– AROUND THE HORN –

• For weekend No. 5, Purdue visits the state of Alabama for the first time since a March 2014 doubleheader in Birmingham. The Boilermakers split that dual-team twinbill with Butler and Samford. It was a late addition to the schedule after a series at Missouri State was canceled due to snow and ice.

• Jacksonville State is the first Ohio Valley Conference opponent on the schedule since Purdue won 2 of 3 at Southeast Missouri in March 2017.

• The Boilermakers are currently 2-3 during their eight-game spring break schedule. They rallied to win a neutral-site series with NJIT last weekend. Purdue won game 2 of a doubleheader in walk-off fashion on a bases-loaded walk and then took the rubber game after Trent Johnson struck out the side in order in the ninth inning to strand the tying run at third base.

• The Boilermakers' 13-game home win streak was snapped Tuesday in a loss to Milwaukee. The March 12 date marked the earliest home opener in program history. Kyle Wade became the just the fourth freshman since 2005 to start a home opener on the mound. It was also his first collegiate start.

• Purdue has overcome at least a 3-run deficit to pull even in 3 of its last 5 games. The Boilers have not held a lead at the end of the 7th inning at any point this season. Two of their wins were in games tied after 7.

- Of the 15 runs he's allowed this year, nine have scored in the first inning.
- Worked 8 consecutive scoreless innings over his first two starts of the season.
- Surrendered only an infield single over five scoreless innings at Texas as Purdue became the first team to shut out the Longhorns in Austin since April 2016.
- Pitched in 12 games and made five starts in 2018 after redshirting the year prior.
- Started the 2018 Big Ten Tournament championship game vs. Minnesota and an NCAA Regional game vs. Houston.
- Posted a 2.01 ERA and .203 batting average against in 22 1/3 innings as a starting pitcher, recording 21 strikeouts vs. 16 hits allowed.
- Pitched a combined 7 1/3 innings of three-run ball over his two postseason starts
- Purdue led 4-0 when he left the mound in the fifth inning of his start vs. Houston on Sunday of the NCAA Regional.
- Led Purdue to a key late-season win vs. Oral Roberts with 4 1/3 innings of two-run ball
- Earned the win in his first collegiate start with five innings of two-hit ball against Chicago State, retiring the first 12 batters of the game
- Struck out a season-high nine over 5 2/3 innings vs. Purdue Fort Wayne.
- Had Tommy John Surgery prior to enrolling at Purdue, an injury that sidelined him during his senior season of high school at Hamilton Southeastern in suburban Indy.
- Went 5-1 with a 2.55 ERA as a junior, helping lead HSE to a sectional title.
- Prep Baseball Report Indiana ranked him among the top 10 recruits in the state.

- Seven of the eight runs he has allowed in 14 innings as a starting pitcher this season have scored in the first inning.
- Struck out a career-high 7 vs NJIT as Purdue racked up 37 Ks in the series.
- Made his first start as a Boilermaker in the Sunday series finale at Texas, working five consecutive scoreless innings after giving up three runs in the first.
- Quality start at UT was made possible by retiring 17 of the final 19 batters he faced.
- Was used in a pair of high-leverage situations during the season-opening series at Southern Miss.
- Got Friday's game at USM to extra innings after escaping a bases-loaded jam in the ninth inning. Southern Miss tied the game on a dropped fly ball in center field.
- Sunday at USM, issued a bases-loaded walk in the sixth inning after a long ball with the No. 2 hitter. Struck out the next man but USM's cleanup hitter delivered a two-strike, two-out, two-run single against him to take an 8-7 lead.
- Pitched in 10 games, all in relief, in 2018 as a transfer from Heartland College in Bloomington, Illinois; made eight of his 10 appearances in Big Ten play.
- Enjoyed a big week in mid-April as Purdue's 13-game win streak began, working a combined 4 2/3 innings of one run-ball over two appearances.
- Purdue won both road games in which he pitched that week in extra innings.
- Worked two innings of one-hit relief in the 10-inning win at Indiana State.
- Gave up only one run over 2 2/3 innings in the 11-inning win at Maryland.
- Won his lefty-lefty matchups in LOOGY appearances vs. Indiana and Ohio State.
- Appeared in 13 games in 2017 at Heartland, going 7-3 with 48 strikeouts and 40 hits allowed in 51 innings.
- Part of two combined no-hitters as a high school senior in Chicagoland.

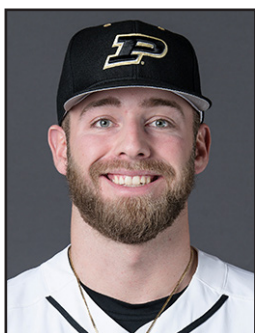

- After not pitching at ORU, helped lead Purdue to a rubber game win vs. NJIT with his finest performance as a Boilermaker. Only run he allowed was a solo homer.
- Posted five zeros to begin the game in his start at Southern Miss, allowing only one run while he was on the mound.
- Opened and closed 2018 as Purdue's Sunday starter, excelling as a midweek starter from late-March to mid-May.
- Pitched very well at Alexander Field, compiling a 1.91 ERA and .222 batting average against in 33 innings. Also had 29 strikeouts vs. 10 walks at home.
- Led Purdue to a big non-conference win vs. Indiana in midweek play that was live on ESPN, working 5 2/3 innings of three-run ball.
- Earned the win in the finale of the Northwestern series with 4 1/3 innings of two-hit scoreless relief, his most-effective relief appearance of 2018.
- Gave Purdue a quality start (6 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 3 K) in the midweek game vs. Ball State.
- His 0.84 ERA was the best in all of NJCAA Division I through the end of the 2017 regular season at College of Southern Idaho, winning Region 18 Pitcher of the Year.
- Finished the season 6-3 with a 1.04 ERA and .177 batting average against, recording 68 strikeouts in 69 1/3 innings pitched.

HEAD COACH MARK WASIKOWSKI

Mark Wasikowski, an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the Universities of Oregon, Arizona, Florida as well as Southeast Missouri State during his career, was hired as the head coach of Purdue baseball in June 2016.

Wasikowski has played and coached in the College World Series. He helped lead teams to 14 NCAA Tournament appearances during a successful 20-year run as an assistant coach. He also won an NCAA championship as the starting third baseman and a captain on Pepperdine's 1992 College World Series team.

Wasikowski (pronounced WOZ-uh-COW-ski) played for and worked under three-time national Coach of the Year Andy Lopez for a combined 18 years. He was part of Lopez's coaching staffs at both Florida (1999-2001) and Arizona (2002-11) before joining George Horton's staff at Oregon in the summer of 2011, spending five seasons with Horton in Eugene. Wasikowski was an assistant coach on Arizona's 2004 College World Series team, the same year that Horton led Cal State Fullerton to the national title.

Wasikowski garnered coach of the year consideration in 2018 after leading Purdue to 38 wins and runner-up finishes in both the Big Ten standings and at the Big Ten Tournament. The Boilermakers went 21-2 from April 20 to May 26 to qualify for an NCAA Regional. Wasikowski's team won 13 consecutive games overall (April 20-May 9) and at home (April 24-May 19) during the late-season surge, both streaks tying single-season program records. Purdue earned the No. 2 seed in the Chapel Hill Regional and held the lead at one point in all three of its NCAA Tournament games.

Wasikowski's arrival spearheaded one of the most successful two-year turnarounds in the history of Purdue Athletics. The Boilermakers went from 10-44 and 2-22 in Big Ten play during the 2016 season to 38-21 and 17-6 in the Big Ten in 2018, just his second year.

Wasikowski led the Boilermakers to a 19-win improvement in his first season. It ranked as the greatest turnaround in program history and tops nationally entering the week of the conference tournaments around the country. Purdue returned to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2012 after winning 10 more games in league play. Wasikowski's team joined the 2007 Boilermakers as the only Big Ten teams since 1988 to post a 10-win improvement in conference play.

The 2017 Boilermakers won seven weekend series after having only six such successful weekends from 2013 to 2016. Purdue was 8-3 in one-run games after having a 2-13 record in similar contests the year before. The Boilermakers' 18 true road wins were tied with Minnesota for the most in the Big Ten.

Wasikowski has coached 130 players that have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, a list highlighted by 33 big leaguers. During his 10 seasons at Arizona, Wasikowski coached 59 Major League Baseball draft picks and 22 future big leaguers. As the recruiting coordinator, he assembled the Wildcats' 2012 national championship team, leaving for Oregon before the start of the 2011-12 school year.

Wasikowski was a two-time All-West Coast Conference honoree at Pepperdine after spending his first two collegiate seasons at Hawaii and Rancho Santiago Junior College. He was selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 1993 MLB Draft, but opted to remain at Pepperdine to finish his bachelor's degree in business administration while serving as a student assistant under Lopez during the 1994 season.

Wasikowski was inducted into the Pepperdine Athletics Hall of Fame along with all of his teammates from the 1992 national championship team. He led the Waves in doubles as a junior and hits as a senior, guiding Pepperdine back to the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

As a player, I left Arizona much better than when I arrived. He was very good at the mental part of the game and pushing us to get to places we didn't know we could go. I still talk to Waz about once every three months. He is very loyal, and I would trust his character to run my program."

QUITE THE TURNAROUND

• The Boilermakers' 19-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 was tops nationally. Purdue took the next step in year 2 under head coach **Mark Wasikowski**, finishing second in the Big Ten and earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for just the second time in program history. The 28-win turnaround over two years, from 10-44 to 38-21, is one of the most impressive in the history of Purdue Athletics.

• The Boilermakers had the best record (172-110, 75-51 B1G) in the Big Ten from 2008 to 2012, but fell on hard times following their program-record 45-win Big Ten championship season. Coach Waz has the program trending upwards again. The 2018 senior class more than doubled its win total (67-48, .583) from its underclassman seasons (30-78, .278).

• The Boilermakers racked up 37 strikeouts in 28 innings pitched while winning two of three vs. NJIT this past weekend at Big League Camp in Marion, North Carolina. It was an extremely competitive series, with the victorious team scoring what proved to be the game-winning run in its final at-bat of all three contests. The 37 Ks, including three from **Trent Johnson** in the ninth inning of Sunday's 3-2 win, were a program high in a three-game series this decade. Purdue had not even struck out 30 batters in a three-game weekend since 2011.

SERIES WIN IN NORTH CAROLINA

- Purdue was originally scheduled to play Creighton in Omaha the weekend of March 8-10. Snow at TD Ameritrade Park canceled the series. A neutral-site series vs. NJIT in Marion, N.C was added.
- After losing game 1 vs. NJIT in 10 innings, the Boilermakers came back to take the series by winning consecutive one-run games against the same opponent for the first time since a March 2011 series victory at Tennessee-Martin.
- Purdue won its first rubber game since April 2017 at Ohio State, which also marked the last time it rallied to win a series after dropping the series opener. For only the fourth time this decade, the Boilermakers came back to win a three-game weekend series after losing the opener.

EARLY UPS & DOWNS

- From games No. 6 through 11, Purdue scored in only 6 of the 55 innings. The Boilermakers went five consecutive games without holding the lead during that stretch, a streak of 52 straight innings. The streak finally ended when the Boilermakers scored in each of the final four frames of the 9-8 walk-off win vs. NJIT, overcoming deficits of 2-0, 3-2 and 7-3 in that game.
- Led by five shutout innings from **Andrew Bohm**, Purdue limited Texas to just an infield single in a 4-0 win. **Bo Hofstra** closed out the win with three innings of hitless relief, retiring the final six batters he faced. The Boilermakers became the first team to shut out UT at home since April 2016. Pinch runner **Milo Beam** scored the go-ahead run on an opposite-field single to left field from **Zac Fascia** in the ninth inning. **Ben Nisle** had doubled off the wall in left field moments earlier.
- The Boilermakers held at least a two-run lead in all three games at Southern Miss, but got swept after being outscored 20-4 from the sixth through 10th innings. They enjoyed an 11-7 scoring edge in innings one through five. The bullpen allowed 9 of 14 inherited runners to score.
- At Texas, Purdue was outscored 12-2 over the first two innings of the series. The Boilermakers used a four-run ninth inning to break a scoreless stalemate and win game 3. Purdue has been outscored 19-3 in the first inning this season.

STACKED EARLY SCHEDULE

- Purdue's pre-conference schedule is definitely its most challenging since 2014 (Tennessee, Rice, LSU, San Diego State). Four of the first five weekend opponents – Southern Miss, Texas, Oral Roberts and Jacksonville State – all won 30-plus games and were a combined 156-86 in 2018. NJIT replaced a 30-win Creighton team on the schedule.
