– BOILERS CLOSE SPRING BREAK TRIP WITH FOUR-GAME SET AT WICHITA STATE –

No. 24 Purdue baseball closes out its eight-game spring break trip with another formidable road test, taking on Wichita State for a four-game weekend series scheduled to be played over three days.

The original start times at WSU's Eck Stadium for the games Thursday and Friday have been pushed up due to Wichita State basketball action. Thursday's game is now set for 4 p.m. ET and action Friday will begin at 6 p.m. ET. Saturday's doubleheader is slated for 3 p.m. ET.

The Boilermakers (12-1) enter the series riding an eight-game win streak, matching their longest streaks of both 2010 and 2011. A win Thursday in the series opener would give Purdue its best-ever one-loss start in program history and its first win streak longer than eight games since posting 13 consecutive victories in 2001.

The Boilermakers have outscored the opposition 82-33 during their win streak. However, five of the eight wins have come in games decided by three runs or less. Tuesday's game at Missouri State featured a combined six runs scored, the fewest in any of Purdue's first 13 games this season.

A balanced lineup has been the Boilers most dangerous asset throughout the season. But during the recent win streak primary run producers **Cameron Perkins** (.526, 14 RBIs) and **Kevin Plawecki** (.485, 15 RBIs) have led the way. Both sluggers have hit safely in all eight games. **Stephen Talbott** has also been on a tear in the nine hole, posting six consecutive multi-hit games during a 17-for-31 hot stretch.

On the mound, **Blake Mascarello** has pitched in five of the eight games during the win streak, earning the win in the victories against Auburn, Murray State (game one) and Missouri State. In an effort to not disrupt the weekend rotation's normal schedule any more than necessary, the coaching staff has opted to give the ball to **Robert Ramer** for Thursday's series opener. **Joe Haase** will remain penciled in for Friday and **Lance Breedlove** and **Calvin Gunter** will take the ball for the two games Saturday.

Ramer pitched well as a midweek and spot starter last season and has compiled a perfect 7-0 record in his three years with the program. However, Thursday will mark his first significant action of the season. He has worked only two innings of relief so far in 2012.

Wichita State (10-8) represents the last of Purdue's four first-time opponents on the 2012 regular-season schedule. The Boilermakers have not played a game in the state of Kansas since losing at Kansas State in March 1996.

The Shockers have a strong baseball tradition, highlighted by a 1989 College World Series championship. Wichita State has played in 27 NCAA Tournaments and seven College World Series, its last CWS appearance coming in 1996.

The Shockers are expected to start a six-foot-six right-hander and three left-handers on the mound against Purdue. Game one starter Mitch Mormann started his college career at LSU and has surrendered only 12 hits in 18 2/3 innings pitched. Used primarily as relievers, Foster Vielock (no earned runs allowed in 17 1/3 innings), Cale Elam (15 Ks and 4 saves in seven appearances) and A.J. Ladwig (0.40 ERA, 16 strikeouts vs. one walk) have led the way for the WSU pitching staff.

Johnny Coy has been the most consistent Shocker at the plate. He leads the team with a .394

batting average, seven extra-base hits and 23 RBIs. The first baseman was the NCBWA National Player of the Week after a 15-for-25 showing at the plate in late February as WSU went 5-0. He has already been selected twice in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Wichita State has posted eight of 10 wins at home this season. Eck Stadium has hosted numerous NCAA Regionals and features an artificial turf surface.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 14th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 380-348 overall record and a 190-178 Big Ten mark through his first 13 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber will make a run at Alexander's all-time wins record (407) this season and is on pace to break the games coached benchmark in 2013.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's single season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first, and reached the Big Ten Tournament for the fourth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons. The four straight tourney appearances represent the longest active streak in the league as well as a program high. The program's 58 Big Ten wins over the last four years are also the most in the league.

Purdue led the Big Ten in numerous statistical categories in 2011, highlighted by runs scored, doubles, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, sacrifice flies, saves and strikeouts. The Boilermakers drew the most walks at the plate and issued the fewest number of free passes on the mound.

Six Boilers were recognized as all-conference performers, matching the second-highest total in program history. Kevin Plawecki and Barrett Serrato were named First Team, Tyler Spillner and Nick Wittgren Second Team and Cameron Perkins and Stephen Talbott Third Team. With Serrato, Spillner and Talbott all honored as outfielders, it marked the first time 1991 that three Purdue outfielders were named all-conference in the same season.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher. He led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 54 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 18 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last seven years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE ENTERS WICHITA STATE SERIES RIDING EIGHT-GAME WIN STREAK

- Purdue enters the second half of its spring break trip riding an eight-game win streak after sweeping Murray State and posting a midweek win at Missouri State on the front half of its eight-game road trip. The eight-game win streak has matched the team's season-long streak of a year ago.
- At 12-1, the Boilers have matched the 1959 team for the best one-loss start in program history. The 1959 team did not suffer its second loss until its 14th game of the year. Purdue has posted its 12 wins against 10 team different teams. The Boilermakers played each of their first 10 games of the season against 10 different opponents.
- While the offense grabbed headlines after scoring 40 runs while batting .437 in the series sweep of Murray State, the pitching and defense also performed well in Purdue's first road sweep since taking all three games of a series at Lipscomb the first weekend of March last season. The Boilermakers only surrendered five runs in the series, with Murray State scoring only one run after the first inning. Defensively, Purdue did not commit an error in the series while turning six double plays.
- The Boilermakers won a low-scoring game Tuesday at Missouri State, with the combined six runs scored in Springfield representing the fewest in a Purdue game this season. The Boilers improved to 6-0 in games decided by three runs or less.

BOILERS' BATS LEADING THE NATION IN TEAM BATTING AVERAGE ENTERING THE WEEK

- Fueled in part by the .437 average Purdue posted in the Murray State sweep, the Boilers entered the week leading the nation with a .373 team batting average. Purdue was also fourth in scoring and ninth in slugging percentage. But the defense has been performing well, too. The Boilermakers were leading the nation in double plays turned per game and ranked fourth in total twin killings (19).

BOILERS GARNER FIRST IN-SEASON NATIONAL RANKING SINCE 2001

- Riding an eight-game win streak and a 12-1 start that represents the program's best since 1959, Purdue debuted in the Collegiate Baseball Top 30 March 5, earning its first in-season national ranking in one of the four major polls since February 2001 (Baseball America). The Boilermakers were also nationally ranked in the 2002 NCBWA preseason poll.
- Purdue also moved into the Baseball America Top 25 and NCBWA Top 30 this week while moving up in the Collegiate Baseball rankings. The Boilers are ranked 24th by Baseball America, 26th by Collegiate Baseball and 28th by the NCBWA.
- Purdue has been ranked among the Top 30 of Perfect Game USA's national Top 50 all season, moving up to 20th this week. The Boilermakers also continue to receive votes in the USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll (Top 25). The Boilermakers received 61 poll points in the USA Today/ESPN Top 25 to essentially rank 27th in the coaches' weekly voting.

WITTGREN BREAKS SAVES RECORD AS PITCHING CARRIES THE LOAD IN MSU WIN

- **Connor Podkul** did not give up a hit until the fifth inning in his first collegiate start and **Blake Mascarello** and **Nick Wittgren** backed him up with 4 2/3 innings of one-run relief, as solid pitching led Purdue to a 4-2 win at Missouri State March 13.
- Wittgren recorded his 16th career save by retiring six of the eight batters he faced over two innings of hitless relief. The junior officially eclipsed the program's all-time saves record. He entered the night in a three-way tie with former closers Scott Dubach (1985-87) and Andy Helmer (1997-00).
- Wittgren recorded his 16 saves in just 35 relief appearances. He has converted 16 of his 18 save opportunities since becoming the closer early in the 2011 season. Seven of his 16 career saves have come in appearances longer than one inning.
- Wittgren is the first Boiler to establish a new individual program record since Matt Bischoff recorded his 258th career strikeout to break the all-time record in an April 2010 home win against Northwestern.

BOILERS POUND OUT PROGRAM-RECORD 30 HITS IN BLOWOUT OF MURRAY STATE

- Purdue pounded out a school-record 30 hits and scored eight runs in an inning twice, reaching the 20-run plateau for the first time since March 2008 in a 22-1 win at Murray State March 10. The Boilermakers sent 12 men to the plate in the eight-run sixth inning that blew the game open and later scored eight times with two outs in the top of the ninth.
- The previous program record for hits was 26, accomplished twice, most recently in a 2006 win at Indiana (25-8). That game also marked the last time Purdue scored 20-plus runs in a road game.
- The Boilermakers have scored seven or more runs in an inning five times this season. All five occurrences have come in the sixth inning or later. Purdue has outscored the opposition 78-21 from the sixth through ninth innings.
- The Boilers also turned four double plays in a game (March 10) for the third time this year, highlighted by a 2-5-4 twin killing on a MSU sac bunt attempt with two aboard and no outs in the second inning.

TALBOTT TABBED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- **Stephen Talbott** recorded multiple hits and scored a run in all three games of the series sweep at Murray State (March 9-11), hitting for the cycle over the course of the weekend, and the No. 9 hitter was recognized as the Big Ten Conference Player of the Week for his efforts. Talbott finished the weekend 10-for-17 with four extra-base hits, five RBIs and five runs scored. He raised his batting average for the season nearly .100 points to .442. The outfielder collected four hits in the wins Saturday and Sunday, his first collegiate four-hit efforts.
- Thanks to a two-run double and a home run, Talbott also matched his career high with four RBIs in the series finale. The two-run double came with two outs in the second inning and tied the game. He went deep to left field in the sixth inning to extend the Boilers' one-run lead entering the frame.
- Talbott also recorded two hits in Purdue eight-run sixth inning in the middle game of the series.
- For the second year in a row, the Boilers have had at least one player honored as the Big Ten Player or Pitcher of the Week after each of the first four weekends of the season.

MASCARELLO STELLAR IN LONG RELIEF ROLE

- Senior left-hander **Blake Mascarello** has been Purdue's most consistent pitcher over the first month of the season, earning the win in four of his seven relief appearances. He was the winning pitcher against Connecticut, Auburn, Murray State (game one) and Missouri State. Mascarello has surrendered a run in only two of his seven appearances and helped the Boilers maintain a lead each time he has taken the mound.
- While the lefty has been consistently excellent, his work in the Connecticut and Murray State wins stand out. He retired 12 of the 14 batters he faced over four scoreless innings in the season opener against UConn. In the series opener against Murray State, he retired 13 of the 14 batters he faced. In both instances he closed out the victory.

FOUR PLAYERS ENTER WICHITA SERIES RIDING MULTI-HIT GAME STREAKS

- **Eric Charles, Cameron Perkins, Kevin Plawecki** and **Stephen Talbott** enter the weekend not only riding hit streaks, but also streaks of consecutive multi-hit games. Charles has multiple hits in each of his last four games, going 10-for-19 (.526) over that stretch. He continues to lead the team with a .483 batting average, ranking 11th nationally entering the week. Perkins has been Purdue's hottest hitter, posting seven consecutive multi-hit games. He's 19-for-34 (.559) during that stretch, scoring a run in six straight games. Plawecki has recorded six consecutive two-hit games, going 12-for-24 (.500) during his streak. Perkins and Plawecki have hit safely in eight straight games overall. Talbott, meanwhile, has six straight multi-hit games, compiling a 16-for-28 (.571) stretch during that streak.

PLAWECKI ON JOHNNY BENCH WATCH LIST AGAIN

- After being among the 13 semifinalists nationally a season ago for the Johnny Bench Award, **Kevin Plawecki** has once again been selected to the initial watch list for the award that recognizes the nation's top all-around catcher. The initial watch list featured 43 catchers. More could be added as the season progresses and a group of semifinalists will be announced May 16.
- Plawecki homered on consecutive days in the wins against Southern Miss and Charleston Southern. Both home runs were towering fly balls over the 35-foot-high wall in left field. He went deep in back-to-back games for the third time in his career. He also accomplished the feat in 2010 (at Illinois State and vs. Penn State) and 2011 (games two and three of Illinois series). Among active Boilers, **Ryan Bridges, Cameron Perkins** (twice) and **Tyler Spillner** have also homered in back-to-back games.
- Plawecki and Iowa's Dan Sheppard were the only Big Ten backstops named to the initial watch list. Plawecki has batted cleanup in each of the first 13 games this season, starting all but two behind the plate. Defensively, Plawecki has thrown out four of six would-be base stealers over the first 13 games. He recorded his 100th career RBI in the weekend-opening win against Auburn.

WITTGREN WINS BIG TEN PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Closer **Nick Wittgren** finished off two of Purdue's three wins at Auburn's tournament (March 2-4), tying the program's all-time record with his 15th career save and earning Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for his efforts.
- Wittgren closed out the victories against Auburn and Charleston Southern, retiring eight of the 11 batters he faced over his three innings of scoreless relief. More importantly, the junior got some big outs when the Boilers need them most. He left the potential tying run at second base while finishing off the Auburn win and fanned the CSU leadoff hitter with the bases loaded to close out the eighth inning.
- Andy Helmer was the last Purdue pitcher to win Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors as a reliever, accomplishing the feat in April 2000.

DeANO EARNS THE WIN IN HIS COLLEGIATE DEBUT

- **Jack DeAno** worked three innings of hitless relief in his Purdue debut, earning the win in the comeback victory against Southern Miss March 3. He retired nine of the 11 batters he faced, highlighted by a 1-2-3 ninth inning. Southern Miss, which had scored 32 runs in its last two games entering the day, racked up nine runs on 13 hits through the first six innings.
- DeAno sat out the 2011 season as a transfer from Vanderbilt. He had not pitched since high school and was listed as an outfielder on the roster his first year with the program. While he could still see action as a defensive replacement or pinch runner, he is now expected to remain a full-time member of the bullpen.

SERRATO'S THREE-RUN HOMER CAPS SEVEN-RUN TWO-OUT RALLY

• Punctuated by a go-ahead three-run homer from **Barrett Serrato**, Purdue scored seven times with two outs in the seventh inning to overcome a six-run deficit and stun Southern Miss, 10-9, March 3 at Auburn's four-team tournament.

• Seven consecutive Purdue hitters reached base safely during the quick-strike rally, which began innocently enough with a seeing-eye single up the middle from **David Miller**. The Boilermakers have scored seven or more runs in an inning three times this year, all three extended rallies giving Purdue the lead in the sixth inning or later.

• **Stephen Talbott**, **Tyler Spillner**, **Cameron Perkins** and **Kevin Plawecki** each delivered a run-scoring hit to set the stage for Serrato. The senior connected for a three-run homer to right center that capped the rally. Purdue hit for the cycle in the inning, Talbott tripling home Miller and Spillner doubling home Talbott.

• Miller was named to CollegeBaseball360.com's Primetime Performers national honor roll after finishing the weekend 5-for-12 and scoring a run in all three games of the Auburn tournament. He also played flawless defense at shortstop. The junior singled and scored the go-ahead run and later a key insurance run in each of the final two innings of the win against Auburn.

100 & 200 CAREER LANDMARKS

• The first four hitters in the Purdue lineup enjoyed a productive night in the March 2 win at Auburn. **Tyler Spillner** and **Eric Charles** both recorded four-hit efforts at the top of the order, setting the table for **Cameron Perkins** and **Kevin Plawecki**. Perkins and Plawecki both tallied their 100th career RBIs in the victory. Together the four hitters were a combined 11-for-20 with nine RBIs and five runs scored.

• Perkins' game-tying sacrifice fly in the sixth inning plated **Stephen Talbott** and accounted for his 100th career RBI. Plawecki's 100th RBI came on a two-run single in the eighth inning that drove in Spillner and Charles. To go-ahead run had scored on Charles' base hit earlier in the inning.

• In the Murray State series (March 9-11), **Tyler Spillner** posted his 200th career hit (a three-run homer in game two of the series) and **Joe Haase** registered is 100th career strikeout. **Eric Charles** had his 200th career hit & 100th career RBI at the East Carolina Tournament (Feb. 25-26).

BREEDLOVE MAKING BATTERS EARN THEIR WAY ON BASE

• **Lance Breedlove** has issued just one walk in his first four starts while leading the team with 24 strikeouts. That one free pass came in his March 3 start against Southern Miss, a one-out walk in the third inning. The senior worked 14 1/3 innings before that first base on balls.

• **Blake Mascarello** also issued his first walk of the season at the Auburn tournament (March 2-4). The senior had not issued a walk in his first 7 2/3 innings over three appearances. Coincidentally, he walked the first batter he faced in his relief outing against Auburn. The lefty still got the win though, stranding the bases loaded in the fifth inning and facing only 10 batters in the sixth through eight innings. He worked 1-2-3 frames in the sixth and eighth.

CHARLES CONSISTENCY EARNS SENIOR BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

• **Eric Charles** recorded multiple hits and scored a run in all three games of the Keith LeClair Classic earning the senior Big Ten co-Player of the Week honors.

• The second baseman finished the weekend 8-for-12 with two doubles, three RBIs and four runs scored. Charles got off to a hot start this season, leading the way a .560 batting average (14-for-25) over the first six games. He hit safely in each of first seven games (including six multi-hit efforts) and scored a run in the first eight. His career-best streak of reaching base safely in 27 consecutive games ended March 4 in the win against Charleston Southern.

BOILERS TURN EIGHT DOUBLE PLAYS IN GREENVILLE

• Purdue turned four double plays in each of its two victories at the Keith LeClair Classic. Of the eight twin killings, six were of the inning-ending variety and none bigger than the 1-2-3 game-ending double play in the East Carolina win. **Nick Wittgren** induced a comebacker off the bat of the ECU cleanup hitter with the bases loaded, one out and Purdue clinging to a 6-4 lead. Wittgren had already walked the previous two hitters to load the bases when the count went full against ECU's Chase McDonald. But moments later the game was over and Wittgren had earned his 13th career save, moving into third place on the Purdue all-time list.

• **Joe Haase** (two), **Joe Eichmann**, **Calvin Gunter**, **Blake Mascarello** and **Connor Podkul** also induced at least one ground ball double play ball. Mascarello started a 1-6-3 double play to eliminate a leadoff single in the eighth inning of the ECU win. Defensively, **David Miller** (six) and **Eric Charles** (five) were active in the twin killings at the second base bag.

• Purdue also turned four double plays in a game in a March 2011 home win against IPFW and three times during the 2009 campaign.

SPILLNER & CHARLES IGNITE THE OFFENSE AT ECU TOURNEY

• While batting their customary first and second in the lineup at ECU's Keith LeClair Classic (Feb. 25-26), **Tyler Spillner** (7-for-12) and **Eric Charles** (8-for-12) were a combined 15-for-24 with three walks, five RBIs and 10 runs scored. Both players reached base safely in all three games and had multiple hits in Purdue's two wins.

• Spillner reached base safely in three of his six opportunities to leadoff an inning, including the first inning of both wins. He's been on safely to open an inning in nine of his 17 opportunities early this season. Sunday in the victory against Western Carolina, the senior posted his third career four-hit effort, scoring a run while recording a hit in each of his first four at-bats.

• **Andrew Dixon**, Spillner and Charles each reached base safely twice and scored a run during the seven-run rally against WCU that decided the game. All three players recorded a hit their first time up to ignite the rally. They each walked in their second plate appearances of the extended frame.

PERKINS' 67-GAME STREAK SNAPPED IN LOSS TO MARYLAND

- After getting robbed of a potential base hit up the middle on a nice play by the Maryland pitcher in what proved to be **Cameron Perkins'** final at-bat of the game, the junior's remarkable streak of reaching base safely in 67 consecutive games was snapped. The streak dated back to 2010. Perkins reached base safely at least one in every game he played as a sophomore.
- Perkins reached base safely 133 times during his streak. He collected 98 hits, 12 walks and was hit by a pitch 23 times, good for an on-base percentage of .421.
- In Big Ten play, Perkins has reached base safely in 42 consecutive contests dating back to 2010. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he has managed to find his way on base in 49 straight games against conference opponents. He has compiled an on-base percentage of .425 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 94 times (70 hits, eight walks, 16 hit by pitch).

BOILERMAKERS OPEN 3-0 AT BIG TEN/BIG EAST CHALLENGE

- After being the only Big Ten team to finish the season-opening Big Ten/Big East Challenge 3-0, Purdue jumped out to its first 3-0 start since the 1991 team opened the year 5-0. The Challenge ended deadlocked 15-15 after both the Big Ten and Big East posted 15 wins. South Florida was the only other team to go 3-0.
- The Boilermakers outscored Connecticut, Cincinnati and Notre Dame at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge by a margin of 30-12. Purdue also posted its three wins in a span of just over 24 hours after Friday's opener against Cincinnati was postponed due to rain. The Boilermakers recorded back-to-back three-run rallies late in the game against UConn, led wire-to-wire in the shutout win against Cincinnati and used a nine-run sixth inning to surge past Notre Dame.

BREEDLOVE BESTOWED WITH PITCHER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- **Lance Breedlove's** career-high 11 strikeouts over his seven innings of two-hit ball in Purdue's shutout win of Cincinnati (Feb. 18) earned the senior right-hander National Pitcher of the Week honors from College Sports Madness as well as Big Ten co-Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Breedlove was dominant in his fifth career start as a Boiler. He surrendered only a pair of two-out singles and did not allow a base runner to advance past first. His 11 strikeouts represented the most by a Purdue pitcher since Matt Morgan fanned 14 in a March 2010 win at Ohio.
- Breedlove would have retired the final 16 batters he faced if not for a two-out error in the fifth inning. The senior worked four 1-2-3 frames. He struck out the side in the first inning. Thanks in part to not issuing a walk, Breedlove only needed 89 pitches to complete his seven innings. Purdue's first shutout win since the 2011 Big Ten home opener against Michigan was played in two hours and two minutes.

PERKINS' GRAND SLAM HIGHLIGHTS NINE-RUN RALLY

- Highlighted by a nine-run sixth inning that featured a grand slam from **Cameron Perkins**, Purdue scored in each of the final five innings to overcome a four-run deficit and defeat Notre Dame, 15-8, on the final day (Feb. 19) of the Big Ten/Big East Challenge.
- Each of the nine players in the batting order reached base safely and scored a run before an out was recorded in the sixth inning, leading to the Boilers' biggest inning since also scoring nine times in a March 2010 home win against Chicago State. Perkins connected for the first grand slam by a Boiler since April 2010, giving Purdue a 9-4 lead with a blast to left field. He finished with five RBIs, one shy of his career high. The grand slam was his 17th career home run, tops among active Boilers.

CONSISTENT LINEUP LEADS THE WAY IN ST. PETE

- The Boilermakers scored in 12 of 25 innings in which they batted at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge, finishing the weekend with a .367 team batting average. **Eric Charles** (6-for-13), **David Miller** (6-for-13), **Kevin Plawecki** (5-for-13) and **Stephen Talbott** (4-for-11) hit safely in all three games. **Andrew Dixon** enjoyed a big night at the plate (4-for-4) in the Cincinnati win, finishing the weekend 5-for-8.
- Thanks in part to the opposition committing 14 errors and issuing 16 free passes (11 walks, 5 HBP) over the three games, Purdue had a base runner in 22 of the 25 innings in which the team batted. A trio of 1-2-3 innings in the shutout win against Cincinnati marked the only times the Boilers went in order. Conversely, Purdue only committed two errors and issued eight free passes (4 walks, 4 HBP). The Boilermakers did not make an error or issue a walk in the season-opening win against Connecticut.

BOILERMAKERS AMONG FAVORITES IN BIG TEN

- Tabbed first or second in the preseason predictions by nearly every college baseball publication and website, Purdue entered the 2012 season among the favorites in the Big Ten Conference. Baseball America and College Baseball Insider both predicted the Boilers will win the Big Ten and represent the conference at the NCAA Regionals. Baseball America also predicted Purdue would be a No. 3 seed at Regionals. The league coaches picked the Boilers second to defending conference co-champion Michigan State in the preseason poll.
- Although Purdue has not won a Big Ten title since 1909, the team has certainly come close quite a few times during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** 14-year tenure. Four times since 2001, the Boilers have either finished in second place (2001, 2005, 2008) or been just one game (or fewer) out of first place in the final standings (2001 & 2011). Purdue tied the program's single-season record with 37 wins in 2011, leading the Big Ten in victories and overall win percentage (.649).

FOUR STRAIGHT BIG TEN TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES

- Purdue is the only Big Ten team to reach the league tournament in each of the last four seasons, a program-long streak. The Boilermakers have managed to win at least one Big Ten Tournament game each of the last four years, and in eight of their nine tourney appearances under head coach **Doug Schreiber**. Purdue's 58 conference victories over the last four years are also tops in the league.

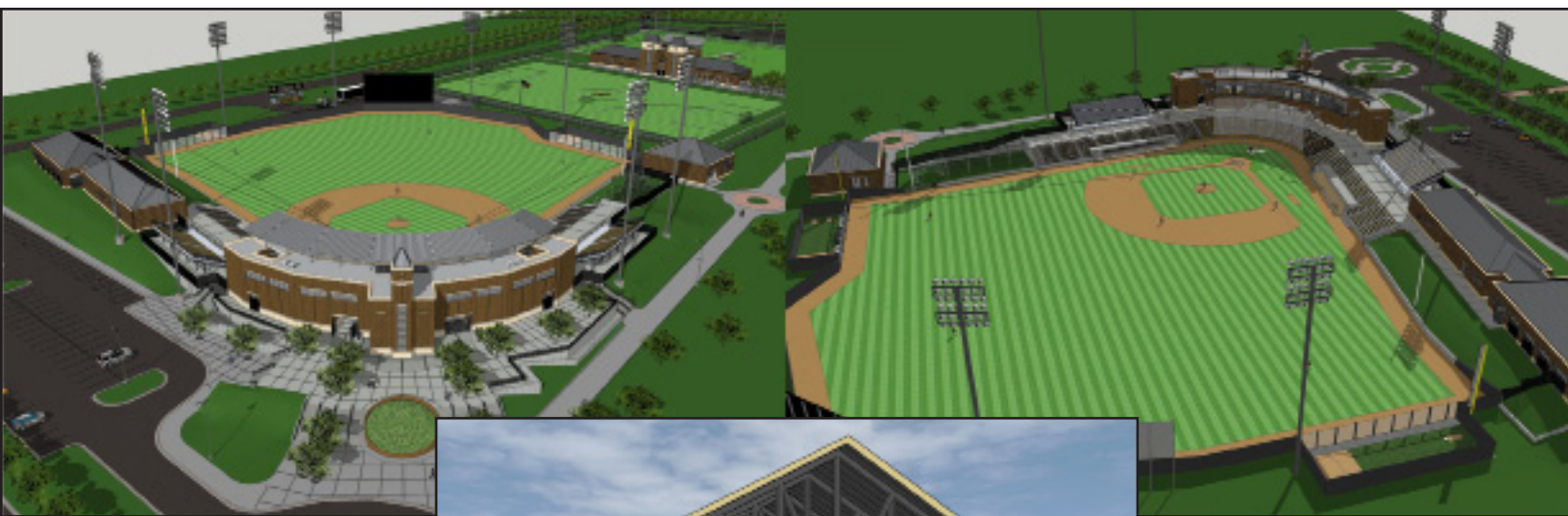

Construction Began in Spring of 2011
Stadium to be located near the intersection of
McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus**

Alexander Field will soon be the new home of the Boilermakers. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. The new stadium will be named Alexander Field in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. The Alexanders were the parents of Dave Alexander, who is giving the lead gift for the project. David Alexander was Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991 and then an athletics administrator through 1994. All three Alexanders graduated from Purdue, and Dave played on Purdue's baseball team. John Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1933, while Anna Margaret Ross Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1935. Both received honorary doctorates from Purdue in 1986.
