BOILER NOTES

THE OPENING TIP

- The Boilermakers return to Mackey Arena after a four-game road swing to face Kent State on Sunday afternoon.
- · Purdue will close out the non-conference season with three of its final four games at Mackey Arena, with the lone road contest at No. 6 South Carolina on Dec. 15. The Old Gold and Black pushed the Gamecocks to double overtime at Mackey last season.
- The Boilermakers earned some recognition for their hot start by the Associated Press and the USA Today Coaches polls earlier this week, receiving votes for the first time this season.

LAST TIME OUT

- Purdue dropped its Big Ten/ACC Challenge matchup at Virginia Tech on Thursday night 67-54.
- Tamara Farquhar and Ae'Rianna Harris combined for 30 points, but the Boilermakers were outscored from the 3-point line 21-0, marking the second time in the last three games without a 3-pointer.
- Despite the loss to Virginia Tech, the Big Ten claimed its first series in the history of the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, a 9-5 decision.

3-POINT CHALLENGES

- After shooting 40% from behind the arc through the opening six games of the year, including a trio of games with nine makes, the Boilermakers have struggled to find their shot over the last three games, shooting just 10% (3-of-29) during that span.
- Karissa McLaughlin, Purdue's usual sharpshooter, leads the team with 12 3-pointers, despite a 25% shooting clip, including a 12% (2-for-16) mark over the last three games
- While Purdue's 32.4% 3-point field goal percentage ranks 133rd in the nation, the Boilermakers' defense has held opponents to just 25% shooting from the outside, which ranks 28th in the country and fourth in the Big Ten.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Purdue returns to Mackey Arena with a 3-0 record in home games this season.
- The Boilermakers have a 41.4% shooting clip and an average of 67.3 points per game at home, while opponents have shot just 34.3% from the field with 14.4 turnovers per game.
- Purdue has also dominated on the glass, outrebounding opponents by 11 per game.
- Dating back to 2016, Purdue is 24-6 in non-conference games at Mackey Arena.

- BOILER NOTES LEADERS BY EXAMPLE

- The Boilermakers have had effective leadership by their
- upperclassmen this season by their on-court performances. Dominique Oden leads the team in scoring with 12.5 points per game, touching double figures in all but two contests.
- Ae'Rianna Harris continues to defend the paint with 24 rejections on the year and nearly averaging a double-double of 11.1 points and 9.1 rebounds per game, good for second in the league.
- Karissa McLaughlin, while she's yet to find her shooting touch, the junior is averaging 8.8 points and a team-high 34 minutes of action per game.
- Tamara Farquhar has been a steady presence on the boards with eight rebounds per game, sixth in the Big Ten.

- Ae'Rianna Harris ranks third in Purdue history (men and women) in career blocks, quickly chasing down A.J. Hammons (343, 2013-16) and Joe Barry Carrol (349, 1977-80).
- Harris became just the fifth student in Big Ten history to record 300 career blocked shots. Harris, joined an elite group that also includes MSU's Allyssa DeHaan (2007-10), OSU's Jessica Davenport (2004-07), Michigan's Trish Andrew (1990-93) and Northwestern's Amy Jaeschke (2008-11).
- Harris has blocked a shot in 84 of 111 career games.
- Harris broke the program record for blocks in 103 games, surpassing Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton's mark of 281 rejections
- She is one-of-two players in Big Ten history to post at least two seasons with 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots.
- Harris is on pace to be the first player in program history to join the 1,000-point, 1,000-rebound and 300-block club, as well as the second player in Big Ten history.
- · Ae'Rianna Harris entered the 2019-20 season as the NCAA active blocks leader.

VS. KENT STATE

- Purdue will face Kent State for the first time since 1990, with the all-time series tied at 2-2.
- The last matchup between the two clubs was a 129-81 Purdue win. The 129 points set the Big Ten record for most points in a game and the most points in a half in Purdue's history with 68. The 32 assists by the Boilermakers were the most in program history, surpassed only by a 34-dime outing against Purdue Fort Wayne in

RI-BOUNDS (YES...KNOWINGLY USED THE SAME NICKNAME STYLE TWICE)

- The first player to surpass 700 rebounds in three years at Purdue, Ae'Rianna Harris Harris is 84 boards shy of the school record of 968 set by Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton.
- She is currently third in program history with 884 rebounds, passing Stacey Lovelace during the game against Gonzaga.
- Harris' 73 boards this season lead the Big Ten.

400 FOR COACH V

- Sharon Versyp will join the 400-win club with her next victory.
- The Purdue alumna has made three head coaching stops in her career, winning 98 games at Maine, 19 at Indiana and 282 at Purdue.
- Versyp's career winning percentage is 75.7%.

KEEPING THE PEDAL DOWN

- Purdue held the least for at least 38 minutes in their first three games of the year and is averaging a lead time of 32:24 per game in winning efforts.
- Much of the early leads can be attributed to outscoring opponents 281-201 in the first half, including an average of 18.6 points in the first quarter, the highest-scoring quarter for the Boilermakers this season.
- The second half has seen opponents find their rhythm on offense, as the Boilermakers been outscored by a margin of +0.7 points over the final 20 minutes of a game, with just 14 points per

NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER (THOUGHT OF THE CAR COMMERCIAL DIDN'T YOU)

- Purdue was 6-0 for the sixth time in school history, matching the best start in the Versyp era.
- The 6-0 start tied matched the best month of November in program history, tying 2011-12.
- Dominique Oden averaged 14.2 points per game, while Ae'Rianna Harris was just .7 rebounds away from averaging a double-double to start the year.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

- Purdue is 17th in the nation in blocked shots per game with 5.6.
- The Boilermakers are 29th in the nation and fifth in the Big Ten in scoring defense at 55 points allowed per game
- The Old Gold and Black has allowed just 9.8 second-chance points per game, thanks to 27.2 defensive rebounds per game.

DROPPING DIMES

- Purdue has assisted on 60.9% (112-184) of its made field goals.
- After a career-high nine assists against Northern Illinois, Kayana Traylor took the team lead with 31 dimes.
- Purdue assisted on 63% of its shots from last year (493-779)
- McLaughlin is the fourth player in at Purdue with at least 100 assists and lead the team in helpers as freshman and sophomore.

DEFENSIVE FOCUS

- Strong defense has always been a staple of a Sharon Versyp team, and the 2019-20 squad is nothing different, as Purdue has held five opponents of the year under 60 points.
- The 34 points allowed against Chattanooga were the secondfewest points the Boilermakers have ever given up a true road game and fewest since Feb. 20, 1976 at Northwestern during the program's first season.
- Dating back to the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Boilermakers have held opponents under 62 points 71 times
- In Purdue's history of 1,349 games, the Boilermakers have held an opponent under 60 points in 557 contests (41.2%).

MAKING SHOTS

- Purdue sits ninth in the Big Ten with a shooting clip of 42.4%, shooting above 40% in five games this season.
- Against Chattanooga, Purdue shot 52.7% from the field, the best mark since Jan. 5, 2019 against Michigan.
- The Boilermakers have created and converted the easy shots, with an average of 29 points in the paint.
- Opponents, meanwhile, have averaged just 32.5% from the field and 25% from behind the arc against the Boilermakers, which ranks 13th and 28th, respectively.

TURNING DEFENSE TO OFFENSE

- One of the biggest points of emphasis during the offseason for Versyp was transition offense.
- Purdue is averaging 15.5 points off turnovers.
- Purdue's active hands have forced an average of 14.4 turnovers.
- On the flip side, the Boilermakers are giving up 16.1 points off turnovers per game due to an average of 17.8 giveaways per

BOILER BLOCK PARTY

- The Boilermakers rank 17th in the nation in shots blocked per game with 5.6 per contest.
- Ae'Rianna Harris has 24 rejections on the year, which is second in the Big Ten and ninth in the nation.
- Her 3.00 blocks per game is second in the conference and tenth in the league.

TOWERING TERRORS

- Harris and Tamara Farquhar have been a potent pair in the paint since the latter's freshman season in 2017-18.
- Since that time, the duo accounted for more than 1,100 boards.
- The tandem is averaging 17.1 rebounds per game this season.
- · Harris ranks second in program history with 7.8 rebounds per game, while Farquhar has 6.4 to rank 11th.
- On the offensive end, Harris is a career 50% shooter from the field with more than 1,100 points. Farquhar has seen her offensive production tick upward significantly each season – 4.6 ppg in 2017-18, 6.7 ppg in 2018-19 and 8.0 ppg in 2019-20.

NIQUES NICE TOUCH

- Dominique Oden leads the team with 12.5 points per game, including and a 42.9% 3-point mark.
- She is just the 15th player in program history to amass 100 starts in a career, hitting the mark earlier this season.
- The senior topped the 1,000-point mark as a junior, just the 33rd player to accomplish the feat before their senior campaign.
- She is 42 points from being the 15th player in program history to join the 1,500-point club.
- Her excellence exceeds the bounds of the court as a civil engineering major, with an intensive internship on campus, as well as community service focuses with Hunger Hike, Carry the Torch and Community Cancer Network.

KARISSA COUNTDOWN

- Still trying to find her shooting touch in 2019-20, Karissa McLaughlin has hit double digits in just three games this year.
- The native of Fort Wayne is 67 points shy of joining the 1,000-point club as the 35th member
- If/when she accomplishes the feat this year, she will be the 18th Boilermaker to do it as a junior and 21st to reach the mark in less than 100 career games, currently through 76.
- The junior posted the third most points by a sophomore in program history with 510 and the seventh most by a rookie with 353.

MCLAUGHLIN FROM DEEEEEP

- Karissa McLaughlin leads the team with 12 3-pointers on the year.
 The loss to Virginia Tech marked just the 11th time in her career that she failed to convert a shot from the outside.
- In her first two years at Purdue, she never shied away from a 3-point opportunity, setting the freshman and sophomore season records and tying the single-season mark of 88, set by Katie Geralds in 2006-07.
- McLaughlin is a career 36.6% shooter from behind the arc, good for ninth in program history.
- In 76 career games, McLaughlin has drained at least one 3-pointer in 65 games and two in 53 contests.

- Kayana Traylor holds the team lead in assists with 31 dimes. She ranks 130th in the nation and 10th in the Big Ten with four assists per game.
- The sophomore is shooting 38.9% from long range this season on seven makes, the third most on the team.
- The native of Martinsville, is fourth on the team with 8.9 points per game.
- Traylor was the seventh freshman in program history to dish out more than 100 assists.

HEY

- Jenelle Grant mad her long-awaited debut for the Boilermakers against Northern Illinois.
- The redshirt junior dropped a season-high six points, including her first for Purdue against Drake.
- She connected on her first triple as a Boilermaker against Gonzaga.
- The London native played two seasons at the University of the Pacific, before sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer regulations.

ALL-CONFERENCE NODS

- For the second straight year, the Boilermakers placed a pair of players on the Preseason All-Big Ten teams.
- Karissa McLaughlin and Ae'Rianna Harris received the preseason honors from the coaches and media.
- Purdue was picked to finish fifth by the league's coaches, the first preseason poll appearance since 2012-13.
- Maryland was the only other Big Ten program to place two players on a preseason squad.

THIS IS PURDUE BASKETBALL

- The 2019-20 season is the 45th campaign for women's basketball at Purdue
- The program holds an all-time record of 862-481 (.642)
- This will be the 39th season for Big Ten women's basketball.
 Purdue has won a record nine Big Ten Conference Tournaments and seven regular season titles, including four outright 1991, 1999, 2001 and 2002.
- Purdue has had 36 All-America selections by the Associated Press or WBCA in its history, with Ae'Rianna Harris as the most recent honoree in 2019 as an Honorable Mention All-American.

BOUNCE BACK CAMPAIGNS

- The Boilermakers are going for their first NCAA Tournament appearance since the 2016-17 campaign.
- Purdue has made a program-best nine NCAA Tournaments under Versyp, reaching the Elite Eight twice.
- Under Versyp, the Boilermakers have received a postseason bid in 12 of her 13 season, electing to forgo a WNIT appearance in 2018-19 due to mounting injuries at the end of the season.
- Purdue is tied for 10th in Division I history with 26 NCAA Tournament appearances (Notre Dame, LSU, Iowa).
- The Boilermakers have failed to win 20 games just seven times since 1986-87, and every time they bounced back with at least 20 victories the following season, including a trio of Elite Eight appearances.

BOILERS DOWN UNDER

- In August, the Boilermakers went on a 10-day tour of Australia, including four games against professionals.
- The thrilling tour featured excursions to the Melbourne Star Ferris Wheel, a crocodile park, a dive at the Great Barrier Reef, a tour of the Sydney Opera House and a climb on the Sydney Harbour Bridge.
- The squad had 10 extra practices and ample time to bond together prior to the start of the school year.
- The team flew more than 44 hours in the air and over 22,000 miles during the tour.

WHEEL RISE EVENT

- In September, junior Leony Boudreau joined together with Shelby Gruss, a PhD candidate in agronomy and the former captain of the U.S. Wheelchair Basketball team, to create the Wheel Rise Event.
- Boudreau planned and carried out an afternoon that featured the Illinois wheelchair basketball team playing an intrasquad scrimmage, lectures from distinguished professors and opportunities for women's basketball players to see what it was like on the court in wheelchairs. (Hint: Very Hard)

AN ALL-TIME GREAT ON THE SIDELINE

- Head coach Sharon Versyp is in her 14th season leading Purdue.
- She holds the program record for overall and Big Ten wins and NCAA Tournament appearances
- Versyp was also a standout for the Boilermakers as a point guard from 1985-88, earning First Team All-Big Ten honors as a senior.

NEW FACES ON THE BENCH

- The Boilermakers had a handful of staff changes during the offseason.

- BOILER NOTES

150 AT MACKEY

- Sharon Versyp is third in Mackey Arena history with 151 wins, behind Gene Keady's 294 and Matt Painter's 203 victories.
- The Boilermakers have a 152-57 record at Mackey under Versyp.
- With the win against Milwaukee earlier this season, she became the first coach in program history to amass 150 wins at Mackey.
- Versyp is the winningest coach in Purdue women's basketball history with 280 victories. She has led the Boilermakers to victory 347 times, when considering her 67 wins as a four-year starter at Purdue from 1985-1988.

JOINING THE FAMILY

- On Wednesday, Purdue added a pair of standout recruits from Indiana on National Signing Day.
- Madison Layden, a 6-foot-1 guard from Kokomo, is a two-time state champion and regarded as one of the most versatile guards in the nation. She is a three-time All-State selection.
- Ra Shaya Kyle is an imposing 6-foot-6 post player from Marion. An All-State pick in 2019, Kyle is a five-star recruit and the No. 5 center in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz.
- The recruiting class was ranked No. 17 by ESPN HoopGurlz and the fourth in the Big Ten, marking head coach Sharon Versyp's 12 top-20 class in her 14 seasons at Purdue.

HALL OF FAMER - SHEREKA WRIGHT

- On Tuesday, the Purdue Athletics unveiled its 2020 Hall of Fame class, featuring women's basketball star Shereka Wright, as well as men's basketball standout Robbie Hummel.
- Wright is the only three-time All-American at Purdue, the threetime All-Big Ten First Team selection amassed 2,251 points, 793 rebounds and 177 blocks.
- Wright made and attempted more free throws than any player in Big Ten Conference history, going 776 for 1,071 from the line.
- After a two-year career in the WNBA, Wright joined the college coaching ranks and currently serves as an associate head coach at Vanderbilt.

THREE-HEADED MONSTER

- Dominique Oden, Ae'Rianna Harris and Karissa McLaughlin have had the lion's share of points over the last two seasons. The trio combined for 61% of the Boilermakers' points during that span (2.675-of-4.405).
- All three players were named to an All-Big Ten team last year.
 (McLaughlin First Team, Harris Second Team, Oden Honorable Mention)
- Over the last two seasons, the trio were mainstays on the court, playing in every game, averaging more than 32 minutes per game, missing just six starts and fouling out a total of seven times.
- Despite not making the NCAA Tournament in 2018-19, McLaughlin ranked ninth in the nation in minutes played at 1,263:26.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

- The 2019-20 roster has the highest amount of international players in program history with five.
- Three Canadians Boudreau, Tamara Farquhar and Roxane Makolo come from Quebec and Dawson College. The trio represent the only Canadians to play for Purdue.
- Fatou Diagne hails from Thies, Senegal, and Jenelle Grant calls London, England, home.
- Purdue has a total of eight international players in its history, five of whom are on this year's team.

STARTING YOUNG

- The Boilermakers returned all-five starters from 2018-19 Harris, Oden, McLaughlin, Traylor and Farquhar.
- Together, the guintet has 358 starts amongst them.
- In the 45-year history of Purdue women's basketball, there have been 27 freshmen starters. The 2019-20 squad features four of them Oden, Traylor, McLaughlin and Farquhar.
- As a player, Versyp was the 12th rookie starter and 1-of-10 fouryear starters in program history.
- Purdue was one-of-three Power 5 programs with 100% of its scoring back for 2019-20, joined by Boston College and Florida State

REPRESENTING THEIR COUNTRIES

- Fatou Diagne was named to Senegal's 2019 AfroBasket roster in August. The Thies, Senegal, native guided the Lionnes to championship game against Nigeria and runners-up honors.
- She averaged six points, and 7.4 rebounds per game during the tournament.
- Roxane Makolo traveled with the Boilermakers to Australia but did not play in a game.
- The Quebec native was tabbed to play for the U19 Canadian Junior National Team at the FIBA Women's Basketball World Cup in Bangkok, Thailand, where her team finished eighth.
- Karissa McLaughlin received an invitation to the U.S. Pan American Games trials last May. Coach Versyp accompanied McLaughlin for part of the five-day experience, which allowed the two to develop a tighter bond and help the junior enhance her game against some of the best players in the nation.

HOPE FOR THE FUTURE

- On Saturday, the Boilermakers took part in the Hope on the Horizon Festival of Trees, hosted by the Community Cancer Network.
- The event brought leaders throughout the community together to honor those who have battled cancer in their lives, as well as raising funds for cancer research and treatment through a live auction of theme-decorated Christmas trees.
- The gala raised more than \$150,000 to help cancer patients in Lafayette, West Lafayette and other communities around the state.
- The Boilermakers also assist in the annual West Lafayette/ Lafayette Hunger Hike, which raises funds and takes in donations to help ensure that poverty-stricken children in the local communities do not go hungry.


