#BOILERNOTES

Monday is the final regular season home game of the year for the Boilermakers, set to host No. 8 Maryland at Mackey Arena. Purdue owns a 13-3 record at home in 2018-19, tied for seventh-most home victories in program history and one shy of moving into a tie for fourth-most ever in Mackey Arena. The Boilermakers last won at least 14 games at home in 2010-11, and their 13 victories in tow are their most since 2011-12.

The Boilermakers continue to jockey for their final seed in the rapidly approaching Big Ten Tournament, still able to finish between the No. 5 and the No. 11 seed in Indianapolis. They entered the weekend tied for sixth with Minnesota, Northwestern and Nebraska, just one game behind Ohio State, a half-game ahead of Michigan State and a game ahead of Indiana.

Meanwhile Maryland has taken over the top spot in the Big Ten standings after a furious, come-from-behind win over Minnesota on Thursday, in which the Terps scored nine points in the final 50 seconds to edge the Gophers 71-69 at the Xfinity Center. They take a one-game lead over Iowa, who slipped up at Indiana on Thursday and play at Nebraska later Monday evening.

TEAM NOTES

- Purdue is in its 44th season of women's basketball, holding an 860-478 all-time record and a 401-225 mark in its 37th season of conference play, becoming just the third Big Ten school to hit the 400-win mark
- The Boilermakers rank ninth in the NCAA and lead the Big Ten in average attendance at 6,546 fans per game, looking to finish in the top-10 in the country for the 24th straight season
- With 5.4 blocked shots per game Purdue leads the conference and is 14th in the country, and ranks fifth in the nation with 156 total rejections
- Purdue has now hit 12 3's in two games this season, matching the No. 7 single-game mark in program history with 12-of-18 vs. Miami and 12-of-20 against Northwestern
- Purdue is team in the conference with three top-15 scorers as McLaughlin is sixth at 15.9 points per game, Oden is 10th at 14.8 points per game, and Harris is tied for 14th at 13.0 points per game
- The trio also ranks in the top-12 of the conference in field goal percentage as Harris is seventh (.493), Oden is 10th (.435) and McLaughlin is 11th (.428)
- The Boilermakers' season-opening win at Ball State was the fifth-largest road win in program history and the biggest since a 43-point win at Butler in 2006
- Purdue had 16 steals against Ball State, its most since Nov. 28, 2012 vs. Georgia Tech in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge
- Purdue blocked 12 shots at Ohio, tying for the third-most in a game in program history and the most since 2014
- With Ae'rianna Harris and Dominique Oden earning Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media, Purdue is one-of-two schools to have two players on both teams (Iowa)

LAST TIME OUT

- The Boilermakers fell on the road at Penn State on Thursday 72-61, shooting only 38.9 percent from the floor, while the Lady Lions hit on 50 percent, including 7-of-16 from 3-point range
- Penn State scored a combined 31 points off of turnovers and offensive rebounds

HEAD COACH SHARON VERSYP

- In her 13th season on the Boilermaker sidelines, Versyp now has the longest tenure of any coach in program history
- She is the winningest coach in program history, owning 274 victories at Purdue
- Has nine 20-win campaigns in 12 seasons with the Boilermakers, and has won at least 20 games in 12 of 18 career seasons as a head coach
- With the conference-opening win over Ohio State, Versyp surpassed Lin Dunn for the Boilermakers' career Big Ten Conference wins mark at 123
- Her 137 career Big Ten wins are fifth in conference history, passing Ohio State's Jim Foster, and are third-most among active coaches
- Her 22 career Big Ten Tournament victories are an event record, breaking the previous mark (shared by Jim Foster and Rene Portland) with Purdue's 2017 quarterfinal win over Indiana
- She's led the Boilermakers to the Big Ten Tournament championship game six times in 12 seasons (four titles)
- Versyp has guided Purdue to a program-record nine NCAA Tournament appearances in 12 seasons
- The Boilermakers are 1-of-25 schools to make at least nine tournaments over Versyp's tenure as head coach, and 1-of-5 schools in the Big Ten Conference

#1 KARISSA MCLAUGHLIN

- Scored a career-high 28 points in the home win over Northwestern, hitting 9-of-11 from 3-point range to tie for second-most in a game in Purdue history
- Second the Big Ten, 16th in the NCAA and third in Purdue's single-season history with 79 triples, nine shy of the Boilermaker season record set by Katie Gearlds in 2006-07
- Owns two of the top-four single-season 3-point totals in Purdue history, making 75 in 2017-18, the most-ever by a Boilermaker freshman
- Averaging a conference-best 2.9 triples per game in Big Ten play, and ranks second at 41.2 percent from 3
- Leads the NCAA in minutes played (1087:33), and has played a complete game 13 times this season
- Has 17 straight games in double figures, tied for the 14th-longest streak at Purdue and the Boilermakers' longest since Shereka Wright posted 35 in a row in 2003-04
- Second in the Big Ten and 13th in the NCAA at the free throw line, converting 89.0 percent (73-82) this season and has cashed in 89.5 percent for her Purdue career (111-124)
- Tied for 11th in program history with 154 career 3-pointers, matching Beth Jones (2001-04) and three shy of Jennifer Jacoby (1992-95)
- Has hit the most 3-pointers over her first two seasons of any player in program history, breaking Oden's record set last season at 125, and has made the seventh-most of any player in Big Ten history over their freshman and sophomore seasons

- The fifth player in program history to deal at least 100 in each of her first two seasons (MaChelle Joseph, Stephanie White, Katie Douglas, FahKara Malone)
- Her 19-point, 11-assist double-double at Wisconsin made her the eighth player in Purdue history to record at least two points-assists double-doubles
- Joined the Boilermaker record books as the fifth player to hit 5-of-5 from 3-point range in a game, draining all five attempts against No. 21 Miami
- Played in eight consecutive complete games and 365 straight minutes at the end of the 2017-18 season, marking the longest streak of any individual in Purdue history
- Named 2017 Indiana Miss Basketball, becoming the ninth honoree to pursue their collegiate career in the Old Gold & Black

#2 ABBY ABEL

- Finalist for the 2019 Wooden Citizenship Cup, which is presented annually to the most outstanding role models at every level of competition (high school, college and professional)
- Named the co-Grand Marshal of the 2018 Indianapolis 500 Festival Parade for her work with the Special Olympics
- Was the keynote speaker at the 2018 Special Olympics USA Games in Seattle

- Created an annual Special Olympics "Play Unified" event at Purdue, which has been held at Cardinal Court in Mackey Arena the last two years with students from across the athletics department and campus

#3 LYNDSY WHILBY

- Scored at least eight points in four of her last six games off the bench, posting nine vs. Nebraska, 10 at Michigan State, eight at Nebraska and nine at Penn State
- Transferred to Purdue after one season at Texas Tech, where she averaged 7.2 points in 30 games and nine starts for the Red Raiders
- A three-time Georgia AAAAAA State Champion at McEachern High School

#5 CASSIDY HARDIN

- Purdue is 5-1 this season when she drops at least two from behind the arc
- Posted a 10-point effort at Minnesota, where she contributed 20 minutes and hit three 3's for her highest-scoring Big Ten game
- Posted a career-high 14 points against Purdue Fort Wayne, hitting four triples
- Hit 96 3-pointers as a senior at Center Grove High School, a school record and the fifth-most in a season in Indiana state history and made 260 career 3-pointers, good for eighth-most in state history
- McDonald's All-America nominee

#11 DOMINIQUE ODEN

- Her 1,297 career points are 18th in Purdue history and are the fifth-most scored by a junior all-time for the Boilermakers

- A native of London, England, she's the first british player in Boilermaker history

#23 KAYANA TRAYLOR

- Missing the game at Michigan State after suffering an ankle injury in the first half vs. Nebraska
- The Boilermakers are 7-3 this season when she deals at least five assists and the team is 5-2 in conference play when she leads the team in assists
- Tallied a career-high 15 points vs. Indiana, including eight in the first quarter, hitting 5-of-10 from the field and 4-of-5 at the free throw line
- Dished a career-most eight assists against Loyola Chicago and Bradley, nearly posting a triple-double with eight points and seven rebounds against Bradley
- Earned her first career start vs. Harvard, and has started 14 games on the year for the Boilermakers
- Second Purdue freshman in as many years to score in double figures in their first career game (McLaughlin)
- Set Martinsville High School records for scoring (2114), assists (437), free throws (472) and games played (98)
- 2018 Indiana Miss Basketball finalist
- McDonald's All-America nominee

#25 TAMARA FARQUHAR

- Her 7.4 rebound per game average is currently tied for the third-best ever for a Purdue sophomore, matching Stacey Lovelace
- Averaging 9.0 points and 7.0 rebounds per game at home in conference play
- Boilermakers are 5-1 this season when she scores in double figures
- Pulled down a career-high 18 rebounds at Northwestern, tying the No. 14 single-game total in program history and the most since Harris' 18 boards vs. Indiana last season
- Hit 8-of-9 field goals on her way to a career-high 16 points against Michigan, adding eight rebounds, a career-high four assists and two blocked shots
- Logged her first career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds at Ohio
- Started 17-of-34 games as a freshman, becoming one of five rookie starters for Versyp's career
- Along with Dawson College teammate Léony Boudreau, they are the first two Canadian players in Purdue women's basketball history

#30 NYAGOA GONY

- Tallied five points, nine rebounds and a pair of blocked shots in her collegiate debut, playing 16 minutes
- Led Lincoln High School to its first state championship appearance in 14 years in 2018
- Two-time honorable mention all-state honoree
- Led the state of Nebraska in rebounding in 2015-16

#32 AE'RIANNA HARRIS

- Named a semifinalist for the Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Award watchlist, 1-of-10 players in the nation, 1-of-3 players from the Big Ten Conference and 1-of-2 underclassmen in the country
- Became the 34th 1,000-point scorer in Purdue history with 13 points at Nebraska and 17th player to hit the mark as a junior
- Ranked eighth all-time at Purdue with 756 career rebounds and is the first Boilermaker player to ever surpass 700 in her third season
- Second in the NCAA with 94 blocked shots this season, while her 3.24 rejections per game average is best average in the Big Ten and No. 3 in the country
- Ranked second at Purdue and 10th in Big Ten Conference history with 274 career blocks, seven short of the Boilermakers' career record of 281, held by Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton
- Her eight blocks at Ohio make her 1-of-4 players in Purdue history to reject at least eight in a game and the first since 2013
- Set Purdue's single-game field goal percentage record vs. Purdue Fort Wayne, going 10-for-10 from the field, becoming the 11th player in Big Ten Conference history to go at least 10-for-10 in a game, and 1-of-4 players in the nation this season
- Has a Purdue junior season record 11 double-doubles, good for third in the Big Ten in 2018-19
- Tied for fourth in program history on the double-double list (20), matching Carol Emanuel, Cathey Tyree and Joy Holmes
- Named to Lisa Leslie Award preseason watch list for the nation's top center
- 2018-19 Preseason All-Big Ten (Coaches & Media)
- 2018 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the third Boilermaker to earn the honor and third sophomore in conference history to take home the award
- One-of-3 players (only one to return in 2018-19) in the NCAA last season to post 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots

OPPONENT NOTES

- The Terrapins come to West Lafayette at 24-3 overall and 13-3 in conference play, sitting at the top of the Big Ten standings
- Maryland has won nine of its last 10 games, with the only hiccup coming at Iowa (86-73 on Feb. 17), outscoring opponents by 12.1 points per game during the stretch
- Ranked eighth in the nation heading into the weekend, the Terps will be Purdue's ninth ranked opponent of the season and second top-10 foe after facing UConn in November in the U.S. Virgin Islands
- Terrapin head coach Brenda Frese is in her 17th season at Maryland and eclipsed the 500-career win mark this year
- Maryland is among the Big Ten's best in nearly every statistical category, most notably scoring margin (+16.3), field goal percentage defense (.364), rebounds (42.9) and rebounding margin (+9.1)
- The Terrapins also boast the top 3-point percentage in conference play, knocking down 39 percent from behind the arc
- Junior Kaila Charles is one of the top players in the conference, ranking fifth in the Big Ten at 16.2 points per game, and sixth in field goal percentage at 49.7 percent
- The freshmen duo of Taylor Mikesell and Shakira Austin are two of the conference's best, leading all conference rookies in scoring and rebounding, respectively
- Mikesell leads the Big Ten with 80 3's on the season, hitting 43 percent from behind the arc
- Austin is fourth in the conference in rebounding (10.0 rpg) and fourth in blocks (2.4 bpg)
