– AROUND THE HORN –

• Purdue's tough early-season slate continues vs. another 40-win team from 2018. Texas is the Boilermakers' first opponent to play in the College World Series the previous season since Louisville in 2015 and first weekend opponent since Indiana in 2014.

• Purdue held at least a two-run lead in all three games at Southern Miss, but got swept after being outscored 20-4 from the sixth through 10th innings. The Boilermakers enjoyed a 11-7 scoring edge in innings one through five. The bullpen allowed 9 of 14 inherited runners to score. The starting pitchers all left the mound with Purdue leading or the game tied, surrendering only two extra-base hits and four walks over 13 2/3 innings.

• Purdue's pre-conference schedule is definitely its most challenging since 2014 (Tennessee, Rice, LSU, San Diego State). The first five weekend opponents – Southern Miss, Texas, Oral Roberts, Creighton and Jacksonville State – all won 30-plus games and were a combined 190-102 in 2018.

• Skyler Hunter, Ben Nisle and Zac Fascia represented Purdue on the Big Ten preseason honors list. The Boilermakers were picked sixth in the preseason poll.

- In just 34 appearances as an underclassman, all but one in relief, registered 7 wins and 6 saves; lone career start was 2017 regular-season finale at Minnesota.
- Surrendered only 6.59 hits per 9 innings during his career, which will rank fourth in program history with 4 more innings to hit 75 career innings mark to qualify.
- Pitched 12 consecutive scoreless innings over his final six appearances of 2018, posting a streak of 12 straight scoreless frames for the second year in a row.
- Matched a Purdue single-season record by winning all five of his decisions in 2018.
- Led the way on the mound in the NCAA Tournament win vs. North Carolina A&T, working 4 scoreless frames.
- Surrendered only one extra-base hit in 13 innings in Big Ten play as a sophomore.
- Worked 3 2/3 innings of two-hit relief over 2 appearances at Big Ten Tournament.
- Pitched two innings of scoreless relief in Big Ten wins at Penn State and Maryland
- After a rocky 2018 season debut the first weekend of March, worked 8 1/3 innings of two-hit relief over his next 6 appearances.
- Established a Purdue freshman record with 6 saves, eclipsing a benchmark that had stood since 1993.
- Worked five innings of scoreless one-hit relief in his collegiate debut to earn the win in game two at Texas State; pitched 12 consecutive scoreless innings over his first four appearances to the begin college career.
- Two-way standout was a two-time all-state honoree near Champaign-Urbana.
- Champaign News-Gazette and WCIA-TV Player of the Year as a senior after compiling a 10-1 record with a 0.58 ERA in 68 1/3 innings on the mound and a .367 batting average at the plate, helped SJO finish as the IHSA class 2A state runner-up.
- Went 11-0 with a 0.28 ERA in 63 1/3 innings pitched as a junior, earning first team all-conference and all-area honors.

- Pitched very well at Alexander Field, compiling a 1.91 ERA and .222 batting average against in 33 innings. Also had 29 strikeouts vs. 10 walks at home.
- Matched his season-high with 7 strikeouts vs. Michigan in the home finale.
- Led Purdue to a big non-conference win vs. Indiana in midweek play that was live on ESPN, working 5 2/3 innings of three-run ball.
- Earned the win in the finale of the Northwestern series with 4 1/3 innings of two-hit scoreless relief, his most-effective relief appearance of 2018.
- Gave Purdue a quality start (6 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 3 K) in the midweek game vs. Ball State.
- His 0.84 ERA was the best in all of NJCAA Division I through the end of the 2017 regular season at College of Southern Idaho.
- Region 18 Pitcher of the Year and first team all-conference honoree.
- Finished the season 6-3 with a 1.04 ERA and .177 batting average against, recording 68 strikeouts in 69 1/3 innings pitched.
- Was a two-way player as a freshman, pitching 75 innings and finishing the year 9-for-28 with 6 RBI at the plate.
- Struck out 11 in the Region 18 Tournament in consecutive years, winning his start with a nine-inning complete game in 2016.
- Scholastic student-athlete of the year as a senior and a two-time all-state pitcher at Rocky Mountain High School. Already inducted into RMHS Hall of Fame.
- Family has roots in Georgia. Full name is Ryan Kixx Beard. He's named after former big leaguer Ryan Klesko and Kix Brooks of Brooks & Dunn.

HEAD COACH MARK WASIKOWSKI

Mark Wasikowski, an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the Universities of Oregon, Arizona, Florida as well as Southeast Missouri State during his career, was hired as the head coach of Purdue baseball in June 2016.

Wasikowski has played and coached in the College World Series. He helped lead teams to 14 NCAA Tournament appearances during a successful 20-year run as an assistant coach. He also won an NCAA championship as the starting third baseman and a captain on Pepperdine's 1992 College World Series team.

Wasikowski (pronounced WOZ-uh-COW-ski) played for and worked under three-time national Coach of the Year Andy Lopez for a combined 18 years. He was part of Lopez's coaching staffs at both Florida (1999-2001) and Arizona (2002-11) before joining George Horton's staff at Oregon in the summer of 2011, spending five seasons with Horton in Eugene. Wasikowski was an assistant coach on Arizona's 2004 College World Series team, the same year that Horton led Cal State Fullerton to the national title.

Wasikowski garnered coach of the year consideration in 2018 after leading Purdue to 38 wins and runner-up finishes in both the Big Ten standings and at the Big Ten Tournament. The Boilermakers went 21-2 from April 20 to May 26 to qualify for an NCAA Regional. Wasikowski's team won 13 consecutive games overall (April 20-May 9) and at home (April 24-May 19) during the late-season surge, both streaks tying single-season program records. Purdue earned the No. 2 seed in the Chapel Hill Regional and held the lead at one point in all three of its NCAA Tournament games.

Wasikowski's arrival spearheaded one of the most successful two-year turnarounds in the history of Purdue Athletics. The Boilermakers went from 10-44 and 2-22 in Big Ten play during the 2016 season to 38-21 and 17-6 in the Big Ten in 2018, just his second year.

Wasikowski led the Boilermakers to a 19-win improvement in his first season. It ranked as the greatest turnaround in program history and tops nationally entering the week of the conference tournaments around the country. Purdue returned to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2012 after winning 10 more games in league play. Wasikowski's team joined the 2007 Boilermakers as the only Big Ten teams since 1988 to post a 10-win improvement in conference play.

The 2017 Boilermakers won seven weekend series after having only six such successful weekends from 2013 to 2016. Purdue was 8-3 in one-run games after having a 2-13 record in similar contests the year before. The Boilermakers' 18 true road wins were tied with Minnesota for the most in the Big Ten.

Wasikowski has coached 130 players that have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, a list highlighted by 33 big leaguers. During his 10 seasons at Arizona, Wasikowski coached 59 Major League Baseball draft picks and 22 future big leaguers. As the recruiting coordinator, he assembled the Wildcats' 2012 national championship team, leaving for Oregon before the start of the 2011-12 school year.

Wasikowski was a two-time All-West Coast Conference honoree at Pepperdine after spending his first two collegiate seasons at Hawaii and Rancho Santiago Junior College. He was selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 1993 MLB Draft, but opted to remain at Pepperdine to finish his bachelor's degree in business administration while serving as a student assistant under Lopez during the 1994 season.

Wasikowski was inducted into the Pepperdine Athletics Hall of Fame along with all of his teammates from the 1992 national championship team. He led the Waves in doubles as a junior and hits as a senior, guiding Pepperdine back to the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

As a player, I left Arizona much better than when I arrived. He was very good at the mental part of the game and pushing us to get to places we didn't know we could go. I still talk to Waz about once every three months. He is very loyal, and I would trust his character to run my program."

QUITE THE TURNAROUND

• The Boilermakers' 19-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 was tops nationally. Purdue took the next step in year 2 under head coach **Mark Wasikowski**, finishing second in the Big Ten and earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for just the second time in program history. The 28-win turnaround over two years, from 10-44 to 38-21, is one of the most impressive in the history of Purdue Athletics.

• The Boilermakers had the best record (172-110, 75-51 B1G) in the Big Ten from 2008 to 2012, but fell on hard times following their program-record 45-win Big Ten championship season. Coach Waz has the program trending upwards again. The 2018 senior class more than doubled its win total (67-48, .583) from its underclassman seasons (30-78, .278).

2018 INDIVIDUAL & TEAM NOTABLES

• **Feb. 17 to March 11** – **Skyler Hunter** hits safely in the first 13 games of the season, Purdue's longest hit streak of the year and the longest by a Boilermaker since 2011.

• **Feb. 23** – Purdue defeats Saint Louis and Incarnate Word at the Alamo Irish Classic to open a season 5-0 for the first time since 1991. The Boilermakers rally for a walk-off win vs. UIW after being down by a run with two outs and the bases empty in the ninth inning. It marked the first time since the opening day of the 2012 season Purdue defeated two different teams in one day. **Bo Hofstra** retires all 11 batters to come to the plate against him to close out the SLU victory en route to retiring 18 straight to begin his college career.

• **Feb. 25** – Down by four entering the ninth inning, the Boilermakers rally for five in the frame to defeat No. 30 Notre Dame 8-7 and win the Alamo Irish Classic. It was Purdue's largest last at-bat rally since a May 2012 win at No. 14 UCLA. The Boilermakers also ended a 41-game losing streak against nationally ranked opponents, which also dated back to 2012.

• **March 31** – Purdue wins both ends of a doubleheader at Penn State to sweep its conference-opening series for the first time since 1985. The Boilermakers swept a Big Ten doubleheader for the first time since 2012 and did it on the road for the first time since May 2005. **Trent Johnson** works five innings of one-hit ball in his Big Ten debut.

• **April 6** – Purdue wins its series opener at No. 10 Indiana for its six straight victory, opening Big Ten play at 4-0 for the first time since 1985. It was the Boilermakers' first win vs. a team ranked among the top 10 nationally since March 2006 and their first win in Bloomington since 2010.

• **April 10 to May 27** – **Skyler Hunter** reaches base safely in 24 consecutive games, the longest career run for any Boilermaker active in 2018. It was the longest streak by a Purdue player since 2014.

• **April 14** – **Ben Nisle** homers twice in the Big Ten home opener vs. Minnesota, posting only the third multi-home run game by a Purdue player at Alexander Field. Overall, it was the first multi-homer game by a Boilermaker since March 2016.

• **April 17** – Purdue scores two in the top of the 10th to defeat Indiana State 3-1, winning an extra-innings game on the road for the first time since April 2014.

• **April 22** – Purdue scores five in the seventh inning to rally for an 8-6 victory to sweep the series at Maryland. The Boilermakers would not trail for 50 consecutive innings through the second inning of their May 4 win vs. Northwestern, posting a 50-inning streak for the second year in a row.

• **April 25** – Before the ESPN-televised win vs. Indiana, Landyn Griffith and his family is recognized

on the field. An 11-year-old ball player from Lafayette diagnosed with cancer in January, #TeamLandyn becomes a rallying point for the remainder of the season. The Boilermakers learn two days later that Landyn passed away. His Junior Bronchos jersey hangs in the dugout for every game the rest of the season.

• **April 27 to 29** – Purdue holds the lead for 26 of the 27 innings in a series sweep of Rutgers, riding an eight-game win streak into final exams week on campus.

• **May 4** – **Bryce Bonner's** pinch-hit, game-tying single highlights a three-run eighth inning as Purdue rallies to defeat Northwestern 8-7 in the series opener.

• **May 8** – The Boilermakers complete a sweep of their nine-game homestand with a 27-3 thrashing of Purdue Fort Wayne, matching their highest run total this century. Purdue draws 15 walks, its most since at least the start of the 2005 campaign.

• **May 9** – Harry Shipley's inside-the-park home run in the ninth inning ties the game up at 8-8 and **Ben Nisle** delivers a two-run, go-ahead single later in the frame. The Boilermakers rally for a 10-8 victory at Ball State to extend their win streak to 13.

• **May 19** – Purdue records 30 outs vs. Michigan to complete its first series sweep of U-M since 1993, clinching second place in the Big Ten standings. Ross Learnard goes through the top of the lineup to finish off game 2 of the series after it was suspended due to rain in the eighth inning Friday. **Owen Jansen's** two-run double was the difference in the 2-1 series finale. The Boilermakers win their final 13 games at home, building what will rank as the third-longest active home win streak in the country entering 2019.

• **May 24** – With the game tied 4-4 in the ninth inning, **Milo Beam** draws a one-out walk in his first plate appearance of the Big Ten Tournament. He then reaches third base before the next batter even comes to the plate. The Wolverines walk the bases loaded and Evan Warden delivers a game-winning single up the middle to give the Boilermakers their first walk-off win at the Big Ten Tournament since 2005.

• **May 25** – Purdue overcomes an early 4-1 deficit to defeat Illinois in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals. The Boilermakers outscore the Illini 10-1 over the final six innings thanks to a pair of four-run frames, advancing to the Big Ten Tournament title game for the first time since 2012.

• **May 26** – Purdue holds leads of 1-0, 3-2 and 4-3 but Minnesota scores the game's final three runs to take the championship game of the Big Ten Tournament. A program-record six Boilermakers represent the program on the Big Ten All-Tournament Team.

• **June 2** – After a sluggish start, the Boilermakers score 12 unanswered runs to defeat North Carolina A&T 14-4 at an NCAA Regional in Chapel Hill. **Dalton Parker** works four scoreless innings of relief to finish his sophomore season having pitched 12 consecutive scoreless frames. Purdue posts just its second NCAA Tournament win in program history.

• **June 3** – Jacson McGowan and **Ben Nisle** connect for consecutive home runs in the fifth inning, the first set of back-to-back jacks for the Boilermakers since April 2010. But Houston scores eight unanswered runs to rally past Purdue for the second time at the Chapel Hill Regional. The Boilermakers finish their season at 38-21, posting the second most wins in program history. They finish the season winners of 22 of their final 27 games.
