boilers moved up to No. 22 this week. Purdue remained ranked in the Baseball America Top 25 and National Collegiate Baseball Writers of Association Top 30 polls for the third week in a row. The Boilermakers jumped to No. 19 in Baseball America's poll and No. 24 in the NCBWA rankings.
- The program has earned its first in-season national ranking since February 2001 (Baseball America). The Boilermakers were also nationally ranked in the 2002 NCBWA preseason poll.
- Thanks to a 18-4 record after recently reeling off a 10-game win streak, Purdue entered the weekend No. 11 nationally in the Boyd's World daily RPI. Thanks to a strength of schedule that was 47th entering the weekend, the Boilers are as high as sixth nationally in Boyd's World's ISR (Iterative Strength Ratings).
- The Boilermakers has been ranked among the Top 30 of Perfect Game USA's national Top 50 all season, moving up No. 15 this week.

TWO-OUT RBI TITANS

• **Barrett Serrato** (19 RBIs, 15 with two outs), **Sean McHugh** (11, 9), **David Miller** (9, 6), **Andrew Dixon** (6, 4) **Stephen Talbott** (11, 6) have supplied the majority of their run production in clutch situations this season. All four players enter the weekend having recorded more than half their RBIs with two outs in an inning. Serrato has led the way, collecting 15 of his 19 RBIs with two outs. On two occasions this year, the opposition (East Carolina and Wichita State) intentionally walked **Kevin Plawecki** with a runner in scoring position to setup a lefty-lefty matchup with Serrato. He delivered a run-scoring single in both instances.

• McHugh and Serrato have both connected for three-run homers with two outs in an inning this season. McHugh hit his three-run on the first pitch thrown by new WSU reliever Tobin Mateychick in the sixth inning of game two of the series. Serrato's three-run homer capped the seven-run rally in the comeback win against Southern Miss.

MASCARELLO STELLAR IN LONG RELIEF ROLE

• Senior left-hander **Blake Mascarello** has been Purdue's most consistent pitcher over the first six weeks of the season, earning the win in five of his 11 relief appearances. He was the winning pitcher against Connecticut, Auburn, Murray State (game one), Missouri State and Louisville. He has closed out the series opener at Ohio State for a save. Mascarello has surrendered a run in only three of his 11 appearances and helped the Boilers maintain a lead or kept the game tied all but one time (game four at Wichita State) he has taken the mound.

• While the lefty has been consistently excellent, his work in the Connecticut and Murray State wins stand out. He retired 12 of the 14 batters he faced over four scoreless innings in the season opener against UConn. In the series opener against Murray State, he retired 13 of the 14 batters he faced. In both instances he closed out the victory.

10-GAME WIN STREAK SNAPPED IN WICHITA; 14-1 START BEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY

• Purdue's 10-game win streak was snapped in a doubleheader sweep at the hands of Wichita State March 17 on the final day of the spring break trip. The Boilermakers lost more games on St. Patrick's Day than they had in the first month of the season (one). Purdue had not dropped both games of a doubleheader since May 2010 at Iowa. The 10-game win streak was the program's longest since the 2001 team won 13 in row.

• At 14-1 before the St. Patrick's Day sweep, the Boilers posted the best one-loss start in program history. Previously, the 1959 team had gone 13-1 before suffering its second loss of the year.

• Purdue has posted its 18 wins against 15 team different teams. The Boilermakers played each of their first 10 games of the season against 10 different opponents.

• While the offense grabbed headlines after scoring 40 runs while batting .437 in the series sweep of Murray State (March 9-11), the pitching and defense also performed well in Purdue's first road sweep since taking all three games of a series at Lipscomb the first weekend of March last season. The Boilermakers only surrendered five runs in the series, with Murray State scoring only one run

after the first inning. Defensively, Purdue did not commit an error in the series while turning six double plays.

WITTGREN BREAKS SAVES RECORD AS PITCHING CARRIES THE LOAD IN MSU WIN

• **Connor Podkul** did not give up a hit until the fifth inning in his first collegiate start and **Blake Mascarello** and **Nick Wittgren** backed him up with 4 2/3 innings of one-run relief, as solid pitching led Purdue to a 4-2 win at Missouri State March 13.

• Wittgren recorded his 16th career save by retiring six of the eight batters he faced over two innings of hitless relief. The junior officially eclipsed the program's all-time saves record. He entered the night in a three-way tie with former closers Scott Dubach (1985-87) and Andy Helmer (1997-00).

• Wittgren recorded his 16 saves in his first 35 relief appearances. He has converted 16 of his 19 save opportunities since becoming the closer early in the 2011 season. Seven of his 16 career saves have come in appearances longer than one inning.

• Wittgren is the first Boiler to establish a new individual program record since Matt Bischoff recorded his 258th career strikeout to break the all-time record in an April 2010 home win against Northwestern.

DeANO EARNS THE WIN IN HIS COLLEGIATE DEBUT

• **Jack DeAno** worked three innings of hitless relief in his Purdue debut, earning the win in the comeback victory against Southern Miss March 3. He retired nine of the 11 batters he faced, highlighted by a 1-2-3 ninth inning. Southern Miss, which had scored 32 runs in its last two games entering the day, racked up nine runs on 13 hits through the first six innings.

• DeAno has now pitched in four games. The right-hander worked 3 1/3 innings of scoreless relief, striking out four, to help lead the Boilers to a series-opening win at Wichita State March 15.

• DeAno sat out the 2011 season as a transfer from Vanderbilt. He had not pitched since high school and was listed as an outfielder on the roster his first year with the program. While he could still see action as a defensive replacement or pinch runner, he is now expected to remain a full-time member of the bullpen.

BOILERS POUND OUT PROGRAM-RECORD 30 HITS IN BLOWOUT OF MURRAY STATE

• Purdue pounded out a school-record 30 hits and scored eight runs in an inning twice, reaching the 20-run plateau for the first time since March 2008 in a 22-1 win at Murray State March 10. The Boilermakers sent 12 men to the plate in the eight-run sixth inning that blew the game open and later scored eight times with two outs in the top of the ninth.

• The previous program record for hits was 26, accomplished twice, most recently in a 2006 win at Indiana (25-8). That game also marked the last time Purdue scored 20-plus runs in a road game.

• The Boilers also turned four double plays in a game (March 10) for the third time this year, highlighted by a 2-5-4 twin killing on a MSU sac bunt attempt with two aboard and no outs in the second inning.

- **Stephen Talbott** recorded multiple hits and scored a run in all three games of the series sweep at Murray State (March 9-11), hitting for the cycle over the course of the weekend, and the No. 9 hitter was recognized as the Big Ten Conference Player of the Week for his efforts. Talbott finished the weekend 10-for-17 with four extra-base hits, five RBIs and five runs scored. The outfielder collected four hits in the wins Saturday and Sunday, his first collegiate four-hit efforts.
- Thanks to a two-run double and a home run, Talbott also matched his career high with four RBIs in the series finale. The two-run double came with two outs in the second inning and tied the game. He went deep to left field in the sixth inning to extend the Boilers' one-run lead entering the frame.
- Talbott also recorded two hits in Purdue eight-run sixth inning in the middle game of the series.
- For the second year in a row, the Boilers had at least one player honored as the Big Ten Player or Pitcher of the Week after each of the first four weekends of the season.
- Talbott finished the spring break trip a team-best 16-for-34 (.471) with six extra-base hits and eight RBIs. He remains a perfect 28-for-28 on stolen base attempts for his career.

- After being among the 13 semifinalists nationally a season ago for the Johnny Bench Award, **Kevin Plawecki** has once again been selected to the initial watch list for the award that recognizes the nation's top all-around catcher. The initial watch list featured 43 catchers. More could be added as the season progresses and a group of semifinalists will be announced May 16.
- Plawecki homered on consecutive days in the wins against Southern Miss and Charleston Southern. Both home runs were towering fly balls over the 35-foot-high wall in left field. He went deep in back-to-back games for the third time in his career. He also accomplished the feat in 2010 (at Illinois State and vs. Penn State) and 2011 (games two and three of Illinois series). Among active Boilers, **Ryan Bridges**, **Cameron Perkins** (twice) and **Tyler Spillner** have also homered in back-to-back games.
- Plawecki and Iowa's Dan Sheppard were the only Big Ten backstops named to the initial watch list. Plawecki has batted cleanup in each of the first 13 games this season, starting all but two behind the plate. Defensively, Plawecki has thrown out four of six would-be base stealers over the first 13 games. He recorded his 100th career RBI in the weekend-opening win against Auburn.

- Closer **Nick Wittgren** finished off two of Purdue's three wins at Auburn's tournament (March 2-4), tying the program's all-time record with his 15th career save and earning Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for his efforts.
- Wittgren closed out the victories against Auburn and Charleston Southern, retiring eight of the 11 batters he faced over his three innings of scoreless relief. More importantly, the junior got some big outs when the Boilers need them most. He left the potential tying run at second base while finishing off the Auburn win and fanned the CSU leadoff hitter with the bases loaded to close out the eighth inning.
- Andy Helmer was the last Purdue pitcher to win Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors as a reliever, accomplishing the feat in April 2000.

- The first four hitters in the Purdue lineup enjoyed a productive night in the March 2 win at Auburn. **Tyler Spillner** and **Eric Charles** both recorded four-hit efforts at the top of the order, setting the table for **Cameron Perkins** and **Kevin Plawecki**. Perkins and Plawecki both tallied their 100th career RBIs in the victory. Together the four hitters were a combined 11-for-20 with nine RBIs and five runs scored.
- Perkins' game-tying sacrifice fly in the sixth inning plated **Stephen Talbott** and accounted for his 100th career RBI. Plawecki's 100th RBI came on a two-run single in the eighth inning that drove in Spillner and Charles. To go-ahead run had scored on Charles' base hit earlier in the inning.
- In the Murray State series (March 9-11), **Tyler Spillner** posted his 200th career hit (a three-run homer in game two of the series) and **Joe Haase** registered is 100th career strikeout. **Eric Charles** had his 200th career hit & 100th career RBI at the East Carolina Tournament (Feb. 25-26).
- Century-mark career milestones for **Blake Mascarello** (99 career strikeouts), Spillner (98 career RBIs) and Talbott (98 career hits) could be achieved this weekend.

- Punctuated by a go-ahead three-run homer from **Barrett Serrato**, Purdue scored seven times with two outs in the seventh inning to overcome a six-run deficit and stun Southern Miss, 10-9, March 3 at Auburn's four-team tournament.
- Seven consecutive Purdue hitters reached base safely during the quick-strike rally, which began innocently enough with a seeing-eye single up the middle from **David Miller**. The Boilermakers have scored seven or more runs in an inning three times this year, all three extended rallies giving Purdue the lead in the sixth inning or later.
- **Stephen Talbott**, **Tyler Spillner**, **Cameron Perkins** and **Kevin Plawecki** each delivered a run-scoring hit to set the stage for Serrato. The senior connected for a three-run homer to right center that capped the rally. Purdue hit for the cycle in the inning, Talbott tripling home Miller and Spillner doubling home Talbott.
- Miller was named to CollegeBaseball360.com's Primetime Performers national honor roll after finishing the weekend 5-for-12 and scoring a run in all three games of the Auburn tournament. He also played flawless defense at shortstop. The junior singled and scored the go-ahead run and later a key insurance run in each of the final two innings of the win against Auburn.

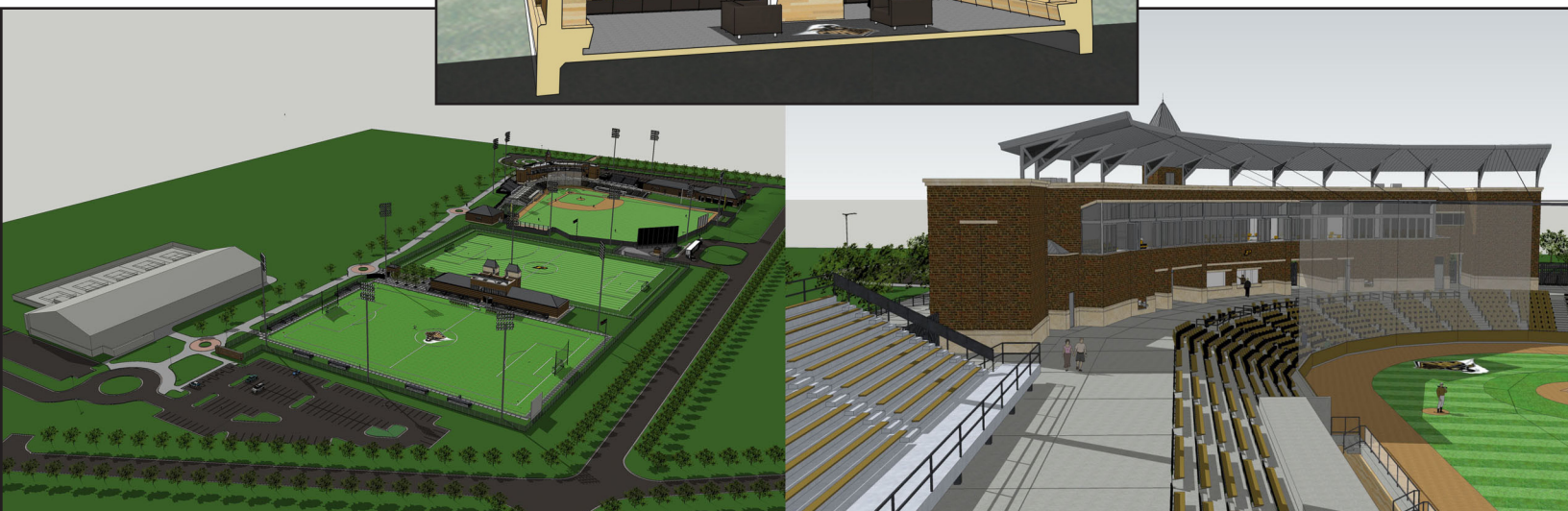
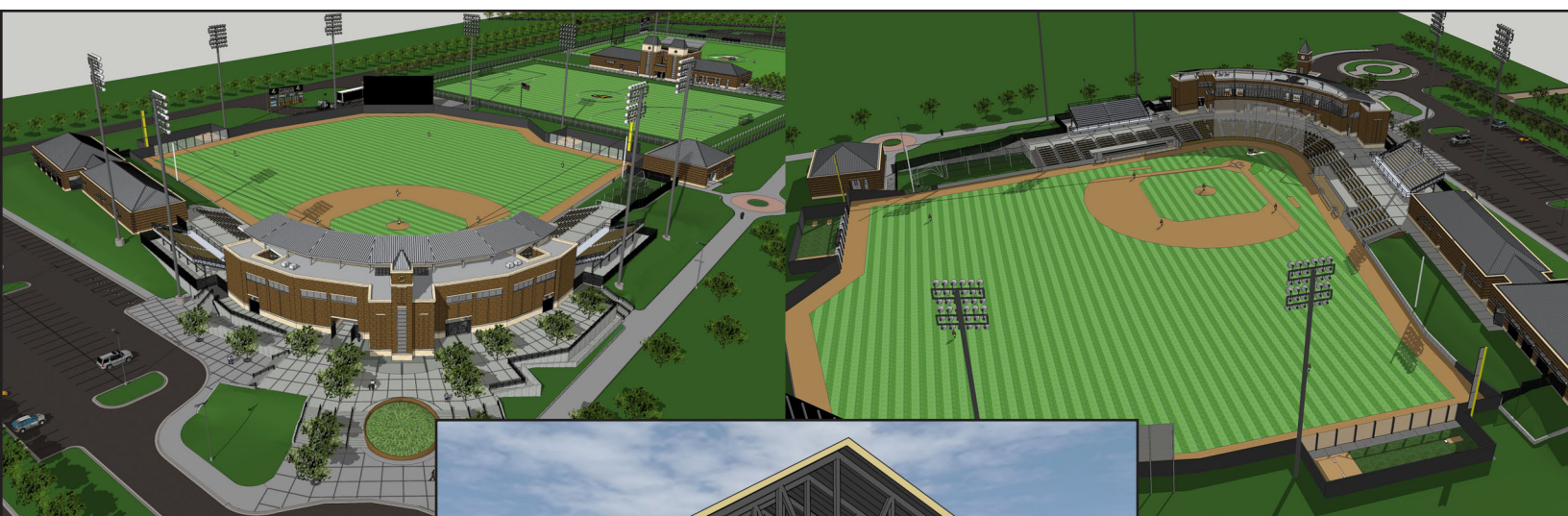

Coming Soon: Alexander Field at the Northwest Athletics Complex Construction Began in Spring of 2011 Stadium to be located near the intersection of McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus

Alexander Field will soon be the new home of the Boilermakers. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. The new stadium will be named Alexander Field in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. The Alexanders were the parents of Dave Alexander, who is giving the lead gift for the project. David Alexander was Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991 and then an athletics administrator through 1994. All three Alexanders graduated from Purdue, and Dave played on Purdue's baseball team. John Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1933, while Anna Margaret Ross Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1935. Both received honorary doctorates from Purdue in 1986.
