BOILER NOTES

THE OPENING TIP

- Purdue returns to Mackey Arena on Sunday to square off with Western Illinois.
- The Boilermakers are 2-0 for the 27th time in program history after defeating Milwaukee and Chattanooga last week.
- Purdue's 2020 recruiting class was ranked No. 17 in the nation and fourth in the Big Ten by ESPN HoopGurlz.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Boilermakers picked up their first road win of the season at Chattanooga on Thursday, a 66-34 decision.
- Purdue jumped out front early and never looked back, outscoring the Mocs 41-14 over the first 20 minutes.
- The Mocs managed just two points in the second quarter, matching a Purdue record last accomplished on Dec. 31, 2016 against Wisconsin.
- Purdue shot 52.7% from the field, including a 66.6% clip in the first half.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

- Strong defense has always been a staple of a Sharon Versyp team, and the 2019-20 squad is nothing different, as Purdue held its first two opponents of the year under 60 points.
- The 34 points allowed against Chattanooga were the second-fewest points the Boilermakers have ever given up a true road game and fewest since Feb. 20, 1976 at Northwestern during the program's first season.
- The Boilermakers are ranked ninth in the nation and second in the Big Ten with 44.5 points against per game.
- Dating back to the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Boilermakers have held opponents under 60 points 68 times.

- Purdue found its rhythm from the field to start the year with a 50.5% shooting clip, good for 16th in the country and second in the Big Ten
- Against Chattanooga, Purdue shot 52.7% from the field, the best mark since Jan. 5, 2019 against Michigan.
- The Boilermakers have created and converted the easy shots, with 66 points in the paint through the opening two games.
- Defensively, the Boilermakers are 12th in the nation in field-goal percentage defense at 27.5%.

- BOILER NOTES

A HOT START

- The Boilermakers are 2-0 for the 27th time in program history
- with a chance to move to 3-0 for the 21st time.
- Under Versyp, Purdue has nine 3-0 starts.
- The best start in program history was a 10-0 record 1990-91.

TURNING DEFENSE TO OFFENSE

- One of the biggest points of emphasis during the offseason for Versyp was transition offense, and the Boilermakers have put
- Through two games, Purdue averaged 17 points off turnovers and 13.5 fast break points.
- Defensively, Purdue's active hands have forced an average of 16.5 turnovers per game.

WELCOMING WESTERN

- Purdue holds an 8-0 record against the Leathernecks.
- Aside from the series opener on Feb. 20, 1981, a five-point win, the Boilermakers have won the ensuing seven contests by at least 20 points.
- Purdue is 14-0 all-time against Summit League opposition.

MAKING A CONTRIBUTION

- Despite not pouring in points to start the season, Karissa McLaughlin has found other ways to contribute.
- The junior has dished out seven assists, good for second on the team behind Kayana Traylor.
- She also tops the team with 33 minutes per game.

150 AT MACKEY

- With the win against Milwaukee last Sunday, head coach Sharon Versyp became the first coach in program history to amass 150 wins at Mackey Arena as Purdue's leader.
- She reached the 150 mark for her career at Mackey last year, when taking into account her one season at Indiana.
- Versyp is the winningest coach in Purdue women's basketball history with 277 victories. She has led the Boilermakers to victory 344 times, when considering her 67 wins as a four-year starter at Purdue from 1985-1988.
- The Boilermakers have a 150-57 record at Mackey under Versyp.

HALL OF FAMER - SHEREKA WRIGHT

- On Tuesday, the Purdue Athletics unveiled its 2020 Hall of Fame class, featuring women's basketball star Shereka Wright, as well as men's basketball standout Robbie Hummel.
- Wright is the only three-time All-American at Purdue, the threetime All-Big Ten First Team selection amassed 2,251 points, 793 rebounds and 177 blocks.
- Wright made and attempted more free throws than any player in Big Ten Conference history, going 776 for 1,071 from the line.
- After a two-year career in the WNBA, Wright joined the college coaching ranks and currently serves as an associate head coach at Vanderbilt.

JOINING THE FAMILY

- On Wednesday, Purdue added a pair of standout recruits from Indiana on National Signing Day.
- Madison Layden, a 6-foot-1 guard from Kokomo, is a two-time state champion and regarded as one of the most versatile guards in the nation. She is a three-time All-State selection.
- Ra Shaya Kyle is an imposing 6-foot-6 post player from Marion. An All-State pick in 2019, Kyle is a five-star recruit and the No. 5 center in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz.
- The recruiting class was ranked No. 17 by ESPN HoopGurlz and the fourth in the Big Ten, marking head coach Sharon Versyp's 12 top-20 class in her 14 seasons at Purdue.

DOMINIQUE ODEN

- Dominique Oden is just the 15th player in program history to amass 100 starts in a career.
- The senior topped the 1,000-point mark as a junior, just the 33rd player to accomplish the feat before their senior campaign.
- Oden has been one of the top two-way players for the
 Boilermakers in recent memory, leading the team in scoring 32
 times and connecting on multiple 3-pointers in 53 career games,

while leading the team in steals 29 times.

 Her excellence exceeds the bounds of the court as a civil engineering major, with an intensive internship on campus, as well as community service focuses with Hunger Hike, Carry the Torch and Community Cancer Network.

A LOT OF FAMILIAR FACES

- Purdue got the gang back together in 2019-20. The entire starting lineup and bench production returned for the Boilermakers.
- The Boilermakers brought back 100% of their scoring, rebounding, blocks, assists and steals.
- The lone departures from last year's roster were Nora Kiesler and new graduate assistant Abby Abel.
- It marked just the fourth time the entire starting lineup has returned since 1998.
- Purdue was one-of-three Power 5 programs with 100% of its scoring back for 2019-20, joined by Boston College and Florida State

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000

- Karissa McLaughlin is 121 points shy of joining the 1,000-point club as the 35th member
- If/when she accomplishes the feat this year, she will be the 18th Boilermaker to do it as a junior and 21st to reach the mark in less than 100 career games, currently through 68.
- The junior posted the third most points by a sophomore in program history with 510 and the seventh most by a rookie with 353.

ALL-CONFERENCE NODS

- For the second straight year, the Boilermakers placed a pair of players on the Preseason All-Big Ten teams.
- Karissa McLaughlin and Ae'Rianna Harris received the preseason honors from the coaches and media.
- Purdue was picked to finish fifth by the league's coaches, the first preseason poll appearance since 2012-13.
- Maryland was the only other Big Ten program to place two players on a preseason squad.

SPLASH SISTERS

- The 3-point corps of Karissa McLaughlin, Cassidy Hardin, Dominique Oden and Kayana Traylor are back.
- Even though the Boilermakers rank outside the top 100 with 6.5 3-pointers per game this season, Purdue is sixth nationally with a 48.1% clip from behind the arc.
- The quartet formed connected on a combined to hit 177 of Purdue's 194 3-pointers last season.

BOILER BLOCK PARTY

- Ae'Rianna Harris is the 2019-20 season as the NCAA active blocks leader with 287 swats.
- Harris has blocked a shot in 78 of 106 career games.
- The senior is on the verge of becoming the first player in Purdue
- history and fifth in Big Ten history to accumulate 300 career rejections
 Harris broke the program record for blocks in 103 games,
- surpassing Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton's mark of 281 rejections
 She is one-of-two players in Big Ten history to post at least two seasons with 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots
- seasons with 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots (Amanda Zahui B., Minnesota).

 Due in large part to Harris, the Boilermakers finished last year
- ranked 13th in block shots with 176 and 17th in blocked shots per game at 5.2.

- BOILER NOTES

RI'S RECORD-BREAKING PACE

- The first player to surpass 700 rebounds in three years at Purdue, Harris is 147 boards shy of the school record of 968 set by Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton.
- The Indianapolis native became the 34th player in Purdue history to eclipse the 1,000-point mark and the 17th to hit the plateau during her junior season.
- Harris is on pace to be the first player in program history to join the 1,000-point, 1,000-rebound and 300-block club, as well as the second player in Big Ten history (Jessica Davenport, Ohio State, 2004-07)
- She also set Purdue's single-game field goal percentage record against Purdue Fort Wayne on Nov. 18, 2018, hitting 10-of-10 from the field, becoming the 11th player in Big Ten history to go at least 10-for-10 in a game.

MCLAUGHLIN FROM DEEEEEP

- In her first two years at Purdue, Karissa McLaughlin never shied away from a 3-point opportunity, setting the freshman and sophomore season records and tying the single-season mark of 88, set by Katie Geralds in 2006-07.
- The Fort Wayne native holds the Purdue record and ranks fifth in Big Ten history for 3-pointers by a player after her freshman and sophomore seasons with 163
- McLaughlin is a career 37.7% shooter from behind the arc, good for ninth in program history.
- She was the fifth Boilermaker to go 5-for-5 from downtown in a game, doing it against No. 21 Miami last year.
- In 70 career games, McLaughlin has drained at least one 3-pointer in 62 games and two in 50 contests.

DROPPING DIMES

- Purdue has assisted on 71% of its made field goals this season.
 The Boilermakers totaled 493 assists, just seven dimes shy of their 14th 500-assist campaign.
- Purdue assisted on 63% of its shots from last year (493-779)
- Karissa McLaughlin became the fifth player in program history to dish out at least 100 assists in her first two years, joining MaChelle Joseph, Stephanie White, Katie Douglas, FahKara Malone.
- McLaughlin is the fourth Boilermaker to lead the team is assists in both her freshman and sophomore campaigns.
- Kayana Traylor averaged 3.6 assists per game as a freshman, the fifth-best mark by a rookie at Purdue.

THREE-HEADED MONSTER

- Dominique Oden, Ae'Rianna Harris and Karissa McLaughlin have had the lion's share of points over the last two seasons. The trio combined for 61% of the Boilermakers' points during that span (2,675-of-4,405).
- All three players were named to an All-Big Ten team last year. (McLaughlin - First Team, Harris - Second Team, Oden Honorable Mention)
- Over the last two seasons, the trio were mainstays on the court, playing in every game, averaging more than 32 minutes per game, missing just six starts and fouling out a total of seven times.
- Despite not making the NCAA Tournament in 2018-19, McLaughlin ranked ninth in the nation in minutes played at 1.263:26.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

- The 2019-20 roster has the highest amount of international players in program history with five.
- Three Canadians Boudreau, Tamara Farquhar and Roxane Makolo - come from Quebec and Dawson College. The trio represent the only Canadians to play for Purdue.
- Fatou Diagne hails from Thies, Senegal, and Jenelle Grant calls London, England, home.
- Purdue has a total of eight international players in its history, five of whom are on this year's team.

THIS IS PURDUE BASKETBALL

- The 2019-20 season is the 45th campaign for women's basketball at Purdue.
- The program holds an all-time record of 862-481 (.642)
- This will be the 39th season for Big Ten women's basketball.
 Purdue has won a record nine Big Ten Conference Tournaments and seven regular season titles, including four outright 1991, 1999, 2001 and 2002.
- Purdue has had 36 All-America selections by the Associated Press or WBCA in its history, with Ae'Rianna Harris as the most recent honoree in 2019 as an Honorable Mention All-American.

BOUNCE BACK CAMPAIGNS

- The Boilermakers are going for their first NCAA Tournament appearance since the 2016-17 campaign.
- Purdue has made a program-best nine NCAA Tournaments under Versyp, reaching the Elite Eight twice.
- Under Versyp, the Boilermakers have received a postseason bid in 12 of her 13 season, electing to forgo a WNIT appearance in 2018-19 due to mounting injuries at the end of the season.
- Purdue is tied for 10th in Division I history with 26 NCAA Tournament appearances (Notre Dame, LSU, Iowa).
- The Boilermakers have failed to win 20 games just seven times since 1986-87, and every time they bounced back with at least 20 victories the following season, including a trio of Elite Eight appearances.

BOILERS DOWN UNDER

- In August, the Boilermakers went on a 10-day tour of Australia, including four games against professionals.
- The thrilling tour featured excursions to the Melbourne Star Ferris Wheel, a crocodile park, a dive at the Great Barrier Reef, a tour of the Sydney Opera House and a climb on the Sydney Harbour Bridge.
- The squad had 10 extra practices and ample time to bond together prior to the start of the school year.
- The team flew more than 44 hours in the air and over 22,000 miles during the tour.

WHEEL RISE EVENT

- In September, junior Leony Boudreau joined together with Shelby Gruss, a PhD candidate in agronomy and the former captain of the U.S. Wheelchair Basketball team, to create the Wheel Rise Event.
- Boudreau planned and carried out an afternoon that featured the Illinois wheelchair basketball team playing an intrasquad scrimmage, lectures from distinguished professors and opportunities for women's basketball players to see what it was like on the court in wheelchairs. (Hint: Very Hard)

AN ALL-TIME GREAT ON THE SIDELINE

- Head coach Sharon Versyp is in her 14th season leading Purdue.
- She holds the program record for overall and Big Ten wins and NCAA Tournament appearances
- Versyp was also a standout for the Boilermakers as a point guard from 1985-88, earning First Team All-Big Ten honors as a senior.

NEW FACES ON THE BENCH

- The Boilermakers had a handful of staff changes during the offseason.
- Melanie Balcomb, the all-time winningest coach at Vanderbilt, was named the senior associate head coach.
- Michael Scruggs joined the team as an assistant coach. He was a four-year practice player for Pat Summitt
- Former standout Alex Guyton returned to Purdue as the team's video coordinator and director of development.
- Jason Pullara was named the director of sports performance. He graduated from Purdue in 2001.
- Abby Abel made the transition to the staff as a graduate assistant after four years on the team.

BOILERMAKER BUILT

Purdue has five former standouts playing professionally overseas.
