- AROUND THE HORN -

- Purdue closes out its home schedule and the regular season with a do-or-die weekend vs. Ohio State as both teams aim to extend their campaigns into the Big Ten Tournament.
- The Boilermakers need a sweep to have a chance at qualifying for the eight-team Big Ten Tournament. Ohio State can likely afford to lose one game and still qualify, but the Buckeyes will need more help around the conference in that scenario.
- The Purdue-OSU series is the only one around the league this weekend in which both teams are currently outside the top eight in the standings. That means the Boilermakers and Buckeyes can eliminate their opponent while helping their own cause.
- Not only does Purdue play at home, where it is 13-7 this year, but Northwestern, Rutgers, Maryland and Michigan State all face teams in the current top six in the league standings.
- This weekend, the Buckeyes join Iowa as the Big Ten teams to make four visits to West Lafayette since Alexander Field opened in 2013.

- Made 18 of his 23 appearances as a Boilermaker as a starter, opening both seasons in the weekend rotation.
- 13 of his 18 career starts were as part of the weekend rotation.
- Pitched very well at Alexander Field during his career, recording a 2.32 ERA and 36 strikeouts over 41 2/3 innings.
- Helped lead Purdue to a 2019 rubber game win at Northwestern by allowing three earned runs over 5 2/3 innings.
- Fanned a career-high 7 in 2018 wins vs. Michigan and Valparaiso.
- Beat Indiana with 5 2/3 innings of three-run ball in 2018 midweek matchup at Alexander.
- Struck out 6 over 7 innings in rubber game starts vs. NJIT and Iowa this season.
- Started the 2018 Big Ten Tournament semifinal win vs. Illinois.

COLLEYVILLE, TEXAS

- Has seen action at five different positions in his 2 seasons as a Boilermaker – first base, second base, third base, shortstop and DH.
- Opened the 2018 season as the starting second base and the 2019 campaign at third base.
- Recorded multiple hits in all 3 games of the 2019 series win at Northwestern.
- Batting .333 in Big Ten play this season despite a hamstring injury limiting him for about a month.
- Reached base safely in 9 of his 16 plate appearances since returning to the starting lineup May 7 in the win vs. Ball State.
- Served as the right-handed half of Purdue's DH platoon during the successful 2018 stretch run, starting 3 postseason games.
- Recorded 2 hits, including a 3-run triple, in the 9-run inning in the win at Jacksonville State this season.
- Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree.



PATRICK SMITH • #30
STARTING PITCHER

- Emerged as one of Purdue's most effective starting pitchers this season after making all 10 of his appearances in 2018 as a reliever.
- With 66 strikeouts in 57 innings, has helped Purdue eclipse the program's single-season strikeouts record this year.
- Earned the opportunity to be Purdue's Friday starter for the first four weekends of Big Ten play.
- In line to make a start in 12 of the 14 weekends.
- Earned the win in three straight starts in March, working a combined 18 1/3 innings of 3-run ball with 24 strikeouts.
- Won a 1-0 pitcher's duel against Penn State in his first career start at Alexander Field.
- Also put together a quality start at Texas this season in his first start as a Boilermaker.
- Made 8 of his 10 relief appearances in 2018 in Big Ten play.
- Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree.

- In Big Ten play, leads the league with a .149 batting average against and ranks 2nd with a 0.59 ERA while averaging 11.6 strikeouts per 9 innings (39 Ks in 30 1/3 IP).
- Worked 14 2/3 consecutive scoreless innings in Big Ten play from April 7-May 3, pitching 6 scoreless vs. Rutgers & Michigan St. after becoming a starter.
- Just the 7th pitcher in team history to reach 100 career strikeouts as a sophomore.
- Posted the only double-figure strikeout game by a Purdue reliever since 2005 by fanning 10 of the 15 batters he faced over 4 1/3 innings March 23 at Northwestern.
- Served as the bullpen's fireman for the first two months, using his nasty slider to help strand numerous runners at third base. Struck out the side to strand the tying at third base while closing out the rubber game win vs. NJIT.
- 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team as a starting pitcher, moving into the weekend rotation in mid-March and making five starts in Big Ten play.
- Surrendered only 21 hits in 41 innings, with only 4 hits going for extra bases, an impressive mark of 4.6 hits per 9 innings that ranked second in program history.
- His 1.76 ERA ranked 8th in single-season history and third best by a freshman.
- Struck out 6 over 5 scoreless innings to earn wins vs. Penn State and Rutgers as Purdue completed series sweeps.
- Compiled a .147 batting average against as a starting pitcher, surrendering only 16 hits in 33 innings.
- Enjoyed his productive season while making 15 of his 18 appearances and working 32 1/3 of his 41 innings away from home.
- First-team all-conference in football, basketball & baseball as a senior at CHS.
- Recorded 127 Ks as a junior and 124 Ks as a senior, leading the state both years.

- 19 of the 30 runs he has allowed in 53 2/3 innings as a starting pitcher this season have scored in the first inning.
- Purdue won each of his 4 starts from March 9-29, moving him to Friday in the rotation in time for Big Ten play; had 31 strikeouts over 22 innings during that stretch.
- Struggled with command in consecutive starts vs. Nebraska and Iowa, leading to a return to the bullpen for the Rutgers series. Rebounded with 8 2/3 innings of shutout ball while making 2 starts the week of April 23-28.
- Shined in his first career start at Alexander Field, striking out a career-high 9 and winning a 1-0 pitcher's duel with Penn State's Dante Biasi.
- Made his first start as a Boilermaker in the Sunday series finale at Texas, working 5 consecutive scoreless innings after giving up 3 runs in the bottom of the first.
- Quality start at UT was made possible by retiring 17 of the final 19 batters he faced.
- Pitched in 10 games, all in relief, in 2018 as a transfer from Heartland College in Bloomington, Illinois; made eight of his 10 appearances in Big Ten play.

HEAD COACH MARK WASIKOWSKI

Mark Wasikowski, an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the Universities of Oregon, Arizona, Florida as well as Southeast Missouri State during his career, was hired as the head coach of Purdue baseball in June 2016.

Wasikowski has played and coached in the College World Series. He helped lead teams to 14 NCAA Tournament appearances during a successful 20-year run as an assistant coach. He also won an NCAA championship as the starting third baseman and a captain on Pepperdine's 1992 College World Series team.

Wasikowski (pronounced WOZ-uh-COW-ski) played for and worked under three-time national Coach of the Year Andy Lopez for a combined 18 years. He was part of Lopez's coaching staffs at both Florida (1999-2001) and Arizona (2002-11) before joining George Horton's staff at Oregon in the summer of 2011, spending five seasons with Horton in Eugene. Wasikowski was an assistant coach on Arizona's 2004 College World Series team, the same year that Horton led Cal State Fullerton to the national title.

Wasikowski garnered coach of the year consideration in 2018 after leading Purdue to 38 wins and runner-up finishes in both the Big Ten standings and at the Big Ten Tournament. The Boilermakers went 21-2 from April 20 to May 26 to qualify for an NCAA Regional. Wasikowski's team won 13 consecutive games overall (April 20-May 9) and at home (April 24-May 19) during the late-season surge, both streaks tying single-season program records. Purdue earned the No. 2 seed in the Chapel Hill Regional and held the lead at one point in all three of its NCAA Tournament games.

Wasikowski's arrival spearheaded one of the most successful two-year turnarounds in the history of Purdue Athletics. The Boilermakers went from 10-44 and 2-22 in Big Ten play during the 2016 season to 38-21 and 17-6 in the Big Ten in 2018, just his second year.

Wasikowski led the Boilermakers to a 19-win improvement in his first season. It ranked as the greatest turnaround in program history and tops nationally entering the week of the conference tournaments around the country. Purdue returned to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2012 after winning 10 more games in league play. Wasikowski's team joined the 2007 Boilermakers as the only Big Ten teams since 1988 to post a 10-win improvement in conference play.

The 2017 Boilermakers won seven weekend series after having only six such successful weekends from 2013 to 2016. Purdue was 8-3 in one-run games after having a 2-13 record in similar contests the year before. The Boilermakers' 18 true road wins were tied with Minnesota for the most in the Big Ten.

Wasikowski has coached 130 players that have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, a list highlighted by 33 big leaguers. During his 10 seasons at Arizona, Wasikowski coached 59 Major League Baseball draft picks and 22 future big leaguers. As the recruiting coordinator, he assembled the Wildcats' 2012 national championship team, leaving for Oregon before the start of the 2011-12 school year.

Wasikowski was a two-time All-West Coast Conference honoree at Pepperdine after spending his first two collegiate seasons at Hawaii and Rancho Santiago Junior College. He was selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 1993 MLB Draft, but opted to remain at Pepperdine to finish his bachelor's degree in business administration while serving as a student assistant under Lopez during the 1994 season.

Wasikowski was inducted into the Pepperdine Athletics Hall of Fame along with all of his teammates from the 1992 national championship team. He led the Waves in doubles as a junior and hits as a senior, guiding Pepperdine back to the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

As a player, I left Arizona much better than when I arrived. He was very good at the mental part of the game and pushing us to get to places we didn't know we could go. I still talk to Waz about once every three months. He is very loyal, and I would trust his character to run my program."

MORE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT SCENARIOS

- Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Minnesota and Nebraska have clinched Big Ten Tournament berths.

- Penn State is the only team eliminated from Big Ten Tournament contention. Northwestern, Rutgers, Ohio State, Maryland, Purdue and Michigan State are essentially battling for the final two berths.

- Iowa is in sixth place and needs only one win this weekend at Maryland to clinch a bid. The only scenario in which the Hawkeyes will not qualify is if they are swept by Maryland plus either Northwestern or Rutgers also reach 12 wins in league play. Iowa owns a head-to-head tiebreaker vs. Ohio State.

- The Purdue-Ohio State series is the only one around the league in which both teams are currently outside the top eight in the standings. That means the Boilermakers and Buckeyes can eliminate their opponent while helping their own cause.

- Not only does Purdue play at home, where it is 13-7 this year, but the Boilermakers (and OSU) are also the only teams chasing a bid that plays a sub-.500 team in league play. Northwestern, Rutgers, Maryland and Michigan State all face teams in the current top six in the league standings.

OHIO STATE HAS PLAYED WELL IN WEST LAFAYETTE

- This weekend, the Buckeyes join Iowa as the Big Ten teams to make four visits to West Lafayette since Alexander Field opened in 2013. Ohio State was the opponent for the first game at Purdue's new stadium on March 22, 2013. The Buckeyes are 8-1 at Alexander. Additionally, the Boilermakers have not won a home series vs. OSU since May 1987, their longest active drought without a home series victory vs. any Big Ten rival.

- When Ohio State won last year's rubber game with the Boilermakers in Columbus, it marked the first time the home team won a Purdue-OSU series since April 2006.

- The Boilermakers' final Big Ten series is against Ohio State for the first time since 1994.

STARTING PITCHERS CROSSING STATE LINES

- Both teams are slated to start a pitcher from the other team's home state. The Buckeyes' Garrett Burhenn, a freshman right-hander, is an Indianapolis native and Lawrence North High School product. He has started OSU's first game of every weekend dating back to March 9. Last weekend against Penn State, he pitched a season-low three innings of two-run ball and did not strike out a batter for the first time this year. Ohio State still won the game 4-2.

- Purdue's **Cory Brooks** is a native of Hilliard, Ohio, a community located only about eight miles from OSU's Bill Davis Stadium. After redshirting due to injury last season, Brooks has worked 11 consecutive scoreless innings to begin his college career since making his debut April 16. He's slated to start the series finale for the second weekend in a row and will likely have a larger pitch count to work with than he did Sunday at Illinois, which was his third appearance in an eight-day span.

- The Buckeyes' Bayden Root (Kokomo) and Brady Cherry (Pendleton) are also Indiana natives. Root (45 Ks in 33 1/3 IP) was a high school classmate of Purdue's **Kyle Wade**. Cherry is a multi-year starter who is enjoying his finest season (12 HR, 14 2B, 39 RBI) this year.

- Andrew Magno (11 Ks over 4 IP at UMD) and Trent Johnson (10 Ks over 4 1/3 IP at NU) are believed to be the only pitchers in the Big Ten this season with a double-figure strikeout game as a reliever. Magno pitched seven innings of one-run relief in OSU's 18-inning marathon at Minnesota on May 4.

PURDUE'S LONGEST SINGLE-SEASON HIT STREAKS SINCE 2005

- While **Zac Fascia** is riding Purdue's longest hit streak (15) in all games since 2011, Ryan Howe's current 11-game hit streak in Big Ten play makes him only the second freshman since 2005 with a double-figure hit streak in league play. **Cameron Perkins** (2010) was the other. Perkins was drafted in 2012 and reached the big leagues with the Phillies in 2017.

QUITE THE TURNAROUND

• The Boilermakers' 19-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 was tops nationally. Purdue took the next step in year 2 under head coach **Mark Wasikowski**, finishing second in the Big Ten and earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for just the second time in program history. The 28-win turnaround over two years, from 10-44 to 38-21, is one of the most impressive in the history of Purdue Athletics.

• The Boilermakers had the best record (172-110, 75-51 B1G) in the Big Ten from 2008 to 2012, but fell on hard times following their program-record 45-win Big Ten championship season. Coach Waz has the program trending upwards again. The 2018 senior class more than doubled its win total (67-48, .583) from its underclassman seasons (30-78, .278).

PURDUE ECLIPSES GAME & SEASON RECORDS FOR STRIKEOUTS

• The Boilermakers have eclipsed their game and strikeout records this season. The game record was broken when Purdue fanned 18 in an April 10 10-inning loss at Indiana. The season record, which stood at 435 from the 2010 campaign, fell in the May 11 loss at Illinois.

• The Boilermakers will also establish a new strikeouts per nine innings benchmark this year. The 2010 team averaged 7.76 Ks per 9. Purdue is racking up 9.1 Ks per nine innings this year, ranking fourth in the Big Ten. This year's team is fifth overall with the 450 strikeouts.

• The Boilermakers have posted 23 double-figure strikeout games, a program high since 2005. They've also had 30-plus strikeouts in a weekend three times this year, recording a double-figure total in seven of those nine games. Purdue had 37 Ks in 28 innings vs. NJIT, fanned 32 batters over 25 innings the following weekend at Jacksonville State and racked up 32 Ks in 27 innings vs. Southeast Missouri.

• Three-game series became the norm throughout the season beginning in 2009 when the Big Ten moved away from the four-game weekends that had been utilized for more than two decades. So while Purdue played fewer three-game series prior to 2009, the JSU series still marked only the second time since 2005 that the Boilermakers posted a double-figure strikeout total in all three games of a weekend.

PURDUE LINEUP POSTS FIRST NO-STRIKEOUT GAME SINCE 2012

• There were only a combined two strikeouts in the May 12 series finale at Illinois, both recorded by Purdue pitchers. The Boilermakers had gone over seven years (April 22, 2012 at Nebraska) without a no-strikeout game at the plate. Meanwhile, one night after eclipsing the program's single-season strikeouts record, the two Ks matched a season low. Purdue also had just two Ks vs. Oral Roberts, Milwaukee and Indiana State.

PITCHING CARRIED THE LOAD UNTIL TOUGH SERIES AT NEBRASKA

• The Boilermakers surrendered only one run over 19 innings against Penn State the final weekend of March. Purdue's 22 consecutive scoreless innings from the second inning of the March 26 win vs. Valparaiso through the fifth inning of the March 31 victory vs. Penn State represented the team's longest streak since posting 24 straight zeros in May 2016.

• The Boilers posted 29 consecutive scoreless innings vs. Penn State from 2018 to 2019 – 15 straight to finish off a three-game sweep in State College last season and 14 in a row to begin this year's series.

• Over a 15-game stretch from March 10 to April 3, Purdue compiled a 2.34 ERA, 1.23 WHIP and .243 batting average against. The Boilermakers also posted a .975 fielding percentage. Those marks have helped them go 8-7 during that stretch after opening the season 2-10.

• But things did not go well for Purdue in a three-game sweep at Nebraska the first weekend of April. The Huskers racked up 39 runs in the series and scored six-plus runs in an inning four times. Walks and wild pitches doomed the Boilermakers early in the series opener and the 17-0 loss was the most lopsided of the season. But it was costly errors that helped open the door for big innings for Nebraska over the final two games. Purdue conceded eight unearned runs over the final two games of the series.

TWO WALK-OFF RBI IN THE SAME SEASON

• **Cole McKenzie** has the game-winning RBI in both of Purdue's walk-off victories this season, including the game-winning sacrifice fly in the 10th inning vs. Penn State. This decade, Cameron Perkins (2012) is the only other Boilermaker with a pair of walk-off RBI in the same season. Seth Gergely joined Milo Beam (2017), Nick Dalesandro (2016), Alec Olund (2015), Jeff Evak (2014) and Kevin Plawewski (2010) as freshmen to score the game-winning run in a walk-off this decade.

• McKenzie also delivered a game-tying, two-out double in the ninth inning April 10 at Indiana.

PITCHERS TO REACH 100 CAREER STRIKEOUTS AS SOPHOMORES

• **Trent Johnson**, **Andrew Bohm** and **Bo Hofstra** have helped the Boilermakers post only their fourth 400-strikeout season this year. Johnson has already become just the seventh pitcher to reach 100 career Ks by his sophomore season. Bohm and Hofstra are on the cusp of doing the same.

- In 160 career games, Hunter has 200 hits and a .323 average. Of those 200 career hits, 135 have come as a left-handed hitter (.315 career) and 65 as a right-handed hitter (.340 career). Daryl Hallada (1997-00) owns Purdue's all-time hits record (279) thanks to a .340 career batting average. Hallada is also the program's all-time leader with 820 at-bats. His daughter Kaeley Hallada is currently a freshman on the Purdue softball team.
- Hunter is the only Boilermaker since 2005 with a 20-game reached base safely streak in three different seasons. Hunter has posted a hit streak of at least 10 games in each of his first three seasons, a feat accomplished by only three other Boilermakers since 2005. Eric Charles (2009-12), Cameron Perkins (2010-12) and Nick Dalesandro (2016-18) all went on to be drafted.
- Hunter has tripled to begin a game three times this year. His six triples lead the Big Ten and are the most by a Boilermaker since Stephen Talbott also had six during the 2012 Big Ten championship season. Purdue's league-leading 16 triples are the program's most since the 2012 team had 17.

PURDUE'S DOUBLE-FIGURE STRIKEOUT GAMES THIS YEAR

- The Boilermakers have posted their 23 double-figure strikeout games, already the program's most since at least 2005, against 16 different opponents. They had 30-plus strikeouts in series against NJIT (37), Jacksonville State (32) and Southeast Missouri (32). They likely would have reached that the 30-K mark against Penn State (28 over two games) as well had the final game of the series not been canceled.
- Nine different pitchers have led the team in strikeouts during one of Purdue's 10-K games this year. Andrew Bohm has led the way a team-high six times. **Austin Peterson, Trent Johnson and Conner Tomasic** have all posted outright team-high totals as relievers.

JOHNSON IS PURDUE'S ONLY RELIEVER WITH 10-STRIKEOUT GAME SINCE 2005

• **Trent Johnson** struck out 10 of the 15 batters he faced over 4 1/3 innings of one-hit relief in game 2 at Northwestern, becoming just the eighth Boilermaker with a double-figure strikeout game since the beginning of the 2005 season. He's the only member of that group to do it as a reliever. He's one of only four relievers nationally with 10-plus Ks in an outing.

• By striking out 67 percent of the batters he faced, Johnson accounted for one of the most dominant performances by a Purdue pitcher since 2005. Only six Boilermakers have recorded at least five Ks and struck out more than half the batters they faced, with all-time saves leader and current big leaguer Nick Wittgren accomplishing the feat twice in 2011. Johnson's 10 Ks are easily the most among that group.

WON MULTIPLE ONE-RUN GAMES IN SAME WEEKEND TWICE THIS YEAR

• Already twice this season, Purdue has won a weekend series via a pair of one-run victories. The series wins vs. NJIT and Penn State both included a walk-off win as well. Prior to this year the Boilermakers had not won a pair of one-run games vs. the same team in the same weekend since March 2011. Since the Big Ten moved to three-game weekend series in 2009, the Boilermakers have won a pair of one-run games in the same weekend only six times. The 2012 Big Ten championship team was the last to do it twice.

FASCIA NAMED TO BUSTER POSEY AWARD WATCH LIST

• **Zac Fascia's** defensive excellence behind the plate and presence in the middle of the lineup earned him a spot on the initial watch list for the newly rebranded Buster Posey Award (formerly the Johnny Bench Award).

• Fascia has made 37 of his 50 starts this season behind the plate, serving as the starting catcher in 29 of the last 38 games. He has thrown out 18 base stealers in 48 attempts (38%) to lead the Big Ten. Fascia has also worked with a pitching staff that is averaging 9.1 strikeouts per nine innings, fourth best in the Big Ten. The Boilermakers already have 23 double-figure strikeout games this season, a program-high total since 2005.

• Fascia has made a team-high 37 starts as the cleanup hitter. He leads the Boilermakers with 34 RBI. A 2-for-32 slump from March 13 to 23 held down his overall numbers a bit this season.

FOUR-GAME TWO-HIT STREAK FOR EVARTS

• **Nick Evarts** recorded two hits in four straight games from March 22 to 26 (8-for-15, .611 OBP), raising his average over .100 points. He became the first Boilermaker with four straight multi-hit games since Evan Warden in February 2018. Evarts was also just the seventh Boilermaker since 2013 to record multiple hits in all three games of a series or weekend. During the 2012 Big Ten championship season, that was a feat achieved 11 times by Boilermakers, including three times each by first team All-Big Ten performers Eric Charles and Cameron Perkins.

• **Skyler Hunter** posted three consecutive two-hit games in the 2017 season-opening series at Texas State, which was a four-game set. Remarkably, those were the first three games of Hunter's college career, serving as a case of foreshadowing as the junior now has 194 hits in 151 career games and 57 career multi-hit games. The switch-hitter has also posted three straight multi-hit efforts this year (March 9-12).

HOFSTRA JOINS ELITE LIST OF RELIEVERS WITH MULTIPLE SAVES IN SAME WEEKEND

• While being the final pitcher used in each of the last six victories, **Bo Hofstra** recorded a win and three saves over Purdue's first two Big Ten series. Since 2005, Josh Lindblom is the only other pitcher to have a similar impact over the first two weekends of conference play. In 2008, Lindblom registered four saves as Purdue won three of four vs. both Northwestern (home) and Iowa (road) on its way to a 21-win conference record. That was the final season in which the Big Ten utilized a 32-game conference slate with Saturday doubleheaders every weekend.

• Hofstra worked three innings of hitless relief during the conference-opening series Northwestern, earning saves in games 1 and 3 of the series. He became just the fifth Purdue pitcher since 2005 to earn multiple saves in a Big Ten series. Overall, the feat has been accomplished by a closer only 11 times since 2005.

EARLY DEFICITS HAVE TESTED A TEAM STRUGGLING TO SCORE

• Purdue has been outscored 53-21 in the first inning this season, giving up at least one run in the opening frame 24 times. The Boilermakers have still managed to win six of those 24 games, rallying for victory when tied or trailing after seven innings six times. But sustained scoring has been an issue at times. From games No. 6 through 11, Purdue scored in only six of the 55 innings and did not hold the lead at any point during a streak of 52 straight innings. Then the Boilermakers only scored in just one of 36 innings from March 15-19. A nine-run inning in game 2 at Jacksonville State prevented them from losing all four games. Purdue has also been shut out six times.

• However, the marquee win of the season was a shutout. Led by five scoreless innings from **Andrew Bohm**, Purdue limited Texas to just an infield single in a 4-0 win in game 3 of the series. **Bo Hofstra** closed out the win with three innings of hitless relief, retiring the final six batters he faced. The Boilermakers became the first team to shut out UT at home since April 2016.
