#BOILERNOTES

The Boilermakers have won five of their last six entering Sunday's rematch with the Hawkeyes, including Thursday's 64-53 victory at Minnesota to improve to 15-6 overall and 6-2 in conference play. Purdue and Iowa remain in a three-way tie for second place in the Big Ten standings, just one game behind conference-leading Rutgers at 7-1.

Purdue continues to hang its hat on the defensive end of the floor, holding its last five opponents under 60 points in regulation, including limiting the high-scoring Hawkeyes to 57 points in the first meeting at Mackey Arena on Jan. 10. The Boilermakers have the second-best scoring defense in conference play, holding opponents to 58.8 points per game, and lead the Big Ten in rebounding defense, limiting foes to 32.3 rebounds per game.

The Boilermakers continue to get an inspired effort out of their leading trio of juniors Ae'rianna Harris and Dominique Oden and sophomore Karissa McLaughlin. The three-headed monster combined for 44 points at Minnesota on Thursday, and are averaging a combined 43.7 points per game in Big Ten play, hitting on a combined 43.1 percent from the field and 37 percent from 3-point range.

TEAM NOTES

- Purdue is in its 44th season of women's basketball, holding an 858-472 all-time record and a 399-219 mark in its 37th season of conference play, looking to become just the third Big Ten school to hit the 400-win mark
- The Boilermakers are receiving votes in the USA Today/Coaches Poll for the second straight week after winning four of their last five
- Purdue jumped to 27th in the Ratings Percentage Index (RPI), 1-of-6 Big Ten teams ranked in the top-30, and 1-of-10 in the top-100
- The Boilermaker bench had its best performance in 10 games Thursday, outscoring Minnesota's 14-2, and marking their first game in double figures since Dec. 16
- The Boilermakers rank eighth in the NCAA and lead the Big Ten in average attendance at 6,619 fans per game
- Purdue and Maryland are the only two schools in the conference with two top-10 scorers as McLaughlin and Oden are seventh and eighth at 15.5 and 15.4 points per game
- The Boilermakers lead conference play, limiting opponents to 31.3 rebounds per game, and rank second in the Big Ten securing 72.4 percent of their opponents misses
- Purdue's 113 blocked shots rank eighth in the NCAA, while its 5.4 blocks per game average is 15th-best in the nation, and its 5.5 rejections per game lead Big Ten play
- The Boilermakers' season-opening win at Ball State was the fifth-largest road win in program history and the biggest since a 43-point win at Butler in 2006
- Purdue had 16 steals against Ball State, its most since Nov. 28, 2012 vs. Georgia Tech in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge
- The Boilermakers cashed in 12-of-18 3's against Miami, marking the No. 7 single-game performance in the NCAA this season and tied Purdue's No. 7 single-game mark all-time
- Purdue blocked 12 shots at Ohio, tying for the third-most in a game in program history and the most since 2014
- With Ae'rianna Harris and Dominique Oden earning Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media, Purdue is one-of-two schools to have two players on both teams (Iowa)

LAST TIME OUT

- The Boilermakers picked up their third road win of the year and second in conference play with a 64-53 victory at Minnesota
- Purdue held Minnesota to 31.3 percent from the field, and kept the Golden Gophers off the free throw line, committing only 10 fouls resulting in nine Minnesota attempts

HEAD COACH SHARON VERSYP

- In her 13th season on the Boilermaker sidelines, Versyp now has the longest tenure of any coach in program history
- She is the winningest coach in program history, owning 272 victories at Purdue
- Has nine 20-win campaigns in 12 seasons with the Boilermakers, and has won at least 20 games in 12 of 18 career seasons as a head coach
- With the conference-opening win over Ohio State, Versyp surpassed Lin Dunn for the Boilermakers' career Big Ten Conference wins mark at 123
- Her 135 career Big Ten wins are tied for sixth in conference history, matching Northwestern's Don Perrelli, and are third-most among active coaches
- Her 22 career Big Ten Tournament victories are an event record, breaking the previous mark (shared by Jim Foster and Rene Portland) with Purdue's 2017 quarterfinal win over Indiana
- She's led the Boilermakers to the Big Ten Tournament championship game six times in 12 seasons (four titles)
- Versyp has guided Purdue to a program-record nine NCAA Tournament appearances in 12 seasons
- The Boilermakers are 1-of-25 schools to make at least nine tournaments over Versyp's tenure as head coach, and 1-of-5 schools in the Big Ten Conference

#1 KARISSA MCLAUGHLIN

- Leads the Big Ten and fourth in the NCAA at the free throw line, converting 92.5 percent (62-67) this season and has cashed in 91.7 percent for her Purdue career (100-109)
- Leads the NCAA in minutes played (780:52), and has played a complete game 10 times this season
- Hitting 38.2 percent from 3-point range in conference play and is tied for third in the Big Ten averaging 2.6 triples through eight Big Ten games
- Has six games with at least four 3-pointers this season (Ball State, Western Illinois, Miami, Ohio, Ohio State, Rutgers), now owning 10 career games with at least four
- Matched her career high with 11 assists at Wisconsin and the Boilermakers are now 19-3 in her career and 7-1 this season when she deals at least five assists in a game
- Her 19-point, 11-assist double-double made her the eighth player in Purdue history to record at least two points-assists double-doubles
- Joined the Boilermaker record books as the fifth player to hit 5-of-5 from 3-point range in a game, draining all five attempts against No. 21 Miami
- Scored a career-high 25 points twice this season first hitting the mark vs. St. John's, hitting 9-of-14 from the field and 3-of-7 from 3-point range, and scoring 25 again vs. South Carolina as she hit 10-of-12 at the free throw line
- Earned 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team honors, becoming 10th player in Purdue history, fifth under Versyp and first Boilermaker since 2013
- Her 75 3-point field goals in 2017-18 are most-ever by a Purdue freshman and third-most in a season in Boilermaker history

#2 ABBY ABEL

- Named the co-Grand Marshal of the 2018 Indianapolis 500 Festival Parade for her work with the Special Olympics
- Was the keynote speaker at the 2018 Special Olympics USA Games in Seattle
- Created an annual Special Olympics "Play Unified" event at Purdue, which has been held at Cardinal Court in Mackey Arena the last two years with students from across the athletics department and campus

#3 LYNDSY WHILBY

- Transferred to Purdue after one season at Texas Tech, where she averaged 7.2 points in 30 games and nine starts for the Red Raiders
- A three-time Georgia AAAAAA State Champion at McEachern High School

#5 CASSIDY HARDIN

- Coming off a 10-point effort at Minnesota, where she contributed 20 minutes and hit three 3's for her highest-scoring Big Ten game
- Posted a career-high 14 points against Purdue Fort Wayne, hitting four triples
- Hit 96 3-pointers as a senior at Center Grove High School, a school record and the fifth-most in a season in Indiana state history and made 260 career 3-pointers, good for eighth-most in state history
- McDonald's All-America nominee

#11 DOMINIQUE ODEN

- Averaging 15.8 points per game in conference play, tied for sixth in the Big Ten
- Is the top-shooting guard in the Big Ten, ranked 11th overall at 46.8 percent from the field
- Grabbed a career-high five steals at Northwestern
- Posted her first career double-double with 19 points and 10 rebounds vs. South Carolina
- Her 157 career 3's are already tied for ninth in Purdue history, matching Jennifer Jacoby (1992-95), and her 36.7 career percentage from 3 is 12th all-time for the Boilers
- Hitting 81.9 percent at the free throw line in her career, the No. 6 mark in program history
- Became the 33rd 1,000-point scorer at Purdue with 16 at Ohio
- She is the 16th junior in program history to accomplish the feat and the seventh player to do it in under 80 games
- Her 1,192 career points are one point shy of Cathey Tyree for 25th in program history
- Poured in a career-high 27 points against Miami, hitting a career-most six 3's
- Named to the Big Ten Player of the Week Honor Roll twice this season (12/3, 12/17)
- 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)
- Earned 2017-18 Second Team All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media
- Averaged 18.8 points over the final 15 games of the 2017-18 season, topping the 20-point mark nine times
- Led Purdue in scoring at 14.1 points per game, becoming the first sophomore to lead the Boilermakers since 2009-10
- One-of-5 players all-time at Purdue to hit at least 5-5 from 3-point range in a game, draining all five attempts vs. Northwestern in 2018
- Interning in the school of civil engineering for the 2018-19 academic year, working on a variety of projects on campus including Ross-Ade Stadium and State Street

#12 NORA KIESLER

- Graduated in August of 2018, with her bachelor's degree from the Krannert School of Management
- Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree
- Interned in the John Purdue Club in the summer of 2018

#13 AJAH STALLINGS

- Dished out three assists in a career-most 10 minutes against Purdue Fort Wayne
- Scored her first career points with a pair of free throws against Western Illinois
- Second preferred walk-on in Versyp's 13 seasons as Purdue's head coach
- 2018 Indiana high school honorable mention all-state
- Featured by ESPNW in 2015

#15 LÉONY BOUDREAU

- Out indefinitely with an injury
- Along with Dawson College teammate Tamara Farquhar, they are the first two Canadian players in Purdue women's basketball history
- Majoring in biomedical engineering with goals to work with and build prosthetics for paraolympic athletes

#22 JENELLE GRANT

- Transferred to Purdue from the University of the Pacific, where she appeared in 56 games for the Tigers, including 23 starts
- Averaged 7.5 points and 7.2 rebounds per game in 2017-18
- A native of London, England, she's the first British player in Boilermaker history

#23 KAYANA TRAYLOR

- Talled a career-high 15 points vs. Indiana, including eight in the first quarter, hitting 5-of-10 from the field and 4-of-5 at the free throw line
- Has scored 12 points on three occasions this season, including the upset over No. 17 Iowa
- Dished a career-most eight assists against Loyola Chicago and Bradley, nearly posting a triple-double with eight points and seven rebounds against Bradley
- Ranked 13th in the Big Ten, third among freshmen, with 4.0 assists per game
- Earned her first career start vs. Harvard, and has started 11 games on the year for the Boilermakers
- Second Purdue freshman in as many years to score in double figures in their first career game (McLaughlin)
- Set Martinsville High School records for scoring (2114), assists (437), free throws (472) and games played (98)
- 2018 Indiana Miss Basketball finalist
- McDonald's All-America nominee

#25 TAMARA FARQUHAR

- Averaging 9.7 points and 10.0 rebounds in conference play, hitting on 45.0 percent from the floor
- Pulled down a career-high 18 rebounds at Northwestern, tying the No. 14 single-game total in program history and the most since Harris' 18 boards vs. Indiana last season
- Hit 8-of-9 field goals on her way to a career-high 16 points against Michigan, adding eight rebounds, a career-high four assists and two blocked shots
- Logged her first career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds at Ohio
- Posted her second double-figure scoring game of the season against Ole Miss, finishing with 10 points, three boards and three blocks
- Tied her then-career-best with 12 points vs. Western Illinois, hitting 4-of-6 from the floor and 4-of-5 at the free throw line
- Started 17-of-34 games as a freshman, becoming one of five rookie starters for Versyp's career
- Set top-10 Purdue freshman marks for rebounding (163) and blocked shots (28)
- Along with Dawson College teammate Léony Boudreau, they are the first two Canadian players in Purdue women's basketball history

#30 NYAGOA GONY

- Talled five points, nine rebounds and a pair of blocked shots in her collegiate debut, playing 16 minutes
- Led Lincoln High School to its first state championship appearance in 14 years in 2018
- Two-time honorable mention all-state honoree
- Led the state of Nebraska in rebounding in 2015-16

#32 AE'RIANNA HARRIS

- Named to the Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Award watchlist, 1-of-15 players in the nation, and 1-of-3 underclassmen
- Enters Sunday with 932 career points, closing in on becoming the 34th 1,000-point scorer in Purdue history
- Already 14th in program history with 686 career rebounds, passing Stephanie White, and looking to become the first player at Purdue to grab 700 rebounds in less than three seasons
- Second in the NCAA with 68 blocked shots this season, while her 3.24 rejections per game average is best average in the Big Ten and No. 4 in the country
- Ranked second at Purdue and 13th in Big Ten Conference history with 248 career blocks, passing Minnesota's Amanda Zahui B. with four blocks at Northwestern
- Her eight blocks at Ohio make her 1-of-4 players in Purdue history to reject at least eight in a game and the first since 2013
- Set Purdue's single-game field goal percentage record vs. Purdue Fort Wayne, going 10-for-10 from the field, becoming the 11th player in Big Ten Conference history to go at least 10-for-10 in a game, and 1-of-4 players in the nation this season
- Has eight double-doubles this season, good for third in the Big Ten, including back-to-back in the last two games
- Tied for seventh in program history on the double-double list (17), matching Sam Ostarello (2010-13)
- Named to Lisa Leslie Award preseason watch list for the nation's top center
- 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)
- 2018 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the third Boilermaker to earn the honor and third sophomore in conference history to take home the award
- One-of-3 players (only one to return in 2018-19) in the NCAA last season to post 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots

- The second player in Boilermaker history to block at least 100 shots in a season, rejecting 105, three shy of Purdue's single-season record and tied for 13th-most in a season in Big Ten Conference history

#45 FATOU DIAGNE

- Coming off her best career Big Ten game with four points, seven rebounds and two blocks at Minnesota
- Started her first career game vs. Ole Miss, posting career-high totals of six points, seven rebounds and three assists in 22 minutes
- Posted five points and six rebounds in 13 minutes against Purdue Fort Wayne
- Sat out the 2017-18 season at Purdue due to injuries (foot)
- Played on back-to-back NJCAA National Championship teams at Gulf Coast State College
- Second player in program history from Senegal, following Aya Traore (2004-06)

OPPONENT NOTES

- The Hawkeyes host Sunday's game at 15-4 overall and 6-2 in conference play, winners of four straight since losing at Purdue on Jan. 10
- Iowa dealt conference-leading Rutgers its first loss in Big Ten play Wednesday, earning a 72-66 win at Carver-Hawkeye Arena and snapping a 10-game win streak for the Scarlet Knights
- Iowa is ranked 17th in the AP Poll, 15th in the USA Today/Coaches Poll and 10th in the RPI
- Head coach Lisa Bluder is the second longest-tenured head coach in the conference, in her 19th season with the Hawkeyes and has the second-most Big Ten wins in conference history at 185
- Iowa remains one of the most offensively efficient teams in the nation, leading the NCAA in field goal percentage at 52.1 percent and ranked 18th in the NCAA at 80.5 points per game
- The Hawkeyes also lead the country with 422 assists and rank fourth in assist/turnover ratio at 1.6

- The Boilermakers "limited" Gustafson to 19 points and 13 rebounds at Mackey Arena before she fouled out with 1:43 left in regulation
- Senior Hannah Stewart and junior Kathleen Doyle bolster Gustafson's efforts, each averaging 12.4 points per game, as Stewart shoots 58.4 percent from the floor, while Doyle adds 5.7 assists per game
