- BOILER NOTES

THE OPENING TIP

- The Boilermakers play their lone exhibition prior to the 2019-20 season against Southern Indiana.
- Head coach Sharon Versyp returns for her 14th season at the helm of the Boilermakers.
- Purdue will open its 2019-20 campaign Sunday, Nov. 10, against Milwaukee.

A HISTORY OF TUNEUPS

- Purdue holds a 45-3 all-time record in exhibition games, including 40 straight wins.
- The Boilermakers are 15-0 in tuneups under Sharon Versyp and have a winning margin of 37.5 per contest.
- Last year, the Boilers downed Ashland 85-69, with Karissa McLaughlin leading the way with 29 points.
- Purdue's last loss in an exhibition came back on Nov. 29, 1992, against the Hoosier Lady Stars, 86-82.

BRING IT ALL BACK

- Purdue has plenty of depth entering the 2019-20 campaign with its entire starting lineup returning.
- The Boilermakers bring back 100% of their scoring, rebounding, blocks, assists and steals.
- It marks just the fourth time the entire starting lineup has returned since 1998.
- Jenelle Grant will get her first chance to play for Purdue after sitting out 2018-19 for NCAA transfer regulations.

ALL-CONFERENCE NODS

- For the second straight year, the Boilermakers placed a pair of players on the Preseason All-Big Ten teams.
- Karissa McLaughlin and Ae'Rianna Harris received the preseason honors from the coaches and media.
- Purdue was picked to finish fifth by the league's coaches, the first preseason poll appearance since 2012-13.
- Maryland was the only other Big Ten program to place two players on a preseason squad.

SPLASH SISTERS

- The 3-point corps of Karissa McLaughlin, Cassidy Hardin, Dominique Oden and Kayana Traylor are back.
- The quartet formed connected on a combined to hit 177 of Purdue's 194 3-pointers last season.
- Together, the group connected on 32.9% of its shots from outside.

- BOILER NOTES

BOILER BLOCK PARTY

- Ae’Rianna Harris opens the 2019-20 season as the NCAA active blocks leader, 42 ahead of Lauren Cox from Baylor, the next active DI player.
- The senior is on the verge of becoming the first player in Purdue history and fifth in Big Ten history to accumulate 300 rejections in a career.
- Harris broke the program record for blocks in 103 games, surpassing Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton’s mark of 281 rejections
- She is one-of-two players in Big Ten history to post at least two seasons with 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots (Amanda Zahui B., Minnesota).
- Due in large part to Harris, the Boilermakers finished last year ranked 13th in block shots with 176 and 17th in blocked shots per game at 5.2.

RI’S RECORD-BREAKING PACE

- The first player to surpass 700 rebounds in three years at Purdue, Harris is 157 boards shy of the school record of 968 set by Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton.
- The Indianapolis native became the 34th player in Purdue history to eclipse the 1,000-point mark and the 17th to hit the plateau during her junior season.
- Harris is on pace to be the first player in program history to join the 1,000-point, 1,000-rebound and 300-block club, as well as the second player in Big Ten history (Jessica Davenport, Ohio State, 2004-07)
- She also set Purdue’s single-game field goal percentage record against Purdue Fort Wayne on Nov. 18, 2018, hitting 10-of-10 from the field, becoming the 11th player in Big Ten history to go at least 10-for-10 in a game.

MCLAUGHLIN FROM DEEEEEEP

- In her first two years at Purdue, Karissa McLaughlin never shied away from a 3-point opportunity, setting the freshman and sophomore season records and tying the single-season mark of 88, set by Katie Gerald’s in 2006-07.
- The Fort Wayne native holds the Purdue record and ranks fifth in Big Ten history for 3-pointers by a player after her freshman and sophomore seasons with 163
- McLaughlin is a career 37.6% shooter from behind the arc, good for ninth in program history.
- She was the fifth Boilermaker to go 5-for-5 from downtown in a game, doing it against No. 21 Miami last year.
- The junior is 137 points shy of joining the 1,000-point club as the 35th member, the 18th to do it as a junior and 21st to do it in less than 100 career games.
- In 68 career games, McLaughlin has drained at least one 3-pointer in 60 games and two in 48 contests.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

- The 2019-20 roster has the highest amount of international players in program history with five.
- Three Canadians - Boudreau, Tamara Farquhar and Roxane Makolo - come from Quebec and Dawson College. The trio represent the only Canadians to play for Purdue.
- Fatou Diagne hails from Thies, Senegal, and Jenelle Grant calls London, England, home.
- Purdue has a total of eight international players in its history, five of whom are on this year’s team.

DROPPING DIMES

- The Boilermakers totaled 493 assists, just seven dimes shy of their 14th 500-assist campaign.
- Purdue assisted on 63% of its shots from last year (493-779)
- Karissa McLaughlin became the fifth player in program history to dish out at least 100 assists in her first two years, joining MaChelle Joseph, Stephanie White, Katie Douglas, FahKara Malone.
- McLaughlin is the fourth Boilermaker to lead the team is assists in both her freshman and sophomore campaigns.
- Kayana Traylor averaged 3.6 assists per game as a freshman, the fifth-best mark by a rookie at Purdue.

THREE-HEADED MONSTER

- Dominique Oden, Ae’Rianna Harris and Karissa McLaughlin have had the lion’s share of points over the last two seasons. The trio combined for 61% of the Boilermakers’ points during that span (2,675-of-4,405).
- All three players were named to an All-Big Ten team last year. (McLaughlin - First Team, Harris - Second Team, Oden Honorable Mention)
- Over the last two seasons, the trio were mainstays on the court, playing in every game, averaging more than 32 minutes per game, missing just six starts and fouling out a total of seven times.
- Despite not making the NCAA Tournament in 2018-19, McLaughlin ranked ninth in the nation in minutes played at 1,263:26.

REPRESENTING THEIR COUNTRIES

- Fatou Diagne was named to Senegal’s 2019 AfroBasket roster in August. The Thies, Senegal, native guided the Lionnes to championship game against Nigeria and runners-up honors.
- She averaged six points, and 7.4 rebounds per game during the tournament.
- Roxane Makolo traveled with the Boilermakers to Australia but did not play in a game.
- The Quebec native was tabbed to play for the U19 Canadian Junior National Team at the FIBA Women’s Basketball World Cup in Bangkok, Thailand, where her team finished eighth.
- Karissa McLaughlin received an invitation to the U.S. Pan American Games trials last May. Coach Versyp accompanied McLaughlin for part of the five-day experience, which allowed the two to develop a tighter bond and help the junior enhance her game against some of the best players in the nation.

STARTING YOUNG

- The Boilermakers return all-five starters from 2018-19 - Harris, Oden, McLaughlin, Traylor and Farquhar.
- Together, the quintet has 314 starts amongst them.
- In the 45-year history of Purdue women’s basketball, there have been 27 freshmen starters. The 2019-20 squad features four of them - Oden, Traylor, McLaughlin and Farquhar.
- As a player, Versyp was the 12th rookie starter and 1-of-10 four-year starters in program history.

THIS IS PURDUE BASKETBALL

- The 2019-20 season is the 45th campaign for women’s basketball at Purdue.
- The program holds an all-time record of 862-481 (.642)
- This will be the 39th season for Big Ten women’s basketball. Purdue has won a record nine Big Ten Conference Tournaments and seven regular season titles, including four outright - 1991, 1999, 2001 and 2002.
- Purdue has had 36 All-America selections by the Associated Press or WBCA in its history, with Ae’Rianna Harris as the most recent honoree in 2019 as an Honorable Mention All-American.



- BOILER NOTES**SCHEDULE NOTES**

- The Boilermakers will play nine games against 2019 NCAA Tournament teams, three of which were ranked at the end of the season.
- Purdue will face two opponents for the first time in 2019-20 in Chattanooga and Drake. The Mocs will be the Boilermakers' 200th different opponent.
- The Boilermakers will open Big Ten play on the road for the seventh time in the last eight seasons.

BOUNCE BACK CAMPAIGNS

- The Boilermakers are going for their first NCAA Tournament appearance since the 2016-17 campaign.
- Purdue has made a program-best nine NCAA Tournaments under Versyp, reaching the Elite Eight twice.
- Under Versyp, the Boilermakers have received a postseason bid in 12 of her 13 seasons, electing to forgo a WNIT appearance in 2018-19 due to mounting injuries at the end of the season.
- Purdue is tied for 10th in Division I history with 26 NCAA Tournament appearances (Notre Dame, LSU, Iowa).
- The Boilermakers have failed to win 20 games just seven times since 1986-87, and every time they bounced back with at least 20 victories the following season, including a trio of Elite Eight appearances.

BOILERS DOWN UNDER

- In August, the Boilermakers went on a 10-day tour of Australia, including four games against professionals.
- The thrilling tour featured excursions to the Melbourne Star Ferris Wheel, a crocodile park, a dive at the Great Barrier Reef, a tour of the Sydney Opera House and a climb on the Sydney Harbour Bridge.
- The squad had 10 extra practices and ample time to bond together prior to the start of the school year.
- The team flew more than 44 hours in the air and over 22,000 miles during the tour.

WHEEL RISE EVENT

- In September, junior Leony Boudreau joined together with Shelby Gruss, a PhD candidate in agronomy and the former captain of the U.S. Wheelchair Basketball team, to create the Wheel Rise Event.
- Boudreau planned and carried out an afternoon that featured the Illinois wheelchair basketball team playing an intrasquad scrimmage, lectures from distinguished professors and opportunities for women's basketball players to see what it was like on the court in wheelchairs. (Hint: Very Hard)

AN ALL-TIME GREAT ON THE SIDELINE

- Head coach Sharon Versyp is in her 14th season leading the Boilermakers.
- She holds the program record for overall and Big Ten wins and NCAA Tournament appearances
- Versyp was also a standout for the Boilermakers as a point guard from 1985-88, earning First Team All-Big Ten honors as a senior.

NEW FACES ON THE BENCH

- The Boilermakers had a handful of staff changes during the offseason.
- Melanie Balcomb, the all-time winningest coach at Vanderbilt, was named the senior associate head coach.
- Michael Scruggs joined the team as an assistant coach. He was a four-year practice player for Pat Summitt
- Former standout Alex Guyton returned to Purdue as the team's video coordinator and director of development.
- Jason Pullara was named the director of sports performance. He graduated from Purdue in 2001.
- Abby Abel made the transition to the staff as a graduate assistant after four years on the team.

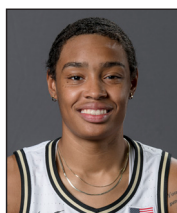
