– BOILERS OPEN SPRING BREAK TRIP WITH SERIES AT TENNESSEE-MARTIN –

Purdue baseball begins its eight-game, 10-day spring break trip through the Volunteer State with a three-game series in the state's northwest corner where the Boilermakers square off against Tennessee-Martin.

The series opener is set for Friday at 5 p.m. (EST). The single games on Saturday and Sunday are slated for 2 p.m. (EST).

Purdue (9-2) carries a six-game win streak into spring break trip, which will also take the Boilermakers back to Nashville for midweek games against No. 2 Vanderbilt and Belmont and finally east to Cookeville for a three-game series at Tennessee Tech, the defending Ohio Valley Conference regular-season champion.

Tennessee-Martin (3-8) also calls the OVC home and last welcomed Purdue to town for a three-team weekend in March 2009. The Boilermakers managed to win their games against UTM and SIU Edwardsville at Skyhawk Field. As freshmen, **Eric Charles** and **Tyler Spillner** both connected for their first collegiate home runs in the UT Martin victory. **Sean Collins** and **Matt Morgan** earned victories on the mound.

Purdue concludes its season-opening stretch of 19 consecutive games away from Lambert Field over the next 10 days. The Boilermakers will have batted first in 18 of those 19 games, the Feb. 19 loss to Notre Dame in St. Petersburg, Fla., representing the only contest in which Purdue will have served as the home team.

But the Boilers have capitalized on the opportunity to come to the plate first, scoring first in each of the first 11 games this year. The Purdue pitchers, meanwhile, have yet to give up a run in the first inning. The result has been an 18-0 scoring edge in the first inning and 32-2 edge in the opening two frames of a game.

The Boilermakers enter the weekend having not trailed during their current six-game win streak, a stretch of 52 consecutive innings. Having scored in the first inning of its last three games, Purdue has also led for 29 consecutive innings dating back to the eighth inning of the series-opening win at Lipscomb last weekend.

Even more remarkable are the leading-trailing splits for the season thus far; having scored first every time out, Purdue has trailed infrequently. Entering the weekend, the

Boilers have played 99 innings and held the lead after the completion of 70. They've been behind on the scoreboard after only 14.

Tennessee-Martin has traditionally been somewhat similar to the Morehead State team Purdue took three-of-four from the final weekend of February. The Skyhawks can regularly swing the bats effectively but often times lack pitching depth. However, so far this season, the pitchers have yet to receive much support from a lineup featuring a .251 team batting average. For example, game two projected starter Danny Kelley is 0-2 despite compiling a 1.96 ERA and a .236 batting average against in his first three starts. UT Martin has also committed 13 more errors than its opponents in the first 11 games.

The Skyhawks conclude a season-long 11-game homestand this weekend. They're currently 3-5 on their extended home stay and were swept at South Alabama during their season-opening weekend. But UTM has regularly been a formidable team at home, where it posted a 15-11 record last year and swept three-game nonconference series against IPFW and Cleveland State.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 13th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 343-328 overall record and a 176-168 Big Ten mark through his first 12 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons, while Joe Sexson guided the Boilermakers for 527 games over 18 years.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher and newcomers Kevin Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Brad Schreiber were recognized for standout freshman seasons. Bischoff led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 48 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 16 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last six years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

BOILERMAKERS OFF TO BEST START SINCE 1993

• Purdue won its sixth straight game March 8 at No. 20 Louisville, posting its third win against a nationally-ranked opponent from the BIG EAST Conference this year. With a 9-2 record through the first 11 games, the team is off to its best start since the 1993 squad was also 9-2. The 1993 Boilermakers began the year 16-2 on their way to posting a 36-win campaign.

MORE NOTABLES ON LOUISVILLE WIN

- Although the teams played only twice from 1999-10, Purdue managed to post its first win against Louisville since 1998 March 8. In the process of winning 6-4, the Boilermakers snapped a pair of notable U of L streaks.
- Purdue was the first team to score more than four runs against the Cardinals this year. The Louisville pitching staff entered the game with a 1.47 team ERA.
- The Boilermakers snapped Louisville's 11-game win streak against Big Ten Conference teams dating back to 2009. The Cardinals won all three of their games at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge and were 23-2 against Big Ten opponents since 2006.

PURDUE SCORES FIRST IN EVERY GAME THUS FAR

• Purdue has scored first in each of its first 11 games this season, outscoring its opponents 32-2 in the first two innings in the process. The Boilermakers' pitching staff has yet to give up a run in the first inning of game. Purdue has also batted first in 10 of the first 11 games, acting as the home team in only the Feb. 19 loss to Notre Dame.

• Because the Boilermakers have scored first in every game, they've trailed very infrequently early this year. Purdue has not trailed since losing in walk-off fashion in the 11th inning of the nightcap of the Feb. 26 doubleheader at Morehead State, a streak of 52 consecutive innings since it was last behind on the scoreboard. For the season, the Boilers have held the lead for 70 of the 99 innings they've played. They've trailed for only 14 innings.

• In the four-game series at Morehead State (Feb. 26-27), Purdue scored multiple runs in the first inning of each of the first three games, including five-run rallies in games one and three.

PLAWECKI NAMED TO JOHNNY BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST

- Sophomore catcher **Kevin Plawecki** has been named to the initial watch list for the Johnny Bench Award, which honors the nation's top Division I catcher. Forty-two catchers appeared on the initial watch list, which will be updated periodically until a list of semifinalists is unveiled May 19.
- Plawecki was a Freshman All-American in 2010 and is among the Big Ten's top prospects for the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He has batted cleanup and hit safely in every game he has played so far this season.

MORGAN GOES THE DISTANCE, HAASE PITCHES INTO THE NINTH

• In the last four games, the Purdue starting pitchers have prevented the opposition from scoring until at least the fifth inning. **Matt Morgan** kept Lipscomb off the scoreboard entirely with his three-hit, complete-game shutout in Purdue's 1-0 win on March 4. It was the senior's first career complete-game shutout and second complete game overall, earning him Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for the second time this season.

• **Joe Haase** finished one out shy of also pitching a complete game in the March 8 win at Louisville, but was still impressive with 8 2/3 innings of four-run ball. He did not issue a walk. It was the longest outing of the junior's career by more than four innings.

• Morgan was honored for the third time in his career after striking out 10 in Purdue's first 1-0 win since 2007. While registering his third career game with 10 or more strikeouts, he struck out at least one batter in eight of his nine innings. His five 1-2-3 frames were highlighted by a ninth inning in which he retired the heart of the Lipscomb lineup in order. He needed only 108 pitches to go the distance in a game that was played in one hour and 51 minutes.

ANOTHER NO-HIT BID INTO THE SIXTH, SCHREIBER WINS FIRST THREE STARTS

• **Lance Breedlove** carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning of his first start as a Boilermaker, helping Purdue win game one of the March 6 doubleheader at Lipscomb. The right-hander gave up a leadoff single in the sixth but still managed to earn his first win as a member of the program with 5 1/3 innings of three-run ball.

• It marked the second Sunday in a row that a Purdue pitcher carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning. **Brad Schreiber** did likewise Feb. 27 at Morehead State before it was broken up by a two-out hit. Schreiber also won his start in the nightcap of the Lipscomb doubleheader, improving to 3-0 on the season. He's the first Purdue weekend starter to open the season 3-0 since Jay Buente in 2006. Buente won three of his first four starts as the team's No. 1 arm in 2006, the lone no decision coming in a Purdue win at nationally-ranked North Carolina.

MILLER MAKES THE MOST OF HIS OPPORTUNITY

- **David Miller** has started at shortstop in six of the last seven games and taken advantage of his playing time. The junior college transfer has reached base safely and scored a run in each of the first six games he has started. For the season, he has drawn seven walks versus only one strikeout in 32 plate appearances.
- After finishing the Morehead State series 8-for-13 with four RBIs, Miller also excelled in the doubleheader sweep of Lipscomb March 6. He reached base safely in each of his five plate appearances in game one and finished the day 4-for-6 with a home run, four walks and four runs scored.

PERKINS' HITTING STREAK SNAPPED AT 14, PLawecki's EXTENDED TO 10

- **Cameron Perkins'** career-best 14-game hitting streak dating back to the final four games of the 2010 season was snapped in the March 8 win at Louisville. The 14-game run matched Eric Charles for the longest streak by an active Boilermaker. Charles hit safely in 14 straight games in 2009 on his way to earning Freshman All-American honors.
- **Kevin Plawecki** is now the only Purdue regular to hit safely in every game he has played this year. The current 10-game streak is the longest of the sophomore's college career.
- Perkins extended his hitting streak in his final at-bat of the March 4 win at Lipscomb, delivering the big hit of the 1-0 victory with a two-out, run-scoring single in the eighth inning to plate **Stephen Talbott** from second base. In the March 6 doubleheader, he singled in his first at-bat of both games to extend the streak early. Perkins finished the series 5-for-15 with a team-best four RBIs. He was also 8-for-18 with five extra-base hits and a team-high nine RBIs in the four games at Morehead State. He delivered a clutch bases-clearing, two-out double that put Purdue ahead in the ninth inning of game two. The sophomore came back the next day and connected for a two-run homer to center field in both games in the doubleheader.
- **PERKINS' 14-GAME HIT STREAK: .390 (25-for-64), 5 2B, 3B, 2 HR, 18 RBI, 11 R, BB, 2 SB, SAC FLY**

FOUR RELIEVERS ALREADY WITH AT LEAST ONE SAVE

- The Purdue bullpen has continued to backup the starting pitchers with solid relief work. During the current six-game win streak, only one of seven inherited base runners has come around to score.
- Meanwhile, four pitchers have already teamed up for Purdue's five saves. **Nick Wittgren** has closed out a pair of games but **Lance Breedlove**, **Calvin Gunter** and **Blake Mascarello** have also earned saves while recording the final out of a game. Mascarello backed up Breedlove with 3 2/3 scoreless innings of relief in game two of the Lipscomb series. He has issued only one walk in 11 2/3 innings this year. Gunter ended the Louisville win by striking out the Cardinals' leadoff man with the potential tying run on first base.
- Seven different pitchers had at least one save last season as Purdue totaled 14 as a team, none having more than three saves.

CIANFROCCO NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- **Angelo Cianfrocco** hit for the cycle over the course of Purdue's series at Morehead State, earning Big Ten co-Player of the Week honors for his big weekend at the plate. The sophomore finished the series 10-for-16 with four extra-base hits, five RBIs and eight runs scored. He had multiple hits and scored twice in all four games over the weekend. And after walking twice and getting hit by a pitch, he reached base safely in 13 of his 19 plate appearances.
- Cianfrocco homered in his first two at-bats of the nightcap of Saturday's doubleheader, matching his freshman-season total in one game and accounting for the first two longballs of the new season for Purdue. In the process, he joined classmates **Cameron Perkins**, **Kevin Plawecki** and **Stephen Talbott** as current Boilers with a multi-homer game on their collegiate résumés.
- After Barrett Serrato won the award on Feb. 21, Serrato and Cianfrocco represent the Boilers' first set of back-to-back Big Ten Players of the Week since having three straight players recognized in 2008 (March 24 through April 8).

SCHREIBER CARRIES NO-HITTER INTO SIXTH INNING, BULLPEN SOLID AT MSU

• In a four-game series that featured a combined 83 runs on 115 hits, **Brad Schreiber** was dominate in his game three start Feb. 27 at Morehead State. He took a no-hitter into the sixth inning and surrendered only two hits total. The right-hander retired 15 consecutive MSU hitters from the first through sixth innings until his no-hit bid was broken up by a two-out hit in the sixth. He would have retired the first 17 batters of the game in order if not for two-out error in the first inning. He gave way to the Purdue bullpen with the Boilers leading 14-1 after the sixth, having reached the 100-pitch threshold.

• Schreiber has surrendered only seven hits over 12 innings in his first two starts of the season, good for a batting average against of .156. The sophomore has struck out 12 while issuing only two walks.

• The Purdue bullpen was also impressive in the series win at Morehead State. For the weekend, the quartet of **Lance Breedlove**, **Sean Collins**, **Pat Gannon** and **Robert Ramer** combined for 11 2/3 innings of scoreless relief. Breedlove closed out game one with three scoreless innings to earn his first save as a Boilermaker. Collins earned the win in game one with two innings of hitless relief and also got the final two outs of the series finale after entering the game with the bases loaded. Gannon worked three innings of scoreless relief, inducing a pair of double play balls, to back up Schreiber in game three. And Ramer gave Purdue an opportunity to win game two with three innings of hitless relief.

PURDUE OPENS WITH SUCCESSFUL WEEKEND AT BIG EAST-BIG TEN CHALLENGE

• Purdue opened its new season by winning two-of-three at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge, posting wins against nationally-ranked Connecticut (10-2) and Pittsburgh (5-3). The Boilermakers also lost to Notre Dame after the Fighting Irish blew the game open with an 11-run fourth inning. Purdue scored first in all three games and never trailed against UConn, a team that was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the BIG EAST by the league coaches.

• The Boilermakers snapped a seven-game losing streak at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge dating back to 2009 and exceeded their combined win total in the first two years of the event.

• The BIG EAST won the Challenge, 14-10. Michigan State (3-0), Purdue (2-1) and Penn State (2-1) were the only Big Ten teams to post a winning record. Sunday, the Boilers defeated at Pitt team that had beaten Illinois and Iowa in the first two days of the Challenge.

WINS OVER NATIONALLY-RANKED COMPETITION

• Connecticut was ranked ninth by *Baseball America* in the publication's preseason poll. Pittsburgh was tabbed 30th by *Collegiate Baseball* in its preseason poll. Purdue managed to defeat both teams during its season-opening weekend.

• The victory against UConn was Purdue's first against a nationally-ranked opponent since 2007 (Michigan) and first against a Top 10-ranked opponent since winning the opener of a 2006 series at North Carolina. The Boilermakers defeated No. 2 UNC and No. 16 Missouri early in the 2006 campaign, the last time Purdue had multiple wins against nationally-ranked teams in the same season.

MORGAN, PLawecki & SERRATO RECOGNIZED

• **Barrett Serrato** and **Matt Morgan** were selected as the first Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Week of 2011 for their standout performances at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge. CollegeBaseball360.com selected **Kevin Plawecki** and Morgan to its Challenge All-Tournament Team and included Serrato on the Honorable Mention list. Morgan, meanwhile, was also named a Primetime Performer for the season-opening weekend by CollegeBaseball360.com.

• Morgan was recognized by the conference office for the second time in his career, while the honor for Serrato was his first. Purdue's last Big Ten Player of the Week was Ben Wolgamot in April 2008 and the Boilers had not swept the league's weekly awards since March 2006 (Eric Wolfe and Dan Sattler).

• Serrato hit safely and drove in a run in all three games at the Challenge, finishing the weekend 6-for-9 with a double, triple, walk, four RBIs and three runs scored. He was 3-for-4 with runners in scoring position. The junior came through with three hits in the Pitt win, driving in the game-tying run in the sixth and a key insurance tally with a two-out single in the eighth. He had two hits, including a double, drove in a run and scored twice against UConn.

• Morgan worked 5 2/3 shutout innings to earn the victory against nationally-ranked Connecticut Friday, setting the tone for the upset win and weekend in general. He struck out five and surrendered only three hits while pitching into the sixth inning. He did not allow the leadoff man to reach in any of the six innings he started, opening the inning with a K in the third, fourth and fifth frames. It was his second consecutive shutout performance at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge.

• Plawecki hit safely in all three games, finishing the weekend 6-for-12 with a walk, stolen base, four RBIs and a run scored. He had three hits and three RBIs in the win against UConn and helped Purdue defeat Pittsburgh Sunday with two hits and an RBI. He also scored the go-ahead run in the sixth inning and a key insurance tally in the eighth of the Pitt victory.

SCHREIBER & WITTGREN IMPRESS ON THE MOUND IN PITT WIN

- **Brad Schreiber** and **Nick Wittgren** were Purdue's standout performers in the Feb. 27 win against Pittsburgh. Their work on the mound was a big reason why the Boilers limited a Pitt team that ranked second in the nation last season with a .363 batting average to three runs on nine hits.
- Schreiber won his first start of the season with six solid innings, surrendering only three runs (two earned) on five hits. He struck out a career-high seven, including the final two batters he faced while closing out his sixth inning of work.
- Wittgren earned his first Purdue save with a stellar relief outing, slamming the door on a potential Pitt rally with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh inning. He entered the game with the Boilers clinging to a one-run lead in the seventh and struck out the No. 4 and 5 hitters in the Pitt lineup to leave the bases loaded. After a 1-2-3 eighth inning, the Panthers posted back-to-back two-out hits against the sophomore right-hander in the ninth. But he again retired the Pitt cleanup hitter to close out the victory.

SEASON-OPENING NOTEWORTHY

- **Eric Charles** posted his third career four-hit game in the season-opening win against UConn. He led off the fifth and seventh innings with singles and eventually scored in both frames. He drove in a run with another single in the eighth inning.
- **Tyler Spillner** collected three RBIs without the luxury of a hit in the UConn win, drawing a pair of bases-loaded walks and registering a sacrifice fly to left field. He also led off the Notre Dame and Pittsburgh games with doubles.
- **Cameron Perkins** hit safely in all three games of the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge to extend his current hitting streak to seven games dating back to last season. He tripled home a run against UConn and collected another RBI with a first-inning double against Pittsburgh.
- Purdue batters were hit by a pitch seven times at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge. **Stephen Talbott** was hit three times, including twice in the season opener. Despite collecting only one hit, Talbott had a productive weekend. Against UConn, he scored twice and tagged up and took third on fly ball to left field. He executed a successful squeeze bunt to record an RBI vs. Notre Dame. Sunday against Pitt, he singled and stole a base.

BOILERS OPEN WITH 19 STRAIGHT AWAY FROM HOME

- The program's 123rd season features the Boilermakers playing their first 19 games away from West Lafayette. Purdue plays 16 consecutive road games from the final weekend of February through the end of the spring break trip (March 19).
- This season also marks the 46th and final year for the Boilermakers at Lambert Field, their home since 1965. Construction of the new Northwest Baseball Facility is slated to begin this spring and the new stadium is scheduled to open in 2012.

RECORDING-SETTING SEASON IN 2010

- The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and strikeouts (435), strikeouts per nine innings (7.76) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.35) on the mound.
- Individually, **Tyler Spillner** led the Big Ten with seven triples, a new Purdue single-season benchmark. **Matt Bischoff** established new single-season (95) and career strikeout records (291) while closing out his college career as a four-time All-Big Ten honoree.
- As a team, Purdue led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) while ranking second in ERA (4.78) and saves (14).

PERKINS, PLawecki & SCHREIBER AMONG BIG TEN'S PLAYERS TO WATCH

- Projected to play prominent roles this spring after earning assorted freshman honors in 2010, **Cameron Perkins**, **Kevin Plawecki** and **Brad Schreiber** have been highlighted among the Big Ten Players to Watch this season. In conjunction with the unveiling of the projected Big Ten Tournament field, each league coach highlighted three players expected to be key to his team's success this season.
- Plawecki was honored after the 2010 season for his impressive numbers at the plate and his work with the Purdue pitching staff. He was recognized as a Freshman All-American by *Collegiate Baseball* and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association after batting a team-best .343 with 21 extra-base hits and a Purdue freshman-record 53 RBIs. He was also the unanimous selection as the catcher on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team thanks in part to a .435 batting average with runners in scoring position.
- Perkins started at first and third base, but settled in at the hot corner and finished the year with a .961 fielding percentage. He joined Plawecki on the *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-American team after batting .338 with 27 extra-base hits, 34 RBIs and 10 stolen bases. He established new Purdue freshman records for hits (74), doubles (17), total bases (119) and at-bats (219). Perkins hit safely in 13 consecutive Big Ten games during the heart of conference play and in all four games at the Big Ten Tournament.
- Schreiber slugged .506 in only 79 at-bats last season – nine of his 22 hits going for extra bases – showing glimpses of the power potential that helped him twice win Wisconsin State Player of the Year honors as high school standout. He was recognized as the relief pitcher on the 2010 Big Ten All-Freshman Team after surrendering only three earned runs in 10 1/3 innings pitched over six appearances on conference weekends. The right-hander is expected to get a chance to start on the mound this year and should get more at-bats at designated hitter.

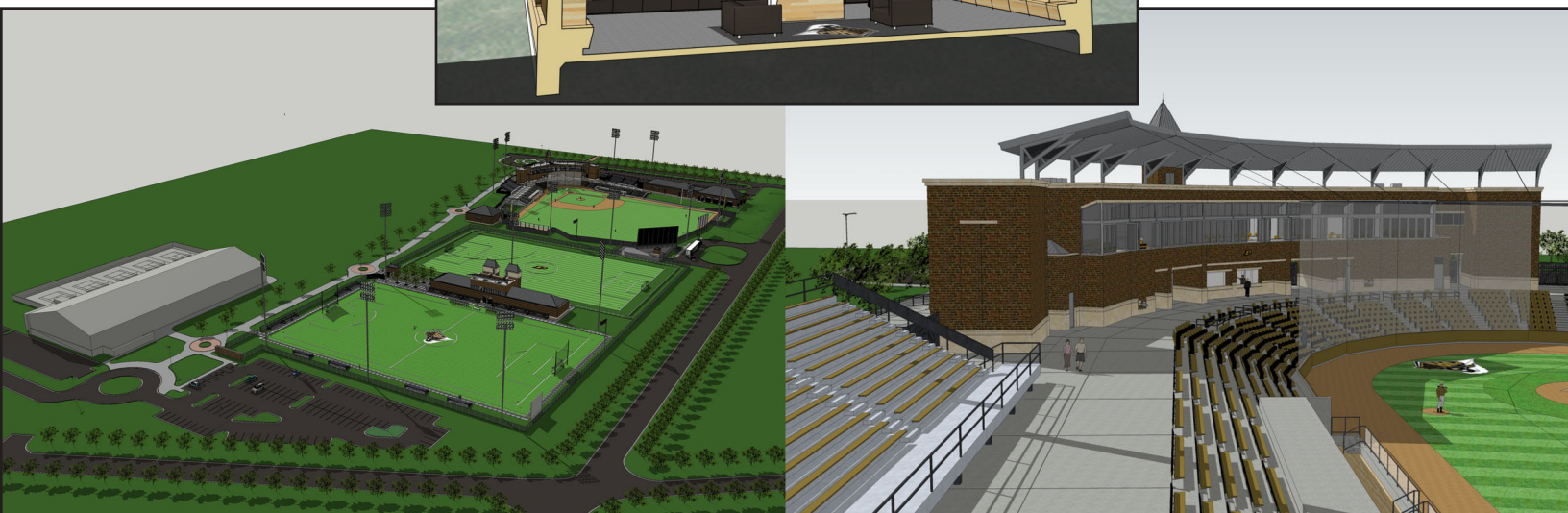
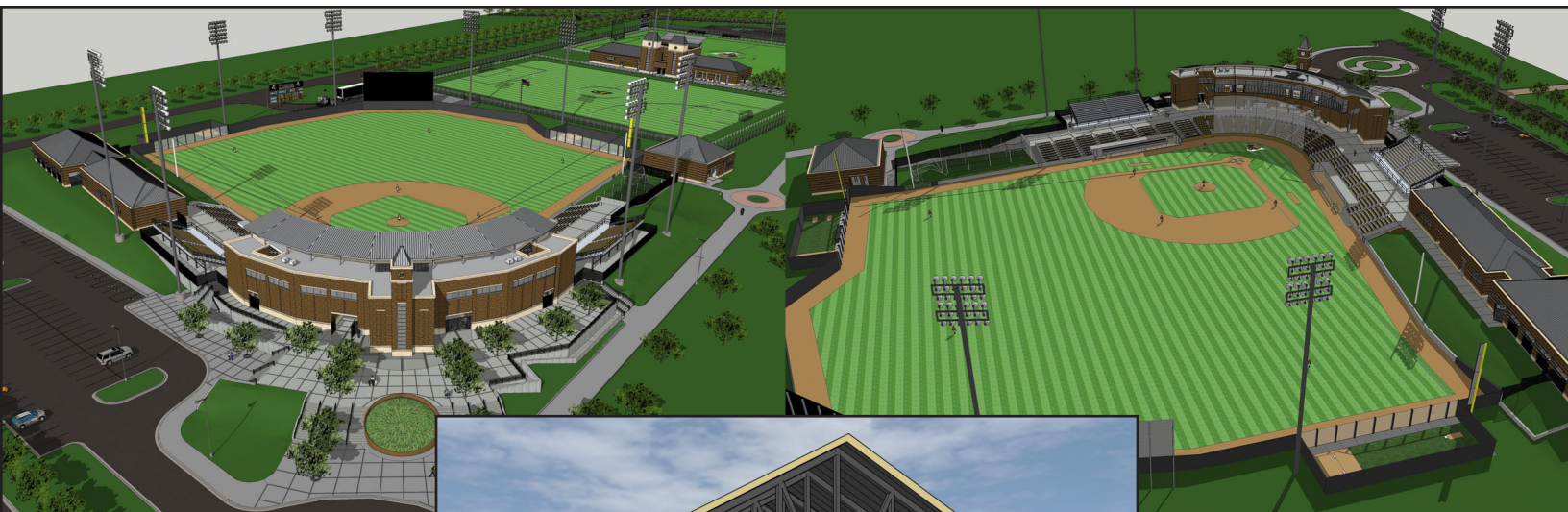

The 2011 season will be Purdue's last at Lambert Field. The new northwest baseball facility is set to open for the 2012 home opener. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. Purdue will close out Lambert Field this year with an eight-game homestand from May 11-21, highlighted by Big Ten Conference series against Illinois and Iowa.
