NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: QUICK-HIT HISTORY

NOTABLE HISTORY

• For the third time in head coach Tony Ermland's five years, Purdue is sending seven or more to the NCAA Championships.

• Purdue is seeking its first All-American since Ivan Lopouchanski was seventh at 149 pounds in 2013 ... Luke Welch (125) and Dylan Lydy (174) fell one match shy of All-America honors in 2017 ... Chad Welch (165) fell in the blood round in 2016.

• Forty Purdue wrestlers have captured All-America accolades for a total of 54 honors ... a trio of individuals have earned the distinction three times and there have been eight two-time All-Americans.

• The last time Purdue had multiple All-Americans was in 2006 with Chris Fleeger finishing as the 133-pound runner-up and Ben Wissel placing third at 184.

• The last NCAA champion for the Boilermakers was Charles Jones, who won the 167 pound title in 1992 ... Ivan Lopouchanski was the last All-American, placing seventh at 149 pounds in 2013.

• Purdue has had three grapplers earn a national title ... Arnold Plaza is the only Boilermaker ever to win two titles, winning at 114.5 pounds in 1948, followed by a 121-pound championship in 1949 ... in 1950 Joe Patacsil took top-honors at 128 pounds.

• Purdue has nine top-10 team finishes to its credit ... in 1950 the Boilermakers were the national runner-up with four All-Americans ... the last top-10 finish came in 1991, placing seventh with a program record 39.75 points.

- Secured automatic bid to first NCAA Championships with 10-4 upset of seventh-seeded Zeke Moisey of Nebraska ... Schroder stormed back from a four-point nearfall by the Husker in the second period with back-to-back reversals and a four-point nearfall of his own.

- Went 2-3 at Big Ten Championships to place eighth ... opened the tournament with a commanding 13-5 major decision over eighth-seeded Malik Heinselman of Ohio State in his first match since Feb. 10.

- Both of Schroder's wins at Big Tens were over ranked opponents: No. 18 Heinselman and No. 17 Moisey.

- Missed last four duals due to injury.

- Is the only Boilermaker to surpass 100 points scored in the first period ... has surpassed over 200 total points scored in back-to-back seasons.

- Team leader with five dual bouts resulting in bonus points (3 MD, 2 TF) ... six of first 11 matches were with bonus points (2 MD, 3 TF, 1 F) ... second consecutive season with at least half of his wins coming with bonus points.

- Went undefeated in January to build a 5-0 mark in Big Ten duals.

- Owns a pair of wins against Gabe Townsell of Stanford ... took a 4-2 (SV1) decision in the Princeton Open quarterfinals ... a five-point second period lifted Schroder to an 11-7 place-clinching victory in Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational wrestlebacks.

- Recorded first pin of his career by sticking Trey Chalifoux of Army in 6:10 in the opening bout of the Journeymen Collegiate Classic ... Schroder medically forfeited his last two matches to place fourth.

- Had four wins over 2018 NCAA qualifiers (Ryan Millhof, Arizona State - 12-2; Ibrahim Bunduka, George Mason - 8-0; Christian Moody, Oklahoma - 7-1; and Michael McGee, Old Dominion - 8-1) ... had narrow losses to two-time All-American and 2015 runner-up Zeke Moisey of West Virginia (7-2) and All-American Sebastian Rivera of Northwestern (3-1) ... Moody was ranked 20th when Schroder beat him at the Michigan State Open ... also beat No. 18 Johnny Jimenez of Wisconsin (7-2; Michigan State Open).
- Closed out the season by winning the Greyhound Open ... won first three matches by technical fall to become the first Boilermaker to have three or more consecutive technical falls since Logan Brown had four on Dec. 20, 2009.
- Major decided on a pair of top-10 seeded wrestlers at Midlands: No. 4 Ryan Millhof of Arizona State (12-2) and Minnesota's seventh-seeded Steve Polakowski (10-0) ... Millhof was ranked 14th nationally.
- Won six straight matches spanning the Jim Koch Open and Midlands, including a pair of technical falls and a pair of major decisions.

- Met teammate Luke Welch in the Michigan State Open finals and the seventh-place match at Midlands.

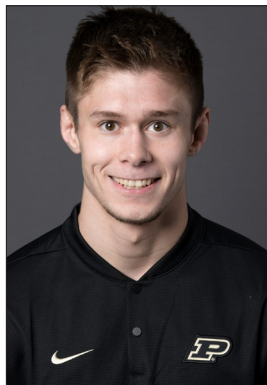
