HEAD COACH CATHY WRIGHT-EGER



Entering her 18th season as head coach of the Boilermakers, Cathy-Wright Eger has established a reputation of producing outstanding student-athletes.

With a dual meet record of 124-71-2 and an overall program grade-point average of 3.5, Wright-Eger's teams consistently place well in the pool as well as in the classroom.

Since coming to Purdue in 1987, Wright-Eger has coached some of the best female swimmers in the Big Ten and the nation, including four Big Ten champions (Darlene Warta-Renie 1988 and 1990, Susan Wolfle 1991, Kim Fritsch 1993 and 1994, Lindsay Lange 2003).

Over the years, she also has coached several All-Americans. Both Kim Fritsch and Warta-Renie were named to All-America status during their time at Purdue, and 13 other Boilermakers have been named to honorable mention status (most recently Lisa Dolansky, Patricia Finnerty, Lindsay Lange, Kim Paradeise and Tracy Duchac in 2003).

On the national level, Wright-Eger's teams have advanced swimmers to the NCAA championships 16 out of the last 17 years, finishing a program-best 22nd in 1992.

Although her teams continue to perform extremely well in the water, their performance in the classroom is even more impressive. Since her arrival, 167 swimmers and divers have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, an average of nearly 10 student-athletes per season. In addition, 13 Purdue women have been named Academic All-America, and 42 have received honorable mention honors. The teams also has ranked consistently or near the top among Purdue's varsity teams in terms of GPA. In fact, Wright-Eger's teams have been the recipients of Purdue's President's Cup award (presented to intercollegiate athletics teams with the highest GPA) four times in the last five years.

During the 2003-04 season alone, 11 women were named Academic All-Big Ten, and the team's combined GPA of 3.5 was not only the best at Purdue and in the Big Ten, but was seventh-best in the nation. Couple this with the team's strong finish in the Big Ten and NCAA, and the argument can be made that the 2003-04 Boilermakers were one of the best all-around teams in the nation.

Wright-Eger also has coached several Purdue swimmers to success internationally. Former Purdue swimmer Gyongyver Lakos represented her native Hungary as an Olympian in both Atlanta and Sydney, as well as in the 2001 World University Games. Other Boilermakers coached by Wright-Eger who went on to international competition include Kim Fritsch, Marisa Watts and Karina Bolanos. Wright-Eger also has coached seven United States Olympic Trial qualifiers during her tenure at Purdue. Lange competed in the 100 and 200 breaststroke at the 2004 trials in Long Beach, Calif.

Wright-Eger is no stranger to personal honors and recognition. Since coming to Purdue, she has been selected as the Big Ten Women's Swimming Coach of the Year (1990), the Boilermaker Coach of the Year by the Purdue Club of Chicago (1993), and was handed the 1996 Salute to Women Award, given annually by the local YWCA. In 2001, Wright-Eger was featured as one of three coaches in Sports Illustrated for Women in an article focusing on being a mother and coach at the same time.

In August of 2003, Wright-Eger was accorded the honor of joining the U.S. Women's Swim Team as its manager for the Summer World University Games in Daegu, South Korea. Wright-Eger will represent United States Swimming this October at the third annual Women in Coaching Summit, which takes place in Colorado Springs, Colo.

A native of West Lafayette, Ind., Wright-Eger has been involved in the sport of swimming her entire life. Graduating from Lafayette Jefferson High School, she was a part of the school's 1975 state championship women's swimming and diving team. After graduation, she attended Ball State University and earned a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1982.

From 1983 to 1985, Wright-Eger was a school teacher at her alma mater, Lafayette Jefferson. In addition to her duties in the classroom, she also served as the school's head swimming coach, an experience that undoubtedly led her to a career in coaching.

Wright-Eger left Lafayette for a brief period (1985-1987) to be an assistant coach at the University of Iowa before returning to take the reins of the Boilermaker program in 1987.

Wright-Eger and her husband, Rob, reside in West Lafayette with their sons, Tyler, 16, and Tory, 10.

Darlene Renie **Asst. Swim Coach • Recruiting Coordinator**

Darlene Renie is in her eighth year as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Purdue program.

As the main recruiter for the Purdue women's program, Renie has been and continues to be responsible for all aspects of both on- and off-campus recruiting.

Since joining the Purdue staff, Renie has used her expertise, personal example and excellent recruiting skills to help take Purdue from the basement of the Big Ten Conference to a respectable sixth-place showing in 2004.

Many of Renie's recruits continued to excel for the Boilermakers in 2003-04, including Tracy Duchac, Susan Hentschel, Katie Seleskie and Christine Leupold.

Under Renie's watch, Duchac qualified for her second straight NCAA Championships, her first as an individual, competing in the 50 and 100 freestyle. In the prelims of the 100 free at the Texas A&M-based meet, Duchac recorded a personal best time of 50.84 seconds. Earlier in the season, at the Big Ten Championships, Duchac recorded a varsity record of 22.95 in the 50 free, becoming the first Boilermaker freestyler to swim under the 23-second mark.

Duchac also succeeded in the classroom, being selected as a CSCAA Academic All-American.

Hentschel was one of Purdue's most outstanding rookies, recording new freshmen records in the 50 and 100 free, while helping post varsity record times in the 400 and 800 freestyle relays. Hentschel's record mark of 50.26 in the 100 free, was not only a new freshmen standard, but was the team's fastest time of the season. Additionally, Hentschel recorded six NCAA provisional times, three as an individual and with three relay squads.

Leupold was an inspiration to the team last season, overcoming an illness to score in three individual races at the Big Ten Championships. In addition to scoring in the 100 and 200 free and 200 individual medley, Leupold also helped the 400 and 800 freestyle relays post new varsity records.

Seleskie made an impact for the team at the Texas A&M Invitational and at the Big Ten Championships. At Texas A&M, Seleskie posted lifetime bests in several events, including the 50 and 100 free, leading the Boilermakers to a fifth-place showing. Seleskie improved on those times at the conference championships and managed a seventh-place NCAA provisional time of 50.55 in the finals of the 100 free.

Prior to joining Wright-Eger's staff, Renie spent six years coaching the boys and girls teams of Logansport (Ind.) High School and the Cass County YMCA Swim Team.

Renie, formerly Darlene Warta, was an outstanding swimmer and student-athlete at Purdue from 1987 to 1990. She became Purdue's first female swimmer to be selected as an All-American after she placed fifth in the 200-yard butterfly at the 1989 NCAA Championships. In 1990, Renie earned All-America honors again in the 200 fly and honorable mention recognition as a member of the 400 medley relay team.

Renie also captured two Big Ten titles by winning the conference's 200 butterfly in 1988 and 1990. A four-year letterwinner, she was a Senior Nationals consolation champion, a Junior Nationals qualifier, a four-time NCAA qualifier, and the first woman in Purdue history to score individually at the NCAA's. She was named Purdue's Outstanding Senior Athlete by Mortar Board, and the John Purdue Club's Chicago Athlete of the Year her senior year. By the time she finished her illustrious career, she held school records in the 100 and 200 fly, 800 freestyle relay and 400 medley relay.

A native of Chicago, Renie and her husband, Jeff, live in Lafayette. Jeff, also a Purdue swimming alumnus, was a member of the 1986-87 Boilermaker squad under current head coach Dan Ross.

The Renies have three children: Jessica (11), Jake (8) and Joshua (4).



Wenbo Chen **2004 Big Ten Diving Coach of the Year**

Wenbo Chen, selected this past season as the Big Ten's Diving Coach of the Year, is in his fourth year at the helm of the Purdue diving program.

Since his arrival in West Lafayette, Chen has restored pride and prestige to the Purdue diving team, guiding ten different athletes to the NCAA Regional Zone Meet in three full seasons. His biggest success stories include NCAA qualifier Kara Hajek-Gustafson, three-time Regional Zone qualifier Clayton Davis and three-time Big Ten Champion Carrie McCambridge.

McCambridge won all three of her Big Ten titles at last year's conference championships, giving her Diver of the Year and Diver of the Championships honors. At the Big Ten meet, McCambridge also established new varsity records in all her competitions, finishing with scores of 321.80 (one-meter), 544.35 (three-meter) and 413.50 (platform).

Following the Big Ten Championships, Chen guided McCambridge to three top five-showings at the NCAA Central Regional Diving Zones, which clinched her first appearance at the NCAA Championships. Rookie diver Amanda Miller also joined McCambridge and Chen at NCAA's after placing among the top eight in the platform and one-meter competitions at the zone meet.

Success followed McCambridge to the NCAA Championships, where she became only the second Purdue diver in the history of the program (Nicole Zlotnik, 1992) to attain honorable mention All-America status.

This past summer, Chen traveled with McCambridge to a number of prestigious diving events, including the U.S. Olympic Diving Trials and the Speedo National Diving Championships. During the regular season, Chen had McCambridge compete at the World Cup Diving Trials.

Chen came to Purdue from Moultrie, Ga., where he was the head coach of the Moss Farms Diving Tigers program from 1996 to October 2001.

While at Moss Farms, Chen compiled an impressive record. Among his proteges: 2001 U.S. Olympic Trials qualifiers, Senior World champions and team members, Junior World champions and team members, U.S. and Canadian Senior National champions and team members, U.S. Junior National champions and team members, Can-Am-Mex Championships medalists and team members, and U.S. Goodwill Games team members.

Prior to his Moss Farms stint and his immigration to the United States in 1992, Chen began his coaching career and was one of the premier coaches in the Peoples' Republic of China. From 1983 to 1991, he was the coach of the Chinese National Team. During that time, he coached Olympic gold, silver and bronze medalists, as well as Chinese national champions and gold medalists in the World Championships, the World University Games and the Asia Championships.

Chen has had collegiate coaching experience as the head coach at Florida State in 1998 and as a visiting assistant coach at Illinois from 1992 to 1993.

Himself a decorated diver, Chen was one of the best divers in China from 1973 to 1982 as a member of the Chinese National Team. In 1976, he was the Chinese Junior National champion on the 3-meter springboard. Then, from 1977 to 1982, he was a finalist at the Chinese National Championships on both the 3- and 10-meter platforms.

A native of Beijing, Chen earned his bachelor's degree at Beijing Sports University in 1987. He is married to Wenyin Han, a former Chinese ballerina. The Chens reside in West Lafayette and have two daughters, Amy Yao (12) and Annie Yuan (3).
