HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 16th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the inaugural season at the new ballpark turned out to be a rebuilding year for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909. In its 16 games during the final year at Lambert, Purdue won three times in walk-off fashion and locked up the Big Ten title May 12 in front of a large group of program alumni.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's previous single-season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings under Schreiber in 2001, 2005 and 2008.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 30 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last nine years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

– PURDUE VISITS HOUSTON FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2005 –

As the Boilermakers travel to the state of Texas for the first time since 2009, they're set to take on an 11th-ranked Rice team that represents the first of five preseason conference favorites on Purdue baseball's schedule this year.

First pitch at Reckling Park in South Central Houston is set for 5:30 p.m. Friday, 3 p.m. Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday (all times ET).

The Boilermakers are visiting the home of the Rice Owls for the first time since the 2005 spring break trip. Purdue also made a season-opening splash at Reckling Park in February 2001 when it defeated No. 1 Rice and a nationally-ranked Wake Forest team at a four-team tournament. The Owls were the top-ranked team in Collegiate Baseball's weekly poll early that season, but Ben Quick led the Boilers to a 5-2 victory with a complete-game effort in which he struck out nine.

Purdue has not played in the state of Texas since getting swept in a three-game series at Texas State (San Marcos) in March 2009. Along with 2001, 2005 and 2009, the Boilers also made trips to Texas in 2002 (series at Texas-San Antonio) and 2008 (series at Baylor) for season-opening weekends during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** tenure (1999-present).

Rice has been to 19 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, advancing to the College World Series seven times during the remarkable streak. The Owls won the national title in 2003. Head coach Wayne Graham, now 77 years old and in his 23rd year at Rice, won his 1,000th career game as the leader of the program Tuesday with an 11-inning victory against Texas State. The Owls are the preseason favorites in Conference USA this year after winning the Eugene Regional of the NCAA Tournament last season.

Purdue will give **Patrick Kenney** a chance to start on the mound for the first time in his college career Friday. The sophomore right-hander has a live arm and is one of the pitching staff's hardest throwers. He earned three saves early in his freshman season, but has battled control problems as a Boilermaker and not really excelled when entering the game with inherited runners on base. The coaching staff's thinking is Kenney could benefit from the opportunity to start a game with a clean slate. **Jordan Minch** will take the ball Saturday after doing OK in his season-opening start at Tennessee, working 4 2/3 innings of two-run ball.

Along with playing well defensively and putting the ball in play often, a group of Purdue relievers were another of the team's bright spots amidst an otherwise tough season-opening weekend in Knoxville. The quintet of **Gavin Downs** (5 IP, 1 R), **Joe Eichmann** (2 1/3 IP, 1 R), **Mike Lutz** (2 IP, 0 R), **Matt Frawley** (2 IP, 0 R) and **Tim McElroy** (1 2/3 IP, 0 R) for 13 innings of three-run ball, a respectable weekend showing for a bullpen. But the Boilers' relievers were asked to pitch 18 of the 24 innings in the season-opening series. As the starters get stretched out and the weekend rotation solidifies in the weeks leading up to Big Ten play, the bullpen should not be as taxed.

Rice opened a six-game homestand Tuesday with its win against Texas State before losing to intra-city rival Houston on Wednesday. Being able to play midweek games, whether they're home or away, in February is yet another advantage the southern teams have in college baseball. None of the Big Ten teams are scheduled to play a midweek game until the first week of March. Additional live game at-bats and reps in the field early in the season help teams get up to speed faster.

The Owls opened the season with a quality road series win at Stanford. Pitchers Matt Ditman (4 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 10 K in relief) and Blake Fox (6 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 3 K) led the way as Rice won the first two games of the series. Ditman worked 7 1/3 innings of one-run ball as the starting pitcher Wednesday

against Houston, so Purdue may not see him until later in the series if at all. Fox is the first left-handed starter Purdue will face this year. Friday starter Jordan Stephens (8 wins, 2.43 ERA, 100 Ks in 118 IP in 2013) and closer Zech Lemon (14 saves, 2.02 ERA, 71 Ks in 75 IP in 2013) are two other power arms to watch for the Owls; both were among the top 70 in Perfect Game USA's preseason list of junior class prospects.

Offensively, first baseman Skyler Ewing has begun the new season swinging a hot bat. He was named the National Hitter of the Week by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association after recording multiple hits and multiple RBIs in all three games of the series win at Stanford. He's 11-for-21 with 2 doubles, 2 home runs, nine RBI and only one strikeout in the first five games. Ewing is one of six position players back after being regular starters a year ago.

BOILERMAKERS TRAVEL TO TEXAS FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2009

• Purdue continues its pre-Big Ten schedule this weekend with a three-game series at No. 11 Rice, marking the Boilers first road trip to the state of Texas since February 2009 when they were swept in a series at Texas State. Purdue also played at Rice for a four-team tournament in February 2001 and a midweek game on the March 2005 spring break trip. In their 2001 season opener, the Boilers defeated a Rice team that was ranked No. 1 at the time in Collegiate Baseball's weekly poll.

• Purdue has posted 23 victories over nationally-ranked teams during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** tenure (1999-present), its last coming in the finale of a May 2012 series at UCLA. The Boilmakers also defeated a ranked Wake Forest team at Rice's Reckling Park in 2001.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM A TOUGH OPENING WEEKEND

• Purdue was swept in its three-game series at Tennessee, its first season-opening loss and 0-3 start since 2010. The Boilmakers had not been swept in a traditional series to begin a season since 2008 at No. 15 Baylor, which was also the last time Purdue did not open at the Big East/Big Ten Challenge. Purdue was shutout in its season opener for the first time since 2007 (at Georgia).

• The Purdue defense and the lineup's ability to put the ball in play consistently were among the team's strengths during the season-opening weekend. The Boilmakers were only charged with one error in 99 total defensive chances. Catcher **Sean McHugh** threw out three would-be base stealers. At the plate, Purdue hitters struck out only 16 times in 102 plate appearances (1 K per every 6.4 PAs) and three of those 16 Ks came in the final inning of the nightcap of Sunday's doubleheader in which the Boilers trailed 20-2. The team performed admirably in both areas despite not having a chance to practice or play outside at all during preseason practice due to the harsh winter throughout the Midwest.

• A group of Purdue relievers also pitched well in Knoxville. **Gavin Downs** (5 IP, 1 R), **Joe Eichmann** (2 1/3 IP, 1 R), **Mike Lutz** (2 IP, 0 R), **Matt Frawley** (2 IP, 1 R) and **Tim McElroy** (1 2/3 IP, 0 R) combined for 13 innings of three-run ball, a respectable weekend showing for a bullpen. But the relief corps was asked to cover 18 of the 24 innings in which the Boilers were in the field due to short outings from starters **Kyle Wood** and **Connor Podkul**. Podkul's start was expected to be abbreviated as he made his first appearance on mound since the 2012 regular-season finale, coming back from Tommy John surgery. His arm was fine after the game but he is still working his way back from a leg ailment that has slowed his progress this year.

NO REGULAR-SEASON NEUTRAL SITE GAMES; FIRST MONDAY GAME SINCE 2010

• Purdue's season-opening weekend in Knoxville was impacted multiple times by inclement weather. The Boilmakers were originally scheduled to play Tennessee and Nebraska-Omaha twice apiece, but it became a standard three-game series against the Volunteers after UNO canceled its travel plans due to poor weather. The games against Omaha were the only neutral-site contests on Purdue's regular-season schedule. The Boilers would now have to qualify for the eight-team Big Ten Tournament, set for May 21-25 at TD Ameritrade Park in Omaha over Memorial Day, to play in a neutral-site game this season. Since 1970, only twice (1978 and 2007) has Purdue failed to play in at least one neutral-site game.

• The series finale at Tennessee was played on Monday after weather delayed first the start of the series and then Purdue's departure from campus. It was the Boilers' first Monday game since beating Michigan State in a rubber game at Lambert Field in May 2010. Purdue also played a Monday game during its 2010 season-opening weekend at the Big East/Big Ten Challenge. The Boilmakers also have a Monday game scheduled for March 17, the finale of their weekend wrap-around series at San Diego State.

HUDNALL'S REACHED-SAFELY STREAK IN GAMES STARTED ENDS AT 29

• **Conner Hudnall** finished his junior season having reached base safely in the final 27 games of the year in which he started. After he doubled off the wall in right field in both games of the 2014 season-opening doubleheader at Tennessee, the streak was at 29 before it ended in the series finale. The outfielder hit safely in all three games of the Northwestern, Illinois and Michigan State series last year.

• Hudnall delivered arguably the biggest hit of the 2013 season when he came through with a bases-clearing double with two outs to cap Purdue's four-run rally in the ninth inning of the series finale at Michigan. It turned out to be the Boilers' final win of the year. Hudnall finished the season as the team leader with nine doubles and six outfield assists.

• **Cody Strong** also posted a 19-game streak in which he reached base safely from March 23 through May 8 of the 2013 season. He led the team with a .436 on-base percentage in 2013 thanks in part to 25 free passes (19 walks, 6 HBP). Strong's .492 on-base percentage in Big Ten play would have led the league but he fell six plate appearances shy of the minimum to qualify.

• **HUDNALL'S REACHED SAFELY STREAK: .328 (38-FOR-116), 10 2B, HR, 14 RBI, 15 R, 10 BB, .375 OBP**

HAVE TO WIN MORE AT HOME

• Purdue struggled in its inaugural season at Alexander Field last year. The Boilmakers' 17-34 overall record was brought down in part by a 5-14 home mark. Purdue ended up having a better winning percentage in true road games (.346) than at home (.263). A 1-11 home mark in Big Ten play was almost inconceivable after the Boilers had been below .500 overall at home only twice in **Doug Schreiber's** first 15 seasons (10-11 in 2002 and 8-10 in 2007).

• The five home wins last season were Purdue's fewest since going 2-12 at Lambert in 1975.

McHUGH, MINCH & WOOD AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

- For the Boilermakers to have a bounce back season and return to the winning ways that saw the program qualify for five consecutive Big Ten Tournaments from 2008-12, **Sean McHugh**, **Jordan Minch** and **Kyle Wood** will likely have to be among the team's top contributors. They were Purdue's highlighted trio among the Big Ten Players to Watch this year.
- Last season, the trio accounted for the team leaders in batting average, hits, RBI and slugging percentage (McHugh); strikeouts, wins and games started (Minch); and home runs and runs scored (Wood). All three have experienced a summer playing for the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox in the prestigious Cape Cod League. McHugh spent the summer of 2012 on the Cape while Minch and Wood were teammates there last summer.

McHUGH BACK AS PURDUE'S LONE FOUR-YEAR SENIOR, JOINED BY BROTHER

- Purdue has only three seniors on its 2014 roster, its fewest since also having three in 2011. **Sean McHugh** looks to close out his career on a high note as the program's only current four-year letter-winner. He was part of some of the most dramatic moments of the 2012 Big Ten championship season, including delivering the go-ahead single in the 10-run ninth inning rally at UCLA and the game-tying pinch hit home run with two outs in the ninth inning of the final game at Lambert Field.
- McHugh moved to third base for the first time as a Boilermaker last year. The Kansas City-area native went on to win team MVP honors after starting 50 of the 51 games, leading the team with a .298 average, 59 hits, nine doubles, 31 RBI and a .434 slugging percentage. He's expected to see action at the hot corner and behind the plate this year.
- McHugh's younger brother **Matthew** is now part of the team as well. Sean and Matthew McHugh are the third set of brothers to be teammates at the same time under head coach Doug Schreiber, who also played with two sets of brothers at Purdue in the mid-1980s. Matthew McHugh is expected to see action as a corner infielder and relief pitcher. The McHugh's' parents, Peter and Pam, along with their brother P.J. are also Purdue alumni.

BIG SOPHOMORE CLASS SHOULD BE KEY TO SUCCESS

- Following the 2012 Big Ten championship season, the Boilermakers graduated a 15-player senior class and also lost three juniors who were selected in the first nine rounds of the MLB Draft. A large freshman class replaced many of those players in 2013 and Purdue ranked among the national leaders with 13 freshmen and 17 total new players. A year later, sophomores dominate the Boilers' roster.
- After redshirt seasons for **Gavin Downs**, **Connor Podkul**, **Kyle Upp** and **Kyle Wood**, Purdue now has 14 sophomores on its 2014 roster. Of those 14 sophomores, **Kyle Johnson**, **Jack Picchiotti**, **Cody Strong** and Wood were all regulars in the lineup a year ago. Sophomores **Jordan Minch**, Downs, Podkul and Wood project as key starting pitchers for Purdue this season. **Eddie De LaRiva**, **Patrick Kenney**, **Mike Lutz** and **Tim McElroy** teamed up to make a combined 71 relief appearances as freshmen. If most of the sophomore class can enjoy better seasons after getting a chance to play a lot as freshmen, Purdue should see its overall record improve.
- Minch (63 strikeouts, 81 1/3 innings and 14 games started), Lutz (25 appearances) and Wood (14 hit by pitch) all set new Purdue freshman records in 2013.

POSITIONAL FLEXIBILITY DEMONSTRATED IN 2013

- Jack Picchiotti**, **Cody Strong** and **Kyle Wood** all impressed with their positional flexibility in 2013. Picchiotti started games at five different positions (C, LF, RF, DH, 3B) and Strong saw action at five different spots (2B, 3B, RF, LF, C), starting at least once at every spot but catcher. Picchiotti also batted in eight of the nine spots in the lineup (all but cleanup). Meanwhile, Wood started games at four different positions (DH, P, 1B, RF). **Conner Hudnall** (RF, 3B, LF) and **Sean McHugh** (3B, C, SS) each started games at three different positions as juniors.

WOOD IN SELECT COMPANY NATIONALLY AS TWO-WAY STARTER

- For the second year in a row, **Kyle Wood** begins the season as a projected starter in the regular lineup and the weekend rotation. Some quick research compiled by Northern Illinois revealed there are approximately 28 players around the country expected to be full-time two-way players as starters in the lineup and weekend rotation. Wood was the lone Big Ten player on the list. A year ago, he became the first Boiler since 2003 to bat in the lineup in the same game in which he was the starting pitcher.
- Wood was a constant in the middle of the lineup in 2013, but only made seven starts on the mound after a forearm strain limited him to a designated hitter role for much of the first half of the season. He returned to the rotation in time for the Nebraska series in mid-April and started a game on the mound in each of the final six weekends. The Chicagoland-area native led the team with five home runs and 32 runs scored in 2013.

PODKUL RETURNS TO ACTIVE ROSTER

- **Connor Podkul** returns to the active roster this season after missing 2013 following Tommy John Surgery. The right-hander will look to return to the form that earned him a spot in the Boilers' weekend rotation during the 2012 Big Ten championship season. Purdue went 6-3 in his nine starts in 2012 and Podkul led the way in key victories against Missouri State, Louisville, Northwestern, Illinois and Nebraska. The MSU and Louisville (6 no-hit innings) wins were great résumé boosters for the Boilers in the first two months of the season.
- After joining the weekend rotation in time for the first weekend of April, Podkul struck out a season-high six in a quality start at Northwestern and worked 6 1/3 innings of two-hit ball as Purdue completed a sweep of defending Big Ten champ Illinois. But his most memorable performance (Win, 5 1/3 IP, 3 R) of the season may have been in the rubber game win at Nebraska in front of large crowd of Husker faithful.
- Podkul struggled down the stretch in 2012 and did not pitch more than four innings in any of his final four starts. He did not pitch in the Big Ten Tournament or NCAA Regional that Purdue hosted in Gary, Ind.

JOHNSON'S IMPRESSIVE TURNAROUND CARRIED OVER TO SUMMER ALL-STAR HONORS

- **Kyle Johnson** entered the Penn State series the final weekend of March last season batting only .119 (5-for-42) for the season. But beginning March 29, he went on to bat .321 the rest of the year to see his average rise .147 points. The impressive turnaround carried over to the summer league season. He batted .336 with nine extra-base hits, 16 RBI and 23 walks in 107 at-bats for the San Luis Obispo Blues of the California Collegiate League. He played for the North Division in the CCL All-Star Game.
- Johnson hit safely and drove in a run in all three games of Purdue's first-ever sweep at Penn State (March 29-31, 2013), leading to Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He was the only freshman around the conference to be named Big Ten Player of the Week in 2013. He also became the first Purdue freshman to be honored since 2003. He went on to post a 10-game hit streak in April, the longest on the team in 2013. Johnson also hit safely in all three games of the Big Ten series against Illinois, Nebraska and Michigan and scored a run in all three games against Michigan after drawing five walks in the series.
- Johnson was named the Boilers' defensive player of the year after the 2013 season. He made 41 of his 42 starts in center field and impressed with his range. He also made seven relief appearances on the mound and pitched for the SLO Blues in the summer as well.

- Purdue faces a challenging 2014 schedule that features numerous quality programs. Indiana, LSU and Louisville all qualified for the 2013 College World Series and are preseason favorites in their conferences. No. 15 Rice, San Diego State and Illinois were also NCAA Regional teams a year ago. Missouri State (MVC) and Illinois-Chicago (Horizon) were picked to finish second in their leagues this year.
- Purdue's 2014 opponents compiled a combined record of 622-453 (.579) last season.

BIG TEN TOURNAMENT EXPANDS TO EIGHT TEAMS

- For the first time, the Big Ten Tournament will be held at the same site as the College World Series, TD Armitrade Park in Omaha. It will also feature an eight-team field for the first time. The Big Ten Tournament has been played annually since 1981, with a four-team field through 1999 and a six-team event from 2000-2013.
- Purdue was predicted to finish eighth in the Big Ten standings this year by Perfect Game USA. If the prediction holds true, the Boilers would earn the final Big Ten Tournament berth. The league coaches picked Indiana, Nebraska, Ohio State, Michigan State, Illinois and Michigan to finish in the top six of the standings this year.
- The Boilermakers won the 2012 Big Ten Tournament but saw their program-long streak of five consecutive tourney berths snapped last season. It was the longest active run in the league at the time. Ohio State's three-year streak is now the longest active run. Six different teams won the tournament each year from 2007 through 2012 (Ohio State, Michigan, Indiana, Minnesota, Illinois and Purdue).
- Purdue has qualified for the Big Ten Tournament eight times in the last 10 years while making 10 appearances total in **Doug Schreiber's** first 15 seasons as head coach. The Boilermakers have qualified for the tournament field 16 times since its inception in 1981. Purdue is 18-30 all-time at the Big Ten Tournament and has gone two-and-out only four times in its 16 appearances, including just once (2001) under Schreiber.
