
# Season Preview



### **WRIGHT-EGER'S EVENT ANALYSIS**



Cathy Wright-Eger is entering her 18th year as the Boilermakers' head coach. This season may be Purdue's most exciting as it plays host to its first ever NCAA Championship meet and a second Central Regional Diving Zone.

Wright-Eger has high expectations for her team, which returns a number of Big Ten scorers, including Carrie McCambridge, Christine Leupold and Tracy Duchac. The veteran mentor also is excited about the rapid development of her sophomore class, which progressed faster than expected as freshman last season.

Wright-Eger sees a lot of strength within this year's lineup and is beginning to believe that a lot of her student-athletes are due for a career-making season.

#### **Freestyle**

In the sprints, Tracy Duchac is our No. 1 swimmer but she needs to score big points for us in the 100 freestyle, like she has previously done in the 50. She is starting to realize that she a two-event star, and needs to prove that to the competition.

With Tracy are Katie Seleskie and Susan Hentschel. If both student-athletes improve on last year's accomplishments, we could have three swimmers placing among the top eight in both sprints; plus they'll take over 3/4 of the 200 and 400 freestyle relays.

Tracy, Katie and Susan are coming off their best year ever, and are coming into this season with something to prove. It's strange, but there is something in the atmosphere at the Boilermaker Aquatic Center, that makes me feel like this is their year.

Comparing ourselves to all the Big Ten schools, we lost the least amount of talent and points. If we are going to make a significant move in the conference standings, it will start with this year's team.

Rounding out the sprint roster are Kimbre Vogel and Christine Leupold in the 50 and 100, and freshman Jenae Gill in the 50. All three of these women are candidates to complete both freestyle relays.

Erica Chandler leads way in the 200 freestyle, as she is our varsity record holder (1:48.50). Erica wants to make the NCAA 'A' cu to compete at the next level. She has recorded 'B' cut after 'B' cut, but has gotten tired of waiting around for her chance at the NCAA's.

Following Erica in the 200 are Christine Leupold, Katharine Telfer, Susan and Katie, all of whom have the potential to reach the top eight at the conference championships.

Katharine Telfer is looking to step up since she will be a key to our success in the 800 freestyle relay. She had a solid freshman season, so we should expect more from her this season. Her 800 freestyle relay team owned the 14th best time in the nation last season, but the NCAA ended up accepting the top 13. We need to push ourselves over that hump and qualify.

Our distance crew is led by Erica and Yvonne Laaper, who are easily our top two competitors in all distance events: 500, 1,000 and the 1,650-yard courses. Katharine also is good in the 500; she recorded an NCAA 'B' cut last year of 4:53.71.

#### **Breaststroke**

Sophomore Rory Belk is coming off a sensational first season, which saw her record a new freshman record and an NCAA 'B' cut in the 200-yard breast. She appears to be our top swimmer in this event, followed by freshmen Jennifer Lavers and Shannon Grace, who already possess times that can score at the Big Ten Championships.

Lavers is extremely good, and had the extra added benefit of competing for a real solid club team. We feel great that we were able to get her out of Texas, and

away from nationally ranked Texas and Texas A&M.

Our hope is to have these three student-athletes carry us in this event all season long. I want them to stay healthy and succeed not only for themselves, but for Erica (Chandler), as well. Erica helped us out a lot last season in the breast-stroke, especially in the medley relays, but it's important for me to keep her fresh for her freestyle races. If she doesn't have to worry about the breaststroke, that will help her qualify for NCAA's.

We are in a much better situation this season with Rory, Jennifer and Shannon leading the way. It's a personnel change that can help both Erica and our team.

#### **Backstroke**

It's fair to say that Brandy Keever had a very rough year last season as a junior. She was a top-eight finisher at Big Ten's her sophomore year, but could not regain that same speed and form last season. This team really needs the Brandy Keever of old to reemerge, and if she does, she'll definitely be a key to this team's success.

Kat Telfer was our No. 2 behind Brandy last season, so she'll continue to compete in this event, as well as the distance freestyle races. Again, we need Kat to step up.

Freshman Jenae Gill is someone who we specifically recruited for the backstroke, and right now she is as fast as Brandy. She will make an immediate impact in this event, and has a chance to challenge for a spot on the 'A' medley relay.

Another freshman, Abby Kiffmeyer, also gives us depth at backstroke, even though we recruited her as a butterfly specialist.

#### **Butterfly**

We have Carlene Takaki handling the reins of the distance butterfly squad and Abby Kiffmeyer is looking to help Christine Leupold in the sprint butterfly. Backing up Carlene and Abby are a few individuals we've labeled as "projects", athletes who are loaded with potential and who we expect will work their way up the ladder.

Last year we plugged in several individuals in the butterfly with mixed success, so this event has become our top recruiting priority for next season. We need another stud butterflyer.

If we had one weakness on this team, it would be the butterfly, and that's just because of the lack of depth. However, we have faith in the people who are in place in this event.

#### **Individual Medley**

Jennifer Merte leads IM squads, also with Christine Leupold in the sprint and Yvonne Laaper in the distance. Erica Chandler, I expect, could help us in both races in dual meets.

Last season, Jen produced our team's top time of the season in the 400 IM with a NCAA provisional time of 4:20.52. Of all our returners, Christine has the best sprint IM time at 2:03.85, also an NCAA 'B' cut.

#### **Diving**

Everyone is aware of the talent this team now possesses off the diving boards, primarily our NCAA qualifiers Amanda Miller and Carrie McCambridge. As I've said before, these two are the team's 'A'-level divers and we'll expect them to score again at the Big Ten's, central regional zones and NCAA Championships.

Our two freshman recruits are Katie Berg and Lauren Hallyburton. Both are extremely talented divers that have experience at high-level competitions, and that's what Wenbo is looking for. He wants individuals who are with traveling club teams, and who have competed at the Senior and Junior National level.

We'd love to see both Berg and Hallyburton produce points at Big Ten's and diving Zone's, which would give us four divers among the top 16, and could bump us up another notch in the standings.

### **COACH WRIGHT-EGER Q&A**

### How excited are you and the team to be playing host to the NCAA Championships in just a few years?

I think it's phenomenal. We built this pool and it's been a picture-perfect setting for a number of events. We played host to diving zones its first year, women's and men's Big Ten Championships followed in the second and third years, and this year were back to hosting zones as well as the NCAA Women's Championships. It's a huge compliment to our event staff to be able to play host to these high-caliber events, year after year.

Our swimmers and divers are beginning to feel a sense of urgency; they want to make it to NCAA's this season and compete in front of their fans.

#### How has this championship meet helped the home pool?

It's such a statement to go into a recruit's home and tell them that the NCAA Championships are taking place at our home pool. Hosting this event means our facility is good enough to welcome some of the very best collegiate athletes and teams in the nation.

With the recruits. it gives us total credibility with them, and credibility is power. They realize that we compete in one of the nation's elite facilities and are impressed.

Hosting this event also gives us exposure to the country's top teams. Anumber of nationally ranked schools wanted to come here and compete this season, and there were some that I had to say 'no' to after we filled our home schedule.

### What athletes do you expect to make a significant leap this season?

We had several student-athletes who just missed scoring in a number of events at Big Ten's last year, so there are several contenders. The first person that comes to mind is Rory Belk. She went from being an extra on the breaststroke roster to being one of the top swimmers in the conference, earning an NCAA provisional mark in the 200 breast.

Susan Hentschel, as a freshman last year was a seven-event scorer at the Big Ten Championships. She was on three of our relays, which finished among the top 15 in the nation. This past summer at Senior Nationals she scored in the top eight in two different events. Susan is extremely confident, and could produce a number of high scores at the dual and championship levels.

Diver Amanda Miller made the NCAA meet a year ago, but unfortunately did not score. I think she's on fire coming into this season and is ready to take another shot at the competition. She knows what it takes to score and loves every ounce of training; she definitely wants bigger and better things this year.

### Who are you expecting to make the biggest impact within this year's sophomore class?

Susan Hentschel should be a three-time top eight swimmer at Big Ten's this year in the 50, 100 and 200 freestyle. She should really make a difference for us. Kimbre (Vogel), Rory and Carlene (Takaki); if they can somehow squeeze into the top eight, they could double their points from last season.

If you look at how many points each of the other Big Ten teams graduated, we are beginning to think this could be Purdue's year. We only lost 20 points from last year's team.

The way we're trying to motivate the team is by showing them how many of their competitors graduated. For example, Erica Chandler finished ninth in the 500 freestyle last season, but six of the top eight in that event have graduated. We have to keep telling her, "This is your year."

### What are the major differences between last year's freshman class and this year's?

For the first time in my coaching career, our freshmen will be the icing on the cake. We are not going to depend on this year's freshmen class as much as previous ones. I want them to come in and learn from the talent this team already possesses, and that way they can fit right into the system. We're not saying to them, "We need you now", which is what we've frequently done in the past.

There are a handful of freshmen who could make an immediate impact, but we don't want them to feel the pressure. Last year, we had Susan (Hentschel) anchoring our relays and that's a lot of pressure to handle; she didn't even know

what the Big Ten's was all about. She, like most of our other incoming freshmen, were state champions, and a lot of them think that they're going to win at the conference level too. And then they find out it's a completely different ball game.

It's so much better for our freshmen not to feel that anxiety. I want them to ease into the system, and not receive any pressure from the team like last year's class did. I want them to experience a healthy transition.

### Do you expect anyone from this year's freshman class to contribute?

I think Jennifer Lavers will step right in. I could see her making our 'A' medley relays as the breaststroke leg. But Shannon Grace is right behind her, and they're going to be pushing one another for that top relay spot. All of the freshmen are incredibly competitive.

Abby Kiffmeyer, our recruit from Alaska, has raw talent but she hasn't been exposed to all the facilities and training methods that can improve performance. Jenae Gill is a state champion and former two-sport athlete, so she knows what it takes to win, how to stay in shape year round and stay mentally tough.

I wouldn't be surprised if at the end of the season 50 percent of our relays were comprised of freshmen, especially in the medleys. Our medleys were a weak spot for us last year, and if we want to move up in the Big Ten Conference standings, both have to finish in the top five. If our team wants to be in the top five at Big Ten's, then all our relays, medleys included, have to finish in the top five.

#### Has anyone really taken you by surprise this preseason?

The whole team has impressed me. We are not starting where we left off this spring, we are starting way ahead of where we left. There is no doubt in my mind we are better right now today then we were last spring, and that is so encouraging as a coach. The team is really listening to the coaches, the athletic trainers and the strength trainers, and utilizing their advice.

We have a big team this season, in that we are carrying more people on the roster than are allowed to compete at Big Ten's. Knowing that they all have to fight for a spot on the conference team, has made a positive difference.

### With there being as many upperclassmen as there are freshmen, who provides the leadership?

It's such a compliment to the team knowing that our juniors and seniors are extremely good leaders. They lead in various ways, but they make a difference. Our sophomores were a very mature class last year as freshmen, and they just have tremendous potential to improve as leaders in and out of the pool.

Several team meetings have already taken place this year without the coaches involvement, where the upperclassmen have laid out their expectations for the freshmen, and for each other. They've made it a point to speak of the importance of the team's reputation, and how everyone is responsible for their own actions. The captains also made it clear that there is no division between the freshmen and upperclassmen, saying the team will operate as one.

As soon as our freshman signed, we assigned them a teammate who would serve as their mentor, and the results have been outstanding. This program has allowed me to focus more on my coaching, knowing that each of my freshmen has their own personal coach within the team.

#### What are the goals for this year's team?

The goals are to finish among the top 25 to 30 at NCAA's. Since we are at home, we want to have divers, swimmers and relays all scoring. If we accomplish those goals, then we can finish among the top 25. We also want to be return to the top five at Big Ten's, and retain the President's Cup (awarded by semester for highest team grade-point average).

### What needs to be done to surpass the likes of Michigan and Wisconsin at the Big Ten meet?

I think we'll move up faster at NCAA's than we will at Big Ten's. If you look at our conference, all 11 teams regularly score in the top 40 at NCAA's, it's just that good. The team and coaches desperately want to win a conference title, but it's going to be a yearly progression. We need to recruit for a few more years before we can win at Big Ten's, but I see us moving up the NCAA ladder rather quickly.
